

- Previously named Edinboro Academy, Edinboro Normal School, Edinboro State Teachers College, and Edinboro State College
- The second normal school established in Pennsylvania and the 12th in the U.S.
- Became Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1983 with the formation of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education



President Foster F. Diebold



Now in his fourteenth year as president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, Foster F. Diebold is the fourteenth chief executive officer of the institution of higher learning that has come to acclaim in the last decade as one of Pennsylvania's and the nation's finest. He has brought a vi-

gorous educational and moral leadership, a strengthening of the spirit of community, a clear sense of direction and purpose, and a dimension of multicultural pluralism and diversity.

Much has been accomplished during President Diebold's tenure. The University has returned to financial health. Significant facilities and grounds improvements have been achieved, with several of the historic structures on campus restored to their original splendor. Academic programs have been emphasized and improved, with more than 100 degree offerings now available. Enrollment gains have been unprecedented in both numbers and academic quality. International linkages have been established with institutions in several other countries, and Edinboro University's program for students with disabilities continues to garner acclaim as one of the finest among all colleges and universities in the United States. Widely recognized as a leader in education both here and abroad. President Diebold has positioned Edinboro University to meet the challenges of the 1990s, as well as those that will face public higher education in the 21st century.

The Orange, New Jersey, native is a graduate of Monmouth College and also holds a master of arts in educational administration from Seton Hall University. He has met coursework requirements for a doctorate in education at Rutgers University and is currently completing the dissertation requirement for the Ph.D. program in higher education at the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency of Edinboro University, President Diebold was president of the University of Alaska from 1977 to 1979. Before that, he was executive secretary to the Board of Regents and special assistant to the president of the University of Alaska Statewide System. From 1969 to 1976, he was director of Development and Planning at Kean College in New Jersey and a member of the graduate faculty at that institution; and from 1965 to 1969, he was assistant superintendent of the Neptune Township (New Jersey) Public Schools.

Recognized for his extensive experience in the field of education management, President Diebold's scholarly achievements in the discipline of applied ethics in higher education deserve special mention. The model statement he authored for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, "Ethical Practices for College Presidents," was unanimously adopted by that professional organization and published as policy for the chief executives of its nearly 400 member institutions nationwide. It is the first formally adopted ethical practices and policy statement for higher education presidents.


For his leadership on an international scale and for his many contributions to the advancement of higher education and enrichment of an emerging culture in Pakistan, President Diebold was decorated with prestigious gold medals from three Pakistani universities. The awards for educational eminence were presented during visits to the Edinboro campus by official Pakistani delegations.

President Diebold was also honored by the Government of Pakistan with the awarding of the degree of Doctor of Laws (honoris causa), presented at the Government House in the City of Karachi. The ceremony was attended by the presidents of the several Pakistani universities holding linkage agreements with Edinboro University, as well as many high-ranking officials of the Government of Pakistan and U.S. diplomatic officials.

A recently bestowed honor was President Diebold's appointment to the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations, the leading national, non-partisan, public affairs organization devoted to building constructive and durable relationships between the two countries. The appointment recognized his insight into the Chinese people and his experience with the academic linkage agreement he established with Zibo College in China's Shandong Province. Students and scholars have been at Edinboro University under terms of the formal linkage agreement since the 1986-87 academic year.

A staunch advocate of a statewide system of public universities in Pennsylvania, President Diebold supported the enabling legislation for the State System of Higher Education (Act 188 of 1982) and saw the State system come to existence in 1983 as a member of the transition team. He currently serves on the System's Executive Council of Presidents and on the boards of the Pennsylvania Academy for the Profession of Teaching, the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, and the Dixon University at Harrisburg.

Athletic Director James K. McDonald



Edinboro University's athletic program was placed under the talented and aggressive leadership of Jim McDonald in July of 1981. Increased emphasis on fund raising to provide a sound scholarship foundation has

become his top priority while numerous changes and innovations have also keyed the Scots' athletic program under his direction.

Through his efforts more than \$5 million has been raised during the past twelve years. The funds generated by the energetic athletic director's efforts will be used to assist Edinboro's men and women athletes who compete in the Scots sixteen intercollegiate sports.

In addition to maintaining Edinboro's respected winning tradition in intercollegiate athletics, the former health and physical education professor has vastly expanded the University's summer activities.

Sixty camps were sponsored by the Fighting Scots Booster Club this past summer on the University's campus. Sox Harrison Stadium was the site for the Buffalo Bills-Pittsburgh Steelers first scrimmage, an event the veteran athletic director hopes to bring back to the area each year.

The personable athletic director also introduced Edinboro's Hall of fame program which has evolved into an annual year-ending event to honor present and past athletes.

McDonald has been at Edinboro since 1962 and for 12 years served as the Fighting Scot basketball coach (1962-1975) and never experienced a losing season while his teams compiled an impressive 181 wins against only 89 losses. During that span, his cagers won four Western Division Pennsylvania Conference crowns, the PC state championship and two District 18 titles that netted trips to the NAIA National Tournament. His teams set 27 University records and made 19 post-season

appearances while four of his players were named All-Americans.

Prior to accepting his position at Edinboro, McDonald served as assistant basketball coach in Erie, Pa. He is a 1956 graduate of Bridgeport High School in his home town of Bridgeport, West Virginia.

In 1960 he received a degree in chemistry and physical education from West Virginia Wesleyan College and he also holds a master's degree in health from the University of Buffalo.

As an undergraduate, he set nine school records at Wesleyan and was twice voted both AP and UPI basketball All-American. In 1960, he was the second leading scorer in the United States, averaging slightly over 33 points a game, and led his team to the national basketball tournament in Kansas City, Missouri. He was named to the NAIA's All-Tournament Team in 1959 and 1960.

The funds generated by the energetic athletic director's efforts will be used to assist Edinboro's men and women athletes.

In 1966, McDonald was selected Area Eight Coach of the Year by the eastern seaboard coaches and that same year was honored as one of the top ten finalists in the Coach of the Year national poll. McDonald's honors also include selection to the West Virginia All-Time College Basketball Team and membership in the West Virginia Sports Hall of Fame.

As a resident of Edinboro, McDonald has a record of extensive community involvement. He was Little League Baseball director for four yeas and also held a four-year post as a member of the General McLane School Board. He and his wife, Mary Lou, have three sons - Mark, Mike and Matthew.

Head Coach Stan Swank



Stan Swank is entering his seventh season as head coach of the Edinboro University women's basketball team. His first six years at the helm have been filled with success and national recognition. Under Swank, the Lady Scots have advanced to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship game four of

the last five years, and have made NCAA national tournament appearances three of the past four.

Entering his first season in 1987-88, Swank took over a team comprised mainly of underclassmen. Swank provided the spark which this young team needed, guiding the Lady Scots to a record of 14-11, one game out of the PSAC playoffs.

In '88-89, the Lady Scots stormed the PSAC and won the western division title with a 10-2 conference record. They won the first game of the PSAC championship playoffs before bowing out in the state title game. The team finished with a 21-6 record, the best in Lady Scot history. Swank was named PSAC-West Coach of the Year for his efforts.

Swank's third season saw the Lady Scots take their play to new heights. They took the PSAC-West title with an 11-1 conference record and then went on to capture the PSAC state crown. With an overall record of 27-3 and a national ranking, the Lady Scots advanced to the NCAA tournament's round of 16 before their dream season ended. Swank was named PSAC-West Coach of the Year for the second straight year posting the best season in Lady Scot history in only his third year.

After graduating the 1989-90 team, Swank had 12 new players for his next season. During this rebuilding season, the Lady Scots showed signs of promise for the future, finishing 8-19, 1-11 in the PSAC West.

The next season brought Swank the kind of results he had been used to as Boro head coach. The five returners and five strong recruits put the Lady Scots back in the national spotlight. The team finished with an overall record of 22-8, 8-4 in the PSAC-West. The squad, ranked nationally, claimed the PSAC runners-up trophy and advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs.

Last year's team continued Swank's success at Edinboro. It finished 18-12 overall, 9-3 in the conference. For the second straight season the Lady Scots finished as runners-up at the PSAC championships and again they advanced to the NCAA Division II tournament. For his efforts, Swank was named the PSAC-Western Division Coach of the Year.

Swank began his coaching career at Nova High School in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, as an assistant men's coach. He helped guide the squad to an outstanding 30-3 record and an eighth place finish in the state.

In 1977, he joined the Parkland Junior College staff as an assistant men's coach.

In 1980, he began a two year stint as head coach of the Fisher High School boy's varsity team. He left the high school ranks with a 39-14 record and two regional championships.

When Parkland Junior College came looking for new leadership for its women's program, Swank fit the bill. 1983 was the first of four stellar seasons for Parkland, as Swank led the Cobras to four straight 20-plus win seasons, culminated by a 30-4 finish in '85-86 and a 30-3 finish in '86-87. His '86-87 unit finished the year ranked 13th in the NJCAA final rankings and led the NJCAA in scoring average, pouring in 93.8 points per game. That year's club eclipsed the 100 point mark eleven times, scoring as many as 129 points. His overall mark at Parkland was 104 wins against just 20 losses.

His accomplishments with Parkland included four straight sectional championships ('83-87), two third-place finishes in NJCAA Region 24 ('83-84 & '84-85), and two regional runners-up finishes ('85-86 & '86-87).

Coming to Edinboro in 1987-88, Swank's credentials spoke for themselves. No team he had ever coached had posted a losing record, but he faced a program that lacked leadership and experience. Swank let his energy and charisma take over and as the season progressed, it became evident that the Lady Scots were forming a winning tradition. Swank thus demonstrated his ability to turn a program around. The foundation of the Lady Scot basketball program is now solid and the glue that holds it together is the knowledge, energy and emotion of Stan Swank.

Swank earned a bachelor of science in physical education from Purdue University in 1976, then returned to receive a master of science degree in educational administration four years later. He is a 1972 graduate of Champaign Centennial High School in Champaign, Illinois.

Swank and his wife, Gail, have two children; 10 year-old Stanley II, and Benjamin, six, and reside in Edinboro.

ASSISTANT COACH SARAH JAY

Sarah begins her second year as an assistant coach after graduating from Edinboro in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education and in 1992 with a master's in student personnel services. She is also a certified athletic trainer (A.T.C.).

Playing for Swank for three years, Sarah currently ranks second in Edinboro history in scoring, (1,652) seventh in rebounding (565) and fourth in assists (239). She holds the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference single-season record for foul shooting with an 86.8 percentage. Sarah was named PSAC-West First-Team three consecutive years and was also tabbed a Kodak All-American in the East Region her senior year. Sarah brings a wealth of knowledge to the Lady Scots and is a great addition to the Edinboro coaching staff.



ASSISTANT COACH JOHN RADOVICH

John Radovich, in his seventh season as assistant women's basketball coach, is also the Scots' head baseball coach. He came to Edinboro from the Community College of Allegheny County South Campus where he was head baseball coach for five years, guiding his squads to a 144-63 overall record. Radovich's EUP baseball squad has made a remarkable turnaround since his arrival and finished just one game out of the PSAC playoffs in '89 and '91. He was named Edinboro University Coach of the Year in 1991 and is well respected in coaching circles in both sports.

Radovich is Swank's "right hand man," a fact not lost on the head coach. "John is a former basketball standout," Swank says, "and he gives us additional coaching inside. Being 6'7", he has a handle on what it takes to play the inside game. His love for basketball and desire is contagious. He is an excellent role model for any athlete and a definite plus for our program."



VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH BILL PEPICELLO

Bill Pepicello joins head coach Stan Swank on the sidelines for his fourth season. Pepicello has over 16 years of basketball coaching experience, starting with boy's and girl's programs at St. James parochial school in Erie,PA. He was an assistant at Penn-State-Behrend in 1987-88, then joined the Mercyhurst College staff for the following two years.

Pepicello is a 1967 graduate of Iroquois High School. After a year at Yankton College in South Dakota, he joined the United States Coast Guard and was given an honorable discharge in 1972. Throughout his coaching experience, he has attended many clinics, including sessions with coaching greats Bobby Knight and Mike Krzyewski.

Bill and his wife, Charlene, have one daughter, Nicole.







1993-94 Preview - A Matter of Pride

After qualifying for the NCAA Division II playoffs three of the past four years, Edinboro University has established itself as a perennial leader in women's basketball. With the return of several key players and the addition of strong recruiting talent, the Lady Scots consider it a matter of pride to continue to uphold that success in 1993-94. Led by seven-year head coach Stan Swank, the Lady Scots are looking to make return trips to the PSAC championship and the NCAA tournament.

According to Women's Division II Bulletin, the Lady Scots will continue the tradition. In its preseason poll, WDIIB has the Lady Scots ranked 22nd in the nation and fourth in the East Region.

Swank directed Edinboro to an 18-12 overall mark and a PSAC-West record of 9-3 a year ago. The Lady Scots will have to duplicate that success without last season's leading scorer and rebounder, Jeannine Jean-Pierre, as well as Terri Ayers and Andrea Williams.

Jean-Pierre became only the second basketball player, male or female, in Edinboro history to be named a First-Team Kodak All-American. She was also named the PSAC-West Player of the Year and to the PSAC-West First-Team for the second straight time. She averaged 21.4 ppg, 11.7 rpg and 2.7 apg. Jean-Pierre's 622 points last season is second only to First-Team Kodak All-American Tammy Walker-Strode's 691 a year earlier.

Ayers leaves the Lady Scots as the all-time leader in blocked shots with 159 over her three seasons. She also leaves ranked fourth in career rebounds and 16th among career scorers. Williams departs after two seasons ranked seventh in career assists and 20th in career scoring.

The '93-94 Lady Scots return eight young players from last year with NCAA tournament experience. Four of these returners held starting positions at some point a year ago.

The lone senior this season is 6'0" forward Cathlene Criss, who played extremely well in her limited action a year ago. She has the ability to help the Boro with its inside game.

Also returning is junior Pam Artman. Artman, a guard, comes into this season already ranked fifth in career assists and has a chance to be in the top 20 in career scoring and rebounding by the end of this season. She averaged 8.1 ppg, 4.9 apg and 4.0 rpg.

Six sophomores return, all of whom played an important role in last year's success.



Leading the way is guard Lori Montgomery who started most of the season, averaging 9.5 ppg, 3.3 apg and 3.3 rpg. Her outstanding freshman season garnered her PSAC Western Division Rookie of the Year honors.

The two other partial starters returning from last year are forwards Shauna Nevel and Sedessa Grushecky. Nevel averaged 5.1 points and 2.4 rebounds in her starting role, while Grushecky added 3.6

ppg and 2.8 rpg. Grushecky also added six blocked shots.

The other three sophomore returnees are guards Diana Holder, Joy Sheppard and Christine Roppolo. All three saw action off the bench last season and played an important part in the Boro's national success. They should all see more playing time this season.

Swank has also added four new players to his program. They include three junior college transfers and one true freshman.

Heading the list of newcomers is junior Kimberly Jaeger. Jaeger, a point guard, comes to Edinboro from Moberly Area Community College in Moberly, MO, where she was tabbed an Academic All-American a year ago. She also sank 83.0% of her free throws, which ranked ninth nationally among junior college players.

Sandie Blum, a 5'11" forward, enters the Boro from Glen Oaks Community College in Centerville, MI. Last year, she was tabbed an all-conference player while averaging 16 points and eight rebounds per game.

Karen Gibbs, a 6'4" forward, comes to Edinboro via Delta Junior College in Bay City, MI. She could be pressed immediately into action with the loss of Ayers. At Delta a year ago, she averaged a dozen points and rebounds per game and set a Delta record by pulling down 25 boards in a single game.

The only freshman on this year's squad is Lee Piccioni. She comes to Edinboro from Thomas Jefferson High School in Pittsburgh where she was named to the Section 9 All-Star team after averaging 17 points per game.

This year's team hopes to have the chemistry to continue the success of the past, but will have its hands full with a strong non-conference schedule that includes two meetings with perennial Division II powerhouse Pitt-Johnstown. When PSAC western division play begins in January, Swank looks for his team to be at the top of its game and makes it a matter of pride to build upon Edinboro's established basketball reputation.

Lady Scots Go to Nationals, Again

This past season marked another banner year for the Edinboro University women's basketball program, as the Lady Scots advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs for the second consecutive year and the third time in the past four seasons. They also advanced to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship game for the second consecutive year and the fourth time in the last five.

Edinboro posted an 18-12 overall mark, with a 9-3 PSAC-West record, which was good enough to earn second place in the division. These records, along with the solid play of several returners from the year before, helped the Lady Scots advance to the PSAC title game and the NCAA East Regional.

At the East Regional, the Lady Scots were eliminated in the first round by the University of Pittsburgh at Johnstown in a tough, 88-76, overtime loss.

Senior forward Jeannine Jean-Pierre finished her career in impressive fashion by receiving numerous post-season awards. Her top honor was her selection as a Kodak First Team All-American, one of only ten players chosen. She was also named First Team All-PSAC-West for the second straight season and was selected as the PSAC-West "Player of the Year."

For the season, Jean-Pierre posted the third highest single-season scoring average (21.4) in school history and scored the second most points (622). Her rebounding total of 339 is third for a single season and her 11.7 rpg ranks fourth. She led the PSAC in rebounding and finished second in scoring.

Freshman Lori Montgomery also received post season recognition last year. She was named PSAC-West "Rookie of the Year" after averaging 9.5 points, 3.3 rebounds and 3.3 assists per game.

Head coach Stan Swank also won the PSAC-West "Coach of the Year" award for the third time in five seasons.

Making a big impact for the Lady Scots last season was senior guard Andrea Williams and junior center Terri Ayers.

Williams scored 11.4 points and pulled 5.5 rebounds a game and leaves Edinboro ranked

20th all-time in career scoring with 652 points and seventh in assists with 216 in her two seasons.

Ayers scored 13.7 points and pulled down 9.9 rebounds, finishing her three year career at Edinboro ranked fourth in rebounding with 721 and as the leader in blocked shots with 159.

Turning in her second consecutive strong season was sophomore guard Pam Artman. Artman averaged 8.1 points, 4.9 assists and 4.0 rebounds, giving her 231 career assists, good for fifth on the all-time list.

The Lady Scots also received solid seasons from freshmen forwards Sedessa Grushecky and Shauna Nevel. They both combined for a starting position, with Grushecky scoring 3.6 points and pulling down 2.8 rebounds and Nevel averaging 5.1 points and 2.4 rebounds per game.

Also turning in strong seasons off the bench for the Lady Scots was junior forward Cathlene Criss, freshmen guards Diana Holder, Marcie Heasley, Christine Roppolo and Joy Sheppard and freshman forward Mandy Futchi.

Criss was selected a PSAC Scholar Athlete for the third consecutive season.

After starting out with tough trips to Alaska and Fort Wayne, Indiana, the Lady Scots turned their game up a notch when conference play started, winning nine of their first ten league games before dropping their last two.

In the first round of the PSAC playoffs, the Boro defeated Bloomsburg on its home court

before losing the state title to Clarion. In the NCAA Division II East Regional, Edinboro lost the first game to powerhouse Pitt-Johnstown, ending its season.


