Edinboro Women's Basketball

"Celebrating a Decade of Excellence"

The Edinboro University of Pennsylvania women's basketball program has enjoyed a "Decade of Excellence," highlighted by several Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championships and NCAA Division II national tournament appearances.

Under the leadership of head coach Stan Swank, who begins his 10th year at Edinboro, the Fighting Scots have established themselves as perennial contenders in the PSAC.

Edinboro has played in five Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference postseason tournaments under Swank, advancing to the league's championship game four times.

Edinboro has finished first or second in the PSAC Western Division four times under Swank, compiling a 150-96 overall record during the last nine seasons.

The Scots have won 20-or-more games three times, including a record 27-3 campaign in 1989-90, when the Boro won the PSAC West, claimed the conference postseason tournament title, and earned a berth in the NCAA tournament.

In his nine years at Edinboro, Swank has averaged more than 16 wins per season and has been named the PSAC West Coach of the Year three times.

In addition to team success, the program has had four All-Americans, 16 all-conference players and two PSAC Rookies of the Year.

After advancing to the semifinals of the PSAC postseason tournament last season, the Edinboro women's basketball team will enter this new season with great expectations, as the 1996-97 Fighting Scot women's basketball program continues a Decade of Excellence.

"We're proud of the success our program has enjoyed over the years, but we're even more excited about the future. We finished very strong last year, and there's no question our players are on a mission to win another PSAC title and return to the NCAA tournament this year."

The 1989-90 Scots Celebrate the PSAC Title!

Highlights of the Stan Swank Era

- **1995-96** ~ Edinboro qualifies for the PSAC post-season tournament. As the No. 4 seed from the West, the Scots upset PSAC East champion Kutztown, 98-83, on the road. After an outstanding effort, the Scots fall in the PSAC semifinals, 67-60, to eventual NCAA tournament qualifier Slippery Rock.
- **1992-93** ~ Edinboro receives its third NCAA Division II tournament bid in four years after finishing as the PSAC runner-up in the league's postseason tournament.
- **1991-92** ~ The Scots finish as the PSAC runner-up and earn another NCAA Division II tournament berth. With a 22-8 overall mark, the Scots win 20 games for the third time in four years.
- **1989-90** ~ Edinboro enjoys its most successful season ever. The Fighting Scots finish first in the PSAC West, defeat Lock Haven, 77-67, to win the conference postseason tournament and advance to the NCAA Division II national tournament. The Boro finishes with a 27-3 overall mark, EUP's best record.
- **1988-89** ~ The Scots capture the PSAC West title and advance to the conference postseason tournament championship game for the first time in school history. Edinboro falls, 70-62, to Lock Haven, but records a 21-6 overall record.
- **1987-88** ~ Edinboro posts a 14-11 overall record in Stan Swank's first season as head coach.

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania

HISTORY

Founded in 1857 as a private academy, the institution became Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1983 with the formation of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.

ACADEMICS

Edinboro University offers a diversified and comprehensive selection of more than 100 degree programs, with 52 minors tailored to meet the needs of each student.

With a student-faculty ratio of 18:1, Edinboro offers associate's degrees, bachelor's degrees and master's programs in many specialized fields of study.

Edinboro has an undergraduate and graduate enrollment of nearly 7,500 students.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Edinboro is proud to feature the nation's third-largest educational program for the physically disabled, including services for the hearing and visually impaired, and the learning disabled. The campus is nearly 100-percent wheelchair accessible.

The University has an outstanding honors program for academically gifted students and an international education program for the exchange of faculty and students.

Internships and field experiences integrate academic pursuits with on-site "real-world" work situations, while numerous cultural, social and recreational activities are available.



FACILITIES

Edinboro features 42 buildings on a spacious 585-acre campus which includes a five-acre lake, open fields and woods. Day and evening classes are available at the Porreco Extension Center in Erie.

There are eight on-campus residence halls housing approximately 2,600 students.

A state-of-the-art seven-story library features more than 430,000 bound volumes, 1.2 million microform units, on-line public access catalog, on-line CD-ROM searching systems, public access for the visually impaired and inter-library loan service.

Edinboro University has a planetarium, modern science labs, robotics laboratory, a television studio, radio station and a performing arts center.

The University also features a reading clinic, a speech and hearing clinic, a math clinic, parent-child development center, and numerous computer labs featuring state-of-the-art technology.

Edinboro recently completed construction of a modern student center, which includes a full-service bookstore and dining areas, an indoor running track and aerobics room, whirlpools and saunas, a large weight room, racquetball and handball courts.

The campus also has outdoor tennis courts and an all-weather running track at Sox Harrison Stadium.

Several indoor athletic facilities, including basketball courts, weight rooms, and a swimming pool, are housed at McComb Fieldhouse, home of the Fighting Scots.

Edinboro, Pennsylvania



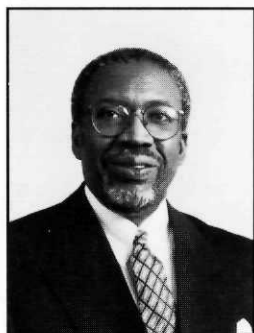
Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is located in the resort community of Edinboro -- just 15 miles south of Erie, Pennsylvania's third-largest city. Edinboro is conveniently located approximately 100 miles from Pittsburgh, Cleveland and Buffalo. The University is easily accessible from all directions because of its proximity to interstates 79 and 90.

The Borough of Edinboro has a population of nearly 8,000 and is one of the area's fastest-growing municipalities. From 1980 to 1990, Edinboro enjoyed a 22-percent population increase as individuals and businesses recognized the benefits of a small-town community located in close proximity to major metropolitan areas.

There are two lakes nearby: Edinboro Lake is a 250-acre recreational area with three guarded beaches for swimming, boating and other water sports. The Edinboro lakeside community features a large selection of cottages for rent. Lake Erie, one of the Great Lakes, is just 15 miles north. Edinboro also is close to several ski resorts for both downhill and cross country enthusiasts. The area is a popular hunting and fishing spot for outdoorsmen.

Edinboro University is the largest employer in the area, with approximately 2,000 full- and part-time employees, many of them current and former Edinboro University students.

President Frank G. Pogue



Dr. Frank G. Pogue Jr. was appointed President of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996. Dr. Pogue brings to Edinboro more than three decades of experience in higher education including equity, diversity, excellence in teaching, retention, Afro-American studies, health care and citizenship.

Dr. Pogue serves on the Executive Council for the State System of Higher Education, which is comprised of the SSHE Chancellor and Presidents from the 14 System institutions. He is the Vice Chairperson of the Executive Committee and Chairperson of the Task Force on Equity and Diversity for the Commission on Higher Education, Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

The recipient of numerous awards in recognition of his academic and personal accomplishments, Dr. Pogue was recognized by the Office of the Governor of New York as an African American of Distinction. He has toured South Korea, China and Kenya and has worked to establish student exchange programs with these countries. Prior to coming to Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue served

for 10 years as the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs and Special Programs at the State University of New York Central Administration. During that time, he served for a year as Interim President of SUNY at Cobleskill. He also held several other positions during his 22-year tenure at SUNY. In addition, he was the Senior Research Associate and Assistant Professor of Family Health at Meharry Medical College in Nashville; Assistant Professor of Sociology and Director of Afro-American Studies at Chatham College in Pittsburgh; and Dean of Students and Chair of the Department of Sociology/Anthropology at Philander Smith College in Little Rock.

Dr. Pogue provides leadership to Edinboro University with particular regard to the importance of creating and maintaining a culture of academic excellence among University students, faculty, staff and administrators. He works to diversify the college experience by developing for students opportunities to interact with people different from themselves.

Athletic Director Jody Mooradian



Jody Mooradian is in her third year as athletic director at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania after serving as associate athletic director and senior women's administrator for one year with the Fighting Scots. Mooradian, a New Hampshire native who joined the Edinboro athletic staff after assisting with compliance at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) athletic department, assumed her current post in August of 1994.

Mooradian is responsible for overseeing the daily operations of the Fighting Scots' nationally competitive 19-sport intercollegiate athletics program. She has implemented several new programs for Edinboro's student-athletes, including the establishment of the EUP Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and the reinstatement of an athletic awards system.

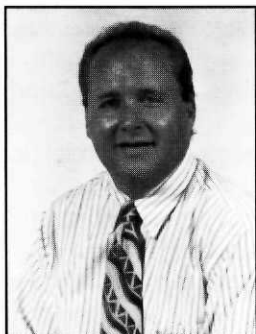
Mooradian not only provides leadership for the Fighting Scots' athletic department, but also is a key figure on campus and within the NCAA and Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference. She serves on the President's Cabinet at Edinboro, is a member of the NCAA Interpretations Committee and the PSAC Executive Committee, and serves as chair of the PSAC Volleyball Committee.

At UCLA, Mooradian handled NCAA compliance and eligibility matters and also worked with tutorial services budgets and Title IX evaluations. She performed similar duties at Edinboro after joining the staff in August of 1993 and also assumed responsibility for financial aid for the Fighting Scots' 300-plus student-athletes, scheduling and administering Edinboro University's intercollegiate athletic events, as well as special events such as the University's outstanding summer camps.

Before dedicating herself to a career in intercollegiate athletics, Mooradian served for five years as a practicing attorney. She handled all aspects of insurance litigation for Devine, Millimet and Branch of Manchester, New Hampshire, for nearly two years after serving as in-house counsel for the CIGNA Insurance Company in Philadelphia for more than three years.

Her father, Andy Mooradian, was athletic director at the University of New Hampshire for 22 years. She played college basketball for two years and earned a B.A. in political science in 1981 from New Hampshire. She received her Juris Doctorate from the Delaware Law School in 1986, and a master's degree in public administration at the University of Delaware in 1987. She served as a New Hampshire state representative for District 4 from 1980-82 and is a member of the New Hampshire and Pennsylvania bars.

Support Staff



Todd V. Jay, Assistant to the Vice President for Athletic Compliance and Publicity

Todd Jay is in his 12th year of service with the Edinboro University Athletic Department, and his second year as Assistant to the Vice President for Athletic Compliance and Publicity.

Jay began his career in sports administration at Edinboro in the summer of 1985, serving as the Fighting Scots' sports information and promotions director for the first 10 years of his tenure. Jay was primarily responsible for publicizing all aspects of Edinboro athletics while coordinating many of the Athletic Department's special events. He served as the department's primary media liaison and as host of "Fighting Scot Sports," Edinboro's weekly cable television show. He coordinated the department's annual Student-Athlete Recognition and Hall of Fame banquets, while also serving as master of ceremonies.

In addition, Jay has been very involved in the organization and promotion of several international wrestling exhibitions and NFL scrimmage games, as well as the highly successful Sports Memorabilia Auction.

Jay is currently responsible for monitoring all aspects of Edinboro's NCAA compliance program, including working closely with the NCAA Clearinghouse in certification of initial eligibility, with the NCAA, Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, and with the members of the EUP coaching staff on on-going legislative matters. Jay continues to oversee the operation of the sports information and promotions office, coordinates travel arrangements for the Scots' 19-sport program, and assists in many areas of departmental fund-raising activities. Todd chairs the University's Athletic Hall of Fame Committee, is a member of the Edinboro University President's Cabinet, and the NCAA Division II Basketball Committee.

Jay earned a bachelor's degree in elementary education at Clarion in 1982 in addition to his master's. He was a two-time All-PSAC baseball player for the Golden Eagles. Todd is married to the former Sarah Bishop, an All-American basketball player and former coach at Edinboro.



Dave Higham, Assistant to the Athletic Director

Dave Higham began his association with the Edinboro University Athletic Department in 1982, and currently serves as an Assistant to the Athletic Director, a position he has held since 1989.

Higham was a standout offensive lineman with the Fighting Scots from 1982-86. He was selected the Scots team captain prior to his senior year and also was a preseason All-American pick.

Higham earned a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1987, and served as a graduate assistant for the Athletic Department for the next two years while receiving his master's degree in secondary administration.

Among Dave's numerous responsibilities is directing and coordinating all aspects of Edinboro's extensive summer camp program, including recruiting and coordinating all on-campus arrangements for thousands of visitors each year. During the school year, Higham manages all of the Fighting Scots' home athletic events and handles scheduling for the department's facilities. His many other duties include NCAA compliance for team practices, supervising maintenance employees during both the summer and school year, and assisting in the recruitment of student-athletes.

Dave is a member of the Edinboro Hall of Fame Committee and assists with EUP's Student Athlete Advisory Committee, which works with Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Special Olympics, the Erie City Mission, and campus leaders.

Dave is an adviser and regional board member for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. He also serves as a board member of many departmental committees, is a member of the Christian Businessmen's Organization and the Health and Physical Education Club.

Sue Marshall, Athletic Business Director

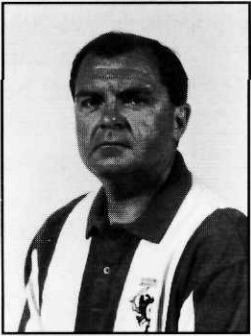
Sue Marshall has been the business manager and fundraiser coordinator for the Fighting Scot Booster Club for the past 11 years.

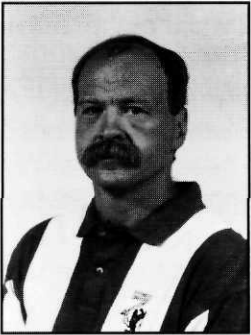
Roberts has extensive experience in the sports medicine profession, highlighted by experiences at several international competitions. Roberts has worked two Olympic Games for the United States Olympic Committee, volunteering his services for Olympiads in Los Angeles in 1984 and Barcelona in 1992. He also has worked several National Sports and Olympic festivals and the World University Games.

In addition to directing the training room facilities and staff at Edinboro, George is a member of several on-campus and professional committees, including the Curly Halmi Scholarship Committee. He is a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association and serves on the Board of Directors of the College Athletic Trainers Society. 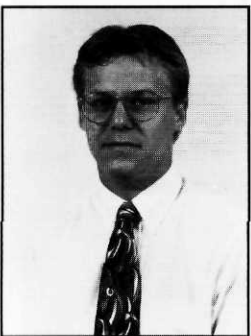

Sports Information and Promotions

Shawn Ahearn, Coordinator



Shawn Ahearn is in his second year as the Coordinator of Sports Information and Promotions at Edinboro and his 11th year as a full-time SID. Ahearn is responsible for a wide range of duties, including the production of athletic publications, media relations, home event management, statistical record keeping, and promotion of EUP student-athletes and athletic teams. Ahearn also serves as host of the "Fighting Scot Sports" weekly cable television show, and assists with various fund-raising activities.

Ahearn, a native of Pittsburgh, Pa., joined the Fighting Scot staff in July of 1995, after serving as a sports information director in the Midwest for nine years. He was the sports information and marketing director at Pittsburg State University in Pittsburg, Kan., for six years, after serving as SID at Chicago State University from 1986-89. While at Pittsburg State, Ahearn coordinated several major promotional campaigns for student-athletes, including successful campaigns for consecutive Harlon Hill Award winners in 1991 and 1992, and numerous All-Americans. He also played a major role in increased national publicity for the University's highly successful football program, which won

the NCAA Division II championship in 1991.

Ahearn is an active member of the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), serving as the chair of the NCAA Division II SIDs this year. He has been a presenter several times at the organization's national workshop, and has been honored for his athletic publications by CoSIDA four times. He currently chairs the Northeast Regional Harlon Hill Advisory Committee, and the CoSIDA Division II East Regional Basketball Committee. Ahearn is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Shawn and his wife, Karen, live in Edinboro with their two daughters, Ashlyn, 5, and Emily, 1.

Head Coach Stan Swank



Stan Swank enters his 10th season as head coach of the Edinboro University women's basketball team.

After graduating from Champaign Centennial High School (1972) in Illinois, he earned a bachelor of science degree in physical education from Purdue University in 1976. Swank later returned to Purdue and received a master of science degree in educational administration in 1979.

Swank began his head coaching career at Fisher High School in Florida, where he coached the boys team for two years, compiling a 39-14 record. In 1983, he moved on to Parkland Junior College, where his Cobra team won four consecutive sectional championships and finished second twice, and third once in the NJCAA Region 24. He recorded an impressive 104-20 overall mark at Parkland.

After his success at Parkland, Swank came to Edinboro University in 1987. His 1987-88 squad finished 14-11 overall and missed the postseason by only a game. Building off the previous year's success, the 1988-89 team captured the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's Western Division crown, compiling an

overall record of 21-6. The 20-plus win season was the first of three that Swank has enjoyed while at the 'Boro. Swank would also win his first of three PSAC-West Coach of the Year awards.

The Scots repeated as PSAC-West champions the following season, and advanced to the 1989-90 NCAA Division II national tournament. After finishing the season with a school record 27 wins, Swank was named PSAC "Coach of the Year" for the second straight season.

After a rebuilding season in 1990-91, Swank's 1991-92 team finished 22-8 overall and second in the PSAC. The Scots also made another appearance in the NCAA national tournament.

After an 18-12 record in 1992-93, the Fighting Scots again finished second in the PSAC and once again appeared in the national tournament- their third time in the previous four seasons.

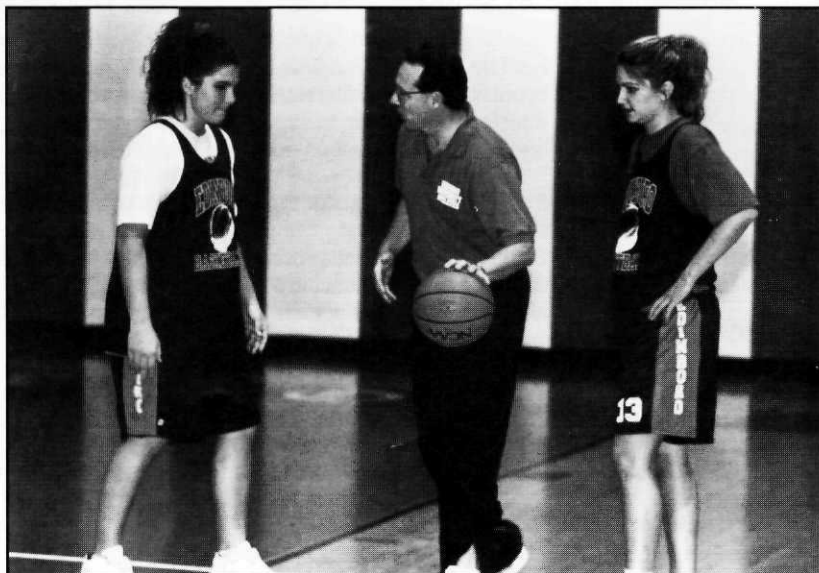
In 1993-94, the Scots finished 10-15 overall. In 1994-95, Edinboro compiled a 15-11 overall mark, despite playing with only two seniors on the squad.

Swank's 1995-96 team returned to the postseason once more, as the Scots finished 15-13 overall. After defeating tri-champion Kutztown in the opening round of the PSAC post-season tournament, Edinboro advanced to the PSAC "Final Four." Although the Scots fell to the Rockets and ended a very satisfying season, many of the younger players on the squad gained the experience to compete in the always-rugged PSAC. Now just 11 victories away from becoming the all-time winningest coach in school history, Swank looks to build upon last season's success in 1996-97, as he completes a "decade of excellence" at Edinboro University.

Swank and his wife, Gail, have two sons- Stanley II, 13, and Benjamin, 9. The Swanks reside in Edinboro.

Assistant Coach Andrea Williams



Andrea Williams, a native of Fort Wayne, Indiana, returns to Edinboro University for her second year as an assistant coach for the Fighting Scots women's basketball program.

Williams played her last two years of college basketball for the Scots. While at Edinboro, Williams competed in two Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship tournaments, as well as a pair of NCAA Division II national tournaments. Her senior year, she was co-captain of the Fighting Scots. Williams also played softball at Edinboro University for one season, earning PSAC first-team honors.

After graduating from Edinboro in 1994 with a degree in physical education, and a minor in health and fitness, Williams taught at Washington-Jefferson Middle School in Columbia City, Indiana. She began her coaching career in Columbia City, coaching seventh-grade and eighth-grade teams in basketball and volleyball, as well as a junior varsity team in softball. Before her days as a student-athlete at Edinboro, Williams set numerous records in two seasons at Vincennes University (Indiana). Included was the school's career scoring mark with 888 points. She was ranked 12th in the nation with a free-throw percentage of 88.2%. She was named all-district, all-region and honorable-mention All-American. Combining her totals at Edinboro and Vincennes, Williams scored 1,444 points during her collegiate career. While at Vincennes, she earned her associates degree in physical education.

Williams, 25, is single and resides in Edinboro.

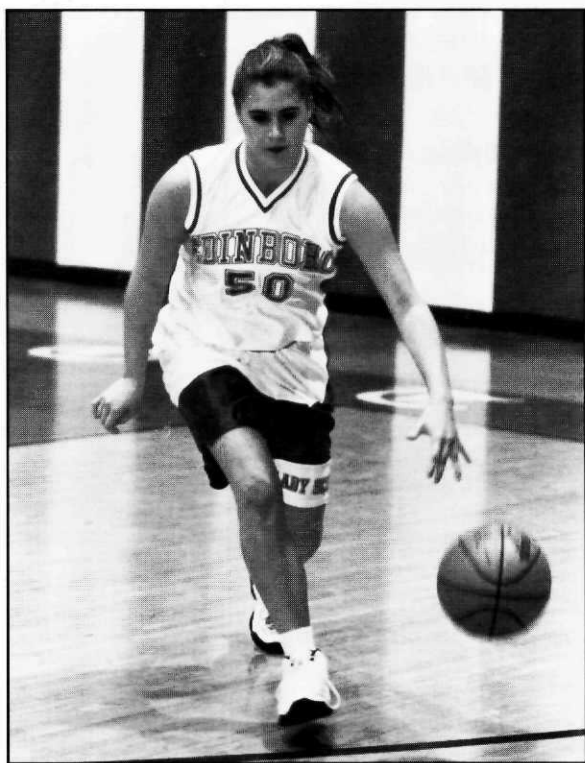
Scots Looking to Repeat Playoff Run in '96-97

After finishing the 1995-96 regular season at 14-12, the Edinboro University women's basketball team made an outstanding run in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference post-season tournament, which the Scots hope to build upon in 1996-97.

Traveling to PSAC-East tri-champion Kutztown for the opening round of the tournament, the Fighting Scots proved they deserved to be in the post-season with a convincing 98-83 victory over the Golden Bears. Edinboro advanced to the PSAC Final Four, and faced Slippery Rock at Shippensburg in the semifinals. After leading for much of the first half, the Scots could not hold off Slippery Rock and eventually fell to the No. 2-seeded Rockets, 67-60.

While the Scots were not extended an invitation to the NCAA Division II national tournament, playing one of the toughest schedules in Division II should be a positive factor in this year's success.

Edinboro, under the direction of head coach Stan Swank, who enters the 1996-97 season with a career record of 150-98 (.605), must replace three all-PSAC players. But the veteran coach is excited about several newcomers, as well as the team chemistry the Scots

have developed in early season workouts.

"We are certainly going to miss those three players," said Swank. "But this season, we will have more of a balanced attack. We can rely on any given person to pick up the scoring on any given night."

"This season, we have a much smarter team," Swank continued. "While the team speed of years past may not be as strong, I feel that we can overcome that by playing smarter basketball. I'm really excited about the chemistry we've already developed and once we play a few games, we should really come together."

This season, the Fighting Scots will look to a very deep and talented blend of returning veterans, transfers and recruits to once again make another run at a championship season. "This year, we may have the most depth since I've been here," said Swank.

Here's a position-by-position look at the '96-97 Fighting Scots:

Guards

At the guard position, Edinboro returns 5-7 sophomore Meaghan Miller, who led the Scots in minutes played during her freshman campaign with 911. Miller also led the team in assists (4.2) and was second in steals (2.2), while averaging 9.7 points per game for the Fighting Scots.

"Meghan had a very successful first season of college basketball," said Swank. "She has improved even more in the off-season. We really are expecting a big year from her this season."

After playing a reserve role her first two seasons, junior Leah Guandolo also returns to the Scots' backcourt and should see additional playing time in 1996-97. "Leah works very hard for our team," said Swank. "She is always improving every time she steps on the court."

After transferring from Clarion University, 5-6 junior Stacie Seneta (Girard H.S.) will join the Fighting Scots this season and will have an immediate impact for Edinboro this year.

"Stacie has a great basketball mind," said Swank. "She knows the game very well and has great court sense. She is a talented three-point shooter who can also handle the ball very well."

Two talented freshmen from Ohio also will begin their first season. 5-7 Cara Peyton (Cincinnati/McAuley) and 5-8 Jessica Rowe (Columbus/St. Francis DeSales) are both tremendous athletes and will give Swank depth at both guard positions. Peyton, who also plays soccer for the Scots, and Rowe are also very good defenders.

"Both Cara and Jessica are hard-nosed competitors," said Swank. "They hustle and play great defense."

1996-97 Season Outlook

Forwards

Leading the frontcourt for Edinboro will be 5-11 junior Heather Gates (Beachwood, OH/Beachwood). In only her second season, Gates led the Scots and the PSAC in rebounding at 10.8 per game. She twice pulled down over 20 rebounds in a single game, with 21 against Indiana-Purdue at Fort Wayne and a 22-rebound effort against Indiana (Pa.). Gates also provided scoring, as she averaged 11 points per game in 1995-96.

"Heather is very intense and is obviously a great rebounder," said Swank. "She has also developed her shot and defensive play and will continue to play a major role for us."

Rhani Rochon (Beachwood, OH/Beachwood), a 5-11 sophomore, also returns. Rochon logged significant playing time as a freshman in 1995-96 and averaged 4.1 points per game and 4.7 rebounds per game. "Rhani is great at drawing fouls. She is one of our best inside players on the team," said Swank.

Tami Piljuga (Pittsburgh/Brentwood H.S.), a 5-11 junior, can play both the inside and the outside game. "Tami can beat you inside and then pop out and hit a three-pointer the next time down the court," said Swank.

Piljuga has developed significantly over the course of the previous two seasons of play and will see a lot of action this winter for the Fighting Scots. She averaged five points a game last season, serving as a spot-starter and top reserve for Edinboro.

Kelly Mankowski (North East, PA/North East), a 5-9 junior, and Megan Fiala (Brookville, PA/Brookville), a 6-0 sophomore, both return after playing reserve roles for the Scots last season. Mankowski, who also plays softball for Edinboro, can play both the forward and guard positions. Fiala can play both inside and outside positions. Both will give Swank depth at forward in 1996-97.

"Both of those players give us strong minutes off the bench," said Swank. "They both have improved since they've been here, and both of them should see increased playing time this season."

Erin Miller (Pittsburgh/Oakland Catholic), a 5-11 junior, can also play both the forward and guard positions. Miller joins the Scots after transferring from the University of Pittsburgh. After playing in the Big East Conference, Miller should adjust quickly to PSAC play.

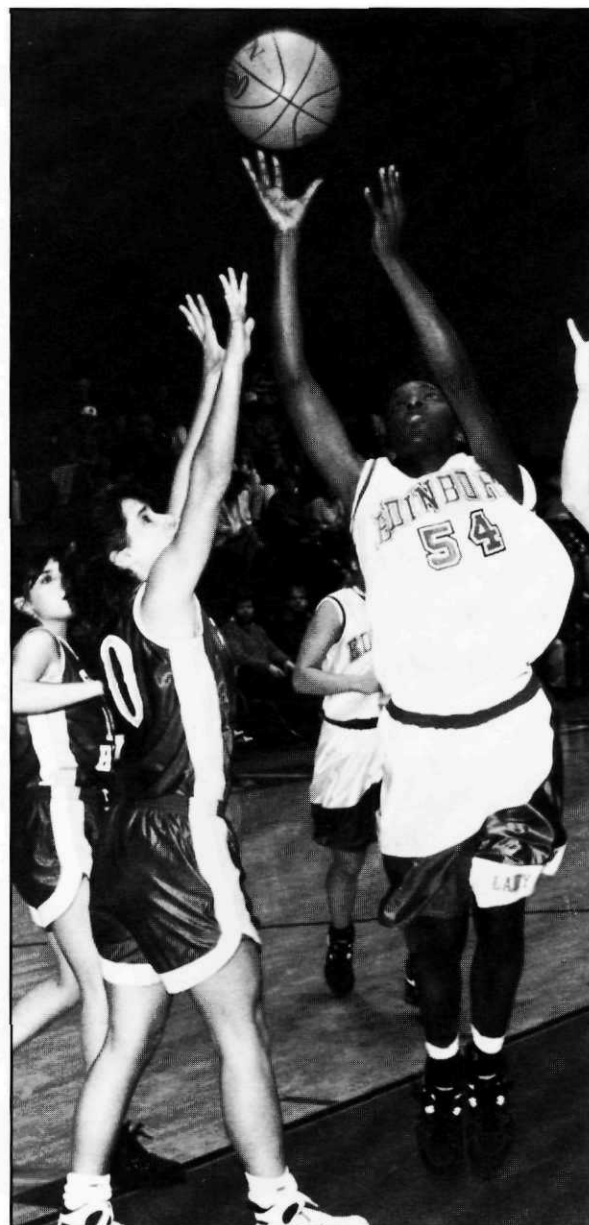
"Erin has tremendous ball control," said Swank. "She has great experience, having played at the University of Pittsburgh. She also played under a coach who won an Olympic gold medal (Suzie McConnell) in high school."

Center

The hero of the Scots' playoff win over Kutztown, Amy Rapelje (Perrysburg, OH/Eastwood) is the only true center on the Fighting Scots. The 6-2 Rapelje (10.3 ppg, 6.9 rpg) exploded for a career-high 41 points and 14 rebounds in Edinboro's PSAC playoff win last March. With improved confidence after last season, expect Rapelje to do even more for the Scots this year. "Amy could become a dominating force in the PSAC," said Swank. "She is a great rebounder and has improved her shot tremendously."

Schedule

Edinboro will once again have a challenging non-conference schedule to go along with the always-competitive PSAC-West. Edinboro will compete in the Northern Kentucky tournament (Dec. 6-7), and the Scots will host two tournaments, the Fighting Scot Invitational (Nov. 30-Dec. 1) and the EUP Holiday Tournament (Dec. 29-30).

Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) has established itself as one of the finest NCAA Division II women's basketball conferences in the nation, with several teams annually representing the league in the NCAA postseason tournament.

Last season, three PSAC schools received invitations to compete in the NCAA Division II national tournament. Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania captured the East Regional title, advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight, and finished as the national runner-up to North Dakota State. The previous year, three PSAC schools competed in the NCAA tournament, with Clarion University earning a berth in the Elite Eight after winning a regional title.

The PSAC is divided into seven-team divisions, with California, Clarion, Edinboro, Indiana, Lock Haven, Shippensburg, and Slippery Rock making up the West, and Bloomsburg, Cheyney, East Stroudsburg, Kutztown, Mansfield, Millersville and West Chester forming the East. The top four teams from the East and West meet in the conference postseason tournament, with the winner earning an automatic NCAA berth.

The PSAC was founded in 1951 for the purpose of promoting and administering the athletic programs at the 14 state teachers colleges in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. From its inception, each conference member selected its own competitive division within the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). In 1980, however, the president's of each school, which make up the league's Board of Directors, voted to reclassify to NCAA Division II membership. Nine schools also elect to participate at the NCAA Division I level in select sports.

In 1983, all member institutions were granted university status and the State System of Higher Education (SSHE) was formed. The system currently has an enrollment in excess of 99,000 students, with an alumni base of 402,000, including 287,000 which reside in the state. The Chancellor of the SSHE is Dr. James H. McCormick.

The PSAC, which is under the leadership of Commissioner Dr. Charles A. 'Tod' Eberle, sponsors championships in 20 men's and women's sports, including baseball, basketball, cross country, field hockey, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball and wrestling. The Board of Directors voted to expand the men's and women's postseason basketball tournament field from four to eight teams in 1996. The top four teams from both the East and West will compete for the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division II national tournament.

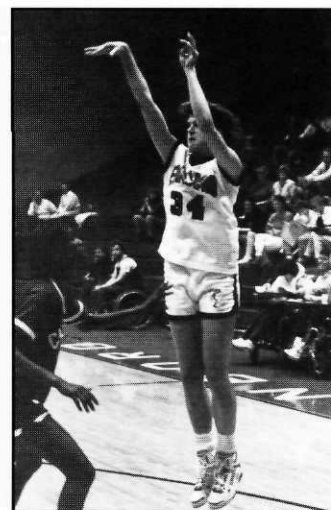
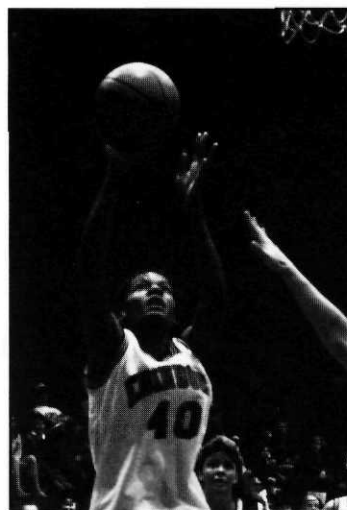
