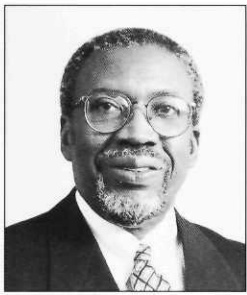

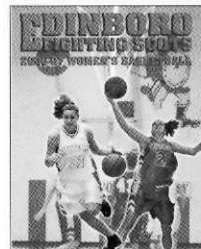

Flexible Roster Key to Success in 2006-07

Edinboro University women's basketball coach Stan Swank has always been one to look at things from an optimistic standpoint. That includes his basketball teams. So it's no surprise that as Swank enters his 20th season in charge of the Fighting Scots, he is filled with excitement and promise.

The Fighting Scots come off a 21-10 finish in 2005-06, the most wins since the 1997-98 edition went 23-8. The similarities don't end there. Despite qualifying for the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Tournament six times in the last seven years, Edinboro had not reached the PSAC title game since 1997-98. And that was also the last year the Fighting Scots were invited to the NCAA Division II Playoffs. And lest you think there was much losing involved during that period, Edinboro had averaged 16 wins over the previous seven years, with just two losing campaigns (1999-2000 and 2001-02).

The good news for the Fighting Scots is the return of two starters and seven letterwinners. The bad news - the loss of three starters who played a tremendous role in the team's success over the last four years, and a hellacious schedule.

Edinboro must replace Callie Iorfido,

Maria DiVecchio and Jessi Montie, a trio that combined for 2,807 career points, 1,291 career rebounds, and 866 career assists. Most of the assists belonged to Iorfido, an All-American in 2005-06 who departs as the career leader in assists with 682. That figure also ranks second all-time in the PSAC. DiVecchio, meanwhile, finished her career ranking 12th in career scoring (1,214 points) and tenth in career rebounds (590).

As for the schedule, Swank notes, "I think we have a very good basketball team. The one aspect that I look at as a big concern is our schedule. Our schedule is vicious. It might be the toughest schedule we've played since I've been here."

Swank proceeded to rattle off the likes of Charleston(WV), Glenville State, West Liberty and Pitt-Johnstown. That's before taking into account the PSAC, highlighted by a pair of games against a California(Pa.) team which was 26-5, plus Indiana(Pa.) (19-9). All told, Edinboro's opponents compiled a 440-324 record.

With all of that staring Swank in the face, he still feels good about his team. The biggest reason is a versatile roster which all of a sudden features plenty of height. That didn't necessarily translate into better rebounding, as the Fighting Scots still ranked near the bottom of the PSAC in rebounding margin. But Edinboro led the PSAC in blocked shots and ranked 13th nationally. That height, with three players listed at 6'3" or taller, translated into opponents shooting just 39.0 percent from the floor.

"I really like our team because we have a lot of different components," stressed Swank. "We have a good returning nucleus, with the ability to play inside or outside. I think our number one thing is our versatility. We can play a lot of styles -- slow-down, fast-paced. We have a lot of flexibility in terms of our players. We can move them around a lot. It's just yet to be seen if we can do it intellectually."

Swank also raves about the team's chemistry. He has found that the seven returning letterwinners and the group of three newcomers have meshed well, both on the court and off. In addition, Swank feels the newcomers are advanced enough to make an immediate impact.

"One of the neat things about this team is I wouldn't hesitate to put anybody out on the floor," Swank stated. "Some of our returning kids have improved, and our freshmen aren't as much a development project. As freshmen they're ready to be thrown to the wolves. They'll do fine."

With the schedule Swank has assembled, they definitely are being thrown to the wolves. It all gets underway on Friday, November 17 when Edinboro plays in the Millersville Tournament. The Fighting Scots open with Goldey Beacom, then on the sec-

ond day face North Carolina-Pembroke. Three days later Edinboro plays a rematch against a Charleston(WV) team that ended the Fighting Scots season with a 71-62 defeat in the NCAA Division II East Regional, and advanced to the Elite Eight before finishing 30-3.

Edinboro plays in two other tournaments. The Fighting Scots will face West Liberty, an NCAA qualifier at 24-7 a year ago, in the opening round of the Avalon Classic in Erie, Pa. on December 8-9, with Gannon and Central State rounding out the field. The 2006 portion of the season concludes on December 29-30 with the Edinboro Classic. After a second meeting with West Liberty, Edinboro opposes a Glenville State team which went 30-3 and lost to Charleston in the East Region title game.

Here's a position-by-position look at the 2006-07 Fighting Scots:

Backcourt

The good news is the return of Kelly Calderone, a two-time All-PSAC West performer who played one season at the University at Buffalo before transferring to Edinboro. A 5'7" senior, Calderone has led Edinboro in scoring the last two seasons, a year ago averaging 16.0 ppg. She has also been Edinboro's top three-point threat, making 58 of 166 in 2005-06. The 58 three-pointers made were the ninth-highest total in school history, while the 166 attempts ranked eighth. Calderone was a first-team All-PSAC West choice a year ago after earning second team honors in 2004-05.

Calderone ranked fourth in the PSAC in scoring, and ranked ninth in the conference in steals (58) and three-point field goal percentage (38.0 pct.). She excelled the most at the free throw line, where she set a school record while ranking first in the PSAC and tenth nationally at 87.9 percent. She made 145 of 165 attempts at the charity stripe, with the free throws made ranking third all-time. In addition, she was second on the team in assists (73).

Calderone enters her senior year ranked 22nd in career scoring with 947 points, and including her one season at Buffalo, has 1,079 career points. She has a career-best 86.5 percent free throw percentage, along with ranking fifth in career three-pointers made (117) and seventh in career three-pointers attempted (323).

"Kelly will be our leader," Swank pointed out. "Being an all-conference player, she's looked at as our leader, our 'go-to' player. She wants it on her shoulders. She's willing to take that kind of responsibility. It's her senior year, and she wants to finish her career strong."

Now comes the bad news. The Fighting Scots must figure out how to replace Callie Iorfido, Edinboro's all-time assist leader, with a total of 682 that also ranks second all-time

in the PSAC. Iorfido was named the PSAC West Athlete of the Year and earned honorable mention Kodak/WBCA All-American honors. Iorfido's leadership and ballhandling skills will be hard to replace.

Swank feels he has the answer in Lacey Heiar, a junior college transfer from Williston State. A 5'4" junior, Heiar helped Williston State to a 22-7 record a year ago. She averaged 11.3 ppg, while leading the Lady Tetons with 132 assists and 33 steals. Heiar made 75 of 201 three-pointers as a sophomore.

"Lacey will be our replacement," Swank commented. "She'll take on the personality of a point guard. Lacey and Callie are two different kinds of players. They have different strengths and weaknesses. It will make us a different type of team. Lacey is an outside threat. She's a very intelligent player who understands the game. She comes from a rich basketball area and tradition. Most of all, she's used to winning."

In addition to Heiar, Calderone has played point guard in the past, and freshman Samantha Reimer can play the point or on the wing. Reimer is 5'7" and a former standout at Altoona (Pa.) High School. Like Heiar, Reimer has been part of winning programs. The Altoona teams she played on had a 78-10 record, including 24-6 her senior season. She averaged 17.9 ppg, while being named the *Altoona Mirror* Player of the Year, in addition to earning Mountain Athletic Conference Player of the Year honors. Reimer's 537 points were the second-highest in school history, and she departed as Altoona's all-time leading scorer with 1,265 points.

"Samantha can play the one or two spot, although she is probably better at the two," related Swank. "She's an excellent scoring threat who can drive and draw fouls, or can shoot it from the outside. Defensively, she's a hard-nosed, tough, get in your face player."

The team's versatility is clearly evident in the backcourt, where in addition to Calderone and Reimer at the two spot, Jen Boykin is also available. A 5'7" junior, Boykin isn't much of an offensive threat, scoring just 11 points in 19 games a year ago. But she is an excellent defensive player.

"Jen worked over the summer and improved a great deal," Swank pointed out. "We've narrowed what we want her to do. That has helped her game."

Rae Sherred will line up at the other wing spot. In many instances the 5'9" junior would be remembered for a strange play at the end of the PSAC Championship game against California(Pa.). With the game tied at 59-59 with seven seconds left to play, she came up with a steal, but then called a timeout. The Fighting Scots were out of timeouts, however, and were assessed a technical foul. California(Pa.) went on to make four free throws in the final seven seconds to clinch a 63-59 win.

The class that Sherred showed afterwards, however, spoke wonders. She faced the media at the post game press conference afterwards and addressed the curious play. Her class and

maturity led the NCAA to award her with the NCAA Sportsmanship Award.

However, Sherred's play down the stretch, along with her improvement during the course of the year, is what will be remembered most. She averaged 6.0 ppg, and 3.5 rpg, while making 30 of 82 three-pointers. But over the last five games she averaged just under ten points per game. In fact, in the PSAC Championships she had a career-high 17 points in the semifinal win over Kutztown.

"Rae brings a lot of experience and maturity," Swank stated. "She came on real strong at the end of the year. She has the ability to shoot the three-pointer or post up. Rae does a lot of things that don't show up in the newspaper."

Kelsey Conklin has been a pleasant surprise in early workouts. Swank was high on the 6'1" freshman from nearby General McLane High School to begin with, but is even more impressed now. "I think Kelsey is our biggest surprise so far," admitted Swank. "In early practices she's looked better than we expected. She was good in high school, but I think the college game suits her even better. With her track background, she has the ability to run the floor, but she has nice size at 6'1"."

Conklin was a first team All-Region 4 selection as a senior, helping the Lancers to a 20-5 record. She averaged 10.7 ppg, and 7.9 rpg, and shot 51 percent from the floor. Conklin was coached by former Edinboro standout Meghan Miller Meabon, and finished her career with over 1,000 points.

Frontcourt

Two years ago Swank emphasized the need for more height. With that in mind, he brought in three players who were 6'3" or taller. After varied contributions a year ago, he expects the trio to play a larger role this year.

Most prominent a year ago was Agnieszka Michalow, a junior college transfer from the College of DuPage. The senior sat out the 2004-05 season, then stepped in a year ago and started 27 of 31 games. At 6'3", Michalow has the ability to change shots inside, but yet offensively she is more comfortable facing the basket, with three-point range. She averaged 11.1 ppg, and a team-leading 6.6 rpg, while making 26 of 82 three-pointers. Michalow blocked a school-record 81 shots, ranking second in the PSAC and 14th in Division II.

"Agnes creates a mismatch," noted Swank. "She will play the four for us, but she also has the ability to play the wing with her shooting ability."

Michalow's versatility is one reason she can play the wing, but another is the presence of sophomores Kim Mardis and Jessica Trotter. Both are still raw, but at 6'4" and 6'5", respectively, they provide plenty of size inside.

"Both have a definite impact," Swank pointed out. "They change shots. Both need to score more and become more offensive threats. Kim has a great deal of strength and is developing how she controls that strength.

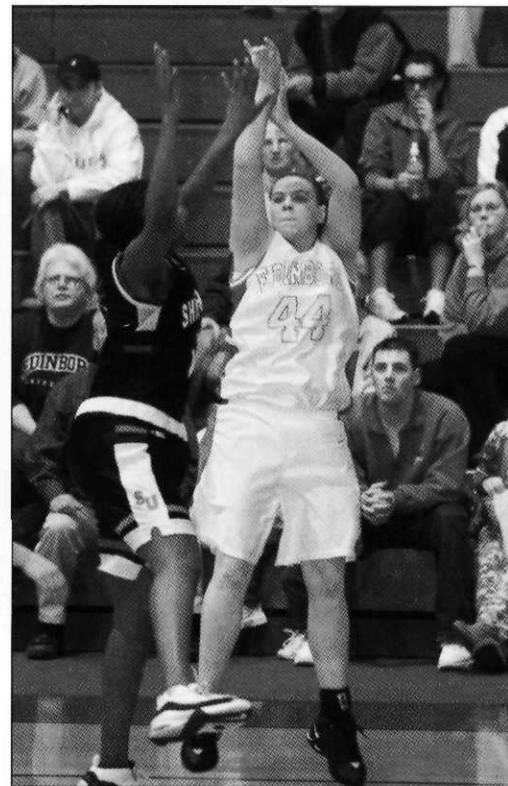
She is more under control and not fouling. Jess is more of a finesse situation. She has developed a little baby hook. She came on late in the year."

Mardis played in 27 contests, averaging 0.9 ppg, and 1.4 rpg. She blocked 12 shots. Trotter played in 25 games, with 0.5 ppg, and 1.6 rpg. She blocked 18 shots, an average of more than one per every ten minutes, but made just 4 of 27 field goal attempts (14.8 pct.).

Swank also feels the presence of assistant coach Jordie Soso, who played two seasons at Memphis, will greatly assist in their development in post play. Given his belief in their roles, that is important. "I think the key for us will be if Jess and Kim can give us quality minutes," admitted Swank. "They're in better basketball shape. They have improved around the basket, and can improve even more. They can have a strong impact on rebounding, especially on the offensive boards, getting second and third shots."

Rachel Johnson doesn't possess the impressive size of the trio, but the junior could be a key part of the frontcourt. A thin 5'11", she is an athletic player who always seems to be around the ball. Johnson averaged 2.0 ppg, and 1.5 rpg, in 29 games last season.

"Rachel has really looked strong," Swank assessed. "She has been scoring a lot more. She's very quick, and defensively helps us. She runs the floor well."

Stan Swank

20th Year
Rutgers '73



Now in his 20th season, Stan Swank has brought a winning tradition to Edinboro University. The winningest coach in Fighting Scot women's basketball history, Swank has had 15 winning seasons during his 19-year tenure while compiling a 328-205 overall mark. He currently ranks 30th in Division II among active coaches in wins with 328. Swank and West Chester coach Deirdre Kane have been at their respective PSAC schools longer than any other coaches in the conference.

Edinboro women's basketball has enjoyed eight 20-win seasons, with Swank directing the Fighting Scots to six of those. All told, six of his Fighting Scot editions have reached the NCAA Division II playoffs, with Edinboro reaching the PSAC postseason tournament thirteen times. On seven of those occasions the Fighting Scots have advanced to the championship game, winning the PSAC title in 1989-90. In the NCAA Division II Tournament, he has guided Edinboro to the Final 32 twice, the Sweet 16 and the Elite Eight.

The 2005-06 Edinboro edition added to Swank's legacy. The Fighting Scots advanced to the PSAC Championship game for the first time since the 1997-98 season, winning playoff contests over Indiana(Pa.) and Kutztown. Edinboro met California(Pa.) in the title game, and battled the defending champions down to the wire before the Vulcans hit four free throws in the final seven seconds for a 63-59 win. It was Edinboro's ninth

appearance in the PSAC Playoffs in the last eleven years.

Edinboro advanced to the NCAA Playoffs for the first time since that 1997-98 campaign. Charleston(WV) handed the Fighting Scots a 71-62 defeat, ending the Boro's season at 21-10. The 21 wins represented the most since 23 wins in 1997-98.

Two years ago Swank's Fighting Scots posted their second straight 18-10 ledger, finishing fourth in the PSAC West. Edinboro jumped out to a 14-2 record, capped by an eight-game winning streak. The year before Edinboro surprised the rest of the PSAC by going 18-10 to finish third in the PSAC West. Three of the losses came to national champion California(Pa.), along with setbacks to nationally-ranked West Texas A&M and Emporia State.

After enduring just his fourth losing season in 2001-02 with a 12-14 record, Swank guided his 2002-03 edition to a 16-12 record. Picked to finish fifth in the preseason coaches poll, the Fighting Scots tied for third to return to postseason action.

In 2000-01, Swank led a young outfit which had to replace Jessica Rowe and Marin Hightower to a surprising 17-10 finish. The veteran coach employed a variety of tactics to take advantage of his entire roster, including inserting his entire second team enmasse for the starters. The Scots qualified for the PSAC Tournament. Despite a losing record in 1999-2000 (13-14), the Fighting Scots reached the PSAC Tournament.

Swank came to Edinboro in 1987 after an outstanding career as head coach at Parkland (IL) Junior College, where he recorded an impressive 104-20 overall mark.

His first Edinboro squad finished 14-11 overall, barely missing the PSAC playoffs. Building off the previous year's success, the 1988-89 team captured the PSAC Western Division crown, compiling a 21-6 overall record. Swank was chosen PSAC West Coach of the Year as the program won 20 games for the first time in nearly a decade. The Scots repeated as PSAC West champions in 1989-90 and won the PSAC tournament for the first time ever. Edinboro also advanced to the NCAA Division II national tournament, winning its first NCAA playoff game in history to advance to the Sweet 16. The team finished with a school-record 27 wins, and Swank was named PSAC West Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

Swank's 1991-92 team finished 22-8 overall and was the PSAC runner-up. The Scots also made another appearance in the NCAA

national tournament. The Fighting Scots again finished second in the PSAC in '92-93 and appeared in the national tournament for the third time in four years. After a two-year hiatus, Swank's 1995-96 team returned to the postseason, as the Scots finished 15-13 overall. Edinboro beat PSAC East tri-champion Kutztown in the opening round of the PSAC tournament.

Edinboro was the PSAC West co-champion and the PSAC tournament runner-up in 1996-97, with Swank once again earning Coach of the Year honors. The Scots then posted three victories in the NCAA tournament to win the East Regional title and earn a berth in the NCAA Elite Eight. Edinboro finished the year 24-9, the second highest win total in school history.

The '97-98 Fighting Scot squad also made a run in the NCAA Playoffs after finishing as the runnerup in the PSAC Tournament. Edinboro defeated the University of Charleston before suffering an 88-78 loss to PSAC-rival Shippensburg in the NCAA's.

The Fighting Scots jumped out to a 9-0 start in 1998-99 and were ranked 16th in the USA Today WBCA Division II poll. Ravaged

by injuries, Edinboro dropped 10 of its next 17 contests, finishing the year 16-10 and missing the PSAC playoffs.

During his tenure Swank has had 39 All-PSAC performers, two PSAC West Rookie of the Year recipients, and seven Kodak All-Americans. He has received numerous honors, being named the PSAC West Coach of the Year four times and Edinboro University's Coach of the Year twice.

Swank earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Education at Purdue University in 1976. He completed work on his master's degree in Educational Administration at Purdue in 1979. He embarked on his head coaching career at Fisher High School in Illinois, where his boys team compiled a 39-14 record in two seasons. In 1983, he moved on to Parkland Junior College, where his Cobra team won four consecutive sectional championships and finished second twice, and third once, in the NJCAA Region 24.

Swank, his wife Gail have two sons, Stan II, 23, and Benjamin, 19, and reside in Edinboro. Benjamin is a freshman on the football team at the Naval Academy Preparatory School.

Boro Rides Seniors to NCAA Playoff Berth

For several years the Edinboro women's basketball team has been lacking in height. That was not the case in 2005-06, as the roster featured three players who were 6'3" or taller, undoubtedly the tallest team in school history.

Yet it was the smallest player on the roster who played the biggest role. Callie Iorfido barely stretched 5'5", but her competitive spirit was every bit as impressive as her ability to distribute the ball. Despite her lack of size, she made everyone around her better.

Her never-say-die attitude was never on display better than the regular season finale against Shippensburg. With the Lady Raiders leading by 12 points in the second half, Iorfido rallied the Fighting Scots.

The Boro point guard scored Edinboro's final nine points in regulation as Edinboro rallied from a 72-64 deficit with 3:53 to play to send the game into overtime. In overtime she contributed four more points as Edinboro came away with an 89-83 win.

When the afternoon had ended, Iorfido had posted her second triple-double of the season, and third in Edinboro history, finishing with career-highs of 29 points and 14 rebounds, along with 10 assists.

The victory propelled a Fighting Scot team that had lost three of its previous four contests into the PSAC Tournament. Playing at Indiana (Pa.) in the first round, the third-seeded Fighting Scots upset the Indians, the second seed, 65-54. Kelly Calderone led the way with 23 points. In the quarterfinals Edinboro met Kutztown, and it was no contest. Jumping out to a quick lead, the Fighting Scots posted a 77-46 win over the Golden Bears as Rae Sherrad scored a career-high 17 points.

Edinboro met old rival and PSAC powerhouse California (Pa.) on its homecourt in the finals. It marked the first time Edinboro had reached the championship game since 1998.

Losers of twelve straight to the Vulcans, the Fighting Scots led for much of the game. With the contest tied at 59-59 with seven seconds

remaining, Sherrad came up with a steal, but then called time out when Edinboro had none. The Fighting Scots were assessed a technical foul and the ensuing free throws led to a 63-59 decision for Cal.

The loss mattered little, as a day later Edinboro was selected for its first trip to the NCAA Playoffs since 1997-98. As for Sherrad, she would go on to earn an NCAA Sportsmanship Award. Faced with the task of facing the media after the championship game, she bravely answered questions regarding the incident.

Edinboro would suffer a 71-62 loss to a Charleston (WV) team that would go on to win the East Regional and reach the Elite Eight. The 21-10 ledger marked the most wins since the 1997-98 squad went 23-8, and was the sixth in head coach Stan Swank's 19 years at the helm.

Iorfido would go on to be named the PSAC West Athlete of the Year and later earn honorable mention Kodak/WBCA All-American honors. It marked the first time a Fighting Scot had earned All-American accolades since Jessica Rowe was a first team selection and Marin Hightower earned honorable mention honors in 1999-00.

Iorfido was the most recognized of three seniors who helped Edinboro win 73 games during their four years. She fell short of reaching 1,000 points for her career with 932, but she set the school record for career assists with 682. That figure also ranks second all-time in the PSAC. In addition, Iorfido finished with 283 career steals, a figure which ranks fourth all-time at Edinboro.

After missing several games due to an ankle injury as a junior, and seeing her scoring average drop from 14.1 ppg. to 8.8 ppg., Maria DiVecchio enjoyed a strong senior campaign. The 5'11" forward averaged 11.9 ppg. and 5.9 rpg. She concluded her career with 1,214 points, good for 12th all-time, along with 590 rebounds, the tenth-highest career total.

Jessi Montie didn't put up the numbers that Iorfido and DiVecchio did, but she was so valuable that she appeared in 114 career games, the fifth-highest total in school history. In her first year as a starter, Montie averaged 7.3 ppg. and 4.4 rpg. She finished her career with 661 points.

Calderone joined Iorfido as a member of the PSAC West first team. A junior guard, she led the Fighting Scots in scoring for the second straight season at 16.0 ppg., and not only set a school record for highest free throw percentage at 87.9 percent, but also broke the PSAC standard. Calderone enters her senior season needing 53 points to reach 1,000 for her career at Edinboro. She has already scored 1,000 career points, counting one season at Buffalo.

Agnes Michalow proved a solid addition to the Fighting Scots. A junior college transfer who sat out the previous season, the 6'3" junior averaged 11.1 ppg. and a team-leading 6.6 rpg. The native of Poland also set a school record for blocked shots with 81.

The 2005-06 campaign began with five straight wins, beginning with back-to-back triumphs in the Kutztown Classic. The Fighting Scots weren't as fortunate in their second tournament, losing both contests in their own Edinboro Classic. The losses came to a pair of WVIAC powerhouses, West Liberty State and Glenville State.

Edinboro entered PSAC West action with a 12-3, and opened league play with a 68-61 win at Slippery Rock. Following a loss to California (Pa.), the Fighting Scots ran off three more wins to move to 16-4.

Its playoff chances suddenly dimmed, however, with losses in four of the next five games. The stretch was culminated by a 75-72 overtime defeat at home against Lock Haven, as the Fighting Scots squandered an eight-point halftime lead.

While suddenly clinging to postseason hopes, Edinboro snapped a three-game losing streak with a 68-61 win at Clarion to clinch a Western Division playoff berth with one game to go. The rest they left up to Iorfido.

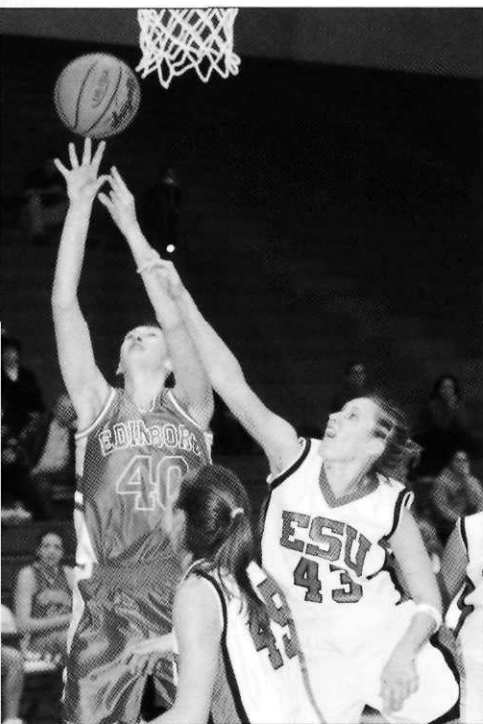

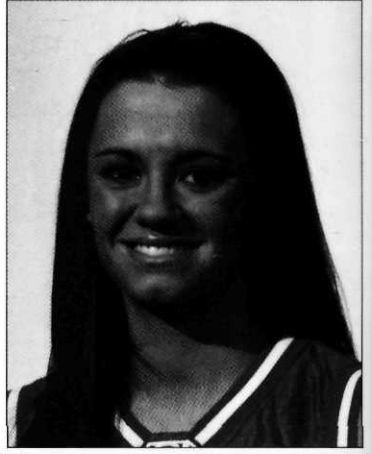

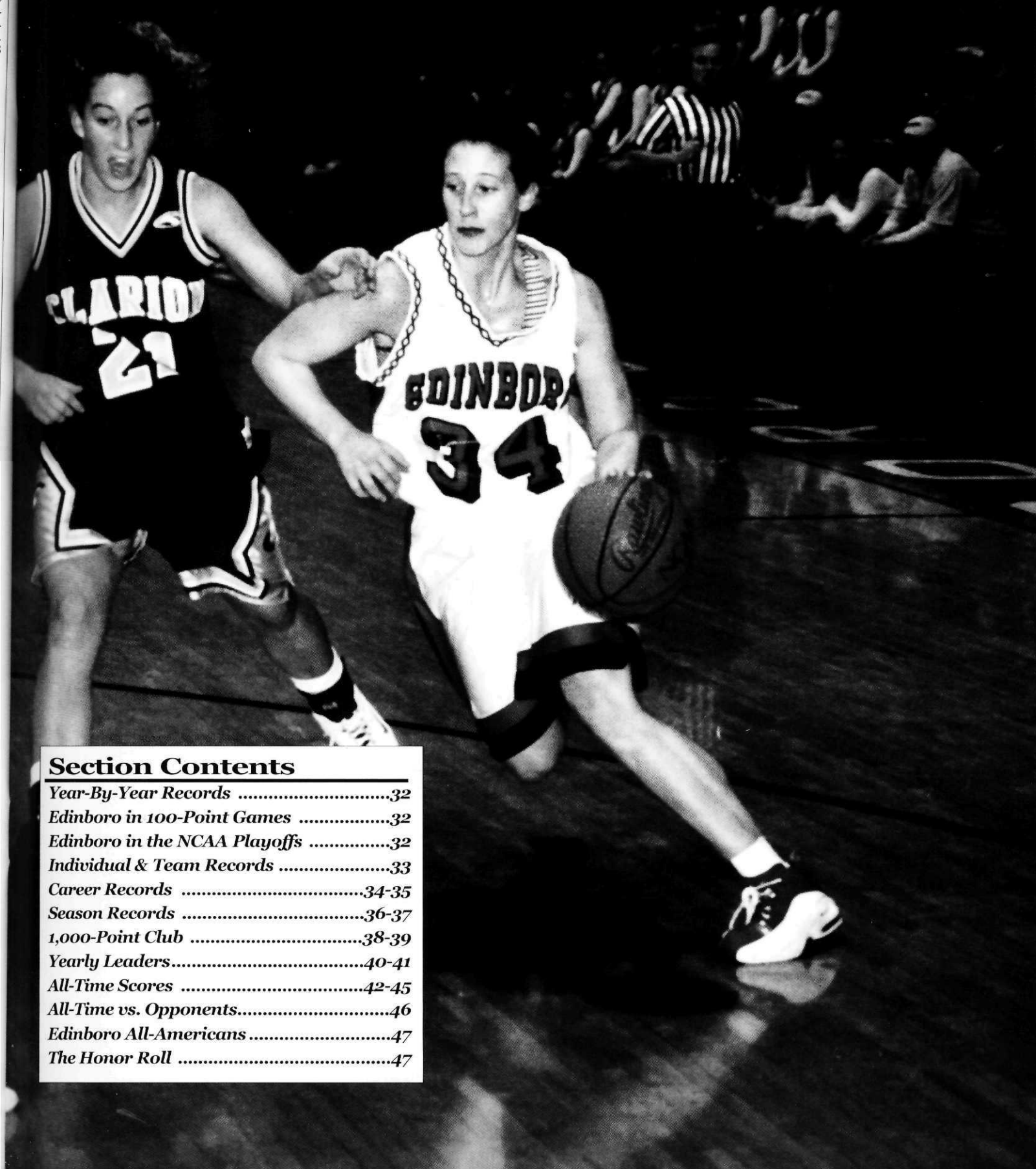
Callie Iorfido Earns Kodak/WBCA All-American Honors

Iorfido was also named the PSAC West Athlete of the Year and was a first team All-PSAC West choice after earning second team honors as a junior. The 5'5" guard finished as Edinboro's second-leading scorer at 12.5 ppg., and also added 5.1 rpg. More importantly, she set a school record with 249 assists while turning the ball over just 89 times. She led the PSAC in both assists and steals, finishing with 95 in the latter category. Edinboro had had just one triple-double in its history prior to this past season, when Iorfido

accomplished the feat twice. The first came against Seton Hill (20 points, 11 rebounds, 14 assists), followed by 29 points, 14 rebounds and 10 assists in her final home appearance vs. Shippensburg. Iorfido continued Edinboro's history of standout point guards. While not taking over as the starter until her junior season, she concluded her career with a school-record 682 assists, despite missing the final seven games of the 2003-04 campaign due to an injury. That figure is second all-time in the PSAC. In addition, Iorfido finished with 283 career steals, a figure which ranks fourth all-time at Edinboro. She fell just short of reaching 1,000 points for her career with 932.

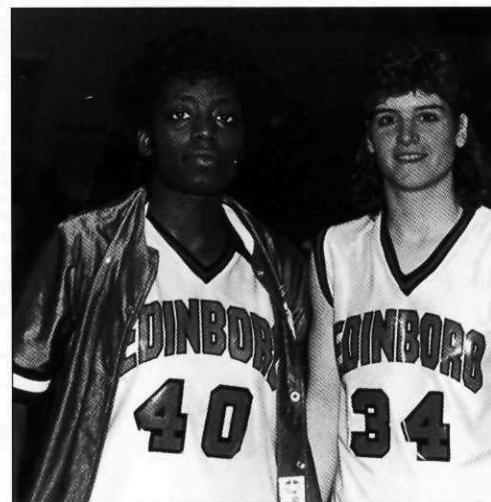

This is Edinboro University



Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is the largest comprehensive four-year university in northwestern Pennsylvania. Its 585-acre campus is home to nearly 8,000 students studying in more than 100 academic programs. The University's programs in art, criminal justice, and speech language pathology, among others, have earned regional and national recognition and accolades and the University has been named a "College of Distinction" by Student Horizons, Inc. In 2003 the University's institutional accreditation with the Commission on Higher Education Middle State Association of Colleges and Schools was reaffirmed with commendation for ten years. In the 2006-07 academic year,

the University is celebrating its Sesquicentennial recognizing 150 years of service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and beyond.

Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie - Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 500,000 bound volumes and 1.4 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

The main campus also includes a modern University Center that is undergoing a \$17 million renovation, planetarium, observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and television stations, health center, counseling center, and much more - all accessible for people with disabilities. The Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of its kind in the nation.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including five residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learning floors - all are wired for voice, video and data.

Edinboro University also operates centers in Erie and Meadville. Edinboro University in Erie - The Porreco Center is a beautiful 27-acre campus that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for small conferences, business meetings, and special events. Edinboro University in Meadville is located in the city's historic Bessemer Building.

Dr. Frank G. Pogue

President, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania

Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Dr. Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor for student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central

Administration in Albany, serving in that position for 10 years. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, President Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY at Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. He serves as a member of the American Council on Education (ACE) Commission on Women in Higher Education which provides counsel to ACE on policies and concerns related to expanded roles and equal opportunity for women in higher education. He is a member of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Millennium Leadership Initiative (Chair), Committee on Professional Development, and Christa McAuliffe Selection Committee. He was appointed in 2003 to the International Association of University Presidents Commission on Disarmament Education, Conflict Resolution and Peace. Since 1984, Dr. Pogue has served on the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA). Currently, he serves on an advisory panel to address accreditation issues related to "affiliated" candidate and accredited institutions. Recently, he served as President for the MSA Board of Trustees and as a member of its Executive Committee, and he is a former vice chair of the Commission's Executive Committee. Dr. Pogue also serves on the Board

of Directors of Pennsylvania Campus Compact. He served for two years as chairperson of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) Commission for the Universities and Commission of Presidents Executive Committee. He is a member of the Executive Board of A Community of Agile Partners in Education (CAPE). In October 1996, Dr. Pogue was appointed by then Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge to the Governor's Commission on Academic Standards. In November 2002, he was appointed co-chair of the Higher Education Committee of Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell's Transition Team. In May 2004, he was appointed to the Pennsylvania Department of Education's Higher Education Advisory Board.

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the Boards of Directors for the Meadville Area Industrial Commission, the Erie Regional Chamber and Growth Partnership, and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra. In 2005, he was elected to the Executive Committee of the Civic Coordinating Committee of Erie County. Additionally, he serves on the Boards of Corporators for the Hamot Health Foundation, the Saint Vincent Health Center, and the Meadville Medical Center. He is a member of the Erie Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee and an Honorary Member of the Erie Wolves Club. Dr. Pogue was chairperson of the Erie County Millennium Commission, the Erie County State Employees Combined Appeal (SECA) campaign in 2001 and 2002, and of the Erie Day School's Adopt-A-Scholar scholarship program (2000-01 and 2002-03). He was also a member of the Erie Mayor's Task Force on Public Safety. Dr. Pogue has served on the boards of directors for the United Way of Erie County and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

Dr. Pogue was honored by the Erie Area Chamber of Commerce with the Louis J. Tullio Community Service Award. The Greater Erie Community Action Committee (GECAC) honored him in 2004 with the Othello Myers Johnson Human Services Award and with the Paul P. Martin Community Service Award in 2000. In 1999, the Distinguished Service Award for Leadership and Vision was presented to him by the SUNY at Albany Council of Trustees.

Dr. Pogue has shared his experiences and expertise in Edinboro University classrooms via guest lecturer presentations. He has also taught a course titled, "Special Topics in Sociology" for the Department of Sociology. He continues to enjoy working in the classroom environment.

Since becoming president, Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.
