

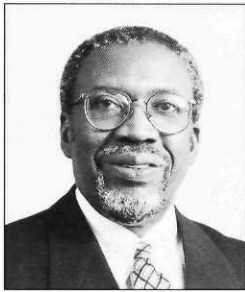

2004-05 Season Preview

Winning Nucleus in Place for Swank's Squad

In 17 years Edinboro University women's basketball coach Stan Swank has suffered just four losing seasons. A year ago the Fighting Scots finished with an 18-10 record, reaching the PSAC Playoffs for the tenth time in Swank's tenure. There's no question that Swank has had more talented teams, but it was a team with great leadership, plenty of heart, and a never-say-die attitude, overcoming a series of injuries.

So when Swank talks about how much he likes his 2004-05 team, people better sit up and take notice. "I'm very excited," exclaimed Swank, "mainly because we have a great nucleus back. It's a team with a real good work ethic, tremendous attitude, good chemistry, and a strong determination to be successful."

While Swank talks of intangibles, it still takes talent to win. That's where seven letter-winners, including a pair of key players who missed lengthy periods due to injury, come into play. "I think towards the end of the season Megan Zitner was coming on. She's back to where she was before the ACL surgery. Getting Jodie (Calderone) back, who didn't

play in a conference game, and getting Callie (Iorfido) back, who missed a great deal of February, is key. When you add in Maria DiVecchio, an all-conference player, there's a real good nucleus there. Another player who has a great deal of experience is Jessie Montie.

"Throw in the addition of Kelly Calderone, a Division I transfer with game experience already at a high level, and it provides us with a great deal of excitement for this year. I think we're ready to take off."

The Fighting Scots must replace the heart and soul of the team in point guard Courtney Thompson. Thompson was a four-year starter who departed as the second all-time leader in career assists. Her true value was as a playmaker, defender and leader.

"We'll miss Courtney as far as her playing intelligence on the court, but I think we'll make up for it with athleticism," stressed Swank. "My biggest concern is losing Courtney's intelligence and stability. She kept the team under control and played a cerebral game."

For the last two years Edinboro's biggest concern has been rebounding. A year ago the Fighting Scots had a -7.4 rebounding margin, but that's better than the year before when the figure was -9.9. "I'm not as concerned about the rebounding as I was in the past. We still have the same size, but I think Anneke (Chewning) and Danielle (Lantzy) have more of a nose for rebounding than in the past, and I think Megan Zitner brings strong rebounding."

The 2004-05 schedule also bears an interesting twist. Eight of the first ten games are on the road, with the Fighting Scots playing in a pair of challenging tournaments. Edinboro opens the season November 19-20 in the Millersville Classic. The first night finds the Fighting Scots opposing a strong Barton team, an NCAA playoff team a year ago, followed by a contest against St. Anselm. After playing back-to-back home games against local rivals Gannon and Mercyhurst, the Scots hit the highways for a month. The six-game road trip ends with the Mountain Cat Classic at Pitt-Johnstown.

"I think this schedule is stronger than last year," Swank emphasized. "I thought last year's was really strong. We open with Barton, an NCAA Tournament team that won 24 games a year ago, then play St. Anselm, who has an excellent program. After Christmas we play in the UP

Tournament, and after the New Year we have West Virginia State, who some people think might be one of the best teams in the region. They're loaded."

Guards

As has been the case in recent years, the Scots should feature strong guard play. Callie Iorfido will step in at point guard for Thompson, while Jodi Calderone returns on a wing after missing half of the season due to a broken hand. The former high school teammates will provide the Fighting Scots with outstanding defense and ballhandling.

Iorfido played in 21 games a year ago, with five starts. She was sorely missed after going down with an injury and missing the last seven games. The 5'5" junior averaged 7.3 ppg. and had 100 assists while turning the ball over just 56 times. She finished second on the team in steals (57) despite missing a quarter of the season. Iorfido ranked among the PSAC leaders in assists and assist-to-turnover ratio prior to her injury.

"Callie will run the show," exclaimed Swank. "The ball will be in her hands. I feel extremely confident with her. She's a great ballhandler, she's shooting the ball well, and she provides us with excellent speed and quickness. Plus she's intelligent with the ball. Callie's a very exciting player to watch."

The Calderone sisters are expected to open at the wings. Jodi was greatly missed after going down with a broken hand 14 games into the season. With the loss of the 5'5" senior, Edinboro was deprived of its top three-point threat, not to mention another solid ballhandler and defender. She was just starting to snap out of a shooting slump when the injury occurred. She averaged 8.9 ppg. and had made 28 of 108 three-pointers. Jodi ranks fourth in career three-pointers made (128) and third in career three-pointers attempted (416).

Kelly is Jodi's younger sister and a transfer from the University at Buffalo, where she played a year ago as a freshman. She provides the Fighting Scots with another three-point threat to spread the floor and make up for the team's lack of height. The 5'8" sophomore appeared in 26 games at Buffalo, with three starts. She averaged 5.1 ppg. with 26 assists, and made 18 of 61 three-pointers. Like her sister, she is an excellent free throw shooter, making 42 of 49 (85.7 pct.).

"Jodi and Kelly will play at the guard spots, and both also have the potential to handle the ball to relieve Callie," emphasized Swank. "We're looking for big things from Jodi. It's her senior year, and I think she's hungry and ready. Missing her last year really hurt us down the stretch. She's an excel-

lent player.

"Kelly has a chance to be a tremendous player for us. She has the potential to be a big-time scorer. We expect great things. I think she'll have an immediate impact."

Jessi Montie will also see plenty of time at a wing position. She made great strides a year ago, particularly on the offensive end of the court, where she boosted her scoring average from 3.8 ppg. as a freshman to 7.0 ppg. The 5'9" junior from nearby McDowell High School added 22 assists and 36 steals.

"We're counting on Jessi to be strong," Swank commented. "She came up with some big plays last year. She should be a very consistent, very strong player for us this year."

Freshman Jen Boykin has been a pleasant surprise in preseason drills and has worked her way into the backcourt rotation. The 5'8" guard is another local product from Central High School. "Jen has great athleticism," stated Swank. "She will definitely see time, and will have an impact defensively."

Mandie Iorfido, the younger sister of Callie Iorfido, adds further depth. A 5'7" freshman, she is a walk-on who is another product of Amridge High School. In addition to playing basketball, she is a standout softball player who is expected to make a major impact this spring.

Forwards

Maria DiVecchio was Edinboro's best interior player a year ago. The 5'11" junior earned second team All-PSAC West honors a year ago after averaging 14.1 ppg., the only player in double figures. She finished second in rebounding (4.9 rpg.), and shot better than fifty percent from the floor for the second straight year (51.3 percent). She also shot 82.5 percent from the line (85 of 103), and led the Scots with 14 blocked shots. DiVecchio has scored 653 points in two seasons.

"Maria brings stability in the paint, having played two years there and earning all-conference honors," commented Swank. "She understands what it takes. She's extremely consistent."

Anneke Chewning and Danielle Lantzy will see action in the middle, as well. Chewning is a former transfer from West Virginia Wesleyan who figures to benefit with a year in the system. The 5'11" senior saw limited action while playing in 23 games a year ago, scoring 33 points and pulling down 20 rebounds. "I think last year was her first year and she found out what it was all about," noted Swank. "She's had signs of brilliance and looks very good. She will play a lot.

Lantzy is a 5'11" sophomore who made

strides as the year went on. She played in 20 games, averaging 3.5 ppg. and 1.4 rpg. "Danielle came on really well last year," stated Swank. "She had some excellent performances. She worked hard over the summer, and she's ready to play."

Swank looks for Megan Zitner to be a force on the wing. In 2001-02 she was a player with the ability to post up or drive to the hole, and was very active on the glass. The 5'10" senior missed the 2002-03 season following knee surgery, and didn't really hit her stride until last February. She ended the year averaging 8.9 ppg. and 5.2 rpg. As a sophomore those figures were 11.2 ppg. and a team-leading 7.7 rpg.

"Megan is the type of player who can play inside or outside," stressed Swank. "She has always been a great rebounder. She goes to the boards really hard. During the month of February she was back to her old self."

Rachel Johnson and Jeanine Mizikar are a pair of 5'11" freshman who will add depth. Johnson is from Springfield High School in Philadelphia. As a senior she averaged 14 points, 12 rebounds and 2 blocks while earning first team all-league honors. She will see most of her time inside. Mizikar played at Belle Vernon (Pa.) High School, earning all-section honors as a senior after averaging 9.6 ppg. and 12.9 rpg. Her specialty is rebounding, a noted Edinboro weakness. She departed as Belle Vernon's third all-time rebounder. She played for former Edinboro assistant Lou Zadecky.

After playing volleyball at Penn State-Behrend, where she was named the Newcomer of the Year, Rae Sherred transferred this year to Edinboro to play basketball. She is a former standout at nearby Cambridge Springs High School. The 5'9" sophomore will provide more depth up front. She scored 1,363 career points for the Devils.

Size, or lack thereof, is once again evident with this year's roster, but Swank has already addressed that issue. While they will sit out the 2004-05 season, 6'3" Agnes Michalow and 6'4" Kim Mardis figure to make a huge impact in the future.

Michalow is a junior who played two seasons at College of DuPage, earning third team NJCAA All-American honors a year ago. She averaged 13.7 ppg. and 8.0 rpg. last year, as DuPage lost in the NJCAA Division III National Championship game to Minneapolis CTC. Michalow had 30 points and 17 rebounds in that contest.

Mardis is a raw freshman who will benefit greatly by practicing this season. She played at East Tech High School in Cleveland, Ohio, averaging 8 points, 8 rebounds and 3 blocks as a senior, helping East Tech to the district title game.

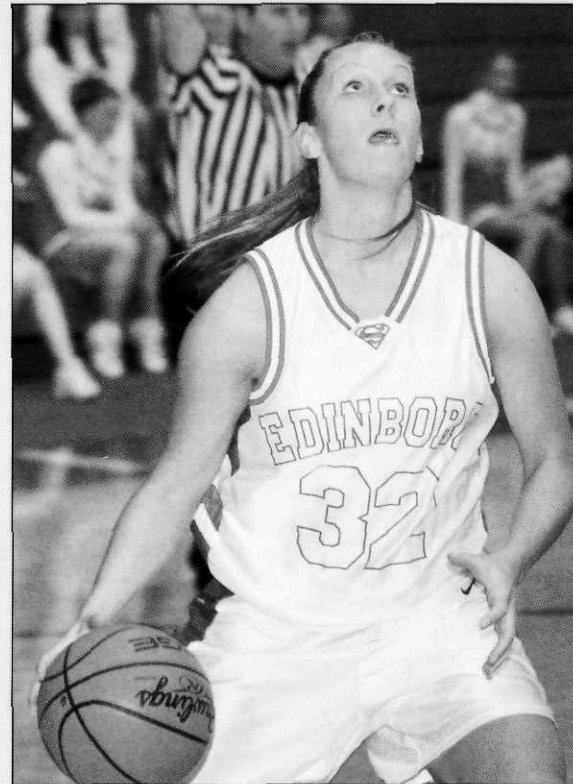

Head Coach Stan Swank



Now in his 18th season, Stan Swank has brought a winning tradition to Edinboro University. The winningest coach in Fighting Scot women's basketball history, Swank has had 13 winning seasons during his 17-year tenure while compiling a 289-185 overall mark.

Edinboro women's basketball has enjoyed seven 20-win seasons, with Swank directing the Fighting Scots to five of those. All told, five of his Fighting Scot editions have reached the NCAA Division II playoffs, with Edinboro reaching the PSAC postseason tournament eleven times. On six of those occasions the Fighting Scots have advanced to the championship game, winning the PSAC title in 1989-90. In the NCAA Division II Tournament, he has guided Edinboro to the Final 32 twice, the Sweet 16 and the Elite Eight.

A year ago Edinboro surprised the rest of the PSAC by going 18-10, the most wins since 1997-98. With a third place finish in the PSAC West, the Fighting Scots made their seventh appearance in the PSAC Playoffs in the last nine years. Three of the losses came to national champion California(Pa.), along with setbacks to nationally-ranked West Texas A&M and Emporia State.

After enduring just his fourth losing season in 2001-02 with a 12-14 record, Swank guided his 2002-03 edition to a 16-12 record. Picked to finish fifth in the preseason coaches poll, the Fighting Scots tied for third to return to postseason action.

In 2000-01, Swank led a young outfit which had to replace Jessica Rowe and Marin Hightower to a surprising 17-10 finish. The veteran coach employed a variety of tactics to take advantage of his entire roster, including inserting his entire second team enmasse for the starters. The Scots qualified for the PSAC Tournament. Despite a losing record in 1999-2000 (13-14), the Fighting Scots reached the PSAC Tournament.

Swank came to Edinboro in 1987 after an outstanding career as head coach at Parkland (IL) Junior College, where he recorded an impressive 104-20 overall mark.

His first Edinboro squad finished 14-11 overall, barely missing the PSAC playoffs. Building off the previous year's success, the 1988-89 team captured the PSAC Western Division crown, compiling a 21-6 overall record. Swank was chosen PSAC West Coach of the Year as the program won 20 games for the first time in nearly a decade.

The Scots repeated as PSAC West champions in 1989-90 and won the PSAC tournament for the first time ever. Edinboro also advanced to the NCAA Division II national tournament, winning its first

NCAA playoff game in history to advance to the Sweet 16. The team finished with a school-record 27 wins, and Swank was named PSAC West Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

Swank's 1991-92 team finished 22-8 overall and was the PSAC runner-up. The Scots also made another appearance in the NCAA national tournament. The Fighting Scots again finished second in the PSAC in '92-93 and appeared in the national tournament for the third time in four years. After a two-year hiatus, Swank's 1995-96 team returned to the postseason, as the Scots finished 15-13 overall. Edinboro beat PSAC East tri-champion Kutztown in the opening round of the PSAC tournament.

Edinboro was the PSAC West co-champion and the PSAC tournament runner-up in 1996-97, with Swank once again earning Coach of the Year honors. The Scots then posted three victories in the NCAA tournament to win the East Regional title and earn a berth in the NCAA Elite Eight. Edinboro finished the year 24-9, the second highest win total in school history.

The '97-98 Fighting Scot squad also made a run in the NCAA Playoffs after finishing as the runnerup in the PSAC Tournament. Edinboro defeated the University of Charleston before suffering an 88-78 loss to PSAC-rival Shippensburg in the NCAA's.

The Fighting Scots jumped out to a 9-0 start in 1998-99 and were ranked 16th in the USA Today WBCA Division II poll. Ravaged by injuries, Edinboro dropped 10 of its next 17 contests, finishing the year 16-10 and missing the PSAC playoffs.

During his tenure Swank has had 35 All-PSAC performers, two PSAC West Rookie of the Year recipients, and six Kodak All-Americans. He has received numerous honors, being named the PSAC West Coach of the Year four times and Edinboro University's Coach of the Year twice. He currently ranks in the top 50 among Division II women's coaches in both wins and winning percentage.

Swank earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Education at Purdue University in 1976. He completed work on his master's degree in Educational Administration at Purdue in 1979. He embarked on his head coaching career at Fisher High School in Illinois, where his boys team compiled a 39-14 record in two seasons. In 1983, he moved on to Parkland Junior College, where his Cobra team won four consecutive sectional championships and finished second twice, and third once, in the NJCAA Region 24.

Swank, his wife Gail and their two sons Stan II, 21, and Benjamin, 17, reside in Edinboro.

Assistant Coach Yvette Sparks



Yvette Sparks was hired as Edinboro University's assistant women's basketball coach in February 2004.

Sparks joined the Edinboro program after serving as the head coach at Malone College in Canton, Ohio from 2001-03. She led the Pioneers to a 37-23 record during her two seasons, including a 24-7 finish in 2001-02. Malone made its first-ever trip to the NAIA National Tournament after finishing third in the American Midwest Conference with a 16-4 ledger. In the first round of the AMC Tournament, the Pioneers earned their first playoff victory since 1982-83 with a 79-63 win over

rival Walsh. Malone played 15th-ranked Judson (Ill.) College in the opening round of the NAIA National Tournament, dropping an 83-68 decision.

Sparks was named the NCCAA East Region Coach of the Year following the 2001-02 campaign. In addition, Malone forward Amy Stefansic was named the school's first-ever NAIA All-American, landing a spot on the third team.

Prior to taking over the Malone program, Sparks served as an assistant coach at Valdosta State University from 1996-2001. The 1996-97 team won the Gulf South Conference East Division championship and earned a spot in the NCAA Division II South Regional, finishing with a 20-7 record. Sparks served as the interim head coach for the 1999-2000 season.

"Yvette brings enthusiasm, passion for the game, and a great personality for recruiting," noted head coach Stan Swank.

A graduate of Clearwater Christian College in 1994, Sparks holds a bachelor of science degree in Physical Education. She was a four-year letterwinner in both basketball and volleyball. Her husband, Jeff, is the National Sales Manager for Snyder Manufacturing in Paris, OH.

Courtney Thompson Awarded NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship

Edinboro University's Courtney Thompson was awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship last May. Thompson was a standout for the Fighting Scots both on the court and in the classroom. She completed her academic career with a perfect 4.00 GPA, earning her bachelor's degree in Mathematics. She received a teaching assistantship at Bowling Green State University, where she is working on her master's degree in Math.

The NCAA awarded 58 scholarships of \$7,500 each to 29 men and 29 women who participated in winter sports, including a total of 22 different sports. To qualify for an NCAA postgraduate scholarship, a student-athlete was not only required to maintain an overall grade point average of 3.200 (on a scale of 4.00) or its equivalent, but also have performed with distinction as a member of the varsity team in the sport in which the student-athlete was nominated.

Making Thompson's award even more impressive was that she was one of only six Division II recipients, and the lone women's basketball player on the Division II level to receive the scholarship. In addition to earning the NCAA postgraduate scholarship, she was the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference nominee for the NCAA Sportsmanship Award.

Thompson concluded a fine career with an outstanding senior campaign. The 5'7" guard ended as the second-leading scorer at 9.6 ppg. while leading the team in assists for the fourth straight year with 120, as opposed to just 65 turnovers. She paced the PSAC in assist/turnover ratio. Thompson made 39 of 107 three-pointers, shot 81.0 percent from the line (81 of 100) and had 39 steals. She ranked fifth in the PSAC in free throw percentage, eighth in assists, tenth in three-point field goal percentage and 12th in three-pointers made per game.

Thompson played in a total of 109 career games, tied for sixth all-time, and ranks second in career assists with 474. She also ranks sixth in career three-pointers made (79) and fifth in career three-pointers attempted (290). She was a four-year PSAC Scholar-Athlete and a four-year Edinboro Scholar Athlete. In addition, Thompson was named to the CoSIDA District II College Division Academic All-America Women's Basketball Team.

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is the largest comprehensive four-year university in northwestern Pennsylvania. Its 585-acre campus is home to some 8,000 students studying in more than 100 academic programs. The University's programs in art, criminal justice, and speech language pathology, among others, have earned regional and national recognition and accolades, and the campus is ranked among the top 10 in the nation for the services provided for students with disabilities. In 2003 the University's institutional accreditation with the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools was reaffirmed with commendation for ten years. In the 2006-07 academic year, the University will celebrate its

Sesquicentennial recognizing 150 years of service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and beyond.

Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie -- Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 480,000 bound volumes and 1.3 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

The main campus also includes a modern University Center, planetarium, observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and television stations, health center, counseling center, and much more -- all accessible for people with disabilities. The recently renovated and expanded Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of its kind in the nation.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including six residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learned floors -- all are wired for voice, video and data.

Edinboro University also operates centers in Erie and Meadville. Edinboro University in Erie -- The Porreco Center is a beautiful 27-acre campus that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for small conferences, business meetings, and special events. Edinboro University in Meadville is located in the city's historic Bessemer Building.

Dr. Frank G. Pogue

President, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Dr. Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor for student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central

Administration in Albany, serving in that position for 10 years. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, President Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY at Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. He serves as a member of the American Council on Education (ACE) Commission on Women in Higher Education which provides counsel to ACE on policies related to women in higher education and advises on other concerns related to expanded roles and equal opportunity for women in higher education. He is a member of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Committee on Professional Development, Millennium Leadership Initiative and Christa McAuliffe Selection Committee. He was appointed in 2003 to the International Association of University Presidents Commission on Disarmament Education, Conflict Resolution and Peace. Since 1984, Dr. Pogue has served on the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA). Most recently, he served as President for the MSA Board of Trustees and as a member of its Executive Committee, and he is a former vice chair of the Commission's Executive Committee.

Dr. Pogue also serves on the Board of Trustees of the BACCHUS &

GAMMA Peer Education Network. He served for two years as chairperson of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (SSHE) Commission for the Universities and Commission of Presidents Executive Committee. He is a member of the Executive Board of A Community of Agile Partners in Education (CAPE). In October 1996, Dr. Pogue was appointed by then Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge to the Governor's Commission on Academic Standards. In November 2002, he was appointed co-chair of the Higher Education Committee of Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell's Transition Team. In May, 2004, he was appointed to the Pennsylvania Department of Education Higher Education Advisory Board.

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the Boards of Directors for the Meadville Area Industrial Commission, the Erie Regional Chamber and Growth Partnership, and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra. He serves on the Boards of Corporators for the Hamot Health Foundation, the Saint Vincent Health Center, and the Meadville Medical Center. He is a member of the Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee and an Honorary Member of the Erie Wolves Club. Dr. Pogue was chairperson of the Erie County Millennium Commission, the Erie County State Employees Combined Appeal (SECA) campaign in 2001 and 2002, and of the Erie Day School's Adopt-A-Scholar scholarship program (2000-01 and 2002-03). He was also a member of the Erie Mayor's Task Force on Public Safety. Dr. Pogue has served on the boards of directors for the United Way of Erie County and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

Dr. Pogue was honored by the Erie Area Chamber of Commerce with the Louis J. Tullio Community Service Award. The Greater Erie Community Action Committee (GECAC) honored him with the Paul P. Martin Community Service Award in 2000, and in 1999, the Distinguished Service Award for Leadership and Vision was presented to him by the SUNY at Albany Council of Trustees.

Dr. Pogue has shared his experiences and expertise in Edinboro University classrooms via guest lecturer presentations. He has also taught a course titled, "Special Topics in Sociology" for the Department of Sociology. He continues to enjoy working in the classroom environment.

Since becoming president, Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.
