

President Foster F. Diebold



Now in his fifteenth year as president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, Foster F. Diebold is the fourteenth chief executive officer of the institution of higher learning that has come to acclaim in the last decade as one of Pennsylvania's and the nation's finest. He has brought a vigorous educa-

tional and moral leadership, a strengthening of the spirit of community, a clear sense of direction and purpose, and a dimension of multicultural pluralism and diversity.

Much has been accomplished during President Diebold's tenure. The University has returned to financial health. Significant facilities and grounds improvements have been achieved, with several of the historic structures on campus restored to their original splendor. Academic programs have been emphasized and improved, with more than 100 degree offerings now available. Enrollment gains have been unprecedented in both numbers and academic quality. International linkages have been established with institutions in several other countries, and Edinboro University's program for students with disabilities continues to garner acclaim as one of the finest among all colleges and universities in the United States. Widely recognized as a leader in education both here and abroad, President Diebold has positioned Edinboro University to meet the challenges that will face public higher education in the 21st century.

The Orange, New Jersey, native is a graduate of Monmouth College and also holds a master of arts in educational administration from Seton Hall University. He has met coursework requirements for a doctorate in education at Rutgers University and is currently completing the dissertation requirement for the Ph.D. program in higher education at the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency of Edinboro University, President Diebold was president of the University of Alaska from 1977 to 1979. Before that, he was executive secretary to the Board of Regents and special assistant to the president of the University of Alaska Statewide System. From 1969 to 1976, he was director of Development and Planning at Kean College in New Jersey and a member of the graduate faculty at that institution; and from 1965 to 1969, he was assistant superintendent of the Neptune Township (New Jersey) Public Schools.

Recognized for his extensive experience in the field of education management, President Diebold's scholarly achievements in the discipline of applied ethics in higher education deserve special mention. The model statement he authored for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, "Ethical Practices for College Presidents," was unanimously adopted by that professional organization and published as policy for the chief executives of its nearly 400 member institutions nationwide. It is the first formally adopted ethical practices and policy statement for higher education presidents.

For his leadership on an international scale and for his many contributions to the advancement of higher education and enrichment of an emerging culture in Pakistan, President Diebold was decorated with prestigious gold medals from three Pakistani universities. The awards for educational eminence were presented during visits to the Edinboro campus by official Pakistani delegations.

President Diebold was also honored by the Government of Pakistan with the awarding of the degree of Doctor of Laws (honoris causa), presented at the Government House in the City of Karachi. The ceremony was attended by the presidents of the several Pakistani universities holding linkage agreements with Edinboro University, as well as many high-ranking officials of the Government of Pakistan and U.S. diplomatic officials.

A staunch advocate of a statewide system of public universities in Pennsylvania, President Diebold supported the enabling legislation for the State System of Higher Education (Act 188 of 1982) and saw the State System come to existence in 1983 as a member of the transition team. He currently serves on the System's Executive Council of Presidents and on the boards of the Pennsylvania Academy for the Profession of Teaching, the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, and the Dixon University Center at Harrisburg.

President Diebold's stature in American higher education has been recognized by several high-level appointments. He was named to the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations, the leading national organization devoted to building constructive relationships between the two countries. He was also appointed to the Leadership Council of the Northeast-Midwest Institute, a regional component of the Center for Regional Policy, and to the Pennsylvania Humanities Council, the private, non-profit group promoting statewide public understanding of the humanities.



Head Coach Stan Swank



Stan Swank is entering his eighth season as head coach of the Edinboro University women's basketball team. His first seven years at the helm have been filled with success and national recognition. Under Swank, the Lady Scots have advanced to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship game four of the last six years, and have made

NCAA national tournament appearances three of the past five.

Entering his first season in 1987-88, Swank took over a team comprised mainly of underclassmen. Swank provided the spark which this young team needed, guiding the Lady Scots to a record of 14-11, one game out of the PSAC playoffs.

In '88-89, the Lady Scots stormed the PSAC and won the Western Division title with a 10-2 conference record. They won the first game of the PSAC championship playoffs before bowing out in the state title game. The team finished with a 21-6 record, the best in Lady Scot history. Swank was named PSAC-West Coach of the Year for his efforts.

Swank's third season saw the Lady Scots take their play to new heights. They took the PSAC-West title with an II-1 conference record and then went on to capture the PSAC state crown. With an overall record of 27-3 and a national ranking, the Lady Scots advanced to the NCAA tournament's round of 16 before their dream season ended. Swank was named PSAC-West Coach of the Year for the second straight year posting the best season in Lady Scot history in only this third year.

After graduating the 1989-90 team, Swank had 12 new players for his next season. During this rebuilding season, the Lady Scots showed signs of promise for the future, finishing 8-19, 1-11 in the PSAC West.

The next season brought Swank the kind of results he had been used to as Boro head coach. The five returners and five strong recruits put the Lady Scots back in the national spotlight. The team finished with an overall record of 22-8, 8-4 in the PSAC-West. The squad, ranked nationally, claimed the PSAC runners-up trophy and advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs.

The 1992-93 team continued Swank's success at Edinboro. It finished 18-12 overall, 9-3 in the conference. For the second straight season the Lady Scots finished as runners-up at the PSAC championships and again they advanced to the NCAA Division II tournament. For his efforts, Swank was named the PSAC-Western Division Coach of the Year.

Last year's squad jumped out to a 8-1 record before hitting the rugged PSAC Western Division. After Christmas break, the Lady Scots went 2-14 for the rest of season.

Swank began his coaching career at Nova High School in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, as an assistant men's coach.

He helped guide the squad to an outstanding 30-3 record and an eighth place finish in the state.

In 1977, he joined the Parkland Junior College staff as an assistant men's coach.

In 1980, he began a two year stint as head coach of the Fisher High School boy's varsity team. He left the high school ranks with a 39-14 record and two regional championships.

When Parkland Junior College came looking for new leadership for its women's program, Swank fit the bill. 1983 was the first of four stellar seasons for Parkland, as Swank led the Cobras to four straight 20-plus win seasons, culminated by a 30-4 finish in '85-86 and a 30-3 finish in '86-87. His '86-87 unit finished the year ranked 13th in the NJCAA final rankings and led the NJCAA in scoring average, pouring in 93.8 points per game. That year's club eclipsed the 100 point mark eleven times, scoring as many as 129 points. His overall mark at Parkland was 104 wins against just 20 losses.

His accomplishments with Parkland included four straight sectional championships ('83-87), two third-place finishes in NJCAA Region 24 ('83-84 & '84-85), and two regional runners-up finishes ('85-86 & '86-87).

Coming to Edinboro in 1987-88, Swank's credentials spoke for themselves. No team he had ever coached had posted a losing record, but he faced a program that lacked leadership and experience. Swank let his energy and charisma take over and as the season progressed, it became evident that the Lady Scots were forming a winning tradition. Swank thus demonstrated his ability to turn a program around. The foundation of the Lady Scot basketball program is now solid and the glue that holds it together is the knowledge, energy and emotion of Stan Swank.

Swank earned a bachelor of science in physical education from Purdue University in 1976, then returned to receive a master of science degree in educational administration four years later. He is a 1972 graduate of Champaign Centennial High School in Champaign, Illinois.

Swank and his wife, Gail, have two children; 11 year-old Stanley II, and Benjamin, seven, and reside in Edinboro.

Sarah begins her third year as an assistant coach after graduating from Edinboro in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education and in 1992 with a master's in student personnel services. She is also a certified athletic trainer (A.T.C.)

Playing for Swank for three years, Sarah currently ranks second in Edinboro history in scoring (1,652), fourth in steals (203), seventh in rebounding (565) and eighth in assists (239). She also ranks in career field goals made (1st with 698), career scoring average (fifth at 15.7), career free throws made (2nd with 259) and career field goal percentage (sixth at 46.0% [698 - 1,506]).

Sarah holds the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference single-season record for foul shooting with a 86.8 percentage. Sarah was named PSAC-West First-Team three consecutive years and was also tabbed a Kodak All-American in the East Region her senior season.

Sarah brings a wealth of knowledge to the Lady Scots and is a great addition to the Edinboro coaching staff.







1994-95 Preview - "Shootout in the West"

The 1994-95 Edinboro University women's basketball team looks toward to the "Shootout in the West" with the return of two PSAC-West all-stars and three starters from last year's squad.

Led by eighth-year head coach Stan Swank, the Lady Scots look to rebound to the national prominence which they have recently enjoyed. The Lady Scots, 10-15 overall and 1-11 in the PSAC-West last season, return six players in 1994-95 and have added four talented newcomers to the roster.

Leading the list of returnees is senior guard Pam Artman who enters the season as a three-year starter, missing only one game over her career. Last season, Artman had her best year, averaging 10.5 points, 5.7 rebounds, 5.7 assists and 3.1 steals per game. Considered by Swank as one of the most versatile players in Edinboro history, Artman enters the year needing just 74 assists and 76 steals to establish school records in those categories. She currently stands third in assists (368) and steals (208), 20th in rebounding (366) and 22nd in scoring (655) in the Boro record books.

Also returning to the line-up is senior guard Kim Jaeger who missed 11 games last season with a broken wrist. In her limited playing action, Jaeger averaged 9.9 ppg and 5.1 apg. Even though last year was her first season with the Lady Scots, Jaeger's 72 assists rank in the top 30 in school history.

The other backcourt returnee is junior guard Lori Montgomery, a PSAC-West second team choice a year ago after averaging 14 ppg, 4.3 rpg and 2.9 apg. Montgomery was named the PSAC-West Rookie of the Year in '92-93, netting just under ten points per game. Currently, Montgomery stands 13th in assists (166), 17th in steals (102) and 25th in scoring (606) on the Boro's all-time charts.

The lone returner in the front court in junior forward Shauna Nevel, also tabbed to the PSAC-West second team last year. She led the team in scoring at 16.0 and also added 6.1 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 2.2 assists per outing. Nevel has seen action in all 55 games over her career and currently stands 18th in steals (96), 23rd in assists (93), 27th in scoring (554) and 30th in rebounding (226).

Also returning to the line-up are junior guard Christine Roppolo and sophomore guard Laura Day. Roppolo has seen action off the bench during the



past two seasons and looks to increase her minutes this year, while Day played in 24 games last season, working mainly as a defensive specialist.

The Lady Scots have added four new faces to their line-up this season including juniors Latricia Brown and Dawn Podkul and freshmen Heather Gates and Tami Piljuga.

Brown transferred from Truett-McConnell Junior College and will help immediately inside. She netted 16.3 ppg and grabbed 7.7 rpg at her JC unit last year. She was named to the Georgia All-Region team last year and was also touted by Division I schools Seton Hall and Rutgers.

Podkul enters her first year at Edinboro lettering three years in basketball at Penn Trafford High School in the Pittsburgh Area.

Gates, a forward, should also help the Lady Scots right away. Last year at Beachwood High School in the Cleveland Area, she averaged 21 ppg, 15 rpg, 4 apg and 3 spg while being named *Cleveland Plain Dealer* "Player of the Week" on two occasions. Gates also competed in the Ohio High School Girls North-South All-Star Classic last year.

Piljuga, a forward, follows in Artman's footsteps from Brentwood High School. Last season as a high school senior, Piljuga averaged 17.5 ppg and 10 rpg while receiving the 1994 Foodland Sports Show Top 15 Players Award. Piljuga gained valuable big game experience last year, performing in the WPIAL District 7 Championship game and also as a participant at the Pittsburgh Girls Roundball Classic.

Edinboro plays a strong non-conference schedule this year, including two games with Pitt-Johnstown, Gannon and Mercyhurst. After hosting the 11th Annual Lady Scot Tournament in early December, Edinboro will get a major test with a visit to the Stonehill Classic in Massachusetts. In the first season of PSAC cross-over games, the Lady Scots will play Mansfield and West Chester twice before entering tough PSAC-West conference play.

With the combination of talented returners and recruits, Edinboro is preparing for the "Shootout in the West" and its hopeful return to their recent national successes. This season, the Lady Scots will seek their fifth appearance at the PSAC Championships in seven years and fourth NCAA Tournament berth since 1989-90.
