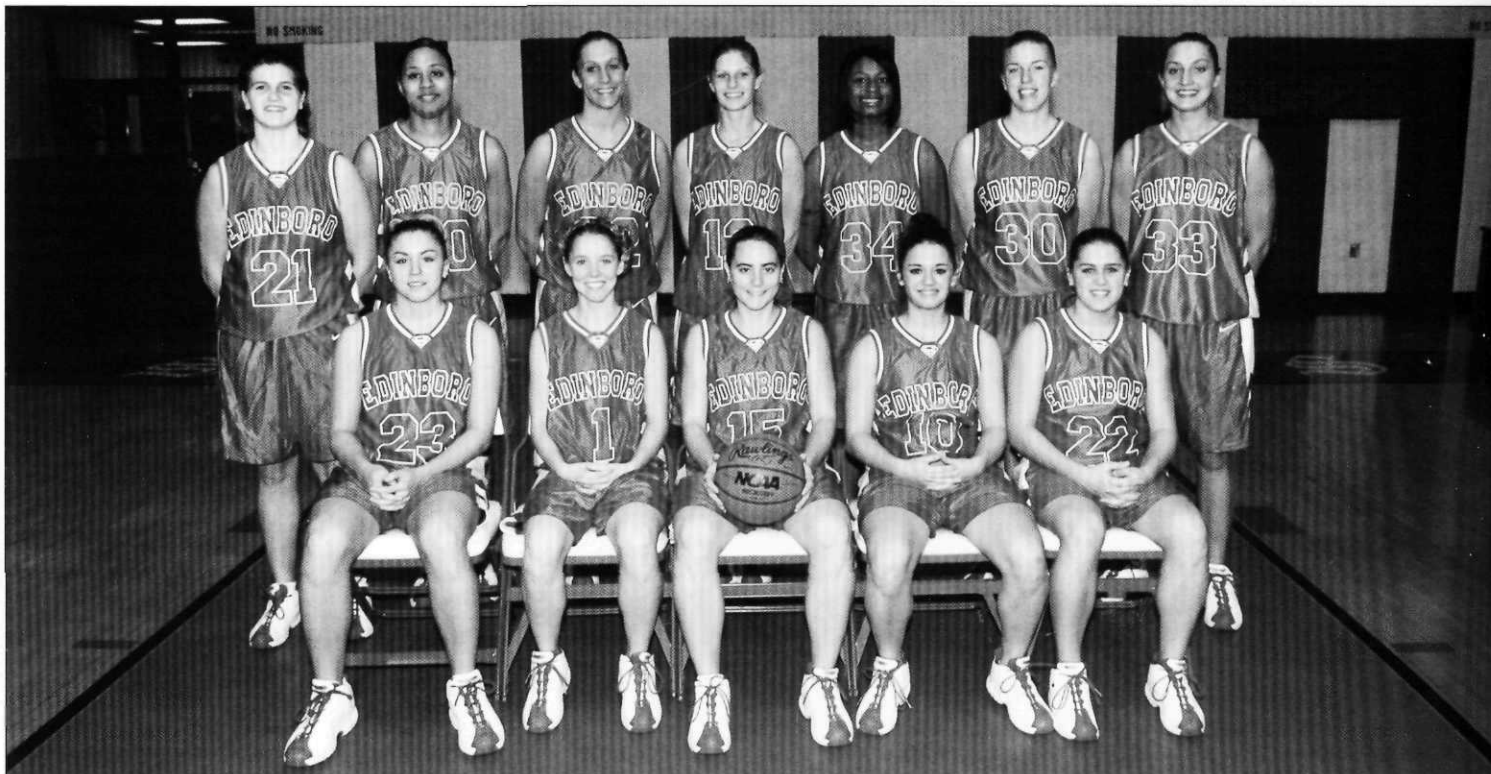

2002-03 Season Preview

Fighting Scots Look To Rebound and Reach Next Level

Stan Swank began coaching the Edinboro University women's basketball team in 1987. Since then, he's taken the Fighting Scots to the "next level" nine times. The "next level" is his term for postseason action, beginning with the PSAC Tournament. For the veteran mentor, nothing else matters, and if his intuition is correct, his 2002-03 team has a good shot at making it to the "next level."

Edinboro looks to rebound from last year's 12-14 finish, and to accomplish that feat, will have to do just that - rebound. A year ago the Fighting Scots were the worst rebounding team in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, being outrebounded by an incredible 12 boards per game.

"If we rebound evenly with our opponents, we'll be successful," Swank assured. "If we outrebound our opponents, it's going to be a very great season. We won 12 games and it is almost miraculous that our team accomplished that because of our rebounding numbers. Consequently, that tells our

coaching staff that we were doing a lot of other things very, very well."

One of those things was long distance shooting. With his team unable to match up inside with opponents, Swank went to his "Smurf" lineup, with four guards and a forward. The end result was school records for three-pointers made (193) and attempted (606) in a season.

Height isn't everything, however. The 2002-03 squad features versatility, cohesiveness, and a work ethic that Swank feels will help them challenge for a PSAC playoff berth. Eight letterwinners, including four starters, return, with Wendy Wiggins the lone missing starter. With the core of the team consisting of five juniors and just three seniors, Swank is taking an optimistic approach.

"We're a young team with experience," he explained. "We understand what it's like to play at the Division II level and in the PSAC. These players have the knowledge and experience that can take them to the next level. We've got a great group of people that get along and work to help each other be successful and attain goals. As a team, they want to win. Not just because there's a game and a band playing. They sincerely want to be successful."

Despite all the optimism, the team's success will still lie in its ability to rebound, and the Scots were dealt a harsh blow in September when Megan Zitner was lost for the year with a torn anterior cruciate ligament. The 5'10" junior averaged 11.2 ppg., but more importantly, pulled down a team-leading 7.7 rpg. Zitner was particularly effective down the stretch, averaging 16.5 ppg. and 9.5 rpg.

"We had super-high expectations of Megan and she had just started peaking," Swank lamented. "But I'd rather lose

Megan at a time when we can make adjustments, rather than half way through the season. And at least the timing allows her to rehab for next year."

Edinboro opens up the 2002-03 season at the Red Roof Inn State/Tech Classic, facing West Virginia Tech and West Virginia State on November 22 and 23. The Fighting Scots then have a stretch of eight out of nine games at home, including contests with backyard rivals Gannon and Mercyhurst. Every opponent on the schedule is a Division II squad and Swank looks forward to the competition. "Our schedule provides a clear view of what we need to accomplish and prepare us for tough conference play in the West," he commented.

GUARD

Senior Krystal Henson and junior Courtney Thompson enter their third season together in the backcourt. Henson provides the Scots with one of the best long-range shooters in Division II, while Thompson plays hard-nosed defense and is an outstanding ballhandler.

Henson earned second team All-PSAC West honors while leading the Scots in scoring at 15.6 ppg. She led the PSAC in three-pointers made per game for the second straight year and ranked fourth nationally, setting school records with 88 three-pointers made and 248 three-pointers attempted. The lefty also broke the record for three-pointers made in a game when she made 10 of 16 versus Columbia Union. Henson ranks second in career three-pointers made (198), needing just 25 more to break the all-time record. She added 52 assists and 35 steals.

"My expectations are high," Swank noted in regards to Henson. "Her greatest attribute is that she hits three's at critical times. They're either back-breakers or when we need to stay alive."

Thompson paced the PSAC in assists-to-turnover ratio, handing out 142 assists while committing just 38 turnovers. The 5'6" floor general boosted her scoring average to 5.4 ppg. and recorded 34 steals, but her greatest attributes remain her leadership and ballhandling skills. She already ranks 13th in career assists with 226. "She does-

n't make mistakes," said Swank.

The backups at guard are very familiar to each other. Former high school teammates Jodi Calderone and Callie Iorfido starred at Ambridge High School, leading the *Bridgers* to a 29-3 record in 2000-01, and are now reunited. Calderone, a 5'6" sophomore, emerged as a dangerous three-point threat when Swank went to his smaller lineup. She started four contests, finishing the year at 5.7 ppg. A shooter with near unlimited range, she made 38 of 121 three-pointers, and figures to push Henson's records before she's finished.

"She gained a lot of confidence and understands the college game," Swank explained. "Jodi doesn't fear anybody or any team. She just plays hard."

Thompson averaged 33.5 minutes per game last year, playing 35-or-more minutes in 17 contests. Swank feels the 5'3" Iorfido will provide some much-needed rest. In her senior year at Ambridge, the daughter of former Edinboro football standout Rich Iorfido averaged 15.8 points, 6.5 assists, and 3 steals per game. She helped the *Bridgers* to a 22-3 finish.

"She sees the floor very well and has good speed," Swank stated. "She also adds the ability to score. Callie helps because Courtney doesn't have to play 35 minutes. Courtney will be more effective with less minutes and being able to get breaks."

FORWARD

Despite the loss of Zitner, three returning letterwinners and three talented newcomers will provide for plenty of competition. Senior Lachelle Crawl played a key role a year ago, registering 9.5 ppg. and pulling down 4.9 rebounds per game, second on the team. Though just 5'9", Crawl is a tenacious inside player who excelled whether starting or coming off the bench. She finished second on the team to Zitner in field goal percentage (48.5 percent) and displayed an ability to get to the line (69 of 110 free throws). In addition, she had 38 steals, second on the team.

"Lachelle did a great job of coming off the bench," Swank recalled. "She provides blue-collar work, gets rebounds, draws fouls, and plays good defense. She is the ultimate team player and does whatever is asked of her for the betterment of the team."

Suzanne Petruska started 19 games a year ago after seeing limited action as a freshman. The 5'9" junior provides versatility with the ability to score inside and outside, evidenced by her 15 three-pointers. Petruska averaged 8.8 ppg. and 4.1 rpg., but Swank feels those numbers could jump.

"Suzanne gives our team a lot of options. We can play her in a lot of different ways," Swank said. "She plays with great intensity and wants to win badly."

Cassandra Leopold debuted a year ago but sat out a good portion of the year due to injury. She played in seven games, but Swank sees the potential for more court time this season for the 5'9" junior. "She has improved greatly each year and if she continues to improve at the rate she is, she will get more time," Swank commented.

Jessi Montie has already caught Swank's eye. The Metro League Player of the Year as a senior at nearby McDowell High School, she finished her career with 1,122 points. The 5'8" freshman led the Lady Trojans to a 21-7 record, the District 10 championship and a berth in the PIAA Class AAAA quarterfinals.

"We knew she was good player when we recruited her," Swank revealed. "In pre-season, she has gone beyond our expectations and looks very good."

CENTER

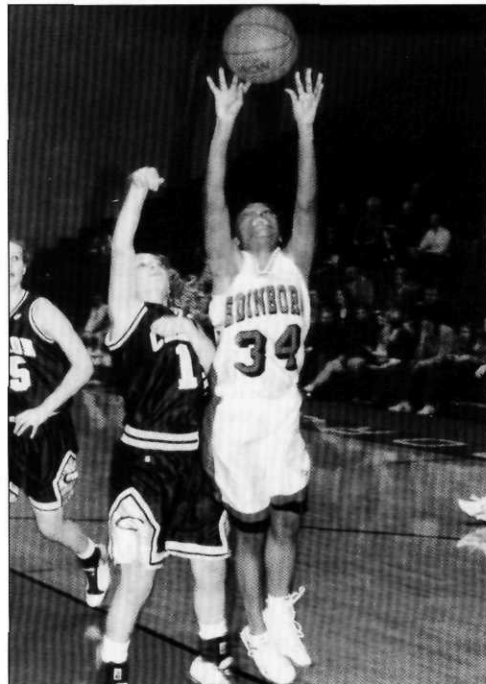
Amy Stevens and newcomers Shaton Williams-Burden and Maria DiVecchio will compete for playing time at center. Stevens, also the goalkeeper for the soccer team, has seen little action on the floor. The 6'0" senior appeared in 15 games. "We need Amy to

give us good minutes this season, from the standpoint of rebounding and scoring off of offensive boards," Swank commented.

At 5'10" each, Williams-Burden and DiVecchio are expected to play key roles. Williams-Burden last played at Contra Costa (Ca.) Junior College in 1997-98, spending the next four years in the Army and earning All-Army accolades. She led Contra Costa in scoring (14.7 ppg.), rebounding (11.2 rpg.), and steals (100), and was named a first team All-Bay Valley Conference selection.

"She gets better every day," Swank pointed out. "We are looking for her to be a strong rebounder and give us stability in the paint. She brings a diverse experience and maturity to the team."

DiVecchio also has the potential to fill the rebounding void. "She was recruited for her rebounding ability, she has the ability to score, and she will see a lot of action as a freshman," Swank related. The 5'10" freshman left a legacy at nearby Villa Maria Academy, finishing her career as the all-time leading scorer with 1,382 points. She led the Victors to a 27-6 record and a berth in the PIAA Class AAA championship game before losing to Allentown Central Catholic. A four-time first team All-Metro League selection, she led Villa Maria in scoring all four years. She finished as the second-leading scorer in the Metro League in both 1999 and 2000.

Head Coach

Stan Swank

Now in his 16th season, Stan Swank has brought a winning tradition to Edinboro University. The winningest coach in Fighting Scot women's basketball history, Swank has had ten winning seasons

during his 15-year tenure.

Swank has posted a 255-163 overall mark. Edinboro women's basketball has enjoyed seven 20-win seasons, with Swank directing the Fighting Scots to five of those. All told, five of his Fighting Scot editions have reached the NCAA Division II playoffs, with Edinboro reaching the PSAC postseason tournament nine times. On six of those occasions the Fighting Scots have advanced to the championship game.

A year ago Swank endured his fourth losing season at Edinboro, as a young Scot squad finished 12-14 overall. Despite a late-season surge, the Scots narrowly missed a playoff berth for the first time since 1998-99.

In 2000-01, he guided a young outfit which had to replace Jessica Rowe and Marin Hightower to a surprising 17-10 finish. The veteran coach employed a variety of tactics to take advantage of his entire roster, including inserting his entire second team enmasse for the starters. The Scots qualified for the PSAC Tournament for the fifth time in the previous six years.

Swank suffered his third losing season during his 15-year tenure in 1999-2000, going 13-14. Despite the losing record the Fighting Scots reached the PSAC Tournament, losing to Shippensburg, 90-76, in the first round.

Swank came to Edinboro in 1987 after an outstanding career as head coach at Parkland (IL) Junior College, where he recorded an impressive 104-20 overall mark.

His first Edinboro squad finished 14-11 overall, barely missing the PSAC playoffs. Building off the previous year's success, the 1988-89 team captured the PSAC Western Division crown, compiling a 21-6 overall record. Swank was chosen PSAC West Coach of the Year as the program won 20

games for the first time in nearly a decade.

The Scots repeated as PSAC West champions in 1989-90 and won the PSAC tournament for the first time ever. Edinboro also advanced to the NCAA Division II national tournament, winning its first NCAA playoff game in history to advance to the Sweet 16. The team finished with a school-record 27 wins, and Swank was named PSAC West Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

Swank's 1991-92 team finished 22-8 overall and was the PSAC runner-up. The Scots also made another appearance in the NCAA national tournament. The Fighting Scots again finished second in the PSAC in '92-93 and appeared in the national tournament for the third time in four years. After a two-year hiatus, Swank's 1995-96 team returned to the postseason, as the Scots finished 15-13 overall. Edinboro beat PSAC East tri-champion Kutztown in the opening round of the PSAC tournament.

Edinboro was the PSAC West co-champion and the PSAC tournament runner-up in 1996-97, with Swank once again earning Coach of the Year honors. The Scots then posted three victories in the NCAA tournament to win the East Regional title and earn a berth in the NCAA Elite Eight. Edinboro finished the year 24-9, the second highest win total in school history.

The '97-98 Fighting Scot squad also made a run in the NCAA Playoffs after finishing as the runnerup in the PSAC Tournament. Edinboro defeated the University of Charleston before suffering an 88-78 loss to PSAC-rival Shippensburg in the NCAA's.

The Fighting Scots jumped out to a 9-0 start in 1998-99 and were ranked 16th in the USA Today WBCA Division II poll. Ravaged by injuries, Edinboro dropped 10 of its next 17 contests, finishing the year 16-10 and missing the PSAC playoffs.

Swank graduated from Champaign Centennial High School in Illinois in 1972, then earned a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education at Purdue University in 1976. He completed work on his Master's Degree in Educational Administration at Purdue in 1979.

Swank began his head coaching career at Fisher High School in Illinois, where his boys team compiled a 39-14 record in two seasons. In 1983, he moved on to Parkland Junior College, where his Cobra team won four consecutive sectional championships and finished second twice, and third once, in the NJCAA Region 24.

Stan, his wife Gail and their two sons Stanley II, 19, and Benjamin, 15, reside in Edinboro.

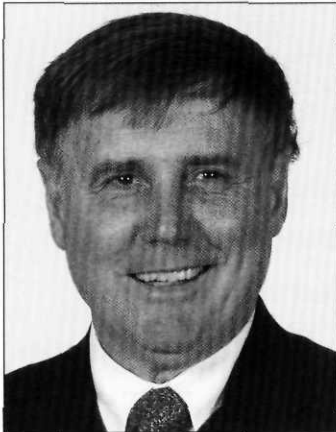

Terry Thompson is in his third season as a volunteer assistant coach with the Edinboro University women's basketball team. However, he is already well-known in local basketball circles.

Thompson began his coaching career in 1965 as the boys varsity coach at East Brady High School, where he also served as a teacher. He led the team to the PIAA state runnerup spot in 1968, before leaving East Brady after the 1969 season.

After a one-year hiatus from coaching, in which Thompson

completed work on his Masters Degree in Education from Slippery Rock University, he served as the assistant varsity boys coach at Butler High School for two years.

In 1973, Thompson took the head coaching position at Knoch High School, where he held a teaching and coaching position for nine years.

After a two-year break from coaching, Thompson found his way to the Erie County League, where he guided the Fairview High School boys team for seven seasons. During the 1985-86 season, Thompson led the Tigers to the ECL and District 10 championships. Fairview had a 124-56 record during Thompson's tenure.

In 1990, Thompson made the jump to the collegiate ranks, working for three seasons as an assistant men's basketball coach at Penn State Behrend.

Thompson returned to the high school ranks in 1992, taking the assistant girls coaching position at Girard High School. In nine years as an assistant for coach Larry Seneta, Thompson helped lead Girard to a PIAA state championship, a PIAA state runner-up, five District 10 titles and three Erie County League titles.

Thompson and his wife Donna, have two daughters, T.L. (23) and Courtney (20). After outstanding high school careers at Girard, both daughters played collegiately. T.L. completed her senior year at Grove City, while Courtney is entering her junior year at Edinboro.

2001-02

Played in 25 games with 8 starts ... finished fourth on the team in scoring, registering 9.5 ppg. and was second in rebounding at 4.9 per game ... reached double figures in scoring in 15 games and registered two double-doubles ... grabbed a career-high 10 boards in both games vs. Indiana(Pa.) and scored a career-high 17 points in the first meeting ... added 16 points and 9 rebounds at Lock Haven ... posted her second double-double of the season vs. IUP, adding 10 points to her 10 rebounds ... ranked second on the team with 38 steals, tying her career high with 4 steals against both Mansfield and Lock Haven ... averaged 14.2 points in a seven-game span before suffering an ankle injury vs. Slippery Rock.

2000-01

Appeared in 26 games, including 8 starting assignments ... averaged 3.7 points and 1.5 rebounds with 22 steals, ranking fifth on the team ... made a significant improvement at the free throw line, improving to 70.3 percent (45 of 64) after shooting 52.2 percent as a freshman ... scored in double figures twice, with a season-high 12 markers at Mercyhurst ... made 6 of 9 free throws and added 6 rebounds in a season-high 29 minutes ... added 11 points (3 of 4 FGs, 4 of 4 FTs) in win at Ashland ... tied career-high with 4 steals in season-opening loss to defending national champion Northern Kentucky.

1999-2000

Rebounding Woes Lead to Uncharacteristic Losing Campaign

Despite breaking numerous records, individual accolades proved to be insufficient, as head coach Stan Swank and the Fighting Scots suffered their second losing season in three years and narrowly missed the playoffs with a 12-14 record overall and a 4-8 record in the PSAC West.

Despite breaking numerous records, individual accolades proved to be insufficient, as head coach Stan Swank and the Fighting Scots suffered their second losing season in three years and narrowly missed the playoffs with a 12-14 record overall and a 4-8 record in the PSAC West.

The season began in fine fashion, with four straight wins. Three of the four wins came on the road, at Mercyhurst, East Stroudsburg and Kutztown. But that stretch was followed by four losses in the next five outings. The first setback came in the opening round of the Fighting Scot Invitational, as Madonna surprised the Fighting Scots, 81-56. The Scots appeared to right themselves with what turned out to be one their best performances of the year, a 76-74 win over Wayne State(MI). Megan Zitner earned All-Tournament honors thanks to a 20-point, 11-rebound performance in the victory.

Road losses at Millersville, Saginaw Valley State and Northwood sent the Fighting Scots into the new year with a 5-4 record, and 2002 began with three wins in four contests. The lone loss came in the PSAC West opener to a powerful California(Pa.) squad by a 74-54 count.

Unfortunately, the Scots then endured a seven-game losing streak, including five setbacks to PSAC West foes.

With playoff hopes dim, Swank found a spark for his struggling team. He resorted to his "Smurfi" lineup, featuring four guards and no starters taller than 5'10." The duo of junior Krystal Henson and freshman Jodi Calderone began to fire three-pointers from all over McComb Fieldhouse, and with the court opened up, 5'10" Megan Zitner drove past the larger players guarding her.

The ploy worked, as Edinboro won four of its last six games, with the combination of Henson and Calderone combining for 77 three-point field goal attempts in those wins. By the season's end, the Boro set season records for both three-pointers made (193) and three-pointers attempted

(606).

The losing streak came to an end with an 89-75 win over Slippery Rock. The Fighting Scots made 12 of 30 three's and for only the third time all season, outrebounded their opponent.

Swank's squad won three PSAC contests in a row and a glimmer of hope remained for the playoffs if the Scots won their last three games down the stretch. Shippensburg shattered those hopes, however, handing Edinboro an 86-75 loss. A game later, Slippery Rock avenged the first defeat in the first meeting, defeating the Boro 89-78.

No matter how strong the Scots proved from behind the arc, there was no compensation for the performance on the boards. If the statistics weren't enough, height served as a constant reminder of their disadvantage on the glass. The tallest Scot to consistently see action was just 5'11." Edinboro was pounded by as many as 34 rebounds against Madonna University and by an average of 12 boards per game all year. The Scots won the rebounding battle on just four occasions and finished as the worst rebounding team in the PSAC.

Henson highlighted the year, rewriting Edinboro's three-point records. The junior set the records for both three-pointers made and attempted in a season, making 88 of 248 from behind the arc. She ranked fourth in Division II for three-pointers made per game. Henson also set the record for three's made in a game (10) versus Columbia Union and tied the record for three's attempted in a game (17) against Indiana(Pa.). The tri-captain moved into second place all-time for career three-pointers made with 198.

Henson was the lone Scot to earn All-PSAC honors, earning a spot on the second team after leading the PSAC in three-pointers made per game for the second straight year. She led Edinboro in scoring with 15.6 points per game.

Zitner was second in scoring at 11.2

ppg, and paced the team with 7.7 rebounds per game. The 5'10" forward played a key role in the late season surge, averaging 16.5 ppg. and 9.5 rpg. in the last six games. She led the team with five double-doubles.

Courtney Thompson ran the show at point guard, distributing 142 assists, while committing just 38 turnovers. The 5'6" sophomore carried a heavy load, playing in 35-or-more minutes in 17 games. She led the PSAC in assist-to-turnover ratio and scored 5.4 ppg. The tri-captain finished with 34 steals and 69 rebounds on the year.

Senior Wendy Wiggins battled inconsistency throughout the year, scoring in spurts. The 5'9" guard scored in double figures in seven of the first ten games, before going dry mid-season. The tri-captain came alive again down the stretch, returning to double digit scoring in the last six games of her career. Wiggins finished third on the team in both scoring and rebounding at 10.2 ppg. and 4.3 rpg.

Lachelle Crawl provided Edinboro with consistency in the paint, scoring in double figures in 15 games, including two double-doubles. She finished her junior campaign fourth in scoring with 9.5 ppg. and second in rebounding with 4.9 rpg.



Wendy Wiggins was third on the team in both scoring and rebounding at 10.2 ppg. and 4.3 rpg.

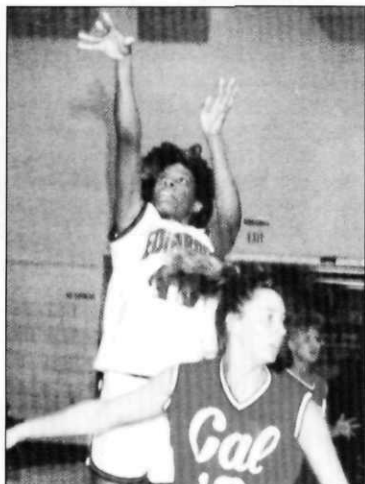

TAMMY WALKER-STRODE 1990-92 First Team Kodak All-American Honorable Mention Kodak All-American



A 6'0" forward from Lexington, KY, Tammy Walker-Strode capped an outstanding two years at Edinboro by earning a spot on the first team Kodak All-American squad in 1991-92. She set a school records that year for rebounding average (14.5 rpg.), while also scoring 23.0 ppg. Walker-Strode scored more points than any other two-year performer at Edinboro, finishing with 1,273 points to rank ninth all-time, and her 777 rebounds stands fourth. During the 1990-91 season, Walker-Strode was an honorable mention Kodak All-American.

JEANNINE JEAN-PIERRE 1991-93 First Team Kodak All-American



A 5'11" forward from St. Thomas, Virgin Islands, Jeannine Jean-Pierre earned a spot on the Kodak All-American first team in 1992-93 after averaging 21.4 ppg. and 11.7 rpg. A first

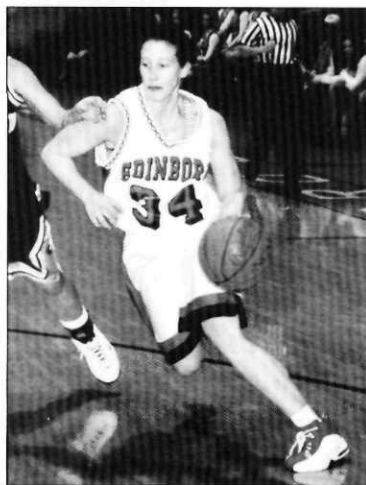
team All-PSAC West performer in both of her seasons at Edinboro, she was also the PSAC West Athlete of the Year in '92-93. Jean-Pierre ranks 11th in career scoring with 1,203 points and is eighth in career rebounding with 604.

HEATHER GATES 1994-98 Honorable Mention Kodak All-American



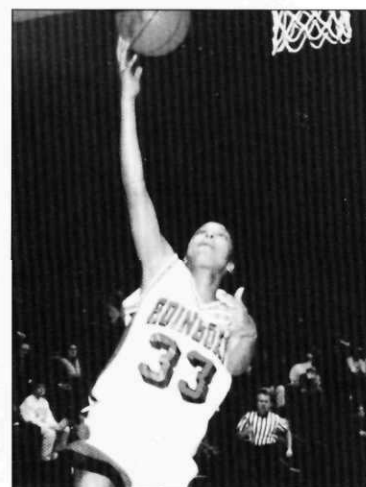
A 5'11" forward from Beachwood, OH, Heather Gates was accorded honorable mention Kodak All-American honors in 1996-97 after leading NCAA Division II in rebounding (14.3 rpg.). She was also recognized as the PSAC West Athlete of the Year that season, after previously being named the PSAC West Rookie of the Year in 1994-95. Gates averaged 14.1 ppg. in '96-97, and concluded her career with 1,320 points. That ranks eighth all-time, and she is one of only two players to score 1,000 career points and pull down 1,000 career rebounds. She is the career recordholder for rebounds with 1,301.

JESSICA ROWE 1996-2000 First Team Kodak All-American



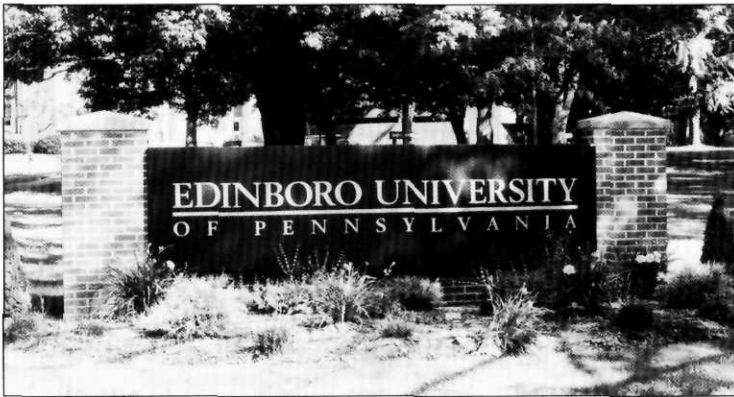
A 5'8" guard from Columbus, OH, Jessica Rowe earned first team Kodak All-American honors after averaging 21.3 ppg. and 4.6 rpg. during the 1999-2000 season. Rowe, a three-time All-PSAC performer, was also named the PSAC West Player of the Year in 1999-2000. She finished her career as Edinboro's all-time leading scorer with 1,846 points, and was second career assists with 453. Rowe also became the first Edinboro player to be recognized as the *Division II Bulletin* Co-Player of the Month for January.

MARIN HIGHTOWER 1997-2000 Honorable Mention Kodak All-American



The 6'1" forward from Pittsburgh, PA gained Kodak All-American Honorable Mention in 1999-2000. Hightower established a new Edinboro highwater mark with a scoring average of 23.6 ppg. in her senior season, also averaging 8.6 rebounds per game. In just three years as a Fighting Scot, Hightower tallied 1,218 points, ranking tenth all-time.

Edinboro University



HISTORY

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania was founded in 1857 as a private academy. Previously named Edinboro Academy, Edinboro State Normal School, Edinboro State Teachers College, and Edinboro State College, the University was the second normal school established in Pennsylvania and the 12th in the United States. On July 1, 1983, it became Edinboro University of Pennsylvania with the formation of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.

LOCATION

Edinboro University is located in the resort community of Edinboro -- just 15 miles south of Erie, Pennsylvania's fourth-largest city. Edinboro is conveniently located approximately 100 miles from Pittsburgh, Cleveland and Buffalo and is easily accessible from all directions because of its proximity to Interstates 79 and 90.

There are two lakes nearby. Edinboro Lake is a 250-acre recreational area with three guarded beaches for swimming, boating and other water sports. The Edinboro lakeside community features a large selection of cottages for rent. Lake Erie, one of the Great Lakes, is just 15 miles north. Edinboro also is close to several ski resorts for both downhill and cross country enthusiasts. The area is a popular hunting and fishing spot for outdoors enthusiasts.

The University is the largest employer in the area, with approximately 850 full and part-time employees, many of them current and former Edinboro University students.

ACADEMICS

Edinboro University offers a diversified and comprehensive selection of more than 100 degree programs, with 52 minors tailored to meet the needs of each student. With a student-faculty ratio of 18:1, Edinboro offers associate's, bachelor's and master's degrees in many specialized fields of study.

Edinboro has an undergraduate and graduate enrollment of more than 7,700 students.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Edinboro University is proud to feature one of the nation's top ten educational program for students with disabilities including services for the hearing impaired, the visually impaired, and the learning disabled. The campus is nearly 100-percent wheelchair accessible.

The University has an outstanding honors program for academically-gifted students and an international education program for the exchange of faculty and students.

Internships and field experiences integrate academic pursuits with on-site "real world" work situations and personal relationships, while numerous cultural, social and recreational activities are available.

CAMPUS FACILITIES

◆ Edinboro features 45 buildings on a spacious 585-acre campus which includes a five-acre lake, open fields and wooded area. Day, evening and weekend classes are available at Edinboro University in Erie -- the Porreco Center.

◆ There are seven on-campus residence halls housing 2,500 students.

◆ A state-of-the-art, seven-story library in the center of campus features more than 440,000 bound volumes and 1,200,000 microform units, an on-line public access catalog, on-line and CD-ROM searching systems, public access catalog for the visually impaired, and inter-library loan services.

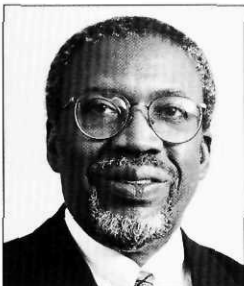
◆ Edinboro University houses a planetarium, modern science labs, solar observatory, robotics laboratory, TV studio, radio station, and a center for the performing arts.

◆ Edinboro also features a reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, math clinic, parent-child development center, and computer lab for children.

◆ Two Compaq large-scale servers, 2,157 personal computers and 36 computer labs with current hardware and software are available for student use throughout the year.

◆ The University Center boasts an indoor running track, saunas and whirlpools, weight room, racquetball and handball courts, full-service bookstore and dining areas, and an aerobics room.

Dr. Frank G. Pogue, Jr. President



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Pogue holds a Bachelor's Degree from Alabama State University, a Master's Degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor of student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central Administration in Albany, serving in that position for ten years. While vice chancellor, he

also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, Dr. Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. Since 1984, he has served on the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and is a former vice chair and member of its Executive Committee and currently

chair of its Task Force on Equity and Diversity. He was also recently appointed chairperson of their Advisory Committee on Institutional Financial Resources, which advises the Commission on the relationship of financial resources to institutional accreditation. In addition, Dr. Pogue serves as a member of the American Council on Education Commission on Government and Public Affairs which advises the Division of Government Relations on the broad range of issues in which congressional and executive branch actions affect colleges and universities. He is also a member of the College Board National Forum Committee. Dr. Pogue was also appointed to both the Executive Committee of the Commission on the Rural Agenda and the Task Force on Teacher Education of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities.

Based on the interest of State System University student government leaders across Pennsylvania to make civility a topic of discovery and discussion for the 1999-2000 academic year, Dr. Pogue has established the "Century of Civility" at Edinboro University in celebration of the new millennium. President Pogue also serves as chairperson for the Erie City and County Millennium Commission, "Together 2000."

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the boards of directors for the Erie Conference on Community Development; the United Way of Erie County; Congressman Phil English's High-Tech Advisory Task Force; Leadership Erie, the Presque Isle Partnership; the Erie County Fiscal Management Task Force; the French Creek Council of the Boy Scouts of America; the Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee; and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross. He has also been appointed to the Board of Corporators for both the Hamot Health Foundation and the St. Vincent Health Center.

Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.

Athletic Administration

Dr. Naomi T. Johnson

Vice President for Student Affairs and Student Success

Dr. Naomi T. Johnson is in her fifth year as the Vice President for Student Affairs and Student Success at Edinboro University. Those responsibilities include overseeing the Fighting Scot athletic program.

Prior to her appointment at Edinboro, Dr. Johnson served as the Associate Dean of Students at the University of California-Santa Barbara. Her wide range of experience in service to students includes past positions as peer counseling coordinator, assistant to the president for student

affairs, director of the campus activities center, and assistant dean of students.

One of Dr. Johnson's main objectives at Edinboro is to facilitate a creative and innovative campus atmosphere. She also looks to lead a united effort by the University Community to ensure a well-rounded education for students.

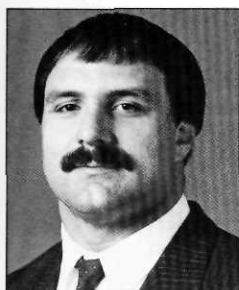

Bruce Baumgartner

Director of Athletics



Bruce Baumgartner is regarded as one of the greatest American wrestlers ever, being recognized as the U.S. Olympic Wrestler of the Century by Globalaxxess.com last year. Now Baumgartner is building a solid reputation as an athletic administrator. Baumgartner was named the acting Director of Athletics in 1997, then was awarded the job permanently in '98.

As the guiding force of the Fighting Scot athletic program, Baumgartner has initiated the Annual Athletic Fund Drive, a fundraising project designed to provide athletic scholarship funds. The University is also working on a gen-

der equity program in compliance with NCAA guidelines.

A four-time Olympic medalist, Baumgartner served as an Edinboro wrestling coach for nearly 13 years, including seven seasons as the head coach. He compiled a 70-36 record, including 14-0 dual meet record in 1997, the best finish in school history. The Scots then went on to finish sixth at the NCAA Division I Nationals, their highest finish ever.

Baumgartner affirmed his status as the greatest freestyle heavyweight

wrestler in American history by winning the bronze medal at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta to go along with two golds and a silver. It was his fourth Olympic medal and record-setting 13th world-level medal. Baumgartner was honored by his fellow United States Olympic athletes when he was chosen to carry the American flag for the opening ceremonies. He won his first gold medal in Los Angeles in 1984, America's first in 60 years of super heavyweight wrestling. Next came a silver medal performance at the 1988 Games in Seoul, Korea, followed by a second gold medal in Barcelona, Spain in '92 to become the first American wrestler to ever medal in three consecutive Olympics.

Honored as the winner of the James E. Sullivan Award in 1995 as the outstanding amateur athlete in the United States, Baumgartner had not lost to an American wrestler from 1981 through his retirement from competition in 1998.

As a collegiate wrestler at Indiana State University, Baumgartner won 134 of 146 collegiate matches with 73 falls. He was twice the runnerup at the national collegiate tournament, then posted a perfect 44-0 mark his senior year to capture the NCAA crown.

Baumgartner was honored by the NCAA as a "Top V Award" recipient for his athletic, leadership and academic success. He was later awarded an NCAA post-graduate scholarship after earning his Bachelor's Degree in Industrial Art Education. He utilized the award to earn a Master's Degree at Oklahoma State University, where he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant.

Baumgartner officially retired from wrestling in the summer of 1998, but still performs a great deal of community service as a motivational speaker and camp clinician. He and his wife, Linda, have three sons, Bryan (10), Zachary (7) and Dylan (4).
