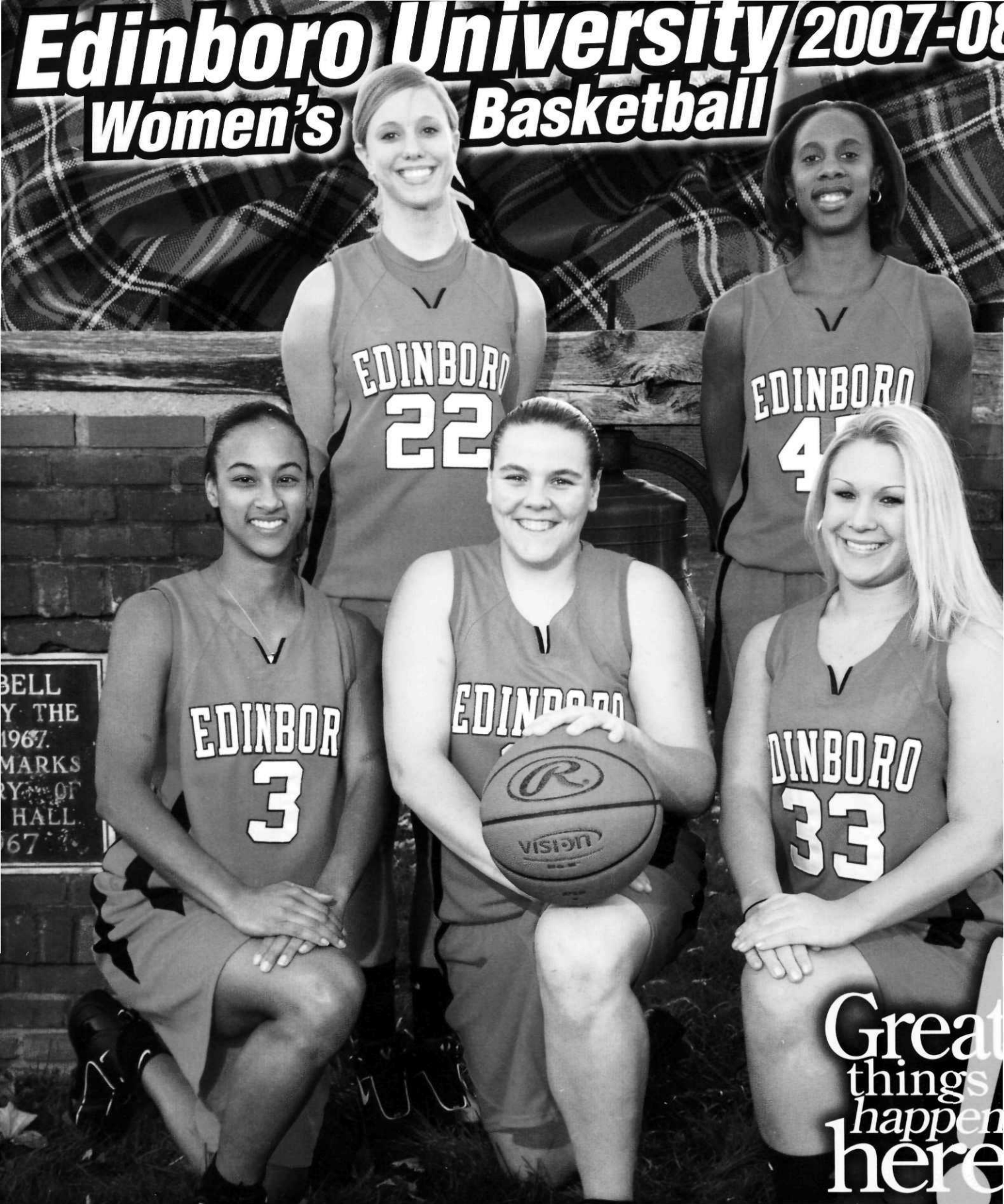

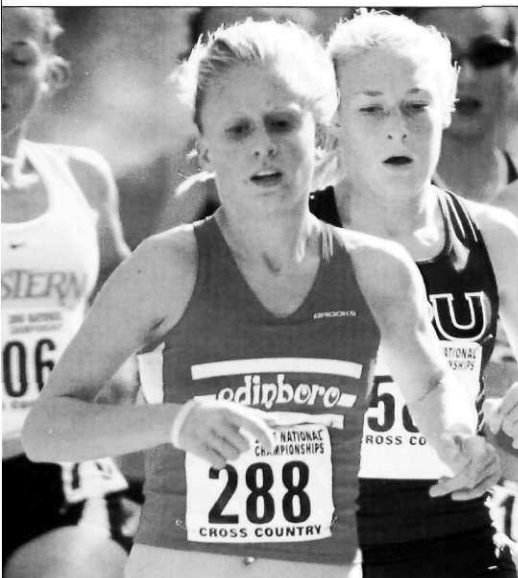

Edinboro Excels in 2006-07



Gregor Gillespie became Edinboro's third NCAA Division I National Champion in March, defeating Josh Churella of Michigan, 3-1 in overtime, to capture the 149 lb. national title. Gillespie was named the EWL and PSAC Wrestler of the Year after finishing the year with a 34-2 record.



Rachael Lanzel enjoyed an outstanding cross country season. The junior led the Fighting Scot women's cross country team to a tenth place finish at Nationals. Individually, she placed fourth at Nationals, the highest finish by an Edinboro female runner in years. In addition, Lanzel captured the PSAC championship and was named the PSAC Women's Runner of the Year.

As we embark on the 2007-08 academic year, it's hard not to take a look back and marvel at the accomplishments of the 2006-07 Fighting Scots. Edinboro athletics enjoyed a banner year, both on the playing fields and in the classroom.

Edinboro won a pair of Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championships, in women's cross country and wrestling, while no fewer than six teams made it to the NCAA Playoffs, or had individual representatives.

It's hard to know where to start, so we'll go by season. The football team finished at 6-5 under first-year coach Scott Browning, but linebacker Ben Stroup was named the PSAC West Defensive Player of the Year and quarterback Trevor Harris was chosen the PSAC West Rookie of the Year. Stroup would go on to be accorded first team AP Little All-America honors.

Volleyball also had a major award winner, as Olivia Williams was named the PSAC West Rookie of the Year.

But the fall belonged to the cross country teams. The women's team featured a youthful lineup all year, while the men's team was decimated by injury. Yet at the end of the year both qualified for Nationals, with the women's team finishing tenth and the men's squad 19th.

Rachael Lanzel led the women's team to its ninth straight PSAC title and won the individual crown. The junior would go on to earn All-American honors for the second time, finishing fourth at Nationals. Dave Niemira was an All-American on the men's side.

The wrestling team capped the winter season, although the wheelchair basketball team certainly gave the grapplers a run for their money. The Fighting Scot wrestlers finished in the top ten at the NCAA Division I wrestling championships for the second straight year, placing ninth. Three wrestlers earned All-American honors, led by Gregor Gillespie. The sophomore became Edinboro's third national champion, winning the crown at 149 lbs. Alex Clemens placed fourth at 184 lbs. and Deonte Penn repeated as an All-American at 165 lbs., finishing seventh.

In addition to the PSAC title, Edinboro won its fifth straight EWL crown and ninth in ten years.

The wheelchair basketball team hosted the 30th National Intercollegiate Wheelchair Basketball Tournament, and nearly came away with a national title. The Scots upset second-

seeded Illinois in the semifinals, then put a scare into top-ranked Wisconsin-Whitewater before eventually losing, 71-58. Jose Leep and Jason Matthews were accorded second team All-American honors, and Mike Looney was an Academic All-American.

Brooke Heath continued her incredible career in the pool. The junior earned three All-American certificates at Nationals, and is now an eight-time All-American in swimming.

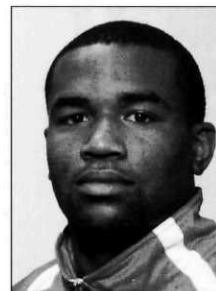
That takes us to the spring, where the softball team made its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Playoffs. Behind the left arm of Vanessa Rose, the Fighting Scots upset Kutztown and Shippensburg before finally being eliminated.

The success was just as evident in the classroom. Edinboro's annual Scholar-Athlete Banquet included 112 honorees. That means nearly forty percent of the total student-athlete population maintains a grade-point average of 3.00 or higher.

Clemens and Lanzel were also named to the PSAC Top Ten. Clemens was voted to the winter team for the second straight year, while Lanzel earned a spot on the fall team.

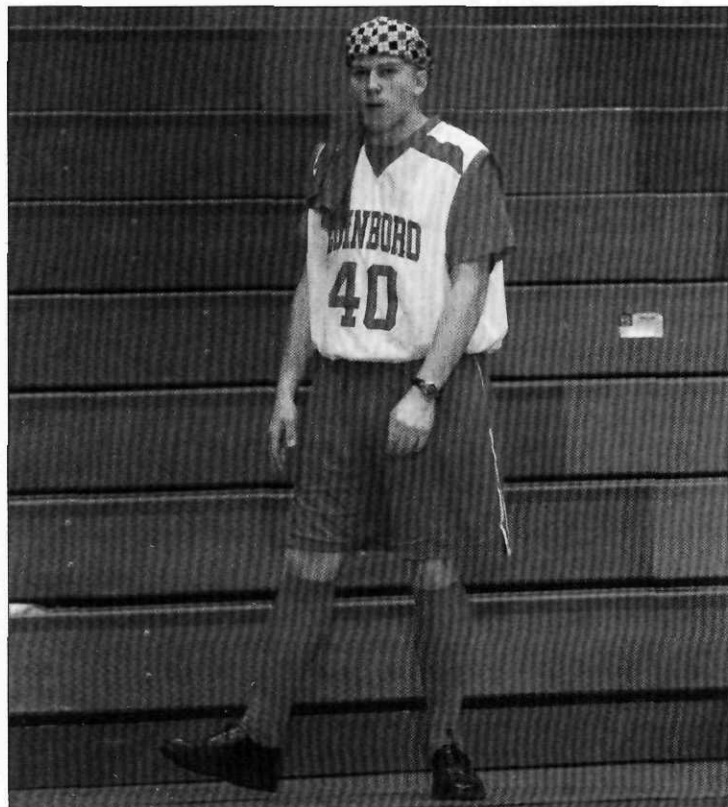

2007-08 Season Preview

Swank Looks for Winning Season with New Point Guard at the Helm

There's a twinkle in Stan Swank's eyes as he talks about his 2007-08 women's basketball team. The veteran Edinboro University coach openly admits that he's an optimist. But he has a special feeling about this year's team.

Maybe it's the seven returning letterwinners, or the group of youngsters he brought in. It could be the athleticism and versatility he sees in his young squad.

Or maybe it's as simple as having a true point guard. Throughout Swank's 20-year tenure, he has had standout point guards. The list goes on and on, including Meghan Miller, Courtney Thompson, Andrea Martre, and current assistant coach Callie Iorfido.

A year ago, however, he was forced to play shooting guards Kelly Calderone and Samantha Reimer at the point. Both made valiant efforts, but it impacted Calderone's scoring ability, and it was tough enough for a freshman like Reimer to start, let alone convert to the point.

Replacing Calderone certainly won't be easy. The three-time All-PSAC West selection led Edinboro in scoring each of her three seasons as a Fighting Scot, including 18.3 ppg. last season. She concluded her career with 1,460 points, good for fourth all-time.

"We have four of our top five leading scor-

ers back," Swank pointed out. "We have a good nucleus returning. Losing Kelly's 18 ppg. is tough, but we still have about 41 ppg. coming back from people who started last year. I think there's a great nucleus. It was amazing we won 14 games last year without a true point guard. Now it's one of our brightest spots. We have a couple excellent point guards."

The reason for Swank's optimism is Brittany Csatlos, a third team All-State selection a year ago. The 5'5" freshman epitomizes the true point guard, bringing back memories of Iorfido with her vision and court awareness. Her former high school teammate at Sharon High School, Janine McDonald, proved she is more than capable of playing the point last year in practice while redshirting.

Including McDonald, a redshirt freshman, the 2007-08 roster has five freshmen and three sophomores. Several of the freshmen are expected to play key roles, and two of the sophomores – Kelsey Conklin and Reimer – combined to average just over 25 ppg. a year ago. The two played a key role in helping the Fighting Scots finish with a 14-14 record and reach the PSAC Playoffs for the fifth straight year and seventh time in the last eight years.

Obviously, the youth has to be of concern to Swank. "We're young in a lot of ways," he admitted. "They're going to play a lot of key roles. That can be a good and a bad thing."

Another concern is rebounding, an age-old problem for the Fighting Scots. "Rebounding will be a key, key issue for us," Swank pointed out. "It is every year. Kelsey does a very good job. If our other post players and forwards rebound, we'll be in good shape.

"I think we'll be good offensively. We have the ability to score a lot of different ways. Last year we leaned a lot on Kelly. At times the other kids stood back and watched. Now everybody on the floor will have the ability to score."

Swank sees the versatility and athleticism leading to a more aggressive defensive approach. "Defensively we should be able to attack more because of our athleticism. We'll be able to use more presses, more traps."

If the youth isn't enough to overcome, Swank has assembled a schedule that will force his team to grow up in a hurry. "I think our schedule is very difficult," he stressed. "We have a tough start. We're away the entire month of December. That will be a monumental chore. With the exception of our first game, every game is against a Division II opponent. We picked up Gannon and Mercyhurst, and both games are away. We play West Liberty twice and go to Charleston. The PSAC West looks extremely strong. California and IUP are very strong. Shippensburg is always good. Clarion returns every player. Lock Haven has a new coach and eight new players. Slippery

Rock only won three conference games, but beat us twice last year."

It all starts for Edinboro on Saturday, November 17, as the Fighting Scots host Temple Baptist. That will be the last time Fighting Scot fans see their team at McComb Fieldhouse until January 5. In all, Edinboro has eight straight games on the road after the opener, including a pair of PSAC crossover double-headers at Millersville and West Chester and at Kutztown and East Stroudsburg. Throw in the games at Gannon, who was 25-6 and finished first in the GLIAC South Division last year, and Mercyhurst, along with games at West Liberty (21-10) and Charleston (23-8), and that eight-game stretch can only be described as "brutal".

Here's a look at the 2007-08 Fighting Scots, position-by-position:

BACKCOURT

The guard position features a ton of depth, but it all begins with Brittany Csatlos. The 5'5" freshman enjoyed an outstanding career at Sharon(Pa.) High School, capped by her selection as a third team Associated Press All-State performer. Csatlos averaged 16.7 ppg., 8.0 rpg., 8.2 assists, and 6.2 steals as a senior, leading the Tigers to the Class AAA Western Semifinals and a 23-6 record. She finished her career with 1,697 points.

More importantly, she provides the Fighting Scots with a true point guard. "Brittany runs the point," beamed Swank. "She is beyond her years. She doesn't play like a freshman. Brittany is a great passer with really good vision and court awareness. Plus, she can score."

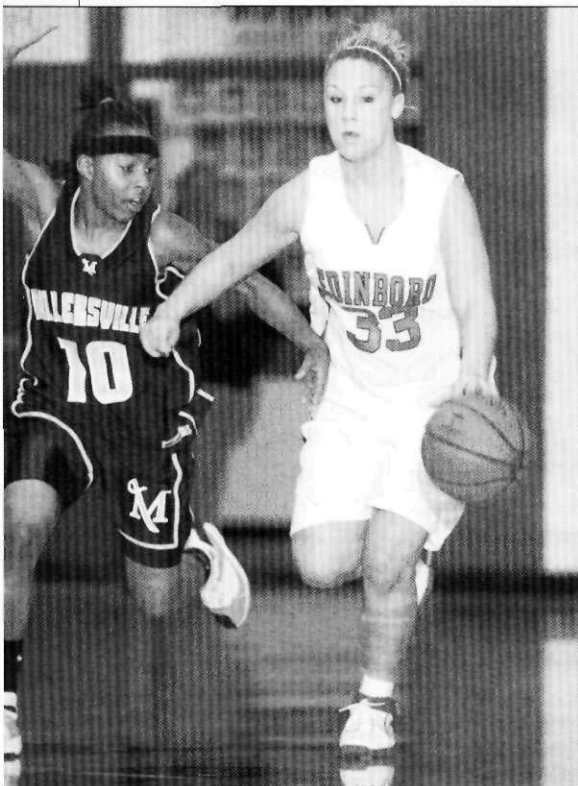
Edinboro will be able to give opponents a double-dose of the Sharon Tigers, as teammate Janine McDonald will once again team with Csatlos. McDonald, 5'7", redshirted a year ago, but showed plenty in practice.

"Janine will play the two," noted Swank. "What's nice is they've played together. Janine is an excellent, excellent player. She is very good offensively."

McDonald averaged 14.5 ppg. and 7.9 rpg. as a senior in 2005-06 at Sharon, with the Tigers finishing 28-2 and reached the Class AA quarterfinals. She played her freshman and senior years at Sharon, and her sophomore and junior campaigns at Warren(OH) Harding High School.

Samantha Reimer started 20 games a year ago while finishing as the second-leading scorer. She averaged 13.1 ppg. while finishing second on the team with 80 assists. The 5'6" sophomore showed an ability to get to the free throw line, making 121 of 158 (76.6 percent). She also made 35 of 116 three-pointers.

since she won't be expected to share ballhandling duties. "We know she can score," Swank commented. "She really worked hard and got in tremendous shape."

No fewer than five other players will look for playing time in the backcourt. Jen Boykin is the lone returnee in that group. The 5'6" senior came along a year ago, and is recognized as an excellent defensive performer. She played in all 28 games, scoring 31 points and pulling down 28 rebounds.

"Jen is tremendous defensively," stated Swank. "She has developed a little bit in terms of scoring. She gives us depth."

Casey Heller is a 5'7" sophomore who hails from nearby Meadville High School and played her freshman season at Glensville State. "Casey has been a nice preseason surprise," admitted Swank. "She's worked real hard. She runs well, and she brings the ability to shoot the three, plus she's physical. She's a strong, hard-nosed player."

Heller played in 30 games for a Glensville State team that was 33-3 a year ago. She averaged 1.8 ppg, while playing eight minutes per game. She scored 1,095 career points at Meadville.

Another player who has been a surprise is Kelly Lewis, a 5'6" freshman from nearby General McLane High School. Lewis helped lead the Lancers, coached by former Edinboro standout Meghan Meabon-Miller, to their first-ever PIAA playoff berth. She averaged 10.7 ppg.

"Kelly is young, but she is going to be really good," predicted Swank. "She's another player who has surprised us. She may be better than what we thought. She shoots the three, she's a hard-nosed, tough kid, and she has good speed."

Those same attributes apply to another freshman, Kayla O'Brien. The 5'7" guard from Notre Dame Cathedral Latin(OH) High School was an honorable mention All-State choice as a junior after averaging 11.0 ppg.

Last, but not least, there is Kelcie Hellmer, who provides Swank with a nice option given she is 6 feet tall. The freshman from Jefferson Area(OH) High School can play either guard or forward. She is a little raw, but she has the ability to shoot the three and also can rebound. Hellmer is a versatile athlete who was also a standout in volleyball and track. After averaging 13.3 ppg, as a junior, she was limited to ten games a year ago and averaged 7.2 ppg.

"Kelcie needs to get stronger and get experience," Swank noted. "She has the ability to shoot the three and has long arms. She will be a nice player."

FRONTCOURT

While the backcourt is loaded with youth and inexperience, the frontcourt has plenty of veteran players. Rae Sherred and Rachel Johnson are two of only three seniors on the team. Sherred is 5'9" and could also play in

the backcourt if needed. She has improved each year, including last season when she was the fourth-leading scorer at 9.3 ppg. Sherred was Edinboro's top three-point threat in 2006-07, making 49 of 166. She was one of three players to start all 28 games.

"Rae has the ability to play inside or outside," commented Swank. "She's an intelligent player and very strong. She can shoot the three, and is an intense competitor."

Johnson emerged as a big-minutes player a year ago, and in particular displayed an ability to play defense. After seeing limited action her first two years and scoring just 62 points, the thin 5'11" senior averaged 27 minutes per game while starting 24 contests. Johnson averaged 7.5 ppg, and was second on the team in rebounding (5.5 rpg.). She shot 55.3 percent from the floor, good for third all-time at Edinboro.

"Last year Rachel got a lot of experience," stated Swank. "She will give us a great deal of experience up front. She is very quick, and a good defensive player."

The future of the frontcourt is also the present in Kelsey Conklin. Swank noted a year ago that he thought the college game would be more to Conklin's liking, and she quickly proved him correct.

An athletic 6'1" sophomore who runs the floor extremely well, Conklin finished as the third-leading scorer (12.0 ppg.) and leading rebounder (7.5 rpg.). She shot a solid 46.0 percent from the floor and was second on the team in steals with 71. Conklin showed the ability to put up some big numbers, including 27 points and 12 rebounds against Shippensburg, and 20 rebounds vs. Charleston(WV).

"Kelsey was one of the top two freshmen in the conference last year, really second only to Lauren Beckley at Shippensburg," Swank pointed out. "She had a great freshman year. The college game really fits her. She has the potential to be even better."

To date, Edinboro's two post players, Kim Mardis and Jessica Trotter, have had their moments, but are still works in progress. Swank feels they may hold the key to a big year.

"If both are in good condition, they can be a big help," he stressed. "They need to become more consistent. If they can improve, they can provide big minutes."

Mardis is a 6'4" junior who averaged 1.3 ppg, and 2.4 rpg, while playing in 27 games and averaging just over eight minutes per contest. Despite the limited minutes, she blocked a team-high 28 points. Swank hopes she can have more games like the contest at Shippensburg last year, when she had four rebounds and seven blocked shots in just 12 minutes.

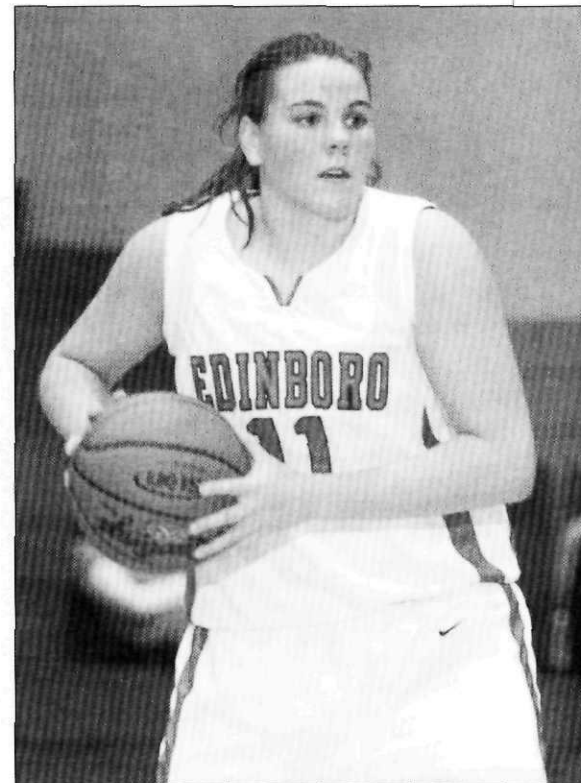
Trotter is a 6'5" junior who played in 22 games, scoring 10 points and pulling down 26 rebounds. She got off to a slow start due to an injury.

**21st Year
Purdue '76**



Now in his 21st season, Stan Swank has brought a winning tradition to Edinboro University. The winningest coach in Fighting Scot women's basketball history, Swank has had 15 winning seasons during his 20-year tenure while compiling a 342-219 overall mark. He is currently tied for 26th among active Division II coaches in wins with 342. Swank and West Chester coach Deirdre Kane have been at their respective PSAC schools longer than any other coaches in the conference.

Edinboro women's basketball has enjoyed eight 20-win seasons, with Swank directing the Fighting Scots to six of those. All told, six of his Fighting Scot editions have reached the NCAA Division II playoffs, with Edinboro qualifying for the PSAC postseason tournament fourteen times. On seven of those occasions the Fighting Scots have advanced to the championship game, winning the PSAC title in 1989-90. In the NCAA Division II Tournament, Swank has guided Edinboro to the Final 32 twice, the Sweet 16 and the Elite Eight.

A year ago the Fighting Scots finished with a 14-14 record and finished fourth in the PSAC West despite featuring a starting five that included two freshmen. The PSAC playoff appearance was Edinboro's 10th in the last 12 years.

The 2005-06 Edinboro edition added to Swank's legacy. The Fighting Scots advanced to the PSAC Championship game for the first time since the 1997-98 season, winning playoff contests over Indiana(Pa.) and Kutztown. Edinboro met California(Pa.) in the title game, and battled the defending champions down to the wire before the Vulcans hit four free throws in the final seven seconds for a 63-59 win. Edinboro advanced to the NCAA Playoffs for the first time since that 1997-98 campaign. Charleston(WV) handed the Fighting Scots a 71-62

defeat, ending the Boro's season at 21-10. The 21 wins represented the most since 23 wins in 1997-98.

Three years ago Swank's Fighting Scots posted their second straight 18-10 ledger, finishing fourth in the PSAC West. Edinboro jumped out to a 14-2 record, capped by an eight-game winning streak. The year before Edinboro surprised the rest of the PSAC by going 18-10 to finish third in the PSAC West. Three of the losses came to national champion California(Pa.), along with setbacks to nationally-ranked West Texas A&M and Emporia State.

After enduring just his fourth losing season in 2001-02 with a 12-14 record, Swank guided his 2002-03 edition to a 16-12 record. Picked to finish fifth in the preseason coaches poll, the Fighting Scots tied for third to return to postseason action.

In 2000-01, Swank led a young outfit which had to replace Jessica Rowe and Marin Hightower to a surprising 17-10 finish. The veteran coach employed a variety of tactics to take advantage of his entire roster, including inserting his entire second team enmasse for the starters. The Scots qualified for the PSAC Tournament. Despite a losing record in 1999-2000 (13-14), the Fighting Scots reached the PSAC Tournament.

Swank came to Edinboro in 1987 after an outstanding career as head coach at Parkland (IL) Junior College, where he recorded an impressive 104-20 overall mark.

His first Edinboro squad finished 14-11 overall, barely missing the PSAC playoffs. Building off the previous year's success, the 1988-89 team captured the PSAC Western Division crown, compiling a 21-6 overall record. Swank was chosen PSAC West Coach of the Year as the program won 20 games for the first time in nearly a decade.

The Scots repeated as PSAC West champions in 1989-90 and won the PSAC tournament for the first time ever. Edinboro also advanced to the NCAA Division II national tournament, winning its first NCAA playoff game in history to advance to the Sweet 16. The team finished with a school-record 27 wins, and Swank was named PSAC West Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

Swank's 1991-92 team finished 22-8 overall and was the PSAC runner-up. The Scots also made another appearance in the NCAA national tournament. The Fighting Scots again finished second in the PSAC in '92-93 and appeared in the national tournament for the third time in four years. After a two-year hiatus, Swank's 1995-96 team returned to the postseason, as the Scots finished 15-13 overall. Edinboro beat PSAC

East tri-champion Kutztown in the opening round of the PSAC tournament.

Edinboro was the PSAC West co-champion and the PSAC tournament runner-up in 1996-97, with Swank once again earning Coach of the Year honors. The Scots then posted three victories in the NCAA tournament to win the East Regional title and earn a berth in the NCAA Elite Eight. Edinboro finished the year 24-9, the second highest win total in school history.

The '97-98 Fighting Scot squad also made a run in the NCAA Playoffs after finishing as the runner-up in the PSAC Tournament. Edinboro defeated the University of Charleston before suffering an 88-78 loss to PSAC-rival Shippensburg in the NCAA's.

The Fighting Scots jumped out to a 9-0 start in 1998-99 and were ranked 16th in the USA Today WBCA Division II poll. Ravaged by injuries, Edinboro dropped 10 of its next 17 contests, finishing the year 16-10 and missing the PSAC playoffs.

During his tenure Swank has had 40 All-PSAC performers, two PSAC West Rookie of the Year recipients, and seven Kodak All-Americans.

He has received numerous honors, being named the PSAC West Coach of the Year four times and Edinboro University's Coach of the Year twice.

Swank played baseball while attending Purdue University and earned his bachelor's degree in Physical Education in 1976. He completed work on his master's degree in Educational Administration at Purdue in 1979. He embarked on his head coaching career at Fisher High School in Illinois, where his boys team compiled a 39-14 record in two seasons. In 1983, he moved on to Parkland Junior College, where his Cobra team won four consecutive sectional championships and finished second twice, and third once, in the NJCAA Region 24.

Swank and his wife Gail have two sons, Stan II, 24, and Benjamin, 20, and reside in Edinboro. Gail received her master's degree in Education Administration from Edinboro and is currently the principal at Corry Middle School. Stan II also graduated from Edinboro with his bachelor's degree in Computer Science. He is currently a commercial pilot. Benjamin is a freshman wide receiver on the football team at Edinboro.

Former Fighting Scot standout Callie Iorfido was named Stan Swank's assistant coach this past September. It marks the first coaching position for Iorfido.

"I am so excited to have such an extraordinary person return to our program," related Swank upon her hiring. "Callie was a great player during her days at Edinboro and will now return to impart her knowledge of the game to our players. It is very exciting that she has an understanding of our system both on and off the court. She will know first hand about the PSAC and what it takes to be

successful in the Western Division.

"Ultimately, she will be a spectacular role model as a former great player and as an excellent student," Swank continued. "It will be exciting to have her involved in the recruitment of future players. She will be a huge asset having played and gone to school here. She is the prime example of 'Great Things Happen Here!'"

Iorfido, a native of Ambridge, PA, played for the Fighting Scots from 2002-06, and ranks as one of the all-time greatest players in Edinboro history. She became Edinboro's sixth Kodak/WBCA All-American, and first since 1999-00, as she earned honorable mention All-American honors. That capped a brilliant senior season in which she was named the PSAC West Athlete of the Year and was a first team All-PSAC West selection. In addition, she was selected as the Nancy Acker Award winner in 2006.

The 5'5" guard finished as Edinboro's second-leading scorer at 12.5 ppg. as a senior, and also added 5.1 rpg. More importantly, she set a school record with 249 assists while turning the ball over just 89 times.

She led the PSAC in both assists and steals, finishing with 95 in the latter category.

Edinboro had had just one triple-double in its history prior to 2005-06, when Iorfido accomplished the feat twice. The first came against Seton Hill (20 points, 11 rebounds, 14 assists), followed by 29 points, 14 rebounds and 10 assists in her final home appearance vs. Shippensburg.

As a junior, Iorfido earned second team All-PSAC West accolades after averaging 10.4 ppg. and handing out 225 assists, along with recording 91 steals. The assists ranks third all-time. She led the Fighting Scots to a 21-10 record that season, along with the team's first berth in the NCAA Division II Playoffs since 1998.

Iorfido likely ranks at the top in a long line of standout point guards at Edinboro. While not taking over as the starter until her junior season, she concluded her career with 682 assists, despite missing the final seven games of the 2003-04 campaign due to an injury. That figure is second all-time in the PSAC. In addition, Iorfido finished with 283 career steals, a figure which ranks fourth all-time at Edinboro. She fell just shy of reaching 1,000 points for her career, finishing with 932.

The Iorfido name has made quite an impact in Edinboro athletics.

Her father Rich was a standout linebacker for the Edinboro football team from 1970-72, and was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame in April 2007. Younger sister Mandie is a senior catcher on the softball team, and is a two-time All-PSAC West performer.

A native of Ambridge, PA, Iorfido received her Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education in December 2006, along with a minor in Coaching. She graduated with a 3.46 GPA.

Combination of Youth, Experience Leads to PSAC Playoff Berth

Ever the optimist, Edinboro head coach Stan Swank entered the 2006-07 season with high expectations. He had several pieces back from a team which finished 21-10 the year before and played in the NCAA Playoffs after reaching the PSAC Championship game.

Unfortunately, what Swank didn't have was a true point guard. He had been spoiled for the previous few years as first Courtney Thompson, then Callie Iorfido ran the point.

Swank ended up juggling Kelly Calderone and Samantha Reimer, a pair of two guards, at the point. To their credit, it worked out just fine, but both were more scoring-oriented and not necessarily the type of floor general Swank was used to.

However, Calderone enjoyed another outstanding season while earning All-PSAC West honors for the third straight year, and Reimer became part of a dynamic freshman combination. When it was all said and done, the Fighting Scots finished 14-14 and earned a spot in the PSAC Tournament for the fifth straight year.

Calderone averaged 18.3 ppg. and 4.9 rpg., in addition to leading the Fighting Scots with 124 assists and 73 steals. She was a first team All-PSAC West selection for the second straight year. The 5'7" guard concluded a brilliant career with 1,460 points, the fourth-highest total in school history. Not bad for someone who played her first season at the University at Buffalo before transferring to Edinboro.

She also set the school record for career free throws made (415) and career free throw percentage (.856).

Reimer and fellow freshman Kelsey Conklin provided the Fighting Scots with a youthful burst of energy, not to mention just over 25 ppg. Reimer averaged 13.1 ppg., second on the team, and also ranked second in assists with 80. The 5'7" guard turned fearless drives to the basket

into plenty of trips to the foul line. She made 121 of 158 free throw attempts. Reimer served notice that she wasn't intimidated by the college game in her very first contest, scoring 25 points in a win over Goldey-Beacom.

Conklin, meanwhile, was a player who Swank felt would be even better as a collegian than in high school, where she starred at nearby General McLane High School. He appeared to be a genius with that prediction.

A 6'1" forward who runs the floor like a guard, Conklin averaged 12.0 ppg. and a team-leading 7.5 rpg. She also ranked second in steals with 71. She keyed the 81-71 upset of nationally-ranked Charleston(WV) with 11 points and 20 rebounds.

Several other returnees made huge strides, most notably Rae Sherrerd and Rachel Johnson. Sherrerd had actually already exhibited a greater impact late in the 2005-06 campaign. The 5'9" swingman continued to grow as a player a year ago, averaging 9.3 ppg. and 4.6 rpg. while leading the Fighting Scots with 49 three-pointers in 166 attempts. What didn't show up in the box score was her hard-nosed defensive play.

The same could be said for Johnson, a thin 5'11" forward who had scored just 62 points and pulled down 53 rebounds her first two seasons. As a junior, Johnson averageed 7.5 ppg. and 5.5 rpg., the latter figure second on the team. She shot 55.3 percent from the floor, the third-highest total in school history. Johnson also played spirited defense, even at times being ask to guard the opposing team's point guard.

Sophomore Kim Mardis and junior Jen Boykin were role players who played a big part in the team's success. Mardis, a 6'4" center, only scored 34 points and averaged 2.4 rpg., but she blocked 28 shots while averaging less than ten minutes per game. Boykin, meanwhile, was a defensive catalyst, and ended up starting eight games late in the year.

The Fighting Scots got off to a fast start, winning their first three games. The season began with an 87-72 win over Goldey-Beacom, followed by a 58-37 defeat of UNC Pembroke.

Victory number three was the impressive one. The Fighting Scots handed 14th-ranked Charleston(WV) an 81-71 defeat. Kelly Calderone had 32 points and 10 rebounds, and in the process went over 1,000 points for her career.

However, a three-game losing streak ensued, signalling a year in which the Fighting Scots would win a few and lose a few. Two of the losses came at home, to Millersville and West Chester. In fact, at the end of the year Edinboro was just 6-7 at home.

Next came a three-game winning streak, punctuated by a 69-54 win against an East Stroudsburg team that came in undefeated and would finish as the Eastern Division champion with a 25-4 record.

The 2006 portion of the season ended with a pair of losses in the Fighting Scot Invitational, albeit to a pair of the best teams in the WVIAC in Glensville State and West Liberty State.

2006 began with a 65-51 win at Cheyney, but four losses in the next five games left the Scots staring at a stretch of six losses in eight games.

The PSAC West campaign opened with three straight losses to Shippensburg, Slippery Rock and Indiana(Pa.), but the Fighting Scots then turned around and won four straight games. The last two were particularly impressive. The first was a 77-59 win over California(Pa.), snapping a 12-game losing streak to the Vulcans. Calderone led the way with 26 points.

Edinboro then avenged its earlier loss at home to Shippensburg by going on the road and handing the Lady Raiders 65-53 defeat. The Fighting Scots had lost 16 of its previous 17 meetings at Heiges Field House. Mardis keyed the win, blocking 7 shots in just 12 minutes.

The Shippensburg victory left the Scots with a 12-9 record. They would win just two of their final final contests, but thanks to a 6-6 record in the PSAC West they finished fourth to qualify for the playoffs.

Edinboro played at IUP in the first round of the playoffs. The Fighting Scots held a 23-22 lead at the half, but the Crimson Hawks shot 68.6 percent in the second half and prevailed 81-58.

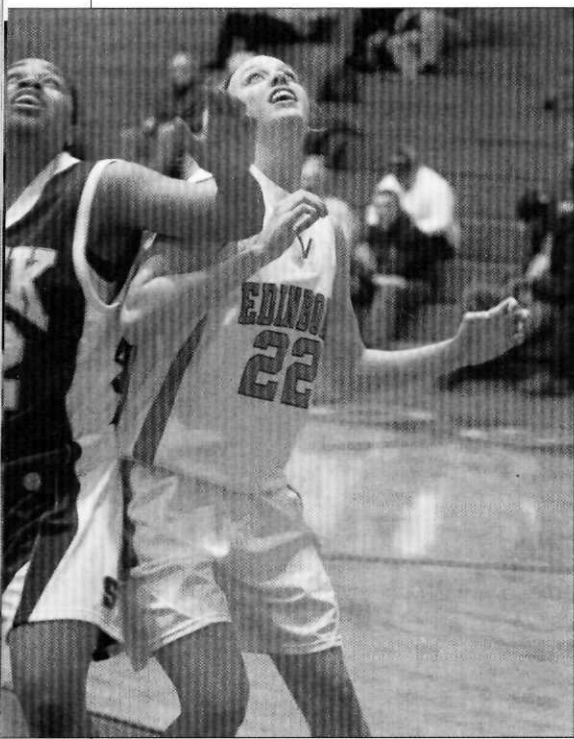

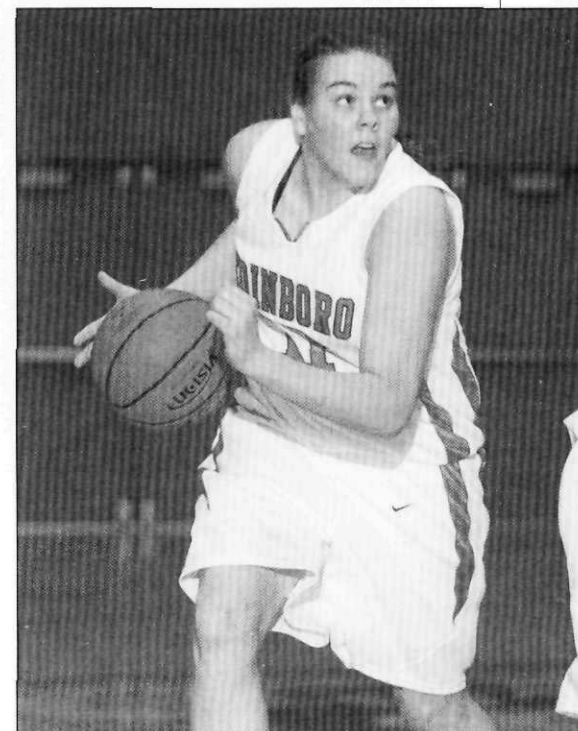

Kelly Calderone Completes Outstanding Career



Kelly Calderone joined the Edinboro women's basketball program in the 2004-05 season after transferring from Division I University at Buffalo. As it turned out, the 5'7" guard was everything head coach Stan Swank expected and then some.

When it was all said and done, Calderone was a three-time All-PSAC West selection who would move into fourth place in career scoring with 1,460 points, while setting career records for free throws made and career free throw percentage.

She previously was a first team choice as a junior, and earned second team honors as a sophomore in her first year as a Fighting Scot.

DEADLY AT THE CHARITY STRIPE

As mentioned, Calderone departs not only holding the Edinboro record for career free throw percentage, but also the PSAC record at 85.9 percent.

She set the season record for free throw percentage in 2005-06, making 145 of 165 (87.9 percent).

Finally, she set the record for consecutive free throws made a year ago. The record was 46 in a row, started in 2005-06 and finished in 2006-07. Later in the year Calderone added a streak of 28 in a row.

PLENTY OF SPOTS IN THE RECORD BOOK

Calderone was a player who contributed in a number of ways, and it showed when it comes to the career rankings. She completed her career fourth in career scoring (1,460 points), while setting the career record for free throws made (415) and career free throw percentage (.859). The latter figure also ranks first all-time in the PSAC. She also stands fourth in career free throws attempted (485), is fourth in career three-pointers made (153), and fifth in career three-pointers attempted (446). Throw in the fact that she ranks 11th in career steals (195) and 13th in career assists (263), and she had a busy career. Finally, her career scoring average of 16.8 ppg. ranks third.

CAPS CAREER WITH NANCY ACKER AWARD AND NCAA DEGREE COMPLETION AWARD

Her career concluded, Calderone received the ultimate honor at Edinboro when she was voted the Nancy Acker Award winner, given to the outstanding senior female athlete.

Later in the summer she would receive another award, this one from the NCAA when she was awarded an NCAA Degree Completion Award. The award is designed to financially assist student-athletes who have completed their eligibility and are within 30 hours of degree completion. Calderone is completing work on her degree in Nursing.

CALDERONE COMPLETES AMBRIDGE CONNECTION

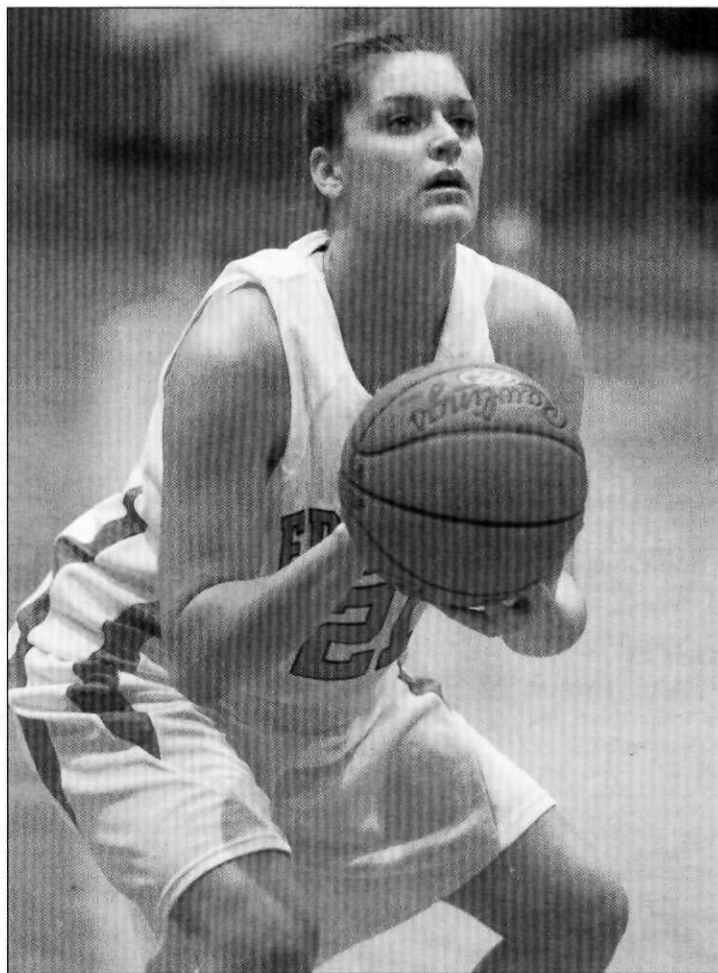
With Calderone's departure, the tremendous trio of Ambridge High School players at Edinboro is complete. Back in 2001 Swank brought in Jodi Calderone, Kelly's older sister. Next came Callie Iorfido, and then in 2004 Kelly joined the Fighting Scots, in time to team with her sister to help Edinboro to an 18-10 record.

The following year the backcourt tandem of Calderone and Iorfido led Edinboro to a 21-10 finish and a berth in the NCAA Playoffs. Both players were accorded first team All-PSAC West honors.

All told, the trio of Ambridge players combined to score 3,232 points.

ONE OF THREE THREE-TIME ALL-PSAC SELECTIONS

Calderone became just the third Fighting Scot to earn All-PSAC honors three times in her career after being named to the first team a year ago.



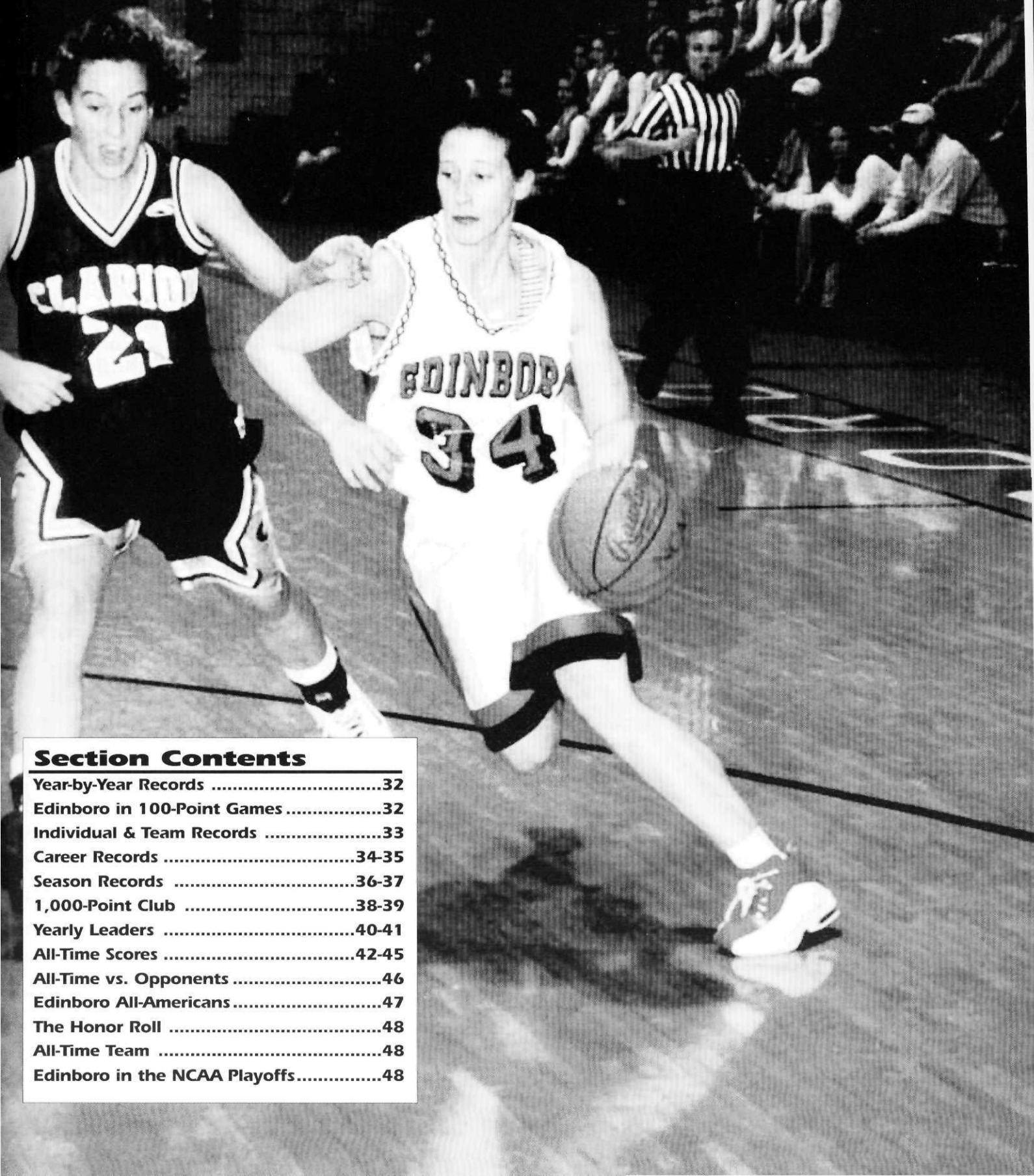

Edinboro All-Time Team

In conjunction with Edinboro University's celebration of its Sesquicentennial, the Athletic Department recognizing its all-time teams in a variety of sports last year. A total of twelve former players were selected to the All-Time Women's Basketball Team. The group is highlighted by the six former players who have earned All-American honors. That includes:

Jessica Rowe, Edinboro's all-time leading scorer with 1,846 points, and a first team Kodak All-American in 1999-2000

Tammy Walker-Strode, Edinboro's lone two-time All-American, earning a spot on the Kodak All-American first team in 1991-92 after landing a spot on the honorable mention team in 1990-91. Walker-Strode played two seasons at Edinboro and ranks ninth in career scoring (1,273 points) and fourth in career rebounds (777).

Jeannine Jean-Pierre, a two-year performer for the Fighting Scots who was a first team Kodak All-American in 1992-93 when she averaged 21.4 ppg. and 11.7 rpg. Heather Gates, who was an honorable mention Kodak All-American choice in 1996-97 after leading Division II in rebounding (14.3 rpg.). She is one of only two players to reach 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in her career, finishing with 1,320 points and 1,301 rebounds.

Marin Hightower, a 1999-2000 honorable mention All-American who set a school record with 23.6 ppg. that season.

Callie Iorfido, an honorable mention All-American in 2006 when she set the school record for career assists with 682. That figure ranks second all-time in the PSAC.

The rest of the team is still a who's-who of Edinboro women's basketball, and represents several eras. From the 1980's there is Tina Skidmore, who played from 1977-81 and ranks eighth in career scoring with 1,337 career points. Sarah Bishop leads a contingent of three players from the late '80's, all who were integral parts of the 1989-90 team which finished 27-3. Bishop played from 1986-90 and ranks third in career scoring with 1,652 points. She is joined by Montique Wade, the second all-time leading scorer and the only other player with 1,000 points and rebounds (1,113 rebounds, also second), and Andrea Martre, who was the point guard on the '89-90 squad.

The 1990's includes players like Meghan Miller, who ranks fourth in career scoring (1,426 points), and Pam Artman, who ranks second in career assists (500) and first in career steals (304).

This is Edinboro University



Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is the largest and most comprehensive institution of higher education in northwestern Pennsylvania. This year we welcome the 16th President of the University, Dr. Jeremy D. Brown. Under his leadership we begin a new era: "Great Things Happen Here!" and have launched plans to grow the size and academic standards of the University.

Edinboro's 585-acre campus is home to nearly 8,000 students studying in more than 100 academic programs. The University's majors in art, animation, criminal justice, education, and speech language pathology have earned regional recognition and national accolades.

The University is located just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of Erie, Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, Crawford County's seat, is located 20 miles to the south.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 500,000 bound volumes and 1.4 million microform units, along with an online catalog access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The library is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

In the 2007-08 academic year the University will complete a \$20 million expansion and renovation of the Frank G. Pogue Student Center and the construction of a \$5 million, state-of-the-art music building, and Sox Harrison Stadium will have artificial turf, lighting, and a new scoreboard. Edinboro is beginning the largest construction project in the school's history – a 1,500-bed apartment-style housing complex to replace Scranton and Shafer Halls and Lawrence Towers.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are more than 40 buildings on the spacious Edinboro campus, including residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learning floors – all wired for voice, video and data.

The University also operates Edinboro University in Erie – the Porreco Center, a beautiful 27-acre facility that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for hosting small conferences, business meetings and special events. Edinboro University in Meadville is the University's most recent expansion and is located in the city's historic Bessemer Building. All campuses are connected by convenient EMTA bus service free to students, faculty and staff.

Dr. Jeremy D. Brown

President, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania



Dr. Jeremy D. Brown became the 16th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 2007.

He succeeds Dr. Frank G. Pogue, who served as the University's president since July 1996.

Dr. Brown came to Edinboro from SUNY-Canton where he served as provost since 2003. As the 2,600-student university's chief academic officer, he steered campus-wide strategic planning, oversaw vigorous growth in distance

learning opportunities and cultivated many international collaborations. During his tenure at SUNY Canton, the number of baccalaureate degrees doubled and external funding increased by 50 percent. While he was at SUNY Canton, many departments reported to Dr. Brown, including academic affairs, institutional research, library, information technology, grants, registrar, small business development, extended studies and national and international development initiatives. While there, Dr. Brown was elected Vice Chair of the SUNY Chief Academic Officers Association.

Dr. Brown is a native of Manchester, England, and earned both a Bachelor of Science and a Ph.D. in physics from the University of Birmingham, England. His doctoral work was in the area of experimental nuclear physics, conducted at both Birmingham University and the University of California-Berkeley. Immediately following the completion of his Ph.D., Dr. Brown spent two years at Indiana University doing nuclear physics research.

Following his stint in Indiana, Dr. Brown accepted a faculty position in the Physics Department of Princeton University, where in addition to continuing his research, he taught undergraduate and graduate-level physics courses. During this period, he also served as a resident faculty fellow at Rockefeller College and was the fac-

ulty liaison for academic and social programs.

Transitioning into academic administration, Dr. Brown was named associate dean of the Graduate School at Yale University. His portfolio included the Science, Engineering and Biomedical Departments as well as recruitment of underrepresented minority students. In addition, Dr. Brown served as the Graduate School's chief budget officer.

Later, Dr. Brown returned to Princeton as associate dean of the faculty. During this appointment, Dr. Brown advised the dean of faculty and provost on long-range academic planning and budgeting. He also supervised appointments, promotions, salaries and personnel issues for the 960 members of the technical, research and library staffs.

In 2000, Dr. Brown was named rector of Florida State-Panama, serving as the chief executive officer of a small U.S. university operating in Latin America. While he was there, enrollment, the curriculum and revenues grew dramatically. He developed strategic plans for growth, and designed and implemented a national and international recruiting program.

During his career, Dr. Brown has published many scholarly articles and has been an invited speaker at international conferences, research institutions and universities. He served as a visiting scientist at the University of Stellenbosch, the University of Manitoba, the Department of Nuclear Physics at Oxford University and the National Accelerator Centre in Cape Town.

Dr. Brown and Rebeca, his wife, are leaving their farm in upstate New York to live in Edinboro. When not out in his apple orchard, Dr. Brown likes to play squash. He coached the St. Lawrence University men's and women's squash teams for the past three years, taking them to the national tournament. Weather permitting, Dr. Brown also enjoys sailing or skiing, and particularly takes delight in spending time with his two sons, Lucas and Gabriel, and visiting his family in England. Having taken film courses while on sabbatical at Oxford University, Dr. Brown likes, when time permits, to unwind by watching movies. Being from Manchester, Dr. Brown is an avid fan of the Manchester United soccer team.

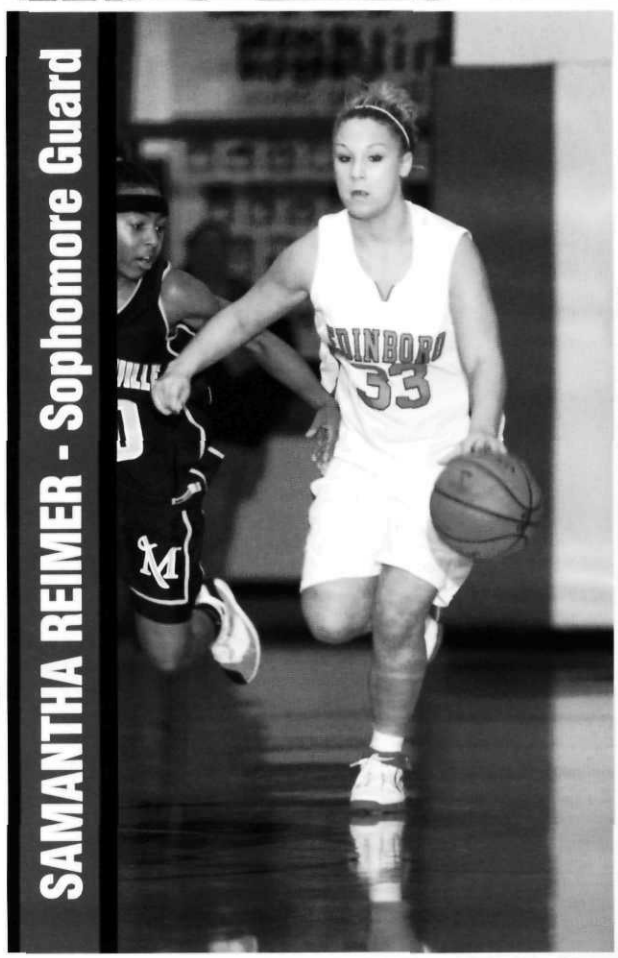

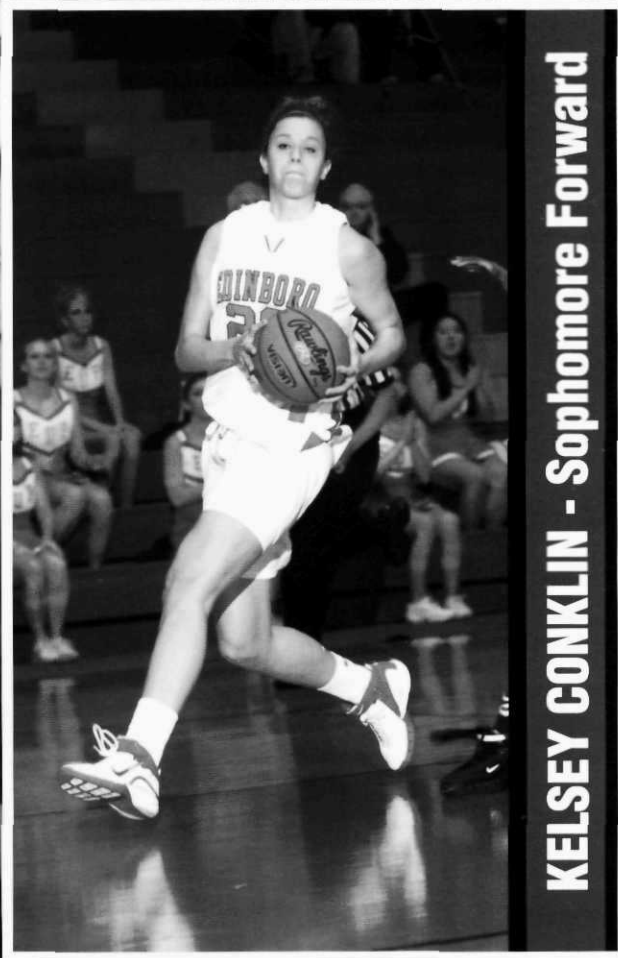
