cake I expect John and I and two

how time flies Jan 11 my Boy will  
be 38 years old perhaps I would had  
~~Grand~~ children what I have and see  
down here makes me feel almost thank-  
full I am alone, John is not well  
and his hands are weak cannot work  
even if he could get work he was  
to the Hds. last week had a little  
time went to see Maymie Amos  
~~and the~~ ~~and~~ ~~and~~ well Mama  
Beth Parker & Littie had just

been there Marjorie said every  
body is making "Booze" even Aunt  
Mandy what do you know about that,  
Ethel is clerking in the Misses  
Willing Fancy store just above 7st.  
on Peach, has dark hair short & fat  
quite a good looking woman usually  
~~wears black skirts very short~~  
waists very low in front, Ethel  
is or was clerking at Trasks she

Dear Ella and Family  
Your letter rec'd and glad  
I was to hear from you  
if it was not for the letters  
~~I get from my Grandmother~~  
would be bluer than I am  
I am I ought not to complain  
I am in a pleasant location  
a good comfortable house and  
very nice neighbors but it is  
not home there has a lady  
just left complaining  
because I don't come and  
~~see them, Thomas Peck~~  
is to be buried tomorrow  
another old neighbor gone  
we have had some cold

winter weather my plants  
have not got-frosted yet -  
have some in two rooms  
up stairs and some in a  
room off the kitchen where  
there is no fire I miss the  
mammure water for them  
have tried to get some  
~~Nitrate of Soda~~ for them  
yes I think the girls have  
done fine going to Sabbath  
& school I judge they are  
growing by the hems having  
to be let down  
for pity sake dont make  
their dresses so low in the  
neck and short in the  
skirts ~~it is not decent~~  
some of the women & girls  
dress we are on the corner  
where they get on & off the

few colored men go tramping  
a long the Lake Shore R R is  
just below us & Nickle Plate  
about us. do you see it is  
handy the Methodists are  
begining to pay for their  
Church so one had about  
as never seen a Tramps come in  
what do you think I am  
keeping boarders this is  
the fourth week have  
two Gentlemen one room  
the Continental Grocery  
store the other sells  
Stock last Saturday they  
sold \$160. worth of Groceries  
& sugar there is four other  
stores here they sell a 24 oz  
of Bread 10<sup>c</sup> every thing is  
cheaper the goods are fine

The North Grind & Baker  
sakes the Bread for the Erie  
Stores also, the Grind  
Baker comes down here  
also Fitches & Erie Baking  
Co, have a Butcher shop  
here Wieslogels Meat Auto  
Wed & Sat an other man Tues  
Thurs & Sat he has home  
made Sausage 20¢ per lb round  
steak 19¢ per lb so you see  
we wont go hungry if we  
have the price we hear  
stills are raining every  
where I see a piece in the  
paper 1926 the Undertakers  
would reap a rich harvest  
they tell about the stuff -  
I wouldn't think one  
would last that long  
I am piecing a quilt -

cover just 5 square blocks  
 $2\frac{3}{4}$  in square 25 for a block  
nothing nice but I had some  
pieces & that would use them  
up colored a living red & got  
some Chally & covered a quilt  
for John, he went to Erie  
a weak a go to day and had  
five roots and two whole  
teeth pulled ~~no more teeth~~  
has got along real well  
so far the men had hard  
colds they are better now  
I have got it, it affects my  
head legs & feet seems as  
tho the bones were pinching  
tho my heels, wish you were  
here to make me a calico  
dress Margery Bacon is  
coming some day this  
week said you will have  
a Polly Prim apron what

it is like I dont know  
she is a good gal like you  
used to be to fix me up  
she lives in Erie but is up  
visiting she was here Sunday  
John said she was meas-  
uring my table length  
& width it is oak top &  
wicker work have Brocker  
~~work with chair tapistry &~~  
wicker a China Cabinet  
that is all that is new  
well I guess I have told  
you all I know cant you  
get your meals so the  
Girls can get them you  
come and stay all night  
and see how we look then  
~~just the Girls on the car~~  
and let them come let us  
know and we will watch
