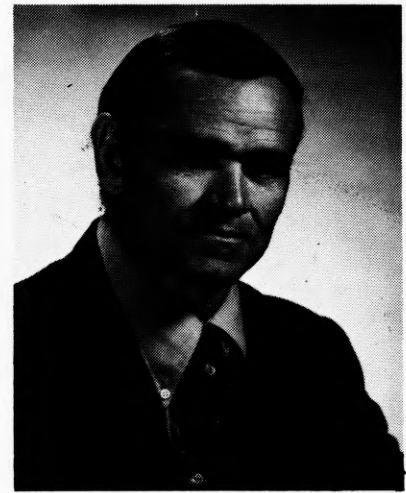

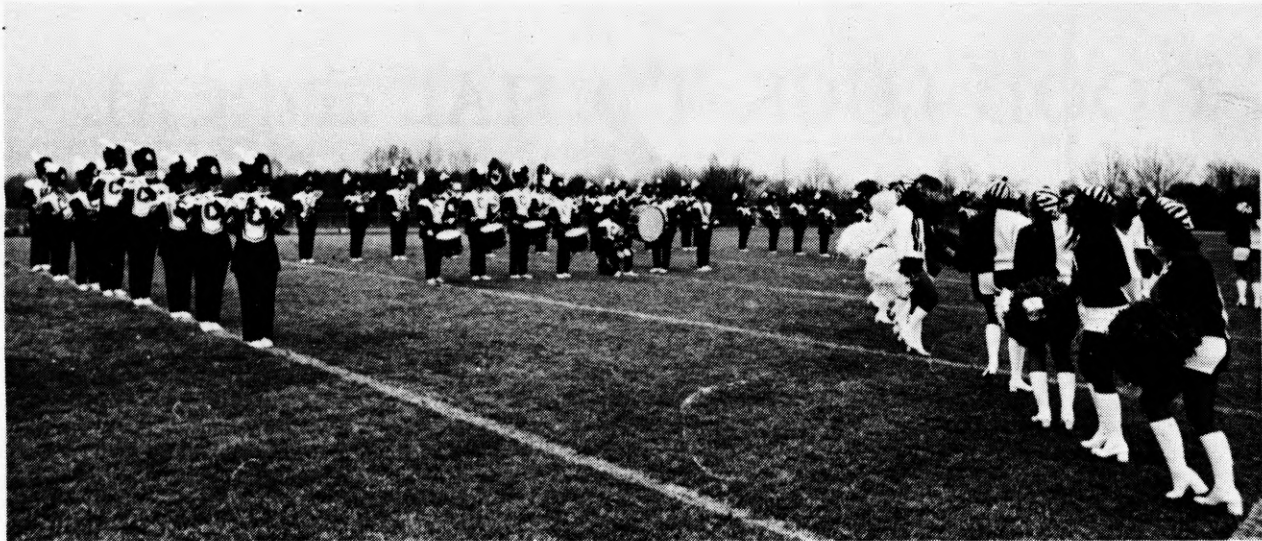

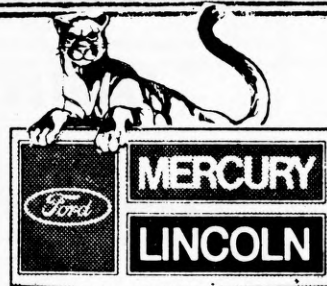

# DO-IT-YOURSELF STATISTICS

Every football fan knows the score doesn't always give a good picture of a game. A few statistics, like those that can be kept on this page, can make the picture clearer, show what individual stars contribute and help win post-game "debates." Besides, it can be fun to second guess official scorers whose statistics will appear in tomorrow's papers. But before you start, here are some pointers on being a statistician:

1. Keep cumulative totals to be informed "up to the minute" and to simplify your figuring of team totals. Example: Jones gains 3,6,9,2 yards and you write 3 9 18 20 on his line.
2. Be satisfied if you're within 10-15 yards of official totals.
3. Remember—it takes 10 yards to make a first down—that last inch can be as important as a yard and must be scored as one. Wait until

the official places the ball and then go by the official down/yard marker on the sidelines.

4. Be sure to credit first downs on scoring plays originating from lines of scrimmage beyond the 10-yard line.
5. On plays involving penalties measured from the point of the foul, credit the rusher or pass receiver with yardage only to the point of infraction.
6. Charge gains and losses on fumbles to the player who, in your judgment, contributed most to the error.
7. Don't score two-point conversion attempts after touchdowns as rushing or passing plays.

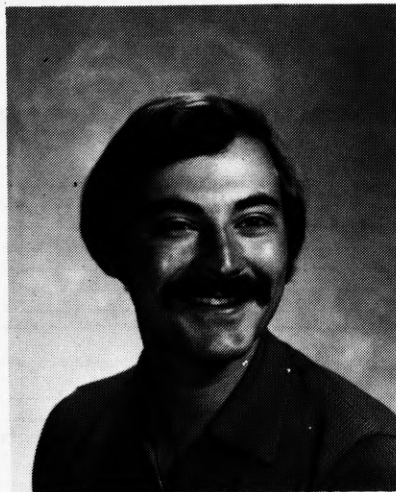

## CSC FACES ANOTHER STRONG DEFENSE

Edinboro hasn't had a great deal of luck in the close games this year. Even though the Fighting Scots have the third best total defense in the league, they have a record of 2-6-1 and have only one conference win (25-13 against Slippery Rock), three losses and one tie (3-3 against Indiana).

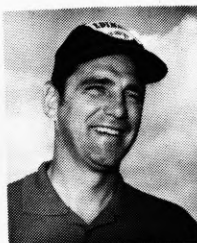
The Scots leading defensive players are senior linebacker Greg Sullivan (163 tackles), junior linebacker Jim Krentz (144 tackles) and middle guard Ron Gooden (121 tackles).

The offense is led by Bryan Libert who is the conference's fourth leading rusher with 606 yards in 122 carries. Golden Anderson is the other back with 362 yards in 94 carries.

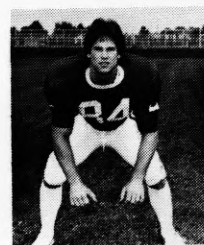
The quarterback is a question mark for today, with Mike Hill or Rick Shover the probable starters. Hill, you'll remember, had a fine day against the Vulcans last year when he set an Edinboro record for most yards passing (275) and most TDs passing (3) in a single game.

This year, Hill has been sharing the duties with Shover. Hill has completed 39 of 110 for 575 yards, but

he also has the conference lead in being intercepted 12 times. Shover, meanwhile, has completed 32 of 65 for 462 yards and only one interception.

## NCAA Traces Colorful History Back 71 Years

Progress and growth have become familiar companions for the National Collegiate Athletic Association during its first 71 years as the major governing organization for intercollegiate athletics in the United States.

A call for stricter control of college football by President Theodore Roosevelt because of the violence in the game brought together 13 institutions in 1905, formulating the original communications base for college athletics.

This initial body called itself the Intercollegiate Athletic Association and was officially constituted March 31, 1906. In 1910, the name was changed to the National Collegiate Athletic Association.

### **Service first**

Many things have become associated with the NCAA during its colorful history. Highest priority goes to the service it provides to more than 800 members, acting as the true "voice" of college athletics today.

Each January the NCAA membership comes together at the annual Convention to review, propose and amend legislation. The Convention presents the opportunity for the nation's institutions of higher learning to speak and act on athletic matters at the national level.

Acting in the best interests of its membership, the NCAA strives to perform these specific functions among its many other responsibilities:

- Conducts 39 annual National Collegiate Championships in 18 sports for three separate divisions.
- Maintains 13 rules committees to formulate, copyright and publish rules of play for the government of collegiate sports.
- Publishes "Official Guides" annually for nine sports through the NCAA Publishing Service.

... Collects, compiles and distributes the official statistics of college football, basketball and baseball through its NCAA Statistics Service.

### **Problem solver**

- Conducts studies as a means of developing solutions to athletic programs.
- Represents the membership in legislative and regulatory matters on the state and Federal levels.
- Annually selects the College Athletics Top Ten, the Award of Valor and the Theodore Roosevelt ("Teddy") Award—the Association's highest honor.
- Administers an honors program which annually awards 80 postgraduate scholarships to recognize outstanding senior student-athletes who have excelled in the classroom as well as athletics. This scholarship was increased from \$1,000 to \$1,500 in 1975-76. The program has provided \$1,024,000 to 944 recipients since its inception in the 1964-65 academic year.
- Supports the United States Collegiate Sports Council (USCSC) and participates in the World University Games movement by supplying funds, coaches, athletes and facilities for international competition.
- Maintains more than 60 full-time staff members at its national headquarters in Mission, Kansas.

## NAIA Crowns Champions In 15 Sports

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association, currently administering programs leading to national championships in 15 sports for 513 fully accredited four-year colleges and universities.

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball the NAIB evolved from the institution of a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" which was inaugurated in 1937. In 1952, the NAIB expanded to include tennis, outdoor track and field, and golf, and that year the organization was officially named the NAIA. In the last 25 years, the NAIA has further expanded to encompass football (it was split into two divisions in 1970), cross country, baseball and swimming, which were added to the NAIA program in 1956, wrestling (1958), soccer (1959), bowling (1962), gymnastics (1964), indoor track and field (1966), ice hockey (1968), and volleyball (1969).

The NAIA, with its national office located in Kansas City, is organized into 32 districts, grouped into eight geographical areas. All areas of intercollegiate athletics are organized and administered at the national level. The National office staff consists of an executive director, three assistant executive directors, the public relations staff, as well as mail room and secretarial staff.

On the district level, a District Chairman, a District Publicity Chairman and a District Eligibility Chairman are appointed to

handle various matters at the district level. A major factor in the success of the NAIA program is the importance placed on "grass roots" organization, in which each district administers and organizes the programs of the schools within their own district. The districts are small enough in the number of schools involved that each individual institution has a major voice in the policy and decision-making process within that district. This procedure carries on to the national level, where each of the 32 districts have an equal voice in national matters.

The NAIA clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletic program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the college or university. The NAIA encourages a broad program of athletic pursuits in its member schools and aims at uniformity and equity in policies and practices through its district and national tournament meets.

Eligibility rules in the NAIA govern all competition in sports recognized by the NAIA, not just post-season competition. These rules must be adhered to by all NAIA member institutions, including those members holding dual affiliations with other associations. NAIA member institutions must pay the annual membership dues and be in support of the policies of the Association.

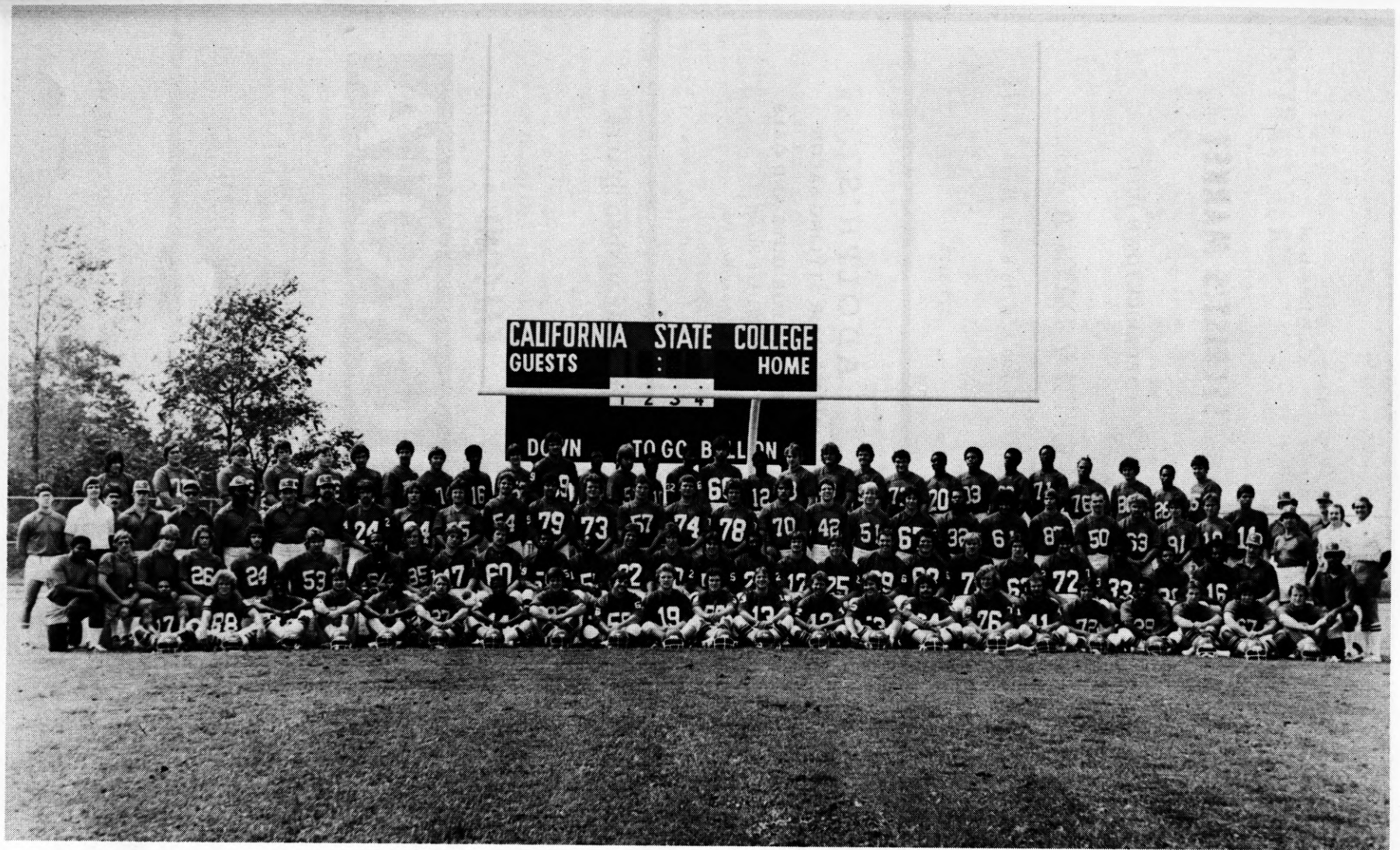

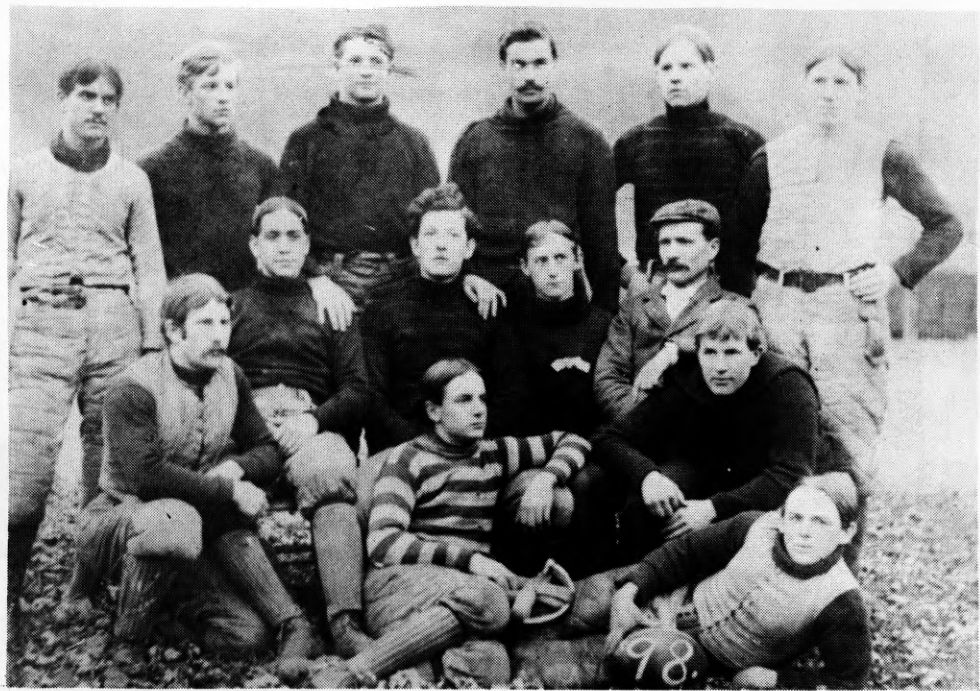

# 1898 FOOTBALL TEAM



## TRACING CAL STATE FOOTBALL ROOTS

With all of the excitement new head coach Hal Hunter's 1977 Vulcan football squad is stirring up, even the most pessimistic observers of Coal State sports are looking forward to a football renaissance. To be certain, Hunter has successfully recruited a promising group of high school gridiron prodigies and has surrounded himself with one of the most competent coaching staffs in CSC history. The future indeed looks rosy.

But, the furor created by the new regime forces one to also take a retrospective look at California's football heritage. In '68, Bill Hepner's Vulcans tied East Stroudsburg for the Conference championship in a 28-28 thriller. In '58, Coach Ted Nemeth led his team to the PAC crown, and Nemeth's 1952 edition of the football Vulcans played in the Pythian Bowl, the only Cal State team to win such an honor. In '48, Coach Earle Sykes Bruce's powerhouse went undefeated.

California's gridiron Eden was created in 1898, and it's unlikely Adam was the Southwestern State Normal School's first coach, Herbert W. "Pop" Harmon. He came to the Normal School via Hobart College and Cornell University. In '98,

while the nation was remembering the Maine and reading about Teddy Roosevelt roughriding up San Juan Hill, and while Ernest Hemingway was busy being born, Harmon was forging his initial football team.

Interestingly, "Pop" didn't confine himself to thoughtful sessions of cigar-smoking and play diagramming. He also found time to play some halfback for his team and was a stellar pitcher for the "Normal Stars" baseball team which he also coached.

Harmon's first product was formed totally of local players. The 13-member squad all came from California, Brownsville, and Fayette City. By comparison, Hunter's recruiting forays reach Ohio, New York, and New Jersey.

The vintage '98 Vulcans, led by such stalwarts as fullback Roy Hayes (who captained W&J in 1902 and '03) and end Bill Ritchie, played a one-game schedule. That single outing resulted in a tough 6-0 loss to Pitt, the 1976 national champs.

Harmon found his team competing under a school policy which stated: "We encourage **within limits** such games as baseball, football, lawn tennis, etc." And,

"Pop" wasn't satisfied. He journeyed to the coal fields (take note Coach Hunter) and found himself some rugged young men with whom he built a winner.

His 1905 squad went undefeated, and the school found itself forced to institute criteria which a player must meet. Each member had to:

1. Be a student in good academic standing.
2. Carry 20 periods (45 minutes each) per week.
3. Have approval of two-thirds of his teachers.
4. Be in good deportment with the faculty and student government.
5. Not miss more than two weeks of class to participate in games.
6. Not place more emphasis on athletics than on the other school work.

Harmon left Southwestern State Normal School to become coach of Grove City, the team against which California picked up its first victory in 1902. Grove City's stadium is now named for Herbert W. Harmon.

It seems a shame that "Pop" decided to leave the old Normal School. After all, it was only 79 years ago that he nearly beat last year's national champs.

boro (Nov. 12) will be carried. WASP also has the option to carry the other two contests, Lock Haven (Oct 1), and Clairon (Oct. 29).

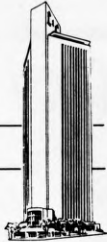
Veteran area sportscaster, Frank Buscanics will again this year do the play-by-play with color commentary added by WASP staff, Steve Snyder.

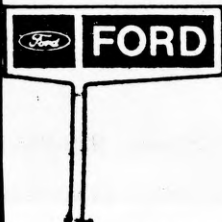
