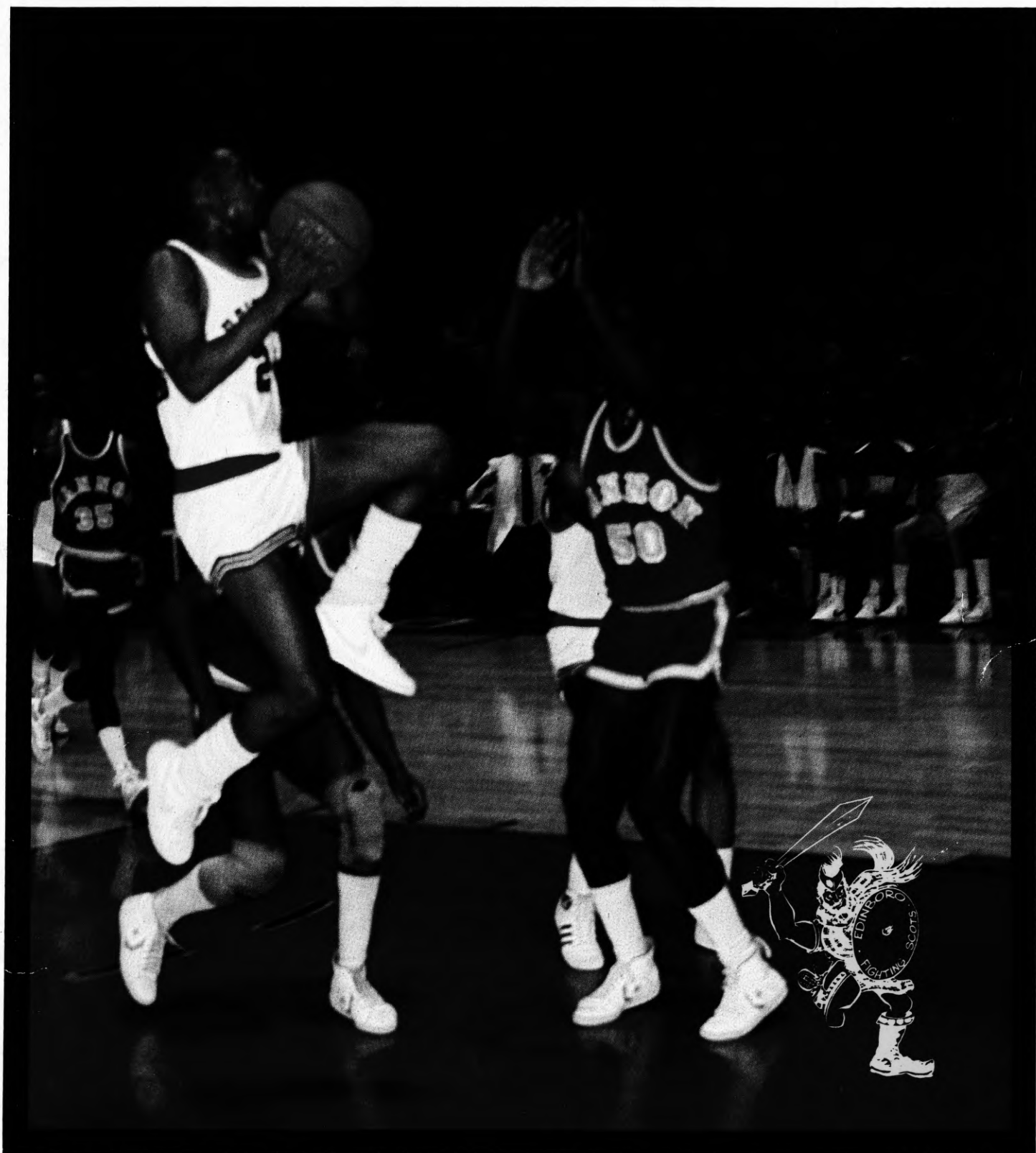

Edinboro President - Foster F. Diebold

In just four short years since his appointment in 1979 as Edinboro's 14th president, Foster F. Diebold has directed the University to its most significant change in the institution's 125-year history - university status. Under Diebold's leadership Edinboro has undergone dramatic internal and external alterations to provide northwestern Pennsylvanians with a dynamic, multi-faceted educational force.

Noted for his extensive experience in the field of education management, President Diebold had previously served as President of the University of Alaska statewide system.

His innovative efforts at Edinboro have taken many shapes. Most recently, he initiated a total reorganization of the University's various academic schools and administrative offices with a watchful eye upon fiscal responsibility and increased institutional responsiveness. In keeping with his policy of making maximum use of existing campus resources in higher education, he has imaginatively met the ever-changing needs brought about by new and emerging student interests and societal expectations.

Unique cooperative programs with area business and industry are also the result of President Diebold's revitalization of Edinboro University. Among his

favorite projects is the University Honors Program, which draws upon the contributions of university staff for its scholarship funds, and which recognizes the academic distinction of excellent students by offering specialized interdisciplinary coursework and advanced research work.

President Diebold's principal fields of professional interest include higher education management, governance, and planning; budget development and fiscal control; legislative liaison; and personnel management/collective bargaining. While at Rutgers University in 1963, he received a Wall Street Journal fellowship.

A native of Orange, New Jersey, he served as President of the University of Alaska from 1977-1979. Prior to that, he was executive secretary to the Board of Regents and Special Assistant to the President of the University of Alaska's statewide system. From 1969 to 1976, he was director of the Division of College Development at Kean College, New Jersey (formerly Newark State College), and from 1965 to 1969, he was Assistant Superintendent of Neptune Township Public Schools in New Jersey.

President Diebold's community service includes membership on the Board of Corporators, Hamot Medical Center in Erie, and on Marine Bank's Local Advisory Board. Recently he was a panel participant at the First Global Conference on the Future in Toronto. He also serves as a member of the William J. McMannis and A. Haskell McMannis Educational Trust Fund Advisory Board, and Chairman of the Government, Education, and Social Agencies Division of the Erie County United Way Campaign.

Edinboro's president holds an associate degree in psychology from Monmouth Community College, West Long Branch, New Jersey; a bachelor of science degree in education from Monmouth College; a master of arts in educational administration from Seton Hall University; and he has met course requirements for his doctorate in education at Rutgers University.

President Diebold currently serves as Chairman of the Committee on Administration and Finance in the University System of Pennsylvania and is a member of the Commission of Presidents Executive Committee. He holds memberships on the American Association of State Colleges and Universities Committee on State Relations, and the Government Relations Committee of the Pennsylvania Association of Colleges and Universities. He is also a charter member of the World Future Society.

The President and his wife, Patricia, have two daughters, seven-year-old Jessica, and two-year-old Stacey.



After 125 years of service to the tri-state area, Edinboro experienced its most significant change in history on July 1, 1983, when the College became Edinboro University of Pennsylvania. Founded as a private academy in 1857, Edinboro University has continued its surge to the forefront as one of the leading educational institutions in western Pennsylvania. Situated on a sprawling 585-acre campus in the scenic resort community of Edinboro, the University is within 100 miles of the educational and cultural centers of Buffalo, Cleveland, and Pittsburgh. It is just 15 miles south of Erie, the third largest city in Pennsylvania, and easily accessible from all directions by interstates 79, 80 and 90.

Edinboro has the distinction of being the second normal school established in Pennsylvania and the 12th in the United States. It has grown to more than forty buildings including the 350,000-volume Baron-Forness Library, a modern seven-story structure which serves as a focal point for the spacious campus. More than 5,800 students representing almost every county in the Commonwealth, as well as numerous states and foreign countries attend Edinboro. Its tradition of educational service and research is matched by a distinguished faculty, more than two-thirds of whom have earned doctoral degrees.

The University now offers more than 100 undergraduate, graduate, and associate degree programs, a diversity unmatched by any other college or university in northwestern Pennsylvania. While seeking to meet the

educational needs of its region from both a professional and cultural standpoint, Edinboro now makes contributions in the fields of education, government, environmental improvement, urban and rural problems, crime prevention, and service to business and industry. Recent program developments include those in the high-demand areas of allied health, business administration, communication, computer technology, nursing, and various pre-professional offerings such as law, dentistry, medicine, pharmacy and veterinary science. Numerous student internships provide additional examples of the University's efforts to create a close working relationship with the people it serves while, at the same time, offering students intellectual and career opportunities.

Edinboro has initiated the University Honors Program to provide challenging and enriched learning experiences for academically gifted students. Undergraduate students are encouraged to strive for academic excellence both in their major fields and in other disciplines. Honors students pursue studies that are greater in depth and scope than those required of other undergraduates.

Although the costs for attending Edinboro rank among the lowest in the Commonwealth, over \$8,000,000 in financial aid is available annually to eligible students.

Students are admitted to the University in September, January, or at the beginning of each summer session and are considered for admission on the basis of their general scholarship, nature of secondary program, and SAT or ACT scores.

MAJOR MOVES MARK McDONALD MANAGEMENT

Edinboro University's athletic program was placed under the talented and aggressive leadership of Jim McDonald in July of 1981. Increased emphasis on fund raising to provide a sound scholarship foundation has become his top priority while numerous changes and innovations have also keyed the Scots' athletic program under his direction.

Through his efforts, more than \$160,000 was raised over the past year while an additional \$250,000 is anticipated during the 1983-84 sports campaign. The funds derived through McDonald's endeavors will be used to assist Edinboro's men and women athletes who, with the recent addition of men's volleyball along with women's cross country and swimming, now compete in 17 intercollegiate sports.

In addition to maintaining Edinboro's respected winning tradition in intercollegiate athletics, the former health and physical education professor has vastly expanded the University's summer activities. The summer camp program has grown from five offerings to include 11 interest areas.

In addition to the annual Buffalo Bills-Cleveland Browns scrimmage at Sox Harrison Stadium as well as the pre-season drills of the Pitt Panthers, Duquesne University and 12 area high schools make Edinboro their camp home. McDonald has constructed 12 new football fields to accommodate these needs and the Football Camp of Champions that attracts more than 350 young gridders.

The personable athletic director also staged Edinboro's first Hall of Fame festivities that featured

the induction of 18 charter members. These past athletes, coaches and individuals who have promoted the cause of Fighting Scot athletics were honored at a banquet where more than 500 attendees witnessed their inductions.

McDonald has been at Edinboro since 1962 and for 12 years served as the Fighting Scot basketball coach (1962-1975) and never experienced a losing season while his teams compiled an impressive 181 wins against only 89 losses. During that span, his cagers won four Western Division Pennsylvania Conference crowns, the PC state championship and two District 18 titles that netted trips to the NAIA National Tournament. His teams set 27 ESC records and made 19 post-season appearances while four of his players were named All-Americans.

Prior to accepting his position at Edinboro, McDonald served as assistant basketball coach in Erie, Pa. He is a 1956 graduate of Bridgeport High School in his home town of Bridgeport, West Virginia.

In 1960 he received a degree in chemistry and physical education from West Virginia Wesleyan College and he also holds a master's degree in health from the University of Buffalo. He has done doctoral work in sports science at West Virginia University.

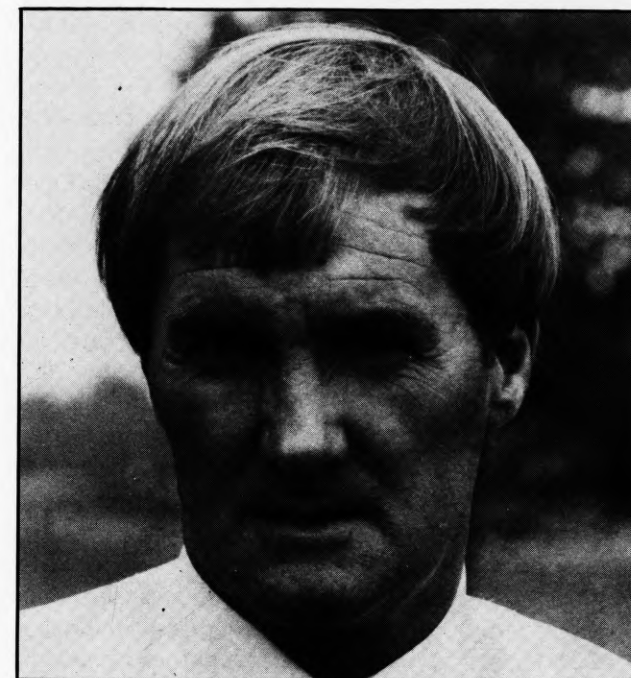
As an undergraduate, he set nine school records at Wesleyan and was twice voted both AP and UPI basketball All-American. In 1960, he was the second leading scorer in the United States, averaging slightly over 33 points a game, and led his team to the national basketball tournament in Kansas City, Missouri. He was named to the NAIA's All-Tournament Team in 1959 and 1960.

In 1966, McDonald was selected Area Eight Coach of the Year by the eastern seaboard coaches and that same year was honored as one of the top ten finalists in the Coach of the Year national poll. McDonald's honors also include selection to the West Virginia All-Time College Basketball Team and membership in the West Virginia Sports Hall of Fame. He served four years on the NAIA's All-American selection committee and was chosen by the NAIA to coach an All-American team of NBA-bound cagers who won the Gold Medal in Israel's Hapoel Games. His all-star coaching assignment brought additional recognition since Edinboro was named as the team's official training site.

In addition to his classroom and basketball coaching duties, McDonald was Edinboro's golf coach for 17 years during which his teams won over 40 tournaments and finished as high as 3rd place at the NCAA Division II National Tournament. He was twice selected District Coach of the Year in golf.

As a resident of Edinboro, McDonald has a record of extensive community involvement. He was Little League Baseball Director for four years and for the past three years, has been a member of the General McLane School Board. He and his wife, Mary Lou, have three sons - Mark, Mike, and Matthew.

CONTI CONTINUES TO BUILD WINNERS

Edinboro University's Guy Conti took over the reins of the Fighting Scot basketball program in 1975 replacing Jim McDonald, who now directs the athletic department at Edinboro.

In eight seasons at the helm of the Fighting Scots, Conti has compiled an impressive 123-87 record including a 24-5 mark in 1975-76, his initial season. He guided the Scots to three tournament championships, the Pennsylvania Conference Western Division title, the NAIA District 18 championship, and a berth in the NAIA national tournament in Kansas City, where they lost in the second round to Lake Superior State, 76-73. His team also set an Edinboro record with 13 consecutive victories.

In his fifth year, Conti led the Scots to a 21-6 record and a spot in the NAIA District 18 playoffs. Included in those 21 wins was a surprising 67-66 triumph over powerful Point Park.

Two years later, Conti guided a veteran squad to a 22-8 campaign, a Pennsylvania Conference Western Division championship, and a berth in the NCAA Division II East Regionals. The Fighting Scots were downed by Bloomsburg, 53-50, before defeating Monmouth, 56-53, in the school's first ever appearance in NCAA tournament action.

Conti's cagers finished 18-10 last year. The Scots won the Allegheny College Cage Classic and made an appearance in the Pennsylvania Conference championships in Bloomsburg.

The Freeport, Pa., native was twice named Pennsylvania Conference Western Division Coach of the Year (1975-76, 1981-82), and was named Pennsylvania Conference Coach of the Year in 1981-82. He has also been cited as the Erie Morning News "Big Five" Coach of the Year four times, three of the last four years.

Conti, a 1965 graduate of Clarion, was a coach for the Pittsburgh Pirates' Bradenton entry in the Gulf Coast Rookie League this past summer. He guided the Edinboro baseball team for two years, 1969-71. In that time, Conti assembled a talent-laden team that recorded the best record in the school's history. He then served as an assistant football coach for four years. He moved quickly up the Fighting Scot grid program ladder moving from freshman coach to receiver coach and finally to offensive coordinator.

Conti and his wife, Jan, have four children—Kim, an employee of the Pittsburgh Maulers of the USFL; Kurt, a sophomore at Edinboro; Craig, a sophomore at the University of Iowa; and Kelly, a freshman at Point Park College in Pittsburgh.



TALENTED SCOTS BATTLE INEXPERIENCE

Although Edinboro University cage coach Guy Conti, had what he calls one of his best recruiting years ever, the Fighting Scot mentor does not have "great expectations" from his young but talented 1983-84 squad.

"This team is very, very young," said Conti, who is beginning his ninth season at the helm of the Fighting Scots and owns an impressive 123-87 overall mark. "We are in a rebuilding process. With the challenging schedule we have, we will be fortunate to break the .500 mark," he added.

Conti has only one returning starter, Edwin Wright, from last year's 18-10 squad that lost to Cheyney in the semifinals of the Pennsylvania Conference playoffs.

Wright, a senior from Clewiston, Florida, led the Fighting Scots with 380 points (13.6 per game) and now ranks twelfth on Edinboro's all-time scoring list with 989 points. The 6-1 guard shot a respectable .486 (157-323) from the floor and .767 (66-86) from the charity stripe. Wright will be depended on, not only for his scoring, but for his outstanding defense as well.

Among those who will be fighting for starting positions is forward Barry Marshall (6-5, senior, Pomfret, MD). Marshall scored 122 points and had 127 rebounds, while leading the Scots with 39 blocked shots. He netted 13 points and ripped down 14 missed attempts in the semifinal playoff game against top-ranked Cheyney. The McDonough High School graduate earned all-tourney honors for his performance against the Wolves.

Also looking for a starting position on the front line is Seaborn White (6-7, sophomore, Toledo, OH), who impressed Conti with his rebounding ability, and William Jeffries (6-5, sophomore, East Cleveland, OH), who plays much like Battle. Tim Williams (6-9, junior, White Plains, NY) has his eye on the center position, but will have competition from freshmen Terrance Jenkins (6-5, East Cleveland, OH), who can also fill in at forward, and Shawn Pope (6-8, East Cleveland, OH). Jenkins and Pope, along with John Hanson (6-2, freshman, East Cleveland, OH), made the trek across the Ohio-Pennsylvania line from Cleveland Shaw High School, where the trio led the Cardinals to an outstanding 27-1 record last year.

Brian Sharick (5-11, senior, Lower Burrell, PA) and Willie Lee (5-5, senior, Clewiston, FL) will be battling for the point guard position. Both have seen considerable action the last two years and are the team's long-range shooters.

They will have stiff competition from Jose' Davis (5-11, sophomore, East Cleveland, OH). The Cleveland Shaw grad poured in 24 points in the Scots' regular season finale from his point guard slot.

Conti also has junior college transfer Earl Minor (6-2, junior, Uniontown, PA), who led Allegheny Community College to the junior college championships last year. Hanson and junior college transfer Al Johnson (6-0, sophomore, Clewiston, FL) will add needed depth at the guard spot.

"This may be the best class I've ever recruited," Conti remarked. "The fans will have to be patient and let these kids mature."

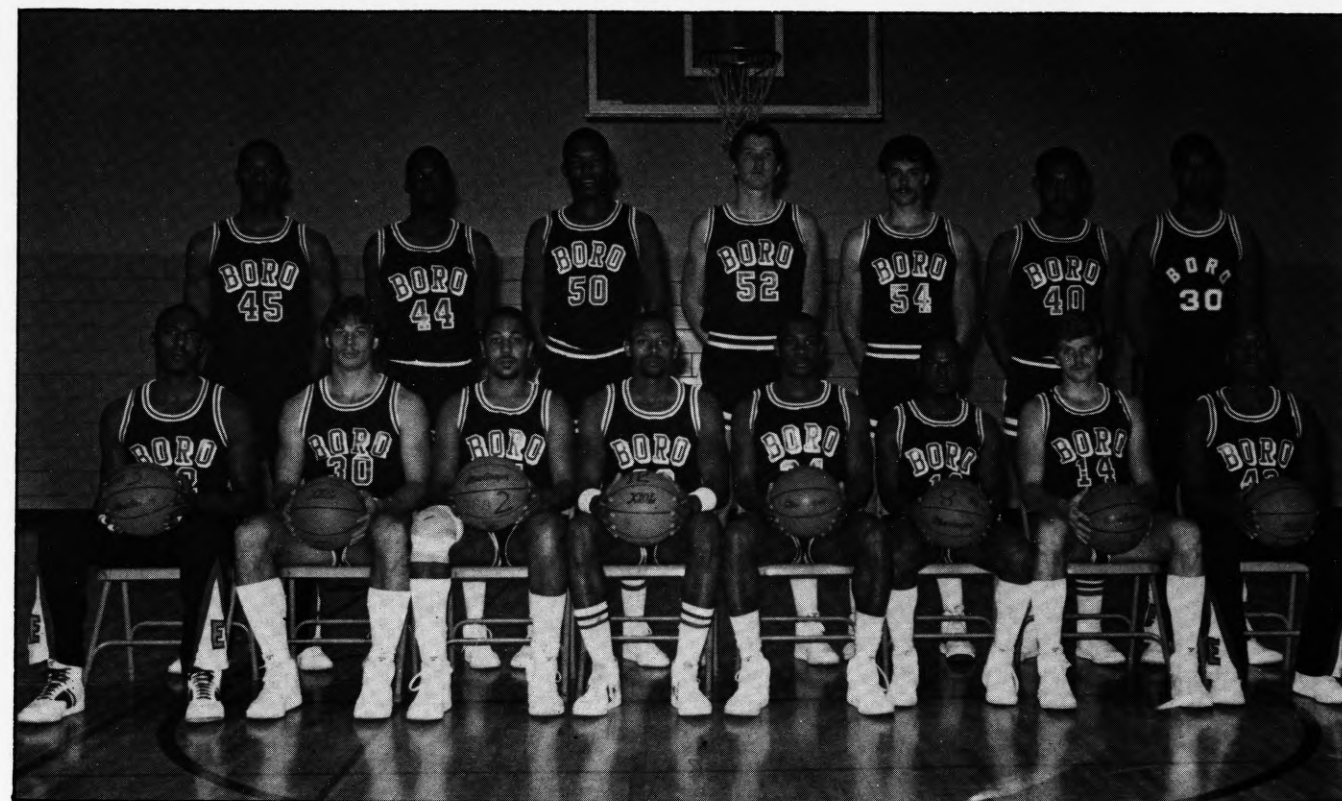

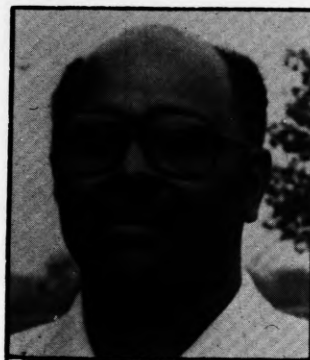

BRINGING EXPERIENCE TO THE SCOT CAMP

ASSISTANT COACH DR. JOHN FURCRON

Dr. John Furcron begins his ninth year as assistant basketball coach at Edinboro. A Wellington, Ohio native, Furcron obtained a B.S. degree in Health and Physical Education and Biology from Bowling Green (Ohio) State University in 1959. He played halfback for the Falcon football team for three years and was named the team's MVP in his senior year when he averaged 5.5 yards per carry and scored eight touchdowns. During his three years on the BGSU grid team, the Falcons compiled an impressive 24-2-4 slate.

Furcron attained his M.S. in Physical Education from West Virginia University in 1969, and his Ed.D. in physical education from WVU in 1976. He began his coaching career in the Elyria, Ohio school system. While coaching football and basketball at the freshman level, he compiled a 27-8 grid record and a 45-9 cage mark.

As an interim coach in 1973, Furcron led the Fighting Scot soccer team to an 8-3-1 season, the NAIA District 18 championship, and a berth in the Area VI playoffs.

Furcron, his wife, Gloria, and their two children, Angela (15) and John (12), reside in Edinboro.

GRADUATE ASSISTANT COACH TIM SMILEY

Returning to his alma mater to assist the Fighting Scot cage program as a graduate assistant coach is, Tim Smiley, one of the most prolific scorers in Edinboro's history. The Fort Wayne, Indiana, product played guard when Edinboro raced to one of its best seasons in history, a 22-5 slate during the 1974-75 schedule, when the Plaid experienced success at the NAIA national tournament in Kansas City, Missouri. The 1978 grad ranks as the second leading scorer in Edinboro's history with 1,574 points and holds the single season standard of 508 markers. Prior to his return, he taught at Wayne High School in Ft. Wayne for three years where he also coached basketball and track. Tim and his wife Nadine, a former Edinboro student, have a two-year-old daughter, Asia.

ASSOCIATE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR DR. KATHLEEN LIPKOVICH

Dr. Kathleen Lipkovich was named Edinboro's first associate athletic director at the outset of the 1981 school year to help administer both the men's and women's athletic program. She also served as the women's basketball coach at the University for a two-year span, prior to devoting her full time attention administratively to Edinboro's rapidly expanding program.

Originally from Youngstown, Ohio, Dr. Lipkovich has had teaching and coaching experience at West Virginia University, Central Connecticut State College, and Trinity College. The Ohio native, who graduated from Chaney High School, began her teaching and coaching career in 1972 with the Howland Local School District in Howland, Ohio, and then held a similar position from 1972 through 1975 at McDonald High School in McDonald, Ohio.

The 1972 Youngstown State graduate received her M.S. degree in 1975 from West Virginia University and was awarded a doctorate from that same institution in 1977 after majoring in educational administration and physical education. 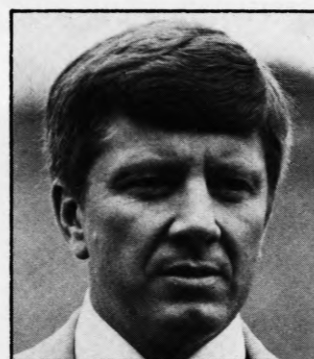

ASSISTANT TO THE ATHLETIC DIRECTOR HAROLD "HAL" UMBARGER

Harold "Hal" Umbarger joined Edinboro University's athletic staff this past spring as assistant to the athletic director. He brings a wealth of talent and experience to the administrative level of the athletic program and plays a vital role in overseeing the academic progress of student athletes as well as coordinating the on-going functions of the athletic director's office and the summer programs which involve the department. The West Newton, Pa., native is a 1954 Slippery Rock University graduate and also owns his masters degree from Penn State. After a three-year stint with the U.S. Army Security Agency in Europe, he coached basketball and baseball at Moshannon Valley (Pa.) High School before accepting a guidance position in the West York Area School District in 1961. He became a member of Edinboro's admissions office a year later and in 1967 was named director of admissions. During his tenure more than 40,000 students were admitted to Edinboro University.

THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (Pennsylvania Conference) is comprised of the 14 schools in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education. This new governing body took over from the Department of Education on July 1, 1983, and the change was also reflected in the granting of university status to all member institutions.

Another major step up for the conference also came about this summer with the naming of Donald E. Kelley as the first PSAC commissioner. A native Ohioan, Kelley was a three-sport high school standout in Cardington, Ohio, and played basketball at Ohio State. After graduation, he signed a professional baseball contract with the Philadelphia Phillies but his career was cut short by injury. Kelley is the former director of athletics at Illinois State University and brings a diversified background in athletics to the PSAC.

All members of the conference (with individual sports exceptions) compete at the NCAA Division II level and have since 1980. Athletes and teams have won numerous honors in national competitions over the years and have helped the PSAC become one of the most respected "small college" conferences in the nation.

A list of member schools with their football affiliation includes: Eastern Division — Bloomsburg University, Cheyney University, East Stroudsburg University, Kutztown University, Mansfield University, Millersville University, West Chester University; Western Division — California University, Clarion University, Edinboro University, Indiana University, Lock Haven University, Shippensburg University, Slippery Rock University.
