



local rival Mercyhurst, a team that has made quite a statement in its first year in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference.

Did we mention that the contest bears potentially huge playoff implications, particularly for the Fighting Scots?

The upstart Lakers were tied with California(Pa.) for first place in the PSAC West until being brought back down to earth somewhat last Saturday when an IUP team smarting from a

loss to Edinboro the week before handed them a 42-10 defeat.

While Mercyhurst saw its four-game winning streak come to an end at IUP, Edinboro extended its winning streak to four games with a 35-14 win at Slippery Rock. The Fighting Scots exorcised some demons against a Slippery Rock team that had embarrassed them the year before, 59-34, and won five of the last six meetings at N. Kerr Thompson Stadium.

Edinboro brings a 7-1 record into the game while Mercyhurst is 5-3. The two are tied for second in the PSAC West with 4-1 records and still have visions of playing in the PSAC Championship game should California(Pa.) stumble.

This promises to be a highly-entertaining and hard-fought contest between two teams that have not met since 2000. The winner will come away with the mythical title of northwest Pennsylvania champion since both have beaten Gannon.

Ranked 16th in the AFCA Top 25 and fourth in Super Regional One, Edinboro has much more to lose with a defeat. In essence, the Fighting Scots have been playing playoff football for two weeks, and now head coach Scott Browning must get them fired up for another emotional game if the season is to continue past November 8.

Enjoy the game!

The Coaches

Scott Browning (Ohio State '81) took over as Edinboro's 13th head coach on January 5, 2006. He was certainly no stranger to Fighting Scot football, however, serving as an assistant coach for the previous twenty years. While at Edinboro he has coached the offensive linemen, defensive backs and run-

ning backs, along with serving as the offensive coordinator. Browning became the first head coach at Edinboro to debut with a win since Bill McDonald in 1969 when the Fighting Scots opened the 2006 season with a 28-14 win at West Chester. He went on to lead Edinboro to a 6-5 finish, the most wins ever by a first-year coach. A year ago he led the Fighting Scots to a 7-4 record. With 13 wins after two seasons, Browning tied Bill McDonald and Tom Hollman for most wins in their first two seasons. He now own s a 20-10 mark. (For more on Scott Browning, see pages 6-7.)

Marty Schaetzle (Bucknell '83) is in his seventh year as the head coach of the Lakers, showing a 26-46 record. Mercyhurst is enjoying its finest season under Schaetzle since the 2003 season when the Lakers were 5-6. Schaetzle is no stranger to the PSAC, serving as the offensive coordinator/offensive line coach at Shippensburg from 1990-97.

Scouting Mercyhurst

Mercyhurst saw its four-game winning streak come to an end in the 42-10 loss at IUP. That game started a brutal stretch for the Lakers to conclude the season. In succession, the Lakers play at IUP and at Edinboro, then host California (Pa.) and West Chester to end the season. Should West Chester win the Eastern Division, they instead would get Bloomsburg that final week ... the Lakers have showcased an outstanding defense this season, although over the last two weeks they've given up 32 points to Gannon and 42 to IUP. They had allowed two touchdowns or less in five of their previous six games. Mercyhurst still ranks second in the PSAC in total defense, giving up just 268.0 ypg.

Players to Watch

Richard Stokes, TB - the 5'9", 204 lb. senior ranks eighth in the PSAC in rushing but leads the conference in scoring. He has rushed for 678 yards on 142 carries with 12 TDs, and also has a touchdown receiving. Stokes has gained 3,098 yards with 36 TDs in his career, both school records. A year ago he ran for 1,177 yards and 13 TDs while earning

first team All-GLIAC recognition.

Garrett Kensy, QB - a former transfer from Mansfield who started the first two games as a freshman before going down with an injury. He actually played linebacker for the Lakers a year ago, then took over as the starting quarterback this year when Joe Laffey went down with an injury. He is also an extremely heart-warming story as several media outlets have covered his battle with cancer.

Theo Hall, CB - a second team All-GLIAC performer a year ago when he intercepted 5 passes. He was also a second team Consensus Draft Services Preseason All-American. The senior has 25 tackles and has broken up 5 passes. He is also a dangerous return man, averaging 25.6 yards per kickoff return.

Bryan Boyce and Jimmy Kokrak, OLB's - the duo of linebackers are a major reason the Mercyhurst defense has ranked among the best in the country this year after both missed the 2007 campaign due to injury. Kokrak is a former preseason All-American and All-GLIAC performer who has 62 tackles and is tied for the team lead with 5 sacks. Boyce is the leading tackler with 72 stops and has 4.5 sacks. He is also a former All-PSAC honoree.

The Mercyhurst Game

The Edinboro-Mercyhurst Series

Edinboro leads 3-1

This marks the first meeting between Edinboro and Mercyhurst since the Fighting Scots captured a 14-6 decision over the Lakers in 2000 at Sox Harrison Stadium. The year before Mercyhurst picked up its lone win in the series, 34-20 at Tullio Field.

The Last Meeting -- September 16, 2000 Edinboro 14, Mercyhurst 6

The Fighting Scots used a stifling defense and punishing ground game to hand former head coach Lou Tepper his first win at Edinboro. Edinboro ran for 359 yards, leading to a time of possession advantage of 40:36 to 19:24. Bernard Henry ran for 263 yards on 29 carries, accounting for both Boro scores. He scored on a 68-yard run in the first quarter, then added a 61-yard run in the third period. Mercyhurst scored on a 68-yard pass from Mac McArdle to Ed Bailey.

Last Week's Games

Edinboro 35, Slippery Rock 14

Trevor Harris threw for 378 yards and tied his own school record with five touchdowns passing as Edinboro won for just the second time since 1995 at Slippery Rock. Rich Cerro hauled in two of the touchdown passes. Edinboro scored on four of five possessions to end the first half, taking a 28-0 lead at halftime. The defense turned in another stellar effort, holding The Rock to 223 total yards and 53 yards rushing. Edinboro had seven sacks.

Indiana(Pa.) 42, Mercyhurst 10

Mercyhurst's four-game winning streak came to an end as IUP built a 21-3 lead at the half. The Lakers were held to 133 total yards, including minus 6 yards rushing. Richard Stokes scored on an 11-yard pass from Garrett Kensy and Chris Ryan booted a 30-yard field goal to account for the Mercyhurst points.

Scots Continue to Rake in PSAC Awards

Iunior OB Trevor Harris parlayed another record-setting day into the PSAC West Player of the Week award. Harris threw for 378 yards and a record-tying 5 TDs in the win at Slippery Rock. He ties his own record for touchdowns passing in a game, which he set against Shippensburg in 2006, along with Scott Dodds, who threw 5 TD passes against Fairmont State in 1986. The 378 yards is the third-highest single-game passing figure, and he finished with 385 total yards, which is also third all-time. Harris was also named the PSAC West Offensive Player of the Week following the season opener at West Liberty State and Édinboro had previously won PSAC Defensive Player of the Week honors four times.

Welcome Back Tom

As a player at Edinboro in the early '70's Tom Herman was renowned for his hard-nosed play, as he played on the offensive and defensive lines. The 1972 Edinboro graduate has parlayed that same intensity into a highly-successful coaching career. Herman is in his 34th year as a coach, and his eighth as an assistant at Mercyhurst. He works with the offensive line. From 1975-85 he served as an assistant coach for the Fighting Scots. Herman was the head coach at Gannon for ten years.

Boro Aerial Game vs. Lakers Stout D

Tonight's game features an interesting matchup between Edinboro's highpowered aerial attack and a Mercyhurst defense which ranks first in the PSAC in passing defense. Edinboro ranks second in the PSAC in passing offense at 267.4 ypg., and Trevor Harris is the leading passer in the PSAC. The Lakers are giving up a league-low 143.9 ypg.

Perillo Big as Pass Rusher

Mike Perillo serves as a reserve defensive back and is the team's nickel back. The redshirt freshman, a transfer from the University of Albany(NY), had a huge game against Slippery Rock, but it didn't come as a pass defender, but rather as a pass rusher. He registered 3 sacks among his 5 tackles while blitzing. All told, Edinboro had 7 sacks against SRU quartertbacks.

Cerro Makes Move Up Record Book

Rich Cerro finished with 6 receptions for 62 yards and 2 TDs at Slippery Rock. The senior wide receiver now has 120 career receptions, moving him into sixth place in career receptions. The two touchdowns give him 16 for his career, which is tied for fifth.

Sox Harrison Stadium's one million dollar renovation of a year ago - the artificial turf, lighting and new scoreboard - have been widely embraced throughout the region, making our stadium one of northwestern Pennsylvania's premier athletic field venues.

Pogue Student Center has quickly become a shining centerpiece and hub of campus activities.

Heading west on Scot Road, you might have noticed the construction just west of the beautiful and serene five-acre Mallory Lake. Within the year, our new Human Services Building will be ready for occupancy there, housing our Nursing programme and our Speech, Language and Hearing Department.

Continuing west along Normal Street, the new \$5 million Dr. William P. Alexander Music Center, our first campus structure built specifically to meet the Music Department's needs, stands next to Academy Hall, the first campus building constructed in 1857 and now listed on the National Register of Historic Places. One of the oldest former Normal School buildings in the nation still used for academic purposes, Academy Hall recently underwent a \$5 million renovation and now houses our Undergraduate Admissions Office. Please stop by on this or your next campus visit.

And if all that isn't enough, a \$23 million construction project will soon be launched on exterior and interior expansion and renovation of Cooper Hall, which houses Edinboro's many science programmes.

So, you can see why we're so excited! Whether in the classrooms, laboratories, libraries or athletic venues, Edinboro University goes far beyond the norm in creating a 21st century higher education experience for the complete college stu-

Head Coach

Scott Browning

3rd Year Ohio State '81



Scott Browning knows a thing or two about the Edinboro football tradition. With twenty years under his belt as an assistant coach, he was all too familiar with the glory days of Edinboro football. So it didn't take him long to restore some lost traditions when he took over as the 13th head football coach of the Fighting Scots on January 5, 2006.

Most prevalent was the return to the "Boro", the common name the football team was referred to during

the 1980's and '90's, some of the most

successful periods in Edinboro football history.

One thing Browning didn't mess with was the tradition of winning. In fact, in his first two seasons Browning has tied the record for most wins by a coach with 13 victories. Only Bill McDonald, who guided the 1969 and 1970 teams to 13 wins, and Tom Hollman, who also totaled 13 wins in 1988 and '89, can match Browning's start.

His first edition finished with a 6-5 record, the most wins ever under a first-year coach. But it didn't end just on the football field. The Fighting Scots excelled in the classroom, including a cumulative team GPA of over 2.8 for the spring semester.

Browning became the first coach at Edinboro since Sox Harrison to win his first two games as head coach. That happened in 1926, the first year of football at the Boro. Thanks to a 28-14 win at West Chester, he became the first coach since Bill McDonald in 1969 to win his first game as head coach.

That victory, on the road at West Chester between a pair of 2005 NCAA playoff teams, also displayed Browning's propensity as a riverboat gambler. The Fighting Scots went for it on fourth down four times, and made it three times.

A year ago the Fighting Scots finished with a 7-4 record while facing one of the most difficult schedules in recent memory. Edinboro faced four nationally-ranked teams, upsetting 25th-ranked Bloomsburg thanks to a memorable comeback, 42-41, while losing to eighth-ranked California(Pa.), 17th-ranked West Chester and 24th-ranked IUP. In fact, Edinboro's four losses came to teams which combined for a 40-9.

The Fighting Scots also continued the strong academic trend, with 15 players earning PSAC Scholar-Athlete honors.

"I am very pleased to announce the promotion of Scott Browning to the position of head football coach at Edinboro University," stated then-President Dr. Frank G. Pogue at the time.

"Scott has been a member of the Edinboro coaching staff for 20 years. He has demonstrated his ability to not only coach athletes on the playing field, but also to lead young men by the example of his character and by his dedication to them as students and as individuals. He will join our other highly successful coaches at Edinboro University."

After serving as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in Lou Tepper's first season, Browning took over as the offensive coordinator in

He had previously served as the offensive coordinator for five seasons under Tom Hollman. In all, Browning had served as Edinboro's offensive line coach the previous 12 years.

Browning joined the Edinboro program in 1986 as the running backs coach under Steve Szabo. After two seasons on the offensive side of the ball, the graduate of The Ohio State University moved to the defensive side, serving as the defensive backfield coach under Hollman. In 1994 he moved back to offense as the offensive line coach. He had remained in charge of the linemen since that time, coaching such All-Americans as Jeremy O'Day, Joe Valvoda and Greg Bzorek. The last two years Browning's offensive line led the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference in fewest sacks allowed.

When Tepper came on board in 2000, Browning was appointed the

recruiting coordinator in addition to his duties with the offensive line. A year later he was named the offensive coordinator, and the Fighting Scot offense made great strides over the last five years. Browning emphasized a balanced attack which showcased the combination of a strong ground game and dangerous aerial attack. Over his last three seasons Edinboro averaged 29.9 ppg. in 2003, 33.2 ppg. in '04, and 31.4 ppg. in '05.

All told, Browning has been an assistant coach on all seven of Edinboro's NCAA playoff teams, along with five of the nine PSAC champion squads. He took over a team which has been to the NCAA Division II Playoffs two of the last three years, and during that period has posted a 26-8 record. The 26 wins were the most in a three-year period in Edinboro history.

"It goes without saying that I am extremely excited to have this opportunity," noted an elated Browning. "I was proud to be a part of the teams in the 1990's that ranked among the best in Division II, and over the last few years we have once again elevated the program to one of the best in the country. The University and the community of Edinboro mean a great deal to me. Over the years we have tried to become an integral part of this community. I am thrilled that I can continue that association while taking over a group of players that represent the ideals I believe in.

"I'm sure you will see some changes in the future, but I can tell you this, the ideals remain in place for this program, and always have in the time I've been here. Without question we want to be successful on the field, and that means challenging for the PSAC West title. But we won't compromise integrity. We will continue to bring in young men

who have the ability to be successful both in the classroom and on the football field. It is my sincere belief that when they take the field, they must wear the Edinboro jersey with pride, and when they are in the community, that they have earned the respect that comes with being a Fighting Scot."

Browning has served on the staffs at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for two years while serving as a graduate assistant. That group included Keith Byars. The Buckeyes went to the Rose Bowl in 1984, dropping a 20-17 decision to USC to finish with a 9-3 record. The following year Ohio State went bowling again, this time defeating Brigham Young, 10-7, in the Citrus Bowl, to once again finish at 9-3.

Browning served as a graduate assistant coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following

year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. Idaho State reached the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs before suffering a 27-20 defeat to Nevada.

A 1981 graduate of The Ohio State University with a bachelor's degree in Education, Browning

began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Worthington High School and Dayton-Fairview High Schools in Ohio from 1979-81. Before transferring to Ohio State he attended Capital University where he played football for one season. Browning later earned a master's degree in Education Administration from New

Mexico State in 1983. Browning, 49 and a

native of Loudonville, Ohio, and his wife, Lynn, reside in Edinboro and have two children. Andrew (14) and Katelyn (10). His brother Mitch has also enjoyed a successful career as a football coach. After several noteworthy seasons as the offensive coordinator at the University of Minnesota, he was hired this past winter as the offensive coordinator at Syracuse University.



under former head coach Tom Hollman. After overseeing the defensive line for seven seasons, Bradford took over as the linbackers coach in 2006.

Bradford orchestrated the top defense in the country three years ago, as Edinboro paced Division II in scoring defense (9.3 ppg.), total defense (211.2 ypg.), and rushing defense (53.7 ypg.). In addition, Edinboro was third in pass efficiency defense and turnover margin. The Fighting Scots recorded three

shutouts, the most since the 1975 team also shut out three opponents. A total of seven opponents were held to seven points or less. He coached four all-conference performers a year ago.

Two years ago his defensive unit recorded two more shutouts while leading the PSAC in rushing defense (70.6 ypg.), good for third in the country.

A year ago Bradford guided a young defense that ended up having five players earn All-PSAC honors.

Under Bradford's tutelage, Edinboro has had thirteen first team All-PSAC West defensive linemen. In fact, he has been responsible for three of the last four PSAC West Defensive Players of the Year, with Ben Stroup earning the honor in 2006, Chris Amico the 2005 recipient, and Seth Fragale

the winner in 2004.

from 1994-98.

A graduate of Salisbury State, Bradford began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the linebackers (1990-92) and defensive linemen (1992-94). In 1994, he was promoted to defensive coordinator.

In 1997, Salisbury State ranked 38th in NCAA Division III in total defense, allowing just 268 yards per game. His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA ord

All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game.

Bradford graduated from Salisbury State in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration. He completed work on his master's degree in Business Administration from Salisbury State in 1992. In addition to working as a member of the football staff, Bradford was a faculty member in the School of Business. Beginning in 1996, he was the Director of the Business Graduate Programs for the Perdue School of Business.

As an undergraduate, Bradford was an offensive lineman. He played on the 1986 Salisbury State team which finished as the NCAA Division III national runnerup.

Bradford and his wife, Gwen, reside in Edinboro with their ten-year-old son, Nicholas, eight-year-old daughter, Julia and three-year-old son Mitchell.

Yurcich has overseen the development of the offense into one of the top units in the country. In particular, the Fighting Scots now rank as one of the top passing teams in Division II. A year ago Edinboro led the PSAC in passing offense (312.8 ypg.), ranked second in total offense (455.7 ypg.), and was fourth in scoring offense at 35.7 ppg., the highest total since 1994 and the fourth-highest in school history. The Fighting Scots ranked eighth in Division II in passing offense, 18th in total offense, and 25th in scoring offense.

A native of Euclid, Ohio, Yurcich served as a graduate assistant coach at Indiana University in 2003-04. In addition to conducting statistical analysis for the Hoosiers' offense, he assisted with the wide receivers.



He has quickly made his mark at Edinboro while instructing the secondary. In his first season a pair of players earned All-PSAC West honors, and this past year three of the four members of the secondary were recognized as All-PSAC performers.

At Clarion, he was elevated to the defensive coordinator in 2002 after

Niedbala recorded 117 tackles, 9 passes broken up, and had 5 interceptions in 1995, earning second team Associated Press Little All-America honors and second team Football Gazette All-American accolades. In 1994, he had 98 tackles, 6 tackles for losses, 4 interceptions and 3 sacks.

Niedbala concluded his career with 407 tackles, 34 passes broken up, 12 interceptions, 11 tackles for losses and 8 fumble recoveries. He was selected to play in the Snow Bowl following his senior season. In all, he earned first

Sox Harrison Stadium



Sox Harrison Stadium serves as the home of the Fighting Scots. Dedicated in 1965, the stadium honors the memory of B. Regis "Sox" Harrison, the head football and basketball coach at Edinboro University for 34 years. Sox Harrison was the key figure in the building of Edinboro's athletic program, unselfishly devoting 34 years of service to the University as an athletic director, coach and physical education instructor. Appropriately, he was the first



member inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.

Harrison coached the Fighting Scot football team from its inception in 1926 to 1938, the returned to guide the gridders in 1941 and '42. In addition, he coached the men's basketball team for 23 seasons, from 1928-53, winning 175 games.

The stadium received a facelift last summer, giving it a spanking new look. Most noticeable is the installation of an artificial surface, Sportexe, to replace the natural grass. And it is now illuminated, with lights being installed for the first time. Finally, a new scorebaord was installed.

Sox Harrison Stadium seats 6,000 people in its two grandstands, along with plenty of standing room. In addition to press boxes on both sides of the stadi-

The stadium has undergone several renovations, including a new sound system and improved handicapped access areas in 1999. In 1997, a new grandstand was constructed on the visitor's side of the field,

In addition to the football field, the facility contains complete track facilities.








TDI Game Ball Goes To: Northern Arizona **University Lumberjacks**

There's nothing more fulfilling than saving a life. Well, maybe except for saving eight lives, all the while improving the health of about 50 others.

That's exactly the potential that one organ donor possesses, and exactly the message the Northern Arizona University Lumberjacks football team is trying to spread.

"There are always people that need certain things that not everyone gives," says Corey Slater, an organ donor and junior quarterback at NAU. "We just want to build awareness [about organ donation] among the people around us. We are in a small town, and I think that the foot-

ball team easily can influence the 60,000 people who live in this 10-mile radius. It's not like we're in a huge city like Phoenix that has one or two million people where it's harder to make a difference."

To get the word out, the NAU football team partnered with the Arizona Organ Donor Network and set up information booths for five days this spring in the

campus' conference center and University Union. It was all part of a community service project, which the team hopes to turn into a long-term program.

Carl Franks, a Lumberjacks football assistant coach who oversaw the project, says he armed his players with all the information they needed and hoped they would reach out to about 30-50 people.

The project turned out to be a bigger success than Franks, or any of the players, ever could have imagined.

"It was intense," Slater says. "We were doing it for five days and we got quite a few people.

We got 350 people to sign up. You put those numbers together, and that's a lot of possible lives to save."

To be exact, that's 2,800 possible lives to save through organ donation alone, and about 17,500 potential others whose lives can be enhanced through tissue donation. To put it another way, those 350 donors have the ability to affect the lives of more people than can fit into NAU's 16,230-seat J. Lawrence Walkup Skydome, where the football team plays its home games.

While those numbers are impressive, it only takes one to make it all

booster who lives near the Flagstaff, Ariz., campus. He was in dire need of a liver

transplant and received a donation from a local high school football player who



"[Barry] was down to 90 pounds, and he's six feet tall," Slater says. "He was basically dead and he finally got a transplant, and he's still going strong. That was eight years ago now."

In addition to a liver, a donor can also give a heart, pancreas and small intestine, as well as both lungs and both kidneys. For recipients in need of tissues, a donor can give corneas, skin, bone marrow, heart valves, and connective tissue.

"There are people out there who need help," Slater says. "Donation or a blood drive. I'm all about it. Be a donor.'

Two Edinboro football players have been finalists for the Harlon Hill Trophy, presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II football. Running back Elbert Cole was one of three finalists in 1989.

while wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist a year later. Cole placed third in the '89 balloting. He earned All-American honors in 1989, receiving first team accolades from Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, second team recognition from Football Gazette, and third team status from Associated Press.

Cole rushed for 1,507 yards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns (24) and points (148). He led the Fighting Scots to the PSAC West title, a 8-3 record and a number seven ranking in the final Division II poll.

Priester was runnerup to North Dakota State quarterback Chris Simdorn in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title. Priester was the PSAC Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He was also recognized by Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press and the Football Gazette as a first team All-American.

The wide receiver hauled in 47 passes for 1,102 vards and 15 TDs. Edinboro finished 9-3, reaching the Division II quarterfinals.




The Cactus Bowl

Cummings and Hansen Named Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year

Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Commissioner Steve Murray is proud to recognize 1,488 student-athletes from the league who will be known as "Scholar-Athletes" for the 2007-08 academic year. The total eclipses last year's figure of 1,420.

Atop the list are the 2007-08 PSAC Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year: Mansfield's Chris Cummings and Slippery Rock's Jennifer Hansen.

The PSAC Pete Nevins Scholar-Athlete of the Year Awards are presented to the top student-athletes who have achieved at least a 3.25 cumulative grade point average while competing at an outstanding athletic level. Student-athletes must have been recognized as a Fall, Winter or Spring Top Ten Award winner to be eligible.

In its 18th year of existence, the awards were renamed in 2007 to honor East Stroudsburg's long-time sports information director Pete Nevins, who passed away earlier that year after a short battle with cancer. Nevins held his position at ESU for 33 years, and it is estimated that he wrote articles on more than 12,000 ESU events that covered more than 5,000 student-athletes.

Cummings, a graduate student at Mansfield, excelled in his final season of eligibility. He was the only PSAC male to garner All-America honors in cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field. His highest national showing came with a second-place finish in the mile during the indoor championships. At other NCAA Championships, he placed sixth in the 1,500m during the outdoor season, and was 26th at the cross country nationals. During the indoor season, Cummings won the mile and ran a leg of the winning distance medley relay at the PSAC Championships. He was crowned co-MVP of the meet and was later recognized as the 2008 PSAC Indoor Track Athlete of the Year.

Recently named an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship recipient, Cummings maintained a 4.0 GPA while pursuing his master's degree in education. As an undergraduate, Cummings carried a 3.86 GPA as a physics major. He finishes his storied career at Mansfield as a five-time All-American - twice each in indoor and outdoor track and field, and once in cross country. Between the two track seasons, the Mansfield native owns school records in nine individual and four relay events.

Hansen, a junior elementary education major, has established a 4.0 GPA. The Charleston, W. Va. product continues to set new standards in the pole vault, which includes All-America citations during this year's indoor and outdoor seasons, finishing third at both national events.

Her outdoor season included a vault of 13-3.75 at the league championships, establishing a new meet record. Coupled with her third-place effort in the long jump, Hansen was named the Most Valuable Field Athlete for the meet. Just a few weeks earlier Hansen established a new PSAC overall record in the pole vault, clearing 13-5.25 at Allegheny's Gator Invitational. It marked the fourth time in two weeks that she had broken the conference record. During the indoor season, Hansen registered a meet and overall record by vaulting 13-1.25 at the conference championship and was later honored as the PSAC Field Athlete of the Year.

Hansen was one of only three PSAC student-athlete to earn first-team Academic All-America status from ESPN The Magazine, and the only one to do so in the cross country/track and field category. She is a five-time PSAC Champion and four-time All-American.



GREAT THINGS HAPPEN HERE! The phrase was coined by new Edinboro University President Dr Jeremy Brown, and it certainly is appropriate for the success the athletic department has enjoyed.

What is truly rewarding is the continued success we enjoy year-in and year-out. We're not talking about a one year phenomenon. Fighting Scot athletic teams have enjoyed tremendous success for many years now. The 2007-08 season saw Edinboro athletic teams post an overall record of 148-84-3. That's just the start of what will go down as a memorable campaign. SUPERIOR COACHING STAFF: I've always felt

that Edinboro has assembled a coaching staff that rivals not only the best in the PSAC, but in all of Division II. For starters, men's basketball coach Greg Walcavich became just the ninth active coach in Division II with 500 wins. Women's basketball coach Stan Swank eclipsed 350 wins this past year, while Missy Soboleski (volleyball) and Jim Glatch (wheelchair basketball) topped 200 wins and women's soccer coach Gary Kagiavas went over the 100-win plateau. All Tim Flynn has done is lead his wrestling program to ten Eastern Wrestling League crowns in 11 years and nine PSAC titles in that same period. He has been named the Coach of the Year in at least one of the two leagues in nine of those 11 campaigns. Long-time cross country coach Doug Watts was once again recognized by the PSAC as its Men's Coach of the Year.

SCOTS DOMINATE INDIVIDUAL HONORS: If there is one thing that stood out above all else this year, it was the incredible individual success our student-athletes enjoyed. No fewer than six Fighting Scots were named the PSAC Player of the Year in their respective sports (Gregor Gillespie - wrestling; Trevor Harris football; Brooke Heath - women's swimming; Rachael Lanzel - women's cross country; Ryan McLemore men's basketball; and Jenna Newman - volleyball. In addition, three Scots were named PSAC Rookie of the year – Chris Honeycutt (wrestling), Barry McLaughlin (men's cross country); and Katie Wilkins (volleyball). Last, but certainly not least, three coaches earned PSAC Coach of the Year accolades - Tim Flynn (wrestling); Gary Kagiavas (women's soccer); and Doug Watts (men's cross country). Those are just a few of the honors our student-athletes picked up this year.
UPGRADED FACILITIES: Edinboro's athletic

facilities have made a quantum leap the last two years. Sox Harrison Stadium was renovated a year ago, complete with a new artificial playing surface, lights, and a new scoreboard, along with improvements to local rooms in the facility.

Journeying over to McComb Fieldhouse, the longawaited weight room project was completed last summer Edinboro athletes can now work out with some of the finest state-of-the-art exercise and weight training equip ment. The gymnasium floor has a bright new paint job that caught the eye of many this past year.
ON THE HORIZON: We anticipate that by the

time 2009 rolls around the new air-supported dome will be completed. This structure, like the new surface at Sox Harrison Stadium, will accommodate not only athletics but many other campus activities. It obviously will provide our athletic teams a tremendous opportu-nity to practice inside during those blustery Edinboro winter days. In addition, you will notice a renewed emphasis on track & field, along with the ability to expand our camp offerings.

We're very proud of everything that has been





Time to Give the "D" Some Love

Much has been written all year about the Edinboro offense, and rightfully so. But in case you haven't noticed, the Fighting Scots defense has also done an outstanding job. For instance, Edinboro ranks second in the PSAC in scoring defense (12.1 ppg.) and rushing defense (97.3 ypg.) and third in total defense (270.8 ypg.) while holding the last four opponents under 85 yards in rushing. We thought we'd take a look at three of the defenders.



Mike Enoch (DE, 6-4, 242, Sr., Fredonia, NY)

By the Numbers: Has 20 tackles, with 6.5 for losses and team-high 4.5 sacks. He's in his third year as a starter and has now started 28 games in his career.

What's the difference in the defense this year?: "I think it's mainly chemistry and attitude. We have a group of guys here this year who have gelled together. They've led the defense and brought us back up to where we need to be."

Discuss your play against

IUP: "It was probably one of my better games. I don't think I did anything different. I just try to play as hard and as physical as I can."

Talk about the senior leadership: "The seniors have done a good job this year but it's a big credit to the young kids to be able to step up. You look at a team like Clemson. If you don't have good younger guys to step in it doesn't good."

DL coach Keith Braxton on Mike Enoch: "This year I would say he's making the plays he's supposed to make. In the past he didn't. He's matured as a player. He's the only senior on the line, and he's taken a leadership role. He's been mentoring the younger players, particularly Keir (Jeter). He has become a leader. In the past he was content to be one of the guys."



Hardin Moss (OLB,

6-1, 220, Sr., Erie, PA) By the Numbers: Has tackles, with 3 for losses and 2.5 sacks.

with 3 for losses and 2.5 sacks. He has started a total of 17 games in his career and has been a regular at outside line-backer the last two years.

What's the difference in the defense this year?: "I don't know if we're playing any differently. You have to have the mentality, the drive. We want to be physical and dominate the opponent"

Talk about the senior leadership: "I think what happens is

the younger players see how hard we work. They're talented, we just show them how to work hard. As seniors we want to lead. Hopefully we can lead us to the

promised land."

What do games like Gannon and Mercyhurst mean to you as a local player: "It's like being back in high school. It's like playing a Central, a Strong Vincent, or a Prep. We definitely embrace playing the local teams."

Defensive coordinator/LB coach Wayne Bradford on Hardin Moss: "Hardin is a soft-spoken, quiet guy, but really intelligent. He really understands the game. He's similar to Y'hoshua Murray in that he has done well with his role. It's been a little bit different at times for him because he comes out in the nickel. Against IUP he made four or five big plays that switched the momentum."



Y'hoshua Murray (ILB, 5-11, 220, Sr., Braddock, PA)

By the Numbers: Leads Scots with 56 tackles, with 4.5 for losses, a sack and an interception. He transferred to Edinboro after playing at IUP in 2003 and '04. He has started 13 games as Fighting Scot.

What's the difference in the defense this year?: "We play together. We trust one another. We have that cohesiveness. We take for one another. That's the biggest difference from last year. We have a bond."

Talk about the senior leadership: "I think the seniors definitely bring leadership. Hardin, Mike Enoch, Ryan Greene. When a plays needs be made we need to step up. Like we did against IUP. The seniors kept everybody focused."

How good did the win against IUP feel: "It was definitely one me mental."

How good did the win against IUP feel: "It was definitely one we wanted. I still know a lot of the coaches and players there. When I was down there we lost twice to Edinboro. Then last year we lost to them. I wanted to get the win."

Defensive coordinator/LB coach Wayne Bradford on Y'hoshua Murray: "He really has been the glue. He keeps everybody else together with his maturity. He really knows the game. He makes up for maybe what he lacks in physical ability with his smarts. He has exceeded my expectations."

Head coach Scott Browning on Mike Enoch, Hardin Moss and Y'hoshua Murray: "You have three guys there who have done a tremendous job leading us for the last two years, and for a couple the last 4-5 years. They're the foundation of what we're doing. All have done a tremendous job in leading us. And you need to include Ryan Greene in that group. They've all led us to where we are right now."
