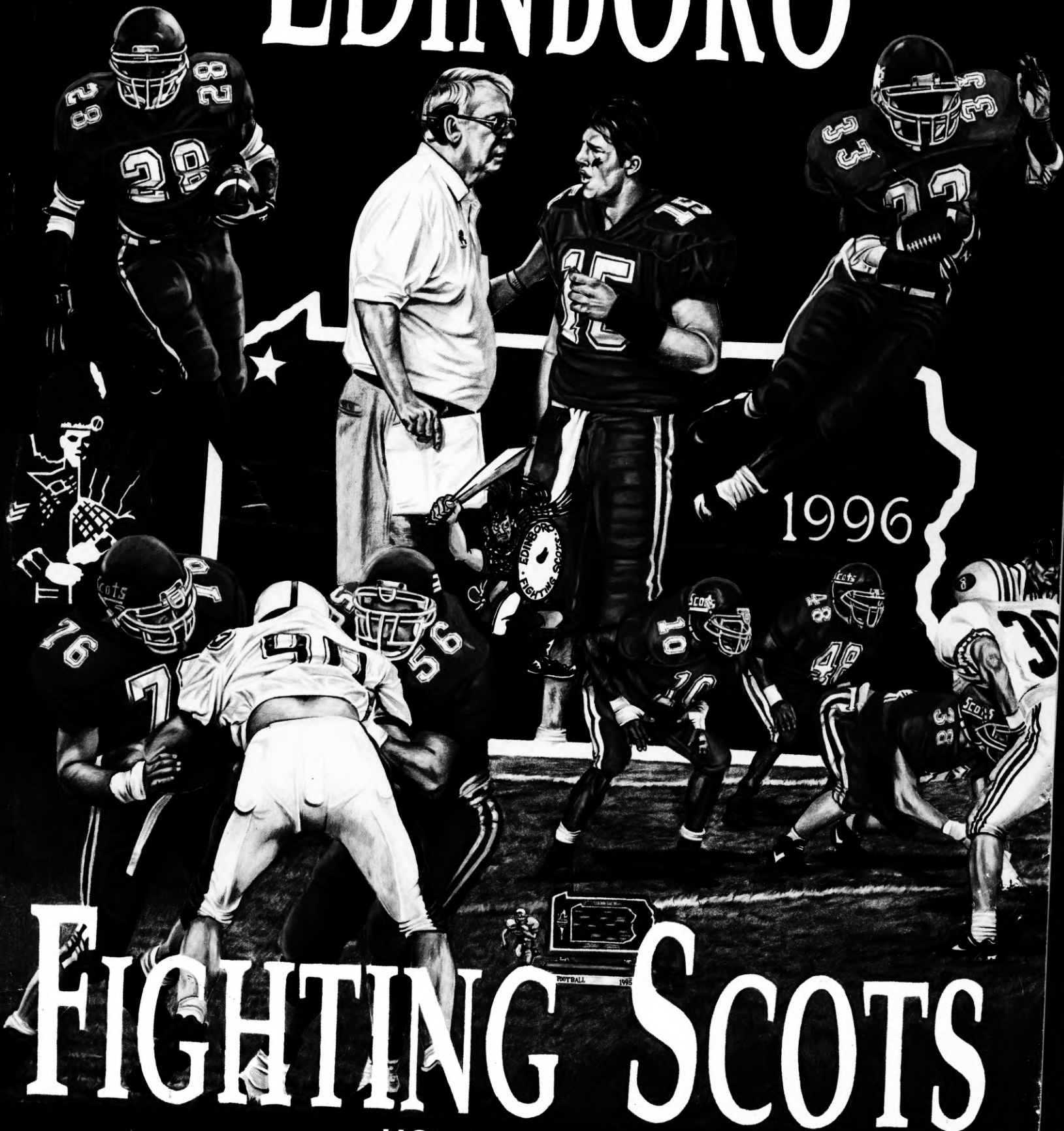

Highlights of the Hollman Era

- **January 1988** -- Edinboro University of Pennsylvania hires Tom Hollman as the 11th head football coach in school history.
- **Sept. 10, 1988** -- Hollman records his first win at Edinboro as the Fighting Scots defeat Saginaw Valley (MI) State University, 37-28.
- **Nov. 10, 1988** -- Edinboro posts a 4-0-1 record in the final five games of Coach Hollman's first year, setting the stage for a run at the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference title in '89.
- **Sept. 23, 1989** -- Edinboro defeats rival Indiana University of Pennsylvania, 37-0 to take early control of the PSAC Western Division race.
- **Nov. 4, 1989** -- The Boro clinches its first PSAC West title under Hollman, and first conference championship since 1970, beating Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania, 62-7.
- **Nov. 18, 1989** -- The Scots advance to NCAA Division II national playoffs, but drop a thrilling 45-32 decision at power North Dakota State University at Fargo, N.D.
- **December 1989** -- Senior running back Elbert Cole finishes third in balloting for Harlon Hill Award, presented annually in Florence, Ala., to the top player in NCAA Division II football.
- **Nov. 3, 1990** -- IUP edges Edinboro, 36-29, in a PSAC West game, giving the Indians the conference title. Despite the loss, the Scots finish the regular season ranked 11th in the Division II poll and the program earns its second straight playoff berth.
- **Nov. 17, 1990** -- The Fighting Scots earn first-ever NCAA Division II playoff win, downing Virginia Union College, 38-14 to advance to an NCAA quarterfinal showdown at IUP.
- **Nov. 24, 1990** -- For the second time in 1990, IUP edges Edinboro by a touchdown, claiming a 14-7 win. The Scots match the school record for victories with a 9-3 mark.
- **December, 1990** -- Edinboro wideout Ernest Priester, the all-time leading receiver in Edinboro history, finishes second in the balloting for the Harlon Hill Award behind three-time winner Johnny Bailey of Texas A&I.
- **Nov. 9, 1991** -- The Fighting Scots battle No. 1 ranked IUP to the end, but drop a 20-17 decision at Sox Harrison Stadium.
- **Oct. 24, 1992** -- The Scots beat California University of Pennsylvania, 33-13, to move to 7-0 for the first time since 1982. Boro moves up to No. 3 in national poll, marking the school's highest ranking ever.
- **Oct. 31, 1992** -- Slippery Rock ends Edinboro's hopes of an undefeated season, upsetting the No. 3 Scots 10-7 at Sox Harrison Stadium.
- **Nov. 14, 1992** -- Scots down Millersville University of

Pennsylvania, 36-12, to post their best regular-season record (8-1-1) in more than 20 years.

- **Nov. 21, 1992** -- Ferris State (MI) University defeats Edinboro, 19-15, in first round of NCAA playoffs. The Boro's Wrentie Martin caught a 43-yard pass on final play of game, but fell a yard short of the end zone as time expired.
- **Oct. 30, 1993** -- Visiting Edinboro scores with 19 seconds left to edge Slippery Rock, 41-38 in a game in which the lead changed hands four times in final quarter.
- **Nov. 20, 1993** -- The Scots once again advance to the NCAA playoffs, but lose a 48-28 decision to the University of New Haven (CT).
- **Oct. 8, 1994** -- Larry Jackson becomes Edinboro's all-time leading rusher in a 31-17 homecoming win over Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania.

- **Oct. 22, 1994** -- Edinboro defeats Slippery Rock, 59-39, at Sox Harrison. The Boro trailed, 39-23, early in final quarter, but scored 36 unanswered points in the final period to pull out an amazing win.
- **Sept. 2, 1995** -- Visiting Edinboro upsets No. 12 Portland (OR) State University, 26-7 on the West Coast.
- **Oct. 28, 1995** -- Scots beat IUP, 35-18, at home, paving the way for the Boro's second PSAC West title under Hollman.
- **Nov. 11, 1995** -- Edinboro clinches PSAC West title with a 28-6 win in a driving rainstorm at Clarion. The following day, the Scots receive their fifth NCAA playoff berth in seven years.
- **Nov. 18, 1995** -- Edinboro loses at New Haven, 27-12, in first round of national playoffs.

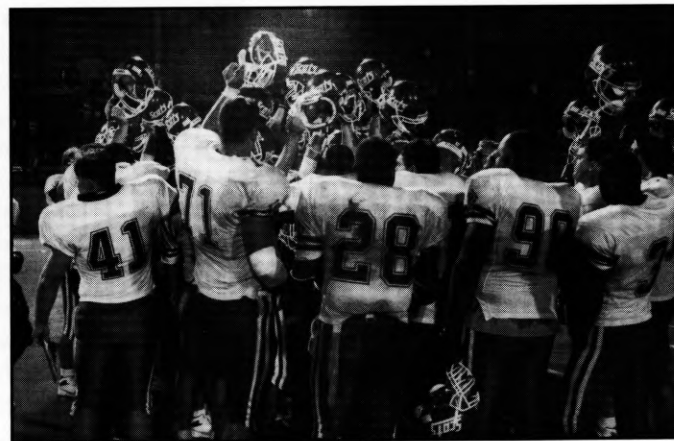
Team Unity Brings Scots PSAC Title!

Sometime after Christmas and before the start of 1995 Spring Football, a group of seniors got together to discuss the upcoming football season. While the games were still eight months or so away, they talked about the frustration of having talented football teams during their careers at Edinboro, but never ending the season with a title. And they made a very clear commitment that they were not leaving Edinboro without championship rings on their fingers. They discussed the keys to success in 1995 and the thing that kept coming to the surface was UNITY.

The Fighting Scots reported to camp in August full of enthusiasm. The opener against Hillsdale was just three weeks away. While the team had a great spring practice and things started to come together, it was suddenly time to begin the most difficult three-game non-conference schedule in school history.

THE TOUGHEST STRETCH IN HISTORY

In game one, things did indeed come together. Red-shirt freshman Gerald Thompson rambled 73 yards on his first collegiate carry and finished the day with his first 100-yard plus game. New quarterback Chris Hart was sharp, throwing for 233 yards and three TDs. And transfer Gilbert Grantlin showed his great skills, catching a touchdown pass. Senior Pat Schuster did his thing, sacking Hillsdale's QB three times. In a very physical and well-played football game by both teams, the unity of the team already made the difference. With the score tied at 14 in the fourth quarter, Edinboro pulled together and scored a late touchdown to win 21-14.



A VALIANT EFFORT

Week two presented a huge challenge for the Scots. Edinboro travelled to Appalachian State University in Boone, N.C. to take on the Division I-AA Mountaineers. Not only was Edinboro playing up a level for the first time in four seasons, the Scots were taking on a team that was ranked No. 2 in the I-AA polls and coming off a win over Wake Forest of the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Edinboro put up a valiant fight before eventually losing the game. The Scots missed some opportunities early and trailed

20-0 at halftime. But Edinboro didn't quit. The Scots drove 90 yards on their first possession of the second half to make it 20-7. But Appalachian State made some big plays and earned the win. The scoreboard read 44-7, but players from both teams knew the game was closer than the final margin when they shook hands afterward.

GREAT NORTHWEST UPSET

The third game of the season provided another monumental challenge. The Scots were flying cross-country to Portland, Ore., to take on a Portland State team that was a national contender just about each season. The Vikings, playing their last season in Division II before moving up to I-AA, were once again ranked in the top 10, and everyone wondered how this fairly untested Edinboro team would respond to the loss at Appy State and the long trip to the Great Northwest.

The questions were answered early. Edinboro's ferocious pass rush rattled Portland quarterback Kyle Allen and the high-powered Viking offense never got off the ground. With Edinboro clinging to a 6-0 lead, Schuster drilled Allen, causing a fumble that fellow defensive end Bryan Lambert returned 55 yards for a TD. Edinboro pushed the lead to 19-0 before Portland mounted a comeback. The Vikings trailed, 19-7, late in the third quarter and were threatening to make it 19-14, but the Scots' Ron Allen refused to let it happen. Allen picked off a pass in the end zone, lateraled to David Sadler, and in a flash it was first and goal going the other way. Allen finished the game with four interceptions to tie a school record and earn National Defensive Player of the Week honors.

The Scots finished off Portland with a 26-7 upset that will go down as one of the greatest wins in school history. It sent a clear message 3,000 miles east that this Fighting Scot team was ready to compete for the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference title.

THE PSAC

In the conference opener, Edinboro overwhelmed Lock Haven, 52-12, as the Boro rushed for a season-best 438 yards. The Scots then beat Shippensburg 40-7 on the road and jumped into the NCAA Division II national rankings for the first time in '95. EUP nearly shutout California (31-7) at home in week six, setting up an always difficult game at Slippery Rock. With the Indiana showdown looming, the Scots fell behind for just the second time before rallying to beat a solid Rock team, 22-13.

THE GAME

It was finally here. IUP, and THE game was at Sox Harrison Stadium. There was an unusual sense of confidence all week. Not cockiness, just a comforting feeling that if Edinboro took care of business against the Indians, the Scots would prevail.

And that's exactly what happened. Senior linebacker Michael Sims returned an interception for a TD to put the Plaid ahead, 7-0, and the Scots never trailed. Even when freshman sensation Gerald Thompson was forced to leave the game with an injury, others stepped up, like junior Tony Brinson, who scored two TDs. Even when IUP scored a TD and two-point conversion to cut the gap to 21-18, Edinboro responded with

two TDs, including a clutch touchdown catch by Todd Henne, to post a convincing 35-18 victory.

WEATHERING THE HOMESTRETCH

The win over IUP meant the Scots would have the opportunity to clinch the PSAC West title with a win the final week of the season at Clarion, the team that knocked Edinboro out of the playoff picture in 1994, with an upset.

But first, Edinboro had to beat PSAC East rival Mansfield, who also upset the Scots in '94. Six inches of snow fell the night before the game, but just like the football team, many people within the athletic department -- administrators and student-athletes and coaches from other EU teams -- pulled together to remove the snow from the tarp in the hours (and minutes) leading up to the game. Another unified effort, just to make the field playable. And once the surface was clear, the Scots again took care of business, overwhelming Mansfield, 42-0.

The weather at Clarion the next Saturday was even worse. The field was sloppy at kickoff and got progressively worse as the game was played in a steady rain. It was a true test of character. Battling the conditions was as tough as fighting off a very good Clarion team, but there was nothing that could stop Edinboro's quest for a championship.

As the clock was winding down on a 28-6 victory, there was a tremendous feeling on the Scots sideline. Some players cried, some laughed. Some just spent a moment or two by themselves, reflecting on the dedication and sacrifice it took the past 11 months to be in this position. Some, like Florida native Grantlin, did swan dives in the mud. There were hugs and high fives. Coach Tom Hollman got a Gatorade bath before being carried off the field, and Edinboro's mentor led a Scottish jig in the locker room.

The Scots were CHAMPIONS!

NCAA ACTION

The next day, the team watched the live satellite telecast of the NCAA Division II playoff parings... together. Edinboro would have to travel to New Haven, Conn., to face the fifth-ranked Chargers of the University of New Haven. The Scots got off to a great start and led 12-3 at halftime, but New Haven came back in the third quarter to take a 13-12 lead. Edinboro just couldn't get the momentum back as New Haven made several big plays to storm past the Scots, 27-12, and into the quarterfinals.

Edinboro's dream of a national title ended. It was a bitter defeat, no question, but it was a sweet season. Many years from now, people will reflect back on the '95 Fighting Scots. They'll remember the nine wins, especially the ones at Portland and against IUP and at Clarion.

But, perhaps more importantly, people will also remember that the 1995 Fighting Scots were the best TEAM in the PSAC because they were a unified group of talented individuals, led by a special group of seniors, putting it all on the line for each other.

And the unity that Edinboro displayed during the '95 season will last a lifetime.

Odds and Ends About the '95 Fighting Scots

- Edinboro finished the 1995 season with a 9-2 overall record, the fifth time in school history the program has won nine games.
- The Fighting Scots were ranked No. 8 in the final NCAA Division II poll, and advanced to the NCAA-II playoffs for the fifth time in the past seven years.
- The Fighting Scots won the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division title with a perfect 6-0 record, the only member of the 14-team PSAC to go unblemished in conference action.
- Edinboro finished the '95 regular season undefeated against NCAA Division II opponents with a 9-0 mark.
- Edinboro's defense allowed just 128 points in 10 regular season games, an average of 12.8 points per game. Throw out the 44-7 loss at Appalachian State, and the Scots allowed just 84 points against Division II foes (9.3 ppg) in regular season play. Five of EUP's 10 Division II opponents were held to seven points or less points.
- Statistically, EU's defense ranked among the Top 15 in NCAA Division II last year in four major defensive categories. The Scots allowed just 14.1 points per game overall (7th in Division II), 253.1 yards of total offense (11th), 97.8 yards per game rushing (15th), and 155.5 yards per game passing (7th).
- The Scots defense recorded 42 sacks in '95, and added an additional 63 stops behind the line. That's 105 opponent plays ending in minus yardage or 9.5/game.
- Offensively, Edinboro averaged 30.4 points per game during the regular season (33.0 ppg vs. D-II opponents). Edinboro averaged 236.6 yards per game rushing to lead the PSAC.
- Individually, red-shirt freshman running back Gerald Thompson rushed for 1,281 yards on 228 carries to lead the conference in rushing (116.5 ypg).
- Senior defensive end Pat Schuster recorded 16 sacks to finish his career with a school-record 38, his jersey number. Junior linebacker Michael Sims led the team in tackles with 105 and interceptions with five, two of which he returned for TDs.

President Frank G. Pogue, Jr.



Dr. Frank G. Pogue Jr. was appointed President of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996. Dr. Pogue brings to Edinboro more than three decades of experience in higher education including equity, diversity, excellence in teaching, retention, Afro-American studies, health care and citizenship.

Dr. Pogue serves on the Executive Council for the State System of Higher Education, which is comprised of the SSHE Chancellor and Presidents from the 14 System institutions. He is the Vice Chairperson of the Executive Committee and Chairperson of the Task Force on Equity and Diversity for the Commission on Higher Education, Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

The recipient of numerous awards in recognition of his academic and personal accomplishments, Dr. Pogue was recognized by the Office of the Governor of New York as an African American of Distinction. He has toured South Korea, China and Kenya and has worked to establish student exchange programs with these countries. Prior to coming to Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue served for ten years as the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs and Special Programs at the State University of New York Central Administration. During that time, he served for a year as Interim President of SUNY at Cobleskill. He also held several other positions during his 22-year tenure at SUNY. In addition, he was the Senior Research Associate and Assistant Professor of Family Health at Meharry Medical College in Nashville; Assistant Professor of Sociology and Director of Afro-American Studies at Chatham College in Pittsburgh; and Dean of Students and Chair of the Department of Sociology/Anthropology at Philander Smith College in Little Rock.

Dr. Pogue provides leadership to Edinboro University with particular regard to the importance of creating and maintaining a culture of academic excellence among University students, faculty, staff and administrators. He works to diversify the college experience by developing for students opportunities to interact with people different from themselves.

Athletic Director Jody Mooradian



Jody Mooradian begins her third year as athletic director at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania after serving as associate athletic director and senior women's administrator for one year with the Fighting Scots. Mooradian, a New Hampshire native who joined the Edinboro athletic staff after assisting with compliance at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) athletic department, assumed her current post in August of 1994.

Mooradian is responsible for overseeing the daily operations of the Fighting Scots' nationally competitive 19-sport intercollegiate athletics program. She has implemented several new programs for Edinboro's student-athletes, including the establishment of the EUP Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and the reinstatement of an athletic awards system.

Mooradian not only provides leadership for the Fighting Scots' athletic department, but also is a key figure on campus and within the NCAA and Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference. She serves on the President's Cabinet at Edinboro, is a member of the NCAA Interpretations Committee and the PSAC Executive Committee, and serves as chair of the PSAC Volleyball Committee.

At UCLA, Mooradian handled NCAA compliance and eligibility matters and also worked with tutorial services budgets and Title IX evaluations. She performed similar duties at Edinboro after joining the staff in August of 1993 and also assumed responsibility for financial aid for the Fighting Scots' 300-plus student-athletes, scheduling and administering Edinboro University's intercollegiate athletic events, as well as special events such as the University's outstanding summer camps.

Before dedicating herself to a career in intercollegiate athletics, Mooradian served a five-year stint as a practicing attorney. She handled all aspects of insurance litigation for Devine, Millimet and Branch of Manchester, New Hampshire, for nearly two years after serving as in-house counsel for the CIGNA Insurance Company in Philadelphia for more than three years.

Her father, Andy Mooradian, was athletic director at the University of New Hampshire for 22 years. She played college basketball for two years and earned a B.A. in political science in 1981 from New Hampshire. She received her Juris Doctorate from the Delaware Law School in 1986, and a master's degree in public administration at the University of Delaware in 1987. She served as a New Hampshire state representative for District 4 from 1980-82 and is a member of the New Hampshire and Pennsylvania bars.

Henne Selected Winner of Woody Hayes National Scholar Athlete Award



Edinboro University of Pennsylvania senior tight end Todd Henne was named a recipient of the prestigious Woody Hayes National Scholar-Athlete Award in December of 1995 after completing a highly successful career as a member of the Fighting Scot football program.

The Woody Hayes Award is presented annually by the Sertoma Club of Columbus, Ohio, to the outstanding man and woman in each of the three NCAA divisions for "demonstrated excellence in academics, athletics, community service and leadership." The award is a living memorial to the high standards of excellence - both on and off the field - of the former Ohio State University football coach.

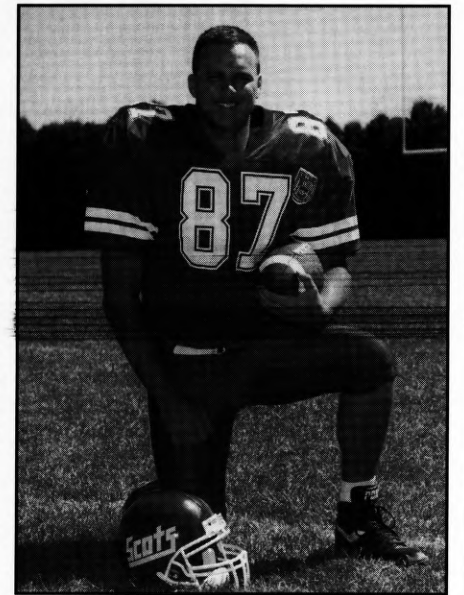
Henne received the 1995 award for Division II men.

As a speech communication major at Edinboro, Henne posted a 3.79 cumulative grade point average. He was a GTE Academic All-District selection as a senior and a national finalist for an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship.

On the field, Henne was a first-team All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference pick as a senior after earning second-team recognition as a junior. He caught 37 passes for 361 yards and seven TDs as a two-year starter. He also was a key blocker for a team that averaged 224.2 yards per game rushing and 28.7 points per contest.

During the fall of his senior year, Henne was appointed to the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and attended the organization's annual meeting in Dallas. He also was a key member of Edinboro's Student-Athlete Advisory Board and served as the sports director for the campus radio station (WFSE). He was part of a student team that produced an award-winning video on responsible drinking.

"I've often said that Todd is one of those people you know will be successful in life," said Edinboro head coach Tom Hollman. "He truly exemplifies what college athletics is all about, adhering to the same ideals that Coach Hayes stood for. We are very proud to have Todd represent our football program and University with this honor."



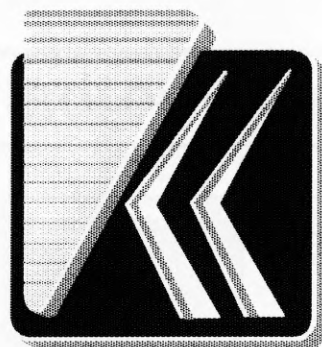

Scots in the Pros

Several former Edinboro University of Pennsylvania football players have received the opportunity to play professional football, both recently and in the past, when the school was known as Edinboro State College.

Wide receiver/kick returner Gilbert Grantlin, who played for Edinboro last season, signed a free-agent contract with the National Football League's Minnesota Vikings last April. According to Minnesota officials, Grantlin has a good chance of landing a spot on the Vikings' roster this fall.

The 6-1, 182-pound Grantlin played only one season at Edinboro, but made a significant impact with his big-play ability. The Florida native, a Dr. C.M. Frank honorable-mention All-American, caught 44 passes for 840 yards (19.1 yards per catch) and eight touchdowns. Grantlin also had 372 yards on 17 kickoff returns (21.8-yard average) and 300 yards on 28 punt returns (10.7-yard average). He returned a punt 85 yards for a touchdown in a win over Mansfield University of Pennsylvania.

Before Grantlin, Mike Kegarise was the last Fighting Scot to play in the NFL. The 6-6, 310-pound offensive tackle, a two-time All-American, signed a free-agent deal with the NFL's Seattle Seahawks after concluding his Edinboro career in 1993. Kegarise spent the 1994 season on the Seahawks' injured-reserve list with a severe knee injury, but then was released the following season when Seattle changed head coaches.

Two other former Scots who played under current head coach Tom Hollman also signed free-agent contracts with NFL teams.

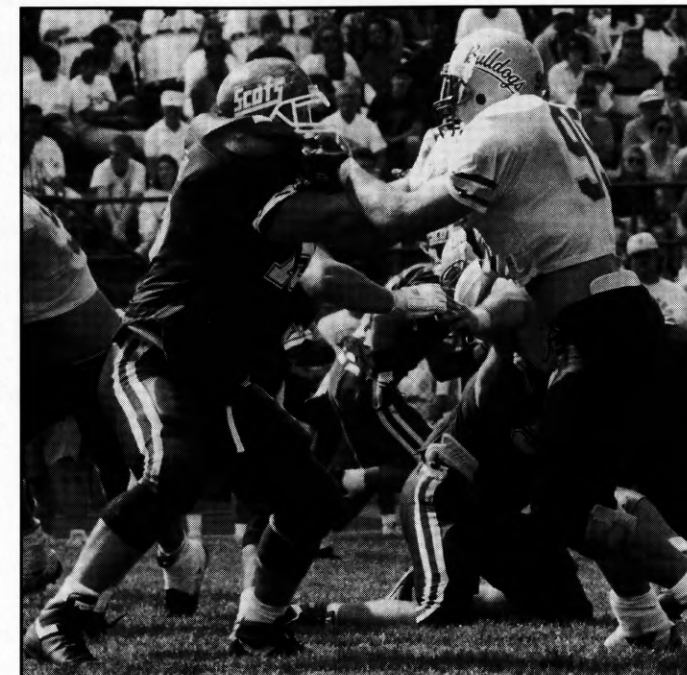
Offensive guard Curtis Rose signed with the Miami Dolphins, while wide receiver Ernest Priester inked a deal with the Denver Broncos. Neither Rose nor Priester played a regular-season game in the NFL, although Cleveland native Priester later played for the Cleveland Thunder of the Arena Football League.

Rose and Priester both were two-time All-Americans at Edinboro. The 6-3, 280-pound Rose earned the honors in 1990 and 1991, while the 5-9, 170-pound Priester did so in 1989 and 1990. Priester was the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He is Edinboro's all-time career leader in receptions (148), receiving yards (3,064), yards per reception (20.7) and touchdown receptions (35).

A pair of Scots who performed during the Edinboro State College days -- David Green and Jim Romaniszyn -- played professional football in the 1970s. Both are members of the Edinboro University Athletic Hall of Fame, with Green being inducted in 1988 and Romaniszyn being honored in 1983.

Green, a running back, played for the Cleveland Browns of the NFL and for the Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League. An All-American, Green played for Edinboro in 1975 and 1976. He ranks fifth on the school's all-time rushing list with 1,978 career yards in 19 games (104 yards per contest).

Romaniszyn played at Edinboro from 1970-72, earning All-American honors. The 6-2, 225-pound Titusville native was drafted by the Cleveland Browns in 1973 as a running back, but was switched to outside linebacker. A versatile performer, Romaniszyn is the only Edinboro player to finish his career with 1,000-plus yards rushing (1,266) and 1,000-plus yards receiving (1,088). He also played basketball for the Scots.

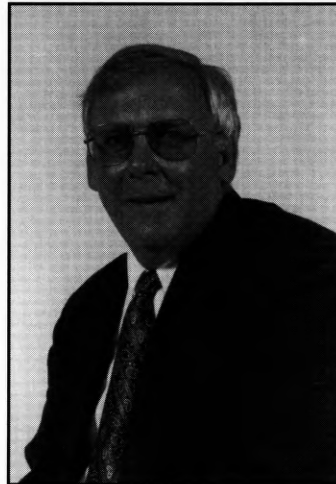


Offensive lineman Mike Kegarise spent two years with the Seattle Seahawks.

Head Coach Tom Hollman



After guiding the Fighting Scot football program to one of the finest seasons in school history last year, Tom Hollman begins his ninth season as head football coach at Edinboro.

The Fighting Scots posted a 9-2 record last fall and was the only program in the 14-member Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference to record a perfect 6-0 league mark. Edinboro

captured the PSAC Western Division title for the second time in Hollman's tenure, adding the '95 championship trophy to the one the Scots claimed in 1989.

Edinboro was ranked eighth in the final NCAA Division II football poll and the program received its fifth berth to the national playoffs in the past seven years.

Hollman became Edinboro's all-time winningest coach in 1995 with a Homecoming victory over Lock Haven. He enters the '96 campaign with a 61-24-2 mark at Edinboro, compiling more victories and a better winning percentage (.713) than any coach in Scot history.

Hollman enters the '96 season ranked 11th on the NCAA Division II Winningest Active Coaches list. He has compiled an 85-35-3 overall record (.703) in 12 seasons as a college head coach, including a 24-11-1 mark in four seasons at Wooster College in Ohio.

Hollman joined the Edinboro staff in January of 1988 as the program's 11th head coach after serving as the defensive coordinator at Ohio University for three years.

Edinboro went 4-0-1 during the final five games of his first season, then in 1989, captured the PSAC West title with a 6-0 record and roared into the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time in school history.

The Scots lost a thrilling 45-32 decision at perennial Division II power North Dakota State University, but the EU program had clearly arrived as a force in Division II football. Hollman was honored as the top coach in the East Region by the American Football Coaches Association and he also was selected PSAC West "Coach of the Year."

In 1990, Hollman guided the Fighting Scots to their first-ever NCAA II playoff win as Edinboro beat Virginia Union, 38-14, on the road to advance to the national quarterfinals. The Scots then dropped a tough 14-7 contest to PSAC rival Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

The Scots returned to the NCAA playoffs in 1992 and 1993 after runner-up finishes in the PSAC.

In addition to team success, Hollman has coached 48 All-Americans at Edinboro, including Elbert Cole and Ernest Priester, who both placed in the top three in the voting for the Harlon Hill Award presented to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year. He also has coached players who have set school records for rushing, passing, receiving, quarterback sacks, and interceptions.

Hollman is a 1968 graduate of Ohio Northern University, where he was a three-year starter for the football team and a two-way performer as a defensive back and end on offense. He holds the school record with 13 career interceptions and earned All-American and All-District honors during the 1966 and 1967 seasons. Hollman also lettered in baseball for three years. Hollman earned a master of science degree in education from Xavier University in Cincinnati in 1971.

Head Coach Tom Hollman

A chronological look at Hollman's coaching career begins in 1968 as an assistant coach at Sidney High School in Sidney, Ohio. From there, Hollman moved on to Greenville High School in Ohio, where he became head coach from 1971-73. His Greenville squads posted an impressive 26-2-2 mark during his three-year stay.

Hollman then moved on to Fremont Ross High School as head coach for the 1974 and 1975 seasons, where his squad recorded 15 wins against three setbacks and two ties. Fremont was the Buckeye Conference champ in 1974, unbeaten at 9-0-1.

In 1976, Hollman moved on to the collegiate ranks, where he was the defensive coordinator for his alma mater at Ohio Northern University. The following year, Hollman accepted the head coach position at Wooster College (OH) and guided his squad to the best four-year record in the school history (24-11-1). In 1981, Hollman took an assistant coaching spot with Ball State University which he held through the 1984 campaign. Then, beginning in 1985, Hollman held the defensive coordinator position at Ohio University.

Tom resides in Edinboro with his wife, Kandi. They have four children, Mari, Jon, Tim and Denise.

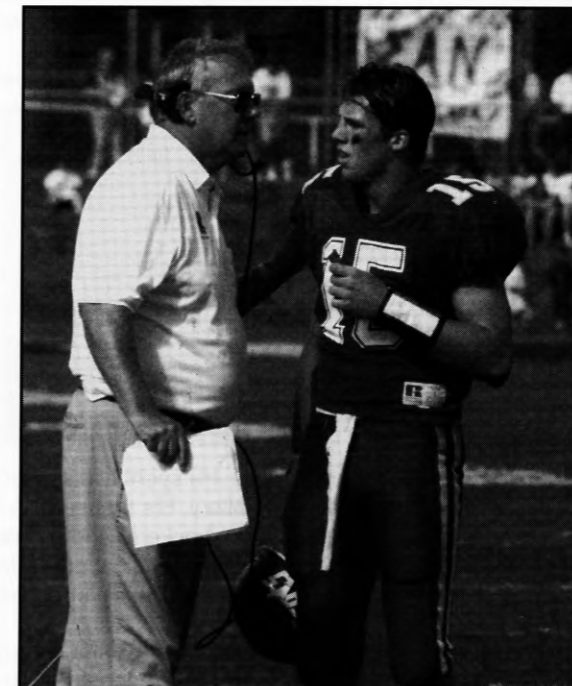

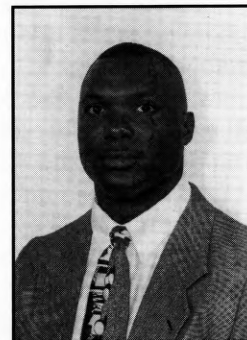
Scott Browning – Offensive Coordinator/Line

Scott Browning begins his second season as Edinboro's offensive coordinator and 11th year overall coaching the Fighting Scots.

Browning has coached a variety of positions at the Boro, including the offensive line for the past three years, and running backs and defensive backs in the past. Under his guidance a year ago, the Scots' offense averaged 388.1 yards of total offense and 28.1 points per game. The offensive line helped the Scots average 224.2 yards per game rushing, 12th in NCAA Division II, and held opponents to only nine sacks in 11 games. Browning's challenge in 1996 will be to reorganize a young offensive line hit hard by graduation.

In his many capacities, Browning has coached several All-Americans such as Steve Russell, Michael Willis, Wade Smith, Georj Lewis, Mike Barnes, Elbert Cole, and Jeremy O'Day.

Browning has coached at three NCAA Division I schools. Before joining the Edinboro staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State University for three years. He also coached the defensive secondary at New Mexico State University in 1982, and the following year mentored the receivers at Idaho State University, an NCAA Division I-AA playoff participant. Prior to his stint at OSU, Browning coached at Worthington and Dayton-Fairview High Schools in Ohio from 1979-81. Browning earned a master's degree in education administration from New Mexico State in 1983, and a BS in education from Ohio State in 1981. Earlier, before transferring to OSU, Scott attended Capital University, where he played football for one season. Browning was a four-year letterman in four sports at Loudonville High School (OH) prior to his collegiate days. Scott is married to the former Lynn Hook, and has a son, Andrew Scott, 3.



Tony Elliott – Defensive Coordinator/Secondary

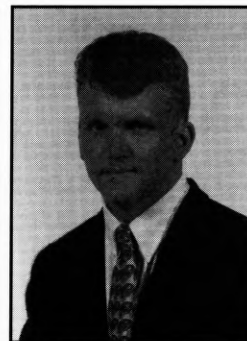
Tony Elliott, a defensive back with the Green Bay Packers from 1986-88, enters his third season as an assistant coach with the Fighting Scots, and second year as the Boro's defensive coordinator.

Last season, the Scots had one of the top defenses in Division II football, ranking in the top 15 nationally in all four major statistical categories. EU allowed an average of 14.1 points per game to rank seventh nationally. The Scots also ranked seventh in passing yards allowed (155.5 ypg), 11th in total yards allowed (253.1 ypg), and 15th in rushing defense (97.8 ypg).

Elliott came to Edinboro from Wayne State (MI) University, where he served as the team's defensive coordinator in 1992 and '93. Elliott began his coaching career at Alma College in 1990-91, before coaching at Grand Valley State University in 1991-92. His main duties at those two schools were recruiting and teaching on the defensive side of the ball.

Elliott is a graduate of Central Michigan University where he majored in sports studies with a minor concentration in interpersonal communications. He was a four-year letterman for the Chippewas. Originally from Detroit, Elliott played at Finney High School from 1979-82, where he was an All-State performer.

Tony and his new wife, Bynarozell, were married this summer.



Nick Cronk – Defensive Line

In his three years as defensive line coach, Nick Cronk has made a tremendous impact on the success of the Fighting Scot defense.

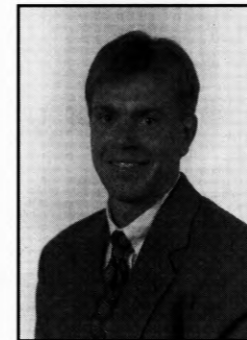
Last season, three of Edinboro's four defensive linemen were All-Conference selections, including senior Pat Schuster, who also was a consensus All-American pick after setting school records for sacks in a season (16) and career (38). Edinboro's defensive front sacked opposing quarterback's 42 times and made 63 additional tackles behind the line of scrimmage.

Before coming to Edinboro, Cronk coached tight ends at Indiana University. He spent two seasons with the Hoosiers, both of them as a graduate assistant to head coach Bill Mallory. His first season in Bloomington, Cronk spent time assisting the defensive coordinator with the linebackers, and he also helped in the recruiting duties. While at IU, he graduated with a master's degree in physical education administration. Prior to joining the staff at Indiana, Cronk was an assistant coach at Carroll

Consolidated High School, handling the special teams and defensive ends.

Cronk spent his playing days at Wabash College, where he was an honorable mention performer in the Indiana College Athletic Conference and captained the 1991 league championship squad. He graduated from Wabash with a bachelor of arts degree in political science. He and his wife, Karla, reside in Edinboro with their son, Hayes Woodrow, who was born in May.

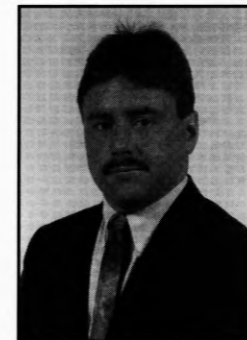
Mike Nelson – Wide Receivers

Mike McCoy – Running Backs

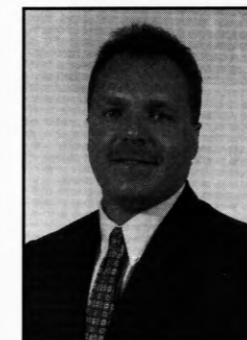
Mike McCoy enters his first season with the Fighting Scots program in 1996 and will be responsible for coaching the Fighting Scot running backs.

'96 Season Outlook

Edinboro Looks to Challenge for PSAC West Title and NCAA Division II Playoff Berth Again in '96

If the old saying that 'defense wins championships' holds true in 1996, then the Edinboro University of Pennsylvania football team could challenge for its second straight Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division title and the program's sixth trip to the NCAA Division II playoffs in eight years.

Last season, Edinboro won the PSAC West title, and posted a 9-2 record under head coach Tom Hollman, featuring a defense that allowed just 9.3 points per game against Division II opponents during the regular season.

Seven starters return from that unit, including one of the top linebackers in the country, 6-2, 220-pound senior Michael Sims, who led the team with 105 tackles and returned two interceptions for touchdowns to earn All-America honors.

Edinboro also returns its other two starting linebackers, a secondary with four experienced players including both starting safeties, and two of its four starters on the defensive line.

In addition to Sims, senior Jerry Roberts and junior Emery Martin return at linebacker after solid 1995 campaigns.

The secondary also is experienced as both starting safeties, seniors Ron Allen and senior Brian Decker return. Allen had four interceptions in EU's upset victory at Portland (OR) State University last season to earn National Player of the Week honors. Decker is an outstanding athlete who high-jumped seven feet this spring. Senior Jermaine Carswell and sophomore David Sadler could move from safety to corner, but expect Hollman to add a quality recruit or two in the secondary.

Up front, the Scots return both defensive tackles, 6-5, 280-pound senior Jeff Traversy and 6-1, 260-pound senior Matt Gentile. However, the Boro must replace two outstanding defensive ends, including consensus All-American Pat Schuster, who set a school record for career sacks (38), and All-Conference performer Bryan Lambert.

The strength of the



Jeff Traversy leads the Scots defensive front.

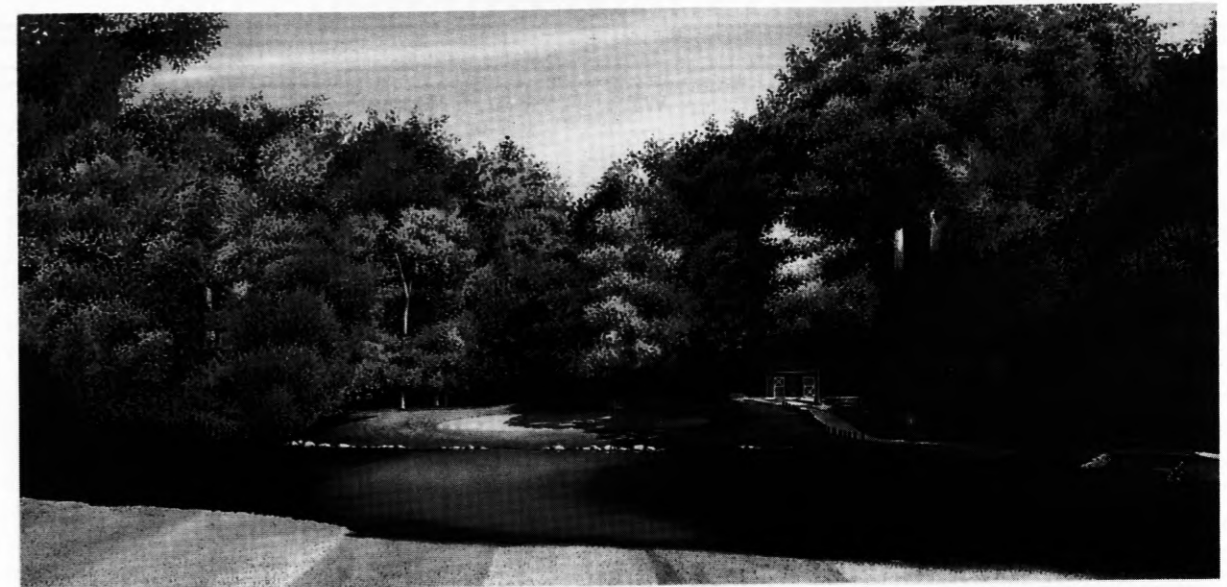
Fighting Scots offense, which returns six starters, will be the exact opposite as last year, when the Boro featured a veteran offensive line and major questions at quarterback, running back and receiver entering the season. This year, senior quarterback Chris Hart returns after starting and maturing an entire season. Hart threw for 1,803 yards and 13 TDs last season, completing 47.9 percent of his passes.

Edinboro also returns both of its starting running backs. Gerald Thompson, a 6-0, 215-pound tailback, rushed for 1,281 yards and 10 TDs on 228 carries (5.6 ypa) as a red-shirt freshman. He was selected the PSAC West Rookie of the Year, first-team All-Conference and first-team All-Northeast Region. He'll be joined in the backfield once again by 6-0, 188-pound senior Tony Brinson, a versatile performer who rushed for 649 yards and 7 TDs and also caught 20 passes for 239 yards and two additional scores. One of the most versatile backs in the league, Brinson was a second-team All-PSAC pick.

Two experienced receivers, junior Quentin Ware-Bey (22 receptions, 289 yards) and senior Terry Roberts (12 catches, 181 yards) also are back, along with tight end John Sabo (3 catches, 29 yards, 1 TD).

Up front, Edinboro must replace four of its five starting linemen, but the one returnee, 6-3, 285-pound senior Jeremy O'Day, is a two-time All-American. He'll probably play both guard and tackle.

If the offense can fill a few holes up front, an experienced and talented group of returnees are in the fold to put some points on the board. However, the strength of the 1996 Fighting Scots will once again be defense, and the Scots may be just good enough to win another title.

Todd V. Jay, Assistant to the Vice President for Athletic Compliance and Publicity

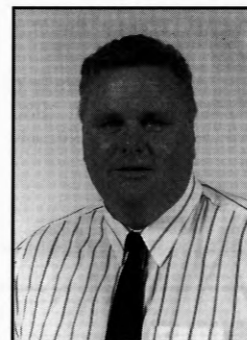

Dave and his wife Carla have two children, Sean, 15, and Hailey Jo, who was born in June.



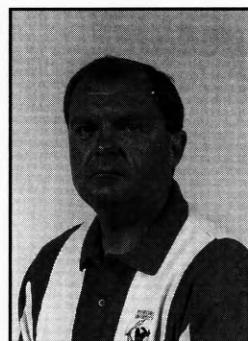
Sue Marshall, Athletic Business Director

George Roberts, A.T., C., Head Athletic Trainer

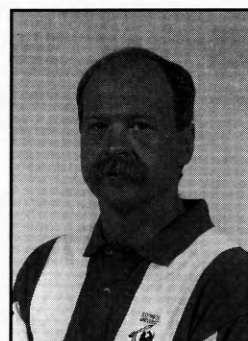

Edinboro Hosts Shippensburg in Homecoming Game



THE GAME

The Edinboro University of Pennsylvania Fighting Scots welcome the Red Raiders of Shippensburg to Sox Harrison Stadium on Saturday as Edinboro celebrates its annual Homecoming weekend.

Kickoff is set for 2 p.m. The game will be broadcast live on WFSE-FM (88.9).

PSAC OPENER

The game will be the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division opener for both teams.

The Fighting Scots, 1-2 overall this season, are the defending PSAC-West champions. Last year, Edinboro was a perfect 6-0 in conference action, the only PSAC school to record an unblemished record. Edinboro advanced to the NCAA Division II national playoffs for the fourth time in the past six years as the Scots finished 9-2 overall record.

Shippensburg enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 1-3. The Red Raiders were 3-8 overall last season and placed fifth in the league with a 2-4 record.

SCOTS IN THE PSAC

Edinboro has posted a 37-9-2 record (.792) against PSAC West foes since head coach Tom Hollman was hired in 1988.

The Fighting Scots won PSAC West titles in 1995 and 1989 and finished as the Western Division runner-up in 1990, '93 and '94.

The Boro has won its last seven PSAC West openers, and the Scots are 11-5 in Western Division openers since 1980.

PERFECT HOMECOMINGS

Edinboro has not lost a Homecoming game since Tom Hollman became head coach of the Scots in 1988.

The Boro dropped a 49-28 decision to West Chester on Homecoming in 1987, and have won eight straight Homecoming contests since. Last year, Edinboro beat Lock Haven, 52-12, on Homecoming.

HOME SWEET HOME

It's more than appropriate that Saturday is Edinboro's Homecoming contest.

The Scots are not only playing at Sox Harrison Stadium for the first time this season, but Edinboro also is playing at home after *five straight road games in five different states!*

The Boro played its final two games on the road last year, winning the PSAC-West title at Clarion in the final game of the regular season, before traveling to New Haven, Conn., for the first round of the NCAA Division II playoffs.

The Fighting Scots opened the '96 campaign with three straight road games: a 35-14 victory at Hillsdale College in Michigan; a 42-12 loss at Carson-Newman in Tennessee, then last week's 17-7 defeat at the University at Buffalo in New York.

TOUGH AT HOME

Edinboro has posted a 33-5-1 record (.859) at Sox Harrison Stadium since Tom Hollman became head coach in 1988. The Scots have won nine of their last 10 home games.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

Not only have the Scots played all road games, the opposition has been especially tough.

Carson-Newman became the No. 1 ranked team in Division II football this week, moving up two spots in the poll from the No. 3 ranking the Eagles held when Edinboro played.

Buffalo, an NCAA Division I-AA program, is now 4-1 on the season. The Bulls, who are making the jump up to NCAA Division I-A status in 1999, are a program on the rise.

THE COACHES

Edinboro's Tom Hollman has posted an 86-37-3 overall record (.694) in 13 seasons as a college head coach, including a 62-26-2 mark (.700) in nine years at Edinboro.

Hollman was ranked 11th in winning percentage among active NCAA Division II coaches entering the '96 season and 20th in total victories. He became Edinboro's all-time winningest coach last season, leading the Fighting Scots to a 9-2 overall record.



Edinboro has captured a pair of PSAC-West titles under Hollman (1989 and 1995), and the Scots have qualified for the NCAA Division II playoffs in five of the past seven seasons.

Hollman is 7-1 versus Shippensburg.

Shippensburg head coach Rocky Rees is in his seventh year at the helm and enters Saturday's game with a 33-38-2 mark with the Red Raiders. His only victory over the Fighting Scots was a 45-7 win over Edinboro in 1991.

Rees has an overall coaching record of 69-53-2.

THE SERIES

The schools will meet for the 36th time on Saturday with the overall series tied, 17-17-1

Shippensburg dominating the rivalry early on, while Edinboro has enjoyed most of the success in recent years. The Fighting Scots have won four straight over the Raiders and Edinboro has claimed 12 of last 14 contests.

Last year, Edinboro jumped out to a 20-0 half-time lead and posted a solid 40-7 victory. Wide receiver Gilbert Grantlin scored three touchdowns, and running back Gerald Thompson rushed for 169 yards and two TDs, leading a balanced Edinboro attack which produced 465 yards of total offense.

Edinboro's defense limited Shippensburg to 155 yards of total offense.

SCOTS TO WATCH

The Edinboro offense features an experienced backfield, led by senior quarterback Chris Hart and the running back tandem of sophomore Gerald Thompson and senior Tony Brinson.

Hart has completed 56 of 97 passes (.577) for 563 yards and two TDs this year, and has now thrown for 2,478 yards in his Edinboro career to rank ninth on EU's all-time list.

Hart had an outstanding first half last week at Buffalo, completing 14 of 18 passes for 153 yards. For the game, he completed 22 of 36 passes for 208 yards.

Thompson, the PSAC-West Rookie of the Year in 1995 after rushing for 1,281 yards and 10 TDs as a red-shirt freshman, has been slowed by a few nagging injuries (back, shoulder) this year.

He had his best outing last week, gaining 71 yards on 29 carries at Buffalo.

Brinson has rushed for 137 yards on 50 carries this year. He eclipsed 1,000 yards rushing for his EUP career at Buffalo and enters the Shippensburg game with 1,018 yards on 237 carries.

Sophomore Quentin Ware-Bey and senior tight end Corey Keyes lead the receivers. Ware-Bey has 16 catches for 182 yards, while Keyes has 12 receptions for 106 yards.

THE BORO DEFENSE

Edinboro returned seven starters from one of Division II's top defenses from last season. The Scots are led by 6-2, 220-pound senior inside linebacker Michael Sims, who led the team in tackles each of the past two seasons, 6-5, 285-pound senior defensive tackle, Jeff Traversy, who recorded eight sacks a year ago, and junior free safety Brian Decker.

Sims was credited with a season-high 18 tackles at Buffalo (9 solo, 9 assists). He now has 24 stops on the season, second on the team behind Decker, who has 30 tackles (18 solo). Traversy has 10 tackles this year, including two sacks and two tackles for loss.

A LOOK AT SHIPP

The Red Raiders are coming off a 34-29 loss to Millersville last week, after a heartbreaking 37-34 defeat at Kutztown two weeks ago. Ship defeated Shepherd (WV) College on Sept. 14 for its only victory of the year, after losing to James Madison in the season opener.

Shippensburg's offense averages 337.5 total yards per game, including 174 yards per game rushing and 163.5 yards passing. The attack is led by junior quarterback Mike Carver, who has completed 47 of 93 passes (.505) for 628 yards with two TDs and three INTs. Senior Michael Buglia leads the team in receiving, hauling in 22 passes for 384 yards and two scores.

Three running backs, sophomore Kevin Washington (27 car., 195 yards, 4 TDs), junior Mark Madson (48 car., 187 yards, 1 TD) and junior Rajahn Bass (31 car., 182 yards, 2 TDs) have handled most of the running duties, but Madsen missed the last game with an injury.

The Shippensburg defense is led by junior linebacker Mike Vnuk, who has a team-high 52 tackles (926 solo), senior defensive back Jeff Brown (42 stops, three forced fumbles) and sophomore defensive back Dean Owens (41 tackles)

UP NEXT

The Fighting Scots will play at California next Saturday night at 7 p.m. Edinboro returns home Oct. 19 with a clash against Slippery Rock at 1 p.m.

Versatile Brinson Quietly Does Job For Fighting Scots

Quietly, but surely, Tony Brinson does the job for the Edinboro University of Pennsylvania football team.

Brinson, a 6-0, 188-pound senior running back from Pittsburgh's Langley High School, went over the 1,000-yard rushing mark for his career in last week's game at the University at Buffalo.

During his career at Edinboro, Brinson has been somewhat overshadowed by the likes of Larry Jackson (Edinboro's career rushing leader with 4,237 yards) and current backfield mate Gerald Thompson (1,281 yards rushing last season), but that has not stopped Brinson from making his mark as a valuable all-purpose back.

Last season, en route to earning second-team Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division recognition, Brinson rushed for 649 yards and seven touchdowns, caught 20 passes for 239 yards and two scores and provided solid blocking for Thompson.

This season, Brinson has rushed for 137 yards in the Scots' first three games, including a team-high 85 yards at Carson-Newman. His production this year gives him 1,018 career yards and ranks him No. 19 on the school's all-time rushing list.

A solid rushing performance in Saturday's homecoming contest against Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania would enable Brinson to climb even higher on Edinboro's rushing list, past former Boro players Joe Sanford (1,026 yards), Bryan Libert (1,031), Chris Conway (1,034) and Joe Early (1,095).

Brinson, however, is a team player, and he would much rather play an all-around role in a win than rush for 100-plus yards in a loss.

"I don't mind if I'm not the featured back," Brinson said. "As long as I contribute to the team as an all-purpose back, I'm all for it. I'm valuable to the team in my role. I play halfback, fullback, the slot."

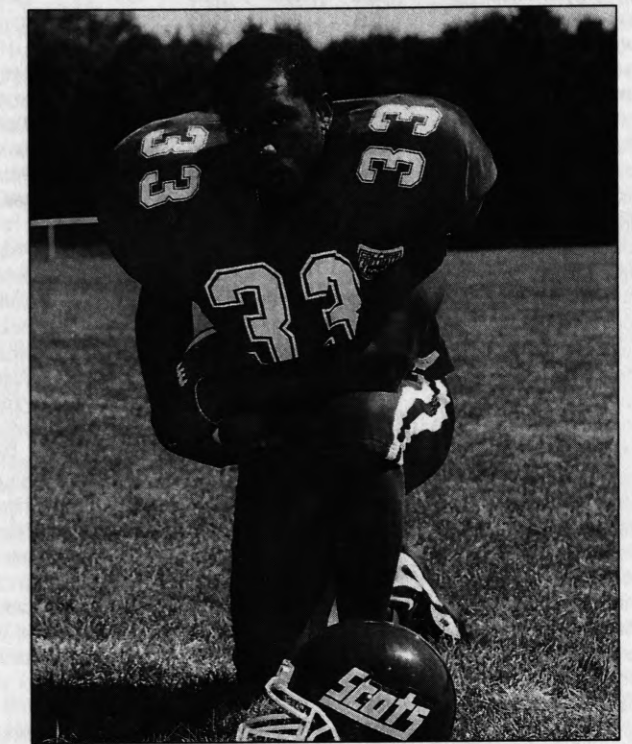
"Tony is a complete player," said Edinboro head coach Tom Hollman. "He can do a number of things for us. He did a lot of big things last year, and we expect more big things from him this year."

"Tony is a great team player," said Edinboro offensive coordinator Scott Browning. "He'll do whatever you ask him to do - run, block, catch a pass."

Brinson, who majors in criminal justice, also plays another key role in a leadership capacity.

"Tony is quiet, but he leads by example," Hollman said. "He's an unselfish team player."

"Tony is a quiet leader who leads by example," Browning said. "He's a hard-nosed kid who plays hard

and practices hard. He sets a good example for our younger players."

Like most running backs, Brinson would love to rush for 1,000-plus yards in a season, but Brinson is more concerned with team success, and Edinboro has enjoyed a lot of success in recent years, advancing to the NCAA Division II national playoffs in two of Brinson's first three seasons.

"I think about what it would be like to rush for 1,000 yards in a season," Brinson said. "But Larry Jackson was a great player, and Gerald Thompson is a great player. I think I've had a pretty good career. I've done a lot more than I thought I would."

Brinson has individual goals, but they do not include a certain number of yards rushing or a certain number of receptions. Brinson simply wants to stay healthy and help the Scots win games. Brinson also wants to help take Edinboro deeper into the national playoffs.

Edinboro is 1-2 thus far, but the Scots have faced a demanding schedule, playing at Hillsdale, at Division II's No. 1 team, Carson-Newman, and at NCAA Division I-AA University at Buffalo.

"It (the tough non-conference schedule) will help us a lot," Brinson said. "We'll be ready come PSAC time."

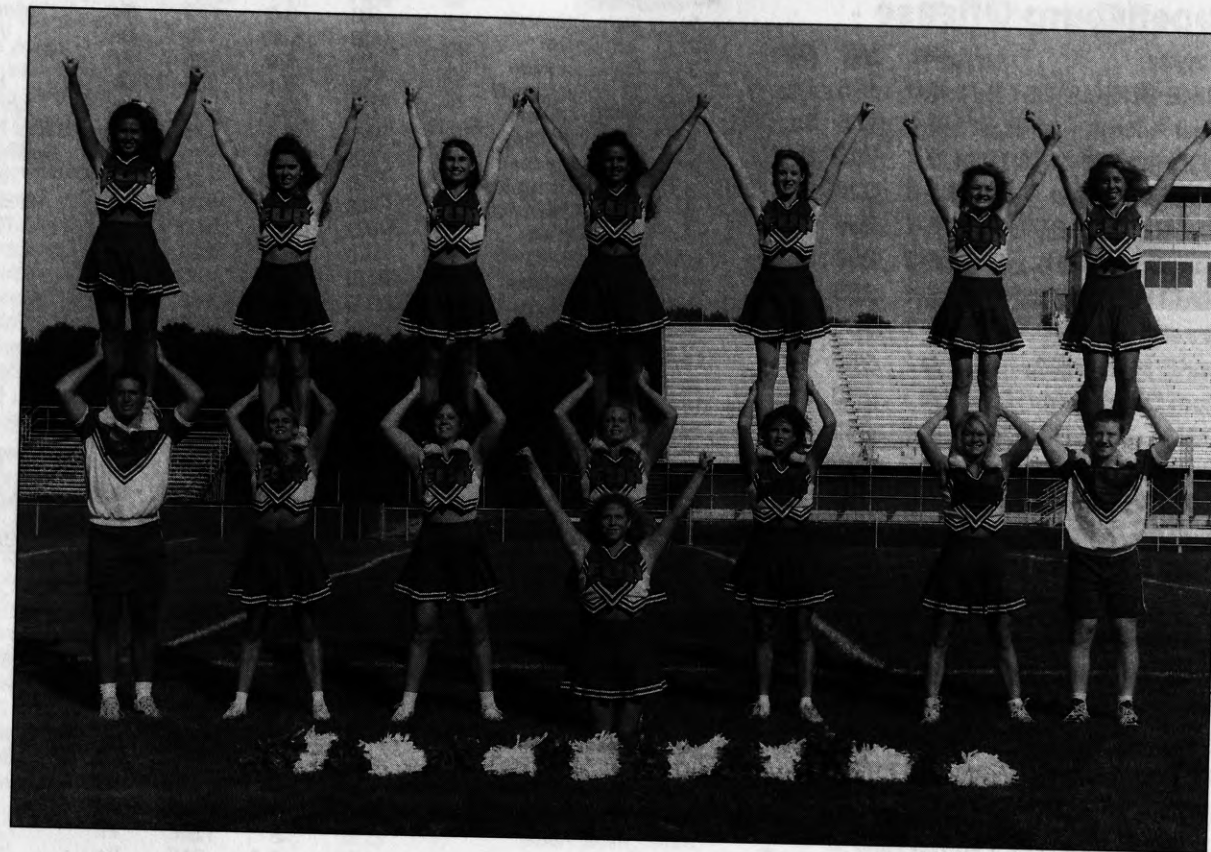

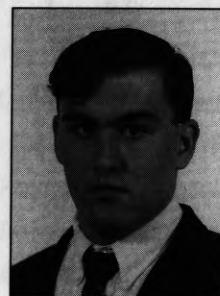

Rocket Outlook

Slippery Rock enters this season with high expectations after finishing the 1995 campaign 7-4 overall and 4-2 in the PSAC West. Wolf Outlook

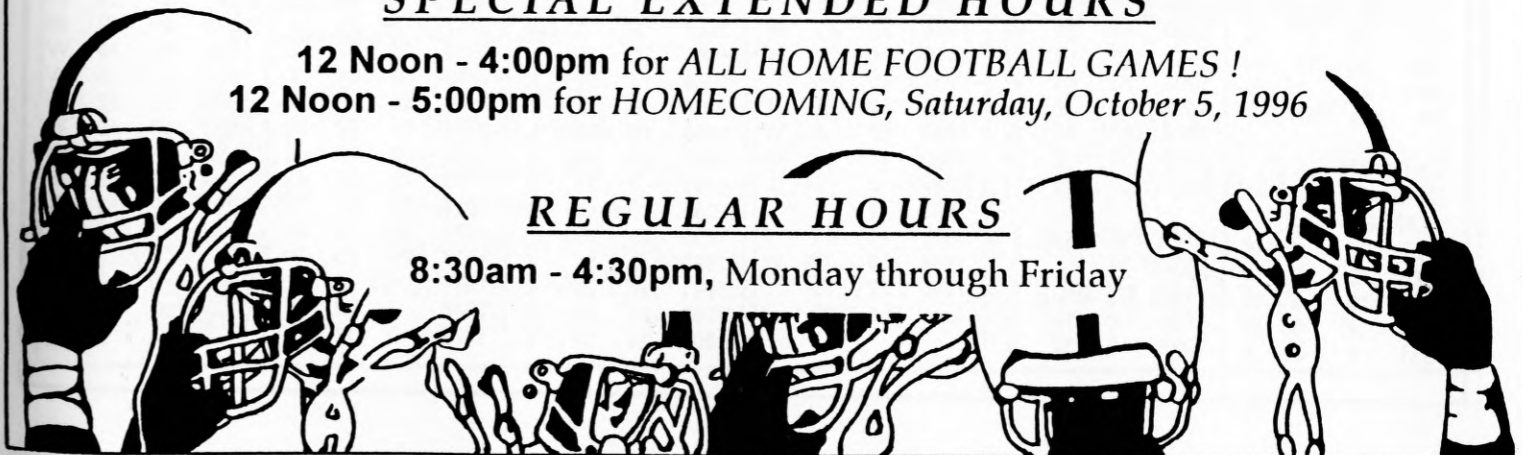

Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) has established itself as one of the premier NCAA Division II athletic conferences in the nation.

Founded in 1951 for the purpose of promoting and administering the athletic programs at the 14 state teachers' colleges in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the PSAC is divided into seven-team Divisions.

The PSAC crowns Divisional Champions in football, but the "State Game" between the top team in the East and West was eliminated after the 1987 contest.

The PSAC is well-represented each year in the NCAA Division II national polls and post-season Football Championship.

The PSAC has had at least two teams compete in the NCAA Division II playoffs every year since 1988. Last season, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania and Millersville University of Pennsylvania represented the conference in the post-season. Since 1990, PSAC teams have participated in a total of 22 NCAA Division II playoff games, highlighted by two national championship game appearances by Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1990 and 1993.

From its inception in 1951, each conference member selected its own competitive division within the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). In 1980, however, the president's of each school, which make up the league's Board of Directors, voted to reclassify to NCAA Division II membership. Nine schools also elect to participate at the NCAA Division I level in select sports.

In 1983, all member institutions were granted University status and the State System of Higher Education (SSHE) was formed. The system currently has an enrollment in excess of 99,000 students with an alumni base of 402,000, including 287,000 who reside in the state. The Chancellor of the SSHE is Dr. James H. McCormick.

The PSAC sponsors championships in 20 men's and women's sports, including baseball, basketball, cross country, field hockey, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball and wrestling. One of the largest NCAA Division II conferences in the nation, the league employs a full-time commissioner, Dr. Charles A. 'Tod' Eberle, and an information director, Steve Murray, who can be reached at (717) 893-2780 for more information.

Edinboro traveled to Clarion with a chance to win the PSAC Western Division title and become the only team in the 14-member conference to go undefeated and untied in league play. For the second straight year, however, the Golden Eagles had a chance to spoil Edinboro's season. In 1994, a 26-20 Clarion victory kept Edinboro out of the Division II playoffs. This time, Edinboro would not be denied the conference title. After a scoreless first quarter, in a game played in a torrential downpour, Edinboro struck first as Tony Brinson scored on a 5 yard run off tackle to put the Plaid up 6-0. Following a defensive stand, Hart hit wideout Jerry Roberts for a 33 yard gain, before tossing a 28 yard TD to Brinson out of the backfield. A two-point conversion attempt was good, as Hart called his own number and crossed the goal line to put the Scots up 14-0. Gerald Thompson scored a pair of second-half TDs, including an end run from 42 yards out. Clarion broke up the Edinboro's bid for a second consecutive shutout with 4:57 left in the contest.

Edinboro, 9-1 overall and ranked eighth in the final NCAA Division II poll, drew No. 5 New Haven (9-0-1) for its first round playoff game, which was played at Southern Connecticut State University. The contest, which was a rematch of a '93 Division II playoff game won 48-28 by the Chargers, would be a "Tale of Two Halves." In the first stanza, Edinboro's defense, which allowed slightly more than nine points per game against Division II opponents, kept the high-powered New Haven offense out of the end-zone, allowing just a field goal in the first 30 minutes. With EUP ahead 6-3 late in the second quarter, defensive back Keith Cushenberry returned a fumble 31 yards to put the Scots up 12-3 at intermission. After outgaining New Haven 156-74 in first half total yards, it appeared the Scots were on their way to victory. However, the second half would be a different story, as UNH rallied for 24 unanswered points for the win. The loss ended one of the most successful seasons in Edinboro history as the Scots matched the school record for wins and earned the program's third conference championship.

Edinboro and the Harlon Hill Award

Two Edinboro University of Pennsylvania football players have been finalists for the Harlon Hill Award, presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II football.

Former Edinboro running back Elbert Cole was one of three Harlon Hill finalists in 1989, while former Fighting Scot wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist for the award in 1990.

Cole placed third in the 1989 balloting, which was won by Texas A&I University running back Johnny Bailey, a three-time recipient. Priester was runner-up to North Dakota State University quarterback Chris Simdorn in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title.

Cole also was selected an All-American in 1989, receiving first-team honors from Kodak, second-team recognition from *Football Gazette* and third-team status from the Associated Press.

He rushed for 1,507 yards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns in a season (24) and points in a season (148). Cole led

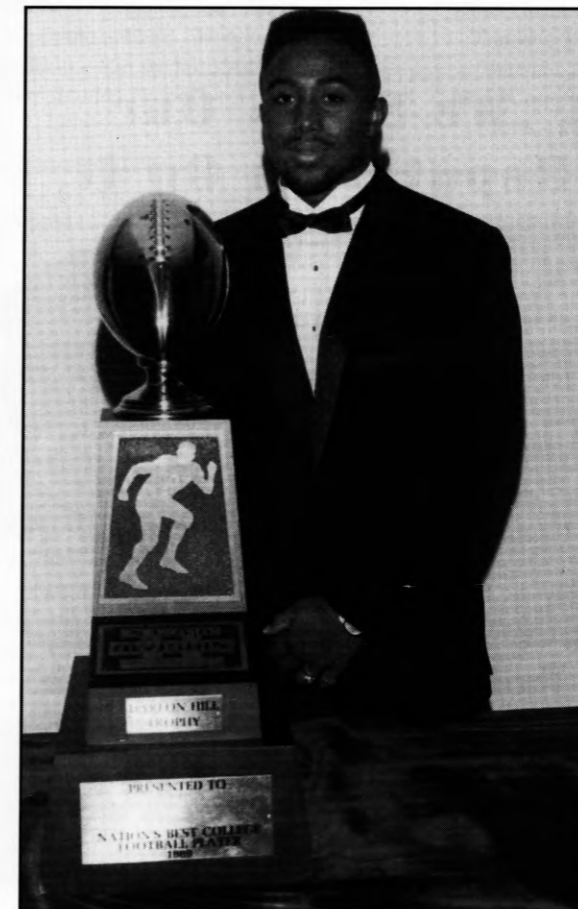
Edinboro to a PSAC West title, an 8-3 overall record and a No. 7 ranking in the final NCAA Division II national poll.

Cole finished his Edinboro career with 3,341 yards rushing and 40 rushing touchdowns, ranking him third and second respectively in school history.

Priester was the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He also was an All-American, receiving first-team honors from Kodak, the Associated Press and *Football Gazette*. Priester caught 47 passes in 1990, totaling 1,102 yards (23.4 yards per catch) and 15 touchdowns. He led Edinboro to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals and a 9-3 overall record.

Priester also had an outstanding season in 1989, catching 49 passes for 1,128 yards (23-yard average) and a school-record 16 touchdown receptions. He is Edinboro's all-time career leader in receptions (148), receiving yards (3,064), yards per reception (20.7) and touchdown receptions (35). Following his career at Edinboro, Priester signed a free-agent contract with the National Football League's Denver Broncos. He later played for his hometown Cleveland Thunder of the Arena Football League.

The Harlon Hill Award is named in honor of legendary Chicago Bears wide receiver Harlon Hill, who was an All-American at the University of North Alabama. The award is selected each year by NCAA Division II sports information directors.

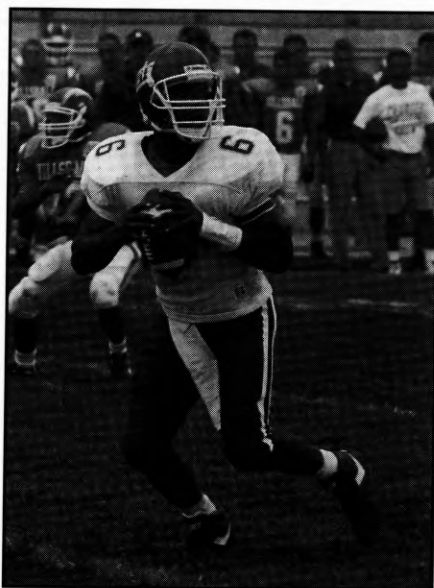

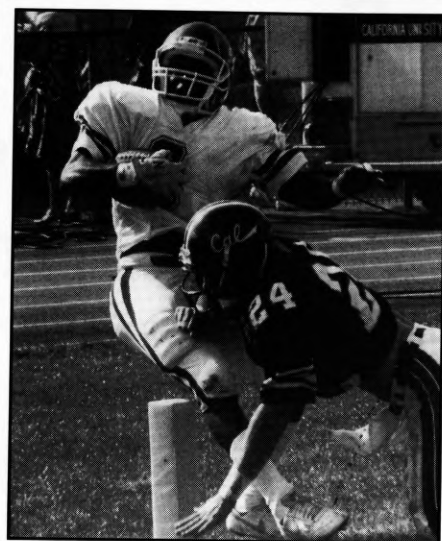

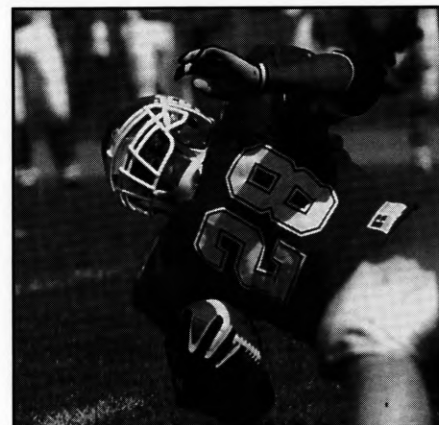

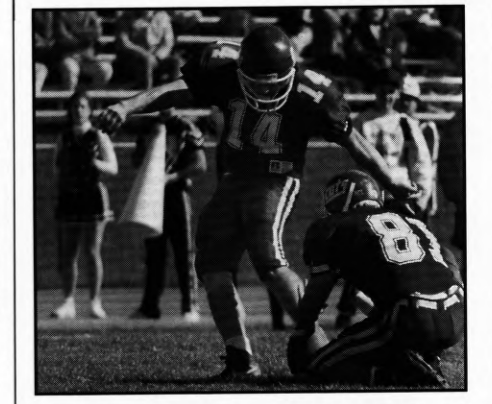
