#### **Highlights of the Hollman Era**

- January 1988 -- Edinboro University of Pennsylvania hires Tom Hollman as the 11th head football coach in school history.
- Sept. 10, 1988 -- Hollman records his first win at Edinboro as the Fighting Scots defeat Saginaw Valley (MI) State University, 37-28.
- Nov. 10, 1988 -- Edinboro posts a 4-0-1 record in the final five games of Coach Hollman's first year, setting the stage for a run at the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference title in '89.
- Sept. 23, 1989 -- Edinboro defeats rival Indiana University of Pennsylvania, 37-0, to take early control of the PSAC Western Division race.
- Nov. 4, 1989 -- The Boro clinches its first PSAC West title under Hollman, and first conference championship since 1970, beating Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania, 62-7.
- Nov. 18, 1989 -- The Scots advance to NCAA Division II national playoffs, but drop a thrilling 45-32 decision at power North Dakota State University at Fargo, N.D.
- December 1989 -- Senior running back Elbert Cole finishes third in balloting for Harlon Hill Award, presented annually in Florence, Ala., to the top player in NCAA Division II football.
- Nov. 3, 1990 -- IUP edges Edinboro, 36-29, in a PSAC West game, giving the Indians the conference title. Despite the loss, the Scots finish the regular season ranked 11th in the Division II poll and the program earns its second straight playoff berth.
- Nov. 17, 1990 -- The Fighting Scots earn first-ever NCAA Division II playoff win, downing Virginia Union College, 38-14 to advance to an NCAA quarterfinal showdown at IUP.
- Nov. 24, 1990 -- For the second time in 1990, IUP edges Edinboro by a touchdown, claiming a 14-7 win. The Scots match the school record for victories with a 9-3 mark.
- December, 1990 -- Edinboro wideout Ernest Priester, the alltime leading receiver in Edinboro history, finishes second in the balloting for the Harlon Hill Award behind three-time winner Johnny Bailey of Texas A&I.
- Nov. 9, 1991 -- The Fighting Scots battle No. 1 ranked IUP to the end, but drop a 20-17 decision at Sox Harrison Stadium.
- Oct. 24, 1992 -- The Scots beat California University of Pennsylvania, 33-13, to move to 7-0 for the first time since 1982. Boro moves up to No. 3 in national poll, marking the school's highest ranking ever.
- Oct. 31, 1992 -- Slippery Rock ends Edinboro's hopes of an undefeated season, upsetting the No. 3 Scots 10-7 at Sox Harrison Stadium.
- Nov. 14, 1992 -- Scots down Millersville University of Pennsylvania, 36-12, to post their best regular-season record (8-1-1) in more than 20 years.



Edinboro added its second PSAC West Championship Trophy under head coach Tom Hollman in 1995.

- Nov. 21, 1992 -- Ferris State (MI) University defeats Edinboro, 19-15, in first round of NCAA playoffs. The Boro's Wrentie Martin caught a 43-yard pass on final play of game, but fell a yard short of the end zone as time expired.
- Oct. 30, 1993 -- Visiting Edinboro scores with 19 seconds left to edge Slippery Rock, 41-38, in a game in which the lead changed hands four times in final quarter.
- Nov. 20, 1993 -- The Scots once again advance to the NCAA playoffs, but lose a 48-28 decision to the University of New Haven (CT).
- Oct. 8, 1994 -- Larry Jackson becomes Edinboro's all-time leading rusher in a 31-17 homecoming win over Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania.
- Oct. 22, 1994 -- Edinboro defeats Slippery Rock, 59-39, at Sox Harrison. The Boro trailed, 39-23, early in final

quarter, but scored 36 unanswered points to pull out an amazing win

- Sept. 2, 1995 -- Visiting Edinboro upsets No. 12 Portland (OR) State University, 26-7, on the West Coast.
- Oct. 28, 1995 -- Scots beat IUP, 35-18, at home, paving the way for the Boro's second PSAC West title under Hollman.
- Nov. 11, 1995 -- Edinboro clinches PSAC West title with a 28-6 win in a driving rainstorm at Clarion. The following day, the Scots receive their fifth NCAA playoff berth in seven years.
- Nov. 18, 1995 -- Edinboro loses at New Haven, 27-12, in first round of national playoffs.
- Nov. 9, 1996 -- The Scots build a 35-7 lead over seventhranked Clarion midway through the first half and go on to an impressive 48-35 victory over the eventual national semifinalist.



#### President Frank G. Pogue, Jr.



Dr. Frank G. Pogue, the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, began the first year of his presidency on July 1, 1996.

President Pogue's administration has brought to Edinboro University a renewed sense and spirit of community, a reaffirmation of institutional purpose, and a commitment to protect the accessibility which Edinboro University and the State System of Higher Education offer to affordable, exceptional, high quality education.

A sociologist, President Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro, President Pogue was the vice chancellor for Student Affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) System Central Administration, in Albany, serving in that position for 10 years. There he was responsible for, among many other programs, system-wide student educational services and programming, access and financial aid services, school and college relations, the New York City Office for Student Recruitment, undergraduate scholarship programs, the Graduate Fellowship Program for Underrepresented Students, diversity and affirmative action initiatives, university public safety, the Office for the Disadvantaged, the Office of Hispanic Affairs, the New York African American Research

Foundation, the university-wide Native American Program, and educational opportunity programs and centers for the disadvantaged. While vice chancellor, Dr. Pogue served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill.

Prior to his assignment in the SUNY System Central Administration, President Pogue served as vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairman, all at SUNY Albany.

In October of this year, Dr. Pogue was appointed by Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge to a statewide panel on academic standards. The bipartisan commission is made up of legislators, business leaders and educators. Pogue represents higher education on the commission and is the only member from northwestern Pennsylvania. The commission has been given the task of developing a new set of standards for Pennsylvania schools in math, science, reading, and writing.

Pogue is no stranger to academic standards. Since 1984, he has served on the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and is currently a member of its executive board. He was a consultant to the commission which reviewed education standards in the state of New York several years ago. His experience in higher education spans three decades.

#### Naomi T. Johnson VP Student Affairs/Success



Dr. Naomi T. Johnson began her duties as Vice President for Student Affairs and Student Success at Edinboro University in June of 1997.

Dr. Johnson earned a B.A. in sociology from Moorhead State University, a master's degree in college student personnel from Bowling Green State University, and a Ph.D. in higher education from Arizona State University.

Prior to her appointment at

Edinboro University, Dr. Johnson served as the Associate Dean of Students at the University of California-Santa Barbara. Her wide range of experience in service to students includes past positions as peer counseling coordinator, assistant to the president for student affairs, director of the campus activities center, and assistant dean of students.

One of Dr. Johnson's main objectives is to facilitate a creative and innovative campus atmosphere. She also hopes to lead a united effort by the University Community to ensure a well-rounded education for students.

Dr. Johnson and her husband, Earl Jacobs, a Certified Public Accountant, reside in Edinboro.

# Bruce Baumgartner Acting Athletic Director



Four-time Olympic medalist Bruce Baumgartner was named Acting Athletic Director at Edinboro University in August of 1997 after serving as a coach at Edinboro for nearly 14 years.

Baumgartner, one of the greatest American wrestlers of all time, has led Edinboro to some of the finest seasons in school history, including a 14-0 dual meet record this past year, the first undefeated season ever at Edinboro. The Scots also placed

sixth at the NCAA Division I National Championships, the program's best showing in 11 years.

Baumgartner became just the sixth athlete in U.S. history to medal in four Olympiads, winning the bronze medal at the Olympic Games in Atlanta in '96 to go along with two golds (1984 and '92) and a silver ('88).


It not only was his fourth Olympic medal, but a recordsetting 13th world-level medal. Baumgartner was honored by his fellow United States Olympic athletes when he was chosen to carry the American flag for the Opening Ceremonies. He also was the winner of the 1995 James E. Sullivan Award as the outstanding amateur athlete in the United States.


#### Henne Selected Winner of Woody Hayes National Scholar-Athlete Award, Selected to Serve on NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Board



Former Edinboro University of Pennsylvania tight end Todd Henne was named a recipient of the prestigious Woody Hayes National Scholar-Athlete Award in December of 1995 after completing a highly successful career as a member of the Fighting Scot football program.

The Woody Hayes Award is presented annually by the Sertoma Club of Columbus, Ohio, to the outstanding man and woman in each of the three NCAA Divisions for "demonstrated excellence in academics, athletics, community service and leadership." Henne received the 1995 award for Division II men.

The award is a living memorial to the high standards of excellence - both on and off the field - of the former Ohio State University football coach.



Henne also is in the process of completing a two-year term as a member of the NCAA Division II Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. He recently attended the first-ever NCAA Division II Student-Athlete Summit in Denver, where student-athletes participated in the NCAA's governance process with members of Division II's Management Council.

As a speech communication major at Edinboro, Henne posted a 3.79 cumulative grade point average. He was a GTE Academic All-District selection as a senior and a national finalist for an NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship.

On the field, Henne was a first-team All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference pick as a senior after earning second-team recognition as a junior. He caught 37 passes for 361 yards and seven TDs as a two-year starter. He also was a key blocker for a team that averaged 224.2 yards per game rushing and 28.7 points per contest. During the fall of his senior year, Henne was appointed to the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee and attended the organization's annual meeting in Dallas. He also was a key member of Edinboro's Student-Athlete Advisory Board and served as the sports director for the campus radio station (WFSE). He was part of a student team that produced an award-winning video on responsible drinking.

"I've often said that Todd is one of those people you know will be successful in life," said Edinboro head coach Tom Hollman. "He truly exemplifies what college athletics is all about, adhering to the same ideals that Coach Hayes stood for. We are very proud to have Todd represent our football program and University in the manner in which he has."



#### Scots in the Pros

Several former Edinboro University of Pennsylvania football players have received the opportunity to play professional football.

Three Fighing Scots are currently playing in the professional ranks, including two members of last year's Edinboro team. Three-time All-American offensive lineman Jeremy O'Day and former teammate Jeff Traversy, a defensive tackle, made the move from collegiate ball to the professional ranks of the Canadian Football League this past spring while Cleveland Pratt, who finished his career at Edinboro in 1990, has enjoyed several successful seasons in the Arena Football League.

O'Day is enjoying a productive rookie season in the CFL. The 6-3, 295-pound offensive lineman was chosen by the defending Grey Cup Champion Toronto Argonauts last May. O'Day's versatility earned him a back-up role at offensive guard and tackle early in the season, but solid fundamentals have won him a starting spot as the season progresses.

Traversy was the third pick (15th overall) of the Calgary Stampeders in the college draft held in April. The 6-5, 280-pound nose tackle's pass rush abilities helped him earn a starting role as well early in the season.

O'Day and Traversy both credit the Edinboro coaching staff as keys to their professional success.

"Coach (Scott) Browning taught me exactly what I needed to know to have a chance to play pro ball," said O'Day. "When I arrived at camp, I was amazed at how well my techniques and training stacked up against veterans. I certainly appreciate his guidance and hope people understand what a great coach he is."

Former Edinboro tackle Jeff Traversy (94) lays a heavy hit on Saskatchewan's quarterback in a recent CFL game.

Traversy agreed. "Coach Hollman and Coach Cronk are two of the most knowledgable men that I've ever been around in football," he said. "They pushed me to the limits and I'm glad they did, because now I'm living a dream and I owe much of my success to them and the Edinboro football program."

Once called "the best kept secret in the league," Pratt has made a name for himself with the Florida Bobcats and the AFL. The 5-7, 171-pound offensive specialist was acquired by the Bobcats in February of 1995, and plays wide receiver and return specialist.


Over the past three seasons, Pratt has been given many opportunities to dazzle crowds with his blazing speed. It was that speed which helped him accumulate more than 2,600 all-purpose yards and 24 touchdowns during the 1996 season. Pratt got off to a quick start this year as he caught 3 touchdown passes and rushed for another in Florida's 55-27 season-opening victory over the Connecticut Coyotes. His performance in '96 propelled him into the league's top 10 in 11 statistical categories (including six top 5's).

Wide receiver/kick returner Gilbert Grantlin, who played for Edinboro during the 1995 season, signed a free-agent contract with the National Football League's Minnesota Vikings in April 1996 and was a member of the team's practice squad. The 6-1, 182-pound Grantlin played only one season at Edinboro, but made a significant impact with his big-play ability. The Florida native, an honorable-mention All-American, caught 44 passes for 840 yards (19.1 yards per catch) and eight touchdowns. Grantlin also had 372 yards on 17 kickoff returns (21.8 yard average) and 300 yards on 28 punt returns (10.7 yard average).

Before Grantlin, Mike Kegarise was the last Fighting Scot to play in the NFL. The 6-6, 310-pound offensive tackle, a two-time All-American, signed a free-agent deal with the NFL's Seattle Seahawks after concluding his Edinboro career in 1993. Kegarise spent the 1994 season on the Seahawks' injured-reserve list with a severe knee injury, but was released the following season when Seahawks' injured-reserve list with a severe knee injury.

Two other former Scots who played under current head coach Tom Hollman also signed free-agent contracts with NFL teams. Offensive guard



Jeremy O'Day, a three-time All-American at Edinboro, has earned a starting spot for the Toronto Argonauts as a rookie.

Curtis Rose signed with the Miami Dolphins, while wide receiver Ernest Priester inked a deal with the Denver Broncos. Neither Rose nor Priester played a regular-season game in the NFL, although Cleveland native Priester later played for the Cleveland Thunder of the Arena Football League.

Rose and Priester both were two-time All-Americans at Edinboro. The 6-3, 280-pound Rose earned the honors in 1990 and 1991, while the 5-9, 170-pound Priester did so in 1989 and 1990. Priester was the runner-up for the Harlon Hill Award honoring the NCAA Division II Player of the Year and the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He is Edinboro's all-time career leader in receptions (148), receiving yards (3,064), yards per reception (20.7) and TD receptions (35).

A pair of Scots who performed during the Edinboro State College days

- David Green and Jim Romaniszyn - played professional football in the
1970s. Both are members of the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame, with Green
being inducted in 1988 and Romaniszyn being honored in 1983. Green, a
running back, played for the Cleveland Browns and for the Montreal
Alouettes of the Canadian Football League. An All-American, Green played
for Edinboro in 1975 and 1976. He ranks fifth on the school's all-time rushing
list with 1,978 career yards in 19 games (104 yards per contest).

Romaniszyn played at Edinboro from 1970-72, earning All-American honors. The 6-2, 225-pound Titusville native was drafted by the Cleveland Browns in 1973 as a running back, but was switched to outside linebacker. A versatile performer, Romaniszyn is the only Edinboro player to finish his career with 1,000-plus yards rushing (1,266) and 1,000-plus yards receiving (1,088). He also played basketball for the Scots.

#### **Head Coach Tom Hollman**



After guiding the Fighting Scot football program to some of the finest seasons in school history, Tom Hollman begins his 10th season as head coach at Edinboro.

Hollman became the all-time winningest coach in Edinboro history two years ago and enters the '97 campaign with a 67-28-2 mark at Edinboro. compiling more victories and a better winning percentage (.701) than any

coach in Fighting Scot history.

Hollman has guided the Edinboro program to NCAA Division II playoff appearances in five of the past eight seasons. The Scots also have captured a pair of Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division titles (1995 and 1989) and have consistently been ranked in the national polls.

Hollman enters the '97 season ranked 10th on the NCAA Division II Winningest Active Coaches List. He has compiled a 91-39-3 overall record (.695) in 13 seasons as a college head coach, including a 24-11-1 mark in four seasons at Wooster College in Ohio.

Last year, Edinboro recorded its ninth consecutive winning season, all under Hollman, highlighted by an impressive 48-35 victory over PSAC West champion Clarion, who advanced to the NCAA Division II national semifinals a few weeks later.

Edinboro will take a three-game winning streak into the '97 campaign. The Scots have won five of their past

seven games, with both of the losses coming in the final minute against Indiana (Pa.) and Slippery Rock.

Edinboro posted a 9-2 record in 1995 and was the only program in the 14-member PSAC to record a perfect 6-0 league mark, the second time the Scots accomplished the feat under Hollman. Edinboro was ranked eighth in the final NCAA Division II football poll in '95 and the program received its fifth berth to the NCAA playoffs.

Hollman joined the Edinboro staff in January of 1988 as the program's 11th head coach after serving as the defensive coordinator at Ohio University for three years.

Edinboro went 4-0-1 during the final five games of his first season, then in 1989, captured the PSAC West title with a 6-0 record and roared into the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time in school history.

The Scots lost a thrilling 45-32 decision at perennial Division II power North Dakota State University, but the EU program had clearly arrived as a force in Division II football. Hollman was honored as the top coach in the East Region by the American Football Coaches Association and he also was selected PSAC West "Coach of the Year."

In 1990, Hollman guided the Fighting Scots to their first-ever NCAA II playoff win as Edinboro beat Virginia Union, 38-14, on the road, to advance to the national quarterfinals. The Scots then dropped a tough 14-7 contest to PSAC rival Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

The Scots returned to the NCAA playoffs in 1992 and 1993 after runner-up finishes in the PSAC.

In addition to team success, Hollman has coached 52 All-Americans at Edinboro, including Elbert Cole and Ernest Priester, who both placed in the top three in the voting for the Harlon Hill Award presented to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year. He also has coached play-

ers who have set school records for rushing, passing, receiving, quarterback sacks, and interceptions.

Hollman is a 1968 graduate of Ohio Northern University, where he was a three-year starter for the football team and a two-way performer as a defensive back and end on offense. He holds the school record with 13 career interceptions and earned All-American and All-District honors during the 1966-67 seasons. Hollman also lettered in baseball for three years.

Hollman's coaching career began in 1968 as an assistant coach at Sidney High School in Sidney, Ohio. After earning a master of science degree in education from Xavier University in Cincinnati in 1971, he became head coach at Greenville High School in Ohio, where he posted an impressive 26-2-2 mark from 1971-73. Hollman then moved on to Fremont Ross High School as head coach for the 1974-75 seasons, where his squads recorded a 15-3-2 mark. Fremont was the Buckeye Conference champ in 1974, unbeaten at 9-0-1.

In 1976, Hollman moved on to the collegiate ranks, where he was the defensive coordinator for his alma mater at Ohio Northern University. The following year, Hollman accepted the head coaching position at Wooster and guided his squad to the best four-year record in the school history (24-11-1). In 1981, Hollman took an assistant coaching spot with Ball State University which he held through the 1984 campaign. Hollman held the defensive coordinator position at Ohio University from 1985 until accepting the head job at Edinboro in 1988.



#### **Edinboro Coaching Staff**



#### Scott Browning - Offensive Coordinator/Line

Scott Browning begins his third season as Edinboro's offensive coordinator and 12th year overall coaching the Fighting Scots.

Browning has coached a variety of positions at the Boro, including the offensive line for the past four years, and running backs and defensive backs in the past. Under his guidance the past two years, the Scots' offense averaged 358.8 yards

of total offense and 27.9 points per game. This season, Browning has an experienced offensive line returning, with one exception, three-time All-American Jeremy O'Day, who has earned a starting position with the Toronto Argonauts of the Canadian Football League.

In his many capacities, Browning has coached several All-Americans including Steve Russell, Michael Willis, Wade Smith, Georj Lewis, Mike Barnes, Elbert Cole, and O'Day.

Browning has coached at three NCAA Division I schools. Before joining the Edinboro staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State University for three years. He also coached the defensive secondary at New Mexico State University in 1982, and the following year mentored the receivers at Idaho State University, an NCAA Division I-AA playoff participant

Prior to his stint at OSU, Browning coached at Worthington and Dayton-Fairview High Schools in Ohio from 1979-81. Browning earned a master's degree in education administration from New Mexico State in 1983, and a BS in education from Ohio State in 1981. Earlier, before transferring to OSU, Browning attended Capital University, where he played football for one season. Browning was a four-year letterman in four sports at Loudonville High School (OH) prior to his collegiate days.

Scott is married to the former Lynn Hook, and has a son, Andrew Scott, 4.



#### Nick Cronk - Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers

After serving as the Fighting Scots defensive line coach for three years, Nick Cronk was promoted to defensive coordinator prior to Spring practice. He will also coach the Edinboro linebackers.

Last year's efforts of the defensive front resulted in 20 quarterback sacks and 36 additional tack-les behind the line of scrimmage. In 1995, three of Edinboro front four players earned All-Conference honors. This year, Cronk will have two pre-season All-Americans to work with, senior defensive back Brian Decker and senior linebacker Jesse Hannan, in addition to a number of players who showed improvement in Spring drills.

Before coming to Edinboro, Cronk coached tight ends at Indiana University. He spent two seasons with the Hoosiers as a graduate assistant to head coach Bill Mallory. His first season in Bloomington, Cronk spent time assisting the defensive coordinator with the linebackers, and he also helped in the recruiting duties.

While at IU, he graduated with a master's degree in physical education administration. Prior to joining the staff at Indiana, Cronk was an assistant coach at Carroll Consolidated High School, handling the special teams and defensive ends.

Cronk spent his playing days at Wabash College, where he was an honorable mention performer in the Indiana College Athletic Conference and captained the 1991 league championship squad. He graduated from Wabash with a bachelor of arts degree in political science.

Nick and his wife, Karla, reside in Edinboro with their 1year-old son, Hayes Woodrow.

#### **Dustin Calhoun - Defensive Secondary**

Dustin Calhoun enters his first season with Edinboro University and will be responsible for the Scots' defensive secondary.

Calhoun joins the Fighting Scots from Ohio State University, where he served as a graduate assistant coach for two years, working primarily with defensive backs.

Prior to his experience at Ohio State, Calhoun spent one season at Lakewood High School in Ohio as an assistant varsity coach and head strength and conditioning coach. He also served as assistant coach at Westerville North High School and has coached at the Ohio State Football Camp for the past four years. He also assisted the OSU football program as a volunteer coach in 1994.

Calhoun earned his bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Otterbein College in 1993, where he played both baseball and football. Calhoun and his wife, Wendi, reside in Edinboro.



#### Mario Houston - Wide Receivers

Mario Houston joins the Edinboro coaching staff for his first year coaching collegiate football. A familiar face to the Edinboro community, Houston played defensive back at Edinboro University from 1990-94. He earned PSAC Rookie of the Year honors in 1990 and was a two-time All-PSAC pick. Additionally, he earned Scholar-Athlete recognition three times during his playing career.

Houston currently leads Edinboro's list of career and single season pass deflections with 53 and 16, respectively, and is tied for 11th place on the list of single season interceptions (5). He registered 269 tackles in his four year career as a Fighting Scot.

Houston has a four-year old son, DeAndre Houston. A native of East Cleveland, Houston now resides in Edinboro.



#### Mike McCoy – Quarterbacks/Running Backs

Mike McCoy enters his second season as a full-time assistant with the Fighting Scots responsible for coaching the Edinboro running backs.

Under the guidance of McCoy, the Boro has continued its tradition of fielding one of the top rushing attacks in the PSAC. For the second straight season, Edinboro produced a 1,000-yard rusher, as Tony Brinson topped the mark in 1996 after Gerald Thompson ran for the fifth-highest single-season total in 1995. With Thompson, and a strong supporting cast featuring several talented fullbacks and a few new speedsters, the Boro backfield should be one of the team's strength's once again.

McCoy came to Edinboro from West Virginia State College, where he served as the offensive coordinator during the 1995 season. McCoy also coached both tight ends and running backs at the U.S. Naval Academy from 1991-94. A 1987 graduate of Marshall University in West Virginia, McCoy coached wide receivers at Rutgers University for one season (1990). He began his coaching career

as a graduate assistant at Marshall under head coach George Chaump. As an undergraduate, McCoy played running back for a Marshall team that finished the 1987 season as the NCAA Division I-AA runner-up.

#### **Butch Posey - Defensive Line**

Butch Posey begins his first year as Edinboro University's defensive line coach after playing in the PSAC and serving as an assistant football coach at two PSAC schools.

Posey joins the Fighting Scots from East Stroudsburg University where he coached the defensive line and special teams. With Posey's assistance, the 1996 Warriors went 6-4 and tied for second place in the PSAC East. Posey also has a year of coaching experience from his alma mater, Slippery Rock University, in the 1995-96 season.



#### George Roberts, A.T., C., Head Athletic Trainer





# Edinboro Hosts Glenville State in Family Weekend Game



#### THE GAME

After an open date last weekend, the Edinboro University of Pennsylvania football team returns to action this Saturday (Sept. 27) hosting Glenville (WV) State College.

Kickoff for the Family Weekend game is set for 1 p.m. at Sox Harrison Stadium.

#### **EDINBORO UPDATE**

Edinboro enters the contest with a 1-1 overall record. The Fighting Scots opened the 1997 season Sept. 6 with an exciting, 21-17, come from behind victory over a tough, hard-nosed Hillsdale (MI) College squad.

After trailing 17-10 in the fourth quarter, Edinboro rallied for the win. Sophomore placekicker Tyson Cook kicked a pair of field goals, including a school-record tying 52-yarder, and made a huge play on a point after touchdown to spark the win. Freshman quarterback Brian Caldwell threw his first TD pass.

The Scots played Carson-Newman (TN) College on Sept. 13 and dropped a 33-10 decision that was closer than the final score. The Scots had a seven-minute edge in time of possession and trailed just 356-307 in total vardage.

Carson-Newman was ranked No. 2 in the NCAA Division II poll before the game, and currently are the nation's top-ranked team.

#### **GLENVILLE SHOCKS CLARION**

The Pioneers stunned defending PSAC West cochampion Clarion last Saturday at Glenville, posting a 51-0 victory over the Golden Eagles.

After splitting its first two games, a 36-35 win at Geneva College in the season opener, followed by a 56-7 defeat at NCAA Division I-AA member Liberty University, the Pioneers really surprised some observers with such a big win over a program that advanced to the NCAA-II semifinals in 1996.

Part of Glenville's success Saturday may have been due to inside knowledge of Clarion's program. First-year head coach Warren Ruggerio was Clarion's offensive coordinator last year, while assistants Mike Snyder and Kim Niedbala also were members of Clarion's program.

The Pioneers accumulated 485 yards of total offense, including 355 through the air. Senior Carlos Ferralls caught 13 passes for 245 yards and three

TDs from quarterback Wilkie Perez.

Glenville led 17-0 at the half as Clarion Qb Chris Weibel suffered a season-ending knee injury. An interception return for a TD made it 24-0 and GSC score 27 points in the final quarter.

#### THE SERIES

This is the first meeting between the Fighting Scots and Pioneers. The last time Edinboro played a team from the state of West Virginia was in 1991 when the Scots defeated Fairmont State 31-21 at Sox Harrison Stadium.

#### MOVIN' ON UP

The West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference moved up from membership in the NAIA (National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics) into NCAA Division II athletics in 1994. The WVIAC is an eight-member league which competes in the same region as Edinboro in most sports including football.

#### THE NORTHEAST REGION

Four of the 16 NCAA Division II post-season berths will come from the 48-team Northeast region, which is made up of three conferences — the PSAC, the WVIAC and the Midwest Intercollegiate — and a few independents.

New Haven (4-0) remained No. 1 in the Northeast Region and moved up five spots to third nationally. They'll play at IUP on Saturday.

Grand Valley (MI) State (3-0) and Saginaw Valley (MI) State (3-0) are tied for second in the region and are 7th and 11th in the national poll, respectively; Indianapolis (4-0) is fourth in the region and ranked 16th, while Northern Michigan is fifth in the region and 20th.

Slippery Rock (2-1) is the only PSAC school in the top six in the Northeast.

#### THE COACHES

Edinboro's Tom Hollman entered the season ranked 10th on the NCAA Division Winningest Active Coaches list. Including this season, Hollman is now 92-40-3 (.693) in 13 years as a collegiate head coach.

Hollman has enjoyed most of his success as a head coach at Edinboro. Now in his 10th season with the Scots, he is the Boro's all-time winningest coach, posting a 62-25-2 overall record (.708), including a

37-9-2 mark against PSAC West foes.

Hollman has guided Edinboro to five NCAA Division II playoff berths and a pair of conference championships (in 1989 and 1995).

Glenville State's Warren Ruggerio is in his first season with the Pioneers after serving as Clarion's offensive coordinator for four years. Last year, he directed a Golden Eagle offense that averaged 40.1 points per game and compiled 6,464 yards of total offense as Clarion advanced to the NCAA Division II national semifinals.

Glenville was a tri-champion of the WVIAC last year, along with Fairmont State and Shepherd.

#### HOLLMAN ON GLENVILLE STATE

"Glenville State is a solid football program; they have quality players and are well-coached. They proved last week that they can be explosive and dominant, so we'll have to be very sharp Saturday to have success against them.

"Having the off-week gave our team a chance to really work on some things. We've had a good week and a half of practice after two very tough, physical games."

#### CALDWELL AT QB

Brian Caldwell is the first true-freshman to start at quarterback since Blair Hrovat got the call in 1981. Caldwell made a successful debut at quarterback against Hillsdale, completing 7 of 16 passes for 111 yards and a TD. His 50-yard strike to Quentin Ware-Bey in the endzone in the fourth quarter gave Fighting Scot fans a glimpse of the great promise he has as a college quarterback.

"For a young player, Brian did some really good things in our first two games," said Hollman. "But he also made a lot of mistakes. The off week has been good for him because it's given him time to see things on film and work on them with a couple extra days in practice."



#### THOMPSON MOVES INTO FIFTH ON CHART

Junior Gerald Thompson leads the Edinboro rushing attack, compiling 195 yards in Edinboro's first two games. He rushed for 133 yards and a TD in the season opener, then added 62 yards rushing in the Scots game at Carson-Newman.

Thompson's 10th career 100-yard game versus Hillsdale sent him over the 2,000-yard mark at Edinboro and into fifth place on the school's all-time rushing chart. He has now gained 2,094 yards rushing on 454 carries, with 18 touchdowns.


#### WARE-BEY MOVES TOWARD TOP 10

With five catches this year, junior Quentin Ware-Bey needs just two more to hit 60 for his career at Edinboro and move into the Boro's Top 10 career receptions list. Ware-Bey's 58 receptions tie him for 11th on the school's all-time chart. His 716 career receiving yards also ranks in the Top 20.

#### **EDINBORO DEFENSE**

The Fighting Scot defense has looked strong in the first two games of 1997. Thus far, Edinboro is allowing an average of 167.0 yards per game rushing and 293.0 yards of total yards per game.

Edinboro did a solid job stopping Carson-Newman's



powerful option attack, but three big plays, including an 80-yard touchdown pass and a 51-yard TD run, really hurt. Having All-American safety Brian Decker knocked out of the game in the first quarter also was a big blow. Decker had seven tackles in the first quarter before suffering a concussion on a punt return.

Three linebackers lead the team in tackles. Sophomore Dan Caro has 20, senior Ed Mattie has 16, and red-shirt freshman Nick Oto has 15. Sophomore Dan Keen leads the team with three quarterback sacks, while Caro has two.

#### **NEXT WEEK**

The Fighting Scots will open PSAC West play Oct. 4, travelling to Shippensburg University of PA for a 1 p.m. contest. The Scots return home Oct. 11, hosting California University of PA in the program's annual Homecoming game at 2 p.m.

Glenville State opens WVIAC play at home against West Liberty.

# Carson-Newman, Edinboro Series Comes North in '98

After making a 10-hour bus trek south to Tennessee the past two seasons to face one of the top NCAA Division II football programs in the nation, the Edinboro Fighting Scots will welcome Carson-Newman College to Sox Harrison Stadium on September 12, 1998, in the final contest of a three-game series between these unnatural rivals.

Edinboro fans might be treated to a game featuring the defending national champion. Newman, which defeated Edinboro 33-10 last week in a game that many considered closer than the final margin indicated, moved up one slot in the NCAA Division II poll this week into the No. 1 position.

The Eagles, who were ranked second in Division II prior to the Edinboro contest, advanced to the NCAA championship game last year, where they dropped a 23-14 contest to the University of Northern Colorado. If it wasn't for six costly turnovers, and an injury to starting quarterback Zac Allen, Carson-Newman might be wearing championship rings already and seeking its second straight NCAA title in 1997.

Regardless of what happens the rest of this season, Fighting Scot fans will have their first opportunity to see a program that has won several national championships play at Sox



Harrison Stadium.

You see, prior to joining the NCAA Division II ranks in 1993, Carson-Newman won five national championships as members of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, better known as the NAIA. Then the Eagles jumped into NCAA play in 1993 and have made the playoffs every year. In fact, Carson-Newman's season has ended at the hands of the national champion each of the past four years, three times to powerful North Alabama and last year to Northern Colorado.

"We knew that Carson-Newman has had one of the top programs in the country for many years when we agreed to play them," said Edinboro head coach Tom Hollman. "That's one of the reasons we wanted to schedule them, because their program is where we want to be, and the only way you become the best is by competing against the best."

"Another reason we entered into the agreement to play Carson-Newman was because they were willing to play us here at Edinboro." said Hollman. "We had to go there twice in order to get them to play on our field, but we think playing the two road games was worth it for our players and fans. By playing one of the top programs at home, hopefully, we'll have a better chance to win the game. And if you can win a game like that, it really helps establish your program."

Carson-Newman Athletic Director David Barger said the Eagles also try to play top caliber competition. "Good teams have to play good

teams, that's just the way it is," said Barger. "Sometimes it's tough to get teams to play you once you have a reputation as being a winner. It's especially tough getting home games, so you try to work out deals with schools to play at both places."

"Our trip to Edinboro will be a nice trip for the players," Barger added. "When you play out of your geographic region, it's special for the kids because they get to travel somewhere they've never been before."

Hollman agreed with Barger. "We really struggle to get home games, and we're pretty much willing to play anybody in Division II if they're willing to go home-and-home with us." Hollman said. "We want to play the best competition we can. And you won't find many programs better than Carson-Newman. I just hope when they come to town next year, people in Northwest Pennsylvania really support the game."

"I can't say that I'm satisfied with how we played last week," said Hollman. "We did many positive things, certainly played a better game than we did the year before (a 42-12 loss), but we went there to win. not to be respectable."

Maybe, in 1998, with the Carson-Newman game at home, the Fighting Scots will indeed pull out a victory over one of the top programs in the nation. Maybe the win will be over the defending NCAA Division II champions in front of a packed stadi-

But maybe, just maybe, Edinboro's trip to Tennessee this year, and the strong showing against Carson-Newman, was just what the Scots needed to realize their own championship dreams.

Who knows, maybe the strong showing at Carson-Newman last week was the spark the Edinboro football program needed to roll through the regular season and into the playoffs this year.

# Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) has established itself as one of the premier NCAA Division II athletic conferences in the nation.

Founded in 1951 for the purpose of promoting and administering the athletic programs at the 14 state teachers' colleges in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the PSAC is divided into seven-team Divisions.

The PSAC crowns Divisional Champions in football, but the "State Game" between the top team in the East and West was eliminated after the 1987 contest.

The PSAC is well-represented each year in the NCAA Division II national polls and post-season Football Championship.

The PSAC has had at least two teams compete in the NCAA Division II playoffs every year since 1988 and a national semifinalist in three of the past four seasons. Since 1990, PSAC teams have participated in a total of 26 NCAA Division II playoff games, highlighted by two

national championship game appearances by Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1990 and 1993. From its inception in 1951, each conference member selected its own competitive division within the National Collegiate

Athletic Association (NCAA) and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). In 1980, however, the presidents of each school, who make up the league's Board of Directors, voted to reclassify to NCAA Division II membership. Nine schools also elect to participate at the NCAA Division I level in select sports.

In 1983, all member institutions were granted University status and the State System of Higher Education (SSHE) was formed. The system currently has an enrollment in excess of 99,000 students with an alumni base of 402,000 including 287,000 who reside in the state. The Chancellor of the SSHE is Dr. James H. McCormick.

The PSAC sponsors championships in 20 men's and women's sports, including baseball, basketball, cross country, field hockey, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball and wrestling.

One of the largest NCAA Division II conferences in the nation, the league employs a full-time commissioner and an information director. Steve Murray has served as the conference SID for five years, and added the commissioner duties on an interim basis this past summer as the conference conducts a national search to fill the position. 





#### Edinboro and the Harlon Hill Award


Two Edinboro University of Pennsylvania football players have been finalists for the Harlon Hill Award, presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II

Former Edinboro running back Elbert Cole was one of three Harlon Hill finalists in 1989, while former Fighting Scot wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist for the award in 1990.

Cole placed third in the 1989 balloting, which was won by Texas A&I University running back Johnny Bailey, a three-time recipient. Priester was runner-up to North Dakota State University quarterback Chris Simdorn in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title.

Cole also was selected an All-American in 1989. receiving first-team honors from Kodak, second-team recognition from Football Gazette and third-team status from the Associated Press.

He rushed for 1.507 vards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns in a season (24) and points in a season (148). Cole led

Edinboro to a PSAC West title, an 8-3 overall record and a No. 7 ranking in the final NCAA Division II national poll.

Cole finished his Edinboro career with 3.341 vards rushing and 40 rushing touchdowns, ranking him third and second respectively in school history.

Priester was the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He also was an All-American, receiving first-team honors from Kodak, the Associated Press and Football Gazette. Priester caught 47 passes in 1990, totaling 1.102 yards (23.4 yards per catch) and 15 touchdowns. He led Edinboro to the NCAA Division II quarterfinals and a 9-3 overall record.

Priester also had an outstanding season in 1989, catching 49 passes for 1,128 yards (23-yard average) and a school-record 16 touchdown receptions. He is Edinboro's all-time career leader in receptions (148), receiving vards (3.064), vards per reception (20.7) and touchdown receptions (35). Following his career at Edinboro, Priester signed a free-agent contract with the National Football League's Denver Broncos. He later played for his hometown Cleveland Thunder of the Arena Football League.

The Harlon Hill Award is named in honor of legendary Chicago Bears wide receiver Harlon Hill, who was an All-American at the University of North Alabama. The award is selected each year by NCAA Division II sports information directors.
