

Welcome to Sox Harrison Stadium. Today's contest is not just another game, it's Homecoming, so we wish all the Boro alumni a special welcome. And what more appropriate opponent than Clarion. The Fighting Scots have played Clarion more than other team since football arrived on campus. This marks the 71st meeting between the two PSAC West rivals.

THE COACHES

Edinboro head coach Tom Hollman (Ohio Northern '68) is in his 12th season in charge of the Fighting Scots. With a 76-45-2 record at Edinboro. Hollman ranks as the

school's career record holder for most wins. He also coached four seasons at Wooster. Hollman has an overall mark of 100-56-3.

Malen Luke (Westminster '76), a former assistant coach at Edinboro from 1981-83, is in his sixth campaign as the head mentor at Clarion. Luke has posted a 28-31 ledger as the Golden Eagle head coach, and is 65-52 in 12 seasons as a head coach. That includes a six-year term at Defiance College, where he was 37-21. Luke led the 1996 Clarion edition to a 11-3 record and a spot in the NCAA Division II Playoffs, where the Eagles reached the semifinals.

THE EDINBORO-CLARION SERIES

Clarion leads 35-33-2

With this the 71st meeting between Edinboro and Clarion. this marks the most-played game for the Boro. Clarion holds a narrow 35-33-2 edge in the series, including a 33-20 win for the Golden Eagles in Clarion last season. The Golden Eagles have won the last two meetings, with Edinboro winning eight of nine prior to that. Clarion last won in Edinboro in 1994, capturing a 24-20 decision.

LAST YEAR'S GAME Clarion 33, Edinboro 20

Clarion, PA -- After falling behind 7-0, Clarion ran off 26 straight points to hand the Fighting Scots their fifth straight loss, the longest in head coach Tom Hollman's tenure.

Henry now has 571 yards in five games ... freshman Sean Thomas, a player who just became eligible two weeks ago, scored his first career touchdown last week. The 5'7", 165 lb. tailback squirted in from a yard out. He gained 24 yards on 7 carries ... Stephane Lubin ranks among the top kick returners in the country. Prior to the Shippensburg contest. Lubin ranked

appears almost fully recovered from a thumb injury which he suffered at the end of preseason drills. The big tight end hauled in a season-high 5 passes for 68 yards. He's ably assisted at the position by freshman Brandon Richardson. Richardson is tied for the team lead in receptions with 11 ... freshman Sean McNicholas continues to impress. He is averaging 39.3 yards on 29 punts, with four inside the twenty, and is 7-for-10 on field goal attempts.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN EAGLES

Clarion is venturing away from home for the first time this season after playing four consecutive home games. The Golden Eagles have played a very demanding schedule. Following a 28-21 loss to nationally-ranked New Haven in the opener, Clarion suffered a narrow 7-0 defeat to Shepherd, an NCAA playoff team a year ago. Next came a 31-21 win over Kutztown. The homestand concluded with a 45-7 setback to powerful Slippery Rock ... like Edinboro. Clarion is expected to start a redshirt freshman at guarterback. Adam Almashy has completed 40 of 78 passes for 401 yards, with 5 TDs and 2 INTs. He was a solid 15 of 25 for 159 yards against Slippery Rock ... Clarion has yet to post a touchdown rushing. Demetric Gardner paces the Golden Eagles with 137 yards on 26 carries, a 5.3 norm. Doug Dudash adds 118 yards on 35 totes ... Andy Pore has made the most of his 16 receptions. The 6'3", 245 lb. tight end has scored 5 touchdowns.

GATES JOINS MORGAN ON SIDELINES

The Fighting Scots lost their second member of the starting backfield in the last three weeks last Saturday when Rick Gates went down with a shoulder injury. The Boro's starting quarterback suffered a broken collarbone against Shippensburg, an injury which is expected to sideline him for the rest of the year. Starting fullback Chris Morgan suffered a season-ending new injury in the Mercyhurst game. With Gates out, redshirt freshman Jack Davis will make his first start at quarterback.

PUT AWAY THE HANKIES

As if the final score of last week's game at Shippensburg wasn't bad enough, coach Tom Holman had to sit back and watch the official whistle his Scots for 16 penalties for 156 yards. The number of penalties was one shy of the school record, and the yardage total wasn't far away, either.

BENJAMIN RETURNS HOME...

Well-travelled Roosevelt Benjamin is a familiar name to local football fans. The 6'2", 215 lb. junior starts for Clarion at strong safety and stands fourth in tackles with 24. He leads the team with 3 interceptions, and has 4 tackles for losses. Benjamin is a two-way standout, seeing time at wide receiver. He has caught 4 passes for 43 yards. In addition, Roosevelt averages 9.0 yards on 4 punt returns. A former standout at Central High School, he spent a period of time at Edinboro.

Forty percent of Clarion's offensive line has Erie roots. Right tackle Dan Geulich hails from Cathedral Prep. Greulich is a 6'3", 300 lb. senior. The bookend tackle is 6'4", 290 lb. junior Ken Nickson, a former standout at Central High School.

THE OUARTERLY REPORT

Edinboro and Clarion present an interesting dichotomy in scoring. Clarion has yet to score a point in the first quarter, being outscored 35-0. The Golden Eagles, meanwhile, own a 34-21 edge in the final period. Edinboro, on the other hand, owns a 43-28 advantage in the first quarter, despite being outscored 14-0 by Shippensburg this past week. But the Boro has seen opponents pile up 63 fourth guarter markers, compared to six for the good guys.

The Fighting Scots will invade Lock Haven next Saturday, October 16. Kickoff at Hubert Jack Stadium is set for 7 p.m.



HEAD GOAGH

TOM HOLLMAN



Since taking over the Edinboro University football program in 1988, winning and Tom Hollman have become synonymous. Hollman ranks as the all-time winningest coach in Edinboro history, entering his 12th campaign with a 75-41-2 record. In addition to holding the career record for victories, Hollman's .644 winning percentage ranks second, bettered only by Denny Creehan (.658).

Hollman has guided the Edinboro program to nine winning seasons in his first eleven years, marred only by four-win seasons in each of the last two years. That includes five NCAA Division II playoff appearances, the first ever

for Edinboro. The Fighting Scots have also captured a pair of Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference titles, in 1989 and 1995, and have been consistently ranked in the national polls.

Including four seasons as the head coach at Wooster College, Hollman showcases a career record of 99-52-3. That is good enough to rank him 22nd among all active Division II head coaches in winning percentage at .653. Hollman's Wooster teams won six games in each of his four seasons, giving him a 24-11-1 ledger at the Division III school.

Starting in 1988, his first season as head coach at Edinboro, the Fighting Scots ran off nine straight winning campaigns under

Hollman. The school record for wins in a season is nine, accomplished five times. Two of those seasons have come under Hollman's tutelage, first in 1990 and again in 1995.

Hollman joined the Edinboro athletic staff in

January of 1988 as the program's 11th head coach. He previously served three seasons as the defensive coordinator at Ohio University. The Fighting Scots posted a 5-4-1 ledger in his initial season, rallying for four wins and a tie in the final five games.

Edinboro enjoyed one of its finest seasons ever the following year, finishing 8-3 and ranked seventh in Division II in 1989. The Scots captured their first PSAC West crown since winning the PSAC in 1970, finishing with a perfect 6-0 in league play. The lone losses came to a pair of Division I-AA institutions - Liberty and Youngstown State - and a thrilling 45-32 setback at perennial Division II power North Dakota State in the Division II playoffs.

That contest marked Edinboro's first visit to NCAA postseason action, and also marked the Boro as one of the top Division II programs in the country.

Following the 1989 season, Hollman was honored as the top coach in the East Region by the American Football Coaches Association and was selected the PSAC West Coach of the Year.

Edinboro bettered the '89 campaign in 1990, going 9-3 and winning its first-ever NCAA playoff game. The Scots won at Virginia Union, 38-14, before suffering a 14-7 setback to PSAC West rival Indiana (Pa.) in the quarterfinals. Just three weeks earlier the Indians handed Edinboro a 36-29 defeat in a showdown for the PSAC West crown. Edinboro's only other loss in 1990 came to Youngstown State by four points.

Following a 7-4 record in 1991, Hollman's Scots finished as the PSAC West runner-up in 1992 and '93, but reached the NCAA playoffs both years. In 1992, the Scots recorded a 8-2-1 ledger, dropping a narrow 19-15 decision at Ferris State in the first round of postseason play. The '93 season featured a 8-3 finish and a season-ending 48-28 loss at New Haven in the first round of the playoffs

With a 7-3 record in 1994, the Scots missed out on postseason action, but they returned in '95, thanks to a 9-2 record and a perfect 6-0 showing in the PSAC West. Following a 44-7 loss at Division I-AA power Appalachian State in the second game of the season, Edinboro ran off eight straight wins to attain a playoff berth. New Haven again halted the Scots' playoff hopes in the first round with a 27-12 win. Edinboro was ranked eighth in the final NCAA Division II poll. Hollman was honored as the PSAC West Coach of the Year for the second time in 1995.

The Scots went 6-4 in 1996, highlighted by a 48-35 victory over PSAC West champion Clarion. The Golden Eagles would go on to

reach the national semifinals. Edinboro has won four games in each of the last two seasons, going 4-6 in 1997 and 4-7 in '98.

In addition to team success. Hollman has 55 coached Americans at Edinboro, including Elbert Cole and Ernest Priester. Both placed in the top three in the voting for the Harlon Hill Award, presented to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year. Cole was a finalist in 1989, with Priester in the top three the following season. Both players earned All-American recognition.

PSAC honors have rolled in for the Scots under Hollman's tutelage. In his eleven seasons, Edinboro players have been honored as the Player of the Year or Rookie of the Year ten times.

Hollman is a 1968 graduate of Ohio Northern University, earning his Bachelor's Degree in Education. He was a three-year starter and

a two-way performer for the Polar Bears, starting at end on offense and defensive back on defense. He set the school record with 13 career interceptions, and was recognized as an All-American and All-District performer in 1966 and 1967. Hollman also lettered in base-ball for three years.

Hollman's coaching career began in 1968 as an assistant coach at Sidney High School in Sidney, Ohio. After earning a Master's Degree in Education from Xavier University in 1971, he became head coach at Greenville High School in Ohio, posting an impressive 26-2-2 mark from 1971-73. Hollman then moved on to Fremont Ross High School in Ohio in 1974-75, where his teams were 15-3-2. Fremont Ross captured the 1974 Buckeye Conference championship with a 9-0-1 record.

In 1976, Hollman advanced to the college ranks, joining his alma mater, Ohio Northern, as the school's defensive coordinator. He was named the head coach at Wooster College the following year. Hollman snapped a stretch of three consecutive losing seasons for the Scots in his first campaign, going 6-3. It would be the first of four straight six-win seasons.

After four seasons in charge of the Wooster program, Hollman served as an assistant coach at Ball State University from 1981-84. He then moved on to Ohio University in 1985, serving as the defensive coordinator until taking over at Edinboro in 1988.

Hollman resides in Edinboro with his wife, Kandi. They have four children -- Mari, Jon, Tim and Denise.

ASSISTANT COACHES

SCOTT BROWNING

Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line



Scott Browning holds the longest tenure of anyone on the Edinboro University coaching staff. Browning is in his fifth season as the offensive coordinator and his 14th year overall.

Browning has coached a variety of positions at the Boro, including the offensive line for the last six years. He also coached the running backs and defensive backs in the past.

In his many capacities, Browning has coached several All-Americans such as Steve Russell, Michael Willis, Wade

Smith, Georj Lewis, Mike Barnes, Elbert Cole and Jeremy O'Day.

In addition to his extensive experience at Edinboro, Browning has served as an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for three years. The Buckeyes went to the Fiesta Bowl, the Rose Bowl and the Citrus Bowl in his three seasons. Browning served as the secondary coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. That outfit reached the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

A 1981 graduate of Ohio State with a Bachelor's Degree in Education, Browning began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Worthington High School and Dayton-Fairview High School in Ohio from 1979-81. Before transferring to Ohio State, he attended Capital University, where he played football for one season. Browning later earned a Master's Degree in Education Administration from New Mexico State in 1983.

Browning and his wife, Lynn, reside in Edinboro and have two children, Andrew, 5, and Kaitlyn, one year old.

WAYNE BRADFORD

Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Line



Wayne Bradford is the newest member of the Edinboro coaching staff, joining the program in early August. Bradford previously was the defensive coordinator at Salisbury State University. In addition to serving as the defensive coordinator, Bradford will instruct the Fighting Scot defensive linemen.

A graduate of Salisbury State, Bradford began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the defensive linemen and linebackers. In 1994, he was promot-

ed to defensive coordinator. His defenses excelled during that period. A year ago, the Sea Gulls paced the Atlantic Central Football Conference in pass defense and quarterback sacks. In 1997, Salisbury State ranked 38th in NCAA Division II in total defense,

allowing just 268 yards per game. His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game.

Bradford graduated from Salisbury in 1990 with a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. He completed work on his Master's Degree in Business Administration from Salisbury State in 1992. In addition to working as a member of the football staff, Bradford was a faculty member in the School of Business. Since 1996, he has been the Director of the Business Graduate Programs for the Perdue School of Business at Salisbury State.

As an undergraduate, Bradford was an offensive lineman. he played on the 1986 Salisbury State team which finished as the NCAA Division III national runnerup.

Bradford and his wife, Gwen, have one son, Nicholas, one-and-a-half reside in Edinboro.

DUSTIN CALHOUN

Linebackers



Dustin Calhoun enters his third season as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff. After directing the secondary for two seasons, Calhoun will serve as the linebacker coach in 1999

Calhoun joined the Fighting Scots' staff after serving as a graduate assistant coach at Ohio State for two years. While with the Buckeyes he worked primarily with the secondary. Ohio State appeared in two bowl games during his stay. The Buckeyes played in the Citrus Bowl in 1995, then finished with the second-

ranked team in the country in '96 following a win over Arizona State in the Rose Bowl.

Prior to beginning work on his Master's Degree in Physical Education at Ohio State, Calhoun spent one season as an assistant coach and the strength and conditioning coach at Lakewood High School in Ohio. He also has served as an assistant coach at Westerville North High School in Ohio in 1993, and was a volunteer coach at Ohio State in 1994.

Henson joined the Edinboro staff after serving as a mathematics teacher, football coach and athletic director at Grand Valley High School in Ohio for 22 years. At Grand Valley, he led the Mustangs to a

150-68-4 record, including five Grand River Conference championships, three East Suburban Conference titles, and three state playoff appearances. In the 1990's, Henson's charges posted three undefeated campaigns and a 23-game regular season winning streak. Henson was named the conference Coach of the Year several times, culminated by his selection as the Ohio Division V Coach of the Year in 1997.

Prior to beginning his stellar career at Grand Valley, Henson debuted as an assistant coach at Cardinal Middlefield (OH) High School, where he served for eight years.

Henson graduated from Hiram College in 1968 with a Bachelor's Degree in Arts & Mathematics, then later completed work on his Master's Degree in Mathematics Education from Youngstown State University in 1972. 

In addition to his conference awards, Decker was named to the CoSIDA All-American team in '96, and was a *Football Gazette* third team All-American that same year. He finished his career with 11 interceptions, tied for seventh on the all-time list.

Decker also excelled at track, earning All-American honors in 1996 when he high-jumped 7/", good for seventh place at the NCAA Division II Nationals.

Decker graduated from Edinboro in December 1997 with a Bachelor's Degree in History. He resides in Edinboro.

MARK HOOVER

Tight Ends



Mark Hoover is in his first season as a member of the Fighting Scot staff. He is working with the tight ends.

Hoover served as the offensive/defensive line coach at nearby General McLane High School a year ago. He helped the Lancers finish with a 10-1 record and capture the Erie County League title. General McLane advanced to the District 10 championship game.
