



# EDINBORO FIGHTING SCOTS (4-7 in '98)

Welcome to the opening of the 1999 football season, as Edinboro hosts Hillsdale in the season opener for both outfits. This marks the sixth straight season the two clubs have opened the season against each other, and Boro head coach Tom Hollman hopes form holds true for a couple reasons. The Fighting Scots have won all of the previous five meetings, although each contest has been very tight. In addition, a victory would hand Hollmn his 100th career coaching triumph.

Today's game is the first of six contests in the friendly confines of Sox Harrison Stadium. It's the first time the Scots have had six home games. In fact, the Boro won't leave Erie County during the month of September, playing three home contests and a game at Mercyhurst.

## **THE COACHES**

Edinboro head coach **Tom Hollman (Ohio Northern '68)** begins his 12th season in charge of the Fighting Scots. With a 75-41-2 record at Edinboro, Hollman ranks as the school's career record holder for most wins. Adding in four seasons as the head coach at Wooster, and Hollman is in pursuit of his 100th victory today. He has an overall mark of 99-52-3, ranking 22nd among all active NCAA Division II coaches in winning percentage.

**Dave Dye (Baldwin-Wallace '67)** enters his third season in charge of the Hillsdale program. He looks to put a jump start into a Charger team which went 3-8 in 1998 and 4-7 the year before that.

## THE EDINBORO-HILLSDALE SERIES

## Edinboro leads 5-0

Edinboro owns a deceiving 5-0 lead in its all-time series with Hillsdale. Four of the five games have been decided by a touchdown or less, with only the 1996 affair,a 35-21 Boro triumph in Michigan, resembling a blowout. But that contest was just a touchdown difference entering the fourth quarter.

A couple interesting facts about the first five meetings. The team that scored first -- Edinboro -- has won every game. And for the most part, Edinboro has showcased the ground game, while Hillsdale has lived through the air. Gerald Thompson topped the 100-yard mark three times, with Larry Jackson topping the century mark in 1994.

## LAST YEAR'S GAME Edinboro 13, Hillsdale 10

Hillsdale, MI -- For the fifth straight season the Fighting Scots opened the season with a win over Hillsdale. The win came courtesy of a pair of Gerald Thompson touchdown runs and several fourth quarter stands by the defense.

Thompson gained 153 yards on 36 carries, with scoring runs of 8 and 2 yards. Both scores were set up by Hillsdale fumbles. The defense, meanwhile, saw the Chargers drive into Boro territory four times in the fourth stanza, but manage just a touchdown.

The Edinboro defensive unit limited Charger signalcaller Kyle Keefer to 16 completions in 39 attempts, good for 195 yards.

## SCOUTING THE FIGHTING SCOTS

Bring The Boro back is Tom Hollman's war cry in 1999. It's not just a catchy phrase, it's an effort to remind his charges how his gridiron editions in the early '90's played. Those outfits featured solid funbdamentals and physical play.

After nine straight winning seasons, including five postseason appearances, the Fighting Scots have suffered back-to-back four-win seasons. That includes last year's 4-7 finish. And with Gerald Thompson, who gained 1,698 yards rushing a year ago, gone, plus a host of other starters missing, it won't be easy. But Hollman has liked the way his team has gone about fall practice. Add in a solid recruiting class, and Hollman is enthused.

Thompson's place will likely be taken by Bernard Henry, a flashy junior college transfer. The 6'1", 210 lb. junior led all junior college rushers in 1997 with 1,810 yards. He'll be joined in the backfield by 250-lb. fullback Chris Morgan, a brusining blocker who is expected to see the ball more as a ballcarrier in '99.

Junior Rick Gates will open at quarterback. Gates completed 24 of 50 passes for 238 yards as a backup last year. He started the season finale, leading the Scots to a victory over Bloomsburg.

Senior tight end Rob Barney is the top returning receiver with 23 grabs for 241 yards. Jeremy Brain, a senior wideout, added 16 catches for 212 yards after finishing as the second-leading receiver in '97.

The Boro defense will have a new look in '99, with five freshmen in the starting lineup. But after giving up 304 points and 369.8 yards per game, a change was needed.

Senior linebacker Dan Caro looks to lead the Scots in tackles for the third straight season. The 6'1", 245 lb. linebacker had 98 hits last year, and earned a spot on the PSAC West first team for

the second straight year.

The defensive line suffered a blow in the spring when Matt Stultz suffered a knee injury and was lost for the season. Look for Hollman to rotate a host of players in his four-man front.

Only D.K. McDonald (23 tackles, 3 INT) returns in the secondary. Three freshmen complete the quartet, including Stephane Lubin, a redshirt who has mnoved from tailback

Even the kicking game is young. Freshman Sean McNicholas will handle both the punting and placekicking chores.

## **SCOUTING THE CHARGERS**

Hillsdale looks to improve on last year's 3-8 finish. The Chargers bring a three-game losing streak into the campaign. Like Edinboro, defense was a major shortcoming for Hillsdale last year. However, 45 letterwinners and 10 returning starters have the Chargers hopeful of a turnaround.

The combination of a youthful Boro secondary and a talented senior signalcaller for Hillsdale should lead to plenty of balls in the air. Kyle Keefer completed 148 of 292 passes for 1,875 yards with 17 TDs and just 10 INTs last year. He added 344 yards and four more scores on the ground.

Keefer's top four targets retrurn, led by Erick Clauson with 43 grabs for 494 yards. Adam Greenman added 42 catches for 589 yards, with 10 TDs. Ed House (23-351-2TD) and Theron Toney (21-252) are other dependable receivers.

Matt Fisher paces the running game. The senior gained 405 yards on 84 carries in '98.

## **CAPTAINS NAMED**

Edinboro will have a trio of captains in 1999. Fullbacks Chris Morgan (Duquesne, PA/Duquesne) and Mick Lilley (Connellsville, PA/Connellsville) were chosen by their teammates, as was linebacker Dan Caro (Bedford, PA/Bedford). All are seniors.

## JUST FOR OPENERS

Edinboro has won its last five season openers, all against Hillsdale. The last time the Boro suffered a defeat in a debut was 1993, when Ferris State, another member of the Midwest Intercollegiate Football Conference, handed the Scots a 23-9 setback at Sox Harrison Stadium. The Scots are 7-4 in home openers under head coach Tom Hollman.

## IS HENRY NEXT?

A year ago Gerald Thompson ran for a school-record 1,698, and departed as Edinboro's all-time leading rusher. Obviously, he will be difficult to replace. But remember that head coach Tom Hollman has had a 1,00-yard rusher in eight of his eleven seasons at Edinboro. Five different backs have gained 1,000-or-more yards. Could Bernard Henry be the next member of the 1,000 yard club? Henry already has a grand to his credit, but that came at Vermilion (MN) Community College, where he gained 1,810 yards in 1997. While not wanting to put any pressure on the Boro's newest tailback, Henry has the size (6'1", 210 lbs.) and speed (10 TDs of 60 yards or more in '97) to put up some big numbers.

### **NEXT WEEK**

The Fighting Scots return to Sox Harrison Stadium next Saturday, September 11, hosting Glenville State. The Pioneers opened with a 35-28 win over California(Pa.) last Saturday. Kickoff

is slated for 1 p.m.



# HEAD COACH

## TOM HOLLMAN



Since taking over the Edinboro University football program in 1988, winning and Tom Hollman have become synonymous. Hollman ranks as the all-time winningest coach in Edinboro history, entering his 12th campaign with a 75-41-2 record. In addition to holding the career record for victories, Hollman's .644 winning percentage ranks second, bettered only by Denny Creehan (.658).

Hollman has guided the Edinboro program to nine winning seasons in his first eleven years, marred only by four-win seasons in each of the last two years. That includes five NCAA Division II playoff appearances, the first ever

for Edinboro. The Fighting Scots have also captured a pair of Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference titles, in 1989 and 1995, and have been consistently ranked in the national polls.

Including four seasons as the head coach at Wooster College, Hollman showcases a career record of 99-52-3. That is good enough to rank him 22nd among all active Division II head coaches in winning percentage at .653. Hollman's Wooster teams won six games in each of his four seasons, giving him a 24-11-1 ledger at the Division III school.

Starting in 1988, his first season as head coach at Edinboro, the Fighting Scots ran off nine straight winning campaigns under

Hollman. The school record for wins in a season is nine, accomplished five times. Two of those seasons have come under Hollman's tutelage, first in 1990 and again in 1995.

Hollman joined the Edinboro athletic staff in

January of 1988 as the program's 11th head coach. He previously served three seasons as the defensive coordinator at Ohio University. The Fighting Scots posted a 5-4-1 ledger in his initial season, rallying for four wins and a tie in the final five games.

Edinboro enjoyed one of its finest seasons ever the following year, finishing 8-3 and ranked seventh in Division II in 1989. The Scots captured their first PSAC West crown since winning the PSAC in 1970, finishing with a perfect 6-0 in league play. The lone losses came to a pair of Division I-AA institutions - Liberty and Youngstown State - and a thrilling 45-32 setback at perennial Division II power North Dakota State in the Division II playoffs.

That contest marked Edinboro's first visit to NCAA postseason action, and also marked the Boro as one of the top Division II programs in the country.

Following the 1989 season, Hollman was honored as the top coach in the East Region by the American Football Coaches Association and was selected the PSAC West Coach of the Year.

Edinboro bettered the '89 campaign in 1990, going 9-3 and winning its first-ever NCAA playoff game. The Scots won at Virginia Union, 38-14, before suffering a 14-7 setback to PSAC West rival Indiana (Pa.) in the quarterfinals. Just three weeks earlier the Indians handed Edinboro a 36-29 defeat in a showdown for the PSAC West crown. Edinboro's only other loss in 1990 came to Youngstown State by four points.

Following a 7-4 record in 1991, Hollman's Scots finished as the PSAC West runner-up in 1992 and '93, but reached the NCAA playoffs both years. In 1992, the Scots recorded a 8-2-1 ledger, dropping a narrow 19-15 decision at Ferris State in the first round of postseason play. The '93 season featured a 8-3 finish and a season-ending 48-28 loss at New Haven in the first round of the playoffs.

With a 7-3 record in 1994, the Scots missed out on postseason action, but they returned in '95, thanks to a 9-2 record and a perfect 6-0 showing in the PSAC West. Following a 44-7 loss at Division I-AA power Appalachian State in the second game of the season, Edinboro ran off eight straight wins to attain a playoff berth. New Haven again halted the Scots' playoff hopes in the first round with a 27-12 win. Edinboro was ranked eighth in the final NCAA Division II poll. Hollman was honored as the PSAC West Coach of the Year for the second time in 1995.

The Scots went 6-4 in 1996, highlighted by a 48-35 victory over PSAC West champion Clarion. The Golden Eagles would go on to

reach the national semifinals. Edinboro has won four games in each of the last two seasons, going 4-6 in 1997 and 4-7 in '98.

In addition to team success, Hollman has coached 55 Americans at Edinboro, including Elbert Cole and Ernest Priester. Both placed in the top three in the voting for the Harlon Hill Award, presented to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year. Cole was a finalist in 1989, with Priester in the top three the following season. Both players earned All-American recognition.

PSAC honors have rolled in for the Scots under Hollman's tutelage. In his eleven seasons, Edinboro players have been honored as the Player of the Year or Rookie of the Year ten times.

Hollman is a 1968 graduate of Ohio Northern University, earning his Bachelor's Degree in Education. He was a three-year starter and

a two-way performer for the Polar Bears, starting at end on offense and defensive back on defense. He set the school record with 13 career interceptions, and was recognized as an All-American and All-District performer in 1966 and 1967. Hollman also lettered in baseball for three years.

Hollman's coaching career began in 1968 as an assistant coach at Sidney High School in Sidney, Ohio. After earning a Master's Degree in Education from Xavier University in 1971, he became head coach at Greenville High School in Ohio, posting an impressive 26-2-2 mark from 1971-73. Hollman then moved on to Fremont Ross High School in Ohio in 1974-75, where his teams were 15-3-2. Fremont Ross captured the 1974 Buckeye Conference championship with a 9-0-1 record.

In 1976, Hollman advanced to the college ranks, joining his alma mater, Ohio Northern, as the school's defensive coordinator. He was named the head coach at Wooster College the following year. Hollman snapped a stretch of three consecutive losing seasons for the Scots in his first campaign, going 6-3. It would be the first of four straight six-win seasons.

After four seasons in charge of the Wooster program, Hollman served as an assistant coach at Ball State University from 1981-84. He then moved on to Ohio University in 1985, serving as the defensive coordinator until taking over at Edinboro in 1988.

Hollman resides in Edinboro with his wife, Kandi. They have four children -- Mari, Jon, Tim and Denise.

# ASSISTANT COACHES

## SCOTT BROWNING

Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line



Scott Browning holds the longest tenure of anyone on the Edinboro University coaching staff. Browning is in his fifth season as the offensive coordinator and his 14th year overall.

Browning has coached a variety of positions at the Boro, including the offensive line for the last six years. He also coached the running backs and defensive backs in the past.

In his many capacities, Browning has coached several All-Americans such as Steve Russell, Michael Willis, Wade

Smith, Georj Lewis, Mike Barnes, Elbert Cole and Jeremy O'Day.

In addition to his extensive experience at Edinboro, Browning has served as an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for three years. The Buckeyes went to the Fiesta Bowl, the Rose Bowl and the Citrus Bowl in his three seasons. Browning served as the secondary coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. That outfit reached the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

A 1981 graduate of Ohio State with a Bachelor's Degree in Education, Browning began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Worthington High School and Dayton-Fairview High School in Ohio from 1979-81. Before transferring to Ohio State, he attended Capital University, where he played football for one season. Browning later earned a Master's Degree in Education Administration from New Mexico State in 1983.

Browning and his wife, Lynn, reside in Edinboro and have two children, Andrew, 5, and Kaitlyn , one year old.

## **WAYNE BRADFORD**

Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Line



Wayne Bradford is the newest member of the Edinboro coaching staff, joining the program in early August. Bradford previously was the defensive coordinator at Salisbury State University. In addition to serving as the defensive coordinator, Bradford will instruct the Fighting Scot defensive linemen.

A graduate of Salisbury State, Bradford began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the defensive linemen and linebackers. In 1994, he was promot-

ed to defensive coordinator. His defenses excelled during that period. A year ago, the Sea Gulls paced the Atlantic Central Football Conference in pass defense and quarterback sacks. In 1997, Salisbury State ranked 38th in NCAA Division II in total defense,

allowing just 268 yards per game. His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game.

Bradford graduated from Salisbury in 1990 with a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. He completed work on his Master's Degree in Business Administration from Salisbury State in 1992. In addition to working as a member of the football staff, Bradford was a faculty member in the School of Business. Since 1996, he has been the Director of the Business Graduate Programs for the Perdue School of Business at Salisbury State.

As an undergraduate, Bradford was an offensive lineman. he played on the 1986 Salisbury State team which finished as the NCAA Division III national runnerup.

Bradford and his wife, Gwen, have one son, Nicholas, one-and-a-half reside in Edinboro.

## **DUSTIN CALHOUN**

Linebackers



Dustin Calhoun enters his third season as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff. After directing the secondary for two seasons, Calhoun will serve as the line-backer coach in 1999.

Calhoun joined the Fighting Scots' staff after serving as a graduate assistant coach at Ohio State for two years. While with the Buckeyes he worked primarily with the secondary. Ohio State appeared in two bowl games during his stay. The Buckeyes played in the Citrus Bowl in 1995, then finished with the second-

ranked team in the country in '96 following a win over Arizona State in the Rose Bowl.

Prior to beginning work on his Master's Degree in Physical Education at Ohio State, Calhoun spent one season as an assistant coach and the strength and conditioning coach at Lakewood High School in Ohio. He also has served as an assistant coach at Westerville North High School in Ohio in 1993, and was a volunteer coach at Ohio State in 1994.

Calhoun earned his Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from Otterbein College in 1993, where he played baseball and football. He and his wife, Wendi, reside in Edinboro with their ninemonth-old son, Parker.

## JIM HENSON

Running Backs



Jim Henson is another one of the Fighting Scot assistant coaches who will have new responsibilities in 1999. After guiding the defensive line a year ago, Henson enters his second year on the Edinboro staff in charge of the running backs.

Henson joined the Edinboro staff after serving as a mathematics teacher, football coach and athletic director at Grand Valley High School in Ohio for 22 years. At Grand Valley, he led the Mustangs to a

150-68-4 record, including five Grand River Conference championships, three East Suburban Conference titles, and three state playoff appearances. In the 1990's, Henson's charges posted three undefeated campaigns and a 23-game regular season winning streak. Henson was named the conference Coach of the Year several times, culminated by his selection as the Ohio Division V Coach of the Year in 1997.

Prior to beginning his stellar career at Grand Valley, Henson debuted as an assistant coach at Cardinal Middlefield (OH) High School, where he served for eight years.

Henson graduated from Hiram College in 1968 with a Bachelor's Degree in Arts & Mathematics, then later completed work on his Master's Degree in Mathematics Education from Youngstown State University in 1972. He and his wife, Evelyn, reside in Orwell, Ohio. They are the parents of a son, Jim, and daughter, Jennifer.

## MARIO HOUSTON

Defensive Backs



After a stellar career at Edinboro, Mario Houston joined the Fighting Scots' coaching staff three years ago. He coached the wide receivers his first two seasons, but the East Cleveland, OH native now returns to familiar surroundings as the defensive backs coach.

As a defensive back for the Scots, Houston earned PSAC Rookie of the Year accolades in 1990 after leading the team with five interceptions. That total ranks 11th all-time for season interceptions. He was a two-time All-PSAC selection and

concluded his career with school records for passes broken up (53). He also holds the season record for pass deflections with 16 in 1990. In addition, Houston racked up 269 career tackles, racking among the top twenty all-time tacklers.

Houston was also a standout in the classroom, earning Scholar-Athlete recognition three times. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in Accounting in 1996. The father of a five-year-old son, DeAndre, Houston resides in Edinboro.

## BRIAN DECKER

Wide Receivers



Brian Decker begins his first season as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff. Decker is hardly a stranger to the Fighting Scot program, however. He enjoyed an outstanding career as a safety for the Scots, including earning PSAC West Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1997. Decker makes his coaching debut on the other side of the football, tutoring the receivers.

A native of Portville, NY, Decker played for coach Tom Hollman from 1995-97. He

was a first team All-PSAC West selection as a junior and senior, finishing as the team's second-leading tackler both years. In addition to his conference awards, Decker was named to the CoSIDA All-American team in '96, and was a *Football Gazette* third team All-American that same year. He finished his career with 11 interceptions, tied for seventh on the all-time list.

Decker also excelled at track, earning All-American honors in 1996 when he high-jumped 7%, good for seventh place at the NCAA Division II Nationals.

Decker graduated from Edinboro in December 1997 with a Bachelor's Degree in History. He resides in Edinboro.

## MARK HOOVER

Tight Ends



Mark Hoover is in his first season as a member of the Fighting Scot staff. He is working with the tight ends.

Hoover served as the offensive/defensive line coach at nearby General McLane High School a year ago. He helped the Lancers finish with a 10-1 record and capture the Erie County League title. General McLane advanced to the District 10 championship game.

Prior to coaching at General McLane, Hoover began his coaching career as a student assistant at James A. Garfield

(OH) High School.

A native of Sugar Grove, PA, Hoover received his Bachelor's Degree in Communications in 1996. He is currently pursuing his teacher's certification in Elementary education at edinboro.

## DON'T JUDGE A LINEBACKER BY ITS COVER

Not many football players will admit that their most memorable moment is getting knocked silly. Furthermore, if that's the thing they remember most, odds are they haven't had a very successful career.

Meet Dan Caro. The Edinboro University linebacker vividly recalls the Carson-Newman contest back in 1996, his freshman campaign. "It was our second game of the season, and the

first game I every started," he recalled. "I wasn't expecting to start. I found out a half hour before the game. On the first play of the game, they busted it for a touchdown, and I got a concussion."

But believe it or not, that knock to the head paved the way for Caro to become a standout. From then on, I knew what it took. It irritated me, and motivated me."

Caro would play in eight games that season, registering 34 tackles. The last two years he has started at linebacker, leading the Fighting Scots in tackles both years. In addition, Caro was named to the All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference West Division first team as a sophomore and junior.

Despite Caro's success, Edinboro has struggled the last two years, posting back-to-back four win seasons. That's something Caro hopes will change in '99.

"The past two years I've been going into the season thinking we're going to tear things up," he admitted. "We have something to prove. I don't think they respect us. We don't have the people with the big statistics, but we have people who can play."

The 6'1", 245 lb. backer will be looked upon as a leader on and off the field. On the field shouldn't be a problem. A year ago, Caro recorded 98 tackles, including 9 for losses and 4 sacks. He had 85 stops, with 5 sacks, in '97. And Caro has saved some of his best games for the top competition. He had a career-high 16 hits last year against Slippery Rock, in addition to 12 tackles against the Rockets as a sophomore.

"I have goals, but I don't tell anyone," commented Caro. "We'll see what happens. Of course I'd like to be an All-American, but you have to win first, then that stuff will come."

Though a quiet player, Caro has gained the respect of his teammates. That's evident by his recent selection as a team captain. With a defensive unit that could feature up to six true and redshirt freshmen, Caro's abilities as a leader will be sorely tested.

"I'm not real vocal," noted Caro. "I'm vocal, but in my own way. If you play hard, they'll follow you. I'm quiet, but once you get to know me, I'm not quiet."

First-year defensive coordinator Wayne Bradford has been impressed with Caro, while also realizing he will play a key role in the team's success in '99. He'd like to see a few more of his players emulate the team's standout linebacker.

"He's going to be our leader," stated Bradford. "He's a

very intense football player. He doesn't smile or kid around. Dan is all business. On top of that, he's smart football player. He has good instincts. Bottom line is, he's a very good football player. And Dan is ready to go every snap."

Head coach Tom Hollman has had the pleasure of working with the Bedford, Pa. native since his arrival at Edinboro. The long-time mentor hopes Caro's extra work this summer will translate into his best season yet.

"Dan's working real hard," stressed Hollman. "He has had a good camp. I know he has a lot of high expectations. He's a true team player, and a fierce competitor who is well-respected by his teammates. Dan was up here most of the ummer, working hard on his conditioning. I hope has the year he's hoping to have."

While playing with the intensity of former greats like Dick Butkus, Ray Nitschke and Jack Lambert, Caro's quiet nature belies the ferocity of the position. Yet he readily admits a bit of a Jeckyll-Hyde personality.

"I try to play hard, tough and aggressive, always giving 100 percent," related Caro. "Once you're out there as a football player you have to try to be a leader. You always have to think you're the best player out there. I take pride in being tougher than everybody else."


While currently enjoying a career corralling opposing ballcarriers, Caro will soon embark on another career as a crime-buster. He is a Criminal Justice major who expects to receive his Bachelor's Degree in December.

"I've thought about a lot of things," commented Caro on his future plans. "I might work with a juvenile agency, or

even go into the military. Right now I'm just focusing on getting done with school and finishing my football career strong."

Who knows, maybe Caro will leave himself with a memory that will erase that September afternoon in 1996 when he suffered the concussion against Carson-Newman. Since that time, he's been nothing but a headache for opposing coaches and players.
