

Welcome to Parents Day at Sox Harrison Stadium. The Fighting Scots play their final non-PSAC West opponent before opening divisional play next week. However, Edinboro is not stepping out of the PSAC, instead bringing in the East Division preseason favorite in Millersville.

Both teams come off losses last weekend. The Fighting Scots turned the ball over five times and gave up a 14-0 lead in dropping a 34-20 decision at Mercyhurst. The Marauders, meanwhile, played at Division II power New Haven, falling in the final minute by a 38-35 count.

Even still, the Marauders are tied for 20th in the latest NCAA Division II rankings.

### THE COACHES

Edinboro head coach **Tom Hollman (Ohio Northern '68)** is in his 12th season in charge of the Fighting Scots. With a 76-43-2 record at Edinboro, Hollman ranks as the school's career record holder for most wins. He also coached four seasons at Wooster. Hollman has an overall mark of 100-54-3, ranking 22nd among all active NCAA Division II coaches in winning percentage, and picking up win number 100 vs. Glenville State.

**Dr. Gene Carpenter (Huron '63)** is in 30th year as the head coach at Millersville. Under Carpenter's guidance, Millersville has won ten PSAC Eastern Division championships. In fact, in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, only Penn State's Joe Paterno has more wins. With a career record of 206-84-6 (including one season at Adams State), Carpenter stands second among Division II coaches in career victories.

### THE EDINBORO-MILLERSVILLE SERIES

#### Millersville leads 4-3

The Marauders gained a narrow lead in the series with a convincing 42-7 win last season. Edinboro has won two of three meetings at Sox Harrison Stadium, however, including a 52-27 triumph in 1993. That marks the last time the Ville invaded the Boro.

### LAST YEAR'S GAME

#### Millersville 42, Edinboro 7

Millersville, PA -- For the third straight week a Boro opponent scored more than forty points. PSAC East power Millersville ran over the Scot D for 471 yards, while the Marauder defense held Gerald Thompson in check.

For the third straight week, as well, the Scots faced a high-powered aerial attack. Marauder Drew Folmar did not disappoint, completing 16 of 21 passes for 286 yards with 4 TDs.

One of the few bright spots for the Boro was punter Tyson Cook. Cook averaged 46.8 yards on five boots, with a long of 64 yards.

### BORO BITS

While the Boro suffered a disappointing 34-20 loss at Mercyhurst last week, several players enjoyed outstanding outings in a losing cause. Bernard Henry posted his third straight 100-yard effort, gaining 119 yards on 28 punishing carries. That gives him 348 yards in three games ... Chris Buehner, who entered the season with just seven career receptions, caught 4 passes for 117 yards, including a 75-yarder for the Boro's first TD ... freshman Sean McNicholas continues to impress. He averaged 37.2 yards on five punts, and made good on field goal attempts of 39 and 35 yards. He has now con-

verted 5 of 7 three-pointers ... Dave Holton is becoming an impact player on special teams. While doing an excellent job as the long snapper, the sophomore linebacker has really made his mark on the punt return team. Holton has blocked punts the last two weeks. The Boro has blocked a punt in each of its first three games ... Mercyhurst became the first team to rush for 100 yards against the Boro. The Lakers gained 118 yards ... redshirt freshman Dave Smith is quickly making his mark as a pass rushing specialist. Smith, a 6'2", 235 lb. defensive end, has had at least one sack in each of the first three games.

### SCOUTING THE MARAUDERS

Millersville suffered a heart-breaking loss a week ago, giving up a 45-yard field goal with 32 seconds left in a 38-35 loss at New Haven ... the Marauders, 8-2 a year ago and the PSAC East titlist, are the preseason favorites to repeat. Despite the loss, they are tied for 20th in the latest NCAA Division II poll ... for the fourth straight week the Scots will face a proficient passing game. Junior Drew Folmar already ranks third in career passing yards at the Ville with 5,666 yards. He has thrown 53 career TDs, a school record. Folmar earned first team All-PSAC East accolades ... Folmar's favorite target is Sean Scott. The junior wideout caught 13 passes for 150 yards vs. New Haven, giving him 19 catches for 279 yards in two games ... Millersville is not a one-dimensional team. The Marauders also feature a dangerous running back in John Flamish, another All-PSAC first teamer. The 5'11", 215 lb. junior gained 19 yards with 2 TDs in the opener vs. Bowie State, but was held to 43 yards on 17 totes last week ... Boro coach Tom Hollman feels the Scots won't see a larger offensive line all year than Millersville's. The five average an even 300 lbs., led by Matt Doherty, a 290 lb. center who was a first team All-PSAC East choice ... the defense is paced by all-conference performer Lee Rizzotto. The senior linebacker has 18 tackles, including a pair of sacks. DE Jarad Tucker also owns two sacks.

### ON THOSE TURNOVERS

In week number one, the Fighting Scots committed seven turnovers which led to 28 points in a 28-10 loss to Hillsdale. The following week, the Boro went without a turnover and posted a 29-20 win over Glenville State. The turnovers returned in game number three, as five miscues resulted in 17 Mercyhurst points. Final score -- Mercyhurst 34, Edinboro 20. The good news for head coach Tom Hollman is that, if form holds true, the Scots will be error-free in the even numbered week.

### YOUNG SECONDARY HOLDING UP WELL

One would think that after facing three top-notch quarterbacks, the Edinboro secondary, with three freshmen starters, would be shellshocked. But the youthful group has held up quite well. Against Mercyhurst's Matt Kissell, the foursome limited the Laker standout to 25 completions in 48 attempts for 241 yards, a week after he had thrown for over 400 yards. Freshman FS Jason Gordon has both of the Boro's interceptions.

### HENRY COMPARES FAVORABLY TO THOMPSON

One constant at Edinboro since Tom Hollman took charge is the presence of a standout ballcarrier. The latest in that long line is Bernard Henry. The 6'1", 210 lb. junior has topped the 100-yard mark in each of his first three games wearing the Red & White. For the record, Gerald Thompson turned the trick a year ago on his way to a school-record 1,698 yards. The team that stopped him in week number four? Millersville. Thompson was held to 77 yards vs. the Marauders.

### WELCOME BACK RON

A week ago the Scots faced a former player in Tom Herman, an assistant on the Mercyhurst staff and a member of the 1970 Edinboro PSAC championship team. This week the Boro welcomes home Ron Rankin, who played running back for Edinboro in the early 1980's. Rankin is the Millersville defensive coordinator.

### NEXT WEEK

The Fighting Scots leave Erie County for the first time in 1999, opening PSAC West play with a contest at Shippensburg. Kickoff is slated for 1 p.m. on Saturday, October 2.





# HEAD COACH

## TOM HOLLMAN



Since taking over the Edinboro University football program in 1988, winning and Tom Hollman have become synonymous. Hollman ranks as the all-time winningest coach in Edinboro history, entering his 12th campaign with a 75-41-2 record. In addition to holding the career record for victories, Hollman's .644 winning percentage ranks second, bettered only by Denny Creehan (.658).

Hollman has guided the Edinboro program to nine winning seasons in his first eleven years, marred only by four-losing seasons in each of the last two years. That includes five NCAA Division II playoff appearances, the first ever for Edinboro.

The Fighting Scots have also captured a pair of Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference titles, in 1989 and 1995, and have been consistently ranked in the national polls.

Including four seasons as the head coach at Wooster College, Hollman showcases a career record of 99-52-3. That is good enough to rank him 22nd among all active Division II head coaches in winning percentage at .653. Hollman's Wooster teams won six games in each of his four seasons, giving him a 24-11-1 ledger at the Division III school.

Starting in 1988, his first season as head coach at Edinboro, the Fighting Scots ran off nine straight winning campaigns under Hollman.

The school record for wins in a season is nine, accomplished five times. Two of those seasons have come under Hollman's tutelage, first in 1990 and again in 1995.

Hollman joined the Edinboro athletic staff in

January of 1988 as the program's 11th head coach. He previously served three seasons as the defensive coordinator at Ohio University. The Fighting Scots posted a 5-4-1 ledger in his initial season, rallying for four wins and a tie in the final five games.

Edinboro enjoyed one of its finest seasons ever the following year, finishing 8-3 and ranked seventh in Division II in 1989. The Scots captured their first PSAC West crown since winning the PSAC in 1970, finishing with a perfect 6-0 in league play. The lone losses came to a pair of Division I-AA institutions - Liberty and Youngstown State - and a thrilling 45-32 setback at perennial Division II power North Dakota State in the Division II playoffs.

That contest marked Edinboro's first visit to NCAA postseason action, and also marked the Boro as one of the top Division II programs in the country.

Following the 1989 season, Hollman was honored as the top coach in the East Region by the American Football Coaches Association and was selected the PSAC West Coach of the Year.

Edinboro bettered the '89 campaign in 1990, going 9-3 and winning its first-ever NCAA playoff game. The Scots won at Virginia Union, 38-14, before suffering a 14-7 setback to PSAC West rival Indiana (Pa.) in the quarterfinals. Just three weeks earlier the Indians handed Edinboro a 36-29 defeat in a showdown for the PSAC West crown. Edinboro's only other loss in 1990 came to Youngstown State by four points.

Following a 7-4 record in 1991, Hollman's Scots finished as the PSAC West runner-up in 1992 and '93, but reached the NCAA playoffs both years. In 1992, the Scots recorded a 8-2-1 ledger, dropping a narrow 19-15 decision at Ferris State in the first round of postseason play. The '93 season featured a 8-3 finish and a season-ending 48-28 loss at New Haven in the first round of the playoffs.

With a 7-3 record in 1994, the Scots missed out on postseason action, but they returned in '95, thanks to a 9-2 record and a perfect 6-0 showing in the PSAC West. Following a 44-7 loss at Division I-AA power Appalachian State in the second game of the season, Edinboro ran off eight straight wins to attain a playoff berth. New Haven again halted the Scots' playoff hopes in the first round with a 27-12 win. Edinboro was ranked eighth in the final NCAA Division II poll. Hollman was honored as the PSAC West Coach of the Year for the second time in 1995.

The Scots went 6-4 in 1996, highlighted by a 48-35 victory over PSAC West champion Clarion. The Golden Eagles would go on to

PSAC honors have rolled in for the Scots under Hollman's tutelage. In his eleven seasons, Edinboro players have been honored as the Player of the Year or Rookie of the Year ten times.

Hollman is a 1968 graduate of Ohio Northern University, earning his Bachelor's Degree in Education. He was a three-year starter and

reach the national semifinals. Edinboro has won four games in each of the last two seasons, going 4-6 in 1997 and 4-7 in '98.

In addition to team success, Hollman has coached 55 All-Americans at Edinboro, including Elbert Cole and Ernest Priester. Both placed in the top three in the voting for the Harlon Hill Award, presented to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year. Cole was a finalist in 1989, with Priester in the top three the following season. Both players earned All-American recognition.

a two-way performer for the Polar Bears, starting at end on offense and defensive back on defense. He set the school record with 13 career interceptions, and was recognized as an All-American and All-District performer in 1966 and 1967. Hollman also lettered in baseball for three years.

Hollman's coaching career began in 1968 as an assistant coach at Sidney High School in Sidney, Ohio. After earning a Master's Degree in Education from Xavier University in 1971, he became head coach at Greenville High School in Ohio, posting an impressive 26-2-2 mark from 1971-73. Hollman then moved on to Fremont Ross High School in Ohio in 1974-75, where his teams were 15-3-2. Fremont Ross captured the 1974 Buckeye Conference championship with a 9-0-1 record.

In 1976, Hollman advanced to the college ranks, joining his alma mater, Ohio Northern, as the school's defensive coordinator. He was named the head coach at Wooster College the following year. Hollman snapped a stretch of three consecutive losing seasons for the Scots in his first campaign, going 6-3. It would be the first of four straight six-win seasons.

After four seasons in charge of the Wooster program, Hollman served as an assistant coach at Ball State University from 1981-84. He then moved on to Ohio University in 1985, serving as the defensive coordinator until taking over at Edinboro in 1988.

Hollman resides in Edinboro with his wife, Kandi. They have four children -- Mari, Jon, Tim and Denise.

# ASSISTANT COACHES

## SCOTT BROWNING

*Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line*



Scott Browning holds the longest tenure of anyone on the Edinboro University coaching staff. Browning is in his fifth season as the offensive coordinator and his 14th year overall.

Browning has coached a variety of positions at the Boro, including the offensive line for the last six years. He also coached the running backs and defensive backs in the past.

In his many capacities, Browning has coached several All-Americans such as Steve Russell, Michael Willis, Wade

Smith, Georj Lewis, Mike Barnes, Elbert Cole and Jeremy O'Day.


In addition to his extensive experience at Edinboro, Browning has served as an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for three years. The Buckeyes went to the Fiesta Bowl, the Rose Bowl and the Citrus Bowl in his three seasons. Browning served as the secondary coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. That outfit reached the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

## WAYNE BRADFORD

*Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Line*



Wayne Bradford is the newest member of the Edinboro coaching staff, joining the program in early August. Bradford previously was the defensive coordinator at Salisbury State University. In addition to serving as the defensive coordinator, Bradford will instruct the Fighting Scot defensive linemen.

A graduate of Salisbury State, Bradford began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the defensive linemen and linebackers. In 1994, he was promoted

to defensive coordinator. His defenses excelled during that period. A year ago, the Sea Gulls paced the Atlantic Central Football Conference in pass defense and quarterback sacks. In 1997, Salisbury State ranked 38th in NCAA Division II in total defense,

allowing just 268 yards per game. His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game.

Bradford graduated from Salisbury in 1990 with a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. He completed work on his Master's Degree in Business Administration from Salisbury State in 1992. Ohio State appeared in two bowl games during his stay. The Buckeyes played in the Citrus Bowl in 1995, then finished with the second-

ranked team in the country in '96 following a win over Arizona State in the Rose Bowl.

Prior to beginning work on his Master's Degree in Physical Education at Ohio State, Calhoun spent one season as an assistant coach and the strength and conditioning coach at Lakewood High School in Ohio. He also has served as an assistant coach at Westerville North High School in Ohio in 1993, and was a volunteer coach at Ohio State in 1994.

## JIM HENSON

*Running Backs*

Henson joined the Edinboro staff after serving as a mathematics teacher, football coach and athletic director at Grand Valley High School in Ohio for 22 years. At Grand Valley, he led the Mustangs to a

In the 1990's, Henson's charges posted three undefeated campaigns and a 23-game regular season winning streak. Henson was named the conference Coach of the Year several times, culminated by his selection as the Ohio Division V Coach of the Year in 1997.

Prior to beginning his stellar career at Grand Valley, Henson debuted as an assistant coach at Cardinal Middlefield (OH) High School, where he served for eight years.

Every player has goals when they step onto the football field. Some strive to score touchdowns, some aim to rack up a lot of yardage. Then there is Edinboro's 5'10" 238-pound starting fullback Chris Morgan.

"When I step onto the field my goal is to punish anybody in my way. If the opposite jersey crosses my path, I have to hit him. Once you step onto that field you have to turn into a demon," said Morgan.

Morgan, a star running back while at Duquesne High School where he ran for 2,839 yards his junior and senior years, has been clearing running holes for star tailbacks since leaving high school. Originally a prized recruit at Kent State, Morgan was a key element in the Flashes running game for two seasons. His freshman season was cut short when he injured his knee in the third game of the year. In that game against Akron, Morgan had gained 42 yards on eight carries before the injury.

After receiving a medical redshirt as a freshman, Morgan came back the next season to gain 89 yards on 21 carries and grab six catches for 45 yards while creating holes for the Flashes star running back Astron Whatley. Whatley averaged 144.5 yards per game with the help of Morgan's devastating blocks.

The trend of blocking for a star back continued when Morgan transferred to Edinboro. The Scots all-time leading rusher Gerald Thompson was able to rack up huge numbers, including a school-record 1,698 yards and 13 touchdowns last year, running through the holes Morgan helped create.

This season the senior fullback has been punishing the opposition with his demonic blocking and his punishing running style. In the Scots first three games Morgan has paved the way for many of junior tailback Bernard Henry's 229 rushing yards, including the 119 yard performance Henry put up against Mercyhurst last weekend.

"Once your tailback gets up around the 100-yard mark, that shows that not only are you doing your job as a fullback but the O-line is also doing the job and he is hitting the holes right," said Morgan.

Although Morgan excels as a blocking back, his game is not limited to blocking. "Chris has deceptive speed, he runs hard and has very good hands," said head coach Tom Hollman.

After working hard this summer on his conditioning and strength, Morgan has become a staple in the Scots offense. He has gained 61 yards on 13 carries and caught 1 pass for 15 yards.

In the Glenville State game, Morgan helped the Boro earn its first win of the year by gaining 24 yards on the ground, 15 yards in the air and scoring a touchdown in the first half. An achilles tendon injury forced Morgan to sit out the second half of the Scots' 29-20 win.

Evidence of the hard work Morgan put in this summer can be seen in his playing weight. After weighing nearly 270 pounds during the 1998 season, Morgan came into camp this year a trim, muscular 238 pounds. "Shedding those 30 pounds has helped my conditioning, I can run a lot more plays without getting tired and it has allowed me to get some plays in at the tailback position," admitted Morgan.

"I think Chris has made a real strong commitment to improve his cardiovascular endurance and physical strength," noted Hollman. The head coach has even rewarded the fullback by placing him in some one-back sets and getting him the ball more.

Last season Morgan tallied only 12 carries in ten games com-

pared to the 12 totes he has through three games this year. "We just thought we needed to improve our running situation, to do that we have to get the ball to our fullback," explained Hollman regarding the increased use of Morgan as a runner.

Morgan's teammates also noticed the hard work he put in over the summer and named him a team captain. "I took the initiative to stay up here this summer to work hard so I could finish my last season on a high note, but I wasn't alone. There were six of us up here and we all worked hard," Morgan said.

Hollman attributes Morgan's hard work and dedication to the senior's recognition that this is his final year. "Chris realized this is the last go-round. He wants to go out and put his best foot forward."

Morgan is the first person to agree with his coach. "I have been procrastinating the past few seasons. I used to say I have next season, I have the next season. Now I can't even say that. This is my last year to get it done."

Despite the individual success and recognition Morgan has received, he is quick to note that individual achievements are all secondary. "I have goals as far as yards and touchdowns, but those aren't important. The important thing is to stay healthy and get those W's," proclaimed Morgan, an Edinboro captain.

While Hollman surely shares the notion that health and wins are important, he picked out another aspect of Morgan's career that the star fullback can take pride in.

"Inside, Chris can be personally proud of the fine effort he has put forth. He has to be proud of his upcoming graduation, I know that is what his parents are most proud of."

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Unfortunately, Chris Morgan suffered a knee injury in last week's loss at Mercyhurst. He is expected to miss several week's action. This article was written prior to the game, and we felt Chris deserved this article. We wish Chris a speedy recovery.
