

showdown for first place with the Rockets, but a much-improved California(Pa.) outfit was able to outscore the Boro in a wild affair, 40-35, last week. That left the Scots at 3-5 overall and 2-2 in PSAC West play. Now they look to play the role of spoiler against a Slippery Rock club which has climbed to third in the NCAA Division II rankings after an opening-

game loss at Youngstown State. The Rockets have proceeded to run off seven straight wins to move to 7-1 and 4-0 in league play.

THE COACHES

Edinboro head coach Tom Hollman (Ohio Northern '68) is in his 12th season in charge of the Fighting Scots. With a 78-44-2 record at Edinboro. Hollman ranks as the school's career record holder for most wins. He also coached four seasons at Wooster. Hollman has an overall mark of 102-55-3, ranking 22nd among all active NCAA Division II coaches in winning percentage, and picking up win number 100 vs. Glenville State.

Dr. George Mihalik (Slippery Rock '74) is in 12th year at the helm of the Rockets. A former starting guarterback at SRU, Mihalik has guided the Rock to the elite of Division II. Slippery Rock has had just two losing seasons under Mihalik, coming in his first three years. Since 1997, SRU has posted a 30-5 ledger, going to the NCAA Playoffs the last two years. Mihalik has an overall mark of 83-42-4.

THE EDINBORO-SLIPPERY ROCK SERIES Slipperv Rock leads 40-20-7

The Rockets have won the last three meetings between the two schools, with two of those contests at N. Kerr Thompson Stadium. Prior to that, Edinboro had won the previous three outings.

Slippery Rock, PA -- Highly-ranked Slippery Rock limited Edinboro to 180 total vards and forced six turnovers. The Rockets, meanwhile, totalled 467 yards, including 303 yards on the ground.

Slippery Rock jumped to a 28-0 lead at the half, but the Boro cut the margin in a half with a pair of third guarter touchdowns. Edinboro's final three possessions ended with interceptions, howev-

In fact, a lot that might have do with that last ome game, a 30last-minute vicry over Clarion. likely no coincience that the sertion of Jack avis into the startg lineup at quarback has revitaled the Boro tack. The Scots ave scored 30, 38 nd 35 points in avis' three starts. he redshirt freshan plays with a orld of confience. He has mpleted 46 of 92 isses for 560 vards with 4 TDs and 5 INTs ... looking for more reasons for the offense's resurgence -- look no further than TE Rob

Barney and TB Stephane Lubin. Barney has emerged as Davis' favorite target, and at 6'4". 250 lbs., he is a load once he has the ball. The Central HS product has a team-leading 23 catches for 288 yards and 2 TDs. Over the last four games, however, he has hauled in 19 balls. Lubin, meanwhile, started at cornerback the first five games. He was moved to offense to give Bernard Henry a break, and has now become an amazing complement to the Boro's leading rusher. The diminutive (5'6") redshirt freshman comes off his first 100-yard game at Cal, carrying 18 times for 112 yards with 2 TDs. He also caught one pass for 40 vards, and returned 2 kickoffs for 93 yards, including an 81-yarder for six points. That's 245 all-purpose yards ... Henry struggled at Cal, gaining just 15 yards on 12 carries. But it's hard to fault the junior who has had five 100vard games. He leads the Scots with 809 yards on 176 carries, with 7 TDs ... the Boro defense was burned for 341 rushing yards by the Vulcans, dropping from the top spot in the PSAC against the rush to seventh. Senior LB Dan Caro continued his strong play with 14 tackles, giving him 65 for the year. That boosts his career total to 282 hits ... freshman SS Lou Mitchell had 18 stops last Saturday, a high for a Boro player in '99 ... DE Dave Smith, a redshirt freshman, posted another sack at Cal, giving him 7 for the vear

SCOUTING THE ROCKETS

You could call Slippery Rock dominant, with a capital D! The Rockets have won the PSAC West crown the last two years, and own a 30-game regular season winning streak against Division II competition. The Rockets have trailed at the half the last two weeks, but came on strong to make it 18 straight wins over PSAC West foes. SRU's lone loss is to Youngstown State, a top-ten team in Division I-AA ... after facing the country's leading rusher in Wesley Cates last week, the Boro will have to contend with SRU's Dorrian Glenn this week. The sophomore speedster is one half of the Rock's tailback tandem. He amassed 295 yards in last week's showdown against 19th-ranked Shippensburg, sprinting 85 yards for the winning score in a 27-21 victory. And he scored 4 TDs in all. All that despite not feeling well. Glenn has gained 429 vards the last two weeks, boosting his season total to 899 yards with 10 TDs ... the other back is Stan Kennedy, a junior who has 653 yards and 10 TDs after gaining 899 yards a year ago ... what makes the SRU offense special is Randy McKavish. The junior guarterback has won PSAC West Player of the Year honors his first two seasons, and recently became the Rock's all-time leading passer. His numbers aren't necessarily that noteworthy (240 yards and 5 TDs rushing, 72 of 145 passing for 1033 yards with 6 TDs and 4 INTs), but his intensity level and leadership gualities are ... among McKavish's targets is D.J. Flick, the PSAC West Rookie of the Year in '98. Flick has 11 catches for 271 yards, a gaudy 24.6 yard average, and averages 11.7 yards on 20 punt returns, with another TD ... the Boro swept the PSAC West awards a year ago, with Brian Polk capturing Defensive Player of the Year accolades. A 5'9" cornerback, he was a second team All-American a year ago ... in all, SRU returned five All-PSAC West first team performers on offense - three on the line -- and one on defense.

SLIPPERY ROCK HAS LOCAL FLAVOR

Credit much of Slipperv Rock's success to harvesting a bountiful crop in Erie County. The Rockets feature a number of former local standouts, some who are playing a key role presently, and others with bright futures. Senior CB Brian Polk, from Girard HS, was the PSAC West Defensive Player of the Year in 1998, and was a consensus preseason All-American. He has 40 tackles, 5 INTs and 6 passes broken up. Another defensive standout is senior Casey Vogt. A defensive end from Harbor Creek HS, Vogt has 33 tackles, including 6 sacks. He is the second member of the Vogt family to star at the Rock, following brother Chad, who guarterbacked the

Rockets in the mid-90's. Sophomore Nick Sargent of Fort LeBoeuf HS is the backup at free safety. On the offensive side, former Mercyhurst Prep standout Jaime Kaiser is a 6'4", 270 lb. junior who starts at left tackle. His backup is Jerry Baker, a junior from Corry HS. As for the future, Lincoln Bufalino, from nearby General McLane HS, is a reserve defensive back, as is East HS freshman Bryan Gore.



TOM HOLLMAN



Since taking over the Edinboro University football program in 1988, winning and Tom Hollman have become synonymous. Hollman ranks as the all-time winningest coach in Edinboro history. entering his 12th campaign with a 75-41-2 record. In addition to holding the career record for victories, Hollman's .644 winning percentage ranks second, bettered only by Denny Creehan (.658).

Hollman has guided the Edinboro program to nine winning seasons in his first eleven years, marred only by four-win seasons in each of the last two years. That includes five NCAA Division II playoff appearances, the first ever

for Edinboro. The Fighting Scots have also captured a pair of Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference titles, in 1989 and 1995, and have been consistently ranked in the national polls.

Including four seasons as the head coach at Wooster College, Hollman showcases a career record of 99-52-3. That is good enough to rank him 22nd among all active Division II head coaches in winning percentage at .653. Hollman's Wooster teams won six games in each of his four seasons, giving him a 24-11-1 ledger at the Division III school.

Starting in 1988, his first season as head coach at Edinboro, the Fighting Scots ran off nine straight winning campaigns under

Hollman. The school record for wins in a season is nine. accomplished five times. Two of those seasons have come under Hollman's tutelage, first in 1990 and again in 1995.

Hollman joined the Edinboro athletic staff in

January of 1988 as the program's 11th head coach. He previously served three seasons as the defensive coordinator at Ohio University. The Fighting Scots posted a 5-4-1 ledger in his initial season, rallying for four wins and a tie in the final five games.

Edinboro enjoyed one of its finest seasons ever the following year, finishing 8-3 and ranked seventh in Division II in 1989. The Scots captured their first PSAC West crown since winning the PSAC in 1970, finishing with a perfect 6-0 in league play. The lone losses came to a pair of Division I-AA institutions - Liberty and Youngstown State - and a thrilling 45-32 setback at perennial Division II power North Dakota State in the Division II playoffs.

That contest marked Edinboro's first visit to NCAA postseason action, and also marked the Boro as one of the top Division II programs in the country.

Following the 1989 season, Hollman was honored as the top coach in the East Region by the American Football Coaches Association and was selected the PSAC West Coach of the Year.

Edinboro bettered the '89 campaign in 1990, going 9-3 and winning its first-ever NCAA playoff game. The Scots won at Virginia Union, 38-14, before suffering a 14-7 setback to PSAC West rival Indiana (Pa.) in the guarterfinals. Just three weeks earlier the Indians handed Edinboro a 36-29 defeat in a showdown for the PSAC West crown. Edinboro's only other loss in 1990 came to Youngstown State by four points.

Following a 7-4 record in 1991, Hollman's Scots finished as the PSAC West runner-up in 1992 and '93, but reached the NCAA playoffs both years. In 1992, the Scots recorded a 8-2-1 ledger, dropping a narrow 19-15 decision at Ferris State in the first round of postseason play. The '93 season featured a 8-3 finish and a season-ending 48-28 loss at New Haven in the first round of the playoffs.

With a 7-3 record in 1994, the Scots missed out on postseason action. but they returned in '95, thanks to a 9-2 record and a perfect 6-0 showing in the PSAC West. Following a 44-7 loss at Division I-AA power Appalachian State in the second game of the season, Edinboro ran off eight straight wins to attain a playoff berth. New Haven again halted the Scots' playoff hopes in the first round with a 27-12 win. Edinboro was ranked eighth in the final NCAA Division II poll. Hollman was honored as the PSAC West Coach of the Year for the second time in 1995.

The Scots went 6-4 in 1996, highlighted by a 48-35 victory over PSAC West champion Clarion. The Golden Eagles would go on to

reach the national semifinals. Edinboro has won four games in each of the last two seasons, going 4-6 in 1997 and 4-7 in '98

In addition to team success, Hollman has coached 55 Americans at Edinboro. including Elbert Cole and Ernest Priester. Both placed in the top three in the voting for the Harlon Hill Award, presented to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year. Cole was a finalist in 1989, with Priester in the top three the following season. Both players earned All-American recognition.

PSAC honors have rolled in for the Scots under Hollman's tutelage. In his eleven seasons, Edinboro players have been honored as the Player of the Year or Rookie of the Year ten times.

Hollman is a 1968 graduate of Ohio Northern University, earning his Bachelor's Degree in Education. He was a three-year starter and

a two-way performer for the Polar Bears, starting at end on offense and defensive back on defense. He set the school record with 13 career interceptions, and was recognized as an All-American and All-District performer in 1966 and 1967. Hollman also lettered in baseball for three years.

Boro football

Hollman's coaching career began in 1968 as an assistant coach at Sidney High School in Sidney, Ohio. After earning a Master's Degree in Education from Xavier University in 1971, he became head coach at Greenville High School in Ohio, posting an impressive 26-2-2 mark from 1971-73. Hollman then moved on to Fremont Ross High School in Ohio in 1974-75, where his teams were 15-3-2. Fremont Ross captured the 1974 Buckeye Conference championship with a 9-0-1 record.

In 1976, Hollman advanced to the college ranks, joining his alma mater. Ohio Northern, as the school's defensive coordinator. He was named the head coach at Wooster College the following year. Hollman snapped a stretch of three consecutive losing seasons for the Scots in his first campaign, going 6-3. It would be the first of four straight six-win seasons.

After four seasons in charge of the Wooster program, Hollman served as an assistant coach at Ball State University from 1981-84. He then moved on to Ohio University in 1985, serving as the defensive coordinator until taking over at Edinboro in 1988.

Hollman resides in Edinboro with his wife. Kandi. They have four children -- Mari, Jon, Tim and Denise.

ASSISTANT COACHES

SCOTT BROWNING

Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line



Scott Browning holds the longest tenure of anyone on the Edinboro University coaching staff. Browning is in his fifth season as the offensive coordinator and his 14th year overall.

Browning has coached a variety of positions at the Boro, including the offensive line for the last six years. He also coached the running backs and defensive backs in the past.

In his many capacities, Browning has coached several All-Americans such as Steve Russell, Michael Willis, Wade

Smith, Georj Lewis, Mike Barnes, Elbert Cole and Jeremy O'Day.

In addition to his extensive experience at Edinboro, Browning has served as an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for three years. The Buckeyes went to the Fiesta Bowl, the Rose Bowl and the Citrus Bowl in his three seasons. Browning served as the secondary coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. That outfit reached the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

A 1981 graduate of Ohio State with a Bachelor's Degree in Education, Browning began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Worthington High School and Dayton-Fairview High School in Ohio from 1979-81. Before transferring to Ohio State, he attended Capital University, where he played football for one season. Browning later earned a Master's Degree in Education Administration from New Mexico State in 1983.

Browning and his wife, Lynn, reside in Edinboro and have two children, Andrew, 5, and Kaitlyn, one year old.

WAYNE BRADFORD

Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Line



Wayne Bradford is the newest member of the Edinboro coaching staff, joining the program in early August. Bradford previously was the defensive coordinator at Salisbury State University. In addition to serving as the defensive coordinator, Bradford will instruct the Fighting Scot defensive linemen.

A graduate of Salisbury State, Bradford began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the defensive linemen and linebackers. In 1994, he was promot-

ed to defensive coordinator. His defenses excelled during that period. A year ago, the Sea Gulls paced the Atlantic Central Football Conference in pass defense and quarterback sacks. In 1997, Salisbury State ranked 38th in NCAA Division II in total defense, allowing just 268 yards per game. His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game

Bradford graduated from Salisbury in 1990 with a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. He completed work on his Master's Degree in Business Administration from Salisbury State in 1992. In addition to working as a member of the football staff, Bradford was a faculty member in the School of Business. Since 1996, he has been the Director of the Business Graduate Programs for the Perdue School of Business at Salisbury State.

As an undergraduate, Bradford was an offensive lineman, he played on the 1986 Salisbury State team which finished as the NCAA Division III national runnerup.

Bradford and his wife, Gwen, have one son, Nicholas, one-anda-half reside in Edinboro.

DUSTIN CALHOUN

Linebackers



Dustin Calhoun enters his third season as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff. After directing the secondary for two seasons, Calhoun will serve as the linebacker coach in 1999.

Calhoun joined the Fighting Scots' staff after serving as a graduate assistant coach at Ohio State for two years. While with the Buckeyes he worked primarily with the secondary. Ohio State appeared in two bowl games during his stay. The Buckeyes played in the Citrus Bowl in 1995, then finished with the second-

ranked team in the country in '96 following a win over Arizona State in the Rose Bowl.

Prior to beginning work on his Master's Degree in Physical Education at Ohio State, Calhoun spent one season as an assistant coach and the strength and conditioning coach at Lakewood High School in Ohio. He also has served as an assistant coach at Westerville North High School in Ohio in 1993, and was a volunteer coach at Ohio State in 1994.

Calhoun earned his Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from Otterbein College in 1993, where he played baseball and football. He and his wife. Wendi, reside in Edinboro with their ninemonth-old son, Parker.

JIM HENSON Running Backs



Jim Henson is another one of the Fighting Scot assistant coaches who will have new responsibilities in 1999. After guiding the defensive line a year ago, Henson enters his second year on the Edinboro staff in charge of the running backs.

Henson joined the Edinboro staff after serving as a mathematics teacher, football coach and athletic director at Grand Valley High School in Ohio for 22 years. At Grand Valley, he led the Mustangs to a 150-68-4 record, including five Grand River Conference championships, three East Suburban Conference titles, and three state playoff appearances. In the 1990's, Henson's charges posted three undefeated campaigns and a 23-game regular season winning streak. Henson was named the conference Coach of the Year several times, culminated by his selection as the Ohio Division V Coach of the Year in 1997.

Prior to beginning his stellar career at Grand Valley, Henson debuted as an assistant coach at Cardinal Middlefield (OH) High School, where he served for eight years.

Henson graduated from Hiram College in 1968 with a Bachelor's Degree in Arts & Mathematics, then later completed work on his Master's Degree in Mathematics Education from Youngstown State University in 1972. He and his wife, Evelyn, reside in Orwell, Ohio. They are the parents of a son, Jim, and daughter, Jennifer.

MARIO HOUSTON

Defensive Backs



1999 Fighting Scot Football

After a stellar career at Edinboro, Mario Houston joined the Fighting Scots' coaching staff three years ago. He coached the wide receivers his first two seasons, but the East Cleveland, OH native now returns to familiar surroundings as the defensive backs coach.

As a defensive back for the Scots. Houston earned PSAC Rookie of the Year accolades in 1990 after leading the team with five interceptions. That total ranks 11th all-time for season interceptions. He was a two-time All-PSAC selection and

concluded his career with school records for passes broken up (53). He also holds the season record for pass deflections with 16 in 1990. In addition, Houston racked up 269 career tackles, racking among the top twenty all-time tacklers.

Houston was also a standout in the classroom, earning Scholar-Athlete recognition three times. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in Accounting in 1996. The father of a five-year-old son, DeAndre, Houston resides in Edinboro.

BRIAN DECKER

Wide Receivers



Brian Decker begins his first season as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff. Decker is hardly a stranger to the Fighting Scot program, however. He enjoyed an outstanding career as a safety for the Scots, including earning PSAC West Defensive Player of the Year honors in 1997. Decker makes his coaching debut on the other side of the football, tutoring the receivers.

A native of Portville, NY, Decker played for coach Tom Hollman from 1995-97. He

was a first team All-PSAC West selection as a junior and senior, finishing as the team's second-leading tackler both years. In addition to his conference awards, Decker was named to the CoSIDA All-American team in '96, and was a Football Gazette third team All-American that same year. He finished his career with 11 interceptions, tied for seventh on the all-time list.

Boro Football

Decker also excelled at track, earning All-American honors in 1996 when he high-jumped 7", good for seventh place at the NCAA Division II Nationals.

Decker graduated from Edinboro in December 1997 with a Bachelor's Degree in History. He resides in Edinboro.

MARK HOOVER

Tight Ends



Mark Hoover is in his first season as a member of the Fighting Scot staff. He is working with the tight ends.

Hoover served as the offensive/defensive line coach at nearby General McLane High School a year ago. He helped the Lancers finish with a 10-1 record and capture the Erie County League title. General McLane advanced to the District 10 championship game.

Prior to coaching at General McLane, Hoover began his coaching career as a student assistant at James A. Garfield

(OH) High School.

A native of Sugar Grove, PA, Hoover received his Bachelor's Degree in Communications in 1996. He is currently pursuing his teacher's certification in Elementary education at edinboro.




SPIRIT OF THE SCOTS

describe the Edinboro secondary prior to the 1999 season. After all, the Scots had three true freshmen penciled in as starters with the lone upperclassmen being junior cornerback D.K. McDonald.

McDonald, a three-year starter for the Boro, has played with a host of celebrated Edinboro players including former All-American Brian Decker, who is currently in his first season as the Scots' wide receiver coach. This experience has provided the

secondary with crucial leadership both on and off the field.

McDonald takes his role as a leader seriously, trying to teach his young teammates how to prepare on the practice field and in film sessions

"I try to lead by example, by going hard in every practice and showing the other guys the mentality it takes to play and be successful at this level. I was lucky enough to have people like coach Decker take me under his wing when I was a freshman. I can look back and see how much that helped me, and I want to continue the tradition," offered McDonald.

McDonald often takes charge on the field, lining up against the opponents' top receivers to go one on one.

"The coaching staff has confidence in me and know that they can put me on the other teams top man," asserted McDonald. "That allows the rest of the team to go out and play 10 on 10 ball. If I don't perform, then it effects our whole defensive scheme."

Edinboro's defensive coordinator Wayne Bradford echoed the thought: "D.K. is our top cover man. He has been playing more consistently each week which has helped solidify our defense."

There is another aspect to McDonald that makes his leadership off the field perhaps even more important than his on-field accolades. A licensed Baptist minister, McDonald has brought to the team spiritual leadership as well.

"My faith helps keep me on an even keel and grounded. I think my teammates see that. I know they have accepted me for who I am - they know my beliefs are strong and they respect that," he assessed.

"There are times when different guys will come to me and we will have private discussions about faith and accepting responsibility. We talk about how faith can make you strong and that there is a better life out there for all of us."

Though raised in the church, McDonald did not always live his life with God. Until his sophomore year in high school, McDonald admits to living a bit of a crazy lifestyle until unhappiness drove him to re-evaluate his life.

One of the inspirational figures that helped McDonald's change was his older brother, Andre. From the time they used to go one on one in their backyard growing up, Andre always gave his younger brother an image to live up to. Andre continued to lead by example, your life will be blessed." as a standout defensive back at the Virginia Military Institute.

"Andre has always succeeded in everything," commented his younger brother. "His example showed me how much discipline it took to play ball on the next level. Watching him play football at VMI inspired me to go on and play college ball.

McDonald's parents have also played a key role in keeping the Scots' top coverman striving towards his goals.

"They've been at all but two games I've ever played. I look up in the stands and find where they are sitting. It makes me feel good to know they are there supporting me. Once I see them I can relax and just play my game."

Young. That was the word used to McDonald's faith extends even as far as the number seven on his jersev

> "Seven is God's perfect number of completion. I've worn number seven since my sophomore year in high school as a symbol to myself to continue working to be the most complete football player and human being I can be.

> In pursuit of that goal, McDonald acknowledges some of the people who have been influential in his development at the Boro. Dave Higham, a former Fighting Scot as an offensive lineman, now serving as the Administrative Coordinator to the Athletic Director for Edinboro is one such person.

> "Dave is a great man. He is a strong Christian man with firm values. Also, as a former football player he reminds me of the great tradition of Edinboro football."

> Higham and McDonald work closely together with the University's Fellowship of Christian Athletes chapter where McDonald has served as president for the past two years.

> Another who has received McDonald's praise is the Scots' current defensive back coach Mario Houston.

> "When I first got here, coach Rio was the receiving coach, but we all knew he had been a great d-back at the Boro. I used to watch film on him and try to pick up his technique. He knows things that you won't find in textbook football.

> "Now to be playing for him is great. Being an alumni coach, he brings a lot of pride and dedication to the program everyday. He's fired up just for practice - to say nothing of game days. I really put pressure on myself as I try to live up to the standards he set as a player and now as my coach."

> Looking forward to the future, McDonald is excited, and a bit apprehensive.

> "I hope I get a shot to play ball somewhere down the road. I am working towards that, but right now we have to finish this season strong. There are still some personal goals I'd like to accomplish in the next year and a half. I am a little intimidated by what lies beyond next year, but my faith will lead me down the path that's right for me."

McDonald's faith truly dictates the person he is becoming. By example, he hopes to show others that he is all that he claims to be; he truly lives the life of God. The Scots' 'Minister of Defense' has one final message he would pass along to the Edinboro Family:

There is a better life out there, and if you have the strength and faith to follow the better path, then
