

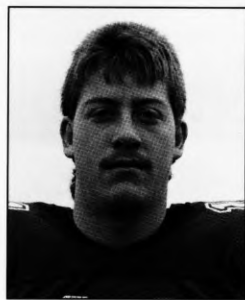

# IN MEMORY OF HAL GALUPI



The Edinboro University football family suffered a loss on August 8, 2000 when Hal Galupi passed away on Tuesday, August 8. The 32-year-old Galupi was a member of the Fighting Scot football team from 1987-90.

A native of Baden, PA, Galupi led Edinboro in passing his final three seasons, and still ranks among the leading passers ever at Edinboro. He ranks second in career passing yards (5,650), career attempts (706) and completions (372), and in career touchdown passes (50).

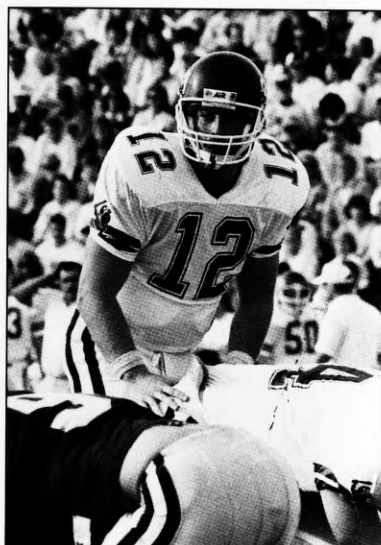
Galupi led the Fighting Scots to the NCAA Division II Playoffs in his final two seasons. Under head coach Tom Hollman, Edinboro went 8-3 in 1989, dropping an exciting 45-32 contest at North Dakota State in the first round of the playoffs.

Galupi completed 122 of 224 passes for 1,911 yards with 22 TDs, the second-highest season total, and 14 INTs. He then guided Edinboro into the second round of the Division II playoffs as a senior. The Fighting Scots posted a 9-3 ledger, tying the record for most wins in a season, with Galupi throwing for 2,097 yards, the second-highest season total. He completed 130 of 253 passes with 17 TDs and 20 INTs.

Galupi holds two of the top five single-game passing records, both coming in 1990. He threw for 351 yards, the second-highest total, in a 36-29 loss to Indiana(Pa.). His 299 yards passing against California(Pa.) represents the fifth-highest game total.

While playing with some of the finest players to ever don the red and white, such as Elbert Cole and Ernest Priester, Galupi earned *Football Gazette* honorable mention All-American honors as a junior. In addition, he was accorded second team All-PSAC West honors that same year.

An avid sportsman, Galupi was a 1986 graduate of Ambridge High School. The son of Harold and Joan Galupi, he was part-owner of All-State Development in Munhall, Pa.

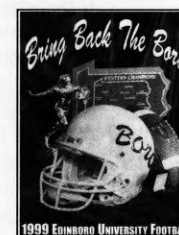

broadcasting experience for Edinboro students, along with quality broadcasts of Fighting Scot athletics.

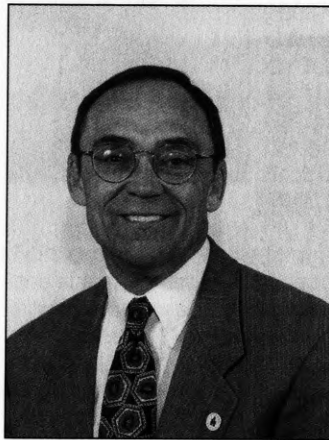

## LOU TEPPER



Veteran Division I mentor Lou Tepper was appointed the 12th head football coach at Edinboro University in late December, officially taking charge of the Fighting Scot program on January 5.

Tepper inherits an Edinboro program which has won just eleven games over the last three seasons, including a 3-8 finish this past year. That marked the fewest wins since the 1987 campaign, and the three consecutive losing seasons were the first since 1977-79.

### BACKGROUND

Tepper, a native of Keystone, PA, returns to the Division II level after coaching at Division I institutions for almost thirty years. He is renowned as a defensive coaching genius, with a resume that includes three Butkus Award honorees and an Outland Trophy winner. Tepper's list of defensive standouts include Bruce Smith, John Holecek, Simeon Rice, Kevin Hardy, Henry Jones and Joel Steed, all current NFL standouts. In addition, he has worked with some of the top head coaches in the country, including Bill Dooley at Virginia Tech, Bill McCartney at

Colorado, John Mackovic at Illinois and Gerry DiNardo at LSU. "Being a native of western Pennsylvania, it will be neat to be a head coach again and to be a head coach in that environment," Tepper related.

"I've recruited western Pennsylvania for half of my career. It's a joy to be back home."

Tepper completed his second full season as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana State University last year. He began his tenure with the Tigers on December 15, 1997, helping LSU to a 27-9 Independence Bowl win over Notre Dame. All told, he has served as a defensive coordinator for 18 of his 32 years in the coaching profession.

### BIG TEN HEAD COACH

The 54-year-old Tepper was appointed the head coach at the University of Illinois on December 13, 1991, just prior to the team's appearance in the John Hancock Sun Bowl. He replaced Mackovic, who left for the head coaching position at the University of Texas. During his five year stint as the Fighting Illini head coach, Tepper compiled a record of 25-31-2, including two more bowl appearances. He guided Illinois to a pair of wins over Ohio State, includ-

ing one at Columbus; the school's first victory in Ann Arbor against Michigan in 27 years; and three consecutive wins over rival Iowa by a combined score of 122-17. Just as impressive, Tepper graduated 91 percent of his seniors.

Tepper joined the Illinois program in 1988, serving as the defensive coordinator for four seasons and assistant head coach for two years. In his nine seasons at Illinois, he helped the program to six bowl invitations, one Big Ten title and top ten rankings in the AP and UPI polls.

He was honored as the Big Ten's top defensive assistant coach in 1990 by *The Sporting News*. His defensive units annually ranked among the best in the country, finishing 10th in 1989, 14th in 1993, ninth in 1994, and 21st in 1995.

Tepper's 1992 Illini squad finished 6-5-1, suffering a 27-17 defeat to Hawaii in the Holiday Bowl. Illinois went in to Columbus and upset Ohio State, 18-16, and posted a 22-22 tie against Michigan in Ann Arbor.

While his '93 edition finished 5-6, that included a 24-21 win in Ann Arbor against the Wolverines. The Illini made it back to post-season play in 1994, handing East Carolina a 30-0 whitewashing in the Liberty Bowl. The '94 squad finished 7-5, again upsetting one of the elite in the Big Ten. And once again it was on the road, as Illinois shocked Ohio State, 24-10, in Columbus behind Butkus Award winner Dana Howard.

### LINEBACKERS

While Penn State has gained the reputation as "Linebacker U", Illinois could make a good case for that designation as well during Tepper's tenure. He produced

consecutive Butkus Award winners in Dana Howard (1994) and Kevin Hardy (1995). Along the way, he also produced Big Ten Defensive Players of the Year in Moe Gardner and Darrick Brownlow (1990), Howard (1993 and '94) and Big Ten Defensive Lineman of the Year Simeon Rice in 1994. For the only time in Big Ten history, Tepper had four first team All-Big Ten linebackers at his disposal. In all, he has coached over 25 professional linebackers, and recently wrote the book, "Complete Linebacking", a 312-page comprehensive book on linebacker play.

Hardy and Rice became the highest defensive draft duo in the history of the NFL draft in 1996 when Hardy went second to Jacksonville and Rice third to Arizona. That stood until this past April when Penn State's Courtney Brown and Lavar Arrington went one-two.

### PITTSBURGH

Tepper began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pittsburgh in 1967, then moved on to the

University of New Hampshire from 1968-71, coaching the running backs and linebackers before becoming the defensive coordinator. His next stop was the College of William & Mary, where he joined former New Hampshire head coach Jim Root as the defensive coordinator from 1972-77. The 1976 William & Mary squad posted the school's best record in thirty years. He was the assistant head coach his final year at William & Mary.

### VIRGINIA TECH

In 1978, Virginia Tech head coach Bill Dooley hired Tepper as his linebackers coach. Tepper helped build the Hokies into a consistent bowl contender with a defense that annually ranked among the nation's top ten. He stayed at Virginia Tech from 1978-82, working with Outland Trophy winner and Buffalo Bills great Bruce Smith, among others. The 1980 Hokie edition played in the Peach Bowl.

### COLORADO

Tepper joined Bill McCartney's staff at Colorado in 1983, serving as the defensive coordinator and assistant head coach until departing for Illinois in 1988. Tepper helped turn around a Buffalo defense which ranked No. 100 nationally in yards allowed prior to his arrival, to one which was as high as 11th in Division I in total defense. He earned the title of assistant head coach to McCartney his final two seasons, and helped the Buffaloes to the 1985 Freedom Bowl and the 1986 Blue Bonnet Bowl. Among the assistant coaches at Colorado was Gerry DiNardo, who would later bring Tepper in to direct his LSU defense.

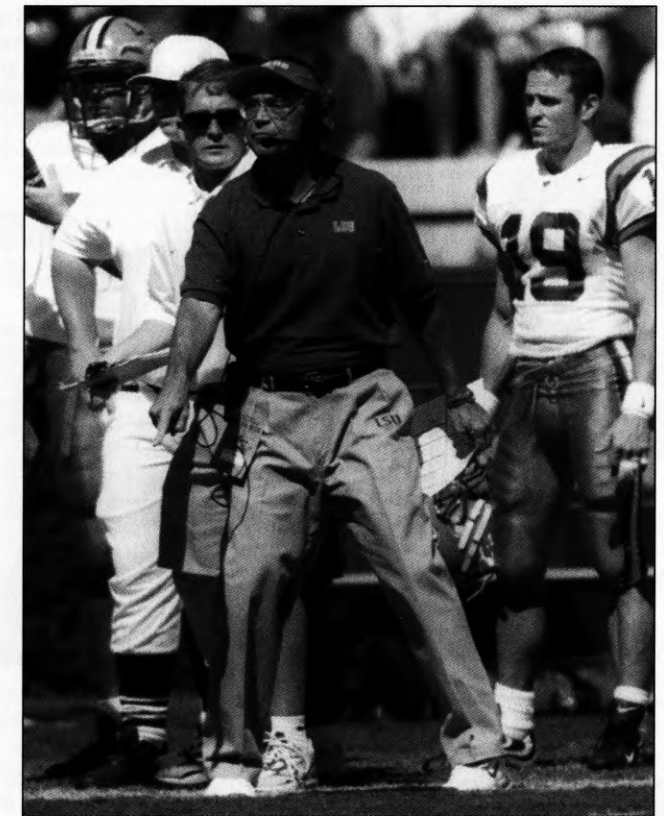
### PERSONAL BACKGROUND

Tepper, born September 7, 1945, graduated from Rutgers University in 1967. He enjoyed a standout career as a defensive back at Rutgers from 1965-67. As a player, Tepper led the Scarlet Knights in interceptions as a junior and tackles as a senior. He won the George Cronin Trophy as the Most Improved Player in 1965.

Tepper is an active member of the American Football Coaches Association and has served on the NCAA Ethics Committee. He is active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and has spoken for Promise-Keepers, founded by former Colorado coach Bill McCartney. Tepper and his wife, Karen, have two children, Matthew, an assistant on the Edinboro staff, and Stacy.

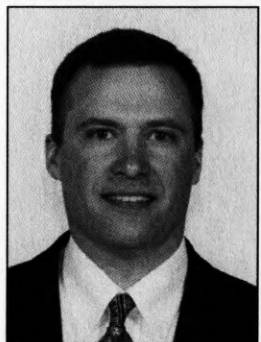
Lou Tepper on the sidelines as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana State.

## JEFF VORIS Offensive Coordinator



Jeff Voris joins the Edinboro staff after serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at DePauw University the last four years. He will serve as Edinboro's offensive coordinator, in addition to working with the quarterbacks.

In all, the native of Aurora, Ill. spent six seasons working with DePauw, the first two as the offensive line coach. During his tenure in charge of the DePauw offense, the Tigers went 29-11, twice finishing in the top eight in NCAA Division III in turnover-takeaway margin. He coached a two-time all conference quarterback and a second team all conference signalcaller. In Voris' first season as offensive coordinator, the Tigers ranked eighth in Division III in passing offense and led the Indiana Collegiate Athletic Conference in passing and scoring offense.

Prior to joining the DePauw staff, Voris was a graduate assistant coach under John Mackovic at Illinois from 1990-92 and Texas from 1992-94. He worked with the Fighting Illini defensive backs and linebackers, and was an aide with the Longhorn wide receivers and offensive line.

A 1989 graduate of DePauw, Voris was a four-year starter at quarterback, setting several records which still stand. Those include career marks for passing yardage (6,035 yards),

touchdown passes (56), pass attempts (910) and completions (504). His career average of 215.5 passing yards per game still ranks among the top 25 in Division III, and his 38 completions in a 1987 win over Findlay is among the most in a Division III contest.

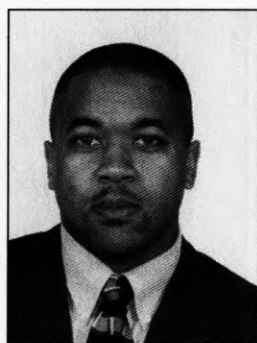

## ROD BOYKIN Defensive Coordinator



Rod Boykin assumed the duties of defensive coordinator and secondary coach this past spring after previously serving as an assistant coach at Wittenberg University the last two years.

Boykin played collegiately at the University of Illinois under Lou Tepper. A four-year letterwinner at Illinois, Boykin was twice named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week as a defensive back, and was named the Fighting Illini Defensive Champion of the Year. He played in a total of 44 games for the Illini, playing in three bowl games. The Dayton, OH native enjoyed his best season as a senior, recording 25 tackles with 2 passes broken up. As a junior, he had 21 stops, along with a fumble recovery in the end zone for a touchdown against Arizona.

Boykin graduated in 1995 with a Bachelor's Degree in Kinesiology and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Tepper that same year. He worked with the Fighting Illini from 1995-97, picking up a Master's Degree in Higher Education and Administration.

Boykin joined the Wittenberg staff in 1997 as the defensive backs coach. He helped the Tigers post back-to-back 11-1 finishes, winning the North Coast Athletic Conference championship both seasons and reaching the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs. Boykin served on the Wittenberg

staff for three seasons. The Tigers went 31-3 during that period, and in 1998 was the number one rated pass defense in the country.

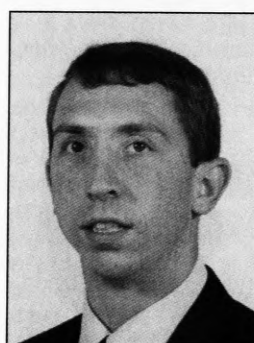

# A CONVERSATION WITH LOU TEPPER



## What attracted you to Edinboro?

"I was attracted to Edinboro because I love to coach young men who are serious about the game and use football as a tool to influence them toward positive academic, athletic and social behavior. Edinboro was attractive because of the leadership of the administration, particularly that of Dr. Frank Pogue and Bruce Baumgartner. Edinboro has a location and setting that can attract quality student-athletes. Karen and I are

both familiar with this area and the PSAC. We love smaller communities yet Erie provides many attractions plus we have entrée to three metropolitan areas in close proximity."

## Has it been difficult for you to adjust to Division II football?

"My biggest challenge has been to create a Division I mindset in a Division II setting. Sometimes people lack vision because certain things have been the way they are for so long. It's been really fun to see players, co-workers and this community expand their horizons to do things with greater expectations. It's been a real joy to see so many react positively to this challenge. I have found it very enjoyable and at times down right thrilling."

## What can people look for in a Lou Tepper coached team?

"I think the greatest compliment for a football team is that they are fundamentally sound, execute and play with enthusiasm."

## What type of player are you looking for?

"In our evaluation system, we first look for character. A young man with character is dependable and a team-builder. He will get the most from his talent and bring out the best in his teammates."

## Your staff is a mix of coaches familiar with you and coaches familiar with Edinboro. Was that by design?

"I learned in my first head coaching experience that hiring a staff was perhaps the single most important issue for future success. As a rookie head coach I wanted to run out and quickly hire staff so that we could recruit in a hurry. I made some mistakes and staff mistakes stay with you for a long time.

I wanted coaches who were good people, cared for young men, were willing to work hard and had a strong measure of organization. Half of this staff was with me previously and there were no doubts about these qualities with them. I did not have a notion one way or another about the coaches who were here previously. Another advantage of taking my time, however, was that I got to know the coaches here well and experience first-hand the qualities mentioned earlier. I

was very impressed with those I chose to retain. The administration put no pressure on me to hire them. They sold themselves and brought with them real loyalty to Edinboro."

## Edinboro has suffered three straight losing seasons. How long do you expect to take to turn the program around?

"It's really hard for me to gauge where we are. I don't know how our talent stacks up with the rest of the league, so we must work diligently on the fundamentals, techniques and our schemes. We will all know at the end of the season just how far we've progressed. I think at that time we'll be able to fairly assess our chances to be a conference challenger."

## You're known as a defensive specialist. Do you feel you can install most of your defensive principles this year?

"Surprisingly, this group of young men has learned our scheme much quicker than most have in the past. Obviously, the whole scheme will not be taught in fall camp, but we will be able to add it as the season progresses. I believe that enough will be put in during the first year that we can be effective if we are fundamentally sound and play with enthusiasm."

## From an offensive standpoint how would you characterize your goals?

"The offense that Jeff Voris and his staff have brought to us is broad and can accommodate various personnel strengths. Our challenge is to identify those strengths and attempt to emphasize the things our players naturally do best. Eventually, we would like to have true balance between our running and passing game. Because of the many new faces in our offense this fall, the personality of our offense could change radically during the course of the camp.

We always want to be a high-scoring offense that protects the ball and recognizes the significance of field position."

## What can you tell us about the PSAC?

"The PSAC is one of the most challenging leagues in America. Its beauty comes from the tremendous rivalries that are generated because it is all within the state of Pennsylvania. The tremendous high school football surrounding us gives the league quality players. The football staffs are proven coaches and each week is a strategic as well as physical battle."

## You place a great deal of emphasis on special teams. Please explain.

"Generally, the special teams will play in about 15 percent of the total snaps yet account for over half the yardage in a game. Few fans recognize the impact of special teams and many players don't buy into its significance.

Unlike offensive and defensive plays, special teams "drives" only last one play. "The concentration and intensity required for a "one play and out" setting with so much yardage at stake, is not duplicated anywhere else in sports."

## First-Year Mentor Tepper Hopes Tough and Classy Equals Victories

The Edinboro University football team will have a fresh look when it debuts this fall. The Lou Tepper Era officially begins on September 2 when the Fighting Scots host Ashland. The Edinboro administration is banking on Tepper, a long-time coach on the Division I level, being the tonic needed to inject life into a program which suffered through its third straight losing season. The last time that happened at Edinboro was in 1981.

Fighting Scot fans would love a repeat of history. Following that 1981 campaign, Edinboro won 25 games over the next three seasons. Tepper would certainly take that kind of success, but he is quick to point out that the 2000 season will feature more than just a bit of the unknown. "I don't know what we're going to be like," Tepper noted, "I really don't know. I'm excited about our attitude. I think we will play hard and play with class. We will find out

Just 13 starters and 30 letterwinners return

from last

year's 3-8 squad, and the spring didn't necessarily afford Tepper and his staff the chance to get a good feel for what awaits in the fall. "We only had 55 players in the spring," Tepper related. "By way of example, we had seven offensive linemen, of whom only five were on scholarship. We held our breath about the offensive line depth. But that group is close-knit and it will be a strength if healthy. We need to learn more about each other and see how the newcomers impact our depth and style of play."

Tepper appears a perfect fit for what ails the Fighting Scots - defense. The former Illinois head coach is renowned as a defensive strategist, and after giving up a school-record 347 points, Edinboro could stand for some improved play on the defensive side of the ball. Any concerns about the Scot defenders picking up his schemes were quickly defused in the spring.

"Defensively, the players mastered the scheme as well as any first spring I've been a part of," exclaimed Tepper. "We want to be sound in taking on blockers, pursuit, tackling and coverage. If we can master those four fundamentals, we can be successful."

Making matters worse for Tepper is an 11-game schedule which features seven teams with .500 or better records. It all gets underway with a battle against a 7-3 Ashland squad which figures as one of the best in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Then comes a contest at NCAA Division I-AA national runner-up Youngstown State (12-3) in week number two, followed by a rematch against local rival Mercyhurst in the third week. Edinboro then opens PSAC West action against Slippery Rock (10-2), an NCAA Division II playoff team, and later faces another post-season outfit in Indiana(Pa.) (9-4). The Fighting Scots must also travel to West Chester to face a 7-3 Golden Ram edition which will likely be one of the favorites to win the Eastern Division. All told, Edinboro's 2000 opponents finished 72-52.

"I think our schedule is very demanding," Tepper understated. "I wish we were starting with squads less talented than Ashland, Youngstown State and Mercyhurst. The PSAC Western Conference is a real challenge, particularly with the traditional bullies, Slippery Rock and IUP. We have our hands full. But right now, we have to focus on improving, and not so much our opponents."

Having coached at the likes of Illinois, LSU, Colorado and Virginia Tech, Edinboro's new coach has a propensity for winning. He also has a reputation for discipline, but yet a gentlemanly manner. It's no wonder that the Fighting Scot theme for this season is "Tough and Classy".

## SPECIAL TEAMS

Tepper places a great deal of emphasis on special teams play, and he employs some unique terminology when discussing the subject. "Special teams make up about 15 percent of the snaps, and over 50 percent of the yardage," he explained. "The queen bees are the kickers and return men. But the worker bees make the difference. They do the grunt work and don't get the recognition. We need more worker bees."

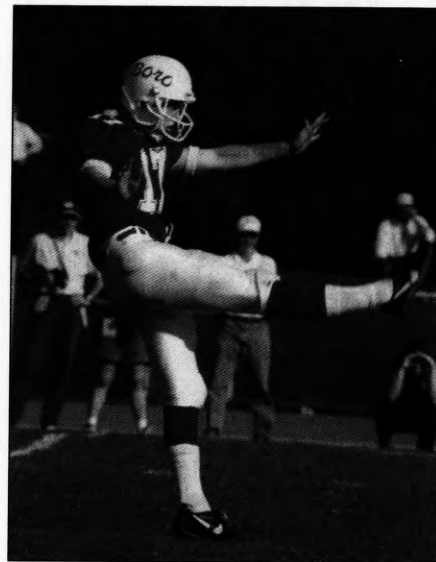
In Stephane Lubin, Edinboro has one of the finest queen bees the PSAC has to offer. The 5'6" sophomore was a first team All-PSAC West choice as a return specialist after averaging 26.3 yards on 24 returns, including an 81-yarder for a touchdown. Tepper would like to see Lubin assume the punt return chores, as well. Junior Josh Geis is another candidate to return punts, while Edinboro native Lincoln Bufalino, a transfer from Slippery Rock, could prove a factor on both return units.

Sean McNicholas turned in some impressive numbers while doubling as both the punter and placekicker as a freshman, ranking nationally in both categories. He averaged 40.2 yards per punt to earn a spot on the PSAC West second team, and made good on 11 of 19 field goals and 23 of 25 extra points. Seven of McNicholas' eight misses on field goals came from outside of forty yards, and he made good on three-pointers of 47 and 49 yards.

While not gaining much notoriety, David Holton sets a fine example for the worker bees. The sophomore linebacker is an exceptional long snapper, and blocked four kicks last year.

## OFFENSE

The Edinboro offense ranked in the bottom half of the PSAC in

virtually every statistical category, including 12th out of 14 teams in scoring offense and ninth in total offense. Maybe most alarming, the Fighting Scots finished 12th in turnover margin.

Tepper's eventual offensive strategy is a balanced attack, but that may be more of a long range than short term goal. Five starters return, but just two regulars return on the offensive line. And while Tepper would like to see the ball in the air more, a bevy of talented running backs suggest the Scots may be more ground-oriented in his early reign. Once again, the development of the offensive line, plus the situation at quarterback, will have a major bearing on a unit which averaged just 20.2 points and 303.5 yards while turning over the pigskin 26 times.

**QUARTERBACK:** Sophomore Jack Davis is a strong contender after starting the final six games. The 6'3", 222 lb. signalcaller completed 89 of 178 tosses for 1,068 yards with 8 TDs and 9 INTs. Like any redshirt freshman, Davis had both his ups (15 of 22 for 219 yards vs. Slippery Rock) and downs (9 of 31 for 87 yards vs. IUP).

Ed Nelson, a 6'4", 220 lb. sophomore, saw action in one contest last season.

An intriguing possibility is Steve Tryon, a transfer from Robert Morris. A 6'2", 210 lb. junior, Tryon appeared in six games for the Colonials, completing 37 of 64 passes for 691 yards with 6 TDs and just one pickoff. He came off the bench to throw the winning touchdown pass with no time left against Wagner.

**RUNNING BACKS:** Tepper admits that the strongest position on the team is at tailback, although it is possible several players could change positions to get the best athletes on the field. For starters, senior Bernard Henry returns after gaining 1,046 yards on 220 carries with 8 TDs. He also finished third in receiving with 16 catches for 159 yards and 2 TDs. The former transfer from Vermilion Junior College has dropped 15 lbs. and now weighs in at 195 lbs. Henry had six 100-yard efforts, including a season-high 165 yards against Indiana(Pa.), the top rushing defense in the conference. He was a first team All-PSAC West choice.

A year ago, Henry provided the power, with Lubin the change-of-pace back. Lubin will see time at tailback, but most of his snaps will likely come at wide receiver in 2000.

For a more punishing runner, Tepper can turn to 6'0", 225 lb. Javar Manning. A redshirt freshman, Manning earned All-State accolades as a senior at nearby Meadville High School after rushing for over 2,000 yards with 31 TDs.

A pair of transfers will make Tepper's decision even more difficult. John Williams, a 6'0", 195 lb. junior, was the second-leading rusher at the University of Rhode Island. He played in ten games for the Rams, rushing for 222 yards and 1 TD on 59 carries, along with 15 receptions for 122 yards. Alonzo Roebuck, 5'11", 200 lbs., is a transfer from Pittsburgh who sat out the '99 campaign and, like Williams, has two years of eligibility remaining.

The story is not quite as rosy at fullback. Injuries decimated the position a year ago, with sophomore Paul Amico (5'9", 210) and senior Ben Keefer (5'11", 230) the lone returnees. Each saw limited action, mainly on special teams. Amico carried the ball 5 times for 12 yards.

**RECEIVERS:** The good news for the receiving corps is the return of Chris Buehner. The bad news is that the rest of the pure wide receivers own a combined 7 career receptions. Buehner turned in a solid sophomore campaign, latching on to 26 passes for 315 yards with 3 TDs to earn first team All-PSAC West recognition. He is a strong blocker and can jump.

Senior George Bailey and Geis are the only other experienced wideouts. Bailey has bounced between defensive back and receiver since his arrival at Edinboro. A year ago, he caught 3 passes

for 18 yards. Geis, a versatile athlete, played cornerback in the spring and departed spring practice high on the depth chart. The lack of experienced depth at receiver led to his return to the offense during the summer. He caught 3 passes for 40 yards in '99.

Redshirt freshman Howie Smith will fight to add depth. Freshmen will be forced to contribute if the passing game blossoms.

The addition of Lubin to the receiving corps should add a bit of excitement. At just 5'6", 168 lbs., he is a scatback with great quickness. Lubin started the first five games at cornerback, then was moved to the other side of the line. He finished as the second-leading rusher with 336 yards and a 5.1 yard average, adding 11 receptions for 169 yards. He scored 5 touchdowns from scrimmage and added a sixth on returns. All told, Lubin accounted for 1,165 all-purpose yards.

The Fighting Scots will have a tough time replacing tight end Rob Barney, last year's leading receiver with 34 catches. Matt Jakovac, a 6'1", 230 lb. junior, emerged from spring ball as the starter. A strong competitor, Jakovac owns just one career reception, that for a touchdown.

## OFFENSIVE LINE:

Despite producing a 1000-yard rusher, the offensive line struggled in '99. Edinboro ranked ninth in the PSAC in rushing offense, and the school-record 37 sacks stood 11th in the league. The numbers alone leave Tepper concerned, but it is a unit which potentially could make great strides in 2000. Six players should see considerable action, with the freshmen class looking to provide immediate help.

Both starting guards return, with

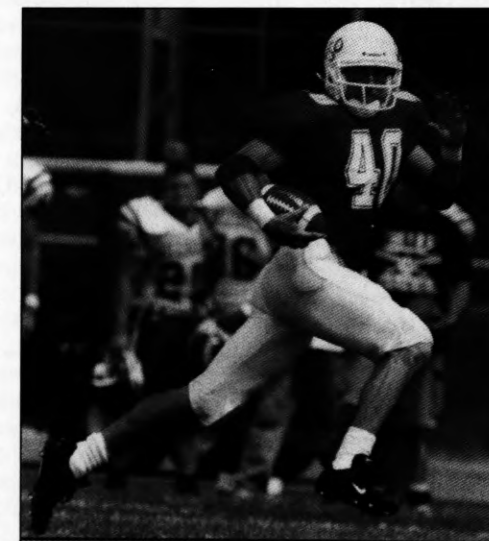

# 2000 OUTLOOK

right guard Mark Weidner (6'2", 270) entering his fourth season as a starter and left guard Brandon Nicodemus (6'2", 280), a player noted for his physical nature, his second. They provide the Fighting Scots with a strong nucleus.

The word "potential" is most prominent at tackle, where red-shirt freshman Jason Oman is slated to start on the left side. At 6'4", 283 lbs., Oman can be a future all-conference performer. Former defensive tackle Greg Tarbell made a strong conversion to the offensive line, and is now up to 290 lbs. He departed spring camp as the starter at right tackle, but is versatile enough to move to guard, as well. Tarbell started one game at guard and one at tackle last season.

Steve Smith moved from tackle to center during the '99 campaign, and will debut as the starter at center. The third-year sophomore is 6'3" and, through a hard workout regimen, has dropped to 295 lbs. He appeared in nine games in '99.

The rest of the reserves are up in the air. Among returning players, redshirt freshman Brian Richardson (5'10", 240 ) will serve as Smith's caddy. Incoming freshmen will have to fill in the gaps.

## DEFENSE

It was a much-maligned Edinboro defense that left the field in 1999. But it should be pointed out that the Fighting Scots started five and sometimes six freshmen a year ago, and a lack of depth took its toll as the season wore on. And it is a unit that ranked among the national leaders in rushing defense early in the year, limiting the first five opponents to 130 yards-or-less on the ground. Except for the school-record point total, the defensive numbers placed the Fighting Scots in the middle of the PSAC pack in terms of rushing defense (6th) and total defense (7th). In many instances, turnovers left the defense in a precarious position. In fact, 11 of the opponents' scoring drives totaled 40 yards-or-less.

Tepper's answer is the installation of an aggressive 3-4 defense with an emphasis on sound, fundamental football. Tepper has proven over a long period of time with some of the top teams in the country that his system produces outstanding results. At Virginia Tech, Colorado and Illinois, his defensive units were among the nation's elite.

**DEFENSIVE LINE:** Injuries limited Tepper's ability to assess his defensive front in the spring. Dave Smith and Pat Ashley, two of the three likely starters, did not participate. As a redshirt freshman, Smith, a 6'3", 245 lb. defensive end, led the Fighting Scots with 8 sacks among his 12 tackles for losses. In all, he totaled 31 tackles, and was tabbed a first team All-PSAC West choice. At 6'4", 250 lbs., Ashley brings some much-needed size to an undersized front. He possesses excellent potential, but is inexperienced, seeing limited action in nine games.

Senior Glenn Mannion (6'2", 265) will likely man the nose. He started all eleven games a year ago, finishing with 23 stops.

Experienced depth is definitely lacking. Sophomore Nick Blair, a 6'0", 270 lb. tackle, saw limited playing time, recording 9 hits. Defensive end Greg Delluomo (6'4", 235) is a promising redshirt freshman who will spell Smith.

**LINEBACKERS:** Gone is Dan Caro, Edinboro's leading tackler the last three years. Tepper's career includes teaching 25 professional linebackers and three Butkus Award winners. He is excited to watch this group mature. The most experienced of the 'backers is Chris Wiggins, a third-year sophomore who started all 11 contests last year. An aggressive 5'9", 220 lb. performer, Wiggins finished as the fourth-leading tackler with 52 stops, including 10 for losses. Wiggins will likely be joined inside by Foster Johnson, a promising 6'1", 220 lb. sophomore. Johnson totaled 18 tackles while making three starts in '99.

At 6'4", 238 lbs., Sean Keslar, another third-year sophomore, provides size and speed. He is making the transition to rush linebacker, and Tepper feels in time he could be an impact player. Keslar ranked seventh in tackles last season with 34 stops, including 4 for losses, while making three starts. Junior David Hart departed spring practice as the fourth starter. Previously a strong safety, the 6'2", 210 lb. Hart moves to an outside linebacking spot. The coaches note that he plays with passion.

Sophomores Keldrick Walker and Holton will battle for playing time at inside linebacker. Holton, renowned for his special teams play, had 21 tackles. Walker is undersized at 5'8", 175 lbs., but he saw considerable action as a freshman, totaling 30 hits.

Hart will battle Nick Roth and Corey Jensen at the other outside backer spot. Both are redshirt freshmen, Roth at 6'0", 207 lbs. and Jensen 6'1", 210 lbs.

**DEFENSIVE BACKS:** D.K. McDonald was the graybeard of the secondary a year ago. The senior was surrounded by three freshmen in the secondary. McDonald, meanwhile, is a three-year starter who earned first team All-PSAC West honors as a junior. An excellent cover man, McDonald broke up a team-high 11 passes while taking part in 29 tackles.

Sophomore Tommie Virgies started the final six games at cornerback, finishing the season with 29 tackles and 3 passes broken up. He is expected to start opposite McDonald.

Derrick Davis returns after a one-year absence at strong safety. The 6'2", 200 lb. senior is an aggressive performer who registered 22 tackles and an interception while playing in nine contests in '98.

Rounding out the secondary is sophomore Jason Gordon, a starter in all eleven games at free safety as a true freshman. He finished as the third-leading tackler with 56 stops, also leading the Fighting Scots with 3 interceptions and 2 fumble recoveries. He added 6 passes broken up.

A pair of transfers are expected to provide relief at the corners. Bufalino, a former standout at nearby General McLane High School, was redshirted at Slippery Rock last season. Sophomore James Cowart, meanwhile, attended Millersville a year ago. Redshirt freshman Elliott Page is also in the mix.

A host of other players will make for an interesting battle in the secondary. Junior Chris Kane, the starter the final three games at strong safety, now moves to free safety. He finished with a total of 36 hits, sixth on the team. Redshirt freshman Mike Murton provides further depth at free safety. Redshirt freshman Thomas Wallace also figures into the mix at free safety. Former tailback Anthony Williams moves to strong safety. The 5'11", 205 lb. sophomore saw limited action a year ago, gaining 79 yards.

Transfer Jeff Richardson earned a starting outside linebacker job as a freshman at Hartwick, finishing as the third-leading tackler with 68 stops, adding 5 passes broken up. Now the 6'0", 210 lb. sophomore will compete for playing time at strong safety.

# SOX HARRISON STADIUM



Sox Harrison Stadium serves as the home of the Fighting Scots. Dedicated in 1965, the stadium honors the memory of B. Regis "Sox" Harrison, the head football and basketball coach at

Edinboro University for 34 years. Sox Harrison was the key figure in the building of Edinboro's athletic program, unselfishly devoting 34 years of service to the University as an athletic director, coach and physical education instructor. Appropriately, he was the first member inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.

Harrison coached the Fighting Scot football team from its inception in 1926 to 1938, then returned to guide the gridgers in 1941 and '42. In addition, he guided the men's basketball team for 23 seasons, from 1928-53, winning 175 games.

Sox Harrison Stadium seats 6,000 people in its two grandstands, along with plenty of standing room. In addition to press boxes on both sides of the stadium, the facility has locker rooms, a training room and complete amenities for fans.

The stadium has undergone several renovations, including a new sound system and improved handicapped access areas last year. In 1997, a new grandstand was constructed on the visitor's side of the field, adding 2,500 permanent seats, along with a press box, locker rooms and a training room.

In addition to the football field, the facility contains complete track facilities.

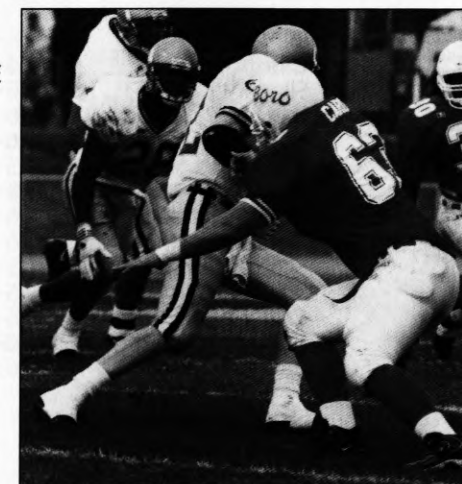

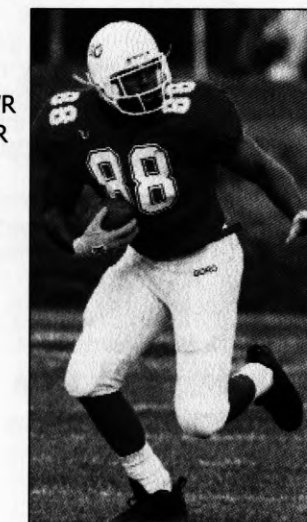

# THE PSAC

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference has established itself as one of the largest and most respected NCAA Division II athletic conferences.

As it heads into its 50th season, the PSAC has laid claim to 30 NCAA team champions and 164 individual title winners, giving credence to its fine athletic tradition. The conference's prosperity on the national level was abundant again in 1999-2000, as 64 of the league's 227 teams participated in NCAA postseason competition.

Academic success is paramount for PSAC member institutions as well. During the 1999-2000 academic year, 960 student-athletes were designated by the conference as "Scholar-Athletes" after attaining a cumulative grade point average of 3.25 or better. Additionally, six PSAC student-athletes earned GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-America awards last season.

The PSAC was organized in 1951 for the purpose of promoting and administering men's athletic programs within the 14 state teachers colleges in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

In 1977, due to the interest and growth of women's athletics, the conference was restructured to provide for women's programs.

From its inception, each conference member selected its own competitive division within the NCAA. In 1980, however, the presidents voted to reclassify the entire conference to Division II.

In 1983, all member institutions were granted university status as a result of Legislative Act 188 which formed the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education. This system now enrolls in excess of 95,000 students. The alumni of the SSHE number more than 494,000, including 342,000 Pennsylvanians.

One of the largest conferences in the nation, the PSAC is governed by the presidents of the 14 member institutions. It employs a commissioner, sports information director and secretary at its headquarters in Lock Haven, Pa.

The conference sponsors championship competition in 20 men's and women's sports. Although all 14 institutions are members of NCAA Division II, nine schools have also elected to compete at the Division I level in selected sports.

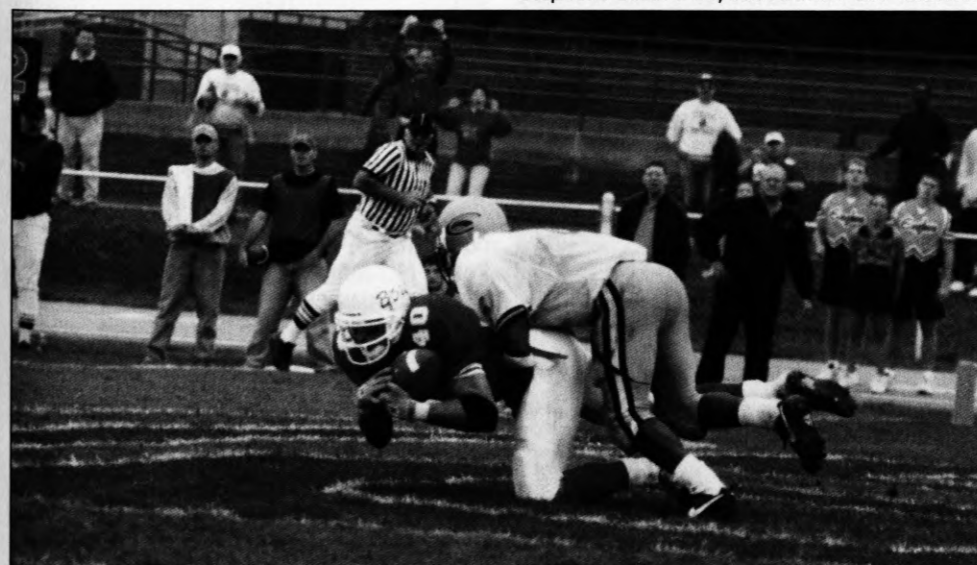
## EDINBORO 30, CLARION 29

Tommie Virgies gave Edinboro its lone lead when he scooped up a fumble and returned it 62 yards. Cal answered with a 68-yard scoring pass, as the third quarter expired at 14-all.

An Edinboro fumble set up Cal's next score on the first play of the fourth period, but Lubin answered less than a minute later with a 19-yard burst. It took just 54 seconds for the Vulcans to reclaim the lead, this time on Cates' 62-yard run.

Cal appeared to put the game away midway through the period following an Edinboro interception, but the Fighting Scots would score two more times, including Lubin's 81-yard kickoff return. Unfortunately, that followed a Cates' 24-yard scoring jaunt that ultimately proved the difference.

Lubin was outstanding in defeat, coming off the bench to contribute 245 all-purpose yards.

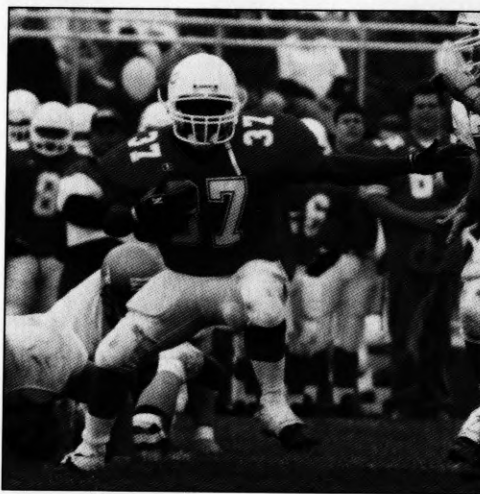

## HARLON HILL AWARD

Two Edinboro University football players have been finalists for the Harlon Hill award, presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II football.

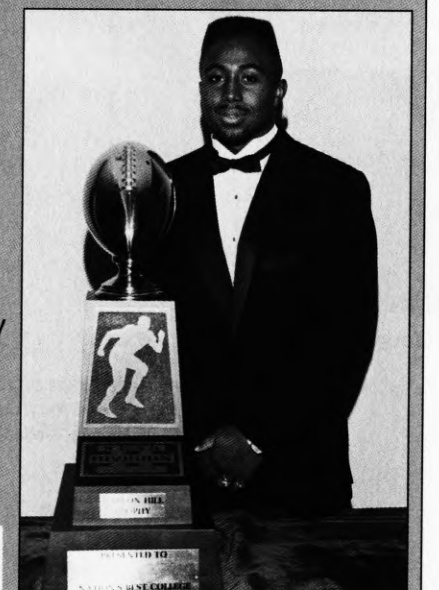
Running back Elbert Cole was one of three finalists in 1989, while wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist a year later. Cole placed third in the '89 balloting, as three-time Harlon Hill recipient Johnny Bailey of Texas A&I captured the honor. Cole earned All-American honors in 1989, receiving first team accolades from Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, second team recognition from *Football Gazette*, and third team status from Associated Press.

Cole rushed for 1,507 yards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns (24) and points (148). He led the Fighting Scots to the PSAC West title, a 8-3 record and a number seven ranking in the final Division II poll.

Priester was runnerup to North Dakota State quarterback Chris Simdorn in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title. Priester was the PSAC Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He was also recognized by Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press and the Football Gazette as a first team All-American.

The fleet wide receiver hauled in 47 passes, good for 1,102 yards and 15 touchdowns. His efforts helped the Boro finish 9-3 and reach the Division II quarterfinals.

Upon completion of his career, Priester was signed as a free agent by the Denver Bronco's of the National Football League. He later played for the Cleveland Thunder of the Arena Football League.

O'Day played two seasons for the Toronto Argonauts, helping them win the Grey Cup. The 6'3", 295 lb. offensive guard was chosen by the Argos in the 1997 supplemental draft. He is now a member of the Saskatchewan Roughriders.

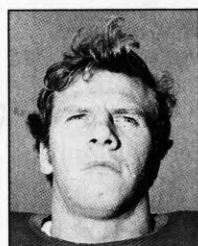

James Dumas, a defensive back two years ago for Edinboro, was signed as a free agent by the San Francisco 49ers in 1999. Gilbert Grantlin was a free agent signee of the Minnesota Vikings in 1996, earning a spot on the practice squad.

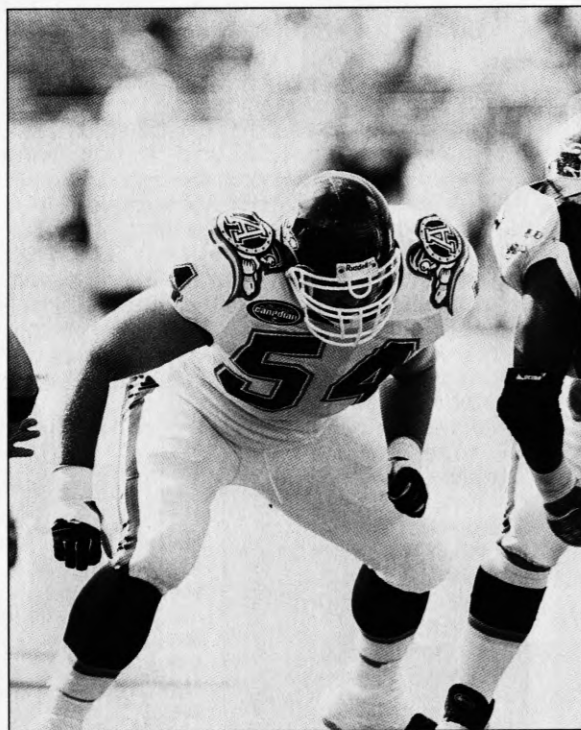

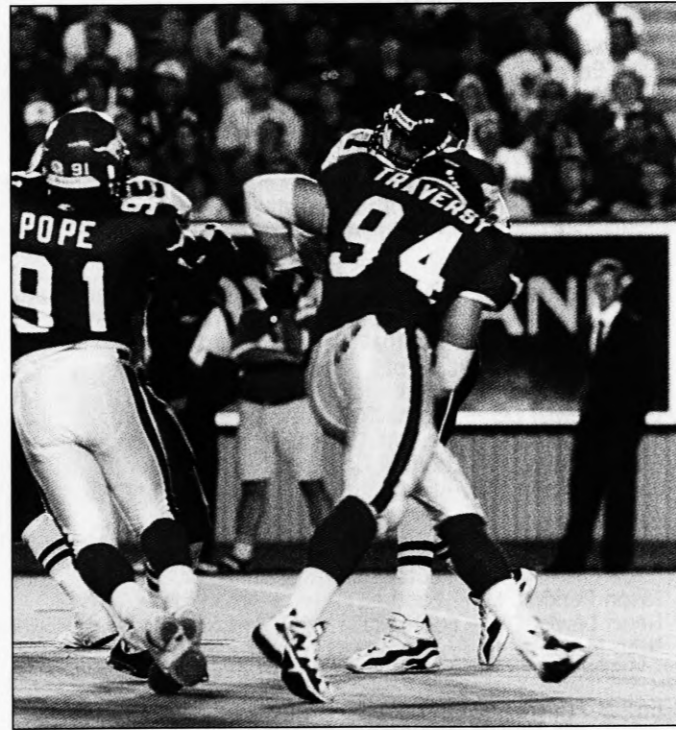
Now a member of the Saskatchewan Roughriders, offensive lineman Jeremy O'Day previously played for the Grey Cup champion Toronto Argonauts.

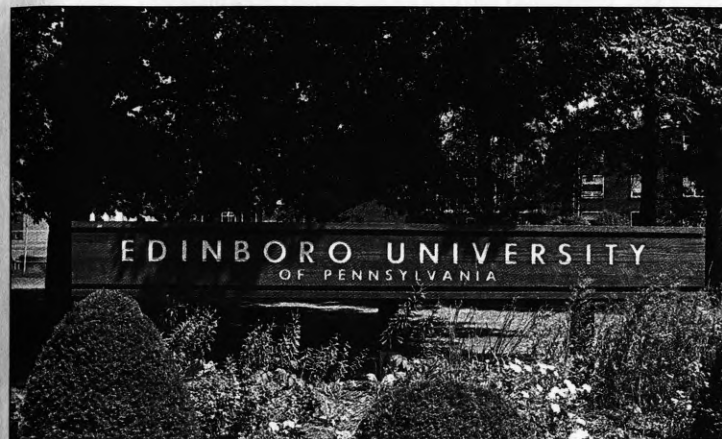

selection of more than 100 degree programs, with 52 minors tailored to meet the needs of each student. With a student-faculty ratio of 18:1, Edinboro offers associate's degrees, bachelor's degree and master's degrees in many specialized fields of study.

Edinboro has an undergraduate and graduate enrollment of nearly 7,200 students.

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Edinboro University is proud to feature the nation's third largest educational program for the physically disabled including services for the hearing impaired, the visually impaired, and the learning disabled. The campus is nearly 100-percent wheelchair accessible.

The University has an outstanding honors program for academically-gifted students and an international education program for the exchange of faculty and students.

Internships and field experiences integrate academic pursuits with on-site "real world" work situations and personal relationships, while numerous cultural, social and recreational activities are available.

## CAMPUS FACILITIES

◆ Edinboro features 43 buildings on a spacious 585-acre wooded campus which includes a five-acre lake, open fields and wooded area. Day, evening and weekend classes are available at Edinboro University in Erie -- the Porocco Center.

◆ There are eight on-campus residence halls housing approximately 2,600 students.

◆ A state-of-the-art seven-story library in the center of campus features more than 440,000 bound volumes and 1,200,000 microform units, an on-line public access catalog, on-line and CD-ROM searching systems, public access catalog for the visually impaired, and inter-library loan services.

◆ Edinboro University houses a planetarium, modern science labs, solar observatory, robotics laboratory, TV studio, radio station, and center for the performing arts.

◆ The University also features a reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, math clinic, parent-child development center, and computer lab for children.

◆ Five powerful mini-computer systems, more than 725 personal computers, 300 terminals, and 11 computer labs with current hardware and software are available for student use throughout the year.

◆ The University Center boasts an indoor running track, saunas and whirlpools, weight room, racquetball and handball courts, full-service bookstore and dining areas, and an aerobics room for student use.

## HISTORY

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania was founded in 1857 as a private academy. Previously named Edinboro Academy, Edinboro Normal School, Edinboro State Teachers College, and Edinboro State College, the University was the second normal school established in Pennsylvania and the 12th in the United States. On July 1, 1983, it became Edinboro University of Pennsylvania with the formation of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.

## LOCATION

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is located in the resort community of Edinboro -- just 15 miles south of Erie, Pennsylvania's third-largest city. Edinboro is conveniently located approximately 100 miles from Pittsburgh, Cleveland and Buffalo. The University is easily accessible from all directions because of its proximity to Interstates 79 and 90.

There are two lakes nearby. Edinboro Lake is a 250-acre recreational area with three guarded beaches for swimming, boating and other water sports. The Edinboro lakeside community features a large selection of cottages for rent. Lake Erie, one of the Great Lakes, is just 15 miles north. Edinboro also is close to several ski resorts for both downhill and cross country enthusiasts. The area is a popular hunting and fishing spot for outdoors enthusiasts.

Edinboro is the largest employer in the area, with approximately 2,000 full and part-time employees, many of them current and former Edinboro University students.

## ACADEMICS

Edinboro University offers a diversified and comprehensive

## FIGHTING SCOT ATHLETICS

Edinboro University competes in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference as a member of the NCAA. The Fighting Scots sponsor 16 sports, with all but wrestling competing on the Division II level. Wrestling is classified as a Division I sport. Edinboro sponsors the following sports:

**Men:** baseball, basketball, cross country, football, swimming, tennis, track (indoor and outdoor) and wrestling  
**Women:** basketball, cross country, soccer, softball, swim ming, tennis, track (indoor and outdoor) and volleyball

McComb Fieldhouse houses several indoor athletic facilities,

including basketball courts, a weight room, and an olympic-sized swimming pool with diving tank. McComb is home for the men's and women's basketball teams, the wrestling team, the volleyball team, and the swimming team. Outdoor facilities include Sox Harrison Stadium, home of Fighting Scot football, an all-weather track, baseball and softball fields, tennis courts, a cross country course, and 26 soccer fields.

Edinboro student-athletes are success stories in the classroom as well as the playing fields. In 1999-2000, almost one-third of all Fighting Scot student-athletes maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better. Over fifty student-athletes were honored as scholar-athletes by the PSAC.



# ADMINISTRATION

## DR. FRANK G. POGUE, Jr. President



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Pogue holds a Bachelor's Degree from Alabama State University, a Master's Degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor of student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central Administration in Albany, serving in that position for ten years. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year

as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, Dr. Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. Since 1984, he has served on the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and is a former vice chair and member of its Executive Committee and currently chair of its Task Force on Equity and Diversity. He was also recently appointed chairperson of their Advisory Committee on Institutional Financial Resources, which advises the Commission on the relationship of financial resources to institutional accreditation. In addition, Dr. Pogue serves as a member of the American Council on Education Commission on Government and Public Affairs which advises the Division of Government Relations on the broad range of issues in which congressional and executive branch actions affect colleges and universities. He is also a member of the College Board National Forum Committee. Dr. Pogue was also appointed to both the Executive Committee of the Commission on the Rural Agenda and the Task Force on Teacher Education of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities.

Based on the interest of State System University student government leaders across Pennsylvania to make civility a topic of dis-

covery and discussion for the 1999-2000 academic year, Dr. Pogue has established the "Century of Civility" at Edinboro University in celebration of the new millennium. President Pogue also serves as chairperson for the Erie City and County Millennium Commission, "Together 2000."

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the boards of directors for the Erie Conference on Community Development; the United Way of Erie County; Congressman Phil English's High-Tech Advisory Task Force; Leadership Erie, the Presque Isle Partnership; the Erie County Fiscal Management Task Force; the French Creek Council of the Boy Scouts of America; the Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee; and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross, for which he served as their 1997 capital campaign chairman. He has also been appointed to the Board of Corporators for both the Hamot Health Foundation and the St. Vincent Health Center.

Since becoming president, Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.



## DR. NAOMI T. JOHNSON Vice President for Student Affairs and Student Success



Dr. Naomi T. Johnson is in her fourth year as the Vice President for Student Affairs and Student Success at Edinboro University. Those responsibilities include overseeing the Fighting Scot athletic program.

Prior to her appointment at Edinboro, Dr. Johnson served as the Associate Dean of Students at the University of California-Santa Barbara. Her wide range of experience in service to students includes past

positions as peer counseling coordinator, assistant to the president for student affairs, director of the campus activities center, and assistant dean of students.

One of Dr. Johnson's main objectives at Edinboro is to facilitate a creative and innovative campus atmosphere. She also looks to lead a united effort by the University Community to ensure a well-rounded education for students.

Dr. Johnson earned her Bachelor's Degree in Sociology from Moorhead State University, then completed work on her Master's Degree in College Student Personnel from Bowling Green State University and her Ph.D. in Higher Education from Arizona State University.

Dr. Johnson and her husband, Earl Jacobs, a member of the Edinboro Development Office, reside in Edinboro.

# DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

## BRUCE BAUMGARTNER



Bruce Baumgartner is regarded as one of the greatest American wrestlers ever, but now Baumgartner is building a solid reputation as an athletic administrator.

Baumgartner was named the acting Director of Athletics in 1997, then was awarded the job permanently in '98.

As the guiding force of the Fighting Scot athletic program, Baumgartner initiated the Annual Athletic Fund Drive, a fundraising project designed to provide athletic scholarship funds. The University is also working on a gender equity program in compliance

with NCAA guidelines.

A four-time Olympic medalist, Baumgartner served as an Edinboro wrestling coach for nearly 13 years, including seven seasons as the head coach. He compiled a 70-36 record, including 14-0 dual meet record in 1997, the best finish in school history. The Scots then went on to finish sixth at the NCAA Division I Nationals, their highest finish ever.

Baumgartner affirmed his status as the greatest freestyle heavyweight wrestler in American history by winning the bronze medal at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta to go along with two golds and a silver. It was his fourth Olympic medal and record-setting 13th world-level medal. Baumgartner was honored by his fellow United States Olympic athletes when he was chosen to carry the American flag for the opening ceremonies. He won his first gold medal in Los Angeles in 1984, America's first in 60 years of

super heavyweight wrestling. He followed with a silver medal performance at the 1988 Games in Seoul, Korea, then became the first American wrestler to ever medal in three consecutive Olympics when he won the gold medal for the second time in Barcelona, Spain in 1992.

Honored as the winner of the James E. Sullivan Award in 1995 as the outstanding amateur athlete in the United States, Baumgartner had not lost to an American wrestler from 1981 through his retirement from competition in 1998. This past summer, Baumgartner was recognized as the US Olympic Wrestler of the Century by Globalaxxess.com

As a collegiate wrestler at Indiana State University, Baumgartner won 134 of 146 collegiate matches with 73 falls. He was twice the runnerup at the national collegiate tournament, then posted a perfect 44-0 mark his senior year to capture the NCAA crown.

His success in college was not limited to the mats, as Baumgartner was honored by the NCAA as a "Top V Award" recipient for his athletic, leadership and academic success. He was later awarded an NCAA post-graduate scholarship after earning his Bachelor's Degree in Industrial Art Education. He utilized the award to earn a Master's Degree at Oklahoma State University, where he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant.

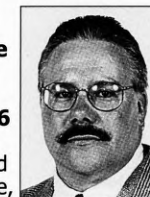
Baumgartner officially retired from wrestling in the summer of 1998, but still performs a great deal of community service as a motivational speaker and role model. He and his wife, Linda, have three sons, Bryan (9), Zachary (6) and Dylan (3).
