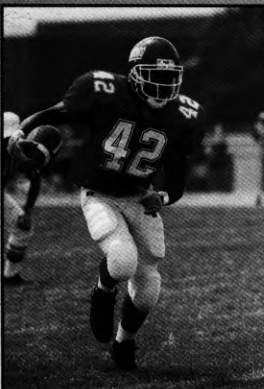

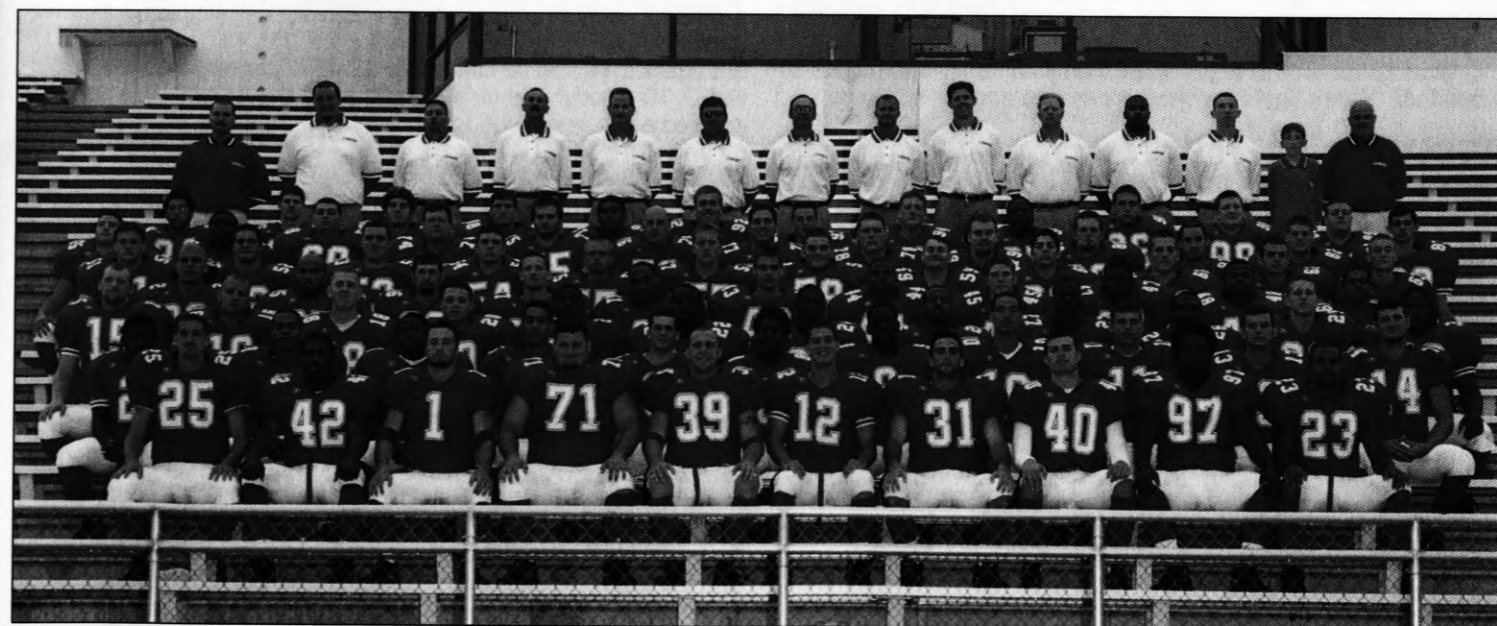

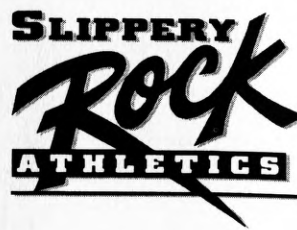

Edinboro was fortunate in that no contest was scheduled for Saturday, September 15, and could deal with the distractions without any game preparation. The Rock was not as fortunate, as it was scheduled to play at Fairmont State, only to have that contest cancelled. It was one of six involving PSAC teams not to go on.

What better way to begin anew than with family and friends all around us. Here's hoping you enjoy this afternoon's festivities.

THE COACHES

Edinboro head coach **Lou Tepper (Rutgers '67)** is in his second season in charge of the Fighting Scots. A year ago he matched the school record for most wins by a first-year head coach as the Scots finished 5-6. Renowned as a defensive genius, Tepper has worked on the staffs of some of the top programs in the country, including Virginia Tech, Colorado and LSU. But his greatest notoriety came at Illinois, where he coached from 1989-96. The defensive coordinator and later assistant head coach from 1988-91, Tepper was appointed the Fighting Illini head coach on December 13, 1991, just prior to the team's appearance in the John Hancock Sun Bowl. He would go on to guide the Illini to two more bowl games while posting a 25-31-2 ledger. He now owns an overall mark of 31-38-2.

Dr. George Mihalik (Slippery Rock '74) has built Slippery Rock into a Division II power. Now in his 14th season as head coach, he owns a 96-46-4 ledger. More impressive, The Rock has won four successive PSAC West championships and earned a berth in the NCAA Division II playoffs three of the last four seasons. During that peri-

od, SRU owns an impressive 41-9 record. Mihalik's association with Slippery Rock goes back thirty years, to his time as a quarterback beginning in 1970.

LAST YEAR'S GAME

Slippery Rock 42, Edinboro 7

D.J. Flick scored three touchdowns, including an 85-yard return on the opening kickoff, to lead Slippery Rock to its 36th consecutive regular season win over a Division II opponent. Flick also scored The Rock's second touchdown on a 16-yard pass play, and later scored on a 77-yard punt return. Slippery Rock scored on its first five possessions to take a 35-0 lead at the half. Edinboro avoided the shutout when John Williams scored on a four-yard run early in the fourth quarter. The Fighting Scots were guilty of four turnovers. Bernard Henry ran for 107 yards, with Williams adding 63.

FIGHTING SCOTS TO WATCH

John Williams, TB -- after finishing as the second-leading rusher with 483 yards a year ago, the senior leads the Scots with 175 yards on 29 rushes and 1 TD. He ran for a career-high 114 yards on 13 carries at Ashland, then came back with 61 yards in the win over Gannon.

Alonzo Roebuck, TB -- the senior was limited to just 16 yards on 10 carries in the Gannon game, but he scored on a 6-yard run. He gained 81 yards, a career-high, on 16 rushes at Ashland.

Steve Tryon, QB -- the senior threw for just 171 yards a year ago, but against Gannon he completed 12 of 22 passes for 200 yards, with 1 TD through the air and another on the ground. He also enjoyed a successful outing at Ashland, completing 16 of 27 passes for 148 yards with 1 TD and 1 INT.

Chris Buehner, WR -- a first team All-PSAC West choice two years ago, he is beginning to show that form again. The senior is tied for the team lead with 6 receptions for 78 yards, catching a nine-yard TD pass vs. Gannon.

Foster Johnson, ILB -- is tied for the team lead with 17 tackles, along with an interception. He led the Scots with 12 tackles at Ashland.

Dave Smith, OLB -- once again leads the pass rush with 1.5 sacks, along with a team-high 5 tackles for a loss. Has 14 tackles in all.

Jeff Richardson, SS -- the junior displayed an ability to come up with the big play a year ago, and he is at again. He has 16 tackles, 2 for losses with a sack and an interception.

Sean McNicholas, PK/P -- is averaging 43.5 yards on 10 punts. Has made 2 of 5 fields, from 38 and 39 yards.

THE ROCK TO WATCH

D.J. Flick, WR -- the senior has totaled nearly 4,000 all-purpose yards in his career, and will soon break the SRU record. A year ago, he caught 39 passes, led Division II in kickoff returns with a 39.9 yard average, and also ranked among the national leaders in punt

returns at 15.8 yards per return. The speedster has caught 3 passes for 69 yards and a TD so far, along with a kickoff return for 28 yards and a punt return for 19 yards. He was a first team All-PSAC West choice both as a receiver and return specialist.

Dorrian Glenn, TB -- comes off a 20-carry, 238-yard effort against Tiffin, with TD runs of 6, 63 and 72 yards. The senior has already gained 410 yards on 48 carries, a gaudy 8.5 yard average, with 5 TDs. A year ago he was a second team All-PSAC West choice.

Tim Arthurs/Kevin Dvorchak, QB -- the duo has been very effective while splitting time at quarterback. Arthurs, a sophomore, comes off an 8-for-14 performance for 89 yards vs. Tiffin, throwing for one touchdown and adding a 20-yard run for another. Dvorchak was 5 of 10 for 61 yards in the same game. He is a junior.

Jim Urbano, CB -- has a team-leading 11 solo tackles, and has posted 3 interceptions, including a pair in the opener at Florida Atlantic. A four-year starter, he earned first team All-PSAC West accolades in 2000 while recording 37 tackles and 4 INTs.

Shawn Hanzely, SS -- in his first year as a starter, the junior has 7 solo tackles and 8 assists, along with picking off the first pass of his career at Florida Atlantic.

MAKING A GOOD FIRST IMPRESSION

Highly-touted freshman Brandon Munson did not carry the ball at Ashland, and for most of the first half he rode the bench against Gannon. But with just over two minutes to play, the 6'0", 222 lb. tailback was inserted into the game. He immediately gained 7 yards, and then on his second carry, went 51 yards for his first collegiate touchdown. Munson would finish with a team-high 72 yards on just four rushes.

YOU'RE NEVER TOO OLD

When most football players have long since retired, at 42 years old, Dale Stoner is in his first year ever playing the gridiron sport. Stoner is a 6'2", 283 lb. defensive tackle for the Fighting Scots who is pursuing his Master's Degree. Stoner did not make the travel squad for Ashland, but got in for the final five plays against Gannon.

THE "OTHER" MCKAVISH

For four years Randy McKavish bedeviled the PSAC. Now younger brother Ryan is trying to make sure the McKavish name remains fresh in coaches' minds. The junior h-back leads Slippery Rock with 9 catches for 72 yards, hauling in 7 balls for 51 yards against Tiffin.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

The Bzorek's will have a hard time rooting at today's game. Junior Bill Bzorek is the starting left tackle for Slippery Rock, while brother Ron Bzorek, a redshirt freshman, is the backup left guard. Meanwhile, Greg Bzorek, yet another brother, is a reserve offensive tackle for the Fighting Scots. And as for that grocery bill, consider that Bill goes 6'4", 280 lbs., Ron is 6'4", 290 lbs., and Greg is 6'5", 330 lbs. All hail from Saxonburg, PA and Knoch High School.

HOLTON AT IT AGAIN

Senior David Holton has made a career out of blocking kicks, and he is at it again. The outside linebacker blocked an extra point and a punt against Gannon, making it six career blocked punts.

FRESHMEN TIGHT ENDS LEAD THE WAY

Edinboro has made good use of three young tight ends. True freshman C.J. Trivisonno led the Scots with 3 receptions for 35 yards in the opener at Ashland. In the Gannon tilt, redshirt freshman Michael Lowe hauled in 4 passes for 64 yards to lead all receivers. And then there's Ed Brown, another true freshman who has started both games and is best recognized for his blocking.

NEXT FOR THE FIGHTING SCOTS

Edinboro plays its second night game of the season on Saturday, September 29 at California(Pa.). Kickoff against the Vulcans is slated for 7 p.m.

HEAD COACH

LOU TEPPER



Veteran Division I mentor Lou Tepper was appointed the 12th head football coach at Edinboro University, officially taking charge of the Fighting Scot program on January 5, 2000.

Tepper inherited an Edinboro program which had won just eleven games in the previous three seasons. His five-win season in 2000 matched the Edinboro record for most victories by a first-year head coach.

The season-ending three game winning streak propelled the Fighting Scots into an enthusiastic winter conditioning session and confident spring practice.

BACKGROUND

Tepper, a native of Keystone, PA, returned to the Division II level after coaching at Division I institutions for almost thirty years. He is renowned as a defensive coaching genius, with a resume that includes three Butkus Award honorees and an Outland Trophy winner. Tepper's list of defensive standouts include Bruce Smith, John Holecek, Simeon Rice, Kevin Hardy, and Henry Jones, all current NFL standouts. In addition, he has worked with some of the top head coaches in the country, including Bill Dooley at Virginia Tech, Bill McCartney at Colorado, John Mackovic at Illinois and Gerry DiNardo at LSU.

"Being a native of western Pennsylvania, it has been neat to be a head coach again and to be a head coach in this environment," Tepper related following his first season at Edinboro. "I've recruited western Pennsylvania for half of my career. It's a joy to be back home." Tepper completed his second full season as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana State University last year. He began his tenure with the Tigers on December 15, 1997, helping LSU to a 27-9 Independence Bowl win over Notre Dame. All told, he has served as a defensive coordinator for 19 of his 33 years in the coaching profession.

"We had an outstanding pool of candidates to choose from, but Lou's integrity, coaching background and national notoriety stood out above the rest. We feel Edinboro provides the opportunity to be one of the top programs in the PSAC, and look at Lou Tepper as the coach to restore our program to that level."

BIG TEN HEAD COACH

The 55-year-old Tepper was appointed the head coach at the University of Illinois on December 13, 1991, just prior to the team's appearance in the John Hancock Sun Bowl. He replaced Mackovic, who left for the head coaching position at the University of Texas. During his five year stint as the Fighting

Illini head coach, Tepper compiled a record of 25-31-2, including two more bowl appearances. He guided Illinois to a pair of wins over Ohio State, including one at Columbus; the school's first victory in Ann Arbor against Michigan in 27 years; and three consecutive wins over rival Iowa by a combined score of 122-17. Just as impressive, Tepper graduated 91 percent of his seniors.

Tepper joined the Illinois program in 1988, serving as the defensive coordinator for four seasons and assistant head coach for two years. In his nine seasons at Illinois, he helped the program to six bowl invitations, one Big Ten title and top ten rankings in the AP and UPI polls.

He was honored as the Big Ten's top defensive assistant coach in 1990 by *The Sporting News*. His defensive units annually ranked among the best in the country, finishing 10th in 1989, 14th in 1993, ninth in 1994, and 21st in 1995.

Tepper's 1992 Illini squad finished 6-5-1, suffering a 27-17 defeat to Hawaii in the Holiday Bowl. Illinois went in to Columbus and upset Ohio State, 18-16, and posted a 22-22 tie against Michigan in Ann Arbor.

While his '93 edition finished 5-6, that included a 24-21 win in Ann Arbor against the Wolverines. The Illini made it back to postseason play in 1994, handing East Carolina a 30-0 whitewashing in the Liberty Bowl. The '94 squad finished 7-5, again upsetting one of the elite in the Big Ten. And once again it was on the road, as Illinois shocked Ohio State, 24-10, in Columbus behind Butkus Award winner Dana Howard.

LINEBACKERS

While Penn State has gained the reputation as "Linebacker U", Illinois could make a good case for that designation as well during Tepper's tenure. He produced consecutive Butkus Award winners in Dana Howard (1994) and Kevin Hardy (1995). Along the way, he also produced Big Ten Defensive Players of the Year in Moe Gardner and Darrick Brownlow (1990), Howard (1993 and '94) and Big Ten Defensive Lineman of the Year Simeon Rice in 1994. For the only time in Big Ten history, Tepper had four first team All-Big Ten linebackers at his disposal. In all, he has coached over 25 professional linebackers, and recently wrote the book, "Complete Linebacking", a 312-page comprehensive book on linebacker play.

Hardy and Rice became the highest defensive draft duo in the history of the NFL draft in 1996 when Hardy went second to Jacksonville and Rice third to Arizona. That stood until the 2000 NFL Draft when Penn State's Courtney Brown and Lavar Arrington went one-two.

PITTSBURGH

Tepper began his coaching career as a graduate assis-

tant at Pittsburgh in 1967, then moved on to the University of New Hampshire from 1968-71, coaching the running backs and linebackers before becoming the defensive coordinator. His next stop was the College of William & Mary, where he joined former New Hampshire head coach Jim Root as the defensive coordinator from 1972-77. The 1976 William & Mary squad posted the school's best record in thirty years. He was the assistant head coach his final year at William & Mary.

VIRGINIA TECH

In 1978, Virginia Tech head coach Bill Dooley hired Tepper as his linebackers coach. Tepper helped build the Hokies into a consistent bowl contender with a defense that annually ranked among the nation's top ten. He stayed at Virginia Tech from 1978-82, working with Outland Trophy winner and Buffalo Bills great Bruce Smith, among others. The 1980 Hokie edition played Miami(FL) in the Peach Bowl.

COLORADO

Tepper joined Bill McCartney's staff at Colorado in 1983, serving as the defensive coordinator and assistant head coach until departing for Illinois in 1988. Tepper helped turn around a Buffalo defense which ranked No. 100 nationally in yards allowed prior to his arrival, to one which was as high as 11th in Division I in total defense. He earned the title of assistant head coach to McCartney his final two seasons, and helped the Buffaloes to the 1985 Freedom Bowl and the 1986 Blue Bonnet Bowl. Among the assistant coaches at Colorado was Gerry DiNardo, who would later bring Tepper in to direct his LSU defense.

PERSONAL BACKGROUND

Tepper, born September 7, 1945, graduated from Rutgers University in 1967. He enjoyed a standout career as a defensive back at Rutgers from 1965-67. As a player, Tepper led the Scarlet Knights in interceptions as a junior and tackles as a senior. He won the George Cronin Trophy as the Most Improved Player in 1965.

Tepper is an active member of the American Football Coaches Association and has served on the NCAA Ethics Committee. He is active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and has spoken for Promise-Keepers, founded by former Colorado coach Bill McCartney. Tepper and his wife, Karen, have two children, Matthew, a graduate assistant on the Edinboro staff, and Stacy Ann, a recent LSU graduate.

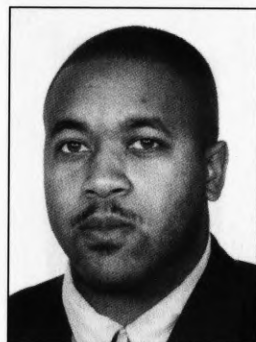

Defensive Coordinator



Rod Boykin assumed the duties of defensive coordinator and secondary coach a year ago after previously serving as an assistant coach at Wittenberg University the last two years.

Boykin played collegiately at the University of Illinois under Lou Tepper.

A four-year letterwinner at Illinois, Boykin was twice named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week as a defensive back, and was named the Fighting Illini Defensive Champion of the Year. He played in a total of 44 games for the Illini, playing in three bowl games. The Dayton, OH native enjoyed his best season as a senior, recording 25 tackles with 2 passes broken up. As a junior, he had 21 stops, along with a fumble recovery in the end zone for a touchdown against Arizona.

Boykin graduated in 1995 with a Bachelor's Degree in Kinesiology and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Tepper that same year. He worked with the Fighting Illini from 1995-97, picking up a Master's Degree in Higher Education and Administration.

Boykin joined the Wittenberg staff in 1997 as the defensive backs coach. He helped the Tigers post back-to-back 11-1 finishes, winning the North Coast Athletic Conference championship both seasons and reaching the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs.

Boykin served on the Wittenberg staff for three seasons. The Tigers went 31-3 during that period, and in 1998 was the number one rated pass defense in the country.

Boykin is single and the father of Rodrick Jr., age 6. He is a former National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award winner at Meadowdale High School in Dayton.

Scott Browning

Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line



Scott Browning holds the longest tenure of anyone on the Edinboro University coaching staff. Now in his 16th season as a Fighting Scot assistant, Browning is working with his third head coach.

After serving as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator a year ago, Browning takes over as the offensive coordinator, while continuing to work with the linemen. That is a role he had handled the previous five seasons. This marks his eighth year in charge of the offensive linemen. He has also coached the running backs and defensive backs in the past.

In his numerous capacities, Browning has coached several All-Americans, including Steve Russell, Michael Willis, Wade Smith, Georj Lewis, Mike Barnes, Elbert Cole and Jeremy O'Day. This past year, Mark Weidner earned Academic All-America honors.

In addition to his extensive tenure at Edinboro, Browning has served as an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for two years. The Buckeyes went to the Rose Bowl and the Citrus Bowl in his two seasons. Browning served as a graduate assistant coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. That outfit reached the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

A 1981 graduate of Ohio State with a Bachelor's Degree in Education, Browning began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Worthington High School and Dayton-Fairview High Schools in Ohio from 1979-81.

Before transferring to Ohio

State, he attended Capital University where he played football for one season. Browning later earned a Master's Degree in Education Administration from New Mexico State in 1983.

Defensive Line

Under Bradford's tutelage, Edinboro has had three first team All-PSAC West defensive linemen. The Fighting Scots have ranked fourth in the PSAC in sacks both years.

Bradford had previously been at Salisbury State since 1990, and was the Sea Gulls' defensive coordinator from 1994-98.

A graduate of Salisbury State, Bradford began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the linebackers (1990-92) and defensive linemen (1992-94). His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game.

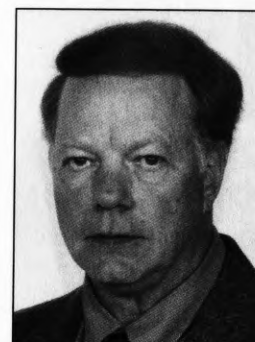

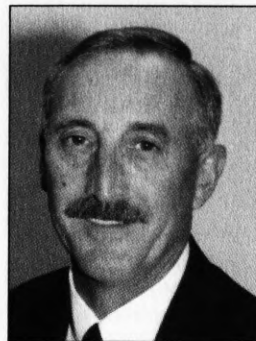

He began his coaching career in 1998, serving as a student coach at Taylor, instructing the defensive backs. He earned his Bachelor's Degree in Sports Management in 1999.

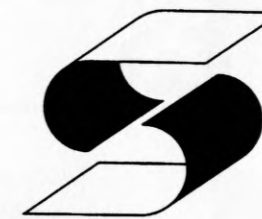

HARLON HILL AWARD

Two Edinboro University football players have been finalists for the Harlon Hill award, presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II football.

Running back Elbert Cole was one of three finalists in 1989, while wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist a year later. Cole placed third in the '89 balloting, as three-time Harlon Hill recipient Johnny Bailey of Texas A&I captured the honor. Cole earned All-American honors in 1989, receiving first team accolades from Kodak American Football Coaches Association, second team recognition from *Football Gazette*, and third team status from Associated Press.

Cole rushed for 1,507 yards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns (24) and points (148). He led the Fighting Scots to the PSAC West title, a 8-3 record and a number seven ranking in the final Division II poll.

Priester was runnerup to North Dakota State quarterback Chris Simdorn in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title. Priester was the PSAC Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He was also recognized by Kodak American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press and the *Football Gazette* as a first team All-American.

CoSIDA/Verizon Academic All-America Team College Division

The 2000 CoSIDA/GTE Academic All-America Football Team, selected by members of the College Sports Information Directors of America, honors the nation's best student-athletes.

Just as the balancing of football and academics is difficult, the standards for nomination and selection to the team are rigorous. To be nominated, a varsity starter or key reserve player must have a minimum 3.200 cumulative grade-point average (on a 4.000 scale).

The program began in the 1950s with honorees in football; later, basketball and baseball all-academic teams were added. Academic and athletic biographical data of nominees are prepared in ballot form and mailed to the CoSIDA membership, who vote in each of eight districts. From the eight district teams comes a national ballot, distributed to the 1,400 members for the final all-academic team.

Offensive lineman Dave Wonderlick of Susquehanna University, a senior who made the first team for the second straight season, was named Verizon Academic All-America Team Member of the Year.

Arkansas Tech was the only school in the college division with a pair of first-teamers — kicker Paul Peletz and defensive lineman Robert Bayer.

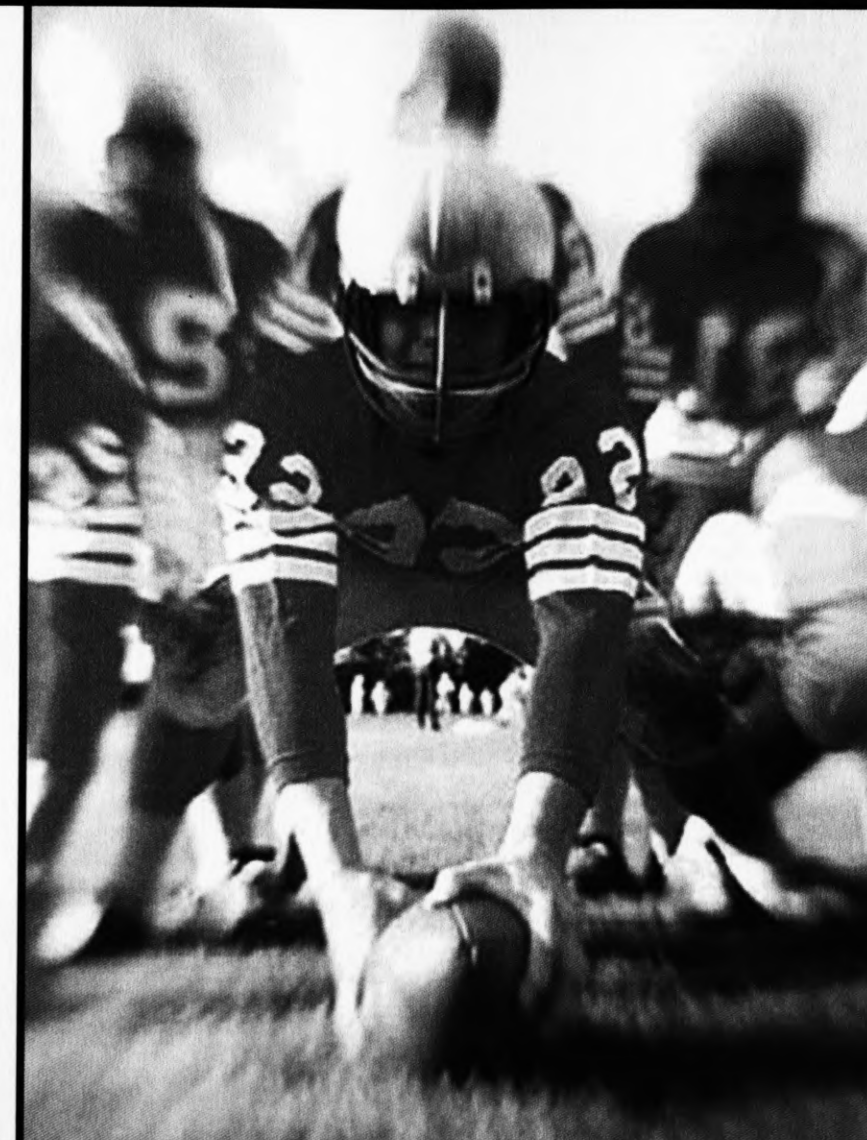

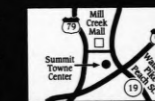

TRY, TRY AGAIN

Steve Tryon wasn't hailed as the second coming of John Elway or Joe Montana when he transferred to Edinboro a year ago. He doesn't possess a rifle arm, and he's rarely confused with a great athlete.

But his arrival was much anticipated. Head coach Lou Tepper saw other qualities he admired in the Amherst, NY native. Coaches call them intangibles.

"I think our team has tremendous confidence in Steve's decision-making ability and the value he has for the football,"

Tepper commented recently. "He was appointed captain for the Gannon game because of those things. I think he has made a very wise decision to conduct a train and not, unlike a lot of quarterbacks, pull it. He has enough skill people around him that if he just gets the ball off to these people we can be an efficient offense."

Tryon made the most of his captain duties against Gannon, completing 12 of 22 passes for 200 yards with one touchdown, while adding a second touchdown rushing. More important than the numbers, Edinboro turned the ball over just once while winning, 37-21.

After struggling to pick up a new system in a new environment, the 6'2", 190 lb. senior has settled in this year. "I think (offensive coordinator) Scott Browning has been a big difference for us," Tryon noted. "We respect him and like to play for him. We pretty much lowered the variety of things we were doing. We took a core amount of plays and got good at those."

Browning has noticed a difference in his signalcaller, as well, although he feels quarterback coach Scott Weaver deserves a great deal of credit. "I think Scott Weaver's done a hell of a job with Steve," Browning exclaimed. "Our players view Steve as our leader. He is more comfortable with everything going on. He understands what we are trying to do."

"I think Steve is playing within the system. That's really big. We're going with a lot of checks. He has to make sure we're in the right play. He really understands the game of football. He's a veteran. He has a great knowledge of the game."

Much was expected of Tryon when he enrolled at Edinboro, but he encountered more difficulties than he thought. "I'm more comfortable this year," he admitted. "Transferring was a little more difficult than you think it is. Not knowing anyone. The second semester, with spring ball, it was a big difference."

Tryon played two seasons at Robert Morris. As a sophomore, he played in six games, completing 37 of 64 passes for 691 yards, with 6 TDs and just 1 INT. He led the Colonials to wins over Sacred Heart and Monmouth while filling in for the injured starter. He also came off the bench to throw the winning touchdown pass on the final play of the game versus Wagner.

When the season ended, Tryon was looking for an opportunity to play regularly. "I was in the heat of competition with another quarterback who was the same year," he recalled. "The coach told me and him at the end of the year that we'd have an equal shot. I felt I had a real good opportunity to play here at Edinboro. Plus, it was cheaper to go to school here."

But the transition took longer than anticipated. Without the benefit of spring ball, and with a new coaching staff in place, Tryon needed a little extra time to pick up all of the nuances.

He finally supplanted incumbent Jack Davis as the starter in week number five against California (Pa.). He didn't put up gaudy numbers in the homecoming game, completing 5 of 10 passes for

95 yards and a score, but his work-man-like performance was a main factor in the 31-17 victory.

He got the starting nod the next week as well at Lock Haven. Few Scots played well that night, including Tryon, who suffered a shoulder injury early in the game yet remained in the entire contest.

The injury would keep Tryon out the rest of the season, as he finished the year completing 18 of 45 passes for 171 yards. Most unTryon-like was the ratio of one touchdown and five interceptions.

"The whole quarterback performance was below average," he noted. "We had to work to get better. I knew I was capable of throwing more touchdowns than interceptions."

Tryon emerged from a three-way battle with Davis and redshirt freshman Cam Marsh in the spring for the starting role, then spent the summer refining his skills.

"Staying here this summer helped us a lot," he pointed out. "I lived with Chris Buehner, and we would have our own practices. We'd have Alonzo (Roebuck), Mike Murton, Tommie Virgies, (David) Hart, (Lincoln) Bufalino. Mentally we were ready for the season three months before it came."

The familiarity with his teammates has also led to a more active role as a leader. "I think it goes along with being comfortable with the players," Tryon stated. "Once you prove yourself, you can lead vocally. When you transfer, I think you have to try to lead by example."

Tepper has also noticed the difference, and likes what he sees. "Steve has performed admirably this fall," assessed the veteran coach. "He was very consistent last spring. He's way ahead of where he was a year ago. I'm very impressed with his performance thus far -- the way he practices and leads our team."

Once again, there's those intangibles. They're what has made Tryon the perfect fit for the 2001 Scots. "I'm not a flashy guy," he readily admits. "I like to lead by example. I don't put much emphasis on how hard or far you can throw the ball. I was always taught that accuracy is the key. That, and try to make as few mistakes as possible."

With that in mind, Tryon would like to lead the Fighting Scots to their first winning record since 1996. With a 1-1 record after two games, that won't be easy. Today's game against Slippery Rock opens up PSAC West play, and early indications suggest another season of balance in the PSAC.

"We'd like to win the PSAC," Tryon stated matter-of-factly. "We have to improve from 5-6. A lot of us seniors want to finish strong. I know I don't want to have any regrets."

Tryon is completing work on his bachelor's degree in Marketing. He hopes to parlay that, plus a minor in Communications, into a career in Sports Marketing. For now, he hopes to market a winning record for the Edinboro football team.
