Sox Harrison Stadium



Sox Harrison Stadium serves as the home of the Fighting Scots. Dedicated in 1965, the stadium honors the memory of B. Regis "Sox" Harrison, the head football and basketball coach at Edinboro University for 34 years. Sox Harrison was the key figure in the building of

Edinboro's athletic program, unselfishly devoting 34 years of service to the University as an athletic director, coach and physical education instructor. Appropriately, he was the first member inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.

Harrison coached the Fighting Scot football team from its inception in 1926 to 1938, then returned to guide the gridirons in 1941 and '42. In addition, he guided the men's basketball team for 23 seasons, from 1928-53, winning 175 games.

Sox Harrison Stadium seats 6,000 people in its two grandstands, along with plenty of standing room. In addition to press boxes on both sides of the stadium, the facility has locker rooms, a training room and complete amenities for fans.

The stadium has undergone several renovations, including a new sound system and improved handicapped access areas in 1999. In 1997, a new grandstand was constructed on the visitor's side of the field, adding 2,500 permanent seats, along with a press box, locker rooms and a training room.

In addition to the football field, the facility contains complete track facilities.

In Memory of Bill McDonald



The 2002 Edinboro University Football Media Guide is dedicated to the memory of Bill McDonald. Edinboro's football coach from 1969 to 1978, McDonald passed away on March 10, 2002.

In his ten seasons as head coach, McDonald compiled a record of 54-36-7, ranking second to Tom Hollman in career wins. His 1970 and '71 squads posted back-to-back 9-1 seasons, with the '70 edition possibly the greatest gridiron team ever at Edinboro. The Scots won their first nine games, including a 14-6 win over West Chester for the school's only PSAC Championship. Westminster handed Edinboro

a 20-7 defeat in the NAIA National Semifinals.

Edinboro was awarded the Lambert Bowl, emblematic of the top small college program in the East. McDonald was honored as the Football Writers Association Coach of the Year in the East, while the NAIA Area VIII and District 18 coaches, as well as the Pennsylvania Collegiate Press Association, also recognized him as Coach of the Year.

The Scots returned to the PSAC title game a year later, dropping a 35-14 decision to West Chester. McDonald's 1975 team also reached the PSAC Championship, losing to East Stroudsburg, 24-20, to finish at 8-3.

Bill McDonald was 72 when he passed away. Survivors included his wife, Joanne, two daughters, Amy Mulligan and Johanna Elgin, and one son, David McDonald. He remained a loyal follower of the Fighting Scots throughout the years, and his presence will be sorely missed.

Head Coach

Lou Tepper



Veteran Division I mentor Lou Tepper was appointed the 12th head football coach at Edinboro University, officially taking charge of the Fighting Scot program on January 5, 2000.

Tepper inherited an Edinboro program which had won just eleven games in the previous three seasons. The Scots have shown consistent improvement in "Coach Tep's" two years. The 2000 season brought a 5-6 record, matching the Edinboro record for wins by a first-year head coach, and a fifth place PSAC finish. Three of the losses, however, were lopsided. In 2001,

Edinboro finished with a deceiving 4-6 record. The Fighting Scots were competitive in every contest and finished third in the PSAC. The victories included a stunning 14-7 upset over 17th-ranked Slippery Rock.

Background

Tepper, a native of Keystone, PA, returned to the Division II level after coaching at Division I institutions for almost thirty years. He is renowned as a defensive coaching genius, with a

tion, he has worked with some of the top head coaches in the country, including Bill Dooley at Virginia Tech, Bill McCartney at Colorado, John Mackovic at Illinois and Gerry DiNardo at LSU.

"Being a native of western Pennsylvania, it has been neat to be a head coach again and to be a head coach in this environment," Tepper related following his first season at Edinboro. "I've recruited western Pennsylvania for half of my career. It's a joy to be back home."

Tepper completed his second full season as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana State University in 1999. He began his tenure with the Tigers on December 15, 1997, helping LSU to a 27-9 Independence Bowl win over Notre Dame. All told, he has served as a defensive coordinator for 19 of his 35 years in the coaching profession.

Big Ten Head Coach

The 56-year-old Tepper was appointed the head coach at the University of Illinois on December 13, 1991, just prior to the team's appearance in the John Hancock Sun Bowl. He replaced Mackovic, who left for the head coaching position at the University of Texas. During his five year stint as the Fighting Illini head coach, Tepper compiled a record of 25-31-2, including two more bowl appearances. He guided Illinois to a pair of wins over Ohio State, including one at Columbus; the school's first victory in Ann Arbor against Michigan in 27 years; and three consecutive wins over rival Iowa by a combined score of 122-17. Just as impressive, Tepper graduated 91 percent of his seniors.

Tepper joined the Illinois program in 1988, serving as the defensive coordinator for four seasons and assistant head coach for two years. In his nine seasons at Illinois, he helped the program to six bowl invitations, one Big Ten title and top ten rankings in the AP and UPI polls.

He was honored as the Big Ten's top defensive assistant coach in 1990 by *The Sporting News*. His defensive units annually ranked among the best in the country, finishing 10th in 1989, 14th in 1993, ninth in 1994, and 21st in 1995.

Tepper's 1992 Illini squad finished 6-5-1, suffering a 27-17 defeat to Hawaii in the Holiday Bowl. Illinois went in to Columbus and upset Ohio State, 18-16, and posted a 22-22 tie against Michigan in Ann Arbor.

While his '93 edition finished 5-6, that included a 24-21 win in Ann Arbor against the Wolverines. The Illini made it back to postseason play in 1994, handing East Carolina a 30-0 whitewash in the Liberty Bowl. The '94 squad finished 7-5, again upsetting one of the elite in the Big Ten. And once again it was on the road, as Illinois shocked Ohio State, 24-10, in Columbus behind Butkus Award winner Dana Howard.

Linebackers

While Penn State has gained the reputation as "Linebacker U", Illinois could make a good case for that designation as well during Tepper's tenure. He produced consecutive Butkus Award winners in Dana Howard (1994) and Kevin Hardy (1995). Along the way, he also produced Big Ten Defensive Players of the Year in Moe Gardner and Darrick Brownlow (1990), Howard (1993 and '94) and Big Ten Defensive Lineman of the Year Simeon Rice in 1994. For the only time in Big Ten history, Tepper had four first team All-Big Ten linebackers at his disposal. In all, he has coached over 25 professional linebackers, and recently wrote the book, "Complete Linebacking", a 312-page comprehensive book on linebacker play.

Hardy and Rice became the highest defensive draft duo in the history of the NFL draft in 1996 when Hardy went second to Jacksonville and Rice third to Arizona.

That stood until the 2000 NFL Draft when Penn State's Courtney Brown and Lavar Arrington went one-two.

Pittsburgh

Tepper began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pittsburgh in 1967, then moved on to the University of New Hampshire from 1968-71, coaching the running backs and linebackers before becoming the defensive coordinator. His next stop was the College of William & Mary, where he joined former New Hampshire head coach Jim Root as the defensive coordinator from 1972-77. The 1976 William & Mary squad posted the school's best record in thirty years. He was the assistant head coach his final year at William & Mary.

Virginia Tech

In 1978, Virginia Tech head coach Bill Dooley hired Tepper as his linebackers coach. Tepper helped build the Hokies into a consistent bowl contender with a defense that annually ranked among the nation's top ten. He stayed at Virginia Tech from 1978-82, working with Outland Trophy winner and Buffalo Bills great Bruce Smith, among others. The 1980 Hokie edition played Miami(FL) in the Peach Bowl.

Colorado

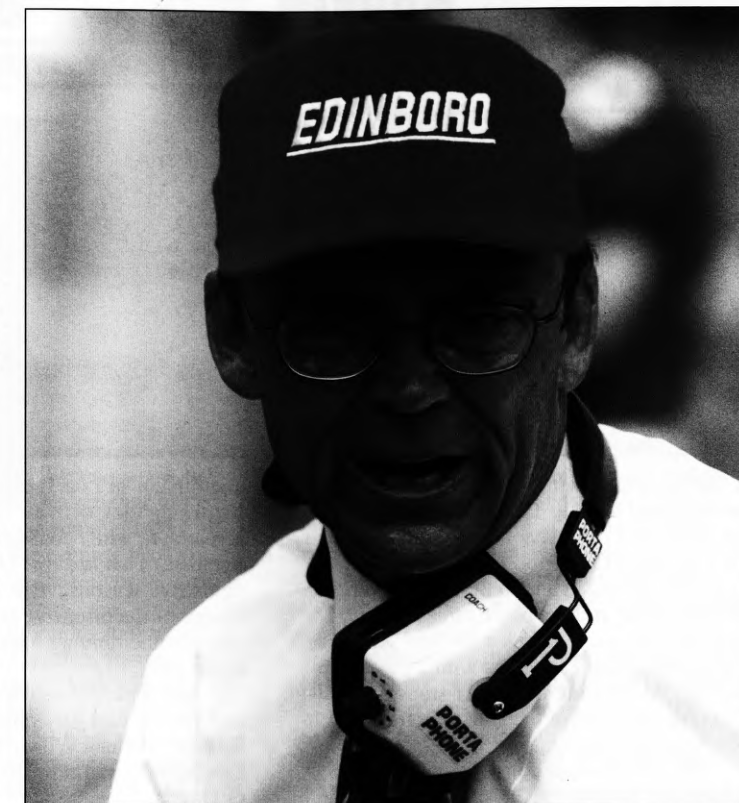
Tepper joined Bill McCartney's staff at Colorado in 1983, serving as the defensive coordinator and assistant head coach until departing for Illinois in 1988. Tepper helped turn around a Buffalo defense which ranked No. 100 nationally in yards allowed prior to his arrival, to one which was as high as 11th in Division I in total defense. He earned the title of assistant head coach to McCartney his final two seasons, and helped the Buffaloes to the 1985 Freedom Bowl and the 1986 Blue Bonnet Bowl. Among the assistant coaches at Colorado was Gerry DiNardo, who would later bring Tepper in to direct his LSU defense.

Personal Background

Tepper, born September 7, 1945, graduated from Rutgers University in 1967. He enjoyed a standout career as a defensive back at Rutgers from 1965-67. As a player, Tepper led the Scarlet Knights in interceptions as a junior and tackles as a senior. He won the George Cronin Trophy as the Most Improved Player in 1965.

Tepper is an active member of the American Football Coaches Association and presently sits on the All-American committee, and has previously served on the NCAA Ethics Committee. He is active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and has spoken for Promise-Keepers, founded by former Colorado coach Bill McCartney. Tepper and his wife, Karen, have two children,

Matthew, a graduate student at Edinboro, and Stacy Ann, a graduate of LSU who is the grants manager for Meals on Wheels in Columbus, OH.

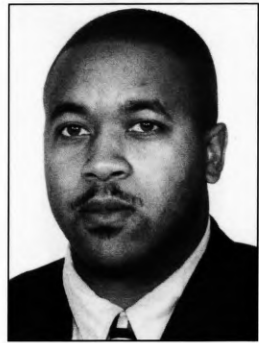

Assistant Coaches

Rod Boykin

Defensive Coordinator



Rod Boykin assumed the duties of defensive coordinator and secondary coach two years ago after previously serving as an assistant coach at Wittenberg University two years prior to that. Boykin played collegiately at the University of Illinois under Lou Tepper.

A four-year letterwinner at Illinois, Boykin was twice named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week as a defensive back, and was named the Fighting Illini Defensive Champion of the Year. He played in a total of 44 games for the Illini, playing in three bowl games. The Dayton, OH native enjoyed his best season as a senior, recording 25 tackles with 2 passes broken up. As a junior, he had 21 stops, along with a fumble recovery in the end zone for a touchdown against Arizona.

Boykin graduated in 1995 with a Bachelor's Degree in Kinesiology and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Tepper that same year. He worked with the Fighting Illini from 1995-97, picking up a Master's Degree in Higher Education and Administration.

Boykin joined the Wittenberg staff in 1997 as the defensive backs coach. He helped the Tigers post back-to-back 11-1 finishes, winning the North Coast Athletic Conference championship both seasons and reaching the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs.

Boykin served on the Wittenberg staff for three seasons. The Tigers went 31-3 during that period, and in 1998 was the number one rated pass defense in the country.

Boykin is single and the father of Rodrick Jr., age 7. He is a former National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award winner at Meadowdale High School in Dayton.

Scott Browning

Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line



Scott Browning holds the longest tenure of anyone on the Edinboro University coaching staff. Now in his 17th season as a Fighting Scot assistant, Browning is working with his third head coach.

After serving as the offensive line coach and recruiting

coordinator in Lou Tepper's first season, Browning took over as the offensive coordinator a year ago, while continuing to work with the linemen. That is a role he had handled the previous five seasons. This marks his ninth year in charge of the offensive linemen. He has also coached the running backs and defensive backs in the past.

In his numerous capacities, Browning has coached several All-Americans, including Steve Russell, Michael Willis, Wade Smith, Georj Lewis, Mike Barnes, Elbert Cole and Jeremy O'Day.

In addition to his extensive tenure at Edinboro, Browning has served as an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for two years. The Buckeyes went to the Rose Bowl and the Citrus Bowl in his two seasons. Browning served as a graduate assistant coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. That outfit reached the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

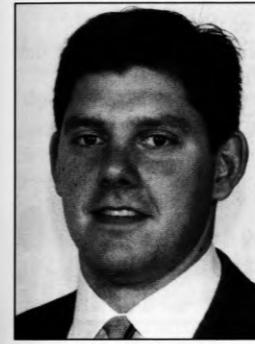

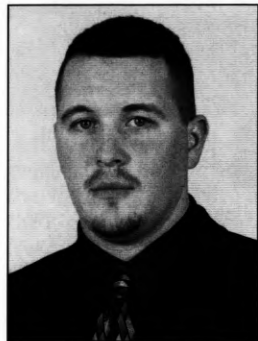

as an assistant coach in charge of the wide receivers at Strong Vincent in 1998-99, then coached at East High School in 2001, working with the offensive and defensive linemen.

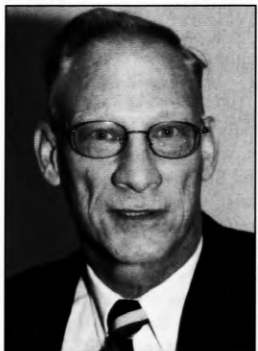

Pennsylvania All-Stars to the gold medal in the Down Under Bowl in Australia.

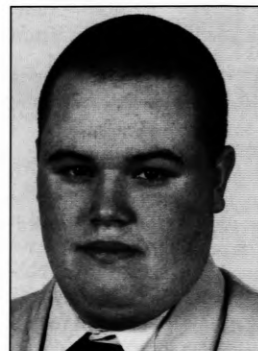

A Conversation with Lou Tepper



What attracted you to Edinboro?

"I was attracted to Edinboro because I love to coach young men who are serious about the game and use football as a tool to influence them toward positive academic, athletic and social behavior. Edinboro was attractive because of the leadership of the administration, particularly that of Dr. Frank Pogue, Dr. Naomi Johnson and Bruce Baumgartner. Edinboro has a location and setting that can attract quality student-athletes. Karen and I are both familiar with this area and the PSAC. We love smaller communities yet Erie provides many attractions plus we have entrée to three metropolitan areas in close proximity."

Has it been difficult for you to adjust to Division II football?

"My biggest challenge has been to create a Division I mindset in a Division II setting. Sometimes people lack vision because certain things have been the way they are for so long. It's been really fun to see players, co-workers and this community expand their horizons to do things with greater expectations. It's been a real joy to see so many react positively to this challenge. I have found it very enjoyable and at times down right thrilling."

You were so close a year ago, only to lose the final three games and finish 4-6. Is this the year Edinboro takes a step forward and snaps its five year losing streak?

"I believe it will be. Our depth and talent level has improved and we have been able to give consistent teaching with a strong and stable football staff. In 2000 we were unable to compete favorably every week. Last season we were competitive throughout the year. The squad not only expects to win but has paid a price to prepare themselves to do so."

What did last year's win over Slippery Rock and strong showing at IUP mean to your program?

"In 2000 we lost by large margins to both of those nationally-ranked programs. One year later we upset Slippery Rock, 14-7, here at Sox Harrison Stadium and then went toe-to-toe with IUP."

Those performances buoyed our confidence and demonstrated that if we continue to improve our talent and schemes we can soon challenge for a PSAC title."

You made modest improvements statistically on offense last year. What can be expected offensively this year?

"We expect to continue our steady offensive improvement. In 2000 we averaged only 14 points a game and improved to nearly 21 points a game last year. We have a very solid offensive front and expect to run the ball with authority. If our efforts to throw the ball more effectively are realized, we can take the next step in our progression and become explosive."

How much importance do you place on special teams?

"Special teams have always been one of my passions because they account for over 50% of the yardage in a game and yet only 15% of the total snaps. Few fans recognize the impact of special teams and many players don't buy into its significance. Last year our kicking game dominated several games. We finished sixth in the nation in net punting and were one of the most efficient punt return units in the PSAC. We have some marquee special teams performers who can really change the course of a game."

The defense played so well most of the year, it had to be disappointing with the showing in the final three games.

"Our defense improved tremendously in the trenches and the front seven returns almost intact. We gave up far too many big plays in the passing game the final three weeks of the season and no championship team can perform in that fashion. We must become more dependable in that area if we are going to be a premier defense."

Do you think people are surprised that your recruiting at Edinboro has centered on freshmen rather than bringing in transfers?

"There are many ways to build a championship program. At Edinboro, we value TALENT AND CHARACTER as the cornerstone of our recruiting. If every player that comes into your program has character then his talent will be magnified and his chances of enduring for his entire career are good. We have no issues with recruiting freshmen or transfers as long as those requirements are met. In our first classes we have signed many more freshmen, but the transfers we have attracted are impact guys and have been very positive influences on our team."

Depth, Experience Add Up To Winning Formula For Fighting Scots

After five straight losing seasons, head coach Lou Tepper feels it's time for his Edinboro University football team to put that behind them. Tepper can only take credit for the last two, and even those two campaigns are deceiving.

Tepper's initial squad in 2000 finished with a 5-6 record thanks to wins in its final three contests. A year ago, the Fighting Scots ended the season riding a four game losing skid, sending the Scots once again under the .500 mark at 4-6.

But the progress made from year one to year two was substantial, and with another year under their belt, Tepper feels this is the year his team turns the corner. Consider that the Scots handed Slippery Rock, ranked 17th in Division II at the time, a 14-7 defeat, and battled Indiana(Pa.) on even terms for three quarters before falling by a 21-6 score.

"Overall, in the first year we couldn't compete favorably," admits Tepper. "Last year we were competitive. This year, I don't believe there is anybody on our schedule we can't beat."

Tepper is quick to point out that Edinboro hasn't yet reached the talent level of IUP or Slippery Rock, the elite in the Pennsylvania

State Athletic Conference Western Division the last decade. But the gap is closing.

Tepper will welcome back 30 letter-winners, but more importantly, 16 starters return. That includes five first team All-PSAC West

performers and two second team selections. A year earlier, only five Scots total were recognized by the league's coaches. While questions remain as the Fighting Scots enter the 2002 campaign, Edinboro has gone from a team seriously lacking in depth to one with a pleasant problem in terms of quality competition at a number of positions.

If Tepper's squad can withstand the first half of the schedule, the first winning season since 1996 could be on the horizon. Edinboro opens the season on Saturday, August 31, making the short trip to Erie to play Gannon. That begins a stretch of four of the first five games on the road. The Scots close with four of the final six -- including the annual Homecoming tilt versus IUP -- in the friendly confines of Sox Harrison Stadium.

Special Teams

Tepper places a great deal of emphasis on special teams play, and it was clearly evident a year ago. He is quick to point out that Edinboro finished sixth in Division II in net punting (38.67 yards), that the Fighting Scots ranked first in the PSAC in punt catches and total punt return yards, and that his team is a major threat to block a kick every game. A year ago, the Scots came up with eight blocked kicks.

He looks for the special teams to once again play a significant role, but did depart the spring with some concern. "I didn't think we had a very good spring in the kicking game," Tepper noted. "It was the worst part of our spring. Hopefully it will motivate us in the fall."

In Sean McNicholas, Edinboro possesses one of the top punters in Division II. A year ago, the senior ranked 13th nationally with an average of 41.4 yards per punt, the second-highest in school history. That boosted his career average to 40.0 yards.

McNicholas has served the dual role of punter and placekicker the last three years, but he will likely concentrate on punting this fall. While ranking among the career leaders in both field goals made and

attempted, he made just 8 of 19 field goals and 16 of 21 extra points last season.

Geoff Heyl, a transfer from the University of Connecticut, is expected to handle the placekicking chores, although redshirt freshman Eli Visnick is also in the picture. Heyl served as the Huskies' regular kicker in 2000, converting 10 of 16 field goals, including a 48-yarder at Boston College, and 22 of 24 PATs.

Tepper has plenty of options in the return game. Lincoln Bufalino averaged 23.5 yards on 13 kickoff returns, and 7.0 yards on 11 punt returns. Justin Lipscomb had a promising start at Ashland, returning three punts for 31 yards before suffering a season-ending shoulder injury. Alonzo Roebuck and Matt Birkett, a transfer from Wisconsin, are other possible returners.

The special teams' biggest loss could be David Holton. Best known for his long snapping and knack for blocking kicks, Holton was a rare performer for Tepper, starting on all six special teams units.

Offense

While you probably wouldn't describe the Edinboro offense as a high-octane attack, the Fighting Scots made great strides in 2001. After ranking near the bottom of the PSAC in scoring offense, passing offense and rushing offense, the Scots climbed to the middle of the pack.

Edinboro boosted its scoring average to 20.2 ppg., and the total offense climbed over seventy yards per game to 329.0 ypg. Most noteworthy, with a greatly improved offensive line paving the way, the Scots displayed an ability to control the line of scrimmage on the ground. Edinboro ranked sixth in the PSAC in rushing at 183.7 ypg.

With eight starters back, it is hoped that the improvement will continue. But the losses were substantial. Steve Tryon proved a capable quarterback in his lone year as a starter, and John Williams, who shared the tailback job, was drafted by the Canadian Football League. Right tackle Greg Tarbell anchored the offensive line and was chosen to play in the Cactus Bowl, and Chris Buehner led the Scots in receiving.

"We have some issues," Tepper admitted. "We have a talented quarterback who lacks experience, and we have to get better blocking from our fullbacks, but other than that, I think we're solid everywhere on offense."

QUARTERBACK: With Steve Tryon and Jack Davis gone, the quarterbacking job is in the hands of talented but untested Cam Marsh. A sophomore now in his third season, the 6'1", 190 lb. Marsh has seen limited action, playing in four games last year and completing both of his pass attempts. However, his athleticism was clearly evident in the spring, and he proved an accurate passer.

"Our quarterback does not have to pull the train," stressed Tepper, "merely conduct us and get us in the right plays. Cam can make

plays. He's the best athlete we've had behind center."

Justin Bouch, a 6'3", 205 lb. redshirt freshman, is expected to push Marsh in the fall, with 6'1", 215 lb. junior Corey Jensen, a line-backer a year ago after previously playing quarterback, also in the picture.

RUNNING BACKS: For just the second time in ten years, Edinboro failed to have a 1,000-yard rusher. But the combination of John Williams and Alonzo Roebuck proved extremely effective. Williams, who led the Scots with 723 yards and added 14 receptions, has moved on to the CFL, but Roebuck should be one of the top backs in the PSAC.

A 5'11", 205 lbs. senior who is in outstanding condition, is one of the most respected players on the roster. His leadership skills aside, he gained 671 yards on 132 carries, a 5.1 yard average, with 8 TDs, despite missing two games due to injury. Roebuck had four 100-yard games in 2001, including a 151-yard effort in the season finale at East Stroudsburg. He is also an accomplished receiver, hauling in 13 passes for 132 yards.

Sophomore Brandon Munson averaged 7.8 yards per carry while gaining 274 yards as a reserve, and has the talent to be a quality player.

Converted fullback J.D. Baker is also in the mix at tailback. Undersized as a fullback at 5'8", 205 lbs., the sophomore is a hard-nosed player who saw action in five games a year ago.

The fullback position promises to be a battle, with no fewer than five potential candidates, including a pair of converted players. "I was disappointed in the fullbacks in the spring," Tepper pointed out. "We have to find an answer."

Former all-state tailback Javar Manning saw the most action at fullback a year ago, starting six contests. Now bulked up to 240 lbs., Manning is best known for his running and receiving abilities. He carried the ball six times for 39 yards, and caught 6 passes for 54 yards. Manning sat out the spring following shoulder surgery.

Mike Martin, a 5'11", 240 lb. junior, has seen plenty of action his first two years, but has been plagued by injuries. After battling knee problems, he missed the spring with a wrist injury. If healthy, Martin can be a devastating blocker.

Redshirt freshman Nick Phillips, 6'1", 230 lbs., played fullback for the first time in the spring. With experience he could prove an interesting performer.

Nate Eimer, another redshirt freshman, moves from tight end to fullback, as does Dylan Wessel, who previously played linebacker. Eimer, 6'2", 230 lbs., caught the eye of the coaches a year ago in practice. Wessel was a standout fullback in high school, and is regarded as a physical, hard-nosed performer.

RECEIVERS: Tepper was quick to point out that the most improved area on the team in the spring was at the wide receiver spots. Though Chris Buehner and Michael Lowe, the team's top receivers a year ago, are gone, Tepper is excited with his receiving corps.

"We have four receivers who are really dependable," noted Tepper. "I feel very good about these four. If we are lacking, it's that we don't have an alarming deep threat."

Leading the way among the wideouts is Sean Hess, a 6'3", 200 lb. junior who came on strong the second half of last season. Hess ended the year with 13 receptions for 198 yards. He is described as a consistent performer and a strong blocker.

Diminutive Lincoln Bufalino is expected to line up alongside Hess. At just 5'7", 170 lbs., Bufalino is an exciting player who also excels as a return man. He caught 9 passes for 167 yards, an 18.6 yard average, with 3 TDs.

Sophomores Jordan Bobitski and Justin Lipscomb will push for playing time. Bobitski is similar size-wise to Hess at 6'2", 185 lbs., and made great strides in the spring after catching just one pass last year. Lipscomb, another player with excellent return skills, missed the last nine games after suffering a broken collarbone at Ashland.

Tepper is hoping that Division I transfers Matt Birkett and Jerry Roquemore will emerge as needed deep threats. Birkett attended Wisconsin last year but did not play for the Badgers. He played with John Williams at Rhode Island, and hauled in 52 passes for 788 yards

with 5 TDs in 1999. The 5'11", 175 lb. junior possesses plenty of speed. Roquemore is even faster, running a 10.37 100 meters in high school. He last played at Washington State in 1998, catching 14 passes while starting the last six games.

Senior Mike Miodus, sophomore Jay Ulmer, and redshirt freshman Jeff Dinger are other candidates at wide receiver.

Edinboro entered the 2001 season with a large hole at tight end. Though just freshmen, the tandem of Ed Brown and C.J. Trivisonno has turned tight end into a strength. At 6'4", 250 lbs., Brown is renowned for his blocking skills. Trivisonno is also 6'4", 250

lbs., and is the stronger receiver. He caught 8 passes for 70 yards.

Junior Pete Gaylord (6'1", 214 lbs.) is a hard-nosed competitor and turned in a strong spring performance.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Tepper spent his first spring lamenting the lack of depth on the offensive line. Now as the Scots enter the 2002 campaign, the offensive line is not only two deep, but had three players earn All-PSAC recognition.

Joe Valvoda and Brandon Nicodemus return as first team performers at center and guard,

respectively. Valvoda, a 6'2", 295 lb. junior, is an intelligent player with excellent feet. Nicodemus proved his toughness a year ago, playing through a painful shoulder injury which kept him out of springs drills.

At 6'3", 275 lbs., the senior is the lightest of the linemen, but runs the best and is outstanding at pulling.

He was a *Football Gazette* honorable mention All-America.

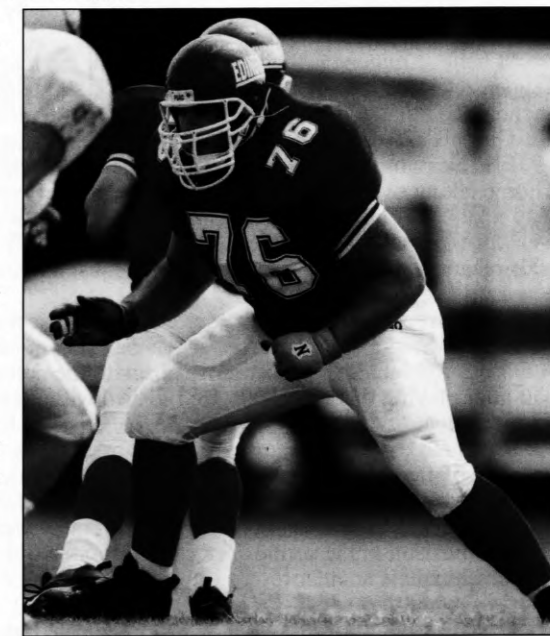

2002 Outlook

and sophomore David Beck (6'5", 290 lbs.) are also returning starters. Tepper felt Peluso, the starter at right guard, was the team's best offensive lineman in the spring. He described him as quick, strong and nasty. Beck joined the starting lineup at left tackle midway through the season and performed well.

Jason Oman is expected to step into the opening at right tackle. A starter in all 11 games at left tackle in 2000, Oman missed the 2001 season due to ankle surgery. He put the time to good use, practically living in the weight room. The junior now puts 312 lbs. on his 6'4" frame. He is a strong, physical run blocker.

Brothers Ron and Greg Bzorek are the backups at left and right tackle, respectively. Ron is a 6'4", 300 lb. sophomore who transferred from Slippery Rock this summer, while Greg, 6'6", 315 lbs., is a red-shirt freshman.

Sophomore Karl Shellgren (6'4", 285 lbs.) will back up at left guard after missing last season with a foot injury. Anthony Suфра (6'2", 280 lbs.), a redshirt freshman, is a top reserve center.

Defense

If not for struggling over the final three games, the defense may have approached the levels of the previous season, when the Scots limited opponents to 317.6 yards per game. As it was, the defensive unit ranked seventh in the PSAC in scoring defense and rushing defense, but was an alarming next-to-last in passing defense. That led to several big plays by opponents, most evident in late-season losses to West Chester and East Stroudsburg.

With eight starters back, many now working in Tepper's scheme for the third year, the Edinboro defense should be strong.

"Overall defensively, the front four, if healthy, is the most physical we've had," assessed Tepper, "but we're thin. Our linebackers run well and have played a lot. The secondary will be key to our improvement. If they perform well, we will be a very consistent defense."

DEFENSIVE LINE: Led by Dave Smith, the Edinboro front four is very talented. Smith, a 6'3", 250 lbs. senior, is a three-time first team All-PSAC West performer, and if the spring is any indication, he's primed for his best season yet. He finished second on the team in tackles with 62, including a school-record 20 for losses, and 8 sacks. He is tied for fourth in career sacks with 21.5.

"Dave Smith looks highly-motivated, and is ready to have a great senior year," predicted Tepper.

"I believe Eugene is the best noseguard in the league," added Tepper, referring to Eugene Grooms. A 6'1", 290 lb. junior, Grooms anchors the middle of the line. He took part in 40 tackles, 9 for losses. Grooms earned second team All-PSAC West accolades a year ago.

Eric Neavins is expected to start at defensive tackle, with Kyle Thorne taking over at end. Neavins is an extremely talented player with a knack for making the big play. A 6'3", 274 lb. sophomore, Neavins took part in 26 tackles as a reserve. At 6'7", 265 lbs., Thorne adds plenty of size to the front four. While just a redshirt freshman, he is a big body who runs well.

The most experienced of the defensive line reserves is Otto Hoover, who started the first five games last year at offensive tackle. A 6'3", 285 lb. junior, Hoover moves back to the defensive side of the ball after playing there in 2000. He finished with 20 tackles that year and adds quality depth.

Sophomore Matt Peterson (6'1", 270 lbs.) moves from tackle to noseguard after a solid freshman season. Seth Fragale, a former wrestler who is now concentrating solely on football, backs up Smith. Though just 6'1", 215 lbs., Fragale runs extremely well and made a solid impression in the spring. Kirk Vermillion, a 6'4", 250 lb. red-shirt freshman, is another reserve at tackle.

LINEBACKERS: Tepper's defenses are predicated on strong linebacker play, and in Foster Johnson and Jermaine Hughley, Tepper feels he has the best pair of inside linebackers in the PSAC. Now if he can just keep them on the field together.

Johnson was a first team All-PSAC West performer last season, and Hughley was as a freshman. Unfortunately, Hughley played in

just four games a year ago after missing three games as a freshman. When healthy, he is an extremely active player. Hughley had 77 tackles as a freshman, and 38 last year, with 6 behind the line. He was named the national co-defensive player of the week for his play in last year's win over Slippery Rock.

Johnson more than picked up the slack, leading the team in tackles for the second straight year with 86 hits. That included 13 for losses, 5 sacks, and a team-high 4 passes broken up.

Seniors Chris Wiggins and Paul Amico give the Scots a pair of experienced reserves on the inside. Wiggins totaled 14 tackles last year, but has over 100 career tackles. Amico is best known for his special teams play, but the former fullback took part in 22 tackles last year and blocked two kicks. Redshirt freshman Diego Matthews is quick and will push for time.

Former cornerback James Cowart is first in line to replace David Hart at drop linebacker. Cowart has bulked up to 205 lbs., and the junior will give the Scots a strong pass defender. He had 34 tackles last year.

The original plan was for Nick Roth to share time with Cowart. Roth, a 6'0", 220 lb. junior, is a strong run stopper, but suffered a knee injury in the spring and is not expected to play this year.

Another alternative is Robert Burns, a transfer from Butler (KS) Community College. A 6'0", 212 lb. sophomore, Burns displayed a great deal of talent in the spring and may develop as the season progresses.

DEFENSIVE BACKS: The most maligned area of the defense, Tepper can call on several talented defensive backs, but depth and lack of experience is a concern.

Jeff Richardson earned second team All-PSAC West honors at strong safety after totaling 56 tackles, 11 for losses. The 6'1", 197 lb. senior led the Scots with 5 interceptions, and has displayed a nose for the ball since transferring from Hartwick following his freshman year.

Free safety is also in good hands with Jason Gordon entering his fourth year as a starter. A smart player who knows the defense well, the senior had 28 tackles in 2001 and is the leader of the secondary.

Senior Tommie Virgies and junior Elliott Page are the returning starters at cornerback. Virgies is probably better suited to play safety, but finished with 23 tackles and tied for the team lead with 4 passes broken up. Page has become a dependable corner. He had 33 tackles and 3 passes broken up.

Ashland, OH -- For the second straight season the Eagles of Ashland handed Edinboro a season-opening loss. Wide receiver Kevin McMahon burned the Fighting Scots for three first half touchdowns.

After a three-and-out series to start the contest for Edinboro, Ashland drove 70 yards on 12 plays to take a 7-0 lead. The score came on a 13-yard reverse Kevin McMahon. The Fighting Scots failed to gain a first down on their next possession, and Ashland struck quickly for a 14-0 advantage less than ten minutes into the contest. On the second play of the drive, Matt McCullough found McMahon behind the Edinboro secondary for a 65-yard scoring play.

The Scots got on the board midway through the second quarter on Sean McNicholas' 38-yard field goal. Edinboro drove to the Ashland nine later in the quarter, only to cough up the pigskin. The Eagles answered with a 91-yard drive, scoring with 32 seconds left in the half for a 21-3 lead at intermission.

Edinboro drove inside the Ashland 10 on two more occasions in the second half, only to come up empty. The first march ended in a 32-yard field attempt which was no good. On the next series, the Scots drove the seven only to lose the ball on downs.

Both teams tacked on a touchdown in the final stanza, with Josh Geis hauling in his first career touchdown pass for the Scots.

Edinboro gained 317 total yards, with the senior running back tandem of John Williams (114 yards) and Alonzo Roebuck (81 yards) rushing for career highs. Steve Tryon completed 16 of 27 passes for 148 yards, but was sacked five times.

Foster Johnson paced the defensive effort with 12 tackles, while Jermaine Hughley added 11 stops. Ashland finished with 387 total yards, including 224 through the air.

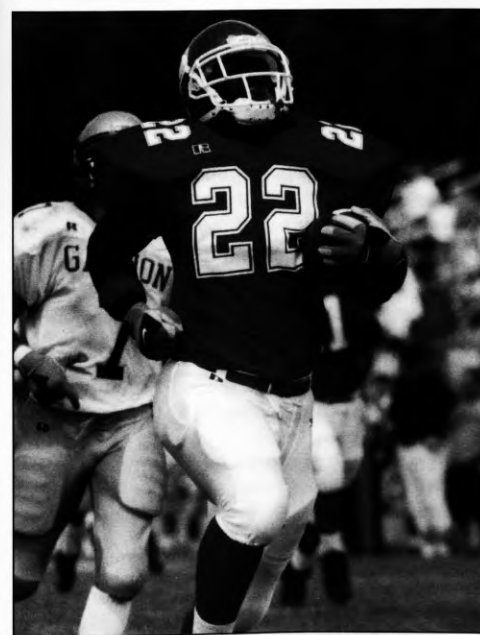

Edinboro, PA -- With head coach Lou Tepper telling his team earlier in the week that at some point a landmark win was needed, his Fighting Scots went out and obliged with a 14-7 win over 17th-ranked Slippery Rock. The game was the PSAC opener for both teams.

The Rock came in having won the last five meetings between the two schools, and had won 23 of its last 24 PSAC West encounters and 42 of 44 regular season contests against Division II foes.

But Slippery Rock was unable to come up with an answer to linebacker Jermaine Hughley, and when John Williams scored on two-yard run with 11:48 to play, the Fighting Scots took their only lead of the day. Williams ran for 34 yards and caught a pass for 17 yards in the 9-play, 59-yard drive. He ended the day with 78 yards on 17 carries and caught three passes.

Hughley, meanwhile, keyed a defense which limited The Rock, the top team in the PSAC in total offense, to 278 total yards. The Rock drove into Edinboro territory three times in the final stanza, but came up empty. Chris Kane stopped the drive with an interception in the end zone. Hughley's sack ended the second march, and Tommie Virgies recorded his first career interception with 1:11 to play to seal the win.

Hughley led the defense with 13 tackles, with 5 for losses and a pair of sacks. Thanks to the effort, he was named the PSAC West Defensive Player of the Week and *Football Gazette* Division II Co-Defensive Player of the Week.

Alonzo Roebuck, who scored Edinboro's first touchdown on a five yard run, ended the afternoon with his first career 100-yard effort, gaining 100 yards on 15 rushes.

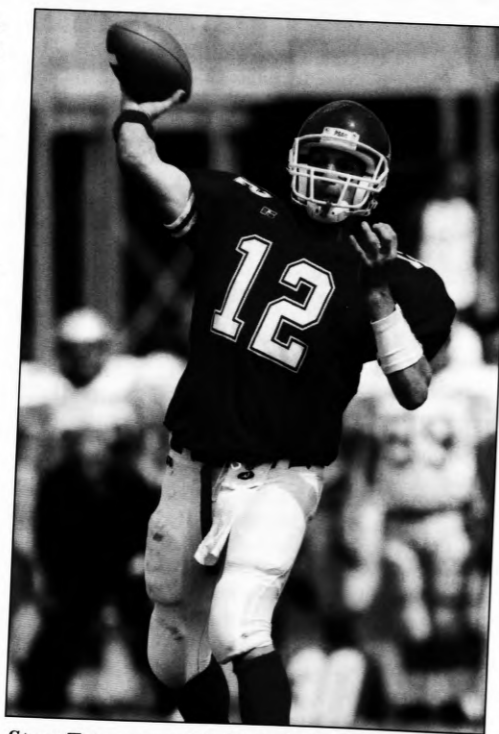

After the Vulcans knotted the score at 7-7, Edinboro scored ten unanswered points in the second quarter. Sean McNicholas accounted for the first score with a 33-yard field goal. Tryon then hooked up with John Williams on a 25-yard scoring aerial late in the half.

After being limited to just 80 total yards in the first 39 minutes of the game, the California(Pa.) offense erupted. Wesley Cates bolted 60 yards for a score, and 16 seconds later the Vulcans again found paydirt on a 32 yard fumble return.

Edinboro regained the lead on Tryon's third touchdown pass of the night, a 22-yarder to Lincoln Bufalino, but the Vulcans scored twice in the fourth quarter following interceptions.

Tryon set career highs with 20 completions in 40 attempts for 255 yards, adding 35 yards

Indiana, PA -- Prior to the game Edinboro head coach Lou Tepper equated the Indians to the bully of the PSAC. The Fighting Scots bloodied the fifth-ranked Indians but could not knock them off their feet.

If not for giving up five plays of 30-or-more yards, Edinboro might well have pulled off the upset. The first accounted for IUP's initial score, a 64-yard pass from Brian Eyeraman to J.R. Thomas. That combination would burn the Scots all day, as Thomas would finish with 5 catches for 202 yards.

The score awoke Edinboro, however, as the Scots put together an impressive 14-play, 80-yard drive that consumed 7 minutes and 45 seconds. John Williams scored the touchdown on a one yard run, but the extra point was no good.

An Edinboro fumble recovery at the IUP 45 set up another scoring opportunity. The Scots used 11 plays and drove to the one, but were turned back on a controversial fourth and goal marking.

After holding the ball for 13:12 of the second quarter, the Scots had the pigskin for 9:50 in

the third stanza, but missed a 24-yard field goal. IUP scored on the first play of the fourth quarter, set up by a 62-yard pass from Eyeraman to Thomas, then put the game away with an insurance score with 2:33 to play. The Scots had one other scoring opportunity, but Sean McNicholas' 25-yard field goal attempt was blocked.

The Indians, while scoring a season-low 21 points, finished with a deceiving 446 total yards. IUP had just 242 yards until the final two plays of the third quarter.

The Edinboro offense was hampered by the loss of Steve Tryon, who went out with a shoulder injury late in the first half and did not return.

McNicholas enjoyed a fine afternoon punting the pigskin, averaging 49.8 yards on five kicks.

by converting a 4th-and-22 play from their own eight with a minute to play. Seven plays later, the Golden Rams' Robert Findora completed his third touchdown pass to Brian Bradley, this one from 19 yards out with 23 seconds to play, completing an improbable comeback and snapping Edinboro's six game home winning streak.

Several inches of snow the night before left Sox Harrison Stadium in less than ideal condition, and gusting winds added to the woes. But the conditions didn't seem to bother either team, as they combined for 761 yards and 56 points.

The Findora to Bradley connection opened the scoring with a 65-yard score. Edinboro answered with a pair of scores. Jack Davis, making his first start of the season, tossed a 21-yard scoring pass to Lincoln Bufalino, and Alonzo Roebuck added a two yard run set up by David Hart's blocked punt.

West Chester would grab a 17-13 lead at the half, and extend it to 24-13 early in the third quarter when Findora and Bradley combined on a 91-yard scoring play.

Back came the Scots, as Davis hooked up with Bufalino for a 71-yard score, and Roebuck dove in from a yard out for his second score with 7:52 left in the third period. The score remained 26-24 until Findora found Cory DeForrest for a 25-yard gain on the 4th-and-22 play, setting the stage for the heartbreaking loss.

Shippensburg, PA -- Edinboro suffered its fourth straight road loss thanks to an inability to take advantage of numerous scoring opportunities. The Fighting Scots repeatedly came up short in the red zone, settling for six field goal attempts.

Dave Brown gave Shippensburg a quick lead, returning the opening kickoff 87 yards for the first of his three touchdowns. The Fighting Scots answered with a drive to the Red Raider 10, but only came away with three points on Sean McNicholas' 44-yard field goal.

McNicholas would later misfire on a 30-yard field goal try, but Josh Geis knotted the score at 6-6 with a 34-yarder, the first of his career, with 11:41 to play in the second quarter.

Geis would boot another three-pointer, this one from 26 yards out, but Shippensburg tacked on a field goal and a 40-yard run by Brown for a 16-9 halftime advantage.

Edinboro had the only scoring opportunity of the third quarter, but Shippensburg blocked Geis' 21-yard try, the third block of the day.

After limiting the Red Raider offense to just

ter, only to watch East Stroudsburg stage several comebacks.

For the second straight week the Scots employed by Sean McNicholas and Josh Geis as placekickers. McNicholas boomed a 45-yard field goal to open the scoring, with the Scots adding a safety early in the second period. Alonzo Roebuck tallied the first of his three touchdown runs from five yards out as Edinboro held a 12-6 lead at intermission.

HARLON HILL AWARD

Two Edinboro University football players have been finalists for the Harlon Hill award, presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II football.

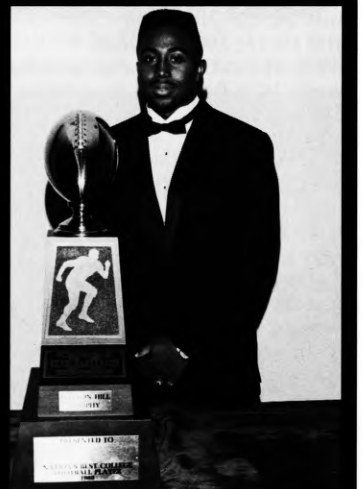
Running back Elbert Cole was one of three finalists in 1989, while wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist a year later. Cole placed third in the '89 balloting, as three-time Harlon Hill recipient Johnny Bailey of Texas A&I captured the honor. Cole earned All-American honors in 1989, receiving first team accolades from Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, second team recognition from *Football Gazette*, and third team status from Associated Press.

Cole rushed for 1,507 yards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns (24) and points (148). He led the Fighting Scots to the PSAC West title, a 8-3 record and a number seven ranking in the final Division II poll.

Priester was runnerup to North Dakota State quarterback Chris Simdorn in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title. Priester was the PSAC Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He was also recognized by Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press and the *Football Gazette* as a first team All-American.

The fleet wide receiver hauled in 47 passes for 1,102 yards and 15 TDs. Edinboro finished 9-3, reaching the Division II quarterfinals.

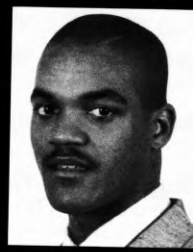

Three-time All-American Jeremy O'Day is in his sixth season as an offensive lineman in the Canadian Football League. O'Day played two seasons for the Toronto Argonauts, helping them win the Grey Cup. The 6'3", 295 lb. offensive guard was chosen by the Argos in the 1997 supplemental draft. He is now a member of the Saskatchewan Roughriders.

Another former Fighting Scot playing north of the border is Jeff Traversy. The 6'5", 280 lb. nose tackle was the Calgary Stampeders' third pick in the 1997 college draft.

The third former Fighting Scot is John Williams, last year's leading rusher. Williams was drafted by British Columbia in the fourth round of this past spring's CFL Draft. He led the Scots with 723 yards rushing and added 14 receptions in 2001.

Several former Edinboro players have enjoyed success in the Arena Football League, most notably Cleveland Pratt. Though just 5'7", 171 lbs., Pratt has prospered in the indoor football league. This past season he played for the Florida Firecats, enjoying an outstanding season. He ranked among the league leaders in scoring and all-purpose yardage.

Former Edinboro wide receiver Quentin Ware-Bey has also toiled in the AFL2, playing for the Carolina Rhinos.

A number of other Fighting Scots have made their marks in the professional ranks. Denorse Mosely was a member of the Miami Dolphins as a defensive back for two seasons, and was also in training camp with the Green Bay Packers a year ago. He spent the majority of his first season with the Dolphins on the practice squad before being activated for the playoffs.

James Dumas, a defensive back two years ago for Edinboro, was signed as a free agent by the San Francisco 49ers in 1999. Gilbert

Grantlin was a free agent signee of the Minnesota Vikings in 1996, earning a spot on the practice squad.

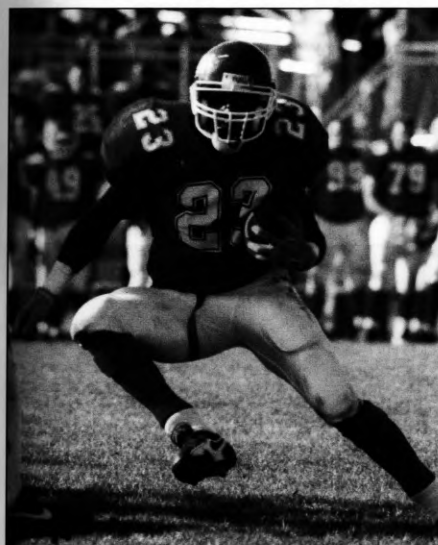
Mike Kegarise, a 6'6", 310 lb. offensive tackle, was highly-regarded by the Seattle Seahawks before suffering a severe knee injury. He spent the 1994 season on the Seahawks' injured reserve list.

Former head coach Tom Hollman produced two other NFL hopefuls. Offensive guard Curtis Rose signed as a free agent with the Miami Dolphins, while wide receiver Ernest Priester was signed by the Denver Broncos. Priester later played for the Cleveland Thunder of the Arena Football League.

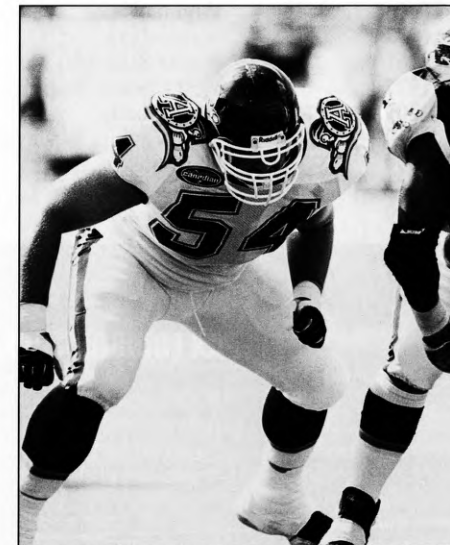

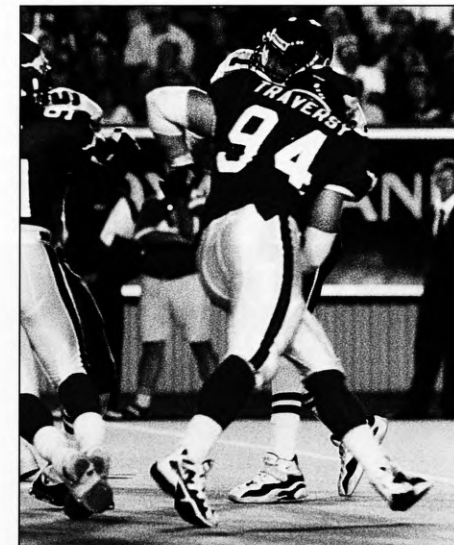

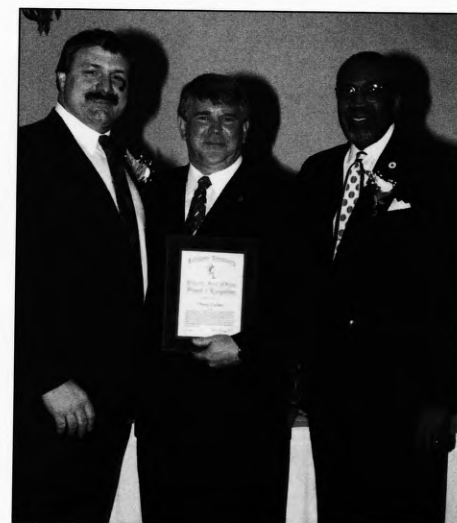

Edinboro University



HISTORY

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania was founded in 1857 as a private academy. Previously named Edinboro Academy, Edinboro State Normal School, Edinboro State Teachers College, and Edinboro State College, the University was the second normal school established in Pennsylvania and the 12th in the United States. On July 1, 1983, it became Edinboro University of Pennsylvania with the formation of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.

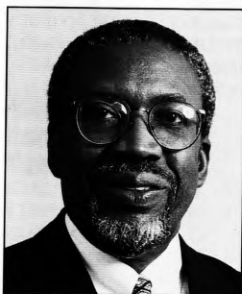
LOCATION

Edinboro University is located in the resort community of Edinboro -- just 15 miles south of Erie, Pennsylvania's fourth-largest city. Edinboro is conveniently located approximately 100 miles from Pittsburgh, Cleveland and Buffalo and is easily accessible from all directions because of its proximity to Interstates 79 and 90.

There are two lakes nearby. Edinboro Lake is a 250-acre recreational area with three guarded beaches for swimming, boating and other water sports. The Edinboro lakeside community features a large selection of cottages for rent. Lake Erie, one of the Great Lakes, is just 15 miles north. Edinboro also is close to several ski resorts for both downhill and cross country enthusiasts. The area is a popular hunting and fishing spot for outdoors enthusiasts.

The University is the largest employer in the area, with approximately 850 full and part-time employees, many of them current and former Edinboro University students.

Dr. Frank G. Pogue, Jr. President



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Pogue holds a Bachelor's Degree from Alabama State University, a Master's Degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor of student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central Administration in Albany, serving in that position for ten years. While vice chancellor, he

also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, Dr. Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. Since 1984, he has served on the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and is a former vice chair and member of its Executive Committee and currently

- ◆ There are seven on-campus residence halls housing 2,500 students.
- ◆ A state-of-the-art, seven-story library in the center of campus features more than 440,000 bound volumes and 1,200,000 microform units, an on-line public access catalog, on-line and CD-ROM searching systems, public access catalog for the visually impaired, and inter-library loan services.
- ◆ Edinboro University houses a planetarium, modern science labs, solar observatory, robotics laboratory, TV studio, radio station, and a center for the performing arts.
- ◆ Edinboro also features a reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, math clinic, parent-child development center, and computer lab for children.
- ◆ Two Compaq large-scale servers, 2,157 personal computers and 36 computer labs with current hardware and software are available for student use throughout the year.

President Pogue also serves as chairperson for the Erie City and County Millennium Commission, "Together 2000."

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the boards of directors for the Erie Conference on Community Development; the United Way of Erie County; Congressman Phil English's High-Tech Advisory Task Force; Leadership Erie, the Presque Isle Partnership; the Erie County Fiscal Management Task Force; the French Creek Council of the Boy Scouts of America; the Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee; and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross. He has also been appointed to the Board of Corporators for both the Hamot Health Foundation and the St. Vincent Health Center.

Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.

As the guiding force of the Fighting Scot athletic program, Baumgartner has initiated the Annual Athletic Fund Drive, a fundraising project designed to provide athletic scholarship funds. The University is also working on a gender equity program in compliance with NCAA guidelines.

A four-time Olympic medalist, Baumgartner served as an Edinboro wrestling coach for nearly 13 years, including seven seasons as the head coach. He compiled a 70-36 record, including 14-0 dual meet record in 1997, the best finish in school history. The Scots then went on to finish sixth at the NCAA Division I Nationals, their highest finish ever.
