Sox Harrison Stadium



Sox Harrison Stadium serves as the home of the Fighting Scots. Dedicated in 1965, the stadium honors the memory of B. Regis "Sox" Harrison, the head football and basketball coach at Edinboro University for 34 years. Sox Harrison was the key figure in the building of

Edinboro's athletic program, unselfishly devoting 34 years of service to the University as an athletic director, coach and physical education instructor. Appropriately, he was the first member inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.

Harrison coached the Fighting Scot football team from its inception in 1926 to 1938, then returned to guide the gridders in 1941 and '42. In addition, he guided the men's basketball team for 23 seasons, from 1928-53, winning 175 games.

Sox Harrison Stadium seats 6,000 people in its two grandstands, along with plenty of standing room. In addition to press boxes on both sides of the stadium, the facility has locker rooms, a training room and complete amenities for fans.

The stadium has undergone several renovations, including a new sound system and improved handicapped access areas in 1999. In 1997, a new grandstand was constructed on the visitor's side of the field, adding 2,500 permanent seats, along with a press box, locker rooms and a training room.

In addition to the football field, the facility contains complete track facilities.


FIGHTING SCOTS ON THE RADIO

Head Coach



Veteran Division I mentor Lou Tepper was appointed the 12th head football coach at Edinboro University, officially taking charge of the Fighting Scot program on January 5, 2000.

Tepper inherited an Edinboro program which had won just eleven games in the previous three seasons. The Scots have shown consistent improvement in "Coach Tep's" three years. The 2000 season brought a 5-6 record, matching the Edinboro record for wins by a first-year head coach, and a fifth place PSAC finish. Three of the losses, however, were lopsided. In 2001, Edinboro finished with a

deceiving 4-6 record. The Fighting Scots were competitive in every contest and finished third in the PSAC. The victories included a stunning 14-7 upset over 17th-ranked Slippery Rock.

Background

Tepper, a native of Keystone, PA, returned to the Division II level after coaching at Division I institutions for almost thirty years. He is renowned as a defensive coaching genius, with a

resume that includes three **Butkus Award** honorees and an Outland Trophy winner. Tepper's list of standouts include Bruce Smith, John Holecek, Simeon Rice, Kevin Hardy, Brad Hopkins, Booger MacFarland, and Ken Dilger, all current NFL standouts. In addi-

tion, he has worked with some of the top head coaches in the country, including Bill Dooley at Virginia Tech, Bill McCartney at Colorado, John Mackovic at Illinois and Gerry DiNardo at LSÚ.

"Being a native of western Pennsylvania, it has been neat to be a head coach again and to be a head coach in this environment," Tepper related following his first season at Edinboro. "I've recruited western Pennsylvania for half of my career. It's a joy to be

Tepper completed his second full season as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana State University in 1999. He began his tenure with the Tigers on December 15, 1997, helping LSU to a 27-9 Independence Bowl win over Notre Dame. All told, he has served as a defensive coordinator for 19 of his 36 years in the coaching profession.

Big Ten Head Coach

The 57-year-old Tepper was appointed the head coach at the University of Illinois on December 13, 1991, just prior to the team's appearance in the John Hancock Sun Bowl. He replaced Mackovic, who left for the head coaching position at the University of Texas. During his five year stint as the Fighting Illini head coach, Tepper compiled a record of 25-31-2, including two more bowl appearances. He guided Illinois to a pair of wins over Ohio State, including one at Columbus; the school's first victory in Ann Arbor against Michigan in 27 years; and three consecutive wins over rival Iowa by a combined score of 122-17. Just as impressive, Tepper graduated 91 percent of his seniors.

Tepper joined the Illinois program in 1988, serving as the defensive coordinator for four seasons and assistant head coach for two years. In his nine seasons at Illinois, he helped the program to six bowl invitations, one Big Ten title and top ten rankings in the AP and UPI polls.

He was honored as the Big Ten's top defensive assistant coach in 1990 by *The Sporting News*. His defensive units annually ranked among the best in the country, finishing 10th in 1989, 14th in 1993, ninth in 1994, and 21st in 1995.

Tepper's 1992 Illini squad finished 6-5-1, suffering a 27-17 defeat to Hawaii in the Holiday Bowl. Illinois went in to Columbus and upset Ohio State, 18-16, and posted a 22-22 tie against Michigan in Ann Arbor.

While his '93 edition finished 5-6, that included a 24-21 win in Ann Arbor against the Wolverines. The Illini made it back to postseason play in 1994, handing East Carolina a 30-0 whitewashing in the Liberty Bowl. The '94 squad finished 7-5, again upsetting one of the elite in the Big Ten. And once again it was on the road, as Illinois shocked Ohio State, 24-10, in Columbus behind Butkus Award winner Dana Howard.

Linebackers

While Penn State has gained the reputation as "Linebacker U",

Illinois could make a good case for that designation as well during Tepper's tenure. He produced consecutive Butkus Award winners in Dana Howard (1994) and Kevin Hardy (1995). Along the way, he also produced Big Ten Defensive Players of the Year in Moe Gardner and Darrick Brownlow (1990), Howard (1993 and '94) and Big Ten Defensive Lineman of the Year Simeon Rice in 1994. For the only time in Big Ten history, Tepper had four first team All-Big Ten linebackers at his disposal. In all, he has coached over 25 professional linebackers, and recently wrote the book, "Complete Linebacking", a 312-page comprehensive book on linebacker play.

Hardy and Rice became the highest defensive draft duo in the history of the NFL draft in 1996 when Hardy went second to Jacksonville and Rice third to Arizona. That stood until the 2000 NFL Draft when Penn State's Courtney Brown and Lavar

Pittsburgh

Tepper began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pittsburgh in 1967, then moved on to the University of New Hampshire from 1968-71, coaching the running backs and linebackers before becoming the defensive coordinator. His next stop was the College of William & Mary, where he joined former New Hampshire head coach Jim Root as the defensive coordinator from 1972-77. The 1976 William & Mary squad posted the school's best record in thirty years. He was the assistant head coach his final year at William & Mary.

Virginia Tech

In 1978, Virginia Tech head coach Bill Dooley hired Tepper as his linebackers coach. Tepper helped build the Hokies into a consistent bowl contender with a defense that annually ranked among the nation's top ten. He stayed at Virginia Tech from 1978-82, working with Outland Trophy winner and Buffalo Bills great Bruce Smith, among others. The 1980 Hokie edition played Miami(FL) in the Peach Bowl.

Colorado


Tepper joined Bill McCartney's staff at Colorado in 1983, serving as the defensive coordinator and assistant head coach until departing for Illinois in 1988. Tepper helped turn around a Buffalo defense which ranked No. 100 nationally in yards allowed prior to his arrival, to one which was as high as 11th in Division I in total defense. He earned the title of assistant head coach to McCartney his final two seasons, and helped the Buffaloes to the 1985 Freedom Bowl and the 1986 Blue Bonnet Bowl. Among the assistant coaches at Colorado was Gerry DiNardo, who would later bring Tepper in to direct his LSU defense.

Personal Background

Tepper, born September 7, 1945, graduated from Rutgers University in 1967. He enjoyed a standout career as a defensive back at Rutgers from 1965-67. As a player, Tepper led the Scarlet Knights in interceptions as a junior and tackles as a senior. He won the George Cronin Trophy as the Most Improved Player in

Tepper is an active member of the American Football Coaches Association and presently sits on the All-American committee, and has previously served on the NCAA Ethics Committee. He is active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and has spoken for Promise-Keepers, founded by former Colorado coach Bill

McCartney. Tepper and his wife, Karen, have two children, Matthew, who recently graduated from Edinboro with a Master's Degree in Counseling, and Stacy Ann, a graduate of LSU who is the grants manager for Meals on Wheels in Columbus, OH.



Boykin played collegiately at the University of Illinois under Lou Tepper.

A four-year letterwinner at Illinois, Boykin was twice named the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week as a defensive back, and was named the Fighting Illini Defensive Champion of the Year. He played in a total of 44 games for the Illini, playing in three bowl games. The Dayton, OH native enjoyed his best season as a senior, recording 25 tackles with 2 passes broken up. As a junior, he had 21 stops, along with a fumble recovery in the end zone for a touchdown against Arizona.

Boykin graduated in 1995 with a Bachelor's Degree in Kinesiology and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Tepper that same year. He worked with the Fighting Illini from 1995-97, picking up a Master's Degree in Higher Education and Administration.

Boykin joined the Wittenberg staff in 1997 as the defensive backs coach. He helped the Tigers post back-to-back 11-1 finishes, winning the North Coast Athletic Conference championship both seasons and reaching the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs. Boykin served on the Wittenberg staff for three seasons. The Tigers went 31-3 during that period, and in 1998 was the number one rated pass

Bradford had previously been at Salisbury State since 1990, and was the Sea Gulls' defensive coordinator from 1994-98.

A graduate of Salisbury State, Bradford began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the linebackers (1990-92) and defensive linemen (1992-94). In 1994, he was promoted to defensive coordinator. In 1997, Salisbury State ranked 38th in NCAA Division III in total defense, allowing just 268 yards per game. His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game.

Bradford graduated from Salisbury State in 1990 with a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration. He completed work on his Master's Degree in Business Administration from Salisbury State in 1992. In addition to working as a member of the football staff, Bradford was a faculty member in the School of Business. Beginning in 1996, he was the Director of the Business Graduate Programs for the Perdue School of Business.

Jim Henson, a highly successful high school coach in Ohio for over twenty years, enters his sixth season on the Edinboro staff.

After working on the defensive side of the ball as the strong safeties/outside linebackers coach for two years, he moved over to the offense

and will once again instruct the running backs. He previously worked with the running backs in 1999 and was in charge of the defensive linemen in '98. Henson is also a professor in the Mathematics Department at Edinboro.

Henson joined the Edinboro staff after serving as a mathematics teacher, football coach and athletic director at Grand Valley High School in Ohio for 22 years. At Grand Valley, he led the Mustangs to a 150-68-4 record, with five Grand River Conference championships, three East Suburban Conference titles, and three state playoff appearances. In the 1990's, Henson's charges posted three undefeated campaigns and a 23-game regular season winning streak. He was named the Conference Coach of the Year eight times and County Coach of the Year three times, culminated by his selection as the Ohio Division V Coach of the Year in 1997 and the Division IV Coach of the Year in '92.

Prior to beginning his stellar career at Grand Valley, Henson debuted as an assistant coach at Cardinal Middlefield (OH) High School, where he served for eight years.

Henson graduated from Hiram College in 1968 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Mathematics, then later completed work on his Master of

McNicholas departed as the career recordholder for punting average (41.0 yards) and punts (236). He has an equally impressive background in powerlifting. Stoner has won two Master's Division National Championships and one world championship. He holds 65 records, including three world and 14 American records.

Stoner and his wife, Susie, reside in Edinboro with their three children -- Katie (19), Robert (15), and Christopher (12).

A Conversation with Lou Tepper



What attracted you to Edinboro?

"I was attracted to Edinboro because I love to coach young men who are serious about the game and use football as a tool to influence them toward positive academic, athletic and social behavior. Edinboro was attractive because of the leadership of the administration, particularly that of Dr. Frank Pogue, Dr. Naomi Johnson and Bruce Baumgartner. Edinboro has a location and setting that can attract quality student-athletes. Karen and I are both familiar with this area and the PSAC. We

love smaller communities yet Erie provides many attractions plus we have entrée to three metropolitan areas in close proximity."

Has it been difficult for you to adjust to Division II football?

"My biggest challenge has been to create a Division I mindset in a Division II setting. Sometimes people lack vision because certain things have been the way they are for so long. It's been really fun to see players, co-workers and this community expand their horizons to do things with greater expectations. It's been a real joy to see so many react positively to this challenge. I have found it very enjoyable and at times down right thrilling."

Over the last two years you've made several offensive adjustments. What can we look forward to this year?

"We've been able to establish a consistent running game that has produced All-PSAC running backs like Bernard Henry and Alonzo Roebuck. John Williams also contributed a great deal before being drafted by British Columbia of the CFL. This year we hope to be able to throw the ball as effectively as we have been able to move it on the ground. We have two quarterbacks with starting experience and a group of receivers who feel they can contribute."

How much importance do you place on special teams?

"Special teams have always been one of my passions because they account for over 50% of the yardage in a game and yet only 15% of the total snaps. Few fans recognize the impact of special teams and many players don't buy into its significance. John Dudley of the Erie Times did an article last year indicating that we had blocked twice as many kicks as any team in the PSAC. In fact, over a three year period we have blocked nearly one out of every

five placements and have had twenty-four blocks in a thirty game period. Sean McNicholas finished second in the NCAA with a 44.2 yard punt average and signed with the New York Jets after the draft. We have some marquee special teams performers who can change the course of the game."

You open the season against one of the best Division I-AA teams in the country in Youngstown State. What is your thinking behind playing such a contest?

"I've always believed that men long for challenges and playing the best raises the bar for our preparations. YSU will be the most talented team that we play and is 23-0 against Division II competition. We are excited to see how much we have improved. We are trying to schedule YSU for 2005 and 2006 as well."

We've talked a lot about the football side of things, but academics are also a very important issue to you. Please discuss.

"While at Illinois, we had a very enviable graduation rate over nine years in the Big Ten. That is also coming to Edinboro. This past semester was perhaps the best academic performance of my 37 year career! We had 77 players this spring in our program and 70 percent of them had over a 2.5 GPA. Our staff is doing it by recruiting more serious students and young men with character. The newcomers who join us now have a peer group that takes their academics seriously. The old adage that 'we become like our friends' is true and it works in the classroom as well."

After nearly thirty years in Division I at schools such as Virginia Tech, Colorado and the University of Illinois, how do you compare the talent level in Division II?

"We are becoming much more competitive through our recruiting process and our development program. We have a number of players who would have played for me in the Big Ten and several who could be outstanding at that level. The fact that Sean McNicholas signed with the New York Jets and that John Williams was drafted in the CFL indicates that there is a lot of talent in the PSAC."

You came to Edinboro with the reputation as a defensive genius, particularly when it comes to linebacker play. Is it safe to say that it is not a coincidence that at least one linebacker each year has earned first team AII-PSAC honors?

"I think it would be safe to say that I'm thrilled each day to teach linebackers their trade. My book 'Complete Linebacking' has attracted a number of prospects to us and high school coaches reading that book and knowing of my career have recommended many linebackers to us."

2003 Outlook

Fighting Scots Look to Celebrate 75th Year with Winning Season

Since arriving on the scene at Edinboro University in 2000, head coach Lou Tepper has had a tradition of providing motivational statements for his players. "Tough & Classy" and "Champions Finish" are just two of the veteran coach's phrases to follow. Don't look for Tepper to steal one from Al Davis this year and dedicate the 2003 campaign to "Just Win Baby", but he definitely expects the on-field accomplishments to match the success enjoyed off the field. As Edinboro enters its 75th season of competition, winning had become a tradition prior to the recent demise, and Tepper works countless hours with one goal in mind - returning the Fighting Scots to a position of dominance in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference.

The Fighting Scots finished the 2002 season with a 5-6 ledger, the sixth straight losing season. When Tepper took over the reins at Edinboro the program was in disarray. The team has increased its number of players significantly and the quality of its student-athletes. Edinboro has become more competitive on the field since Tepper arrived (14-18) and is expecting to have a winning season this year. "Last year

losses by 6, 6, 4 and 4 points," stressed Tepper. Decisive wins over California(Pa.) (38-22) and Lock Haven

(37-14) at the end of the season should serve as a springboard for the upcoming year.

In addition to the strong finish on the field, the team made great strides in the classroom and posted "perhaps the best semester in my 37year career this past spring," according to Tepper. "I applaud our team and the academic work of our staff for this tremendous turnaround."

A total of eight starters return on offense and five on defense, with

31 letterwinners back. One of the most glaring weaknesses on the team at the time of Tepper's appointment was depth on the offensive and defensive lines. Now as the he enters his fourth year in charge of the Fighting Scots, it's strong play in the trenches that hopefully will lead to the team's first winning record since 1996.

"Overall, we'll probably have seven offensive linemen who can get quality reps," Tepper pointed out at the conclusion of spring drills, although several summer develop-

ments may alter that viewpoint. On the defensive side of the ball, strong linebacker play has always been the trademark of Teppercoached defensive units, but the defensive line will be hard to overlook in 2003. "I feel the defensive line's maturity will be the cornerstone of our defensive success," noted Tepper.

A key component of Tepper's teams are the specialty units, and that is an area that absorbed major losses in All-American punter Sean McNicholas and placekicker Geoff Heyl. "I feel much better about our special teams' effort," stressed Tepper. "We have a lot of kids who long to be on special teams. That's not usually the norm in spring practice.'

The kicking game isn't the only area to suffer personnel losses. Offensively, the Scots must replace 1,000-yard rusher Alonzo Roebuck, and Brandon Nicodemus, a four-year starter at left guard, will be sorely missed. The defense faces a reshuffling both at linebacker and in the secondary. The linebacker corps was particularly hard hit, with Dave Smith, a four-time All-PSAC West selection, gone along with Foster Johnson and last year's leading tackler, All-PSAC West performer James Cowart.

The schedule is another obstacle standing in the way of a winning season. Tepper jumped at the chance to square off against Division I-AA powerhouse Youngstown State, with the Scots opening the season on Thursday, August 28 against the Penguins. Edinboro returns to the Buckeye State a week later to play at Ashland, then plays its third straight Ohio squad on September 20 when Tiffin invades Sox Harrison Stadium for the home opener. Eight games against PSAC competition follows, including road contests at Indiana(Pa.) and Clarion, two of the favorites in the PSAC West.

With the Youngstown State encounter setting the example, Tepper is not one to shy away from a challenge. He knows that the Scots have been very competitive the last two seasons, and with physical units on both sides of the line, a defense with better overall speed, and an evolving offense, 2003 is earmarked as that breakthrough campaign.

Special Teams

How much emphasis does Tepper place on special teams' play? Sit down with him for a team assessment, and the first subject to come up is special teams. He is quick to point out that a year ago the Fighting Scots led the PSAC in net punting and were one of the top teams in the country, that Geoff Heyl led the PSAC in field goals, and that Edinboro has blocked 28 kicks over the last three years.

'The challenge will be to replace two outstanding kickers, Sean McNicholas and Geoff Heyl," noted Tepper. McNicholas finished second in Division II in punting with a school-record 44.2 yards per punt, earning first team AFCA and Associated Press Little All-America accolades. He signed a contract with the New York Jets this spring. Heyl, a transfer from Connecticut who played one year with the Fighting Scots, made 10 of 18 field goals and 29 of 31 extra points.

"As we go into the fall, Eli Visnick leads as the kickoff starter," Tepper commented. "We feel real good about him. He'll compete with Kody Robertson for the placekicking job. Matt Barley and Kody Robertson will compete for the punting job. I think Kody is very talented. It's just a question whether he is ready as a true freshman." Barley is the only one of the three with collegiate experience after transferring this past winter from Erie Community College(NY). He averaged 37.0 yards on 39 punts, earning second team All-Northeast Football Conference honors.

In Justin Lipscomb the Fighting Scots possess a proven return man. Lipscomb averaged 9.8 yards on eight punt returns and 23.9 yards on ten kickoff returns. Tepper looks to develop another quality return man in fall camp.

2003 Outlook

Offense

Edinboro has improved its scoring offense steadily the past three years, moving from 14.8 points per game in 2000 to 20.2 in 2001 and 23.0 this past season. Offensive coordinator Scott Browning believes in a strong running game (150.3 yards per game in 2002) but realizes that the passing game must improve if the Fighting Scots are to rank with the best teams in Division II.

It is hoped that the offensive success enjoyed in the last two games will carry over to this season. Edinboro defeated California(Pa.), 38-22, piling up 355 total yards, then ended the year with a 37-14 win over Lock Haven thanks to 434 yards, including a season-high 270 rushing yards.


Questions exist at quarterback and running back, but the Scots possess a mature offensive line and the wide receiver corps has significantly more depth. Edinboro's contingent of tight ends would make anybody in the PSAC envious.

QUARTERBACK: Cam Marsh and Justin Bouch shared the position a year ago, with Marsh starting five games in all and Bouch six. Marsh, a 6'1", 200 lb. junior, proved an efficient passer but was unable to stay healthy. While just a redshirt freshman, Bouch showed glimpses of promise, such as a 353-yard passing effort at East Stroudsburg, along with typical first-year jitters.

Bouch, a 6'3, 205 lb. sophomore, enters the fall as the starter. He completed 90 of 172 passes for 1,180 yards with 4 TDs and 9 INTs, adding three touchdowns rushing. "Justin had a very good spring," pointed out Tepper. "He was very efficient in the spring and has a much better understanding of the offense."

Marsh actually spent the spring at wide receiver but will move back to quarterback to alleviate any depth issues. A year ago he completed 57 of 99 passes for 573 yards with 5 TDs and 4 INTs. "Cam played wide receiver in the spring and was very athletic," noted Tepper. "He will compete for the quarterback job. If he is number two, he may become my first "slash". If number one, he'll be a quarterback only. He could also be an excellent punt returner."

Redshirt freshman Brandon Hunt missed part of spring ball, which hurt his development. But he ended the spring game with a long touchdown pass to win the game. Tepper notes that he has a big-time

The position was further bolstered this summer with the late addition of Matt McAdams. The 6'3", 205 lb. senior is a transfer from Western Illinois, where he served as the backup a vear ago.

McAdams appeared in four games for the Leathernecks, completing 5 of 9 passes for 60 yards and adding a touchdown rushing.

RUNNING BACKS:

The loss of a runner such as All-PSAC tailback Alonzo Roebuck would normally leave a gaping hole to fill. Roebuck finished third in the PSAC in rushing

with 1,177 yards and 13 TDs. However, Tepper has faced the loss of a quality running back every year.

This year's solution to the problem could come in several forms. First and foremost is Brandon Munson, a 6'0", 218 lb. junior who served as Roebuck's caddy a year ago. Munson's talent has been unquestioned since his arrival, but now he must step up and take over as the main man. A year ago he finished with 479 yards on 102 rushes, a 4.9 yard average, with 6 TDs. He ran for a career-high 140 yards on 20 carries with 3 TDs in his only career start last year vs. Tiffin. Munson finished the year with a 110-yard effort against Lock Haven, his third career 100-yard game.

Matt Phillips, a second team All-PSAC West selection as a fullback at Shippensburg in 2001, could also become the feature back. The 6'1", 250 lb. junior sat out the 2002 season after transferring to Edinboro. A bruising blocker, he finished the 2001 season with 591 yards on 150 carries with 8 TDs for the Red Raiders.

"Matt Phillips can be an impact player," Tepper boasted. "He was at 265 lbs., now he's down to 250, and he wants to be 240. He's our first big-time fullback prospect. He gives us an iso-blocker that we've longed to have in the past."

Actually, the starter coming out of spring ball was J.D. Baker, a 5'8", 200 lb. junior who saw limited action a year ago. Baker gained 80 yards on 23 carries while appearing in four games. Tepper loves his

Mike Martin returns for his senior year at fullback. The 5'11", 240 lb. Martin has started on and off the last two years, but has struggled to avoid the injury bug. He caught 4 passes for 61 yards.

RECEIVERS: Depth abounds at wide receiver, although the question remains whether the Fighting Scots have a long ball threat at the position. For starters there's senior Sean Hess, a physical 6'4", 200 lb. wideout who finished with 25 catches for 384 yards and 2 TDs. "Sean has a big body, is a strong blocker, and a real steady receiver. He also gives us fine leadership," noted Tepper.

Tepper views junior Justin Lipscomb and sophomore Jordan Bobitski as co-starters with Hess. Lipscomb made great strides a year ago, hauling in 22 passes for 442 yards, a 20.1 yard average, with 2 TDs. Bobitski added 21 receptions for 181 yards, but missed the spring due to an injury.

Several other receivers will push this trio for playing time. Tom LaVerde, a redshirt freshman, may be the speed receiver the Scots covet. A high school teammate of quarterback Brandon Hunt, he has run a 10.6 100 meters. Ryan Valasek, another redshirt, has plenty of quickness but is still learning the offense. Rangy sophomore Jeff Dinger is a strong blocker and catches the ball well. Dinger caught 3 passes for 19 yards.

2003 Outlook

When Tepper arrived at Edinboro, possibly the weakest position on the team was tight end. Now it may well be the strongest. "As a group, you're hard-pressed to find this much talent at one position," Tepper exclaimed. "I've never had four tight ends as far along as these four."

Juniors C.J. Trivisonno and Ed Brown have shared the position the last two years. Both will see plenty of action this year, but Tepper was particularly impressed with Trivisonno's development this spring. "C.J. took a real step forward," noted Tepper. "He became a true complete tight end for the first time. He blocked well and caught the ball." A year ago he caught 14 passes for 106 yards with 2 TDs.

Brown, meanwhile, missed half of spring ball while competing for the track & field team. He's a very solid blocker, but lacks Trivisonno's receiving skills. He caught 5 passes for 77 yards, with

two of the receptions going for touchdowns.

The talent doesn't end there. Sophomore Nate Eimer saw limited playing time a year ago and has yet to catch a pass in his career, but is likely the best receiver among the tight ends. An excellent student, as well, Tepper expects his playing time to increase this year. Then there's Aaron Fetty, a 6'5", 220 lb. redshirt freshman, who has good size and solid receiving skills.

OFFENSIVE LINE: Over the past few years the offensive line has developed into a strong unit. Depth along the line took a hit with David Beck expected to miss the season due to an offseason automobile accident and Aaron Thompkins out due to financial difficulties. But three of five starters are back, and if Jason Oman can regain his form after missing the last two years with injuries, in essence the Scots return four starters.

Anchoring the unit is two-time All-PSAC West first team center Joe Valvoda, a *Street & Smith's* preseason All-American. The 6'2", 290 lb. senior has started 24 straight games at center, and excels whether it is the run game or pass blocking.

"Scott Browning, our offensive line coach, has worked at Edinboro the last 18 years and feels that he is the best center we have had during his career here," boasted Tepper.

Valvoda's joined at right guard by Anthony Peluso, a 6'1", 285 lb. senior who has started the last two years. In fact, Tepper lauded Peluso as the team's best offensive lineman during spring drills. "I enjoy his nasty attitude, and he really impressed us this spring. Anthony can be special," noted Tepper, who added that Peluso was named the Most Proficient Lineman during the spring.

Greg Bzorek, a 6'6", 310 lb. sophomore, moves to right tackle after sharing the left tackle duties with Beck a year ago. Bzorek started ten games, and Tepper stressed that he was one of the most improved lineman in the spring. "Greg has the maturity of starting a year under his belt and is lighter on his feet," Tepper commented.

A starter in 11 games at right tackle in 2000, mammoth Jason Oman will hopefully line up at left tackle this year. Oman missed each of the last two seasons following ankle surgeries. He spent the recovery time in the weight room, bulking up to 6'4", 325 lbs. "We're hopeful he will come healthy into camp," Tepper stated optimistically. "He's a very strong and very determined player." Beck, a 6'5", 288 lb. junior, started most of the 2002 season at right tackle after starting the final five games at left tackle as a freshman.

Greg Kaczor, a promising 6'2", 285 lb. redshirt freshman, enters fall drills as the starter at left guard in place of Brandon Nicodemus, although Tepper had hoped to bring him along a little slower. Original plans called for Bzorek to play left guard and Beck or Thompkins to line up at right tackle. "Greg can play both guard and center, "stressed Tepper. "He reminds you of a young Peluso."

Mike Mills (6'5", 290 lbs.) is another redshirt freshman who figures to push for playing time. "Mike is a talented linemen," noted Tepper. "He still has progress to make and fall camp will be his chance to prove himself." Mills is slated to back up Oman at left tackle.

Tepper feels that Mike Flinn, a 6'4", 265 lb. sophomore, had a good spring and could see action at tackle. Junior Ron Bzorek (6'3", 300 lbs.), Greg's older brother, is available at guard. Several former walk-ons also bear watching, including Steve Bruno (6'3", 280 lbs.), Anthony Sufra (6'2", 290 lbs.), Andrew Griffith (6'0", 225 lbs.) and Anthony Tedesco (6'2", 260 lbs.).

Defense

There's another saying in football that says "Speed Kills". With only five starters back on defense, including just one regular in the secondary, that is the philosophy of the 2003 Fighting Scot defense. "I like our defensive look," stated Tepper. "Overall defensively we run better. We're smaller and faster at linebacker, and our front four has toughness. Our strength lies with the defensive line. We lost some significant linebackers, but we're still two deep and they can run. The question marks are depth in the secondary and at rush linebacker."

A year ago the Fighting Scots were the worst defense in the PSAC the first half of the season and arguably the best during the second half of the year. Over the last five games opponents averaged just 110.8 yards through the air while only completing 36.9 percent of their passes. Some of the early season production through the air is attributed to the fact three of the top four cornerbacks were injured. In a selfless move, Matt Birkett, a quality Division I wide receiver at Rhode Island, moved to corner and started there for the first time in week number four at East Stroudsburg.

"Because of the injuries in the secondary, we were really limited in coverage schemes until the corners gained experience," explained Tepper.

Defensive coordinator Rod Boykin looks for a much more efficient unit this fall. Overall, the Fighting Scots gave up just 143.0 yards per game rushing and plan to build on that effort.

DEFENSIVE LINE: Three starters return along the front line, although the talents of four-year starter Dave Smith will be greatly missed at rush linebacker. Smith, a four-time All-PSAC selection, left as the career leader in tackles for losses and ranked second in career sacks.

However, the interior of noseguard Eugene Grooms and tackle Eric Neavins should prove extremely difficult to dent. Grooms, a 6'1", 300 lb. senior, earned first team All-PSAC West accolades a year ago after being selected to the second team as a sophomore. He finished the 2002 campaign with 55 tackles, fourth on the team, with 8 for losses. Regarded as the best noseguard in the PSAC, Grooms has All-American caliber talent but has struggled to keep his weight down.

"Eugene is strong and knows our scheme," related Tepper. "We hope he'll return this summer at 285 lbs. He can be a special player at that weight."

Neavins started nine games a year ago and proved capable of coming up with the big play, as evidenced by his 7 tackles for losses

and 2.5 sacks. He ended the year with 45 tackles.

Kyle Thorne and Greg MacAnn shared the defensive end position, with Thorne, a 6'7", 270 lb. sophomore getting off to a fast start before succumbing to injuries, and MacAnn filling in nicely and shared the starting job with Thorne after spring practice. Thorne started the first seven contests, ending the year with 46 tackles, including 13 for losses while tying for the team lead with 4 sacks. MacAnn, a 6'3", 217 lb. sophomore, took over as the starter the final four games and had 17 tackles, with 8 for losses and 2 sacks.

"I consider them co-starters," Tepper commented. "Thorne missed the spring due to an injury and was hurt part of last year, but I think he's ready to be a real good player for us. MacAnn looks frail for the position but plays well and is versatile."

Seth Fragale will start at Smith's rush linebacker role. A former wrestler, the junior is now up to 225 lbs. and saw a good deal of action last year, finishing with 16 tackles. "Seth is fun to watch," exuded Tepper. "His motor runs all the time. He has great pursuit. He's a relentless pass rusher and can play in coverage like a linebacker."

Depth gives Tepper great hope that the front four can be a dominant unit. "I feel like we have seven guys who can play a lot," he stressed. "We just need to find a backup for Fragale."

That depth starts with Otto Hoover, a 6'3", 285 lb. senior who has seen time both on offense and defense during his career. After playing defensive tackle in 2000, he moved over to the offensive side of the ball in 2001, but returned to defense last year and enjoyed a solid season, finishing with 16 tackles. "Otto can spell Eric (Neavins) at any time," noted Tepper.

Newcomer Carleton Glover will come in and spell Grooms at noseguard. A 5'10', 285 lb. transfer from Hutchinson (KS) Community College, Glover has quick feet and is extremely strong. "Glover has squatted 650 lbs. and benched 450 lbs.," Tepper pointed out. "We think he will be an outstanding addition."

The one place depth is a concern is at rush linebacker, where experience is greatly lacking. James Barnett is a 6'2", 240 lb. sophomore, but he failed to pick up the schemes a year ago and saw limited action. J.R. Prad, a 6'1", 245 lb. junior, is another possibility, and MacAnn could also be pressed into service at rush linebacker.

LINEBACKERS: The good news is Jermaine Hughley returns for his fourth season at inside linebacker, and after two injury-filled campaigns, he remained relatively unscathed in 2002, missing just two contests. Unfortunately, his running mates, Foster Johnson and Chris Wiggins, are gone, leaving the Scots without two of the top five tacklers. Throw in the loss of last year's leading tackler, James Cowart at outside linebacker, and the linebacking corps appears up in the air.

But remember, Tepper's specialty is linebacking play, and he sees a bright outlook for the group. Edinboro has had at least one linebacker earn first team All-PSAC West honors in each of Tepper's first three years. Oddly enough, it was a different player each year, with Cowart garnering the attention a year ago after totaling 70 tackles.

It may seem like awhile ago, but Tepper's first All-PSAC backer was Hughley, an extremely active 6'0", 205 lb. senior. Hughley earned first team All-PSAC West honors as a freshman, and was off to a fast start in 2001 only to miss the final six games due to injury. He has missed 11 out of 32 games during his career, but when healthy is one of the most active linebackers in the PSAC. A year ago he finished sixth on the team in tackles with 48 in nine games.

"Without question our most forceful leader is Hughley," Tepper stated. "He had a tremendous spring and is an admired leader."

The other inside linebacker job is up for grabs between senior Dylan Wessell (6'2", 225 lbs.) and junior Brandon Banas. Wessell is another player who has moved between positions, working out at full-back last summer before returning to defense. He finished with 5 tackles, then missed time this spring due to injury.

Banas is a 6'1", 217 lb. transfer from Erie (NY) Community College. He joined the program in January and had an opportunity to compete in spring drills. At ECC, Banas earned second team All-Northeast Football Conference honors, finishing as the leading tackler with 83 stops, including 16 for losses and 6 sacks. He also displayed a nose for the ball with three fumble recoveries and a pair of interceptions. Banas caught Tepper's attention in the spring, as he noted, "He was the highest point-getter in the spring of the entire defense."

A pair of redshirt freshmen also bear watching. Ben Stroup (6'1", 190 lbs.) will backup Hughley after what Tepper called "a dazzling spring". While expected to be a force on special teams, Stroup will also make his presence felt at linebacker. Dave Jazenski is a strong player at 5'11", 225 lbs., and will likely see plenty of special teams action, as well, while pushing Wessell and Banas.

Nick Roth was slated to start at drop linebacker a year ago before going down with a knee injury in the spring. He returned last fall to play in four contests, finishing with 4 tackles and an interception. Now completely healed, the 5'11", 210 lb. senior looks to hold off the challenges of junior Robert Burns and redshirt freshman James Soltis. Burns appeared in five games, registering 13 tackles.

"Roth has good ability and great dependability," Tepper pointed out. "Burns has great ability but lower dependability due to his inexperience." The key could be Soltis, 6'2", 190 lbs., who was named the Freshman of the Year last year and earned a scholarship after walking on. "He played this spring at free safety, and now moves back to drop linebacker," related Tepper. "He will compete and will definitely impact special teams."

DEFENSIVE BACKS: The secondary will definitely have a new look, with Matt Birkett the lone returnee. And Tepper would like nothing better than to see the former University of Wisconsin transfer playing elsewhere. Birkett was recruited a year ago to play wide receiver, but injuries forced his move to cornerback. He got off to a slow start himself due to injuries, missing the first two games. He quickly earned a starting role, starting seven contests. Birkett finished with 27 tackles and a pair of interceptions.

"Matt is a very talented cornerback," stated Tepper. "When he emerged, we started playing gutsy defense." Even still, it is hoped that enough depth will develop in the secondary to allow Birkett to see some time at wide receiver, as well.

Sophomore Chris Avery is the favorite to start opposite Birkett at cornerback. Avery impressed quickly a year ago, starting the third game of the season against Tiffin. He appeared in four games in all before missing the second half of the season with an injury, finishing with 16 tackles.

With depth at cornerback severely lacking, Tepper went out and brought in junior college transfer Jermaine Truax of Alfred State. Truax led Alfred State with four interceptions while recording 32 tackles.

Regis Burns, a former walk on, was described by Tepper as "the most productive defensive back" during the spring. The 6'0", 210 lb. sophomore enters the fall as the co-starter at strong safety along with senior Thomas Wallace. Burns is a tough hard-nosed player, but has seen limited time in the secondary. He totaled 6 tackles in 2002. Wallace played in eight games, finishing with 14 tackles. Both are forceful special teams performers.

Tepper added a junior college transfer for competition at strong safety, as well, in the form of Chris Sinceno. A 6'0", 210 lb. junior, Sinceno was a second team All-Northeast Football Conference selection while playing for Alfred State. He had 106 tackles.

Chris Gilman proved a pleasant surprise in the spring and emerged as the starter at free safety. A former transfer from Lock Haven, he played cornerback in his first season with the Scots, finishing with 8 tackles. "Chris was a wonderful surprise," admitted Tepper. "He played special teams and a little cornerback last year. He improves our man coverage at free safety."

Senior Keldrick Walker and junior Mark Santucci will push Gilman. Walker sat out the 2002 campaign and is a former linebacker who has excelled on special teams in the past. "Keldrick is a real good run support guy," noted Tepper. "He's a little rusty, but he's been a big special teams player in the past." Santucci transferred from Pittsburgh a year ago and had to sit out the season. He suffered an injury prior to the spring to fall further behind, but it is hoped he can contribute at free safety and as a nickel back.

Erie, PA -- Edinboro opened its 2002 season with a workmanlike triumph at Gannon. The victory snapped a four-game losing streak dating back to last year, and also ended a string of three straight losses in season openers.

The Fighting Scot defensive unit limited a Gannon offense which led NCAA Division II in rushing in 2001 (312.9 ypg.) to just 316 total yards, including 138 on the ground. After jumping to an early lead, the Edinboro offense turned conservative, finishing with 192 yards.

Edinboro took the lead for good on its first play of the game. Following a Gannon punt, Cam Marsh hooked up with Lincoln Bufalino on a 55-yard scoring pass less than three minutes into the game. For Marsh, making his first career start, it marked his first career touchdown pass.

The Fighting Scots boosted the lead to 10-0 on a 40-yard Geoff Heyl field goal late in the second quarter, then went up 17-0 midway through the third quarter thanks to a 70-yard, 13-play march. While using up over seven minutes, Alonzo Roebuck capped the drive with a 6-yard scoring run.

Gannon took advantage of an Edinboro fumble to get on the scoreboard on the second play of the fourth quarter on their fourth try from a vard out.

The Scot defense rose to ocassion repeatedly in the second half, stopping the Golden Knights three times in Edinboro territory, after Gannon drove to the 19, 5 and 14-yard lines.

James Cowart paced the defense with a career-high 10 tackles. Punter Sean McNicholas proved a major weapon, as well, averaging 47.7 yards on three kicks, including a 61-yarder.


Edinboro 29, Ashland 26

Edinboro, PA -- The Fighting Scots held off a late Ashland rally to defeat the Eagles and get off to a 2-0 start for the first time since 1992. The win propelled Edinboro into 39th in the Football Gazette Division II Top 40.

Roebuck accounted for the only scores in the next two quarters with a 3-yard run in the second period and an 8-yard burst in the third, setting up the wild finish.

Tiffin, OH -- For the third game in a row Edinboro proved that statistics don't win football games. The Fighting Scots were outgained for the third straight week but improved to 3-0 with a win against Tiffin in the first meeting ever between the two. The Scots entered the game ranked 38th in the Football Gazette poll.

The Edinboro win was even more impressive since the Scots were without leading rusher Alonzo Roebuck and lost starting quarterback Cam Marsh in the first quarter. Brandon Munson stepped in nicely for Roebuck, rushing for a career-high 140 yards on 20 carries with 3 TDs. It marked his second career 100-yard game.

Marsh led Edinboro to scores on two of its first three possessions as the Scots jumped to a 14-0 lead. The sophomore accounted for the first touchdown on a 5-yard pass to Ed Brown, while Munson scored his first six-pointer on a two-yard run with 4:35 left in the first quarter.

Red-shirt freshman Justin Bouch replaced Marsh and had some shaky moments in the first half in his first varsity playing time. He threw a pair of interceptions as Tiffin rallied to knot the score at 14-14 at halftime.

The Edinboro offense regrouped in the second half. Bouch led the Scots on a 7-play, 55-yard drive midway through the third quarter, scoring his first career touchdown on a 6-yard run. The Scots boosted the margin to 28-14 on the first play of the fourth period as Munson burst up the middle untouched for a 22-yard touchdown on a 3rd-and-12 play.

Tiffin took the ensuing kickoff and drove to the Boro three, but the Scot defense held on 4thand-goal as Foster Johnson and Dave Smith combined for an 8-yard loss.

Tiffin closed the gap to 28-21 on a 21-yard pass from Ryan Harpold to Darryl Chapman, but Edinboro came up with the onside kickoff and Munson put the game away on the very next play with a 40-yard scoring run.

Defense and special teams were the biggest ingredients in the win. Tiffin came into the game ranked eighth in NCAA Division II in total offense (468.0 ypg.) and ninth in rushing offense (259.5 ypg.). While outgaining the Scots, 350 yards to 318, the Dragons were held

well below their season average, and gained just 86 yards rushing. The Scots came up with 5 sacks.

East Stroudsburg, PA -- Edinboro, ranked 34th by Football Gazette, suffered its first loss of the 2002 campaign in heart-breaking fashion. The loss negated a brilliant performance by signal-caller Justin Bouch in his first career start.

The Fighting Scots drove from their own 34 to the ESU six in the final half minute. But on a first-and-goal play, Edinboro fumbled the ball away.

East Stroudsburg appeared to have the game well in hand entering the fourth quarter, holding a 24-10 lead. The Scots closed to 24-17 on Bouch's 52-yard pass to Sean Hess, the first touchdown reception of the junior's career. But the Warriors answered right back with a 65-yard drive on Jeremy Palm's fourth touchdown pass. The extra point was blocked.

Bouch responded with his second touchdown pass, a 50-yarder to Justin Lipscomb, his first career touchdown catch. Bouch ended the afternoon completing 22 of 35 passes for 353 yards, the second-highest yardage total in school history.

East Stroudsburg relied almost entirely on the pass in the first half, as Palm completed 14 of 35 passes with three touchdown passes. He would end the day with 379 yards through the air, the fourth-highest total ever vs. Edinboro, completing 21 of 49 aerials.

Bouch accounted for Edinboro's lone touchdown in the first half on a two-yard run. Geoff Heyl added a 41-yard field goal as the Scots trailed 21-10 at intermission.

Edinboro finished with 474 yards of total offense, but the Scots were called for 12 penalties for 113 yards and were just 4 of 14 on third down plays. East Stroudsburg, meanwhile, gained 475 yards and converted 8 of 18 third down plays.

Alonzo Roebuck had his fifth career 100yard effort with 130 yards rushing on 22 carries. Hess entered the contest without a reception in the first three games, but totaled 5 catches for 113 yards.



Shippensburg took the lead for good on its first possession, taking the opening kickoff and driving 73 yards on just six plays. John Kuhn scored the first of his three touchdowns from two yards out. The extra point was blocked, but the ball was picked up by Richard Hershaw, who

Edinboro entered the contest ranked 28th in Division II in rushing defense, but the Red Raiders shred the Scots for 326 yards on the ground, the most allowed since head coach Lou Tepper took over and the 10th-highest by an opponent in school history. Adding in 196 yards through the air, Shippensburg totaled 522 total yards, also the highest since Tepper arrived.



Edinboro, PA -- Indiana(Pa.), ranked 14th in Division II, scored touchdowns on eight of its first nine possessions to spoil Edinboro's Homecoming.

Edinboro fumbled four plays into the game, with IUP recovering at the Edinboro 26. Brian Eyerman threw the first of his record-tying five touchdown passes, a 4-yarder to Carmelo Ocasio. IUP fumbled on its next possession, with the Fighting Scots recovering deep in IUP territory. The Indians defense stopped Edinboro three times inside the two yard line, then the IUP offense put together its third 99-yard drive of the season. Eyerman did the honors once again, passing three yards to Justin Spence for a 13-0 lead at the end of the first quarter.

IUP boosted the lead to 34-7 at halftime as Spence ran one yard for a touchdown and Eyerman threw touchdown passes of 20 yards to Ocasio and 23 yards to J.R. Thomas. Alonzo Roebuck answered with a one yard scoring run for the Scots.

The lead increased to 54-7 midway through the third quarter as Eyerman threw one more touchdown pass in the third quarter, then watched as backup Kevin Weidl hooked up with Thomas on a 67-yard scoring play.

Game 9

Kutztown 14, Edinboro 10

November 2, 2002 Sox Harrison Stadium

Edinboro, PA -- Head coach Lou Tepper found himself in a quarterback quandery against Kutztown. Cam Marsh was still not ready to return from a shoulder injury, and Justin Bouch missed a great deal of practice time due to illness.

The quarterback situation played a large role in the loss to the PSAC Eastern Division Golden Bears, but was still overshadowed by a bad punt snap which resulted in a 40-yard loss and set up the winning touchdown. The loss was the sixth straight for the Fighting Scots.

Bouch was able to answer the bell for the first half, and guided the Scots to a 10-0 half-time lead. Edinboro dominated first half action, outgaining Kutztown 164 yards to 39. The Scots had the ball in Kutztown territory five times, but managed just a field goal and touchdown.

But the second half belonged to Kutztown. For starters, Bouch informed the coaching staff at halftime that he was greatly weakened by illness and the cold conditions. The offense was forced to go conservative with Bouch at the controls.

Kutztown narrowed the gap to 10-7 on Stephen Gammage's one yard plunge, then took advantage of a bad punt snap to go ahead. On a play that began at midfield, the Golden Bears ended up recovering at the Edinboro 10. Gammage on the next play with 3:39 remaining.

In the meantime, Bouch had to leave the game, then returned on the final series with Marsh unable to throw the ball. The redshirt freshman guided the Scots from their own 25 to the Kutztown 16 where the drive stalled in the final seconds.

Neither team was able to muster much offense in the muddy and wintry conditions. Edinboro finished with a slight edge in total yards, 227 to 211, but the Scots suffered three turnovers.

California, PA -- Whatever head coach Lou Tepper said at halftime, he should bottle it. The Fighting Scots trailed 22-10 at intermission, and gave up a touchdown and a safety in the final forty seconds. Riding the tails of a six-game

losing streak, it would have been easy for the Scots to pack it in.

Instead, Edinboro roared out for the second half and completely dominated, scoring on its final three possessions. The numbers at halftime clearly favored Cal, as the Vulcans ran for 155 yards and gained a total of 220 yards. Edinboro, meanwhile, was held to 64 yards rushing and 117 total yards.

But the second half was a different story. The Scots ground game kicked into high gear with 164 yards, and Edinboro totaled 238 yards. California(Pa.) was held to 49 second-half rushing yards, 103 total yards and five first downs.

Alonzo Roebuck and Brandon Munson paced the Scots 228-yard rushing attack. Roebuck ran for 150 yards on 25 carries, including a 44-yard scoring jaunt that gave the Scots a 24-22 lead and pushed him over 1,000 yards for the season. Munson added 97 yards on 14 carries, with TD runs of 5 and 18 yards. J.D. Baker added the final score on a 10-yard run, his first career six-pointer.

Edinboro, PA -- Thanks to a dominant ground game, the Fighting Scots ended the season as it began -- with a win. The victory was the 20th in the last 21 meetings with Lock

After rushing for a season-high 228 yards a week earlier in a win over California(Pa.), Edinboro topped that with 270 yards on 65 rushes. Alonzo Roebuck and Brandon Munson each ran for over 100 yards. Roebuck, playing in his final game, led the way with 131 yards and 2 TDs on 25 carries, his seventh 100-yard game. Roebuck finished the season with 1,177 yards, the tenth-highest season total, and moved into seventh place in career rushing with 2,030 yards. Munson added 110 yards on 23 carries and a touchdown for his third career 100-yard game.

Tied at 7-7 after one quarter, the Fighting Scots scored 24 straight points. Roebuck scored EU 3 7:40 Geoff Heyl 42 yd. field goal

on a three-yard run and Munson followed with a two-yard scoring run for a 21-7 halftime lead. Geoff Heyl tacked on the first of his three field goals from 42 yards out, and Justin Bouch capped the run with an eight-yard pass to Sean

Heyl added 33 and 27 yard field goals in the fourth quarter.

While the Edinboro ground game dominated offensively, the Fighting Scot defense held the Bald Eagles to just 8 yards rushing on 22 carries. That represented the lowest total since East Stroudsburg totaled -10 yards rushing in 1984. and the ninth-lowest in school history.

Edinboro finished with 434 yards compared to 155, ran off 86 plays to 50 for Lock Haven. and held the ball for 39:43.

Fighting Scots in the Pros

Edinboro University has had a history of players performing in the professional ranks, including three players who most recently played in the Canadian Football League.

Sean McNicholas signed as a free agent with the New York Jets this past April. The All-American punter was released in early June.

Three-time All-American Jeremy O'Day played six seasons as an offensive lineman in the Canadian Football League. O'Day played two seasons for the Toronto Argonauts, helping them win the Grey Cup. The 6'3", 295 lb. offensive guard was chosen by the Argos in the 1997 supplemental draft, and later played for the Saskatchewan Roughriders.

Former Fighting Scots Jeff Traversy and John Williams also played north of the border. Traversy, a 6'5", 280 lb. nose tackle, was the Calgary Stampeders' third pick in the 1997 college draft and played through the 2002 season. Williams, Edinboro's leading rusher in 2001, was drafted by British Columbia in the fourth round of the 2002 CFL Draft. He led the Scots with 723 yards rushing and added 14 receptions in 2001.

Several former Edinboro players have enjoyed success in the Arena Football League, most notably Cleveland Pratt. Though just 5'7", 171 lbs., Pratt prospered in the indoor football league. In 2001 he played for the Florida Firecats, enjoying an outstanding season. He ranked among the league leaders in scoring and all-purpose yardage.

Former Edinboro wide receiver Quentin Ware-Bey has also toiled in the AFL2, playing for the Carolina Rhinos.

A number of other Fighting Scots have made their marks in the professional ranks. Denorse Mosely was a member of the Miami Dolphins as a defensive back for two seasons, and was also in training camp with the Green Bay Packers. He spent the majority of his first season with the Dolphins on the practice squad before being activated for the playoffs.

James Dumas, a defensive back two years ago for Edinboro, was signed as a free agent by the San Francisco 49ers in 1999. Gilbert

Grantlin was a free agent signee of the Minnesota Vikings in 1996, earning a spot on the practice squad

Mike Kegarise, a 6'6", 310 lb. offensive tackle, was highly-regarded by the Seattle Seahawks before suffering a severe knee injury.







Edinboro University

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is the largest comprehensive four-year university in northwestern Pennsylvania. Its 585-acre campus is home to some 8,000 students studying in more than 100 academic programs. The University's programs in art, criminal justice, and speech language pathology, among others, have earned regional and national recognition and accolades, and the campus is ranked among the top 10 in the nation for the services provided for students with disabilities. In 2003 the University's instutional accreditation with the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools was reaffirmed with commendation for ten years.

Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie - Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 480,000 bound volumes and 1.3 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

The main campus also includes a modern University Center, planetarium. observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and television stations, health center, counseling center, and much more - all accessible for people with disabilities. The recently renovated and expanded Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of its kind in the nation.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including six residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learned floors – all are wired for voice, video and data.

Edinboro University also operates centers in Erie and Meadville. Edinboro University in Erie - The Porreco Center is a beautiful 27-acre campus that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for small conferences, business meetings, and special events.

The Meadville Access Center is located in the city's historic Bessemer

Dr. Frank G. Pogue, Jr. President , Edinboro University of Pennsylvania



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Dr. Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor for student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central Administration in Albany, serving in that position

for 10 years. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, President Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY at Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. He serves as a member of the American Council on Education Commission on Government and Public Affairs which advises the Division of Governmental Relations on the broad range of issues in which congressional and executive branch actions affect colleges and universities. He is a member of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Task Force on Teacher Education and serves as co-chair of the AASCU Forum on Rural Services. He was appointed in 2003 to the International Association of University Presidents Commission on Disarmament Education, Conflict Resolution and Peace. Since 1984, Dr. Pogue has served on the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools and is a former vice chair and member of the Commission's Executive Committee. He currently serves as President for the Middle States Association Board of Trustees and is a member of its Executive Committee. He was appointed chairperson of the Middle States Advisory Committee on Institutional

Financial Resources, which advised the Commission on the relationship of financial resources to institutional accreditation. Dr. Pogue also serves on the Board of Trustees of the BACCHUS & GAMMA Peer Education Network. He served for two years as chairperson of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (SSHE) Commission for the Universities and Commission of Presidents Executive Committee. He is a member of the Executive Board of A Community of Agile Partners in Education (CAPE). In October 1996, Dr. Pogue was appointed by then Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge to the Governor's Commission on Academic Standards. In November, 2002, he was appointed co-chair of the Higher Education Committee of Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell's Transition Team.

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the Board of Directors for the Meadville Area Industrial Commission and the Boards of Corporators for the Hamot Health Foundation, the St. Vincent Health Center, and the Meadville Medical Center. He is a member of the Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee and an Honorary Member of the Erie Wolves Club. Dr. Pogue was chairperson of the Erie County Millennium Commission, the Erie County State Employees Combined Appeal (SECA) campaign in 2001 and 2002, and of the Erie Day School's Adopt-A-Scholar scholarship program (2000-01 and 2002-03). He was also a member of the Erie Mayor's Task Force on Public Safety. Dr. Pogue has served on the boards of directors for the Erie Conference on Community Development, the United Way of Erie County, and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross, for which he served as their 1997 capital campaign chairman.

Dr. Pogue was honored by the Erie Area Chamber of Commerce with the Louis J. Tullio Community Service Award. The Greater Erie Community Action Committee (GECAC) honored him with the Paul P. Martin Community Service Award in 2000, and in 1999, the Distinguished Service Award for Leadership and Vision was presented to him by the SUNY at Albany Council

Dr. Pogue has shared his experiences and expertise in Edinboro University classrooms via guest lecturer presentations. He has also taught a course titled. "Special Topics in Sociology" for the Department of Sociology. He continues to enjoy working in the classroom environment.

Since becoming president, Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.

Dr. Naomi T. Johnson Vice President for Student Affairs and Student Success

Dr. Naomi T. Johnson is in her seventh year as the Vice President for Student Affairs and Student Success at Edinboro University. Those responsibilities include overseeing the Fighting Scot athletic program.

Prior to her appointment at Edinboro, Dr. Johnson served as the Associate Dean of Students at the University of California-Santa Barbara. Her wide range of experience in service to students includes past positions as peer counseling coordinator, assistant to the president for student affairs, director of the campus activities center, and assistant dean of students.

One of Dr. Johnson's main objectives at Edinboro is to facilitate a creative and innovative campus atmosphere. She also looks to lead a united effort by the University Community to ensure a well-rounded education for students.

Dr. Johnson earned her bachelor's degree in sociology from Moorhead State University, then completed work on her master's degree in college student personnel from Bowling Green State University and her Ph.D. in higher education from Arizona State University.

Dr. Johnson and her husband, Earl Jacobs, a member of the Edinboro Development Office, reside in Edinboro.
