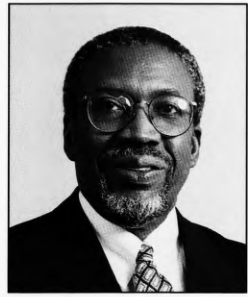

Fighting Scots Seek to Defend PSAC West Crown

Lou Tepper has never professed to be a superstitious individual. But you can bet that the Edinboro University football coach will have offensive coordinator Scott Browning by his side when the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference hosts its annual media day in August.

A year ago Tepper was unable to attend the function, and sent Browning in his place. It turns out that Browning had attended one other PSAC Media Day, that in 1995. The Fighting Scots went on to post a 9-3 record, win the PSAC West, and play in the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Tepper's likely to make sure Browning, his lucky charm and otherwise longtime assistant coach, attends this year's event with eyes on a three-peat.

The expectations were hardly high in 2003 as Edinboro was coming off a 5-6 record and were picked for fifth in the PSAC West by the league's coaches. An opening-game loss at Youngstown State was expected, but the Fighting Scots showed they were for a real during a brutal three-game stretch to end September and begin October. Facing three straight ranked teams, Edinboro defeated 16th-ranked East Stroudsburg, 31-20, dropped a 40-34 decision to 22nd-ranked Shippensburg, then pulled off one of the biggest upsets in school history with a 28-20 win at fourth-ranked Indiana(Pa.).

The IUP victory started the Fighting Scots on a six-game winning streak, the longest since - 1995! The defense held opponents without a touchdown for 20 consecutive quarters, and when Edinboro concluded the regular season with a 48-13 win at Lock

Haven, the Fighting Scots were PSAC West co-champions and were headed to the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Edinboro made its first appearance in the NCAA playoffs since 1995, and while the Fighting Scots lost at top-ranked Saginaw Valley State, the season still ended with a 9-3 record. That represented the first winning season since 1996 and tied for the most wins in school history. Edinboro was ranked 18th in the final AFCA Division II Top 25.

Expectations are understandably much higher entering the 2004 campaign. Edinboro is ranked 13th in *Street & Smith's* preseason Top 25 and 14th in *Lindy's* Top 25. While Tepper is pleased that the Fighting Scots have returned to a position of prominence, he realizes many challenges lie ahead.

"I think we should be ranked in the pre-season as a top twenty team and we should challenge for the PSAC title," Tepper commented. "That being stated, the same things are being said in Shippensburg and Indiana. The three of us were successful last year and have significant returners coming back. I don't know if we are any better than a year ago, but now we expect to win."

Edinboro hopes to make it back-to-back appearances in the NCAA playoffs, but the playoffs will have a different look in 2004. With realigned divisions and six teams now going from each region, the Fighting Scots conceivably have a better chance of reaching postseason action. The East Region no longer includes the likes of two-time defending national champion Grand Valley State and Saginaw Valley State. Now six teams will be selected from teams in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, and the Northeast 10.

A total of 28 letterwinners return, including seven starters on offense and five on defense. It is a team with experience at most of the skill positions, speed on defense, and a renewed attitude on special teams. But that doesn't mean Tepper enters the season without concerns.

"We have to find replacements for Joe Valvoda and Anthony Peluso on the offensive line," pointed out the

former Illinois head coach. "Also, we need to find a dominant tailback. Plus size is a concern on defense, and we need to convert our field goals."

The schedule also figures to pose plenty of problems. The Fighting Scots kick off the 2004 season on Saturday, September 4 against East Stroudsburg. The Warriors were 8-3 a year ago and shared the PSAC East crown. The slate also includes a September 25 date at Shippensburg. The Fighting Scots have not won at Seth Grove Stadium since 1995, losing four in a row there. And the Red Raiders have high hopes of their own, thanks to an 8-3 record in 2003. They are ranked 12th according to *Street & Smith's*.

Last but not least is an IUP team itching to revenge last year's Homecoming defeat. The Indians went on to finish with a 10-1 record, but were denied a trip to the NCAA playoffs due to the one defeat. IUP is ranked seventh by *Lindy's* and 16th by *Street & Smith's*.

Special Teams

Tepper came to Edinboro with a reputation as a defensive genius, but if the truth be known he may emphasize special teams even more. Beginning with his worker bee approach when he first arrived, Tepper has made sure that it is an honor to be a part of the special teams.

"Overall, in our the first three years the special teams were our best team phase," he related. "Last year we slipped to the middle of the pack. If we are going to win championships, the special teams need to improve significantly. I was happy with our spring attitude toward the kicking game."

Tepper feels the Scots have the best kickoff and punt return units since he took over. In Justin Lipscomb the Fighting Scots possess one of the top return men in the PSAC. Lipscomb averaged 23.4 yards on 19 kickoff returns and 10.7 yards on 15 punt returns. He ranked among the national leaders in both categories while standing third in the PSAC in punt returns and fifth in kickoff returns.

Ryan Valasek returned five kickoffs for a 28.0 yard average, including a 92-yarder at Clarion. Lincoln Bufalino, who sat out the 2003 season, was Edinboro's top return man the previous two years, averaging 18.2 yards on kickoff returns and 9.1 yards on punt returns in 2002. Raji El-Amin and Chris Avery add competition to a deep list of return men.

Tepper seeks improvement in the kicking game, where a pair of new starters had their ups and downs last year. Kody Robertson took over as the placekicker midway through the year after sharing the duties with Eli Visnick. The freshman made 34 of 36 extra points but was just 5 of 12 on field goals. As a team, Edinboro converted 11 of 23 three-pointers.

"We need Kody to take the big step and go from being a rookie to a dependable red zone kicker," emphasized Tepper.

Robertson is also in the punting picture. Matt Barley handled the duties a year ago, averaging 38.2 yards on 47 punts, with 11 inside the 20. Robertson punted three times for a 38.0 yard average. "Matt improved his hang time and distance during the spring," Tepper stated, "but Kody has more hang time and distance. There will be a heated competition between them."

One area which showed great improvement a year ago was the long snapping. Joe Jowly, a senior who previously played at Erie(NY) Community College, was as consistent a long snapper as there was in the PSAC. He is also a strong coverage man. Ben Harris, a redshirt freshman, made great improvement in the spring and could handle the short snaps.

Offense

When Tepper took over the Edinboro program in 2000 his goal offensively was a balanced attack. It wasn't until last season that the offense evolved into what Tepper envisioned. And what an evolution! The Fighting Scots averaged 29.8 ppg., the highest figure since the 1994 team averaged 36.7 ppg.

Running the football had never been an issue, but the passing game had lagged behind. Displaying a multitude of formations, Edinboro averaged 198.4 yards per game rushing and 184.2 yards per game through the air. Both figures ranked fifth in the PSAC and helped the Scots rank sixth in total offense at 382.6 ypg.

"From tight end to receivers to fullback to quarterback our starters are better than a year ago," exclaimed Tepper. "We are unusually strong at tight end. We don't have one great receiver, but I wouldn't trade this group for any in the conference. Matt Phillips is the heart of our offense. He can be and needs to be a punishing blocker."

Tepper pointed out two question marks - tailback and the offensive line. "I feel very good about Andre Burke at tailback. In limited contract this spring, we found he is a very hard runner. He and Phillips make for a very physical backfield. But we don't have one tailback who's taken a snap in a game."

"We have a lot of concerns on the offensive line," he continued. "We know Greg Bzorek is going to be as good a right tackle as there is in the PSAC. But replacing Joe Valvoda and Anthony Peluso and developing depth won't be easy."

Quarterback: A year ago Justin Bouch was battling for the starting job after an up-and-down redshirt freshman season. Now the 6'3", 205 lb. junior is the unquestioned leader of the offense after putting together one of the best seasons ever by an Edinboro signalcaller.

"I don't think there's another quarterback I'd rather have. He's Mr. Consistency," stated Tepper. "He knows the offense very well, he's extremely efficient, and he doesn't make many mistakes. Justin's a real competitor."

Bouch completed a school-record 65.9 percent of his passes, with a school-record 168 completions in 255 attempts for 2,044 yards with 15 TDs

and 10 INTs. The 2,044 yards passing was the third-highest total in school history. He added a pair of touchdowns rushing. Bouch ranked 19th in Division II in passing efficiency, and was selected to the PSAC West first team. He enters the season ranked eighth in career passing yards with 3,224.

Brandon Hunt is the backup. A 6'7" sophomore, Hunt took a handful of snaps at Kutztown for his lone varsity action. "I think he can step in and lead the team," Tepper commented. "He's a big tall guy with a strong arm. He has a lot of poise and understands the offense better."

Running Backs: In Matt Phillips the Fighting Scots possess a 6'1", 250 lb. fullback who has caught the attention of NFL scouts with his bruising style. Phillips was used both as a tailback and fullback a year ago, rushing for 644 yards on 161 carries with 13 TDs. He earned first team All-PSAC West honors. Despite Phillips' success carrying the ball a year ago, Tepper would like nothing better than to keep him mainly at fullback and exploit his full blocking talents.

For that to happen one of several performers at tailback will have to step up. A year ago Brandon Munson and Dru Robinson combined for over 1,400 yards at tailback, but now both are gone and not one of the Fighting Scot tailbacks have a carry to their credit.

Andre Burke emerged as the starter out of spring drills. The 5'9", 205 lb. junior originally attended California(Pa.) and sat out last season. He left a lasting impression with the coaching staff in the spring. "Andre is probably the best blocker we've had at tailback, and is very bright," related Tepper. "He has outstanding hands and the line loves to block for him."

Lincoln Bufalino figures as the backup, with a pair of freshmen, Tommy Clanton and Ulysee Davis, also in the mix. Bufalino, a 5'8", 195 lb. senior, did not play last season and has previously played wide receiver. He has plenty of quickness and makes things happen when he has the ball.

Justin Olney is a 5'11", 230 lb. redshirt freshman who will serve as the backup at fullback.

Receivers: When summer began, no area was deeper than receiver, but developments during the summer thinned the depth. Most noteworthy was the news that senior Jordan Bobitski would miss the season due to a summer injury. Last year's improved offense took full advantage of the depth, with Edinboro regularly employing four different wide receivers and three tight ends. Bobitski was the third-leading receiver with 25 receptions for 251 yards.

Tepper views the tight end contingent as the best in the PSAC. As a group the three tight ends caught 29 passes for 5 TDs. C.J. Trivisonno emerged as a complete tight end a year ago, earning second team All-PSAC West honors. A 6'4", 250 lb. senior, Trivisonno caught 17 passes for 194 yards and 2 TDs. As important, he became a dependable blocker.

Trivisonno and Ed Brown enter their fourth season sharing the tight end position. Brown is a 6'4", 254 lb. senior who is best known for his blocking talents, but also caught 7 passes for 63 yards and a score.

The third tight end is Nate Eimer, a 6'2", 225

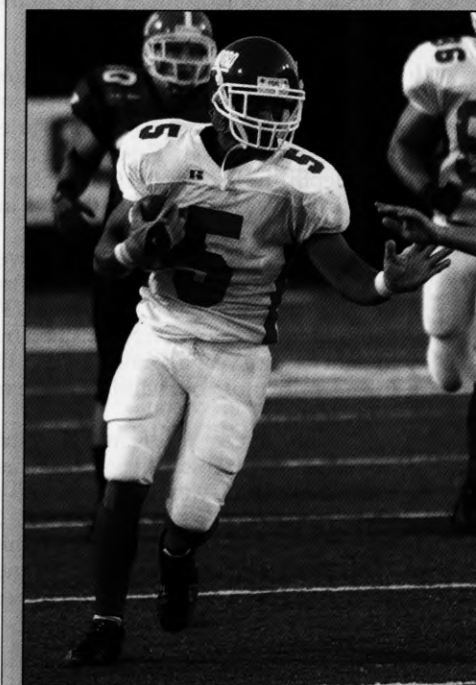

lb. junior who is viewed as the best receiver among the trio. Eimer fills the role of an H-back. His role increased as the season wore on, catching 5 passes for 77 yards and 2 TDs.

Justin Lipscomb headlines the wide receiving corps. The junior earned first team All-PSAC West honors after leading the Fighting Scots with 39 receptions for 739 yards, an 18.9 yard average, and 6 TDs. The receptions and yards were tied for eighth on the season charts. He ranks 12th in career receptions with 62. Lipscomb is a deep threat and also an outstanding return man.

Sophomore Ryan Valasek was a pleasant surprise a year ago. The diminutive 5'8" receiver caught 17 passes for 197 yards and two scores. He is extremely quick and makes things happen once he catches the ball. Valasek is also an accomplished return specialist.

A year ago Aaron Fetty dropped almost 40 pounds and moved from tight end to wide receiver. After an impressive spring, the third-year sophomore is expected to step in and fill the role of Sean Hess. At 6'5", 210 lbs., Fetty brings size and plenty of speed. Tepper predicts big things for Fetty in the future, who caught two passes a year ago. Jeff Dinger is another tall, rangy receiver with experience. The 6'5" junior caught one pass a year ago.

Bobby Woods continues the trend of tall receivers at 6'4". Woods previously played at West Virginia University, and without question has the ability to see plenty of action. However, he must prove he's healthy after missing the final nine games with a shoulder injury. Woods caught one pass last year.

Redshirt freshmen Bob Reiter and Marshall Ellison add more depth to the position.

Offensive Line: Tepper's biggest area of concern on offense is the line. However, if the Fighting Scots can replace starters Joe Valvoda and Anthony Peluso, and develop a little depth, the line has the potential to be outstanding. A year ago four of the five linemen were accorded All-PSAC honors.

Three starters return, two who were second team All-PSAC selections. Greg Bzorek, a 6'6", 315 lb. junior, has started 22 of 23 career games. He made a smooth transition from left to right tackle a year ago and could be the next in a string of outstanding linemen at Edinboro.

Chris Kaczor was feared to be the weak link when the 2003 season began, but as a redshirt freshman he went on to earn all-conference honors at left guard. The 6'2", 290 lb. sophomore moves over to center this year. Tepper predicts that Kaczor will become a center the caliber of Valvoda, an All-American a year ago.

Jason Oman, a 6'4", 345 lb. senior, returns at left tackle. Oman has battled injuries throughout his career, missing two years with ankle woes. He returned last year, and while missing more time with a variety of ailments, he proved when healthy he is a dominating blocker.

Ron Bzorek, Greg's older brother, will battle redshirt freshman Andy Young for the right to replace Peluso at right guard. Ron is a 6'3", 305 lb. senior who has seen limited time since transferring to Edinboro from Slippery Rock three years ago. Tepper admits that the 6'4", 305 lb. Young is the future at right guard, and it is a bright future, but the question remains whether he is ready to step in yet.

When the summer began the left guard job shaped up as a battle between Mike Mills, who stepped in for Oman last year, and LaMont Singleton. Mills, however, is no longer with the program. That leaves Singleton, a 6'4", 318 lb. transfer from Erie(NY) Community College, with plenty to learn in a short time. A year ago he was a first team All-Northeast Conference choice.

The only other players with experience on the line are Anthony Sufra and Anthony Tedesco. Sufra, a 6'2", 282 lb. junior, backs up Oman at left tackle, while Tedesco is a 6'2", 280 lb. junior center.

Defense

The defense made a huge jump a year ago, going from allowing 23.6 ppg. to rank 11th in the PSAC in 2002, to climbing all the way to second, giving up 16.3 ppg. That figure also ranked 12th in Division II. The Fighting Scot defense had a stretch of 20 straight quarters without giving up a touchdown.

The biggest improvement came in the pass defense. After permitting opposing passers to throw for 200.1 yards per game and intercepting just 12 passes, Edinboro gave up just 156.2 yards per game through the air and picked off 23 passes, the second-highest season total. The Fighting Scots ranked 24th in the country in pass efficiency defense, and climbed from last in the PSAC to third in the PSAC in pass defense.

All told, the Fighting Scots ended the year allowing 295.1 yards per game in total offense to rank third in the PSAC and 25th in Division II. By comparison, a year ago the Scots were 11th in the conference, giving up almost 50 yards per game more.

Only five starters return, but plenty of experienced reserves figure to fill in. A year ago Tepper employed a smaller, quicker defense, and that will again be the trend this year. The lack of size, particularly on the line, concerns him, but he likes the aggressive nature of the unit.

Defensive Line: Edinboro will likely have one of the smallest defensive fronts in the PSAC, but that can't dull Tepper's enthusiasm entering the year. The Fighting Scots will no doubt miss three-year starter Eugene Grooms at noseguard, but with two starters back plus two other players who have seen plenty of action, it is a unit with great promise.

Seth Fragale earned second team All-PSAC West accolades in his first year as a starter at rush linebacker. The 6'2", 220 lb. junior finished second on the team with 86 tack-

les and led the Scots both in tackles for losses (12.5) and sacks (4). "I think he's one of the guys who sets the tone, like Matt Phillips on offense," Tepper pointed out. "He's a pass rusher, he defends the pass, he pursues hard, and he's tenacious."

Senior Eric Neavins is the other returning starter on the line. The 6'3", 290 lb. defensive tackle is a spaceeater, but Tepper wishes he wouldn't take up so much space. Neavins had 54 tackles, with 4 for losses, a year ago, and was also a second team All-PSAC selection.

Greg MacAnn shared time with Kyle Thorne at defensive end the last two years, starting four contests a year ago. At 6'3", 225 lbs., he may be the smallest defensive end in the league, but he is another hard-nosed, tenacious performer. MacAnn had 24 tackles with 2 sacks.

With Grooms battling injuries a year ago, A.J. Cousins saw plenty of action at nose-guard as a freshman. Cousins' play left the coaches with great anticipation as a full-time performer, and the sophomore has now slimmed down to 265 lbs. He is another very active lineman.

The reserves are inexperienced, but displayed promise in the spring. Chris Amico came to Edinboro as an outside linebacker, but the redshirt freshman has now bulked up to 252 lbs. and is extremely strong. He will spell Neavins at defensive tackle. "Chris was a real delight in the spring," noted Tepper. "In terms of effort he reminds you of his brother Paul, and he has a motor like Fragale."

The progress of Njeya Chafeh will be interesting to follow. A 5'11", 270 lb. senior noseguard, Chafeh has not played football in several years. The native of Cameroon is extremely strong and was another spring surprise.

A trio of redshirt freshmen add further depth. Joe Malizia (6'2", 230 lbs.) will backup Fragale at rush linebacker, while 6'1", 280 lb. Kevin Beitzel is in the mix at noseguard and Josh Otto is a 6'4", 225 lb. defensive end.

Linebackers: For the second year in a row the defense must replace a standout linebacker. A year ago it was Foster Johnson, now it is Jermaine Hughley, another first team All-PSAC West performer. With a year under his belt, Brandon Banas should make a bigger impact than a year ago, when the former Erie(NY) Community College transfer finished as the third-leading tackler with 69 tackles and a pair of sacks.

Dylan Wessell looks to join Banas at inside linebacker, although he'll have to battle Ben Stroup. Wessell returns for a fifth season after missing all but the first two games with a broken hand. The 6'2", 230 lb. senior had a team-high 9 tackles in the opener at Youngstown State, finishing the year with 13 stops.

Stroup, a 6'1", 205 lb. sophomore, served in a reserve role as a redshirt freshman. Despite missing two games, he finished as the seventh-leading tackler with 44 stops, includ-

ing 6.5 for losses and 2.5 sacks. He is Tepper's kind of linebacker - lean, very active and fearless.

Sophomore Dave Jazenski (5'11", 225 lbs.) saw considerable action as a reserve before going down with an injury late in the year. He finished with 20 tackles but took no live snaps in the spring. If healthy, Jazenski will compete for a starting job.

Redshirt freshman Syl Hanner is a player with potential for the future.

Jim Soltis takes over for Nick Roth at drop linebacker. Though just 195 lbs., he is another of the active players who runs well on the defense. The sophomore made 9 tackles in a reserve role and blocked a pair of punts.

Tepper has waited to see what Robert Burns could do at drop linebacker if healthy. The 6'0", 225 lb. senior has seen little action the last two years due to injuries, but Tepper sees an explosive player with speed and strength.

Steve Renfro, a 6'3", 215 lb. redshirt freshman, has a bright future, but is probably a year away. He's very strong against the run, but needs work on pass defense.

Defensive Backs: The good news is two starters return in the secondary. The bad news is two starters are missing. However, like the wide receiver position, depth abounds in the secondary.

Raji El-Amin and Chris Avery combined for 16 interceptions a year ago. El-Amin turned in an incredible freshman season, earning third team Associated Press Little All-America honors while being named the PSAC West Rookie of the Year. He didn't even join the Fighting Scots until a week of preseason drills had passed, and he began the year as a backup cornerback. Moved to free safety in week number two, he started the final 11 games and finished the year setting school records for interceptions (9) and yards returned (158). El-Amin ranked eighth in Division II in interceptions. He also proved a strong supporter against the run, finishing fourth on the team in tackles with 60. In addition, he broke up a team-high 8 passes.

"Raji improved this spring and recognized that he has a long way to go," cautioned Tepper. "He is a playmaker."

Avery enjoyed an outstanding season in his own right after missing the final seven games in 2002 due to injury. The cornerback added 7 interceptions, good for 22nd in Division II, for 78 yards, along with 24 tackles and 6 passes broken up.

A three-way battle will shape up this fall for the starter opposite Avery. Senior Jermaine Truax is in his second year with the Scots after transferring from Alfred State JC. As the nickel back he had 12 tackles, a pair of interceptions and broke up 4 passes. Truax missed part of the spring with an injury, but has matured and exhibited fine ability.

Chris Gilman is a senior who has seen action both at cornerback and free safety. An excellent special teams player, he took part in 10 tackles.

The third competitor is junior college transfer Damion Malott, who led Hudson Valley Community College with 5 interceptions. The 5'11", 180 lb. junior played free safety in a very similar system to Edinboro's.

Two other players also bear watching at cornerback as backups to Avery. Tom LaVerde (6'1", 194 lbs.) played wide receiver last year, but the sophomore made a strong conversion to corner in the spring. "He was the biggest surprise in the secondary," commented Tepper. "He's a tall, fast cornerback who led us in interceptions this spring."

The other player is Elliott Page, a senior who was a second team All-PSAC West performer in 2002 but did not play last season. Page finished with 38 tackles and a team-high 3 interceptions that year, and is a former two-year starter.

Regis Burns and Tim Hyde look to replace Thomas Wallace at strong safety. Burns, a 6'0", 205 lb. junior, had 30 tackles and returned an interception 50 yards for a touchdown against Kutztown as a reserve. Tepper was impressed with Burns' spring performance. He also sees Burns as an alternative at drop linebacker.

Hyde is another of the players Tepper has imported from Erie(NY) Community College over the last two years. A 5'11", 200 lb. junior, Hyde finished second at ECC in tackles last year with 50, including 8 for losses, and had 3 interceptions and 9 passes broken up. "Tim has great acceleration and the best speed," Tepper stated. "He can play man coverage better than most strong safeties."

Redshirt freshman Mike Mader is in reserve at strong safety, while fellow redshirt freshmen Tom Davidson and Mike Craddock backup at free safety. Davidson, in particular, performed well in the spring and figures to play in the dime package.

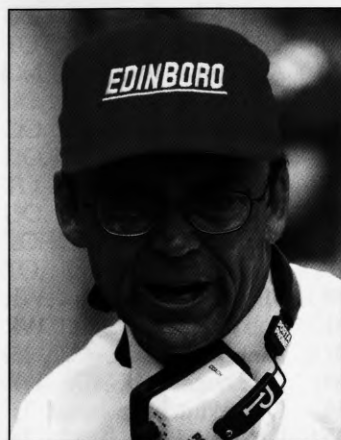

Head Coach Lou Tepper



Veteran Division I mentor Lou Tepper was appointed the 12th head football coach at Edinboro University, officially taking charge of the Fighting Scot program on January 5, 2000. He promised a tough and classy program, and in four short years has delivered a championship team that fans and alumni enthusiastically endorse.

Tepper inherited an Edinboro program which had won just eleven games in the previous three seasons. The Scots have shown consistent improvement in "Coach Tep's" four years, culminated by an appearance in the NCAA Division II Playoffs this past year. The 2000 season brought a 5-6 record, matching the Edinboro record for wins by

Edinboro made its first post-season appearance in 2003, claiming a share of the PSAC West championship. The Fighting Scots survived a brutal three-game stretch early in the season, defeating 16th-ranked East Stroudsburg, 30-21, dropping a 40-34 decision to 22nd-ranked Shippensburg, and finally upsetting fourth-ranked Indiana (Pa.) on the Indians' home turf, 28-20. That win propelled the Scots to a six-game winning streak to end the regular season. During that stretch Edinboro held opponents without a touchdown for 20 consecutive quarters. Tepper was recognized as the PSAC West Coach of the Year in 2004.

While winning is important, it isn't the only emphasis at Edinboro with Tepper at the controls. He has stressed improved character and talent, a family concept and racial harmony. In the classroom the Fighting Scots have shown marked improvement in recent years. It all adds up to a championship program.

BACKGROUND

Tepper, a native of Keystone, PA, returned to the Division II level after coaching at Division I institutions for almost thirty years. He is renowned as a defensive coaching genius, with a resume that includes three Butkus Award honorees and an Outland Trophy winner. Tepper's list of standouts include Bruce Smith, John Holecek, Simeon Rice, Kevin Hardy, Brad Hopkins, Booger MacFarland, and Ken Dilger, all current or former NFL standouts. In addition, he has worked with some of the top head coaches in the country, including Bill Dooley at Virginia Tech, Bill McCartney at Colorado, John Mackovic at Illinois and Gerry DiNardo at LSU.

"Being a native of western Pennsylvania, it has been neat to be a head coach again and to be a head coach in this environment," Tepper related following his first season at Edinboro. "I've recruited western Pennsylvania for half of my career. It's a joy to be back home."

Tepper completed his second full season as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana State University in 1999. He began his tenure with

the Tigers on December 15, 1997, helping LSU to a 27-9 Independence Bowl win over Notre Dame. All told, he has served as a defensive coordinator for 19 of his 37 years in the coaching profession.

BIG TEN HEAD COACH

The 58-year-old Tepper was appointed the head coach at the University of Illinois on December 13, 1991, just prior to the team's appearance in the John Hancock Sun Bowl. He replaced Mackovic, who left for the head coaching position at the University of Texas. During his five-year stint as the Fighting Illini head coach, Tepper compiled a record of 25-31-2, including two more bowl appearances. He guided Illinois to a pair of wins over Ohio State, including one at Columbus; the school's first victory in Ann Arbor against Michigan in 27 years; and three consecutive wins over rival Iowa by a combined score of 122-17. Just as impressive, Tepper graduated 91 percent of his seniors.

Tepper joined the Illinois program in 1988, serving as the defensive coordinator for four seasons and assistant head coach for two years. In his nine seasons at Illinois, he helped the program to six bowl invitations, one Big Ten title and top ten rankings in the AP and UPI polls.

He was honored as the Big Ten's top defensive assistant coach in 1990 by The Sporting News. His defensive units annually ranked among the best in the country, finishing 10th in 1989, 14th in 1993, ninth in 1994, and 21st in 1995.

Tepper's 1992 Illini squad finished 6-5-1, suffering a 27-17 defeat to Hawaii in the Holiday Bowl. Illinois went in to Columbus and upset Ohio State, 18-16, and posted a 22-22 tie against Michigan in Ann Arbor.

While his '93 edition finished 5-6, that included a 24-21 win in Ann Arbor against the Wolverines. The Illini made it back to post-season play in 1994, handing East Carolina a 30-0 whitewashing in the

Liberty Bowl. The '94 squad finished 7-5, again upsetting one of the elite in the Big Ten. And once again it was on the road, as Illinois shocked Ohio State, 24-10, in Columbus behind Butkus Award winner Dana Howard.

LINEBACKERS

Through the years Penn State had gained the reputation as "Linebacker U", but Illinois could have made a good case for that designation as well during Tepper's tenure. He produced consecutive Butkus Award winners in Dana Howard (1994) and Kevin Hardy (1995). Along the way, he also produced Big Ten Defensive Players of the Year in Moe Gardner and Darrick Brownlow (1990), Howard (1993 and '94) and Big Ten Defensive Lineman of the Year Simeon Rice in 1994. For the only time in Big Ten history, Tepper had four first team All-Big Ten linebackers at his disposal. In all, he has coached over 20 professional linebackers, and has published a book, "Complete Linebacking", a 312-page comprehensive book on linebacker play.

Hardy and Rice became the highest defensive draft duo in the history of the NFL draft in 1996 when Hardy went second to Jacksonville and Rice third to Arizona. That stood until the 2000 NFL Draft when Penn State's Courtney Brown and Lavar Arrington went one-two.

DIVISION I ASSISTANT COACH

In over thirty years as an assistant coach, Tepper has worked at some of the top institutions in the country. That includes the likes of Pittsburgh, Virginia Tech and Colorado, in addition to his time at Illinois and LSU.

Tepper began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pittsburgh in 1967, then moved on to the University of New Hampshire from 1968-71, coaching the running backs and linebackers before becoming the defensive coordinator. His next stop was the College of William & Mary, where he joined former New Hampshire head coach Jim Root as the defensive coordinator from 1972-77. The 1976 William & Mary squad posted the school's best record in thirty years. He was the assistant head coach his final year at William & Mary.

In 1978, Virginia Tech head coach Bill Dooley hired Tepper as his linebackers coach. Tepper helped build the Hokies into a consistent bowl con-

tender with a defense that annually ranked among the nation's top ten. He stayed at Virginia Tech from 1978-82, working with Outland Trophy winner and Buffalo Bills great Bruce Smith, among others. The 1980 Hokie edition played Miami (FL) in the Peach Bowl.

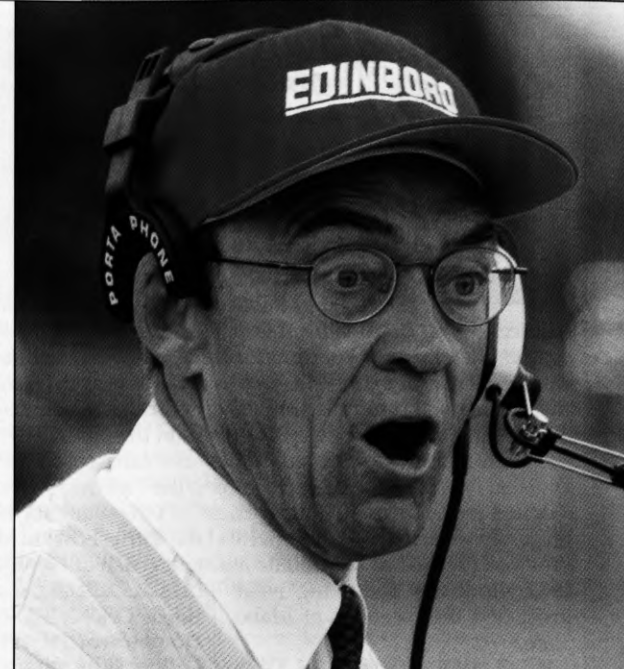
Tepper joined Bill McCartney's staff at Colorado in 1983, serving as the defensive coordinator and assistant head coach until departing for Illinois in 1988. Tepper helped turn around a Buffalo defense which ranked No. 100 nationally in yards allowed prior to his arrival, to one which was as high as 11th in Division I in total defense. He earned the title of assistant head coach to McCartney his final two seasons, and helped the Buffaloes to the 1985 Freedom Bowl and the 1986 Blue Bonnet Bowl.

Among the assistant coaches at Colorado was Gerry DiNardo, who would later bring Tepper in to direct his LSU defense.

PERSONAL BACKGROUND

Tepper, born September 7, 1945, graduated from Rutgers University in 1967. He enjoyed a standout career as a defensive back at Rutgers from 1965-67. As a player, Tepper led the Scarlet Knights in interceptions as a junior and tackles as a senior. He won the George Cronin Trophy as the Most Improved Player in 1965.

Tepper is an active member of the American Football Coaches Association and has served on the All-American Committee and the NCAA Ethics Committee. He is active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and has spoken for Promise-Keepers, founded by former Colorado coach Bill McCartney. Tepper and his wife, Karen, have two children, Matthew, who recently graduated from Edinboro with a master's degree in Counseling, and Stacy Ann, a graduate of LSU who is an administrator for Young Life Ministries in Columbus, OH.

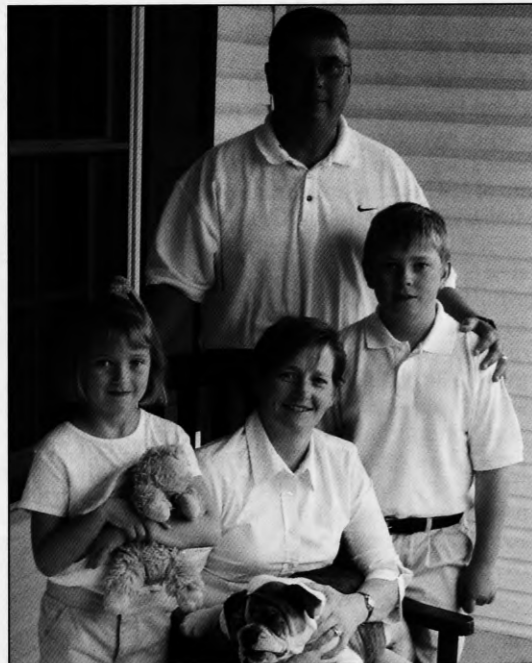
Scott Browning is in his 19th season as a Fighting Scot assistant, working with his third head coach.

After serving as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in Lou Tepper's first season, Browning took over as the offensive coordinator three years ago, while continuing to work with the linemen. This marks his 11th year in charge of the offensive linemen, and ninth as offensive coordinator. He has also coached the running backs and defensive backs in the past.

Browning has served as an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for two years. The Buckeyes went to the Rose Bowl and the Citrus Bowl in his two seasons. Browning served as a graduate assistant coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State.

A 1981 graduate of Ohio State with a bachelor's degree in Education, Browning began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Worthington High School and Dayton-Fairview High Schools in Ohio from 1979-81. Before transferring to Ohio State, he attended Capital University where he played football for one season. Browning later earned a master's degree in Education Administration from New Mexico State in 1983.

Browning and his wife, Lynn, reside in Edinboro and have two children, Andrew, 10, and Katelyn, 6. His brother, Mitchell, is the offensive coordinator at the University of Minnesota. Browning is also camp director of the Tri-State Linemen's Camp, a highly-successful instructional camp for linemen now in its ninth year.



Wayne Bradford

Wayne Bradford is in his sixth year as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff. Bradford was recently given the additional responsibilities of defensive coordinator, a position which he previously held in 1999 under former head coach Tom Hollman. He will continue to oversee the defensive line.

Under Bradford's tutelage, Edinboro has had five first team All-PSAC West defensive linemen. That includes Dave Smith, a four-time All-PSAC selection who ranks first in career tackles for losses and tied for second in sacks, and Eugene Grooms, who was a three-time All-PSAC selection. His 2003 defensive line featured three all-conference performers.

Bradford had previously been at Salisbury State since 1990, and was the Sea Gulls' defensive coordinator from 1994-98.

A graduate of Salisbury State, Bradford began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the linebackers (1990-92) and defensive linemen (1992-94). In 1994, he was promoted to defensive coordinator. In 1997, Salisbury State ranked 38th in NCAA Division III in total defense, allowing just 268 yards per game. His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game.

Bradford graduated from Salisbury State in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration. He completed work on his master's degree in Business Administration from Salisbury State in 1992. In addition to working as a member of the football staff, Bradford was a faculty member in the School of Business. Beginning in 1996, he was the Director of the Business Graduate Programs for the Perdue School of Business.

As an undergraduate, Bradford was an offensive lineman. He played on the 1986 Salisbury State team which finished as the NCAA Division III national runnerup.

Bradford and his wife, Gwen, reside in Edinboro with their six-year-old son, Nicholas, and four-year-old daughter, Julia.

Jim Henson, a highly successful high school coach in Ohio for over twenty years, enters his seventh season on the Edinboro staff. After working on the defensive side of the ball as the strong safeties/outside linebackers coach for two years, he moved over to the offense and will instruct the running backs for the third straight season. He previously worked with the running backs in 1999 and was in charge of the defensive linemen in '98. Henson is also a professor in the Mathematics Department at Edinboro.

Henson joined the Edinboro staff after serving as a mathematics teacher, football coach and athletic director at Grand Valley High School in Ohio for 22 years. He led the Mustangs to a 150-68-4 record, with five Grand River Conference championships, three East Suburban Conference titles, and three state playoff appearances. In the 1990's, Henson's charges posted three undefeated campaigns and a 23-game regular season winning streak. He was named the Conference Coach of the Year eight times and County Coach of the Year three times, culminated by his selection as the Ohio Division V Coach of the Year in 1997 and the Division IV Coach of the Year in '92.

Prior to beginning his stellar career at Grand Valley, Henson debuted as an assistant coach at Cardinal Middlefield (OH) High School, where he served for eight years.

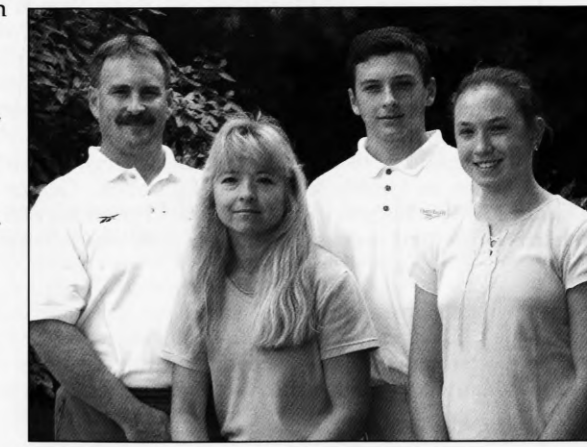

Dan Holland enters his first season as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff but is well-known in western Pennsylvania. All told he has 14 years experience on the high school level, serving as the head coach at Saegertown High School from 2001-03 in addition to stints as an assistant coach at McDowell High School and General McLane High School. He will coach the strong safeties and drop linebackers.

Holland led Saegertown to the 2002 French Creek Valley Athletic Conference championship, as the Panthers finished with a 9-1 record. He was recognized as the 2002 FCVAC Coach of the Year and was also named the PIAA District 10 Coach of the Year by the Pennsylvania State Football Coaches Association. He posted a 19-10 record in three seasons as head coach, resurrecting a program which had gone just 1-17 the previous two years.

Holland began his coaching career as an assistant at General McLane in 1990, leading his 1993 junior varsity squad to a 7-1 record. He moved on to the McDowell school system in 1994, working for three seasons as the head coach at J.S. Wilson Middle School before joining coach Jon Cacchione's varsity staff in 1997. The 1997 edition of the Trojans advanced to the PIAA Class AAAA western finals. While serving on the McDowell staff for four seasons, Holland worked with the offensive and defensive lines, tight ends and special teams.

A 2001 graduate of Edinboro with a bachelor's degree in Specialized Studies, Holland resides in Meadville with his wife, Brenda, a 1996 graduate of Edinboro University with a bachelor's degree in Education.

A Conversation with Lou Tepper



What attracted you to Edinboro?

"I was attracted to Edinboro because I love to coach young men who are serious about the game and use football as a tool to influence them toward positive academic, athletic and social behavior. Edinboro was attractive because of the leadership of the administration, particularly that of Dr. Frank Pogue and Bruce Baumgartner. Edinboro has a location and setting that can attract quality student-athletes. Karen and I are both familiar with this area and the PSAC. We love smaller communities yet Erie provides many attractions plus we have entrée to three metropolitan areas in close proximity."

Has it been difficult for you to adjust to Division II football?

"My biggest challenge has been to create a Division I mindset in a Division II setting. Sometimes people lack vision because certain things have been the way they are for so long. It's been really fun to see players, co-workers and this community expand their horizons to do things with greater expectations. It's been a real joy to see so many react positively to this challenge. I have found it very enjoyable and at times down right thrilling."

Now that you have tasted postseason play, what must you do to take the next step and be a consistent team in the Division II playoffs?

"Three issues jump out at me to answer this question. First, we need to continue to improve our team talent by developing present players and adding quality prospects. Second, the experience of 2003 will give us more confidence. Third, our goal is we want to perform well enough to earn a bye in the first round and host the second round here at Edinboro."

How much importance do you place on special teams?

"Special teams have always been one of my passions because they account for over 50% of the yardage in a game and yet only 15% of the total snaps. Few fans recognize the impact of special teams and many players don't buy into its significance. John Dudley of the Erie Times wrote an article indicating that we had blocked twice as many kicks as any team in the PSAC. In fact, over a three year period we have blocked nearly one out of every five placements and had twenty-four blocks in a thirty game period. Individually, Sean McNicholas finished second in the NCAA with a 44.2 yard punt average before signing with the New York Jets. We have had some marquee special teams performers who can change the course of the game."

Since arriving at Edinboro, you have talked about wanting "balance" on offense. Was that achieved last year or can we look forward to more changes this year?

"I believe that the improvement in our offense was the single biggest factor in Edinboro becoming a championship team in 2003. For the first time we did develop balance on offense. Opponents knew we had the capability of rushing for 250 yards or throwing for 250 yards if they were unound. We had the ability to score quickly in a two-minute offense and yet the strength to hold the ball and run out the clock with our running game. There will be changes in 2004 as we evolve offensively and adapt to new personnel."

It seems as if speed and quickness have become the emphasis on defense. Is this by design?

"Our scheme has always emphasized movement and running ability on defense. We have said many times to our team that there are four fundamentals in the game of football and three of them have very little to do with size. We are one of the smallest defenses in the PSAC and yet we were able to finish seventh in the nation in scoring defense because our players pursue well and change direction quickly."

We've talked a lot about the football side of things, but academics are also a very important issue to you. Please discuss.

"While at Illinois, we had a very enviable graduation rate over nine years in the Big Ten. That is also coming to Edinboro. The past three semesters have been perhaps the best academic performances of my 37 year career! Our staff has made it a priority to recruit more serious students and young men with character. The newcomers who join us now have a peer group that takes their academics seriously. The old adage that 'we become like our friends' is true and it works in the classroom as well."

What did you learn from the championship season of 2003?

"As a staff, it reaffirmed our commitment to recruiting the combination of talent and character as the base of our program. Those improvements combined with the senior leadership that we experienced last year and the selfless play of that team lead to consistent performances every week. It was a fun team to coach and the players enjoyed each other immensely. Now the challenge is to repeat as champions and that has never been accomplished in Edinboro history."

Sox Harrison Stadium



Sox Harrison Stadium serves as the home of the Fighting Scots. Dedicated in 1965, the stadium honors the memory of B. Regis "Sox" Harrison, the head football and basketball coach at Edinboro University

for 34 years. Sox Harrison was the key figure in the building of Edinboro's athletic program, unselfishly devoting 34 years of service to the University as an athletic director, coach and physical education instructor. Appropriately, he was the first member inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.

Harrison coached the Fighting Scot football team from its inception in 1926 to 1938, then returned to guide the gridgers in 1941 and '42. In addition, he coached the men's basketball team for 23 seasons, from 1928-53, winning 175 games.

Sox Harrison Stadium seats 6,000 people in its two grandstands, along with plenty of standing room. In addition to press boxes on both sides of the stadium, the facility has locker rooms, a training room and complete amenities for fans.

The stadium has undergone several renovations, including a new sound system and improved handicapped access areas in 1999. In 1997, a new grandstand was constructed on the visitor's side of the field, adding 2,500 permanent seats, along with a press box, locker rooms and a training room.

In addition to the football field, the facility contains complete track facilities.

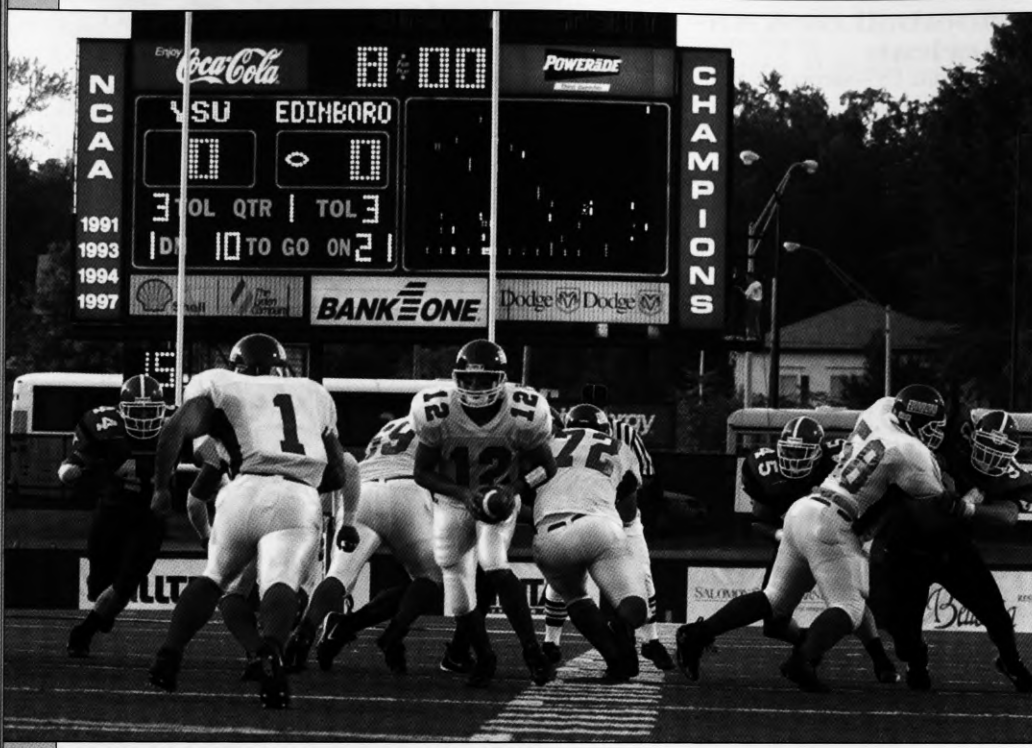

Youngstown, OH – Edinboro provided a stern test for the Division I-AA powerhouse, but when it was all said and done, Youngstown State's speed and the Fighting Scots' inability to turn drives into scores spelled defeat in front of 16,093 fans in the season opener.

All told, Edinboro had the ball in YSU territory seven times, but the Fighting Scots could manage just a touchdown and a field goal. On the first drive of the game, Edinboro marched to the YSU 32 before stalling. The Penguins scored on a 16-yard run by Aaron Marshall, three plays after an Edinboro penalty on fourth down kept the drive alive.

The next drive resulted in a failed 43-yard field goal attempt, with Youngstown State taking a 14-0 lead on Josh Cayson's 73-yard scoring burst. Edinboro cut the margin in half thanks to a 71-yard march which culminated on a three-yard run by Matt Phillips. Phillips then ran in the two-point conversion.

YSU responded with another touchdown for a 21-8 lead, but Edinboro's Eli Visnick kicked his first career field goal, from 37-yards out, with 50 seconds left in the half to cut it to 21-11.

The Penguins stunned the Scots with another touchdown before intermission, aided by an Edinboro personal foul.

The second half belonged to the defenses,

as the only score came on the second play of the fourth quarter, with Mike Burns scoring his second touchdown of the evening.

Edinboro drove to the YSU 36, 8 and 38 in the second half, but could not put any points on the board. One drive ended in a punt, the second on a missed 25-yard field goal, and the third on downs.

Ashland, OH – Thanks to a strong defensive effort Edinboro evened its record at 1-1. Neither team was able to mount any serious offensive threats, as Edinboro finished the night with 243 yards and Ashland with 248.

Ashland scored on its first possession of the night as Austin Wellock booted a 32-yard field goal. Edinboro tried to answer later in the first quarter, but Kody Robertson's 45-yard field goal attempt was no good.

The Scots took the lead for good on Dru Robinson's 66-yard touchdown run with 5:36 left in the second quarter. The senior, a late summer transfer from Indiana University, eluded a pair of tacklers at the line of scrimmage and sprinted down the left sideline for his first score as a Fighting Scot. Robinson would finish with 130 yards on 21 carries. Robertson's extra point attempt was no good.

Eli Visnick came on to handle the place-kicking chores in the second half, booting a 40-yard field goal early in the third quarter, then adding a 20-yarder early in the fourth period. The latter came after Thomas Wallace blocked an Ashland punt.

While the offense struggled most of the night, the defense was exceptional. After throwing for over 300 yards in last year's game, Ashland quarterback John Szabo completed just 12 of 27 passes for 129 yards. Jermaine Hughley led the way with 10 tackles, including a pair of sacks.

Edinboro, PA – After trailing Tiffin 14-6 at the half, Edinboro scored 33 unanswered points in the second half to tame the Dragons in its home opener.

The offense appeared listless over the first thirty minutes, managing just 111 yards and five first downs while turning the ball over three times. The defense had its moments, but gave up 121 yards on the ground in the first half.

The second half was a different story, as the Fighting Scots doubled their offensive yardage midway through the third quarter while finishing with 312 yards. The defense, meanwhile, came up with three interceptions and blocked a punt for the second straight game. Those miscues resulted in 17 points. A high-powered Tiffin offense which came in averaging 459.7 yards per game, 13th in Division II, was held to three first downs and 73 yards in the second half.

Edinboro took the second half kickoff and drove 56 yards on just four plays, culminated by a Justin Bouch-to-Justin Lipscomb 19-yard aerial. Eli Visnick gave the Scots a 16-14 lead with a 30-yard field, then added a 23-yarder five minutes later following the first of Chris Avery's two interceptions.

The second pickoff came two plays later and resulted in an eight-yard scoring pass from Bouch to Mike Martin.

Edinboro tacked on a pair of insurance scores in the fourth quarter. Matt Phillips scored his second touchdown of the day on a seven-yard run after Jim Soltis blocked a Dragons punt. The second score came on a 17-

yard pass from backup quarterback Matt McAdams to Ed Brown. The score was set up by J.D. Baker's 48-yard run.

Edinboro ended the day with 423 total yards, including 252 yards on the ground. The defense, meanwhile, held a Tiffin team which was averaging 300.3 yards through the air, 13th in Division II, to just 85 passing yards. Nate Washington, the leading receiver in Division II, was held to 5 receptions for 43 yards, but did score both of Tiffin's touchdowns.

Edinboro, PA – Playing flawless football under wet conditions, Edinboro handed 16th-ranked East Stroudsburg its first loss of the season in a PSAC crossover game. It marked

the first win for the Fighting Scots over a ranked opponent since a 14-7 win over 17th-ranked Slippery Rock in 2001.

The Warriors came in with some gaudy statistics, including outscoring their first three opponents by a combined 124 points to 24. The Fighting Scots methodically moved down the field against an ESU defense which was ranked third in Division II, allowing just 185.3 yards per game. Edinboro finished with 438 total yards.

Edinboro rallied from a 13-10 halftime deficit to take the lead for good thanks to a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter. Matt Phillips capped a 70-yard drive with a one-yard plunge with 11:40 left in the quarter. The Scots boosted the margin to 24-13 following an interception by Thomas Wallace, the first of his career. Justin Bouch hooked up with Justin Lipscomb from 19 yards out for the touchdown.

East Stroudsburg closed the gap to 24-20 with a touchdown on the first play of the fourth quarter, then drove to the Edinboro 31 before the drive stalled. The Scots followed with an impressive 10-play, 69-yard march, attempting just one pass, which fell incomplete. Brandon Munson accounted for the six-pointer on a 24-yard run.

Munson rushed for a career-high 142 yards on 19 carries as Edinboro gained 205 yards on the ground. Lipscomb accounted for 238 all-purpose yards, catching 5 passes for 77 yards, returning four kickoffs for 147 yards and one punt for 14 yards.

ESU quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger entered the game ranked seventh in Division II in passing efficiency, and burned the Scots for 288 yards through the air with two touch-

downs. However, he was sacked four times and threw a pair of interceptions. In addition, Edinboro held the Warriors to 69 yards on the ground.

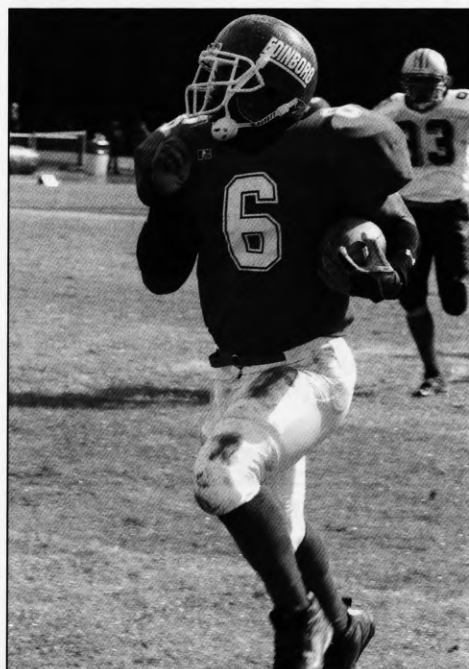

Kuhn, a bruising fullback, scored his fourth touchdown of the afternoon on a four-yard run with 4:28 to play to cap a 73-yard drive. Edinboro took the ensuing kickoff and drove to the Ship 39 before Bouch threw on an interception.

The Red Raiders needed just five plays to cover the 60 yards for the winning score. The Fighting Scots had one last chance, moving to the Red Raider 43 before Bouch was again picked off with just 20 seconds remaining.

After giving up 522 yards a year ago to the Red Raiders, the Edinboro defense again struggled against Shippensburg's Wing T attack, allowing 498 total yards. Indiana, PA - A year ago Indiana(Pa.) came into Sox Harrison Stadium and spoiled Edinboro's Homecoming. With IUP leading 20-7 late in the third quarter, it appeared the Indians were well on their way to celebrating their 2003 Homecoming with a win.

But someone forgot to tell Edinboro. The

Fighting Scots rallied with 21 straight points to defeat the fourth-ranked Indians in one of the biggest wins in school history.

Edinboro had not beaten IUP since 1995, and had not won at Miller Stadium since 1982. In addition, the Indians had won 16 straight home games, 15 straight regular season contests, and their last 14 PSAC West games. The Fighting Scots beat IUP at its own game, completing three long passes to set up touchdowns. The other touchdown came after an interception, one of two on the day.

Following a three-and-out for IUP, the Scots took over at the IUP 45. Bouch found Justin Lipscomb for a 41-yard gain to the IUP 9. On third and goal from there, Valasek made a diving catch of a Bouch toss for his first career touchdown reception with 11:10 to play for a 21-20 lead.

IUP would have the ball three more times but come up with just two first downs. Two of the drives were halted by interceptions. The second, by Chris Avery, led to an insurance score as Matt Phillips bulled in from six yards out for his second touchdown of the day with 57 seconds remaining.

Clarion, PA -- Edinboro passed its first test as a favorite with flying colors. The offense continued its steady improvement with 417 yards, while the defense held the Golden Eagles to 260 total yards and picked off three passes. The win was Edinboro's first at Clarion since 1995.

The Fighting Scots took a 14-3 lead into halftime while being forced to play on a long field the entire half. Edinboro's five drives started from its own 18, 18, 10, 20, and 20. The Scots put together a pair of long marches, including an 82-yard drive in 11 plays on their first possession. Matt Phillips carried the ball four times for 33 yards, and Justin Bouch plunged in from a yard out for the score.

Clarion closed the margin to 7-3 on Mark Hofmeister's 25-yard field goal with 57 seconds to play in the first quarter.

Phillips scored the first of his two touchdowns midway through the second quarter from five yards out, concluding an 8-play, 80-yard march.

Hofmeister added a 33-yard field goal in the third quarter to cut the gap to 14-6, but after playing with a long field for most of the game, the tide turned for Edinboro's final three scores. The first was set up by Raji El-Amin's interception, with Edinboro taking over at the Clarion 25. Four plays later Brandon Munson scored on a 9-yard run with 3:42 left in the third quarter.

Justin Lipscomb's 38-yard punt return had the Scots back in Clarion territory at the 36. Following a 24-yard Bouch-to-Lipscomb hookup, Phillips bulled in from two yards out two plays later to start the fourth quarter.

The Scots added a final touchdown after another interception. Backup quarterback Matt McAdams found Mike Martin wide open for a 42-yard gain to the CU 2. Martin scored on the next play.

Edinboro, PA -- Edinboro secured its first winning season since 1996 with its third straight win. This one belonged to the defense, as the Fighting Scots limited Slippery Rock to 188 total yards and forced four turnovers.

The offense, meanwhile, chuirned out 224 yards on the ground, including a career-high 149 yards from Brandon Munson, and finished the day with 377 total yards. Edinboro held a wide margin in time of possession, 39:01 to 20:59.

The contest was a battle of field goals until late in the first half when a Slippery Rock fumble handed Edinboro a ten-point cushion at intermission. Leading 6-3 and out of timeouts, Edinboro's Ben Stroup forced a fumble by SRU's Mike Vermillo at the SRU 17. Slippery Rock put together its only scoring march of the day on the ensuing kickoff. The drive stalled at the Edinboro 28, with John Katsaouni booting a 45-yard field goal to make it 6-3 with 14:11 left in the second quarter.

Edinboro accounted for the lone points in the second half in an unlikely manner. With Justin Bouch knocked out of the game briefly with an injury, backup Matt McAdams came in, and without the benefit of a warmup toss, threw a 42-yard touchdown pass to Justin Lipscomb.

Kutztown, PA -- In one of its most dominating performances in years, Edinboro celebrated its debut in the NCAA Division II national rankings with a lopsided road win. The Fighting Scots, ranked 23rd in the AFCA Top 25, won its fourth straight game, the longest streak since 1995. The 56 points were the most points scored since 1994, and the 53-point winning margin was the tenth-highest in school history.

The defense stretched its streak to 14 quarters without allowing a touchdown, and scored for the second straight week. The defense actually accounted for two scores while forcing five turnovers and blocking a punt.

After a three-and-out series for Edinboro, the Fighting Scots quickly got on the scoreboard thanks to the defense. On Kutztown's very first

play from scrimmage, Raji El-Amin intercepted a pass and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown just 76 seconds into the game. The freshman free safety would finish with a pair of interceptions and a fumble recovery.

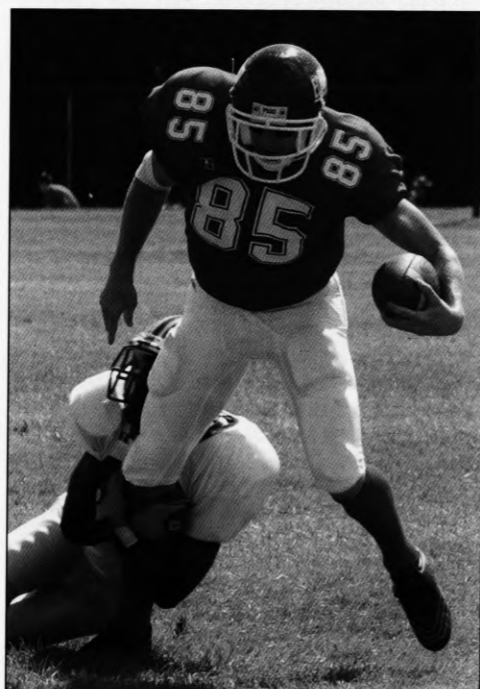
Kutztown's Matt Scartozzi kicked a 39-yard field goal late in the first quarter, setting the stage for 49 straight Edinboro points. In their final eleven possessions the Golden Bears would run just two more plays inside Edinboro territory.

Edinboro took a 21-3 lead at the half with a pair of second quarter touchdowns. Brandon Munson accounted for 62 yards rushing as the Scots drove 66 yards in 12 plays, with Matt Phillips scoring the first of his three touchdowns from a yard out. Chris Avery's interception set up a 17-yard scoring pass from Justin Bouch to Sean Hess with just 15 seconds left in the half.

The Fighting Scots dominated action in the second half, particularly the third quarter when just three plays by both teams were run in Edinboro territory. Phillips capped a 10-play, 78-yard drive with a two-yard run. The Scots were back in business following a fumble recovery, leading to a two-yard Bouch-to-Nate Eimer touchdown pass, the first TD reception of Eimer's career.

Edinboro scored three more times in the fourth quarter, beginning with Phillips' one-yard run on the second play of the period. That score was set up after Jim Soltis blocked a Golden Bear punt. J.D. Baker scored his first career touchdown on a one-yard plunge later in the quarter, and Regis Burns capped the scoring with a 50-yard interception return, his first career interception and touchdown.

The statistics were as lopsided as the score. Edinboro gained 433 yards while holding Kutztown to 147 yards. The Scots had a season-

high 310 yards on the ground, with Munson rushing for 125 yards on 16 carries for his fourth 100-yard game of the season.

Edinboro, PA -- Justin Bouch threw for three touchdowns as Edinboro continued its run for an NCAA Division II Northeast Region playoff berth with its fifth straight win.

A strong first half showing by the offense and a dominant defensive performance keyed the Fighting Scots. Edinboro gained 260 of its 342 total yards in the first half while grabbing a 21-0 lead at intermission against one of the top defenses in the PSAC. In the meantime the

defense extended its streak without giving up a touchdown to 18 quarters. California(Pa.) was held to 178 total yards, the third straight game holding an opponent under 200 yards.

Edinboro scored on its second possession of the game as Justin Bouch directed a 10-play, 73-yard drive, culminated by a 29-yard scoring pass to Nate Eimer. Bouch hooked up with Lipscomb on the Scots' next possession, the scoring toss covering 16 yards.

Lock Haven, PA -- Edinboro, ranked 20th in the AFCA Top 25, claimed a share of the PSAC West championship with its sixth straight win. In the process the Fighting Scots secured their first NCAA Division II Playoff berth since 1995. That was also the last time the Scots were PSAC West champions.

Edinboro jumped out to a 28-0 halftime advantage while extending its string of consecutive quarters without giving up a touchdown. Lock Haven finally became the first team to reach the end zone since IUP scored a six-point-er in the second quarter in week number six.

The Fighting Scots scored on four of their first five possessions, opening the scoring on the second play of the game as Dru Robinson burst 70 yards. Edinboro then scored twice in the final two minutes, with Matt Phillips scoring on a 7-yard run and Brandon Munson reaching paydirt on a 10-yard run. The latter score came after Raji El-Amin's interception.

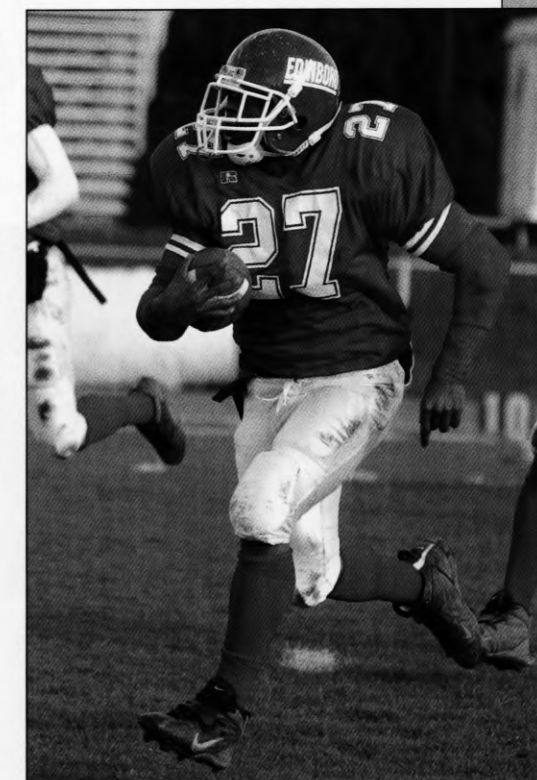

University Center, MI -- Edinboro drew top-ranked Saginaw Valley State in its first NCAA Division II playoff appearance since 1995. The Fighting Scots entered postseason play riding a six-game winning streak, but they could not come up with an answer for the high-powered Cardinal offense.

Edinboro took the opening kickoff and drove 82 yards on 16 plays before settling for Kody Robertson's 19-yard field goal. Featuring a combination of runs and passes, the Fighting Scots converted on three third down plays, but the Cardinal defense stopped Edinboro at the one yard line. The drive took up 6 minutes and 22 seconds, a common theme for Edinboro in the first half.

Unfortunately for the Scots, another common theme was the quick strike ability of the Saginaw Valley State offense. The Cardinals needed just four plays to go 74 yards and take a 7-3 lead, as Glenn Martinez got behind the Edinboro secondary for a 42-yard touchdown pass from Mark Radlinski.

Using the ground game for all but one play, the Scots put together a 12-play march on the ensuing possession, but the drive stalled at the SVSU 35 and the Scots were forced to punt. Saginaw Valley State needed seven plays to cover 80 yards this time, with Joe Johnson scoring on a six yard run for a 14-3 advantage early

in the second quarter.

The Edinboro offense answered with its own drive, going 67 yards on six plays. Justin Bouch, who started the drive with a 44-yard pass to Justin Lipscomb, plunged in from a yard out with 10:45 remaining in the second quarter. The extra point was no good, however, leaving Edinboro with a 14-9 deficit.

Edinboro had the ball in SVSU territory three more times in the quarter, but could not put any points on the board. After forcing a Cardinal punt, the Scots marched from their won 36 to the SVSU 15. In possibly the key play of the first half for Edinboro, Bouch was hit from behind while attempting to pass and fumbled, with the Cardinals recovering at their own 19. On the very next play Radlinski attempted to go deep but was picked off by Raji El-Amin. The freshman free safety returned his school-record ninth interception 12 yards to the SVSU 43.

The Scots were unable to come up with a first down, however, and were forced to punt. Taking over at their own 21 late in the first half, the Cardinals dealt severe blow to Edinboro's upset bid just three plays later. After completing passes of 19 and 9 yards, Radlinski caught Edinboro in one of its few blitzes of the half, hooking up with Mark LaFraniere on a 51-yard scoring play with just 1:38 left in the first half. Ruvell Martin ran in the two-point conversion for a 22-9 lead at the half.

While on the short end of the score, Edinboro dominated play statistically over the first thirty minutes. The Fighting Scots ran off 53 plays for 292 yards and had the ball for 21:56. Edinboro had the ball in SVSU territory on all six of its first half possessions, but could score just twice. While running off just 23 plays, Saginaw Valley State accumulated 277 total yards. In another bit of statistical dominance, the Scots converted 11 of 14 third down

plays. SVSU, however, was forced into a third down situation just once.

The second half belonged to the defenses. Saginaw Valley State took the third quarter kickoff and drove to the Edinboro 20 before Eric Houle came in and booted a 37-yard field goal to boost the margin to 25-9.

The Scots defense held Saginaw Valley State to

a three-and-out for the first time all day on the ensuing possession, but the Cardinals pinned Edinboro back at its own 10. That began a stretch of three straight possessions that began at the 10, 11 and 20 for the Scots, their final three drives of the game.

The poor field position led to a more conservative approach, with the Scots forced to run the ball more. Edinboro managed just one more drive into SVSU territory, reaching the 46-yard line. The Cardinals tacked on an insurance touchdown midway through the fourth quarter, with Joe Johnson scoring his second touchdown on a two-yard run.

After moving the ball at will in the first half, the Scots managed just five first downs and 100 total yards in the second half. The Cardinals, meanwhile, gained 191 yards, including 109 yards on the ground. Known for one of the best passing attacks in the country, the Cardinals threw for 262 yards, but it was their ground game that surprised the Scots, as they finished with 206 yards rushing.

Fighting Scots in the Pros

Edinboro University has had a history of players performing in the professional ranks. Three former Fighting Scots are playing professionally this season, two in the Canadian Football League and one in Arena Football.

Jeremy O'Day is in his eighth season as an offensive lineman in the CFL, and in his sixth season with the Saskatchewan Roughriders. He was chosen by the Toronto Argonauts in the 1997 supplemental draft. John Williams was drafted by British Columbia in the fourth round of the 2002 CFL Draft. He is currently on Toronto's roster.

The third Fighting Scot playing professionally is wide receiver Quentin Ware-Bey, who performs for Green Bay in the AFL2.

A year ago punter Sean McNicholas signed as a free agent with the New York Jets. A number of other Fighting Scots have made their marks in the professional ranks. Denorse Mosely was a member of the Miami Dolphins as a defensive back for two seasons, and was also in training camp with the Green Bay Packers.

Dave Green and Jim Romaniszyn playing for the Cleveland Browns in the 1970's. Green, a running back, also played for the Montreal Alouettes in the CFL. Romaniszyn, a 6'2", 225 lb. running back, was drafted by the Browns in the 13th round in 1973, then switched to linebacker.

Jeff Traversy, a 6'5", 280 lb. nose tackle, was the Calgary Stampeders' third pick in the 1997 college draft and played through the 2002 season.

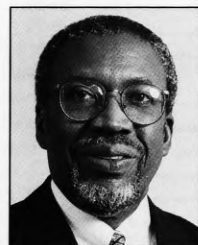
This is Edinboro University



Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is the largest comprehensive four-year university in northwestern Pennsylvania. Its 585-acre campus is home to some 8,000 students studying in more than 100 academic programs. The University's programs in art, criminal justice, and speech language pathology, among others, have earned regional and national recognition and accolades, and the campus is ranked among the top 10 in the nation for the services provided for students with disabilities. In 2003 the University's institutional accreditation with the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools was reaffirmed with commendation for ten years. Dr. Frank G. Pogue

President, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Dr. Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor for student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central Administration in Albany, serving in that position for 10 years. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, President Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY at Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. He serves as a member of the American Council on Education (ACE) Commission on Women in Higher Education which provides counsel to ACE on policies related to women in higher education and advises on other concerns related to expanded roles and equal opportunity for women in higher education. He is a member of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Committee on Professional Development, Millennium Leadership Initiative and Christa McAuliffe Selection Committee. He was appointed in 2003 to the International Association of University Presidents Commission on Disarmament Education, Conflict Resolution and Peace. Since 1984, Dr. Pogue has served on the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA). Most recently, he served as President for the MSA Board of Trustees and as a member of its Executive Committee, and he is a former vice chair of the Commission's Executive Committee.

Dr. Pogue also serves on the Board of Trustees of the BACCHUS &

Sesquicentennial recognizing 150 years of service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and beyond.

Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie -- Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 480,000 bound volumes and 1.3 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

The main campus also includes a modern University Center, planetarium, observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and television stations, health center, counseling center, and much more -- all accessible for people with disabilities. The recently renovated and expanded Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of its kind in the nation.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including six residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learned floors -- all are wired for voice, video and data.

Edinboro University also operates centers in Erie and Meadville. Edinboro University in Erie -- The Porreco Center is a beautiful 27-acre campus that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for small conferences, business meetings, and special events. Edinboro University in Meadville is located in the city's historic Bessemer Building.

GAMMA Peer Education Network. He served for two years as chairperson of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (SSHE) Commission for the Universities and Commission of Presidents Executive Committee. He is a member of the Executive Board of A Community of Agile Partners in Education (CAPE). In October 1996, Dr. Pogue was appointed by then Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge to the Governor's Commission on Academic Standards. In November 2002, he was appointed co-chair of the Higher Education Committee of Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell's Transition Team. In May, 2004, he was appointed to the Pennsylvania Department of Education Higher Education Advisory Board.

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the Boards of Directors for the Meadville Area Industrial Commission, the Erie Regional Chamber and Growth Partnership, and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra. He serves on the Boards of Corporators for the Hamot Health Foundation, the Saint Vincent Health Center, and the Meadville Medical Center. He is a member of the Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee and an Honorary Member of the Erie Wolves Club. Dr. Pogue was chairperson of the Erie County Millennium Commission, the Erie County State Employees Combined Appeal (SECA) campaign in 2001 and 2002, and of the Erie Day School's Adopt-A-Scholar scholarship program (2000-01 and 2002-03). He was also a member of the Erie Mayor's Task Force on Public Safety. Dr. Pogue has served on the boards of directors for the United Way of Erie County and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

Dr. Pogue was honored by the Erie Area Chamber of Commerce with the Louis J. Tullio Community Service Award. The Greater Erie Community Action Committee (GECAC) honored him with the Paul P. Martin Community Service Award in 2000, and in 1999, the Distinguished Service Award for Leadership and Vision was presented to him by the SUNY at Albany Council of Trustees.

Dr. Pogue has shared his experiences and expertise in Edinboro University classrooms via guest lecturer presentations. He has also taught a course titled, "Special Topics in Sociology" for the Department of Sociology. He continues to enjoy working in the classroom environment.

Since becoming president, Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.

Athletic Administration

Bruce Baumgartner

Director of Athletics



Bruce Baumgartner is regarded as one of the greatest American wrestlers ever, being recognized as the U.S. Olympic Wrestler of the Century by Globalaccess.com four years ago and being inducted into the Wrestling Hall of Fame last summer. Now Baumgartner is building a solid reputation as an athletic administrator. Baumgartner was named the acting Director of Athletics in 1997, then was awarded the job permanently in '98.

As the guiding force of the Fighting Scot athletic program, Baumgartner has initiated the Annual Athletic Fund Drive, a fundraising project designed to provide athletic scholarship funds. In addition, he has initiated several other fundraising projects, including a semi-annual sports memorabilia auction which has raised almost \$80,000 in its five years, plus the Super Bowl Raffle, a highly-successful project.

Baumgartner targeted improvements in McComb Fieldhouse this past year. The results were clearly evident. Both the gymnasium and outer lobby were modernized, with emphasis placed on the success of Edinboro's athletic teams and student-athletes. Under Baumgartner's direction Edinboro athletics enjoyed a banner season, with three teams winning PSAC Championships and nine squads advancing to PSAC and/or NCAA postseason action.

A four-time Olympic medalist, Baumgartner served as an Edinboro wrestling coach for nearly 13 years, including seven seasons as the head coach. He compiled a 70-36 record, including 14-0 dual meet record in 1997, the best finish in school history. The Scots then

went on to finish sixth at the NCAA Division I Nationals, their highest finish ever.

Baumgartner affirmed his status as the greatest freestyle heavyweight wrestler in American history by winning the bronze medal at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta to go along with two golds and a silver. It was his fourth Olympic medal and record-setting 13th world-level medal. Baumgartner was honored by his fellow United States Olympic athletes when he was chosen to carry the American flag for the opening ceremonies. He won his first gold medal in Los Angeles in 1984, America's first in 60 years of super heavyweight wrestling. Next came a silver medal performance at the 1988 Games in Seoul, Korea, followed by a second gold medal in Barcelona, Spain in '92 to become the first American wrestler to ever medal in three consecutive Olympics.

Honored as the winner of the James E. Sullivan Award in 1995 as the outstanding amateur athlete in the United States, Baumgartner had not lost to an American wrestler from 1981 through his retirement from competition in 1998. He has been inducted into numerous Hall of Fames, including the Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2002 and the Pennsylvania Hall of Fame earlier this year.

As a collegiate wrestler at Indiana State University, Baumgartner won 134 of 146 collegiate matches with 73 falls. He was twice the runner-up at the national collegiate tournament, then posted a perfect 44-0 mark his senior year to capture the NCAA crown.

Baumgartner was honored by the NCAA as a "Top V Award" recipient for his athletic, leadership and academic success. He was later awarded an NCAA post-graduate scholarship after earning his Bachelor's Degree in Industrial Art Education. He utilized the award to earn a Master's Degree at Oklahoma State University.

Baumgartner officially retired from wrestling in the summer of 1998, but still performs a great deal of community service as a motivational speaker and camp clinician. He and his wife, Linda, have three sons, Bryan (14), Zachary (11) and Dylan (7).

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Credentials for sideline photography should be requested in writing, per credentials guidelines.

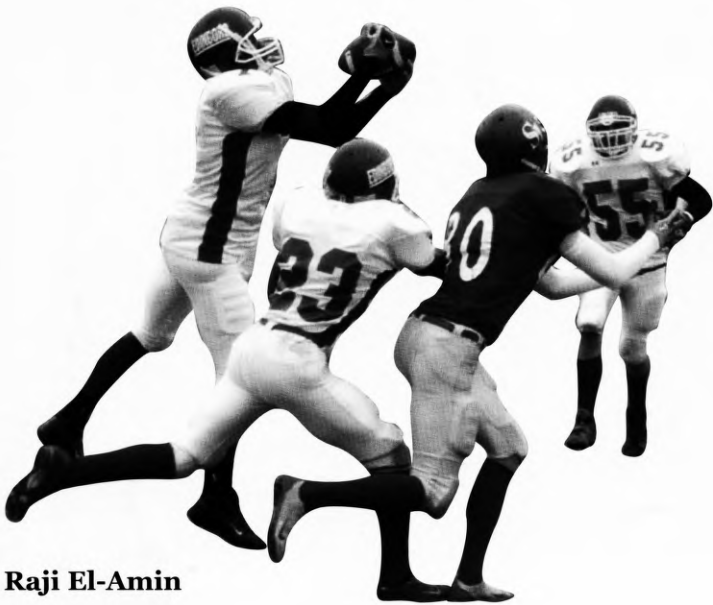

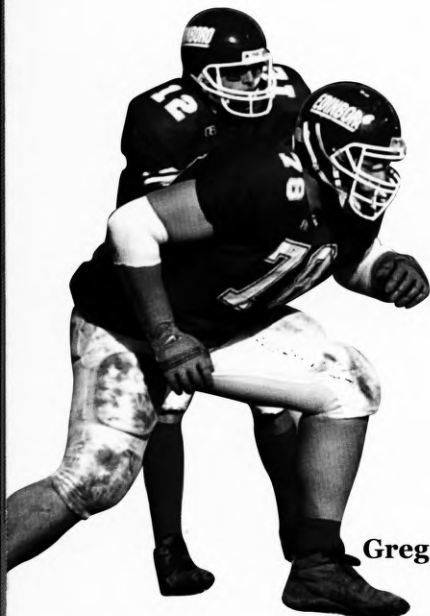

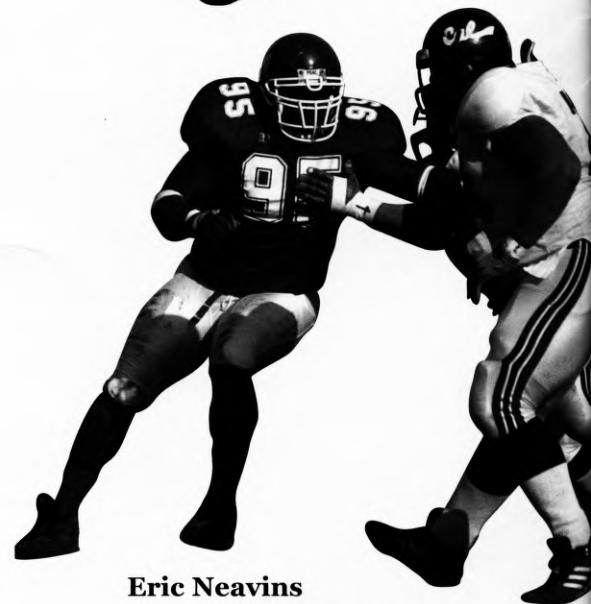
