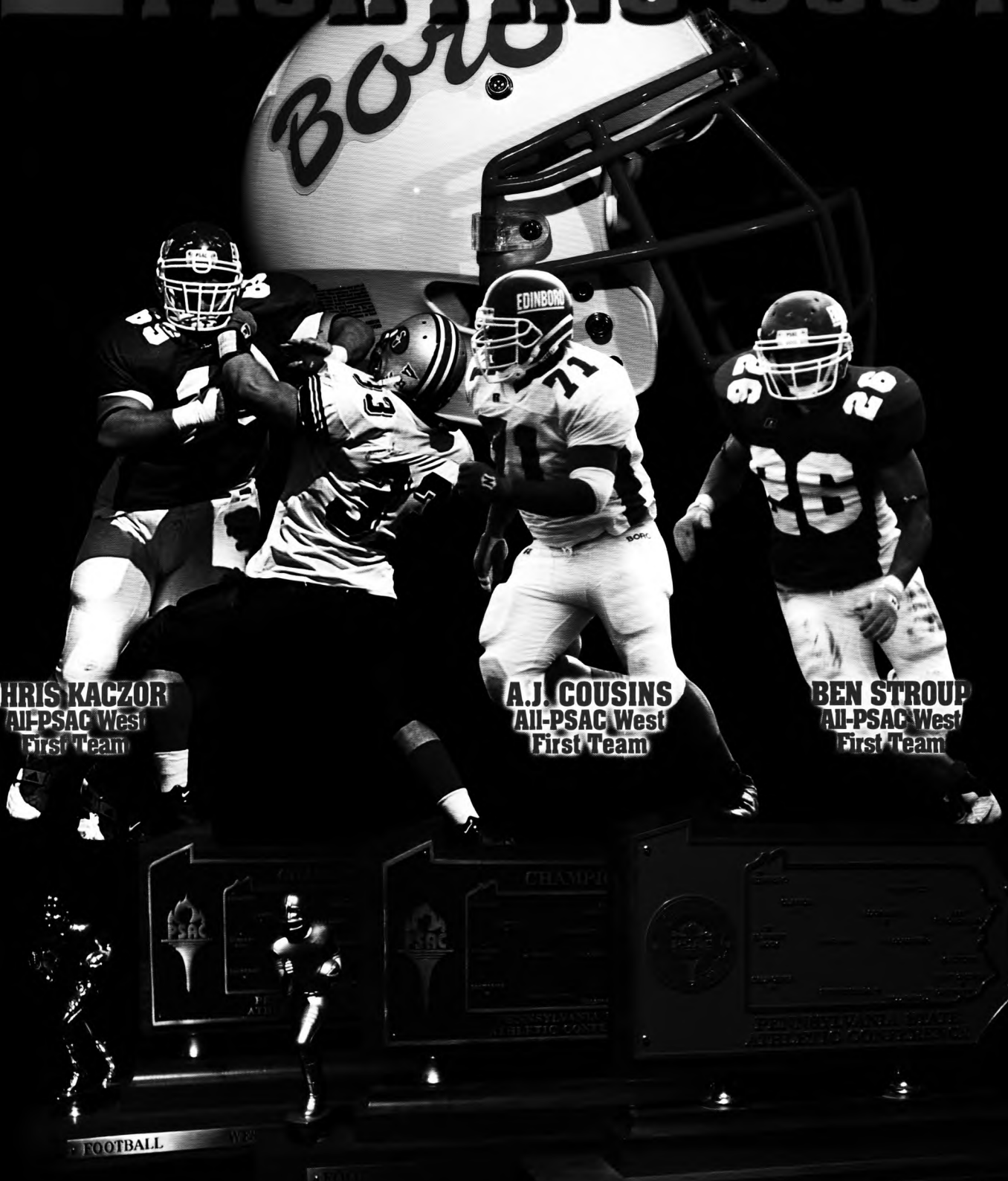

Dear Family, Friends and Fans of the Fighting Scots:



# Edinboro Excels in 2005-06

# 2006 Season Preview

As we embark on the 2006-07 academic year, it's hard not to take a look back and marvel at the accomplishments of the 2005-06 Fighting Scots. Edinboro athletics enjoyed a banner year, both on the playing fields and in the classroom.

Consider that Fighting Scot athletic teams won four Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championships, led of course by the football team with its third straight PSAC West crown.

The men's basketball team made it two straight PSAC championships, the first team to win back-to-back championships since 1983. The women's cross country team won its eighth straight PSAC title, while the wrestling team made it seven PSAC championships in the last nine years. The wrestlers also won their fourth straight Eastern Wrestling League title and eighth in the last nine years.

All told, Edinboro's 14 varsity athletic programs compiled an impressive 142-94-3 record. Out of those 14 sports, nine either qualified for their respective NCAA championships or had individuals in the championships.

The wrestling team made quite an impression on the Division I level, finishing as the lone undefeated team in Division I with a perfect 12-0 record. The Fighting Scots went on to finish eighth at the NCAA Division I Wrestling National Championships.

As you might expect, there were numerous individual honors. A total of 14 individuals earned All-American honors. Four student-athletes were accorded Player of the Year honors in their sports, with Shawn Bunch named the EWL and PSAC Wrestler of the Year. In addition, Chris Amico was recognized as the PSAC West Defensive Player of the Year in football, Callie Iorfido was named the women's basketball PSAC West Player of the Year, and Kelly Richards capped an outstanding season by being named the PSAC Women's Track Athlete of the Year.

Of course, these performances wouldn't be possible without some outstanding coaching. No fewer than four coaches were accorded Coach of the Year honors. In addition to Lou Tepper in football by the PSAC West, Gary Kagiavas was recognized as the PSAC West Women's Soccer Coach of the Year. Doug Watts was named the Regional Coach of the Year in both men's and women's cross country, and Tim Flynn was honored as the EWL Coach of the Year.

The success was just as evident in the classroom. Edinboro's annual Scholar-Athlete Banquet

included 116 honorees. That means over one-third of the total student-athlete population maintains a grade-point average of 3.00 or higher.

A total of 76 Edinboro student-athletes were recognized as PSAC Scholar-Athletes for maintaining a GPA of 3.25 or higher. Five athletic teams had a team GPA of at least 3.0, while the overall average GPA for the spring semester was 2.826.

Cross country and track & field athletes Julie Nemerlut and Richards led the way. Both were chosen for NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships, the only two recipients from the PSAC. In addition, both were first team ESPN the Magazine Academic All-Americans.

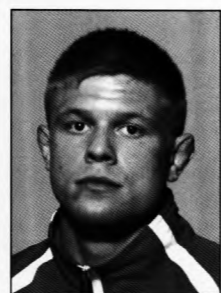

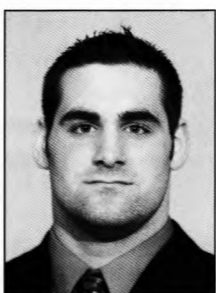

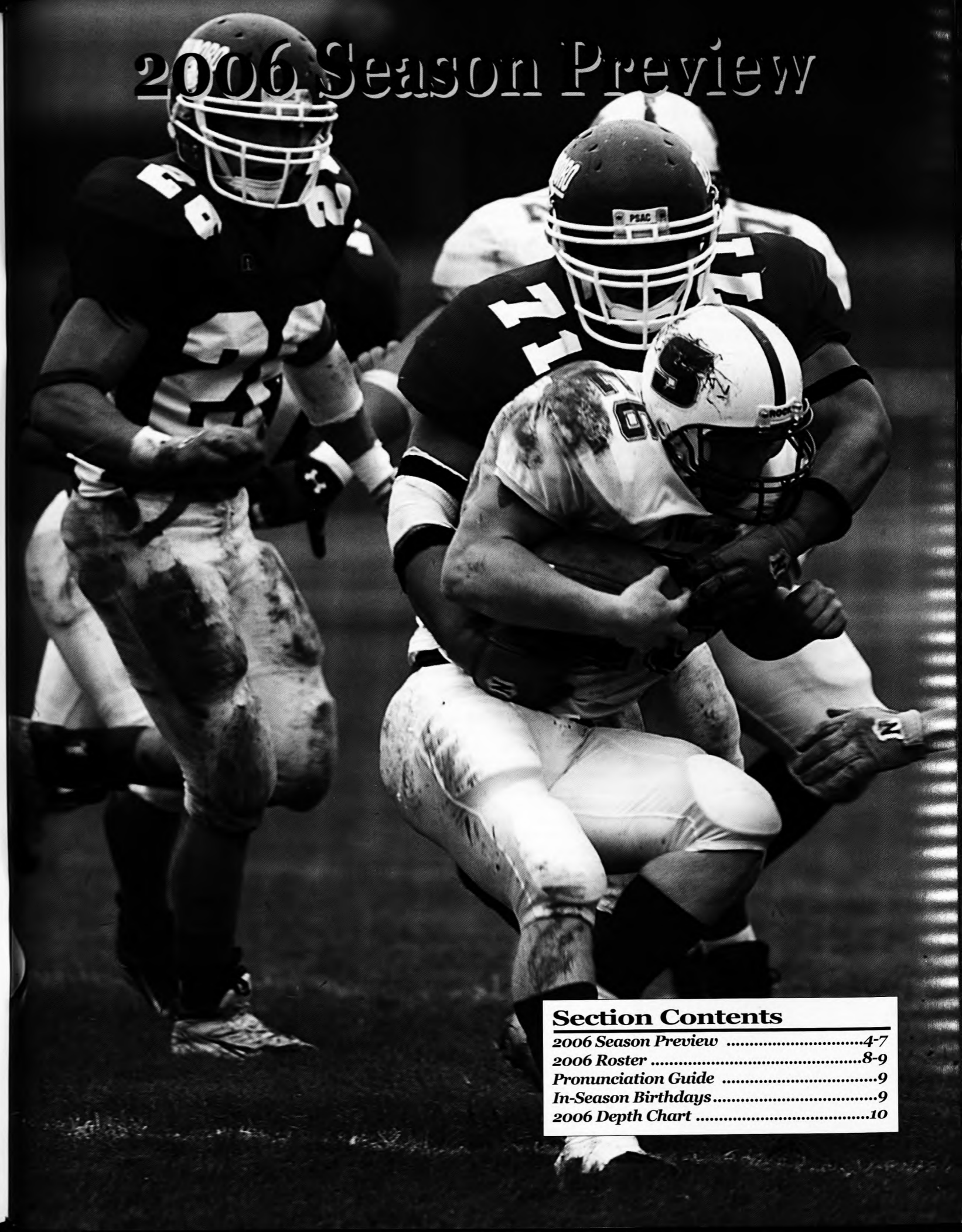

## Defense Spearheads Boro Efforts for Fourth Straight PSAC West Championship

Like a master historian, Edinboro University football coach Scott Browning is well aware of the Fighting Scots' heritage. That's why when he was introduced as the head coach on January 5, 2006, it was not only the beginning of a new era, but the return of an old one. Browning wasted little time in proclaiming "The Boro is Back!"

A veteran of twenty seasons as an assistant coach at Edinboro, Browning knows all too well the tradition of Fighting Scot football. He has been a part of five of Edinboro's nine Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference titles, and all seven of its NCAA Division II Playoff appearances. During that time he has worked with some of the greats in Boro football, players such as Ernest Priestler, Elbert Cole, Larry Jackson, Jody Dickerson, Jason Perkins, etc. The list goes on and on.

"I have always felt there is a great deal of alumni pride in the Boro," stated Browning. "Bringing back the tradition is the best way to connect with the Edinboro alumni. There is a great amount of pride in the Boro, and we intend to exhibit it."

Browning inherits a team which finished 8-2 a year ago, winning its third straight PSAC West title and narrowly missing a third straight

NCAA playoff appearance. Over the past three years the Fighting Scots have won 26 games, the most wins in school history for a three-year period. Now the Fighting Scots seek a fourth straight divisional crown, last accomplished by IUP in the West from 2000-03. In fact, IUP (twice) and Slippery Rock are the only teams to ever win four straight PSAC West crowns.

A total of 37 letterwinners return, including 14 starters. Browning served most of his twenty seasons as an assistant on the offensive side of the ball, but he's fully aware of the value of a strong defense. "Our goal is to win the PSAC West," Browning commented. "You win championships with defense. We think ours can be special this year."

Like a pennant-winning baseball team, Edinboro has assembled a defense which is strong up the middle, beginning with a pair of interior stalwarts in defensive tackle Chris Amico, the PSAC West Defensive Player of the Year, and A.J. Cousins, a two-time All-PSAC West selection. They are the frontline for a linebacker corps that Browning feels is one of the best in Division II. The group includes seniors Ben Stroup, Jim Soltis and Dave Jazenski. The last line of defense is the outstanding safety tandem of Tom Davidson and Damion Malott.

A year ago Edinboro's defense ranked as the best in Division II in three key categories, ranking first in scoring defense (9.3 ppg.), total defense (211.2 ypg.) and rushing defense (53.7 ypg.). In addition, the Scots finished third in turnover margin in Division II and led the PSAC in sacks (39).

"Our strength is definitely our defense," admitted Browning. "Seven starters are coming back. We do have some concerns on defense. Both ends are inexperienced, and we have some unanswered questions in the secondary. We had some kids step up in the spring. Now it will be interesting to see how they respond."

Five starters return on offense, but it will be a new-look attack, beginning at quarterback, where redshirt freshman Trevor Harris replaces Justin Bouch, a three-and-a-half year starter. While new offensive coordinator Mike Yurcich will provide a few new wrinkles, Browning is a firm believer in the ability to run the football while mixing in the pass, but he admits that Yurcich is not of the same conservative nature.

"Offensively, we have some holes to fill," Browning surmised. "Obviously that starts at the quarterback position. Trevor Harris has clearly won the starting role. He had a nice spring and progressed each day. I think he shows signs of being a very good field general. We lose two premier players in the offensive line. We have had some young guys step up. Now we have to settle and create some continuity."

Browning feels the pieces are in place for another run at a PSAC crown. But stand-

ing in the way is a schedule which not only features the traditional PSAC West rivals, but the top three teams in the PSAC East, all NCAA playoff outfits in 2005.

"I think this may be the toughest schedule since I've been here," related Browning. "The only year might be 1995 with Appalachian State and Portland State. That is very comparable. That's good. In '95, our kids stepped up to the challenge. We went after it. That's what our kids have to do."

The 2006 campaign kicks off at West Chester on September 2. The Golden Rams were 8-4 a year ago. The Fighting Scots then play five of their next six contests at home, albeit a brutal stretch. After debuting at home on September 9 against St. Anselm, Bloomsburg invades Sox Harrison Stadium on September 16. The Huskies were 11-1 a year ago and won the PSAC East title.

The Boro opens PSAC West action with a familiar foe on September 30, as former head coach Lou Tepper will bring Indiana(Pa.) to Sox Harrison Stadium. That is followed the next week by a Homecoming date with California(Pa.). A year ago the Vulcans tied Edinboro for the PSAC West crown, and come off an 8-2 campaign. Wrapping up the homestand is a date with East Stroudsburg on October 14. The Warriors reached the NCAA Division II semifinals a year ago, finishing with a 11-3 record behind the top player in Division II, Jimmy Terwilliger. The senior signalcaller won the 2005 Harlon Hill Trophy, and has bedeviled the Scots in previous meetings.

### Offense

The success of the Fighting Scots may well depend on the identity taken by the offense. A year ago Edinboro averaged 31.4 ppg., the second straight year over 30 ppg. The Fighting Scots topped the 40-point mark on four occasions.

Balance has been the keyword in recent years, and last year was no exception. Edinboro averaged 199.3 yards rushing and 174.8 yards on the ground. Yet more than that, it has been a team that hasn't beaten itself. While ranking third in Division II in turnover margin, the Fighting Scots turned the pigskin over just 11 times, including losing just two fumbles. In addition, Edinboro led the PSAC in fewest sacks allowed for the second straight year, tying California(Pa.) with seven sacks allowed.

The 2006 offense returns five starters, but it is how the six new starters pan out that will ultimately decide whether this will be a high-octane attack. With the quarterback depth chart showing two redshirt freshmen at the top, Browning admits the team may be a little conservative at first. Edinboro has made use of multiple feature backs in recent years, meaning several freshmen backs may have to step up. Finally, the offensive line was shuffled during

the spring while looking to replace two starters.

### Quarterback

Justin Bouch is gone, turning over the reins to highly-touted redshirt freshman Trevor Harris. The 6'3", 200 lb. Harris did not disappoint in the spring, but the Fighting Scots still don't have a quarterback that has taken a snap in a game. "We may limit things a little bit at first," admitted Browning. "We'll look to take care of the ball. Early in the season we'll ask Trevor to do things he's comfortable with."

Harris, an intelligent player with a strong arm, put up some gaudy numbers as a prepster at Marion Pleasant (Oh.) High School, and is a former All-Ohio selection. If his spring is any indication, he's ready to replace Bouch. If he's as good as the coaching staff feels he is, he may well be rewriting some of Bouch's records before it's all over.

Joe Wanson, another redshirt freshman, will serve as Harris' backup. At 6'3", 218 lbs., Wanson possesses good size and showed a good understanding of the offense in the spring. Bill Schneider, a 6'1", 195 lb. sophomore who joined the team in the spring, is another option.

### Running Back

Ulysee "Spud" Davis had three 100-yard games in his first five career games, but the sophomore's playing time was reduced over the second half of the season with the emergence of Kelvin Collins. With Collins gone, Davis assumes the main ballcarrying role again.

Davis is a darting 5'10", 200 lb. sophomore who was in great condition in spring drills. "Spud had a very good spring, and exhibited an outstanding work ethic. He has grown up a great deal and really matured. But he's the only proven tailback we have," related Browning. Davis ended the season as the second-leading rusher with 739 yards on 151 carries with 8 TDs.

Chaz Cobbs, a 5'11", 197 lb. sophomore and a converted cornerback, and Jay Van Leer, a 5'9", 190 lb. redshirt freshman, served as Davis' backups in the spring. They will battle for that role in the fall, as will a host of promising freshmen who could make an immediate impact.

Justin Olney returns at fullback after starting three games in 2005. A junior, Olney has bulked up to 245 lbs. Caleb Mayer is expected to push Olney for the starting role. A 6'0", 239 lb. junior, Mayer sat out the 2005 campaign after transferring from Liberty. He played linebacker for the Flames, but moved to fullback at the conclusion of spring drills. Billy Dick, another junior, provides more depth.

### Receivers

Edinboro's receiving corps is solid if not spectacular. While searching for the elusive home-run threat, the Fighting Scots possess a host of solid wideouts. The common thread is good hands and the ability to block. "We made positive strides in the spring at wide receiver," stated Browning. "We're very solid as a core. We don't have one feature guy."

Ryan Valasek became Edinboro's big-play receiver a year ago. The 5'11", 175 lb. senior earned

second team All-PSAC West honors after hauling in a team-leading 28 passes for 509 yards, an 18.2 yard average, with 5 TDs. Valasek ranks eighth in career receiving yards (1,233) and 12th in career receptions (68).

"Ryan had a really productive spring," Browning mentioned. "He caught everything, and improved as route runner."

Aaron Fetty is one of a host of big receivers. The former tight end has battled injuries and has yet to realize his full potential, but the coaching staff feels this may be the year the 6'5", 220 lb. senior breaks through. He caught 12 passes for 129 yards a year ago.

The likely third starter in three receiver sets is Ryan Rybicki, a 6'2", 220 lb. sophomore. Rybicki caught 4 passes for 79 yards while seeing increased playing time as the year progressed.

A host of other receivers will battle for time. Diminutive Deonte Peters (5'7", 163 lbs.) was a solid return man as a freshman, but he made a limited impact as a receiver. Like Valasek, the sophomore has the ability to turn a short gain into a big play. Junior Marshall Ellison returns to the team after sitting out the 2005 season. He caught a pair of passes in 2004. Rich Cerro and Mykel Griggs redshirted in 2005. Cerro is a transfer from Clarion who played defensive back for the Golden Eagles. The sophomore enjoyed a solid spring and could become a factor. Griggs likely needs more seasoning, but the redshirt freshman possesses the speed the team desperately needs. Tom LaVerde is another player with speed. A 6'2", 195 lb. senior, LaVerde has bounced between cornerback and receiver during his career. He has not played on the offensive side of the ball since 2003, when he caught a pair of passes.

A position of concern several years ago, tight end has now become a strength. With C.J. Trivisonno and Nate Eimer both gone, depth is a concern, but talent isn't. Kyle Witucki has seen plenty of action in a reserve role his first two seasons, and the 6'3", 245 lb. junior could play a major role in the offense. A year ago Witucki caught 15 passes for 144 yards, with four going for touchdowns. In fact, six of his 22 career receptions have been for six points.

"Kyle had a super spring," commented Browning. "He runs good routes and catches the ball very well. He needs to continue to improve as a blocker, but we expect big things from him."

Joe Gable is the only other experienced tight end on the roster. The 6'3", 245 lb. sophomore has been a pleasant surprise and should allow the Fighting Scots to once again use plenty of two tight end sets.

**Browning on the Receivers:** "We have a solid group, and all complement each other very well. We don't have one feature guy, but I think we made positive strides in the spring."

### Offensive Line

A strong offensive line has become the Edinboro trademark in recent years, and Browning hopes that continues this season. The Fighting Scots have led the PSAC in fewest sacks each of the last two years, giving up nine in 2004 and seven a year ago. Four linemen have been chosen to play in the Cactus Bowl since 2002.

Browning's concerns are replacing two-time All-American Greg Bzorek at right tackle and

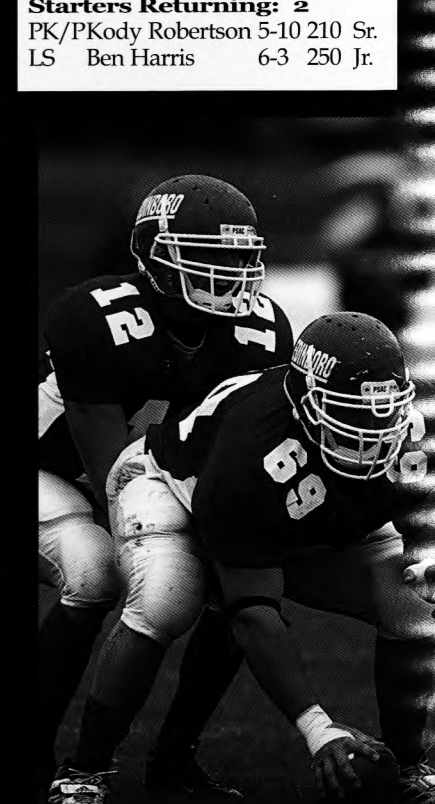

# Edinboro Football 2006 2006 Season Preview

LaMont Singleton at left guard. Both were Cactus Bowl participants a year ago. Their loss has led to a shifting of positions for two other returning starters, leaving the unit in a state of flux.

**Chris Kaczor** assumes the mantle of Edinboro's next great linemen. The 6'2", 300 lb. senior is a three-time All-PSAC West selection, earning first team honors as a junior after being named to the second team in 2004. He was a second team choice at left guard as a redshirt freshman, and returns to that position this year. A third team Football Gazette All-American a year ago, Kaczor was recently accorded first team preseason All-American honors by *Lindy's Magazine*. He has started all 34 games in his career.

"Chris by far is not only our offensive leader, but a team leader," Browning emphasized. "He's tough, and plays the game the way it should be played. He's a special guy."

Like Kaczor, **Andy Young** will move to another spot on the line. The 6'3", 310 lb. junior would likely receive more recognition if not for the presence of players like Bzorek and Kaczor. Young moves outside to right tackle after starting 21 of his first 22 career games at right guard.

The third returning starter on the line is **Josh Bzorek**. The 6'4", 295 lb. sophomore gave Edinboro a pair of bookend Bzorek's at tackle, starting all ten games at left tackle. A former defensive tackle who has gained 30 lbs. since coming to Edinboro, Bzorek continues to improve, and the only remaining question is if he will be better than his brother.

**Mike Mills**, an enigmatic player with excellent potential, assumes the starting role at right tackle, while **Eric Costello's** development

at center has allowed the coaching staff to move Kaczor to left guard. Mills is a 6'5", 300 lb. junior who has sat out the last two seasons, but made four starts in 2003. Athletic for his size, he actually spent most of the spring at tackle before flip-flopping with Young late in spring drills.

Costello is a former walk-on who is the smallest offensive lineman at 6'3", 280 lbs. The sophomore made great strides this spring. He is very intelligent and extremely athletic. Costello saw considerable action as a reserve a year ago, with Kaczor moving to guard at times.

Costello is backed up by senior **Anthony Tedesco** (6'4", 275 lbs.) and promising redshirt freshman **Mike Fazio** (6'4", 290 lbs.). Tedesco has played both center and guard, although he was forced to sit out the spring due to an injury. Fazio enjoyed a solid spring and has a bright future, although the coaching staff is still trying to figure out what his best position may be.

No fewer than three experienced reserves return at the guard spots. Sophomores **Scott Christie** (6'4", 295 lbs.) and **Vince Lutman** (6'2", 300 lbs.) are reserves at left and right guard, respectively. Lutman played tackle a year ago, and comes off a solid spring at guard. **Anthony Byerly**, undersized at 6'1", 265 lbs., is a hard-nosed junior.

Redshirt freshman **Cyrus Kersey** and sophomore **Brian Shreve** are in reserve at left tackle. Kersey is huge at 6'6", 350 lbs., and continues to drop weight. However, he also has immense talent to go with surprising athleticism. Still raw, he could play a major role in the future. Shreve is 6'4", 310 lbs. and has experience at both tackle spots. He, too, is in better shape than a year ago.

**Josh Wachter** came to Edinboro a year ago as a tight end, but was quickly moved to tackle. Now up to 285 lbs. on his 6'6" frame, he is another redshirt freshman with a bright future.

**Browning on the Offensive Line:** "I'd like to think that they feel like they have something to prove. I'm anxious to see how they stack up to the tradition we've had here."

## Defense

It's not hard to see why Browning feels that the defense can carry Edinboro to a fourth straight PSAC West crown. Seven starters, four All-PSAC West performers, return to a unit which led the country in scoring defense (9.3 ppg.), total defense (211.2 ypg.) and rushing defense (53.7 ypg.), not to mention a PSAC-high 39 sacks.

Unlike the offense, which features a big, physical nature, the defense is built on the premise of attacking the ball, with speed and aggressiveness overcoming size. In fact, just one starter weighs more than 250 lbs.

"We have an attacking defense," noted Browning. "We've changed over the years, based on the type of offenses we see and the type of players we have. We've utilized our strengths - the ability to run and hit. We are strong from the inside out, getting big plays

from Chris Amico and A.J. Cousins, along with three very good linebackers."

Browning also has great praise for defensive coordinator Wayne Bradford. In fact, in many respects the defense exemplifies the intensity Bradford brings to the table.

## Defensive Line

It would be hard to find two better interior performers than **Chris Amico** and **A.J. Cousins**. At 6'0", 250 lbs., Amico is hardly your typical defensive tackle, but tell that to interior linemen asked to block him week-in and week-out. Possessing great strength and quickness, Amico was recognized as the PSAC West Defensive Player of the Year and was later named a first team Football Gazette All-American and second team Daktronics All-American. He finished third on the team in tackles with 49, with 14.5 for losses and a team-high 8.5 sacks. Amico is a first team *Lindy's Magazine* preseason All-American.

"Chris is an effort guy," noted Browning. "He prepares 365 days a year to be the best he can be."

Cousins enters his third season as the starting noseguard. The 6'1", 280 lb. senior is a two-time All-PSAC West first team selection and has All-American capabilities. Like Amico, he is strong yet very quick. Cousins totaled 47 tackles, with 10.5 for losses and 6 sacks.

"A.J. is much the same as Chris Amico," equated Browning. "He's another hard worker. I think he's as good as there is at nose-guard."

The questions on the line come on the outside, where starters Seth Fragale and Greg MacAnn, a pair of All-PSAC performers, must be replaced. **Joe Malizia** and **Syl Hanner** are battling for the left side starting job, with promising sophomore **Mike Enoch** taking over on the right side. Malizia, a 6'2", 240 lb. junior, finished with 10 tackles in a reserve role. He is somewhat of an unknown but a player the coaching staff believes in. Hanner has made great strides after bouncing between linebacker and end. The 5'11", 220 lb. junior now appears to have found a home at end.

Enoch (6'3", 250 lbs.) saw limited action a year ago, totaling seven tackles. He comes off a very productive offseason and fits in very well with the aggressive nature of the defense.

**Steve Renfro**, a 6'3", 220 lb. junior, provides further depth on the left side, although the coaching staff is still waiting for his athletic ability to relate to production. **Jerem Appell** (6'1", 230 lbs.) opened more than a few eyes this spring as a backup to Enoch, emerging as one of the biggest surprises.

Depth in the interior is a concern, with **Donnie Marsteller** the lone experienced reserve. A 6'4", 240 lb. sophomore, Marsteller actually spent the first half of spring drills at tight end before moving back to defensive tackle. He's another player who fits the nature of the defense and should see increased time after appearing in five games a year ago.

**Browning on the Defensive Line:** "We feature two impact guys and surround them with some

unproven players, but players who have the ability and play hard. I think they'll step up to the plate."

## Linebackers

Probably the greatest strength of the team lies in the group of linebackers. Again, it is a group somewhat small in stature, but very aggressive, intense, and intelligent. The leader of the group is **Ben Stroup**. While Chris Amico was named the PSAC West Defensive Player of the Year, Bradford feels that honor could just as well have gone to Stroup. A 6'1", 213 lb. senior, he led Edinboro with 76 tackles. Like Amico, he ranked among the national leaders in tackles for losses with a team-leading 15.5, including 5.5 sacks. In his first year as a starter, Stroup was a first team All-PSAC West choice.

"Ben is a special guy," emphasizes Browning. "He is very good." Browning went on to compare Stroup to the best players he's seen in his 21 years at Edinboro.

Stroup is joined by seniors **Jim Soltis** and **Dave Jazenski**. Soltis is 6'2", 205 lbs., and a unique player in his ability to be physical against the run yet very efficient in coverage. He ranked second to Stroup in tackles with 64, with 11.5 for losses. He forced a pair of fumbles and blocked a pair of punts. Soltis is a two-year starter who earned second team All-PSAC West accolades a year ago.

Jazenski is the biggest of the linebackers at 5'11", 225 lbs., and benefited from playing in the spring for the first time in three years. He is affectionately known as a blue-collar player. Jazenski finished fourth in tackles with 48 despite missing one game.

The future bodes well with the likes of **Hardin Moss** and **James English**. Moss is a 6'1", 225 lb. sophomore who saw considerable action in a reserve role a year ago. He finished with 21 tackles. He has good size and strength and doesn't make many mistakes. English has bounced from position to position, starting out as a wide receiver before playing drop linebacker a year ago. The 6'2", 205 lb. junior looked to find a home behind Stroup this spring. He's very athletic. English may redshirt this season to give him two full years of eligibility. He had 17 tackles a year ago.

**Mike Mader** and **Mike Craddock** are smaller linebackers who will probably play more of a role on special teams. Mader, a 5'10", 180 lb. junior, makes the transition from strong safety. Craddock, a 5'11", 205 lb. junior, must recover from a knee injury which forced him to miss the final eight games of the season and the entire spring. **Browning on the Linebackers:** "I think we have one of the best linebacking corps in Division II this year. We're strong."

## Defensive Backs

Continuing with the theme of strong up the middle, Edinboro possesses a pair of strong safeties in **Tom Davidson** and **Damion Malott**. While the duo is almost interchangeable, they will swap positions this year, with Davidson lining up at free safety and Malott at strong safety.

Davidson has started 21 of 22 career games, and is already tied for 12th in career interceptions with 12. He moves back to free safety, where as a redshirt freshman in 2004 he intercepted eight passes while earning second team All-PSAC West hon-

ors. A year ago he had 4 interceptions while taking part in 25 tackles.

"Tom is the quarterback of our defense," related Browning. "He's extremely intelligent and keeps things together back there."

Malott joined the Fighting Scots a year ago as a junior college transfer. The senior did not disappoint, finishing with 38 tackles, a pair of interceptions, and a team-high 8 interceptions. He is also an outstanding special teams player.

Things are not quite as settled at the two cornerback spots, where all-time career interception leader Chris Avery and Jermaine Truax are gone. Senior **Rodney Stevenson** and junior **Taurean Valentine** are expected to step in. Stevenson played in all ten games, with one start, finishing with 16 tackles and an interception. He had a very good spring. The coaching staff feels Valentine could be a special player, with good cover skills and nice size at 5'11", 180 lbs. He played at Allan Hancock (Ca.) Junior College before transferring to Edinboro a year ago and redshirting in 2005.

Depth is a major concern in the secondary. In fact, the only two players back from a year ago are junior **Donnye Aiken** and sophomore **LaVaughn Wesley**. Aiken is a former transfer from Colgate who has been a reserve cornerback the last two years. He is a solid reserve and special teams performer. Wesley is a converted wide receiver who is still learning the secondary. He backs up Malott at strong safety.

**Browning on the Defensive Backs:** "The secondary is thin and unproven."

## Special Teams

**Kody Robertson** once again will handle both the placekicking and punting chores. The senior already ranks among the top kickers all-time at Edinboro, standing third in career field goals made (28) and fourth in career field goals attempted (45). He also needs just 24 extra points attempted and 25 successful PATs to break those school records.

Robertson made 11 of 19 field goals and 34 of 39 extra points as a junior. He also handled the punting duties for the first time, averaging 35.8 yards on 43 punts. However, he dropped 13 punts inside the 20 and had 12 others go for fair catches.

"Kody had a good spring," stated Browning. "This is his last go-around. We expect big things."

**Ben Harris** returns as the long snapper. With a year under his belt, the coaching staff feels the junior will be even better this year.

Several players will be in the running for return duties. **Rodney Stevenson** ranked third in the PSAC in kickoff returns, averaging 23.8 yards on 12 returns. **Damion Malott** averaged 19.6 yards on five returns. **Deonte Peters** handled most of the punt return duties, ranking fifth in the PSAC at 9.8 yards on 13 returns.

As always, Edinboro will look to make noise with its special teams. Over the past few years the Fighting Scots have made a habit blocking kicks. A year ago the Boro blocked six kicks, including five punts, with two turned into touchdowns. The year before Edinboro blocked five kicks.

**Browning on the Special Teams:** "We should be very productive in all areas. We have some experience on the special teams. You need athletes and attitude on special teams - kids who believe in the importance of special teams."

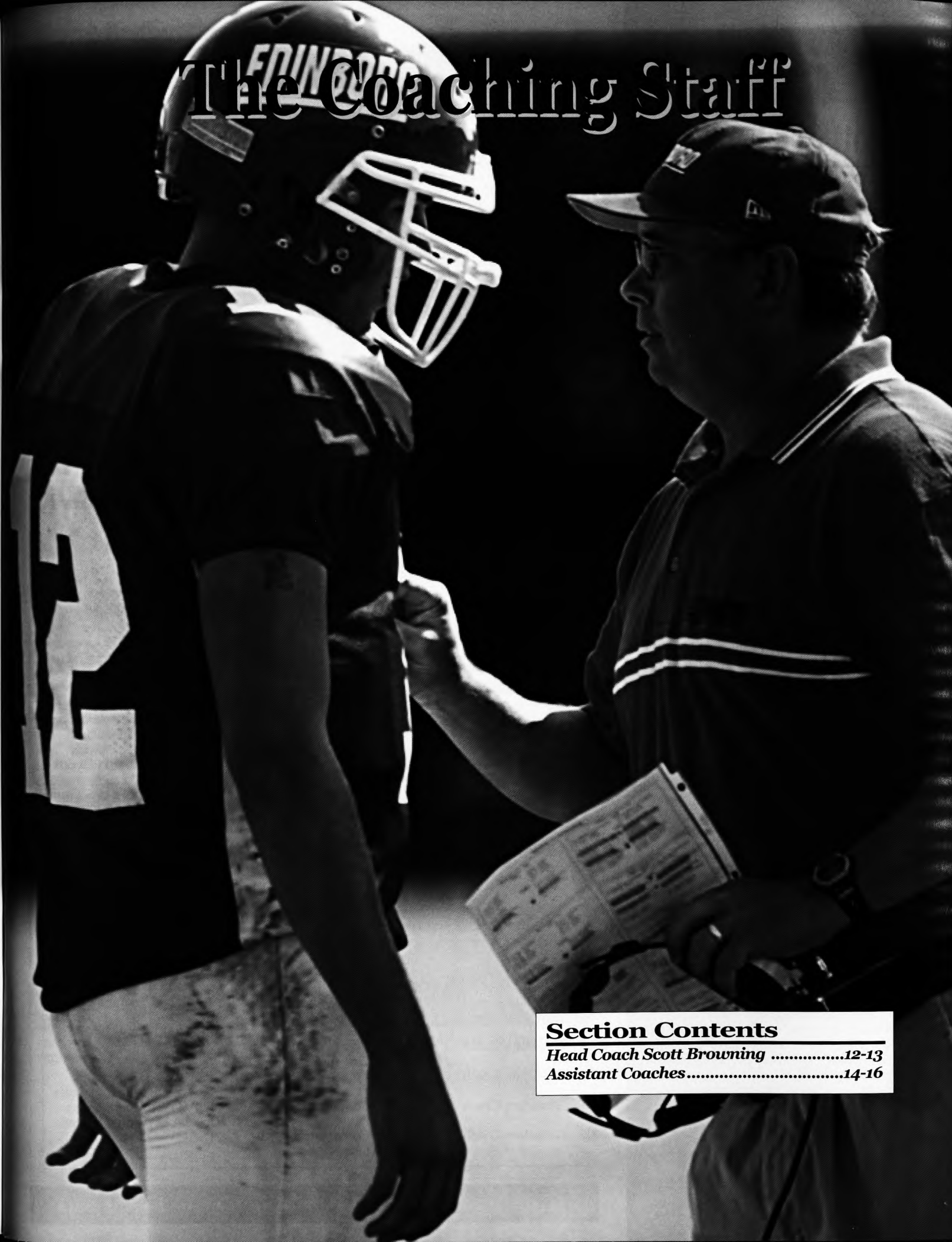

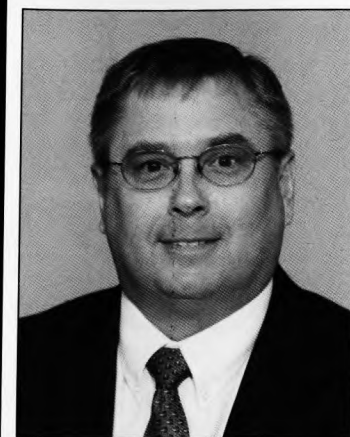

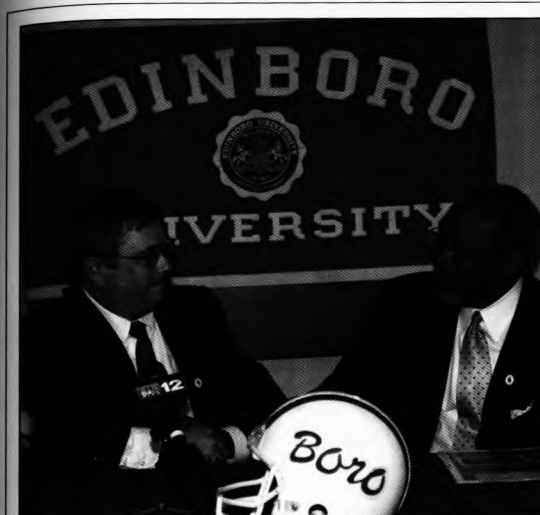

over a group of players that represent the ideals I believe in.

Without question we want to be successful on the field, and that means challenging for a fourth straight PSAC West title this year. But we won't compromise integrity. We will continue to bring in young men who have the ability to be successful both in the classroom and on the football field. It is my sincere belief that when they take the field, they must wear the Edinboro jersey with pride, and when they are in the community, that they have earned the respect that comes with being a Fighting Scot."

Browning has served as an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff, he coached receivers and running backs at

Ohio State for two years while serving as a graduate assistant. That group included Keith Byars. The Buckeyes went to the Rose Bowl in 1984, dropping a 20-17 decision to USC to finish with a 9-3 record. The following year Ohio State went bowling again, this time defeating Brigham Young, 10-7, in the Citrus Bowl, to once again finish at 9-3.

Browning served as a graduate assistant coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. Idaho State reached the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs before suffering a 27-20 defeat to Nevada.

A 1981 graduate of Ohio State University with a bachelor's degree in Education, Browning began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Worthington High School and Dayton-Fairview High Schools in Ohio from 1979-81. Before transferring to Ohio State he attended Capital University where he played football for one season. Browning later earned a master's degree in Education and Administration from New Mexico State in 1983.

Browning, 47 and a native of Loudonville, Ohio, and his wife, Lynn, reside in Edinboro and have two children, Andrew (12) and Katelyn (8). He is also camp director of the Tri-State Linemen's Camp, a highly-successful instructional camp for linemen. 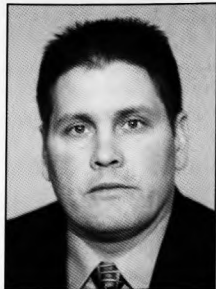

Wayne Bradford is in his eighth year as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff. He enters his second season as the Fighting Scot defensive coordinator, and had previously held the same title in 1999 under former head coach Tom Hollman. After overseeing the defensive line for seven seasons, Bradford will take over as the linebackers coach in 2006.

Bradford orchestrated the top defense in the country a year ago, as Edinboro paced Division II in scoring defense (9.3 ppg.), total defense (211.2 ypg.), and rushing defense (53.7 ypg.). In addition, Edinboro was third in pass efficiency defense and turnover margin. The Fighting Scots recorded three shutouts, the most since the 1975 team also shut out three opponents. A total of seven opponents were held to seven points or less. He coached four all-conference performers a year ago.

Under Bradford's tutelage, Edinboro has had ten first team All-PSAC West defensive linemen. That includes the last two PSAC West Defensive Players of the Year, with Chris Amico earning the honor last year and Seth Fragale, who won the honor in 2004. Fragale was a three-time All-PSAC West selection.

In addition, he has coached Dave Smith, a four-time All-PSAC selection who ranks first in career tackles for losses and tied for second in sacks, and Eugene Grooms, who was a three-time All-PSAC selection.

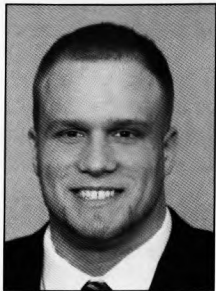
Edinboro's athletic program, unselfishly devoting 34 years of service to the University as an athletic director, coach and physical education instructor. Appropriately, he was the first member inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.

Harrison coached the Fighting Scot football team from its inception in 1926 to 1938, the returned to guide the gridders in 1941 and '42. In addition, he coached the men's basketball team for 23 seasons, from 1928-53, winning 175 games.

Sox Harrison Stadium seats 6,000 people in its two grandstands, along with plenty of standing room. In addition to press boxes on both sides of the stadium, the facility has locker rooms, a training room and complete amenities for fans.

The stadium has undergone several renovations, including a new sound system and improved handicapped access areas in 1999. In 1997, a new grandstand was constructed on the visitor's side of the field, adding 2,500 permanent seats, along with a press box, locker rooms and a training room.

In addition to the football field, the facility contains complete track facilities.

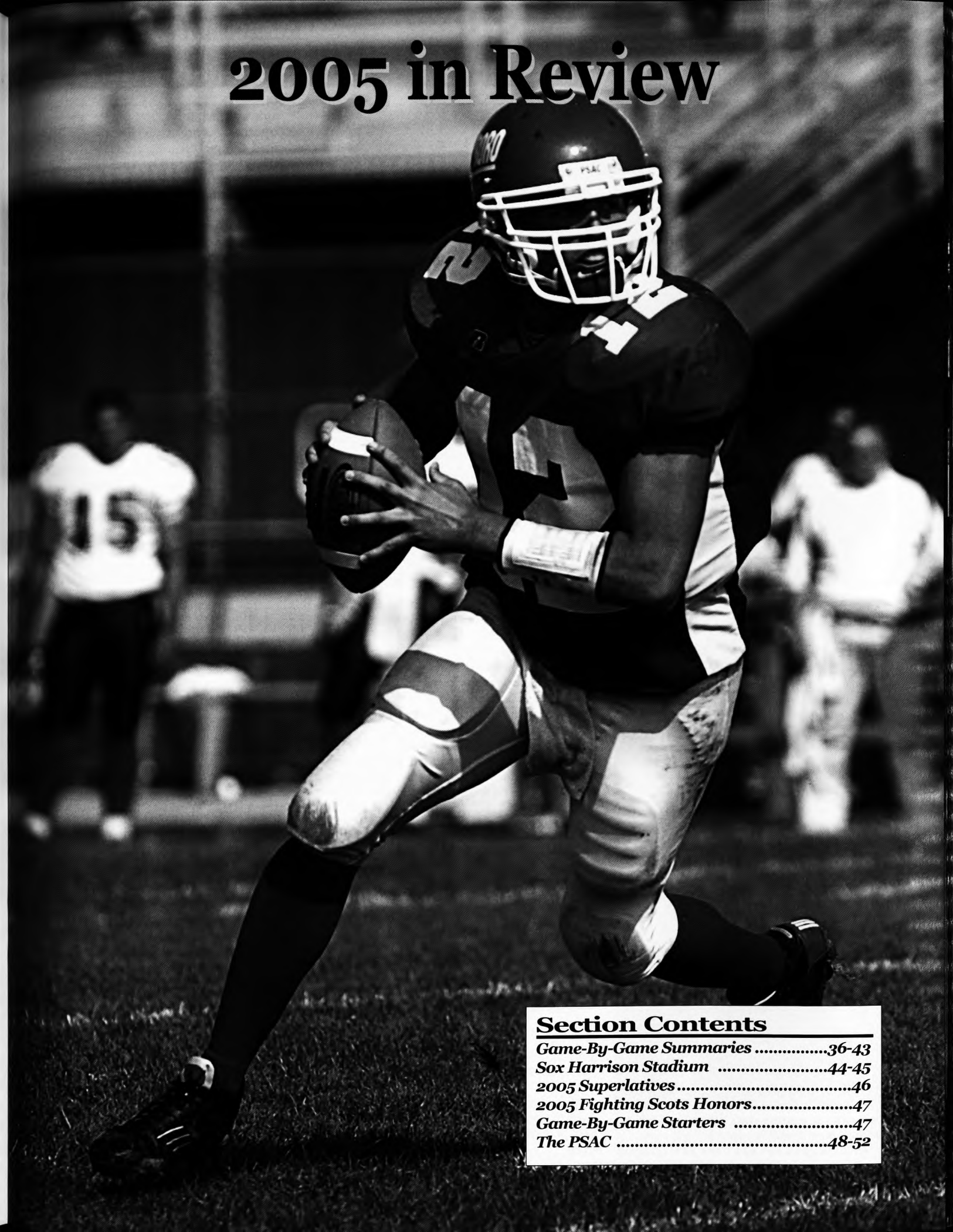

# Edinboro Football 2006 2005 Season Review



## Game 1

### Edinboro 47, WVU Tech 0

August 27, 2005  
Sox Harrison Stadium

**Edinboro, PA** -- It was a day for firsts as the Fighting Scots kicked off the 2005 campaign with a convincing win over WVU Tech. The win was the first season-opening victory for the Fighting Scots since 2002, and the shutout was the first since a 44-0 triumph at Cheyney in 1997. Edinboro came into the contest tied for 14th in the AFCA preseason poll, and sixth according to Sports Illustrated.

Turnovers proved the major difference. WVU Tech committed six turnovers, five on interceptions, while Edinboro was not guilty of a turnover. Six of Edinboro's eight scores came after Golden Bear miscues.

Edinboro unveiled Ulysee Davis as the new starting tailback, and the redshirt freshman debuted with 132 yards on 19 carries with 3 TDs. Spud, as he is commonly known, scored a pair of touchdowns in a two-minute span of the first quarter as Edinboro jumped out to a quick 14-0 lead.

WVU Tech took the opening kickoff and drove to the Edinboro 41 before Chris Amico recovered a fumble at the EU 45. The Golden Bears would venture into Edinboro territory just one more time.

In a five-play, 55-yard drive that featured

Davis carrying on every down, he scored his first career touchdown on a one-yard plunge. Thanks to penalties, he actually ran for 65 yards in the drive.

The Scots were back in business moments later when Chris Avery came up with the first of his three interceptions on the day off Joey Jude. After an incomplete pass, Davis carried three straight times, capping the short 23-yard drive with a 12-yard scoring run.

Kody Robertson concluded the first quarter with a 26-yard field goal at the 1:45 mark to make it 17-0. The score came following another Avery pickoff, giving the Boro the ball at the WVU Tech 36.

Edinboro scored twice in the final 2:20 of the second quarter to boost the halftime lead to 31-0, with both scores set up by interceptions. Junior free safety Damion Malott, playing in his first game as a Fighting Scot, accounted for the first, with Edinboro taking over at the WVU Tech 46.

With Justin Bouch connecting on a pair of third down plays, the Scots drove 46 yards on seven plays. Davis capped the drive with a 23-yard scoring run.

Two plays later, Avery came up with his third interception, returning it 43 yards to the WVU Tech 12. With 46 seconds remaining in the half, Bouch found Jeff Dinger in the right corner of the end zone for a seven-yard TD pass.

Edinboro tacked on a pair of scores in the third quarter. Robertson booted his second field goal of the game, a 27-yarder, for the first score.

Jude's fifth interception of the afternoon set up the second score. Jermaine Trax returned the pickoff nine yards to the WVU Tech 38. Third-string TB Kelvin Collins did the dirty work, carrying four times for 29 yards. Backup quarterback Josh Hinkle followed with a nine-yard scoring toss to C.J. Trivisonno, his first career TD pass.

Edinboro tacked on a final score midway through the fourth quarter on a one-yard run by DeMarkus Robinson. Avery, Edinboro's backup kicker, added the extra point.

The Fighting Scots finished the afternoon with 464 yards compared to just 94 yards for the Golden Bears. Edinboro held a huge 38:14 to 21:46 advantage in time of possession. After limiting WVU Tech to minus seven yards rushing a year ago, the Golden Bears managed just 15 yards on 19 rushes.

# Edinboro Football 2006 2005 Season Review

## Game 2

### East Stroudsburg 23, Edinboro 21

September 3, 2005  
Eiler-Martin Stadium

**East Stroudsburg, PA** -- Heartbreaking. Devastating. Crushing. The list of adjectives could go on and on, but the bottom line is East Stroudsburg once again dealt Edinboro a last-second defeat. While the memory would linger, the Fighting Scots' 23-21 loss to the Warriors would weigh heavy on their minds, but would not end their season. That was the case a year ago when Edinboro traveled to East Stroudsburg in November for a Northeast Regional semifinal game and come away a 36-32 loser.

Not that the way the losses came about weren't eerily similar. A year ago the Warriors scored a touchdown on a 4th-and-22 play with 22 seconds remaining to end Edinboro's season. This time around, ESU's Mark Brubaker drilled a 42-yard field goal with five seconds remaining to spoil a brilliant Fighting Scot comeback.

The contest was a matchup of two highly-ranked squads, as the Boro came in ranked 12th by the AFCA. East Stroudsburg, meanwhile, was ranked eighth.

For once, this was a game that lived up to its pre-game hype. It certainly didn't look that way when Jimmy Terwilliger, who would go on to win the Harlon Hill Trophy, stepped back and hit Ben Culver for an 85-yard touchdown pass on the very first play from scrimmage. Twenty seconds into the game, and Edinboro trailed 7-0.

After bedeviling the Fighting Scots in three previous contests, Terwilliger was off to a fast start. But on this day the Fighting Scot defense would constantly harass the record-setting junior, limiting him to 14 completions in 32 attempts. He did throw for 317 yards despite being sacked three times.

Edinboro knotted the score on a seven-yard pass from Justin Bouch to Ryan Valasek later in the quarter. The senior quarterback went 4-for-5 in the scoring drive, including a 29-yard hookup with Kyle Witucki.

East Stroudsburg reclaimed the lead on its next possession as Brubaker kicked the first of his three field goals, this one from 38 yards out as time expired in the first quarter. The Warriors overcame a 3rd-and-30 situation, as Evan Prall outjumped two Edinboro defenders to pull in a 36-yard pass at the EU 17.

Bouch threw an interception on Edinboro's very next play from scrimmage, leading to a 36-yard field goal by Brubaker. Edinboro sacked Terwilliger twice to stall the drive.

Trailing 13-7 entering the third quarter, the Fighting Scots opened the second half with a

three-and-out series. Terwilliger followed with a 10-yard scoring pass to Prall, boosting the lead to 20-7.

Showing plenty of resiliency, the Edinboro defense continued to pound Terwilliger, and the ground game came alive as the Scots began their comeback bid. Bottled up all day, Ulysee Davis came alive with runs of four and 21 yards. The redshirt freshman had gained just 25 yards on his previous 11 carries, but would finish with 87 yards on 21 totes.

With a 1st-and-10 at the ESU 48, Bouch hit Jordan Bobitski on a crossing pattern at the 35, with the senior breaking a tackle and going down the sideline for a 48-yard touchdown reception. Kody Robertson's extra point closed the margin to 20-14 midway through the third quarter.

Taking over with 8:22 to play at its own 22 yard line, Edinboro put together its best drive of the afternoon, as Davis and Kelvin Collins pounded away at the ESU defense. Davis carried six times for 34 yards, while Collins, a bruising 230-pound transfer from Bowie State, added three rushes for 20 yards.

With just over two minutes to play and the ball sitting at the ESU 15, Bouch parlayed a beautiful play fake into a 15-yard scoring pass to Jeff Dinger in the left corner of the end zone. It was the senior quarterback's third touchdown of the day, capping a 20-for-34 effort for 207 yards. Robertson's extra point gave the Fighting Scots their first lead at 21-20 with just 2:08 to play, capping a 12-play, 78-yard drive.

Unfortunately, that proved to be too much time for Terwilliger. East Stroudsburg's winning drive began at its own 27. Terwilliger completed three passes in the eight-play, 48-yard march, the last a 14-yarder to LeRyan Dallas down to the EU 25 with ten seconds showing on the clock.

A year ago ESU head coach Denny Douds eschewed Brubaker and a potential tying field goal at the end of the game. This time he called on the senior kicker, with Brubaker's booming kick easily good from 42 yards out with just five seconds left.

Ben Stroup paced an impressive effort by the defense, registering a career-high 12 tackles.

### Game 3

### Edinboro 42, Tiffin 7

September 17, 2005  
Sox Harrison Stadium

Edinboro, PA -- Ulysee Davis ran for three touchdowns to lead the 20th-ranked Fighting Scots to a convincing 42-7 win over visiting Tiffin.

Edinboro used a methodical offensive attack to subdue the Dragons, finishing the afternoon with 282 yards rushing and 140 yards passing for 422 yards. The Fighting Scots held the ball for 38:33. Tiffin, meanwhile, was limited to 187 total yards, as Edinboro came within 11 seconds of posting its second shutout in three games. The Dragons gained just 85 yards on the ground.

Davis scored on Edinboro's first two possessions. The redshirt freshman capped an 11-play, 65-yard march after Tiffin began the game with a three-and-out with a two-yard scoring run. All but two of the plays were runs, with Davis carrying eight times. He would finish the day with 112 yards on 23 carries.

Tiffin moved as far as the Edinboro 30 on its next possession before the Fighting Scot defense forced a punt. Damion Malott returned the punt 27 yards to the Edinboro 35,

and the Fighting Scots followed with a seven-play, 65-yard march.

Davis carried four times for 33 yards, with the final nine coming in an interesting fashion. He took the handoff, fumbled it, then had it bounce back into his hands as he proceeded to score on a nine-yard run.

Edinboro scored the lone points of the second quarter on a five-play, 54-yard drive. Backup quarterback Josh Hinkle connected with Nate Eimer for a 25-yard TD pass to make it 21-0 at the half. In the opening 30 minutes, Edinboro piled up 225 total yards while holding Tiffin to 69 yards.

Edinboro's dominance continued in the second half, as the Scots took the opening kickoff and chewed up 6 minutes and 56 seconds, driving 62 yards on 12 plays. Davis made it three touchdowns on the ground with a seven-yard run, marking the second time he had scored three TD's in a game.

Justin Bouch completed his afternoon late in the third quarter after hooking up with Kyle Witucki for a 10-yard scoring pass. The senior quarterback completed 14 of 18 passes for 103 yards, and moved into second place in career total offense with 6,112 yards.

Hinkle accounted for the Boro's final touchdown, scoring on a 25-yard run with 2:05 left in the game.

### Game 4

### Edinboro 16, Shippensburg 0

September 24, 2005

Edinboro, PA -- Thanks to a ten-point spurt in 66 seconds in the second quarter, along with a strong defensive showing, Edinboro posted a 16-0 shutout to improve to 3-1. The Fighting Scots entered the game ranked 20th by the AFCA.

The victory snapped a string of four straight losses to the Red Raiders, as Shippensburg had won seven of the last eight meetings.

The defenses dominated play most of the afternoon, with Edinboro finishing the afternoon with 250 total yards and Shippensburg 188. The Red Raiders gained 67 of those yards on their final drive in the last two minutes against reserves. A team that had given Edinboro fits on the ground in previous years, Shippensburg was held to 68 yards rushing.

In addition to the yardage totals, Edinboro came up with a pair of fumbles and an interception, and the Fighting Scot special teams blocked a field goal and a punt.

Shippensburg had the only scoring opportunity in the first quarter, but Jamie Redo's 23-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Greg MacAnn. The game remained scoreless until Edinboro put together a 12-play, 64-yard march in the second quarter that ended with Kody Robertson kicking a 34-yard field goal.

Following the ensuing kickoff, Dave Jazenski forced a fumble, with Tom Davidson recovering at the Ship two. Ulysee Davis scored on a one-yard run to give the Boro a 10-0 lead. In 66 seconds, Edinboro had put ten points on the scoreboard, with Davis scoring his seventh touchdown of the season.

Davidson gave the ball back to the Scots on the possession with an interception, returning it 43 yards to the Ship 24. The drive stalled at the two yardline, but Robertson came in and booted a 19-yard field goal with two seconds remaining in the half for a 13-0 lead.

Edinboro scored the lone points of the second half on Robertson's third field goal of the game with 8:49 remaining. The 29-yard field goal marked the third time the junior had kicked three field goals in a game, and moved him into fourth place in career field goals made with 22.

A number of defensive players stood out in Edinboro's second shutout of the season,

### Game 5

### Edinboro 44, Clarion 0

October 1, 2005  
Sox Harrison Stadium

Edinboro, PA -- The Edinboro defense celebrated Homecoming in impressive fashion, posting its second straight shutout and third of the season as the 17th-ranked Fighting Scots defeated Clarion, 44-0. At 2-0 in PSAC West action, it marked the first time Edinboro has won its first two games in league play since 1996. The three shutouts are the most since the 1975 team shut out three opponents.

Edinboro entered the contest leading Division II in rushing defense while ranked third in scoring defense and fourth in total defense and turnover margin.

The Fighting Scots did nothing to diminish those figures, limiting Clarion to 38 total yards, the sixth-lowest figure all-time against

Edinboro, and minus eight yards rushing, the eighth-lowest total. So dominant was the performance that the Golden Eagles did not record their initial first down until the 4:07 mark of the third quarter. They would finish with just three first downs.

The Edinboro offense, meanwhile, churned out a season-high 561 total yards, including 283 yards on the ground. A total of six different players scored touchdowns, with four of Edinboro's scoring drives covering 80-or-more yards.

Despite the lopsided final score, Edinboro did not reach the end zone for the first time until the final play of the first quarter, as Justin Bouch completed a 14-yard TD pass to Kyle Witucki. The play came on a 4th-and-4 and capped a 13-play, 80-yard drive.

A Clarion turnover led to the next score, as Seth Fragle forced a fumble and recovered it at the Clarion 11. Four plays later, Kelvin Collins scored his first touchdown as a Fighting Scot on a one-yard plunge.

Edinboro tacked on a pair of scores in the final two-and-a-half minutes of the half to boost the lead to 23-0 at intermission. Backup quarterback Josh Hinkle directed the first score. The sophomore was a perfect five-for-five for 67 yards, the final completion covering seven yards to Jeff Dinger for six points with 2:11 remaining.

Bouch re-entered and led the Scots on another scoring drive, with Kody Robertson making good on a 20-yard field goal with 23 seconds left.

Edinboro added a pair of 80-yard drives in the third quarter and went 85 yards in the fourth quarter. Bouch capped the first march with a 12-yard TD toss to Jordan Bobitski, then added a 43-yard scoring pass to Ryan Valasek with 4:22 left in the third quarter. The senior only completed 8 of 22 passes, but for 188 yards and 3 TDs.

Hinkle directed the final scoring drive, capping off a perfect seven-for-seven day with a 5-yard TD pass to Joe Gable. It marked the first career TD reception for the reserve tight end.

Ulysee Davis paced the ground attack with his third 100-yard effort of the year, gaining a season-high 147 yards on 22 carries despite sitting out much of the second half. Collins added 67 yards on 10 carries.

The defense, meanwhile, registered a season-high 6 sacks.

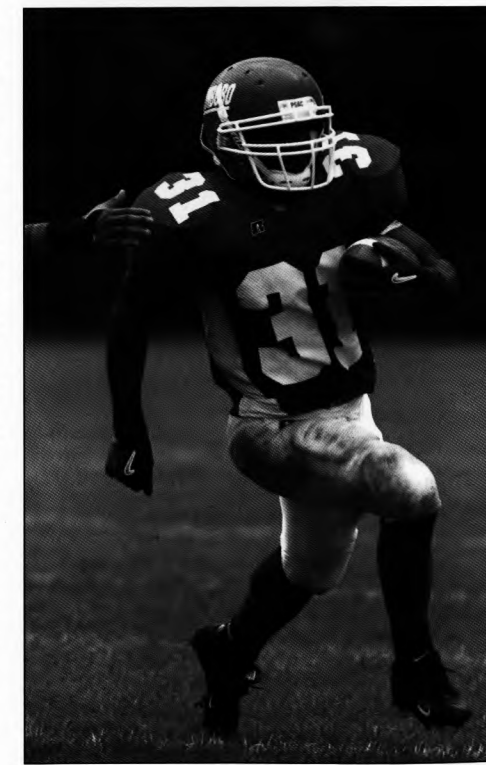

### Game 6

#### California(Pa.) 36, Edinboro 26

October 8, 2005  
Adamson Stadium

**California, PA** – The weather was ugly at California(Pa.), and as far as Edinboro head coach Lou Tepper was concerned, so was his team's performance. The result was a 36-26 loss to the Vulcans. Edinboro entered the game ranked 17th by the AFCA.

The Fighting Scots were attempting to improve to 3-0 in PSAC West action for the first time since 1995. But a defense that entered the game ranked first in total defense and rushing defense and third in scoring defense was not up to the task against a Cal offense that came in averaging 41.8 ppg., seventh in the country. In fact, Edinboro had given up just 30 points in its first five games.

Edinboro committed three turnovers in all, and was penalized seven times for 63 yards. California(Pa.) gained 404 total yards, and while the Fighting Scots finished with a respectable 369 total yards, they were held to 127 yards on the ground.

Despite all of this and a steady rain, Edinboro was driving for a potential winning

score before a pair of interceptions in the final two minutes put a severe damper on its play-off hopes. Trailing 29-26 after Cal took the lead midway through the fourth quarter, the Fighting Scots put together an impressive drive that started from the 31.

With backup tailback Kelvin Collins doing most of the damage, Edinboro moved to the Cal 17. But on a 2nd-and-9 play the Scots were called for illegal procedure. Facing 3rd-and-14, a short pass from Justin Bouch bounced off a receiver's hands and was intercepted by Antwjuan Cox. Cox not only returned the interception 58 yards, but a personal foul against Edinboro gave the Vulcans the ball at the Boro 17.

Antoine Bagwell scored three plays later on an 18-yard run to give the Vulcans a 36-26 lead with 1:48 to play.

Bouch would direct the Scots on another drive to the Cal 21 with just under a minute to play, but once again Cox intercepted a pass that bounced off a receiver's hands to spoil the final comeback bid.

The day ended on a cruel note for Bouch, who deserved a better fate after opening the day with 11 straight completions. The senior ended the day completing 23 of 36 passes for a season-high 242 yards with a TD, but three interceptions.

The game started on an ominous note for the Scots, as Cal took the opening kickoff and drove to the Edinboro 6 as Joe Ruggiero completed five of six passes for 62 yards. But on a 3rd-and goal play, Chris Avery stepped in front of a Ruggiero pass at the one and returned it 99 yards for a touchdown. It was the second-longest return in school history.

Kody Robertson's extra point was no good, the start of a long day for the junior placekicker. He would miss another PAT and a 38-yard field goal.

Cal came back on its next possession to take a 7-6 lead, the start of seven lead changes. Edinboro regained the lead with 9:08 in the second quarter as Bouch directed a 65-yard drive. He completed four passes for 41 yards, the final completion covering four yards to C.J. Trivisonno for six points. Trivisonno enjoyed a career-best day with 6 catches for 68 yards. The extra point again failed.

The Vulcans answered with a 5-yard scoring pass from Ruggiero to D'Monn Baker for a 14-12 lead at the half.

With leading rusher Ulysee Davis enjoying limited success in the wet conditions, Edinboro turned to Collins in the second half. The 230 lb. senior paid immediate dividends as he bulled in from six yards out for the first of his two touchdowns in the second half. Collins would finish with 90 yards on 17 carries, all in the second half. This time the extra point was good, giving the Scots a 19-14 lead.

For the fourth straight time, the Vulcans answered an Edinboro score with a score of its own. This drive covered 63 yards in 10 plays, with Ruggiero throwing his second touch-

down pass, a 12-yarder to Bagwell. Ruggiero then hooked up with Tony Hoskin for a two-point conversion and a 22-19 lead.

Trailing 22-19 entering the fourth quarter, the Scots took their final lead early in the fourth quarter as the offense put together an 11-play, 80-yard march. Collins capped the march with a seven-yard TD run.

Cal made it five-for-five following Edinboro scores, with Ruggiero throwing his third TD pass. This one covered 23 yards to Nate Forse, who ended the day with 10 catches for 121 yards. Ruggiero was six for seven for 70 yards in the 77-yard drive, and he would finish with a 24-for-35 effort for 294 yards.

## Edinboro Football 2006 2005 Season Review

### Game 7

#### Edinboro 20, Indiana(Pa.) 10

October 15, 2005  
George P. Miller Stadium

**Indiana, PA** – Thanks to a strong defensive effort and several key special teams plays, Edinboro posted a 20-10 win at Indiana(Pa.). The Fighting Scots not only kept alive their hopes for a third straight PSAC West crown, but also came away with a win in a difficult venue.

Edinboro defeated IUP for the third straight year, something that hadn't happened to the Indians since Slippery Rock won three straight from 1997-99. That was also the last time the Indians lost to the same opponent two straight times at home. In addition, it marked the first time since 1978-80 that Edinboro had won three straight against IUP, and just the third time since 1926.

The game did not start off as if Edinboro would be celebrating a second straight win at George P. Miller Stadium. With a strong wind blowing from one end of the field to the other, Edinboro had the wind in the first quarter but could manage just one first down.

Following a short 17-yard punt into the wind early in the second period, IUP took at the Edinboro 44. The Indians drove to the 12 before settling for Brad Whitacre's 31-yard field goal at the 10:56 mark.

Edinboro finally got on the board following the first of its four interceptions on the afternoon. Damion Malott came up with his second interception of the season at the Edinboro 35. Justin Bouch proceeded to lead the Scots 65 yards in just four plays. The senior quarterback completed just 9 of 20 passes for 90 yards, but he was three-for-four for 65 yards on the drive, capping it with a 36-yard TD toss to Ryan Valasek with 4:37 left in the half.

Ahead 7-3 at the half, Edinboro took the second half kickoff and left little doubt what its gameplan was for the final thirty minutes. The Fighting Scots put together another 65-yard drive, this one in 10 plays, all runs, with Kelvin Collins the workhorse. The 230 lb. senior came off the bench to carry nine times for 41 yards in the drive, including the final seven yards on a 3rd-and-goal play.

Special teams got into the scoring act on the next series. A sack and a penalty left IUP punting from its own 18. Chris Avery blocked the punt and recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown. While Kody Robertson's extra point hit the left upright, the Boro was up 20-3 with 6:48 left in the third period.

Avery came up with another big play later in the quarter. The senior cornerback intercepted a pass at the Edinboro 5 yardline to halt an IUP drive. It was his 19th career intercept-

tion, tying the school career record, and his 32-yard return gave him 179 yards on returns, a new school standard.

IUP would close to 20-10 on a 56-yard TD pass from Andrew Krewatch to Anthony Cellitti with 6:51 left in the game, but a conservative Edinboro offense which threw just two passes in the second half came up with a first down to use up valuable time. The defense then clinched it when Rodney Stevenson came up with his first interception as a Scot with under two minutes to play.

The Indians held a slim 294 to 264 yards advantage in total offense, but IUP was held to 52 yards rushing by an Edinboro defense which entered the game ranked in Division II in rushing defense. Edinboro gained 174 yards on the ground, accounting for a time of possession advantage of 36:15 to 23:45. That included 21:34 in the second half.

Ben Stroup paced the defensive effort with 11 tackles, including three for losses and a sack. Jim Soltis added a career-high 10 tackles, with 3.5 for losses, and Chris Amico had a pair of sacks.

#### Edinboro 24, Slippery Rock 7

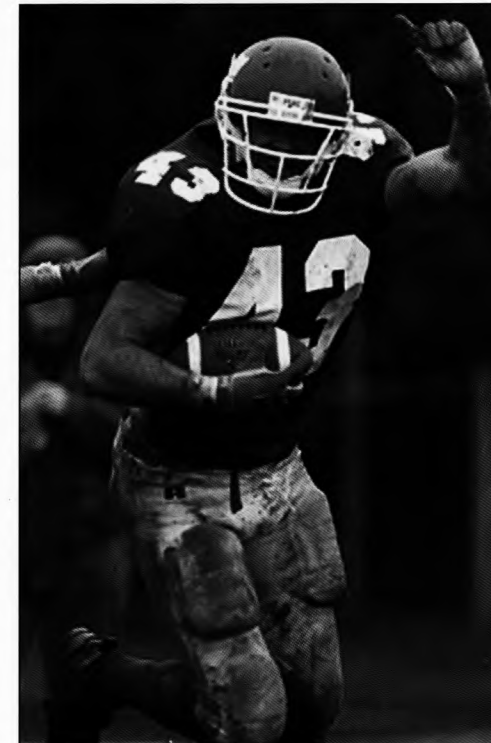

Rock with a 2nd-and-30 at its own 10 yardline.

After a 13-yard run by Josh Kniess, who gained 120 yards on 25 carries, A.J. Cousins sacked Crookshank for a five yard loss. Cousins then blocked Joe Ennis' punt and recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown. Kody Robertson's extra point made it 24-7 with 3:05 left in the contest. It marked the second straight week that Edinboro blocked a punt and recovered it for a touchdown.

Edinboro scored on its very first possession after Tom Davidson intercepted a pass and returned it six yards to the SRU 20. Robertson kicked a 32-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead less than three minutes into the game.

The Fighting Scot offense put together one of its few sustained drives of the afternoon early in the second quarter, marching 93 yards in 11 plays. Kelvin Collins accounted for a large chunk of the yardage, carrying six times for 62 yards. Facing a 3rd-and-goal at the SRU 6, Justin Bouch hit Ryan Valasek in the back left corner of the end zone for a six-yard touchdown pass and a 10-0 lead.

Slippery Rock answered with an impressive drive of its own, going 72 yards in 11 plays. Crookshank scored on a seven-yard run at the 3:06 mark. The sophomore signal-caller threw for 33 yards and ran for another 24 in the drive.

While the Fighting Scots managed just 274 total yards, the defense limited SRU to 240 yards. That included a mere 79 yards on the ground. The Rock came in ranked 24th in rushing offense in Division II (212.0 ypg.).

Collins paced the offense with 133 yards on 25 carries. The senior was making his first start at tailback. Edinboro did lose a pair of fumbles, its first all year.

## Game 9 Edinboro 33, Kutztown 7

**Edinboro, PA** -- Justin Bouch threw a pair of touchdown passes to Kyle Witucki and Edinboro blocked a punt and recovered it for a touchdown for the third straight week, propelling the Fighting Scots to a 33-7 win over visiting Kutztown. It marked the third straight win for the 7-2 Fighting Scots.

Bouch threw both of his touchdown passes in the second quarter as Edinboro snapped a scoreless tie after one period with 20 second-quarter markers.

The first score was set up by a 29-yard punt return by Deonte Peters, giving Edinboro the ball at the EU 43. Behind the running of Kelvin Collins, the Fighting Scots drove 57 yards in 11 plays. Bouch hooked up with Witucki for a one-yard scoring aerial at the 11:47 mark. Collins carried seven times for 37 yards.

The special teams accounted for the next score, as Edinboro forced a three-and-out on the ensuing series. Ryan Nye's punt was blocked by Tom Davidson, with Damion Malott recovering in the end zone for a touchdown. Kody Robertson's extra point was no good, but Edinboro led 13-0.

Bouch and Witucki combined for their second touchdown with 2:35 to play in the quarter, capping a seven-play, 77-yard drive. Ulysee Davis had apparently scored on the previous play on a 26-yard run, but a holding penalty at the two yardline negated the score and pushed the ball back to the 12. Bouch then hit Witucki on the next play, giving him 52 career touchdown passes, second in school history.

Kutztown put together a quick drive late in the first half to close the gap to 20-7 at intermission. Facing a 3rd-and-13 at their own 17, the Golden Bears got a 19-yard run from Maurice Adams for a first down. Following a pair of 27-yard connections from Shane Martin to Brent Howard, Kutztown eventually scored on a 4th-and-goal play, with Martin hooking up with Brett Harbach for a six-yard touchdown pass.

Edinboro had an opportunity to break the contest open in the third quarter, blocking a Golden Bear punt on the first series, then recovering a fumble on the next. Despite taking over at the Kutztown 20 and 23, respectively, the Fighting Scots were forced to settle for a pair of Kody Robertson field goals and a 26-7 lead after three quarters.

Edinboro's last score came on a 14-yard run by Davis with 8:50 to play.

The Fighting Scot defense turned in another impressive showing, limiting Kutztown to 198 total yards, with 71 of those yards coming in the final drive against mainly reserves. For the second week in a row Edinboro recorded 9 sacks. Chris Amico led the way with 2.5 sacks, with A.J. Cousins adding 1.5.

## Game 10 Edinboro 41, Lock Haven 3

**Lock Haven, PA** -- After a slow start, Edinboro came on strong with 27 second-half points to dispose of Lock Haven, 41-3. The victory left the Fighting Scots with an 8-2 record.

With a 5-1 ledger in PSAC West action, the Fighting Scots joined a select group of teams in the PSAC to win three straight divisional crowns. The last team to win three consecutive PSAC West titles was Slippery Rock from 1997-99. Edinboro finished in a first place tie with California (Pa.).

Unfortunately, a day later Edinboro would be denied its third straight trip to the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

The Fighting Scots opened the scoring late in the first quarter as Kelvin Collins capped an 11-play, 67-yard drive with a one-yard run at the 2:35 mark.

Edinboro squandered another opportunity following a bad punt snap on Lock Haven's ensuing series. Kody Robertson's 31-yard field goal attempt was wide left.

But the Fighting Scots were back in business two plays later, as Chris Avery returned an interception 17 yards to the LHU 3. It was Avery's 20th career interception, breaking the school record of 19 previously held by Steve

Russell. Collins plowed in from yards out two plays later, and Robertson's extra point made it 14-0 early in the second quarter.

Edinboro had two more opportunities to score in the quarter, but an interception ended one drive, and the other ended with another missed 31-yard field goal.

The offense came alive in the second half, scoring on five of its six possessions. Following a Lock Haven punt to open the third quarter, Edinboro struck quickly as Justin Bouch hooked up with Ryan Valasek on a 56-yard scoring play. The two former high school teammates enjoyed their finest day at Edinboro, as Valasek set career highs with 7 catches for 150 yards.

Bouch threw his second touchdown pass of the afternoon on the next series, directing an impressive eight-play, 94-yard drive. Ulysee Davis broke off a pair of 19-yard runs, and Bouch and Valasek combined on a 43-yard pass down to the LHU 2. Bouch ended up finding C.J. Trivisonno for a four-yard TD pass and a 28-0 lead with 6:42 left in the period.

Bouch concluded an impressive afternoon, and a record-setting career, with his third touchdown of the day on the first play of the fourth quarter. It was another quick series, the Scots traveling 56 yards in just three plays. The third play was a 48-yard scoring strike to Nate Eimer. The backup tight end hauled in a short pass, then received several downfield blocks to go the distance.

Lock Haven spoiled Edinboro's bid for a fourth shutout in 2005 as the Bald Eagles put together a 10-play, 47-yard march that resulted in Brandon Pickell's 33-yard field goal.

The Fighting Scot reserves answered with a pair of short drives resulting in Robertson field goals of 24 and 42 yards.

Bouch ended the afternoon completing 16 of 21 passes for a season-high 243 yards. He became just the second Edinboro quarterback to throw for 7,000 career yards, finishing with 7,013 yards.

Edinboro finished with a season-high 486 yards, with 198 on the ground and 288 through the air. Collins went over the century mark for the second time in three games with 118 yards on 21 carries.

The defense capped a season in which it would lead Division II in scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense by limiting Lock Haven to 108 total yards and 37 yards rushing.

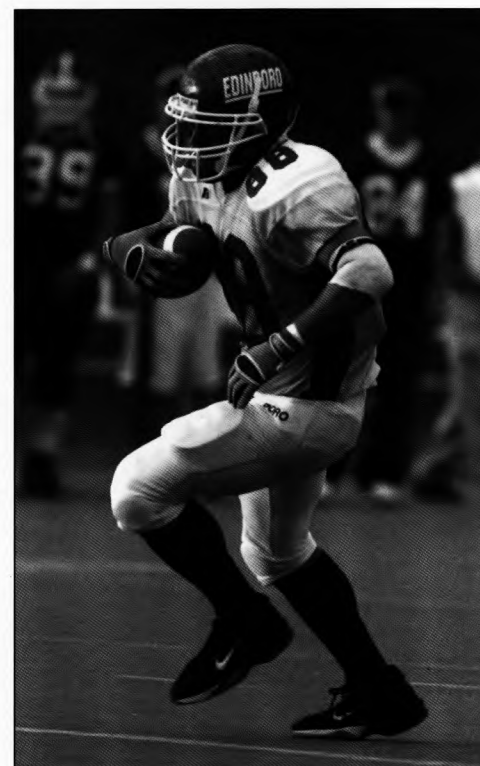

**PSAC Overview**

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, with 55 years of organized competition, has established itself as one of the most respected NCAA Division II athletic conferences.

In its history the PSAC has laid claim to 37 NCAA team champions and 204 individual title winners, giving credence to its fine athletic tradition. The conference has prospered on the national level in recent years, as it annually has close to one-third of its teams participating in NCAA post-season competition. The PSAC also distinguishes itself as the second largest Division II conference in terms of sports sponsorship, awarding titles for 22 different sports.

While proud of its athletic success, the league has also thrived in an academic sense. The number of student-athletes designated by the conference as "Scholar-Athletes" - those who have attained a cumulative grade point average of 3.25 or better - has increased every year since that standard was adopted in 1995-96. The impressive number of yearly designees reached 1,579 in 2005-06, 213 more than the previous year. Furthermore, the most recent figure is nearly double the total of those in the mid-1990s.

The PSAC was organized in 1951 for the purpose of promoting and administering men's athletic programs within the 14 state teachers colleges in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. In 1977, due to the interest and growth of women's athletics, the conference was restructured to provide for women's programs.

From its inception, each conference member selected its own competitive division within the NCAA. In 1980, however, the presidents voted to reclassify the entire conference to Division II. Although all 14 institutions are members of NCAA Division II, eight schools have also elected to compete at the Division I level in select sports.

In 1983, all member institutions were granted university status as a result of Legislative Act 188, which formed Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. The system now enrolls in excess of 107,000 students. The alumni of the State System is over 600,000, which includes roughly 405,000 Pennsylvanians.

One of the largest conferences in the nation, the PSAC is governed by the presidents of the 14 member institutions. It employs a commissioner, two assistants and an intern at its headquarters in Lock Haven, Pa.

The sportswriters' poll was considered a mythical championship. With the advent of the conference in 1950, the Saylor Point System was used to determine a champion. From 1960 to 1987, a "State Game" featuring the champions of the Eastern and Western Divisions determined the conference champion. Since 1988, due to the conference's desire to qualify more teams for NCAA postseason play, only divisional champions have been named.

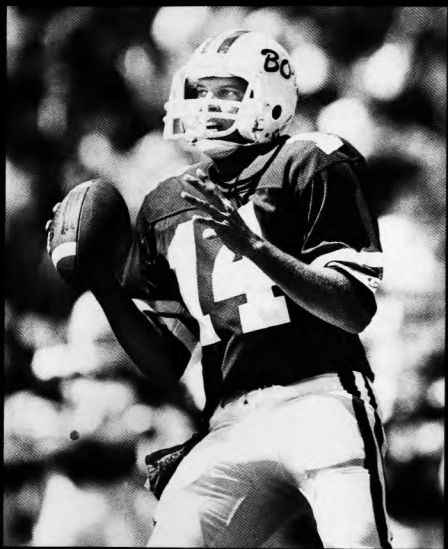

## Harlan Hill Trophy

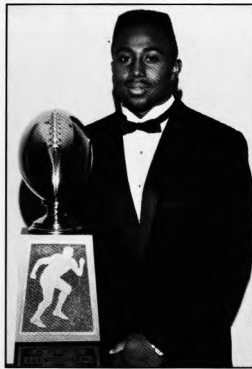
Two Edinboro University football players have been finalists for the Harlan Hill Trophy, presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II football. Running back Elbert Cole was one of three finalists in 1989, while wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist a year later. Cole placed third in the '89 balloting. He earned All-American honors in 1989, receiving first team accolades from Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, second team recognition from Football Gazette, and third team status from Associated Press.

Cole rushed for 1,507 yards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns (24) and points (148). He led the Fighting Scots to the PSAC West title, a 8-3 record and a number seven ranking in the final Division II poll.

Priester was runnerup to North Dakota State quarterback Chris Simdorn in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title. Priester was the PSAC Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He was also recognized by Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press and the Football Gazette as a first team All-American.

The wide receiver hauled in 47 passes for 1,102 yards and 15 TDs. Edinboro finished 9-3, reaching the Division II quarterfinals.

Two years ago Andre Burke (below) made a run at the Harlan Hill Trophy, as the tailback was a Northeast Region semifinalist. Burke ended up with a school-record 1,713 yards and 19 TDs.

Dave Smith (#95) and Seth Fragale (#6) were mainstays on the Erie Freeze defense. After starring for the Fighting Scots, Seth Fragale joined the Freeze this past season. He became an instant standout at line-backers and on special teams. Smith has played two seasons with the Freeze and is the unquestioned leader of the defensive line.

# Fighting Scots in the Pros

Edinboro University has had a history of players performing in the professional ranks. Two former Fighting Scots are playing professionally in the Canadian Football League, with several others playing arena football. The Erie Freeze, a member of the AIFL, featured three former Scots this past season: Dave Smith, Seth Fragale and Anthony Peluso. Joe Valvoda played for Richmond.

Jeremy O'Day is in his tenth season as an offensive lineman in the CFL, and in his eighth season with the Saskatchewan Roughriders. A year ago he was named a Western Division all-star. He was chosen by the Toronto Argonauts in the 1997 supplemental draft, and was a member of the 1997 Grey Cup winning team. The center has played in 152 CFL regular season games and eight playoff games. John Williams was drafted by British Columbia in the fourth round of the 2002 CFL Draft. He has played for Toronto the last two years.

Dave Green and Jim Romaniszyn playing for the Cleveland Browns in the 1970's. Green, a running back, also played for the Montreal Alouettes in the CFL. Romaniszyn, a 6'2", 225 lb. running back, was drafted by the Browns in the 13th round in 1973, then switched to line-backer.

Jeff Traversy, a 6'5", 280 lb. nose tackle, was the Calgary Stampeders' third pick in the 1997 college draft and played through the 2002 season.

A number of other Fighting Scots have made their marks in the professional ranks. Denorse Mosely was a member of the Miami Dolphins as a defensive back for two seasons, and was also in training camp with the Green Bay Packers. Fullback Matt Phillips signed as a free agent with the New England Patriots in 2005, and three years ago punter Sean McNicholas signed as a free agent with the New York Jets.

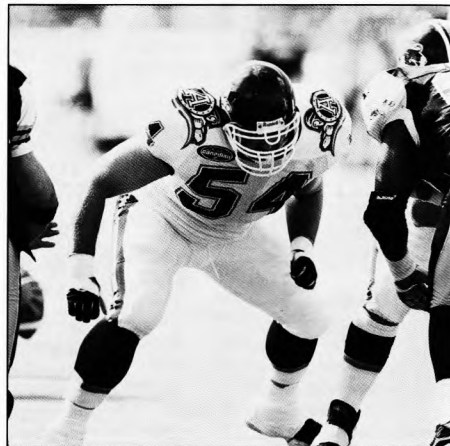

the University is celebrating its Sesquicentennial recognizing 150 years of service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and beyond.

Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie - Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 500,000 bound volumes and 1.4 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

The main campus also includes a modern University Center that is undergoing a \$17 million renovation, planetarium, observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and television stations, health center, counseling center, and much more - all accessible for people with disabilities. The Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of its kind in the nation.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including five residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learning floors - all are wired for voice, video and data.

Edinboro University also operates centers in Erie and Meadville. Edinboro University in Erie - The Porreco Center is a beautiful 27-acre campus that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for small conferences, business meetings, and special events. Edinboro University in Meadville is located in the city's historic Bessemer Building.

of Directors of Pennsylvania Campus Compact. He served for two years as chairperson of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) Commission for the Universities and Commission of Presidents Executive Committee. He is a member of the Executive Board of A Community of Agile Partners in Education (CAPE). In October 1996, Dr. Pogue was appointed by then Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge to the Governor's Commission on Academic Standards. In November 2002, he was appointed co-chair of the Higher Education Committee of Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell's Transition Team. In May 2004, he was appointed to the Pennsylvania Department of Education's Higher Education Advisory Board.

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the Boards of Directors for the Meadville Area Industrial Commission, the Erie Regional Chamber and Growth Partnership, and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra. In 2005, he was elected to the Executive Committee of the Civic Coordinating Committee of Erie County. Additionally, he serves on the Boards of Corporators for the Hamot Health Foundation, the Saint Vincent Health Center, and the Meadville Medical Center. He is a member of the Erie Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee and an Honorary Member of the Erie Wolves Club. Dr. Pogue was chairperson of the Erie County Millennium Commission, the Erie County State Employees Combined Appeal (SECA) campaign in 2001 and 2002, and of the Erie Day School's Adopt-A-Scholar scholarship program (2000-01 and 2002-03). He was also a member of the Erie Mayor's Task Force on Public Safety. Dr. Pogue has served on the boards of directors for the United Way of Erie County and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

Dr. Pogue was honored by the Erie Area Chamber of Commerce with the Louis J. Tullio Community Service Award. The Greater Erie Community Action Committee (GECAC) honored him in 2004 with the Othello Myers Johnson Human Services Award and with the Paul P. Martin Community Service Award in 2000. In 1999, the Distinguished Service Award for Leadership and Vision was presented to him by the SUNY at Albany Council of Trustees.

Dr. Pogue has shared his experiences and expertise in Edinboro University classrooms via guest lecturer presentations. He has also taught a course titled, "Special Topics in Sociology" for the Department of Sociology. He continues to enjoy working in the classroom environment.

Since becoming president, Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.

# Athletic Administration

## Bruce Baumgartner

Director of Athletics



Bruce Baumgartner is regarded as one of the greatest American wrestlers ever, being recognized as the U.S. Olympic Wrestler of the Century by Globalaccess.com six years ago and later being inducted into the Wrestling Hall of Fame. Now Baumgartner is building a solid reputation as an athletic administrator. Baumgartner was named the acting Director of Athletics in 1997, then was awarded the job permanently in '98.

As the guiding force of the Fighting Scot athletic program, Baumgartner has initiated the Annual Athletic Fund Drive, a fundraising project designed to provide athletic scholarship funds. In addition, he has initiated several other fundraising projects, including a semi-annual sports memorabilia auction which has raised almost \$100,000 in six years.

In recent years Baumgartner has targeted improvements in McComb Fieldhouse, and the results are clearly evident. Both the gymnasium and outer lobby were modernized, with emphasis placed on the success of Edinboro's athletic teams and student-athletes. Now comes the much-anticipated weight room renovation, expected to begin this winter. The weight room will be expanded with new equipment added. The project also calls for a video room for the teams to use, plus a new concession area.

A four-time Olympic medalist, Baumgartner served as an Edinboro wrestling coach for nearly 13 years, including seven seasons as the head coach. He compiled a 70-36 record, including a 14-0 dual meet record in 1997, the best finish in school history. The Fighting Scots then went on to finish sixth at the NCAA Division I National Championships, their highest finish ever.

Baumgartner affirmed his status as the greatest freestyle wrestler in American history by winning the bronze medal at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta. It was his fourth Olympic medal and record-setting 13<sup>th</sup> world-level medal. Baumgartner was honored by his fellow United States Olympic athletes when he was chosen to carry the American flag for the 1996 opening ceremonies. He won his first gold medal in Los Angeles in 1984, America's first in 60 years of super heavyweight wrestling. He added a the silver medal in the 1988 Games in Seoul, Korea, followed by a second gold medal in Barcelona, Spain in 1992.

Baumgartner was honored as the winner of the James E. Sullivan Award in 1995 as the outstanding amateur athlete in the United States. He did not lose to an American wrestler from 1981 to his retirement in 1998. He has been inducted into numerous Hall of fames, including the Wrestling hall of Fame in 2002 and the Pennsylvania Hall of Fame in 2005.

As a collegiate wrestler at Indiana State University, Baumgartner won 134 of 146 collegiate matches with 73 falls. He was twice the runnerup at the national collegiate tournament, then posted a perfect 44-0 mark his senior year to capture the NCAA crown.

Baumgartner was honored by the NCAA as a top "Top V Award" recipient for his athletic, leadership and academic success. He was later awarded an NCAA post-graduate scholarship after earning his bachelor's degree in Industrial Art Education. He utilized the award to earn a master's degree at Oklahoma State University.

While officially retiring from wrestling in 1998, Baumgartner still performs a great deal of community service as a motivational speaker and camp clinician. He and his wife, Linda, reside in Edinboro with their three sons, Bryan (16), Zachary (13) and Dylan (9).

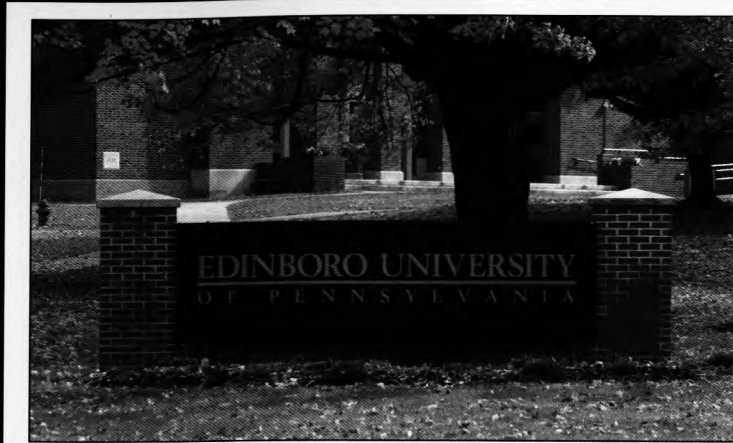

President, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Dr. Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor for student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central Administration in Albany, serving in that position for 10 years. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, President Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY at Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. Recently, he served as President for the MSA Board of Trustees and as a member of its Executive Committee, and he is a former vice chair of the Commission's Executive Committee. 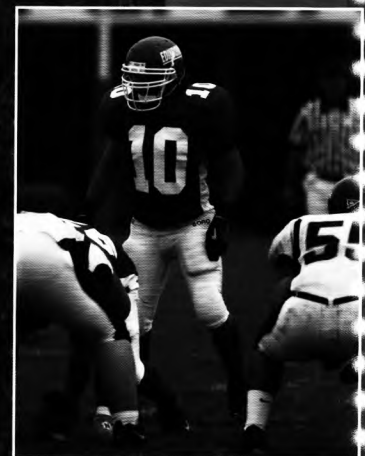

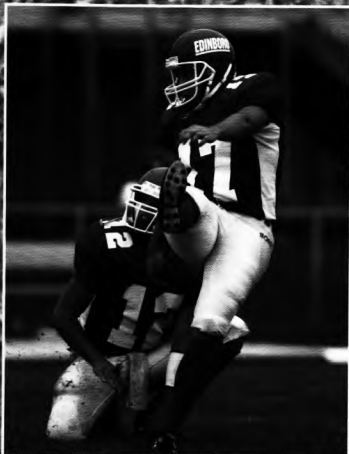
