


Greetings from the President






University football fans can catch all the **Fighting Scot** gridiron action on WFSE FM 88.9. The Edinboro student radio sta-

2005 Season Preview

Intangibles Key to Edinboro Joining Select Few as **Back-to-Back-to-Back PSAC West Champions**

Edinboro University head coach Lou Tepper received a phone call recently from his old college roommate. As they chatted, Tepper's roommate asked what was his greatest worry heading into the 2005 season. "A holder," quipped Tepper.

Tepper's roommate was a bit taken aback by the response, and in actuality the veteran coach was only half-kidding. With 29 lettermen and 15 starters back, many view the two-time defending Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference co-champion Fighting Scots as loaded. It's true that after back-toback 9-3 seasons, with trips to the NCAA Playoffs in 2003 and 2004, expectations are high. In fact, Edinboro is ranked eighth by Street & Smith's 2005 Yearbook and 18th in Lindy's Football Annual.

But Tepper will readily admit that while talent had plenty to do with Edinboro's success the last two years, it is not the team's greatest attribute. The Fighting Scots' recipe for success has been a combination of talent, coaching, and the immeasurables.

"Our kids stress our unity," stated Tepper proudly. "I really think our strength is our camaraderie, our unity - the intangibles. We don't lack talent, but if you were to compare our players versus another team's, we may not have better athletes at each position.

"We have a lot of experience coming back, and great unity. If the intangibles stay strong, I think you'll have to be really good to beat us. I think the players are very confident, but not cocky. They have kept striving to be the best. I think we'll be in the thick of the championship race, but they're saying the same things at IUP, California and Shippensburg.

A year ago Tepper referred to a quote

from former UCLA basketball coach John Wooden, who said, "It takes ability to win a championship, it takes character to repeat." Tepper will no doubt enlist that quote again this year as Edinboro strives for its third straight PSAC West crown. Back-to-back-toback PSAC crowns is something only accomplished four times before in PSAC annals, by West Chester (1959-61), Slippery Rock (1972-74 and 1997-99) and IUP (1990-94)

"Our goals are first to be the best team in Erie, and the PSAC championship is our second goal," related Tepper. "Our third goal is the regional title. We feel we are one of about six teams in the running for the regional title. We're talented enough to beat anyone on our schedule, but poor execution can lose to anyone. I don't know how many 'alarming' players we have. I look at IUP and California and I see a lot of talent."

The 2005 schedule features six games in the friendly confines of Sox Harrison Stadium, beginning with an August 27 date with WVU The Fighting Scots also play Tech. Shippensburg, a team ranked ninth by Lindy's and 13th by Street & Smith's. The Red Raiders have handed Edinboro its only losses the last two years in PSAC West action, prevailing a year ago by a 17-10 count.

But it's three road contests that will shape the Edinboro fortunes in 2005. Week number two finds the Scots traveling to East Stroudsburg for a rematch with the Warriors and their scintillating signalcaller, Jimmy Terwilliger. Lindy's preseason Most Valuable Player selection, Terwilliger has bedeviled Edinboro in three previous meetings, including a 36-32 win in the NCAA Northeast Region quarterfinals a year ago. East Stroudsburg is ranked second according to Lindy's and fifth by Street & Smith's.

The other two road contests against come teams unranked in the preseason, but Indiana(Pa.) has been a perennial Division II

power, and the Îndians are no doubt seething after losing two years in a row to the Fighting Scots. The IUP contest is scheduled for October 15. One earlier week Edinboro will face a California(Pa.) team which will look to celebrate Homecoming with an upset of

Vulcans are assembling, "upset" may hardly be the proper terminology.

Special Teams

Tepper's status as an outstanding defensive coach is unquestioned, but he may get more pleasure out of standout special team's play. Without question, few coaches in the country place more emphasis on special team's performance. In Tepper's mind, there are three equal phases to the game, and special teams always comes first.

The kicking game is in solid hands, or feet, with Kody Robertson returning. The junior converted 12 of 14 field goals and set school records for extra points made (46) and attempted (50) a year ago. Robertson was accorded first team All-PSAC West honors after tying for the scoring lead among kickers with 82 points. He was a D2football.com and Football Gazette honorable mention All-American. Robertson will not only handle the placekicking duties, but now adds the punting chores to his resume. He has punted five times in his previous two seasons.

In Tristan Mulcahy the Fighting Scots possess a backup kicker capable of starting for many teams. Mulcahy did a solid job serving as the kickoff specialist as a freshman, and should improve dramatically this fall.

Tepper will choose from a number of players for punt and kickoff returns. Junior Ryan Valasek has seen the most return duty, returning 22 kickoffs for a 19.5 yard average a year ago. Several other newcomers figure to join Valasek, including freshman Deonte Peters, a diminutive 5'6" wide receiver brought in for his return skills.

Edinboro won't have to look far to replace long snapper Joe Jowly, a standout the last two years. Tepper views Ben Harris as a proven long snapper, stressing that he may even exceed Jowly, who didn't have a bad snap in two seasons. The third-year sophomore snapped for field goals and extra points last season.

Offense

Balance. Balance. Tepper couldn't stress a balanced offense enough when he took over in 2000, but it didn't happen overnight. Over the last two years the Edinboro attack has evolved into one that is multi-faceted, featuring a plethora of offensive sets that has moved the ball effectively on the ground and through the air. On any given play Edinboro could showcase a one-back offense, a four wide-receiver set, or three tight ends.

Running the ball has never been an issue for the Fighting Scots. Edinboro has had a 1,000-yard rusher ten of the last 12 years. But the evolution of the passing game has pushed the Fighting Scott offense into one of the best in the PSAC the last two years. In 2003 the Fighting Scots averaged 198.4 yards rushing

and 184.2 yards passing. Last year the figures jumped to 201.4 yards rushing and 192.3 yards passing. Edinboro ranked 44th in Division II in total offense (393.8 ypg.), with the ground game ranked 32nd nationally. With 33.2 ppg., Edinboro ranked 31st in scoring offense.

Seven starters return on offense, most notably four along the offensive line. The Fighting Scots were dealt an unexpected blow with the loss of Andre Burke and Justin Lipscomb, a pair of record-setting performers at tailback and wide receiver, respectively. With fifth-year senior Justin Bouch at the helm, Edinboro should again showcase a prolific offense. A year ago Edinboro score 398 points, the most since 1989 and the third-highest total in school history.

Quarterback: Justin Bouch is a two-time All-PSAC West first team selection who has started since midway through his redshirt freshman campaign. The 6'3", 205 lb. senior is arguably the second-best quarterback in the Northeast Region after East Stroudsburg's Jimmy Terwilliger. He has put up some impressive numbers as a Fighting Scot, and already ranks as one of the school's most prolific passers. But what sets him apart is his leadership skills and ability to win. He is highly-respected by his teammates while posting a 20-10 record as a starter.

Bouch completed 167 of 299 passes a vear ago for a school-record 2,281 yards with 20 TDs and 12 INTs, adding a pair of touchdowns on the ground. He ranks third in career passing yards (5,505) and career total offense (5,862), while standing fourth in career touchdown passes with 39.

Despite his freshman status, it didn't take long for Josh Hinkle to emerge as Bouch's backup last season. The 6'0", 190 lb. sophomore is an exciting package of running and passing ability. He played in just three games, completing 2 of 4 passes for 5 yards, but the coaching staff predicts a bright future following a fine spring performance.

After having just three quarterbacks on the roster a year ago, and with third stringer Brandon Hunt transferring, quarterback was a recruiting priority. Tepper brought in three freshmen, all with impressive credentials, in Trevor Harris, Brian Kiendl and Joe Wanton.

Running Backs: The Edinboro backfield will definitely have a different look. Consider that not one tailback on the roster has ever carried the ball for the Fighting Scots. In fact, fullback Justin Olney is the only ballcarrier with a rushing attempt at Edinboro, and he has a mere three carries.

Tepper still has plenty of interesting options to choose from at tailback, beginning with a pair of redshirt freshmen. Ulysee Davis, the starter at the end of spring drills, is a more powerful runner than Tommy Clanton at 5'9", 203 lbs. Davis also possesses plenty of speed, and could be a complete back. Clanton (5'9", 186 lbs.) has good burst.

Two transfers will push the duo of redshirt freshmen. DeMarkus Robinson is a 5'10", 180 lb. back by way of Kent State. Robinson has already received his degree from Kent State, but has two seasons of eligibility remaining. He did not see any game action in 2004, and spent time both at tailback and wide receiver for the Flashes. His brother Dru played for the Fighting Scots in 2003.

Kelvin Collins joins Edinboro after previously playing at Bowie State. Collins has plenty of size at 6'0", 230 lbs., yet has deceptive speed. He also

has plenty of experience, gaining 1,198 yards on 324 carries with 19 TDs in his career. His top season came in 2003 when he rushed for 445 yards on 124 carries with 5 TDs.

Matt Phillips will no doubt be sorely missed at fullback. The free agent signee with the New England Patriots was a bullish runner and bruising blocker. After serving as Phillips' caddy, Olney steps in as the starter. Olney is 5'11" and has bulked up to 235 lbs. He carried three times for 13 yards. With depth an issue at fullback, Collins may also see time at fullback. In addition, redshirt fresh man Billy Dick (5'11", 225 lbs.) is available, although he did not participate in spring drills. Tepper wouldn't be surprised if highly-touted freshman Larry Federoff (6'0", 231 lbs.) is one of the few firstyear performers to make an impact.

Receivers: Depth abounds at wide receiver, but Tepper admits that the Scots may not be able to entirely replace Lipscomb. He was one of the few Scots singled out by Tepper as an "alarming" player, able to turn a five-yard pass into a 20-yard gain. The one player who may have those capabilities is Rvan Valasek, but the junior is just 5'9", 175 lbs. Valasek is a big-play specialist, with seven receptions of 30-or-more yards. He averaged 22.9 yards per catch on his 23 receptions with 3 TDs.

The rest of the receiving corps features solid all-around players with plenty of height. Tepper felt a year ago that Aaron Fetty had all-conference qualities, but the 6'5" junior suffered an injury in the first game and missed the next three contests. He was never the same after that, ending the year with 8 receptions for 169 yards. Tepper hopes his pre diction comes true, just a year later.

When Fetty went down, Jeff Dinger stepped in and produced career-high numbers with 24 catches for 265 yards and a touchdown. He had entered the season with just four career receptions. A 6'5" senior, Dinger is a fine possession receiver.

Jordan Bobitski returns after missing the 2004 season due to injury. The senior is a proven wideout known for his ability to make the tough catch. He caught 21 passes in 2002 and 25 in 2003. As many as five other returnees look to make an impact in 2005. Tepper was particularly impressed with the spring performance of Bob Reiter, a junior who has moved into the two-deep rotation. Redshirt freshman Ryan Rybicki (6'2", 215 lbs.) and junior Michael Robinson (6'6", 215 lbs.) both fit in with the big receiver concept. Rybicki may develop into a player similar to Nate Eimer, who can play wide receiver or tight end. Robinson is an immensely talented player who originally began his career at Indiana University. He sat out the 2004 campaign, and caught one pass in 2003 following his transfer from the Hoosiers. Sophomore Marshall Ellison and redshirt freshman LaVaughn

Wesley are also in the picture at wide receiver.

Edinboro must replace four-year co-starter Ed Brown at tight end, but the Fighting Scots still possess three talented players to rotate at the position. Nate Eimer, the smallest of the group at 6'2", 220 lbs., enters fall drills as the starter. The senior is a hybrid player capable of playing tight end, wide receiver, H-back or fullback. He caught 19 passes for 240 yards and 4 TDs last season.

C.J. Trivisonno was lost after two games due to an injury. While he was missed a year ago, the Scots now welcome him back for an unexpected fifth season. The 6'4", 250 lb. senior is described by

Tepper as a complete tight end, and was starting to attract the attention of professional scouts. He shared the starting job with Brown for three years, and was a second team All-PSAC West choice in 2003 after catching 17 passes for 194 yards and 2 TDs.

When Trivisonno went down, it meant Kyle Witucki would not use a redshirt season. Instead, the 6'4", 250 lb. freshman became an integral part of the tight end rotation. He finished with 7 receptions for 34 yards, with touchdown catches in each of the two postseason games. The sophomore figures to play an even greater role in 2005.

Redshirt freshman Joe Gable (6'3", 245 lbs.) is another option at tight end, and the coaching staff views incoming freshman Josh Wachter (6'6", 265 lbs.) as a prized recruit.

Offensive Line: The offensive line definitely catches the attention of opposing teams. Once one of his greatest concerns, now the offensive line is possibly the team's greatest strength, featuring plenty of size and experience, although experienced depth could become an issue

A year ago all five of the offensive linemen tipped the scales at over 300 lbs., and that is something offensive line coach Scott Browning hopes will change. He looks for his linemen to come in a bit trimmer and quicker. He still expects a pile-driving unit that paved the way for an average of 201.4 rushing ypg. while giving up a PSAC-low 9 sacks.

Four starters return, including a pair of All-PSAC West performers. Leading the way is Greg Bzorek, a 6'6", 318 lb. senior who begins his third year as the starter at right tackle after starting as a redshirt freshman at left tackle. All told, he has started 34 of 35 career games. A year ago Bzorek was chosen a third team Associated Press Little All-America, in addition to landing on several other All-America teams. He enters the 2005 campaign as a Lindy's and Street & Smith's first team preseason All-American. A technically-sound lineman with a nasty streak, Bzorek moved up to the All-PSAC West first team after being named to the second team as a sophomore.

Chris Kaczor earned second team All-PSAC West accolades at left guard as a redshirt freshman, and followed that up with a second team selection after moving to center a year ago. The 6'2", 300 lb. junior is another lineman with plenty of experience, starting all 24 games in his career.

A pair of players debuted as starters a year ago at the guard positions, and both are good enough to receive serious all-conference consideration. Andy Young, a 6'4", 300 lb. third-year sophomore, at times was Edinboro's best lineman a year ago. He started 11 games at right guard. LaMont Singleton battled injuries and conditioning issues when he first arrived after transferring from Erie(NY) Community College. He still started all 12 games, and is a bulldozer of a blocker. Singleton came to Edinboro weighing almost 350 lbs., but the coaches look for him to return for the fall at around 300 lbs. on his 6'4" frame.

The fifth starter figures to be a familiar name in PSAC circles. Josh Bzorek will be the

third member of his family to play at Edinboro, and he also had brothers play at Clarion and Slippery Rock. The 6'4", 275 lb. redshirt freshman looks to join his brother Greg as a starter, opening at left tackle. He enjoyed an outstanding spring.

Mike Mills and Anthony Tedesco represent the lone experienced depth. Mills will likely serve as the backup at left tackle, but he has also played guard in the past. The 6'5", 290 lb. sophomore sat out the 2004 season, but started four games in 2003. Tedesco is a 6'4", 280 lb. junior who will line up at right guard.

Sophomore Anthony Byerly (5'10", 290 lbs.) is a backup at left guard, with no fewer than five redshirt freshmen battling for reserve duty. If Josh Bzorek was the biggest surprise this spring, not far behind was Eric Costello (6'3", 285 lbs.). He will serve as Kaczor's backup. Vince Lutman (6'2", 300 lbs.) and Brian Shreve (6'4", 300 lbs.) are in reserve behind Greg Bzorek at right tackle, with Scott Christie (6'4", 295 lbs.) backing up Singleton. Jim Curtin (6'0", 292 lbs.) is a reserve center.

Defense

A year ago the nature of the defense was changed. Gone were the behemoth linemen, in their place a group of small, aggressive players. That was the trademark of the defense, flowing and attacking the football.

In some respects the statistics bely the effectiveness of the defense. The Fighting Scots had the misfortune of facing two of the best quarterbacks in Division II in the NCAA playoffs. Lost in the 47-44 win at Bentley was the play of the defensive unit in the second half, when Edinboro limited the Falcons to 140 vards and ten points. Also, in several games Edinboro jumped out to huge halftime leads, which resulted in a conservative offense and plenty of reserves defensively in the second half. Consider that the Fighting Scots gave up just 47 points in the first quarter and outscored opponents 242 to 128 in the first half.

The Edinboro defense excelled against the run, ranking 14th nationally and second in the PSAC with 97.3 ypg., allowing just nine rushing touchdowns. That being the case, teams loaded up on the pass, throwing a record 406 passes against the Fighting Scots. While giving up 262.8 ypg. through the air, a more indicative figure of the pass coverage was a school-record 30 interceptions, a figure which led the country. In addition, Edinboro led Division II in turnovers forced (42) and ranked first in the PSAC with 33 sacks.

With nine starters back, including five All-PSAC West performers, and several reserves ready to step up and play major roles, the defense looks for another strong season. Defensive coordinator Wayne Bradford will once again showcase speed and movement.

Defensive Line: Edinboro's defensive front might have been the smallest in the PSAC, but it led the PSAC in sacks and ranked second in rushing defense. Three All-PSAC West players return along the front, led by Seth Fragale at rush linebacker. The 6'2", 220 lb. graduate student not only moved up from the second team to the first team all-conference a year ago, but was named the PSAC West Defensive Player of the Year.

Fragale has been the perfect player to assume the multiple roles of the rush linebacker spot, requiring a player to rush the passer, play the run, and drop in coverage. Fragale led Edinboro with 100 tackles and 5.5 sacks, while finishing second in tackles for losses (11). He added a pair of interceptions and 2 fumble recoveries. An honorable mention D2football.com and Football Gazette All-American, he was named a preseason Lindy's second team All-American.

A.J. Cousins emerged as an All-PSAC West performer at noseguard, earning a spot on the first team. He was joined by Chris Amico, a second team choice at tackle. Cousins, a 6'1", 275 lb. junior, is Edinboro's biggest starting lineman. He totaled 51 tackles, with 9 for losses and 5 sacks, in his first season as a starter. Amico is a 6'0", 250 lb. third-year sophomore who finished with 53 tackles and a team-leading 12 tackles for losses, including 4.5 sacks in his year as a starter. The fourth starter is defensive end Greg

MacAnn. At 6'4", 225 lbs., the senior is probably the smallest defensive end in the PSAC, vet he is a fierce competitor who has started 20 games in his career, including all 12 last season. MacAnn ended the year with 49 tackles, 9.5 tackles for losses and 3.5 sacks.

The interior line positions showcase a pair of experienced players, each a unique story. Njieya Chafeh (5'10", 256 lbs.) originally hails from Cameroon, and did not arrive in the United States until he was 14. Extremely strong, the senior moves to tackle this season. He had 16 tackles a year ago.

Justin Koi last played for the Scots in 2001, when he started all ten games, totaling 46 tackles, with 12 for losses. The 6'0", 270 lb. junior noseguard is a powerful, intense performer who must shake the rust off his game.

Redshirt freshmen Donnie Marsteller (6'4", 230 lbs.) and Mike Heasley (6'2", 260 lbs.) provide further depth at tackle and noseguard, respectively.

Joe Malizia returns as Fragale's reserve at rush linebacker, where he will battle Syl Hanner. A 6'2", 215 lb. sophomore, Malizia finished with 8 tackles an an interception. Hanner moved from inside linebacker to rush backer in the spring. The 5'11", 218 lb. sophomore had 8 tackles in seven games. Steve Renfro, a lanky 6'3", 220 sophomore, tries to find his niche as a speed pass rusher. Renfro had 5 tackles, including 2.5 sacks.

Mike Enoch is a 6'3", 245 lb. redshirt freshman who will relieve MacAnn at defensive end. He is the most advanced of a young group of linemen. Sophomore Josh Otto (6'4", 235 lbs.) played in three contests last year. Redshirt freshman David Dix (6'3", 235 lbs.) is another option at end.

The front was further strengthened over the summer with the addition of Caleb Mayer, a transfer who played two seasons at Liberty. A 6'1", 240 lbs. junior, Mayer could see time at a number of linebacker positions. He appeared in seven games for the Flames last year, and as a true freshman in 2002 he had 22 tackles while starting twice.

2005 Season Preview

Linebackers: While Edinboro loses two inside linebackers who started a total of 19 games last season, two players who saw equal time are back, and Tepper expects Ben Stroup to assume the mantle as the team's next great inside linebacker.

A 6'1", 205 lb. junior, Stroup started five of the last six games a year ago, and ended the season with 49 tackles. That included 6.5 for losses and 3 sacks. An instinctive player with great acceleration, Tepper feels that Stroup has put the final touches on his play to join the likes of Jermaine Hughley and Foster Johnson, recent standouts.

Dave Jazenski is expected to start alongside Stroup at inside backer. A 5'11", 225 lb. junior, Jazenski is extremely strong and gained plenty of experience last year, sharing one of the positions with Brandon Banas. Jazenski totaled 43 tackles.

Tepper used spring drills to assess a group of inexperienced reserves at inside linebacker, and he liked what he saw in redshirt freshmen Paul Burger and Hardin Moss. Burger was an all-state performer in Ohio as a prepster, and was also a top wrestling recruit who took over as the starter at 197 lbs. late in the year. Now 215 lbs. after arriving at Edinboro weighing 231 lbs., he now fits in much better with the defensive scheme. Moss is 6'1", 225 lbs. and could have a huge impact this fall.

Sophomore Mike Cradduck is small at 195 lbs., but is very active and seems a better fit at inside linebacker after playing strong safety a year ago. Hanner or Mayer could also play inside.


Jim Soltis was one of the most improved players on the team last year. The 6'2", 200 lb. junior made great strides in his first season as the starter at drop linebacker, and ended the year with his two best efforts of the season in the playoff games against Bentley and East Stroudsburg. After recording 8 tackles and a pair of fumble recoveries at Bentley, he earned national Defensive Player of the Week honors for his play at East Stroudsburg, totaling 9 tackles, 3 for losses, with a sack, a fumble recovery, and a 47-yard interception return for a touchdown. Soltis ended the year with 45 tackles, adding 5 interceptions for 85 yards.

James English moves from wide receiver to drop linebacker. One of the few true freshmen to see playing time a year ago, English is 6'2", 200 lbs. and very athletic. He made a smooth transition in the spring. Senior Regis Burns, a prominent player at strong safety and drop linebacker the last two years, suffered a serious knee injury in the loss at Bentley. He hopes to return after totaling 33 tackles last year, but his playing status is in doubt.

Defensive Backs: With two starters back, both All-PSAC West selections, and a pair of talented newcomers set to make their mark, the secondary is in a strong state. The secondary gave up an alarming 262.8 ypg. passing, but with teams unable to rush the ball against the Fighting Scots, most took to the air. Members of the secondary accounted for 22 of the team's school-record 30 interceptions.

Chris Avery is a two-time All-PSAC West second team selection who has started 26 of 28 games in his career. The senior is tied for second in career interceptions at Edinboro with 13, including 6 a year ago after picking off 7 passes as a sophomore. Avery added 42 tackles and 6 passes broken up, yet may be the most unappreciated player in the secondary. He returned one interception for a touchdown, and also scored after blocking a punt.

Tom Davidson took over as the starter at free

safety for All-American Raji El-Amin in week number two, and the defense didn't miss a beat. The third-year sophomore went on to rank second in the PSAC and seventh in Division II with 8 interceptions for 117 yards. The 8 interceptions were one shy of El-Amin's school record, and helped Davidson earn second team All-PSAC West accolades. He is a Lindy's second team preseason All-American. He is expected to move to strong safety. Damion Malott, a highly-regarded transfer from Hudson Valley Community College, moves in at free safety. Malott had 74 tackles and 4 interceptions for the Vikings last year while playing free safety in a system very similar to Edinboro's.

The other cornerback spot shapes up as a battle between Jermaine Truax, who began the 2004 campaign as the starter, and junior college transfer Rodney Stevenson. Truax was injured early in last year's season opener and also missed spring drills. The senior is a former standout at Alfred State who had a pair of interceptions for Edinboro in 2003. Stevenson joined the Fighting Scots in January and had an opportunity to impress the coaching staff during the spring. A junior, he is another of the former standouts at Erie(NY) Community College to join the Edinboro program.

Tom LaVerde is the most experienced of the secondary reserves. A former wide receiver, he played in a backup role at cornerback last year, and will compete with Donnye Aiken this fall. He had 15 tackles in his first season in the secondary. Sophomore Mike Mader played in five games a year ago, and will play in a backup role at strong safety. He'll battle Keelyn Roberts, a sophomore who transferred from Bowie State but did not play for the Bulldogs, for time behind Davidson.

Aiken, a sophomore and senior Pat Aretz will vie for time at cornerback. Aiken sat out the 2004 campaign after transferring from Colgate, while Aretz formerly played at Thiel and proved a valuable special teams player in his first season at



Head Coach Lou Tepper



Veteran Division I mentor Lou Tepper was appointed the 12th head football coach at Edinboro University, officially taking charge of the Fighting Scot program on January 5, 2000. He promised a tough and classy program, and in four short years delivered a championship team that fans and alumni enthusiastically endorse.

Tepper inherited an Edinboro program which had won just eleven games in the previous three seasons. The Scots have shown consistent improvement in "Coach Tep's" five years, culminated by consecutive PSAC championships

rushing and passing. The defense led the nation with 42 turnovers and 30 interceptions while playing stingy run defense in 2004. Truth be known, Tepper's real passion is for special teams, despite his national reputation on defense. Edinboro has not had a kick blocked the last two years, while blocking four kicks a year ago, with two blocked punts returned for touchdowns.

While winning is important, it isn't the only emphasis at Edinboro with Tepper at the controls. The participation numbers have significantly increased and academic performances have soared. He has demanded recruiting equally a combination of character and talent. The Edinboro staff stresses a family concept and racial harmony. The improvement academically has been so drastic that out of 80 players on the team following spring practice, just three were faced with academic probation.

The 2000 season brought a 5-6 record, matching the Edinboro record for wins by a first-year head coach, and a fifth place PSAC finish. In 2001 and 2002, the Fighting Scots were very competitive, setting the stage for back-to-back championship seasons.

Edinboro made its first postseason appearance in 2003, claiming a share of the PSAC West championship. The Fighting Scots survived a brutal three-game stretch early in the season, defeating 16th-ranked East Stroudsburg, 30-21, dropping a 40-34 decision to 22nd-ranked Shippensburg, and upsetting fourth-ranked Indiana(Pa.) on the Indians' home turf, 28-20. The Scots ended the regular season with a six-game winning streak. During that stretch Edinboro held opponents without a touchdown for 20 consecutive quarters. Tepper was recognized as the PSAC West Coach of the Year in 2004, as Edinboro finished with a 9-3 record and an 18th place ranking in the AFCA poll.

The Fighting Scots once again finished 9-3 and tied for the PSAC West crown a year ago, while duplicating the 2003 AFCA ranking of 18th. Edinboro picked up its second-ever NCAA postseason win with a 47-44 win at 20th-ranked Bentley.

BACKGROUND

Tepper, a native of Keystone, PA, returned to the Division II level after coaching at Division I institutions for almost thirty years. He is renowned as a defensive coaching genius, with a resume that includes three Butkus Award honorees and an Outland Trophy winner. Tepper's list of standouts include Bruce Smith, John Holecek, Šimeon Rice, Kevin Hardy, Brad Hopkins, Booger MacFarland, and Ken Dilger, all current or former NFL standouts. In addition, he has worked with some of the top head coaches in the country, including Bill Dooley at Virginia Tech, Bill McCartney at Colorado, John Mackovic at Illinois and Gerry DiNardo at LSU.

"Being a native of western Pennsylvania, it has been neat to be a head coach again and to be a head coach in this environment," Tepper related following his first season at Edinboro. "I've recruited western Pennsylvania for half of my career. It's a joy to be back home."

Tepper completed his second full season as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana State University in 1999. He began his tenure with the Tigers on December 15, 1997, helping LSU to a 27-9 Independence Bowl win over Notre Dame. All told, he has served as a defensive coordinator for 19 years in his coaching profession.

BIG TEN HEAD COACH

Lou Tepper was appointed the head coach at the University of Illinois on December 13, 1991, just prior to the team's appearance in the John Hancock Sun Bowl. He replaced Mackovic, who left for the head coaching position at the University of Texas. During his five-year stint as the Fighting Illini head coach, Tepper compiled a record of 25-31-2, including two more bowl appearances. He guided Illinois to a pair of wins over Ohio State, including one at Columbus; the school's first victory in Ann Arbor against Michigan in 27 years; and three consecutive wins over rival Iowa by a combined score of 122-17. Just as impressive, Tepper graduated a very high percentage of his Big Ten seniors.

Tepper joined the Illinois program in 1988, serving as the defensive coordinator for four seasons and assistant head coach for two years. In his nine seasons at Illinois, he helped the program to six bowl invitations, one Big Ten title and top ten rankings in the AP and UPI polls. He was honored as the Big Ten's top defensive assistant coach in 1990 by The Sporting News. His defensive units annually ranked among

the best in the country, finishing 10th in 1989, 14th in 1993, ninth in 1994, and 21st in 1995.

Tepper's 1992 Illini squad finished 6-5-1, suffering a 27-17 defeat to Hawaii in the Holiday Bowl. Illinois went in to Columbus and upset Ohio State, 18-16, and posted a 22-22 tie against Michigan in Ann Arbor.

While his '93 edition finished 5-6, that included a 24-21 win in Ann Arbor against the Wolverines. The Illini made it back to postseason play in 1994, handing East Carolina a 30-0 whitewashing in the Liberty Bowl. The '94 squad finished 7-5, again upsetting one of the elite in the Big Ten. And once again it was on the road, as Illinois shocked Ohio State, 24-10, in Columbus behind Butkus Award winner Dana Howard.

LINEBACKERS

Through the years Penn State had gained the reputation as "Linebacker U", but Illinois could have made a good case for that designation as well during Tepper's tenure. He produced consecutive Butkus Award winners in Dana Howard (1994) and Kevin Hardy (1995). Along the way, he also produced Big Ten Defensive Players of the Year in Moe Gardner and Darrick Brownlow (1990), Howard (1993 and '94) and Big Ten Defensive Lineman of the Year Simeon Rice in 1994. For the only time in Big Ten history, Tepper had four first team All-Big Ten linebackers at his disposal. In all, he has coached over 20 professional linebackers, and has published a book, "Complete Linebacking", a 312-page comprehensive book on linebacker play.

Hardy and Rice became the highest defensive draft duo in the history of the NFL draft in 1996 when Hardy went second to Jacksonville and Rice third to Arizona. That stood until the 2000 NFL Draft when Penn State's Courtney Brown and Lavar Arrington went one-two.

DIVISION I ASSISTANT COACH

In over thirty years as an assistant coach, Tepper has worked at some of the top institutions in the country. That includes the likes of Pittsburgh, Virginia Tech and Colorado, in addition to his time at Illinois and LSU.

Tepper began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Pittsburgh in 1967, then moved on to the University of New Hampshire from 1968-71, coaching the running backs and linebackers before becoming the defensive coordinator. His next stop was the College of William & Mary, where he joined former New Hampshire head coach Jim Root as the defensive coordinator from 1972-77. The 1976 William & Mary squad posted the school's best record in thirty years. He was the assistant head coach his final year at William & Mary.

In 1978, Virginia Tech head coach Bill Dooley hired Tepper as his linebackers coach. Tepper helped build the Hokies into a consistent bowl contender with a defense that annually ranked among the nation's top ten. He stayed at Virginia Tech from 1978-82, working with Outland Trophy winner and Buffalo Bills great Bruce Smith, among others. The 1980 Hokie edition played Miami(FL) in the Peach Bowl.

Tepper joined Bill McCartney's staff at Colorado in 1983, serving as the defensive coordinator and assistant head coach until departing for Illinois in 1988. Tepper helped turn around a defense which ranked No. 100 nationally in yards allowed prior to his arrival, to one which was as high as 11th in Division I in total defense. He earned the title of assistant head coach his final two seasons, and helped the Buffaloes to the 1985 Freedom Bowl and the 1986 Blue Bonnet Bowl. Among the assistant coaches at Colorado was Gerry DiNardo, who would later bring Tepper in to direct his LSU defense.

Tepper, born September 7, 1945, graduated from Rutgers University in 1967. He enjoyed a standout career as a defensive back at Rutgers from 1965-67. As a player, Tepper led the Scarlet Knights in interceptions as a junior and tackles as a senior. He won the George Cronin Trophy as the Most Improved Player in 1965.

Tepper is an active member of the American Football Coaches Association and has served on the All-American Committee and the AFCA Ethics Committee. He is active in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and has spoken for Promise-Keepers, founded by former Colorado coach Bill McCartney. Tepper and his wife, Karen, have two married children, Matthew, a graduate of Edinboro with a master's degree in Counseling, and Stacy Ann, a graduate of LSU who is a full-time mother.

Scott Browning is in his 20th season as a Fighting Scot assistant, working with his third head coach.

After serving as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in Lou Tepper's first season, Browning took over as the offensive coordinator four years ago, while continuing to work with the linemen. This marks his 12th year in charge of the offensive linemen, and ninth as offensive coordinator. He has also coached the running backs and defensive backs in the past.

Browning has served as an assistant coach at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff in 1986, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for two years. Jim Henson, a highly successful high school coach in Ohio for over twenty years, enters his eighth season on the Edinboro staff. After working on the defensive side of the ball as





A Conversation with Lou Tepper

How do you see the PSAC West race shaping up?

"Our staff believes that IUP, California and Shippensburg will all challenge for the league title. Slippery Rock, Clarion and Lock Haven look to improve significantly, so the PSAC West will be competitive each and every week."

A year ago you employed a small but fast defensive unit. Is this a change in philosophy for you, or a sign of things to come?

"Throughout my career, we have always been known as a lean, quick defensive scheme. In this modern era of football that emphasizes spread offenses and utilizes space, being powerful and fast are even more important. We led the nation in turnovers with 42 and had 30 interceptions, and a major factor in that production was our ability to accelerate with faster people."

The last two years we've seen more of the "balanced" offense you talked about upon your arrival. What lies in store for the offense this year?

"Each winter and spring we have the opportunity as a staff to tweak our schemes. There will certainly be some changes this fall that reflect our personnel strengths, but the major objectives are still to score 30 points a game and have a 400-yard offense that can run and throw with equal effectiveness. That keeps everyone involved!"

We've talked a lot about the football side of things, but academics are also a very important issue to you. Please discuss.

"When our staff arrived in Edinboro in the winter of 2000, we inherited 56 players and 26 of them were on academic probation or suspension. This past spring, we had a very healthy situation with 80 players and only a handful in academic difficulty. In fact, our team averaged a 2.75 GPA, the highest I have ever been associated with in my career. Our Mission Statement encourages our players to have "Lofty Academic Goals". We don't want our players just to be eligible 2.0 students, but rather we want them to strive in the classroom and make a Master's Degree their goal within two years of graduating at Edinboro.'

Sox Harrison Stadium



Sox Harrison Stadium serves as the home of the Fighting Scots Dedicated in 1965, the stadium honors the memory of B. Regis "Sox" Harrison, the head football and basketball coach at Edinboro University for 34 years. Sox Harrison was the key figure in the building of

Edinboro's athletic program, unselfishly devoting 34 years of service to the University as an athletic director, coach and physical education instructor. Appropriately, he was the first member inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.

Harrison coached the Fighting Scot football team from its inception in 1926 to 1938, the returned to guide the gridders in 1941 and '42. In addition, he coached the men's basketball team for 23 seasons, from 1928-53, winning 175 games.

Sox Harrison Stadium seats 6,000 people in its two grandstands, along with plenty of standing room. In addition to press boxes on both sides of the stadium, the facility has locker rooms, a training room and complete amenities for fans.

The stadium has undergone several renovations, including a new sound system and improved handicapped access areas in 1999. In 1997, a new grandstand was constructed on the visitor's side of the field, adding 2,500 permanent seats, along with a press box, locker rooms and a training room.

In addition to the football field, the facility contains complete track facilities.

2004 in Review

Game 1 East Stroudsburg 20, **Edinboro** 7 September 4, 2004

Sox Harrison Stadium

Edinboro, PA -- Edinboro head coach Lou Tepper knew his defense would have its hands full against East Stroudsburg quarterback Jim Terwilliger. The Fighting Scots defeated East Stroudsburg a year ago, 31-20, "limiting" Terwilliger to 288 yards through the air. Edinboro would go on to finish as PSAC West co-champions, while ESU was the PSAC East co-champion.

Edinboro's second meeting with Terwilliger was not as favorable, as the sophomore signalcaller led East Stroudsburg to a 20-7 win. Edinboro opened the season ranked 21st in the AFCA Division II poll, but lost its fifth season opener in the last six years.

Terwilliger nearly matched last year's total in the first half alone, passing for 228 yards in a half featuring plenty of offense but little scoring. ESU had the ball in Edinboro territory on all four of its first half possessions, but could only manage a 26-yard field goal by Mark Brubaker with 4:38 remaining in the second quarter. One drive was stoped by an interception at the Edinboro 15, and two other drives resulted in missed field goals, one a 26varder which was blocked by Seth Fragale, and a 24-yard attempt which was wide right at the end of the half.


Edinboro had its share of opportunities in the first half, as well. The Scots drove to the ESU three on their first possession, but Justin Bouch's pass was intercepted in the end zone. The second drive resulted in a lost fumble at the ESU three. All told, East Stroudsburg rolled up 268 yards in the first half compared to 159 for Edinboro, and ran off 42 plays to 18.

East Stroudsburg boosted its lead to 10-0 on its first series of the third quarter, taking advantage of a failed 4th-and-2 fake punt and taking over at the EUP 41. Anthony Carfagno scored six plays later on a one-yard run.

Edinboro scored its lone points of the game on its next possession, marching 76 yards in just five plays. Andre Burke scored his first career touchdown on a five-yard run. The drive was highlighted by Bouch pass completions of 46 yards to Ryan Valasek and 25 vards to Jeff Dinger.

In what likely was the key series of the game, East Stroudsburg answered on the very next series. Facing a 3rd-and-18 at the ESU 49, Terwilliger found Strenfel deep down the middle for a 51-yard scoring play and a 17-7 lead.

The Warriors tacked on a 28-yard field goal by Bruabaker with 9:19 left in the game. The score came after Edinboro failed to convert on a 4th-and-2 play from the ESU 41. Edinboro was 0-for-3 on fourth down conversions and just 1 of 8 on third downs. East Stroudsburg, meanwhile, converted 8 of 15 third downs and



1 of 2 fourth downs. East Stroudsburg finished the afternoon with 465 total yards compared to 314 yards for the Scots. Terwilliger fell just short of his career high of 380 yards passing, completing 25 of 38 passes for 371 yards. Strenfel set career highs with 10 receptions for 173 yards, while Evan Prall added 8 catches for a career-high 114 yards. Bouch completed 17 of 29 passes for 230

yards, but was guilty of a pair of interceptions. Justin Lipscomb had 5 catches for 77 yards, while Dinger matched his career total with 4 receptions for 44 yards. Burke had 78 yards rushing on 13 carries, but the Scots gained just 84 yards on the ground. Fragale recorded a career-high 13 tackles to lead the defensive effort.

Edinboro 54, WVU Tech 12 September 11, 2004

Sox Harrison Stadium

Edinboro, PA -- Edinboro scored a schoolrecord 47 points in the first half on its way to a 54-12 win over WVU Tech. The previous record of 42 first half points was set against Shippensburg in 1971.

The Fighting Scots scored on six of their

eight possessions in the first half while jumping to a 47-0 lead. The statistics were as lopsided as the score, with Edinboro totaling 328 vards and WVU Tech 27. The Golden Bears had minus 18 yards rushing in the first thirty minutes, and for the game finished with minus 7 yards. That was the eighth-lowest figure ever by an Edinboro opponent. Edinboro ended the day with 454 total yards, including 261 on the ground, while the Golden Bears totaled 239 yards.

Andre Burke led the way for Edinboro with 173 yards on 22 carries, with 4 TDs, one shy of the school record. Justin Bouch completed 10 of 13 passes for 171 yards and a score. Justin Lipscomb caught 4 passes for 90 yards.

Edinboro took the opening kickoff and drove 70 yards on six plays, all but one on the ground. Matt Phillips pounded in from six yards out for the score. After a three and out for WVU Tech, Burke scored his first touchdown on a five-vard run with 7:12 left in the first quarter. That capped an 8-play, 58-yard drive, with every play on the ground and Burke accounting for 52 of those yards.

The Fighting Scots made it 21-0 in the first auarter when Chris Avery blocked Tyler Armstrong's punt and took it for a touchdown. Avery blocked the punt and picked it off Armstrong's foot at the WVUT 5 and taking it in for six points.

The Scots tacked on four scores in the second quarter, although a bad snap led to one failed run on an extra point, and one PAT try was no good. Burke accounted for the first two on runs of seven and three yards. The first score came after the Scots stopped WVU Tech on a fourth-and-one play at the EU 46. The second touchdown was a quick two-play, 48-yard drive which featured a 45-yard hookup from Bouch to Lipscomb. That made the score 34-0 with 7:01 left in the second quarter.



Chris Amico helped the Edinboro defense hold WVU Tech to minus 7 yards rushing.

Edinboro was back in business on its next possession, taking over at the WVUT 33 following a punt. Bouch did the honors on a one-yard plunge with 2:42 remaining. The final score of the half came with just 11 seconds left when Bouch found Lipscomb down the middle for a 30-yard touchdown.

WVU Tech took the second half kickoff and drove 71 yards on six plays, with Chris Siegel hitting Chris Lawson for an 18-yard TD pass. The Scots answered with an 8-play, 72yard march. Burke bounced around left end for the final 17 yards and his fourth score of the day. He carried six times for 58 yards on the drive.

The Golden Bears posted the lone score of the fourth quarter on a 13-yard pass from Siegel to James Boyd. Tim Hyde blocked the extra point.

Tiffin, OH -- The Andre Burke Show hit the road, and it took Tiffin less than a half to see more than enough of Edinboro's junior tailback. Burke gained 159 yards on 21 carries and scored on touchdown runs of 2 and 20 yards to key Edinboro to a 48-21 win at Tiffin.

Edinboro's first road game looked vaguely similar to its last home game. A week ago the Fighting Scots bolted to a 47-0 halftime against WVU Tech. While only running out to a 38-0 halftime advantage against the Dragons, Edinboro tied a school record with 28 second quarter points.

Edinboro's first possession resulted in a three-and-out series, but the Fighting Scots would score on seven of their next eight possessions. Burke got it started with a two-yard run, capping an 11-play, 47-vard drive in which he carried seven times.

Tiffin quarterback Ryan Harpold, who had not thrown an interception in his first three games, threw the first of six interceptions on the next series, with Chris Avery doing the honors. Kody Robertson would come in and kick a 37-yard field goal.

Tiffin drove down to the Edinboro 20 early in the second quarter, but on a 4th-andinches play Harpold fell short on the sneak and Edinboro took over. Burke burst 36 yards on the next play, and four plays later scored on a 20-yard run. The 5-play, 80-yard march featured Burke carrying four times for 66 yards, and he went over 100 yards on the touchdown run.

For the second straight week Edinboro blocked a punt and returned it for a touchdown, as Ben Stroup blocked the Tiffin punt and returned it six yards for six points.

Another Harpold interception set up Edinboro's fourth touchdown. Avery registered his second pickoff of the day and returned it 12 yards to the TU 48. After a 44yard run by Burke, Justin Bouch found Nate Eimer for a 4-yard touchdown pass to cap the brief two-play scoring drive and give Edinboro a 31-0 lead with 3:26 left in the second quarter. It would also signal the end of Burke's day.

Harpold threw his third interception of the first half, with Jim Soltis doing the honors at the EU 29. Bouch directed a 71-yard march culminated by a 10-yard pass to Jeff Dinger with 43 seconds left in the half. It was Dinger's first career touchdown pass.

Edinboro took the second half kickoff and drove 73 yards on eight plays to make it 45-0. Matt Phillips scored on a 6-yard run. The margin went to 48-0 on the next series on Robertson's 20-yard field goal.

2004 in Review

The Dragons would score three times against the Fighting Scot reserves in the fourth quarter to make the score respectable, but it hardly masked Edinboro's dominance in the contest. The Fighting Scots rolled up 421 vards compared to 359 for Tiffin. Edinboro had 194 yards rushing and 227 yards passing, as Bouch completed 14 of 21 passes for 223 with 2 TDs and an INT. Justin Lipscomb led the receivers with 5 catches for 86 yards. Tiffin, meanwhile, managed just 48 yards on 22 rushes against an Edinboro defense which entered the game giving up just 43.5 yards on the ground.

Game 4

Shippensburg 17, Edinboro 10 September 25, 2004 Seth Grove Stadium

Shippensburg, PA -- Something had to give when one of the best ground games in Division II met one of the best rushing defense in Division II. Unfortunately for Edinboro, the offense got the better of the defense at Shippensburg, as the tenth-ranked Red Raiders celebrated Homecoming and the opening of PSAC West action with a 17-10 win over the Fighting Scots.

Shippensburg entered the game ranked seventh in Division II in rushing offense at 277.8 yards per game, while Edinboro came in fourth in rushing defense, giving up just 135 yards in three games, or 45.0 ypg. The Red Raiders ended the afternoon with 262 yards on 52 carries, with All-American fullback John Kuhn leading the way with 123 yards on 32 rushes. In actuality, the Fighting Scot defense held its won with the Red Raider ground game much of the game, but the Wing T attack broke off ten runs of 10 yards-or-more.

Edinboro's inability to sustain its own ground game and a slew of penalties, plus three turnovers, played as large a role in the defeat at Shippensburg's ability to run the ball. The Fighting Scots managed just 97 yards rushing on 27 carries against a Red Raider defense ranked 13th in the country against the rush. Overall Shippensburg's defense was ranked 12th in total defense, and gave up just 275 total yards to the Fighting Scots. Shippensburg finished the day with 382 total vards.

The Fighting Scots led the PSAC in fewest penalties a year ago, and had committed just 13 for 110 yards through three games. But Edinboro was whistled for 13 penalties for 101 yards, many either giving Ship 1st-and-5 situations or keeping drives alive.

Following a scoreless first quarter Edinboro took a 3-0 lead on Kody Robertson's 20-yard field goal with 8:45 left in the second quarter. The score was set up by a 57-yard pass from Justin Bouch to Justin Lipscomb.

Shippensburg took the ensuing kickoff and drove 66 yards on just five plays, with a pair of Tony Gomez pass completions highlighting the march. On a 3rd-and-7 play he found Tim Devanney for 31 yards to the EU 32. One play later Gomez hooked up with a steaking Patrick Ferguson in the end zone for a 32-yard TD pass and a 7-3 lead.

It appeared the score would remain that

way heading into the half, but Edinboro's Matt Phillips fumbled at the EU 29 while struggling for extra yardage, with Ship recovering with 1:51 left in the half. The Edinboro defense held the Red Raiders to a 30-yard field goal by Iamie Reder.

Shippensburg took the second half kick-

off and increased the lead to 17-3 thanks to a six-play, 71-yard march. A 14-yard run by Ferguson, with a 15-yard facemask penalty added on, on a 3rd-and-4 play kept the drive alive, and three plays later Gomez threw his second touchdown pass, a 17-yarder to Andre McLaurin.

Holding a 17-3 lead with four minutes to play and the ball in Edinboro territory, Shippensburg looked ready to put the game away. But Tim Hyde sacked Gomez and forced a fumble, which Seth Fragale recovered at the Ship 47. Four plays later Bouch found Ryan Valasek behind the Ship secondary for a 32-yard touchdown pass. The ensuing onside kick was recovered by Shippensburg and the Red Raiders proceeded to run out the clock.

Bouch completed 14 of 27 passes for 178 yards with a touchdown, but was guilty of two interceptions. Lipscomb had 5 receptions for 73 yards, with Valasek adding 4 catches for 67 yards. Andre Burke paced the ground game with 67 vards on 19 carries.

Hyde led the defensive effort with 9 tackles, three for losses.

Game 5 Edinboro 21, **Clarion 10** October 2, 2004 Memorial Stadium

Clarion, PA -- At 5'10", 205 lb. Andre Burke hardly has the appearance of a workhorse back. Don't tell that to Clarion, however, as Edinboro gave the Golden Eagles a heavy dose of Burke in the second half, plus showcased a stingy defense to ruin Clarion's Homecoming with a 21-10 victory.

Burke would finish the afternoon with 40 carries for 173 vards with all three Edinboro touchdowns. The junior tailback scored on runs of 1, 21 and 1 yards. The 40 carries tied for the second-most in school history, eclipsed only by Gerald Thompson's 42 carries against Bloomsburg in 1998. It marked Burke's third 100-yard game of the season.

Edinboro trailed 3-0 at the half, and was very fortunate the margin was that small as it turned the ball over three times in the first half. The turnovers resulted in Clarion having excellent field position in the first half, starting five of their six drives inside Edinboro territory. The Fighting Scot defense was up to the challenge, limiting the Golden Eagles to a 29yard field goal by Kyle Snoke with 8:38 left in the first quarter.

The defense came up with the key stop early in the second quarter after Clarion's Matt Morris returned an interception 40 vards to the Edinboro 21. The Golden Eagles moved

the ball to the Edinboro one with third-andgoal. Marcus Lowe was stopped inches short by Seth Fragale and Chris Amico. On fourth down Brandon Dando fumbled the snap and Edinboro took over with the ball just inches shy of the goal line.

Head coach Lou Tepper turned to Burke in the second half. Neither team had mounted much offense in the first half, with Edinboro showing 100 total yards and Clarion 74. Burke himself accounted for an amazing 29 carries for 129 yards in the second half.

Edinboro took the lead with just 26 seconds left in the third guarter as Burke capped a 9-play, 44-yard drive with a one-yard blast up the middle. The drive was kept alive when Justin Bouch hit Justin Lipscomb for an 18yard gain down to the Clarion 10 on a 3rdand-11 play.

After a three-and-out by Clarion, the Fighting Scots boosted the margin to 14-3 on Burke's 21-yard scoring run with 12:02 to play. The drive covered 46 yards on 6 plays. Burke carried on all but one play, gaining 29 yards.

It took Clarion just three plays to pull within four points once again, as Pierre Odom beat the Edinboro secondary for a 48-yard scoring pass from Dando with 11:02 to play.

Edinboro scored an insurance touchdown with 2:13 remaining, putting together its best scoring drive of the game. The Fighting Scots went 11 plays for 69 yards, with Burke carrying eight times for 33 yards and catching a pass for 28 yards. He carried on six of the final seven plays, going in off right tackle from a yard out for the touchdown.

Edinboro ended the day with 340 yards while holding Clarion to 169 total yards, 65 of those on the lone touchdown march. Thanks to Burke, the Scots finished with 197 yards rushing. The Golden Eagles, meanwhile, were held to just 40 yards on the ground. Bouch completed 12 of 21 passes for 143 yards but threw a pair of interceptions. Lipscomb caught 4 passes for 29 yards, extending his streak to 27 straight games with at least one catch.

Fragale paced the defensive effort with a career-high tying 13 tackles, including three for losses, a sack, and a pass broken up. Sophomore Jim Soltis and redshirt freshman Tom Davidson had interceptions.

Game 6 Edinboro 42, California(Pa.) 28 October 9, 2004

Sox Harrison Stadium

Edinboro, PA -- Like a pair of heavyweight champions Edinboro and California(Pa.) traded havmakers, but when the final round ended the Fighting Scots celebrated Homecoming with a 42-28 win over the 25thranked Vulcans in front of 6,219 fans. The win boosted Edinboro, ranked eighth in the Northeast Region, to 4-2 and 2-1 in PSAC West action.

The difference in this bout was Edinboro landing more body blows, pounding a Vulcan defense that was giving up just 97.4 ypg. rushing for 238 yards on the ground. Andre Burke accounted for 203 yards on 27 carries, and scored three touchdowns. In addition, the Edinboro offense did not commit a turnover, while California(Pa.) was guilty of four turnovers, including three interceptions.

While both teams came in with impressive defensive numbers, it was the offenses that ruled the day. The two teams combined for 905 total yards, with Cal finishing with 460 vards and Edinboro 445. The Edinboro defense could claim a victory of sorts, holding the Vulcans to a season-low point total. Cal came in ranked first in the PSAC and eighth in Division II in scoring (41.2 ppg.)

Edinboro shocked the Vulcans on the second-play of the game as Justin Bouch and Ryan Valasek combined on a 60-yard scoring play. Bouch would end the day throwing for three touchdowns while completing 10 of 20 passes for 207 yards.

The Vulcans answered with an 11-play, 74-vard drive, with Matt Humbert completing a 42-yard scoring pass to Claude Whitaker.

2004 in Review

That marked the first touchdown allowed by Edinboro in the first quarter this season.

The Scots went ahead 14-7 late in the first quarter as Bouch completed his second TD pass of the afternoon, this one a 21-yarder to Justin Lipscomb on a six-play, 82-yard march.

The Vulcans knotted the score at 14-14 on Whitaker's second TD reception, a 20-yarder from Dustin Strayer. The Fighting Scots answered with a score of their own, knocking down the Vulcans with another six-play drive, this one covering 72 yards. Burke carried the ball five straight times, including a 51-yarder to the Cal 10, before Bouch hooked up with Nate Eimer for a 5-vard TD pass.

Cal tied the game on the opening possession of the second half as Antoine Bagwell, the second-leading rusher in Division II at 194.0 ypg. Bagwell scored the touchdown on a onevard plunge.

Back came Edinboro with an 80-yard drive. Bouch hit Aaron Fetty with a 48-yard pass to the Cal 6, and three plays later Burke bulled in from two yards out to take the lead for good. The Scots were back in business four plays later as Tom Davidson intercepted his second pass of the day and returned it 18 yards to the Cal 40. Burke accounted for the rest of the yardage, bursting in from 23 yards out for a 35-21 lead.

The Vulcans refused to be knocked out, however, putting together an impressive 12play, 96-yard drive culminated by Whitaker's 18-vard catch and run from Straver to close the margin to 35-28. Jim Soltis would later come up with his fourth interception of the year to quell any Cal comeback hopes, as Edinboro took over at the Cal 18. Edinboro scored the decisive punch this time, a Burke run on the very next play for the final margin.

Game 7 Edinboro 38, Indiana(Pa.) 14

October 16, 2004 Sox Harrison Stadium

Edinboro, PA -- Edinboro employed a bruising ground game to claim a key PSAC West victory over Indiana(Pa.), 38-14. The victory boosted the Fighting Scots to 5-2 overall and 3-1 in the PSAC West. Edinboro, winners of three in a row, came into the game ranked seventh in the Northeast Region while IUP was sixth.

A strong wind going from one end of the field to the other figured to play a huge role in the game, but Edinboro scored 24 points going into the wind while IUP managed just a touchdown. The fact the Fighting Scots were able to run the ball effectively negated the wind, as Edinboro ran for 278 yards. That set up a huge time of possession advantage, with Edinboro holding the ball for 36:05 compared to IUP's 23:55.

The game featured plenty of firsts for Edinboro, as it was the first back-to-back wins over the Indians since 1978-79-80, and the first win at Sox Harrison Stadium over IUP since 1995, snapping a four-game losing streak. In addition, Andre Burke continued his outstanding season with 219 yards on 36 carries. The junior tailback became the first runner in Edinboro history to rush for 200 yards in backto-back games. That pushed his season total to 1,072 yards, already the 12th-highest season total. The 219 yards is tied for the 12th-highest single-game total, and was the fourth-highest total ever against IUP. The game hardly looked like a runaway

when IUP took the opening kickoff and drove 73 yards on 11 plays for a touchdown - into the

wind. The score came on a 16-yard pass from Kevin Weidl to Pat Liebert, the fourth time the two hooked up in the drive. Edinboro answered with a drive of its own, going 62 yards on just six plays thanks to Burke. He carried four times for 52 yards, with the final carry a 28-yard run up the middle for his 14th touchdown of the season.

A short punt into the wind set up Edinboro's next score, giving the Scots the lead for good. The punt traveled just seven vards, and IUP was called for a personal foul, as well, moving the ball to the IUP 27. Justin Bouch hooked up with Justin Lipscomb for an 18yard touchdown and a 14-7 lead.

Edinboro went up 21-7 in the second quarter when Matt Phillips bulled in from a vard out for the first of his two touchdowns. The score came after Weidl completed a pass to Joe Slappy at the IUP 47. Tom Davidson knocked the ball loose, with Tim Hyde picking it up and returning it 23 yards to the IUP 21.

IUP got a break thanks to an Edinboro fumble at the Fighting Scot 33 late in the second quarter. On the very next play Weidl found Slappy open down the middle for a 33yard touchdown to cut the margin to 21-14 with 2:25 left in the half. Edinboro again answered with an impressive 11-play, 57-yard drive as Bouch completed 6 of 8 passes and converted a key fourth down in the final seconds. He hit Aaron Fetty with a 14-yard pass to the IUP 3 with eight seconds remaining, then found Lipscomb in the left corner of the end zone for a three-yard touchdown with one second showing.



Seth Fragale led the Fighting Scots with 12 tackles vs. Indiana(Pa.), with the Edinboro defense holding the Indians to one first down rushing.

IUP had the wind in the third quarter, but the Edinboro defense held the Indians without a first down in the quarter. The offense, meanwhile, tacked on ten points to boost the lead to 38-14. Kody Robertson kicked a 24-yard field goal for the first score.

On the very next play from scrimmage Weidl's pass was tipped by Brandon Banas and intercepted by Seth Fragale at the IUP 42. Bouch completed passes of 20 and 24 yards to Jeff Dinger, the second carrying down to the IUP1. On the next play Phillips scored his second touchdown.

Edinboro finished the day with 419 yards in total offense, while IUP had 306. The Indians were held to 58 yards rushing by an Edinboro defense which entered the game ranked second in the PSAC and 17th nationally in rushing defense at 93.3 ypg. Phillips complemented Burke with 48 yards on 12 carries and the two touchdowns. Bouch, meanwhile, was 14 of 22 for 141 yards with the 2 TDs and an interception. Lipscomb caught 4 passes for 40, making it 29 straight games with at least one reception. He moved into fifth place in career receptions with 92.

The defense was paced by Fragale, who totaled 12 tackles, a sack and the interception. Elliott Page and Davidson also had interceptions.

Edinboro, PA -- The running of Andre Burke and the passing of Justin Bouch proved too much for Slippery Rock as Edinboro spoiled another Homecoming with a 38-26 win. The Fighting Scots won their fourth straight game to improve to 6-2 on the season and 4-1 in PSAC West action. Edinboro entered the contest ranked fifth in the Northeast Region.

A week ago Burke became the first Edinboro back to rush for 200 yards in backto-back games with 219 yards against Indiana(Pa.) and 203 vards vs. California(Pa.). The junior tailback bettered that by a vard, ending the afternoon with a season-high 220 yards on 23 carries, his sixth 100-yard game. That included a 60-yard run for a touchdown in the third quarter to give Edinboro a 33-13 lead.

Bouch, meanwhile, threw three touchdown passes for the second time in the last three weeks and has now thrown eight touchdown passes in the last three weeks. The junior completed 16 of 28 passes for 170 yards.

Edinboro took the opening kickoff and drove 67 yards on 10 plays, with Bouch finding Nate Eimer for an 18-yard touchdown pass on a 3rd-and-10 play. The score remained 7-0 at the end of the first quarter, as Edinboro has now allowed just two touchdowns all season in the opening period.

While struggling at times defensively, the defense came up with a big play on the first play of the second quarter. Chris Avery had the first of his two interceptions, this one in the end zone to halt an SRU drive. The Fighting Scots proceeded to put together a 10-play, 80yard drive, with Bouch finding Justin Lipscomb for a three yard score. Lipscomb ended the day with 5 catches for 51 yards.

Slippery Rock narrowed the margin to 14-7 with 5:57 left in the second quarter when former Fighting Scot Brandon Richardson hauled in a 28-yard TD pass from Nate Crookshank. Edinboro immediately answered the score with a 31-yard field goal by Kody Robertson, his first of three on the day.


The second quarter scoring wasn't finished, as both teams put up points in the final 70 seconds. Josh Kniess returned a punt 59 yards for a touchdown for The Rock with 1:06 left. It was the first punt return against Edinboro for a score since 1999.

The Scots came right back to boost the lead to 20-13 at intermission on a 20-yard field goal by Robertson. The impressive twominute drive covered 11 plays and 60 yards in just 57 seconds. Burke's burst for 28 yards on the first play moved the Scots to the SRU 38, and Bouch connected on a pair of third down passes for first downs.

The Edinboro defense came up with another big play on the first series of the third quarter, with Elliott Page intercepting a Crookshank pass at the SRU 46. The Scots had to overcome a pair of penalties in a six-play, 46-yard drive. Bouch's 14-yard completion to Ryan Valasek on 3rd-and-7 kept the drive alive, and Burke's 31-yard run brought the ball down to the 18, despite a holding penalty at the end of the run. On the next play Bouch tossed his third touchdown, this one to a wide open Ed Brown for an 18-yard touchdown.

Slippery Rock turned the ball over on its next possession, as well. Page recovered a fumble at the EU 31 after Jim Soltis knocked the ball out of Richardson's hands at the conclusion of a 33-yard play. After a nine-yard run by Burke, he burst 60 yards for his longest run of the year and his 15th touchdown.

The Rock came back later in the quarter with an impressive 14-play, 57-yard drive, with Crookshank scoring on a 6-yard run. Ryan Daniels' extra point attempt was blocked by Tim Hyde, with Avery picking it up and going 89 yards for a defensive extra point, making the lead 35-19. It was the first defen-

sive PAT by Edinboro since 2000 against Lock Haven.

Robertson tacked on a 37-yard field goal on the next series. Slippery Rock scored with 13 seconds left as a blown coverage left Nick Carimi wide open for a 27-yard pass from A.J. Ruperto.

Edinboro ended the day with 450 yards in total offense, including a season-high 280 vards rushing. In addition to Burke's 220 yards, Phillips ran for 61 yards on nine carries.

Slippery Rock became just the third team to rush for over 100 yards against Edinboro this year. The Scots entered the game ranked 14th in Division II in rushing defense at 88.3 ypg., but The Rock gained 160 yards on the ground. In all Slippery Rock finished with 365 vards. However, The Rock was guilty of four turnovers while Edinboro did not give up the ball once. Edinboro won at Slippery Rock for the first time since 1995, snapping a four-game losing streak, and scored its most points against The Rock since 1995.

A 26-yard punt return by Lincoln Bufalino set up the next score, as Robertson was true from 29 yards out midway through the second quarter. The half ended with Edinboro trailing 14-13, the first time the Scots have trailed at the half since the Shippensburg game in week four. Edinboro controlled play in the second half, holding the ball for over 20 minutes, yet scored just twice. It took the opening kickoff

and marched to the Kutztown 17, but committed its only turnover of the day, losing a fumble. Kutztown would only have the ball for ten plays in the period. After recovering the fumble, the Golden Bears moved to the Edinboro 30, but Copeland threw his third interception of the day, with Tom Davidson recording the first of his two interceptions, this one in the end zone.

Game 9 Edinboro 23, **Kutztown 14** October 30, 2004 University Field

Kutztown, PA -- You can pardon Edinboro head coach Lou Tepper if he says he's had enough of Homecoming games. The Fighting Scots played in their fifth Homecoming game of the season, coming away with a hardfought 23-14 win at Kutztown, scoring the final 16 points. The victory improved Edinboro's record to 4-1 in Homecoming contests. More importantly, the Fighting Scots, ranked sixth in the Northeast Region, improved to 7-2 overall.

Kutztown jumped out to a 7-0 lead just three plays into the game when Jeremy Wesley took a short bubble screen pass from Jeremy Copeland and turned it into a 57-yard touchdown. Edinboro had a three-and-out series, but the third play of Kutztown's next drive was key for Edinboro. Chris Avery picked off a Copeland pass and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown, tying the score at 7-7 less than three minutes into the game.

The tie lasted for 14 seconds, as James Brooks took the ensuing kickoff and returned it 93 yards for a touchdown and a 14-7 lead. It marked the first kickoff return for a touchdown against the Fighting Scots since 2001.

Edinboro's next three scores were courtesy of Kody Robertson, who booted field goals of 23, 29 and 25 yards. The first came with 2:46 left in the first quarter, concluding an eight-play, 65-yard drive.

The Fighting Scots put together a long drive that used up 7 minutes and 17 seconds, covering 15 plays and 73 yards, but had to settle for Robertson's 25-yard field goal with 44 seconds left in the third quarter. That gave Edinboro its first lead of the game at 16-14.

The Golden Bears drove into Edinboro territory early in the fourth quarter, reaching the 30 before a sack by Brandon Banas forced Kutztown to punt. Edinboro answered with another long drive, and this time the Scots didn't settle for three points. Going 80 yards in 11 plays, Andre Burke scored his 16th touchdown of the season on a two-yard run to give the Scots a 23-14 lead with 4:22 remaining. The drive took 6 minutes and 19 seconds, with Burke carring five times for 36 yards. Bouch again came up with a pair of big third down completions, both to Ryan Valasek. The first covered 35 yards on a 3rd-and-3 play, and the second was a nine-yarder on 3rd-and-8, going down to the KU 11. Edinboro scored three plays later.

Burke fell short of his fourth consecutive 200-yard effort, but still finished with 159 yards on 33 carries. Edinboro finished the day with 210 yards rushing and 401 yards in total offense. Phillips added 52 yards on 12 carries. Bouch completed 16 of 26 passes for 191 yards, moving into second place in career completions (384) and fourth place in career attempts (634). Valasek hauled in 3 passes for 69 yards. with Lipscomb adding 3 for 39 yards. He has now caught at least one pass in 31 straight games. Ed Brown also had 3 receptions for 28 vards.

The defense turned in a strong effort after giving up the long pass early, with that representing one quarter of Kutztown's 232 yards. The Golden Bears were limited to 50 yards rushing, the sixth team to fail to rush for 100 yards. A.J. Cousins led the way with a careerhigh 9 tackles. Edinboro entered the game ranked fifth in the country in turnover margin, and added to that with four interceptions. The Scots now have 26 interceptions for the season, tying the school record set in 1971.

Game 10 Edinboro 38, Lock Haven 17 November 6, 2004 Sox Harrison Stadium

Edinboro, PA -- For the second year in a row Edinboro finished the regular season with a six-game winning streak following a 38-17 win over Lock Haven.

More importantly, the win guaranteed a second straight NCAA playoff bid. The victory boosted Edinboro's record to 8-2 overall and 5-1 in the PSAC West, with the Fighting Scots finishing in a three-way tie with Shippensburg and Indiana(Pa.) for the PSAC West championship. It marked the first time Edinboro had won back-to-back PSAC titles. The Fighting Scots entered the game ranked 24th in the AFCA Division II poll.

Edinboro jumped out to a 14-0 lead after one quarter, but a game Lock Haven team never allowed the Fighting Scots to pull away. After a three-and-out series for Lock Haven to start the game, Edinboro reached paydirt just six plays later Justin Bouch found Justin Lipscomb for a four-yard touchdown pass on third and goal. Kody Robertson booted the first of five extra points.

The Fighting Scots scored on their second possession, as well, marching 63 yards on 10 plays. Bouch was a perfect 4-for-4 on the drive for 53 yards, with Andre Burke pounding in from two yards out for his 17th touchdown. Burke ended the afternoon with his eighth 100-vard day with 136 vards on 24 carries.

A short 21-yard punt into a stiff wind gave Lock Haven the ball at the Edinboro 29 early in the second quarter, and the Bald Eagles took advantage with a three-yard run by Rob Kristiniak to close the gap to 14-7. The Scots were knocking on the door once again as Ryan Valasek returned the ensuing kickoff 53 yards to the LHU 36. After three Burke runs, Bouch threw a seven-yard scoring pass to Lipscomb with 6:42 left in the half.

Edinboro had two more opportunities to score before intermission but failed both EU 3 3:18 Matt Phillips 1 yd. run

imes. The Fighting Scots marched from their
own 24 to the LHU 26 but lost the ball on a
umble. Lock Haven returned the favor three
plays later, with Dave Jazenski falling in a
potched snap at the LHU 27 with 1:04 in the
half. A 21-yard pass from Bouch to Nate
Eimer moved the ball to the LHU 6, but three
straight incompletions left the Scots facing
ourth down. Robertson's 23-yard field goal
attempt was wide left, snapping a streak of six
straight successful three-pointers.

The second half featured four straight series with scores by the two teams. Lock Haven made it 21-10 on Danny Hagerman's 45-yard field goal . Edinboro boosted the margin to 28-10 with a time-consuming drive on the ensuing series. With Burke and Matt Phillips taking turns carrying the ball, the Scots marched 75 yards on 14 plays, chewing up 7 minutes and 23 seconds. Phillips capped the drive with a one-yard plunge.

The Bald Eagles put together their best drive of the day on the next series, going 60 yards in 11 plays. Kristiniak scored his second touchdown of the day on a four-yard run.

The fourth straight series with a score ended with Edinboro boosting the lead back up to 38-17 with an 8-play, 65-yard march, featuring the bullish runs of 251 lb. fullback Phillips. He finished the march with a 10-yard run with 11:00 remaining.

The Fighting Scots tacked on a 22-yard field by Robertson with 2:51 to play.

Edinboro finished the afternoon with 456 total yards, including 261 yards on the ground, the fifth straight game with at least 200 yards rushing. In addition to Burke, Phillips ran for a season-high 74 yards on 10 carries. Bouch completed 14 of 23 passes for 194 yards with 2 TDs and an INT. Lipscomb caught a career-high 8 passes for 93 yards, moving into fifth place in career yards receiving with 1,824 yards.

Lock Haven ended the day with 269 total yards, but did become just the fourth team to rush for 100 yards with 113 yards. Edinboro entered the game ranked tenth in Division II in rushing defense.

Tim Hyde led the Edinboro defense with 8 tackles and an interception. The pickoff broke the school record for interceptions in a season. Edinboro's 27th interception broke the record of 26 set in 1971.

Game 11 Edinboro 47, **Bentley 44** NCAA Division II Northeast

Region Playoff Game November 13, 2004 **Bentley** Field

Waltham, MA - With a final score reading "Edinboro 47, Bentley 44", it might seem hard to believe that it was the Fighting Scot defense that spelled the difference in Edinboro's first NCAA Division II playoff win since 1990. After playing on its heels much of the afternoon while trying to figure out an answer for Bentley's record-breaking tandem of Marc Eddy and Dallas Mall, the defense forced two turnovers in the final quarter and staged a defensive stand in the final two minutes.

Edinboro, ranked sixth in the Northeast Region and 21st nationally, improved to 9-2 while posting its seventh straight win. 20thranked Bentley saw its six-game winning streak snapped while ending the year at 8-2.

Almost five inches of snow fell overnight, but the offenses came out red-hot. The two teams combined for 68 first half points and 713 total yards in a wild first half that ended as it began, in a stalemate at 34-34. In the first half alone Eddy, Bentley's senior quarterback and one of two Harlon Hill Trophy finalists playing in the game, threw for 383 yards and 3 TDs. That represented the fourth-highest total by an Edinboro opponent - IN JUST A HALF!

Eddy would go on to throw for a Division II Playoff record 504 vards, the highest total ever against Edinboro, competing 33 of 48 passes. But he was harassed constantly in the second half by an Edinboro pass rush that recorded 6 sacks. Bentley would finish with 575 total yards, but the Falcons' high octane attack was limited to 140 total yards in the second half after gaining 435 yards at intermission.

Edinboro signalcaller Justin Bouch was brilliant in his own right, accounting for five touchdowns. The junior completed 19 of 43 passes for 304 yards with 4 TDs, adding 51 vards and a touchdown on 10 rushes. Bouch hooked up with Nate Eimer for a 23-yard touchdown pass with 5:26 remaining for the winning score, but Kody Robertson's extra point was wide right, just his third miss of the season. The score came one play after Edinboro converted a 3rd-and-10 play thanks to a brilliant catch by Justin Lipscomb for 32 yards down to the Bentley 23.

Leading 47-44, Edinboro had to hold off two more Falcon possessions. The first series ended with a fumble caused by Seth Fragale, with Jim Soltis recovering at the Edinboro 45. Following an Edinboro punt, Bentley took over with 2:09 remaining at its own 34. The Falcons moved to the Edinboro 36 with 1:48 left following Eddy's 33rd completion. It would be the last completion for Eddy, however. Following an incomplete pass and a run for four yards, Eddy was sacked for a loss of a yard by Greg MacAnn on third down. On 4thand-7, Eddy dropped back to pass but was hit by a blitzing Brandon Banas and his pass was not close to a Falcon receiver.

Bentley took its first lead of the game following one of Bouch's few mistakes on the afternoon. On the first play of the second half, Bouch threw an interception that was returned 42 yards for a touchdown by Anthony Seaforth. The extra point gave Bentley a 41-34 lead just 12 seconds into the third quarter. Edinboro answered with the lone sustained drive of the day, going 65 yards in 13 plays. Matt Phillips capped the march with a two-yard plunge for the tying score. The Fighting Scots converted three times on third down in the drive.

Edinboro forced a Bentley punt on the next series, but Lipscomb was unable to catch the ball in the swirling winds and the Falcons recovered at the Edinboro 15. Enzo Tirino kicked a 33-yard field goal with 4:01 left in the third quarter, but it would be their last points of the day.

The first half featured both teams going up and down the field to the tune of 68 points and 713 yards. The first quarter ended with Edinboro leading 14-7. The second quarter saw Bentley outscore the Fighting Scots, 27-20, with the two teams combining for seven touchdowns in eight possession at one point.

Edinboro posted the first score of the afternoon after Tom Davidson came up with his eighth interception of the season on the third play of the game. The redshirt freshman returned the pickoff 27 yards to the Bentley 14. The Scots scored three plays later on Bouch's

one-vard run.

Eddy shook off the interception to lead the Falcons to a score just two plays later. After a 35-yard pass completion, Eddy found Mall for his 76th career touchdown reception, a brilliant 32-yard throw-and-catch. The game was less than three minutes old and already there were 14 points on the scoreboard.

The teams exchanged punts, with Edinboro taking over at its own 43 after a 16vard punt into the wind. Four plays later Andre Burke burst off left tackle, bounced to the left sideline and went 41 yards for his 18th touchdown run of the year with 6:53 left in the first quarter.

The Scots used another Bentley turnover, one of four on the day, to take a 20-7 lead. Soltis came up with the first of his two fumble recoveries at the Falcon 20. Kody Robertson followed with a 20-yard field goal. The Falcons were called for illegally leaping over the line in an attempt to block the field goal, and head coach Lou Tepper took the points off the board and went for six. On second-andgoal, freshman tight end Kyle Witucki pulled in his first career touchdown pass, a onevarder from Bouch. The Scots failed to convert the extra point due to a fumbled snap.

That score, at the 14:07 mark of the second quarter, set up a string of seven touchdowns in the next 13 minutes. J.J. Sullivan scored on a three-yard run to close the lead to 20-14. It took Edinboro just four plays to counter that score. The final 39 yards were courtesy of a Bouch pass to Lipscomb, extending the junior's streak of consecutive games with at least one catch to 33. Bentley responded with the second of three Eddy to Mall touchdown hookups, this one covering 33 yards and breaking the Division II record for career TD catches. The extra point left Edinboro ahead 27-21.

Back came the Scots, but Burke's fumble at the Bentley three was recovered by Bentley and returned to the 20. Instead of going up by 13 points, Edinboro found the score tied less than two minutes later when the Eddy to Mall connection struck for its third touchdown of the first half, this one from 20 yards out. Bentley failed to convert the extra point, and the score was tied at 27-27.

Going from the shotgun, Bouch threw his third touchdown of the half, as Ryan Valasek beat the Bentley secondary for a 36-yard touchdown. Bentley tied the score at 34-all with 1:03 remaining as Eddy scored on a 9yard run out to cap a 7-play, 75-yard drive.

Bentley's 575 total yards represented the fifth-highest total ever against Edinboro. Edinboro added 475 total yards as the two teams combined for 1,050 yards. The Scots ran for 171 yards in addition to passing for 304 yards. Bentley managed just 71 yards on the ground, the seventh time the Scots held an opponent under 100 yards rushing.

Burke paced the ground game with 88 yards on 16 carries, snapping a string of six straight 100-yard games. In the process the junior tailback moved into second place in season rushing at 1,675 yards.

Bouch's 355 total yards fell just three yards shy of the single game record for total offense. Lipscomb caught 4 passes for 108 yards. He tied the school record for catches in a season (50).

Soltis sparked the defensive effort with 8 tackles and a pair of fumble recoveries. Chris Amico and MacAnn each had 2 sacks.

Game 12 East Stroudsburg 36, **Edinboro 32**

NCAA Division II Northeast **Region Playoff Game** November 20, 2004 **Eiler-Martin Stadium**

East Stroudsburg, PA - All year long the Edinboro football team had built its success on forcing turnovers. The Fighting Scots forced East Stroudsburg into five turnovers in their NCAA Division II Northeast Regional semifinal game, but it was the one they couldn't corral that spelled defeat. ESU scored the winning touchdown with 22 seconds left for a 36-32 win, snapping Edinboro's seven-game winning streak. For the second straight year Edinboro, ranked 21st in the AFCA Top 25, finished with a 9-3 record, tying the school record for wins.

Edinboro grabbed a 32-29 lead with 3:21 to play when Justin Bouch hooked up with Kyle Witucki for a one-yard touchdown pass. The score came after Jim Soltis sacked ESU quarterback Jimmy Terwilliger and forced a fumble which he recovered at the EU 44.

The Scots got the ball back on the very next play from scrimmage on an Elliott Page interception at the Edinboro 33. Edinboro was unable to pick up a first down and was forced to punt. Matt Barley's punt was returned by Ben Culver for 36 yards to the EU 40. East Stroudsburg moved the ball to the 29 where it faced a 4th-and-11. Under pressure, Terwilliger threw the ball up for grabs, with an Edinboro defender in position to record Edinboro's third interception of the day. The ball bounced off his shoulder pads, with Evan Prall making a diving catch for an ESU first down with 54 seconds left. Three straight incomplete passes left the Warriors facing a 4th-and-10 at the EU 17. Eschewing a potential game-tying field goal, Terwillger scrambled to his left and found Culver for a 17-yard touch-

down pass with 22 seconds remaining. For the second week in a row the Fighting Scots found themselves in a back-and-forth contest against one of the nation's top quarterbacks. To make matters worse, Edinboro lost record-setting running back Andre Burke with an injury late in the first quarter. Before exiting Burke gained 38 yards on six carries, setting a new school record for yards rushing in a season. The junior finished with 1,713 yards, breaking Gerald Thompson's record of 1,698 vards.

East Stroudsburg jumped to a quick 9-0 lead. Mark Brubaker kicked a 26-yard field goal to cap a six-minute drive on the opening kickoff. A Bouch interception on Edinboro's third play from scrimmage gave the Warriors the ball at the EU 13. Terwilliger scored on a seven-yard run to make it 9-0, but Page blocked Brubaker's extra point.

Edinboro entered the game ranked fourth in Division II in turnover margin, and proceeded to take advantage of ESU miscues. Chris Amico forced a fumble which Tom Davidson returned 14 yards to the ESU 11. A pair of Burke rushes, the second from four yards out, covered that distance, as Edinboro closed the margin to 9-7 on Burke's 19th touchdown.

East Stroudsburg boosted the lead to 16-7 in the second quarter as Terwilliger completed the first of his two touchdown passes to Tim Strenfel, this one covering 31 yards. Edinboro retaliated behind the running of Matt Phillips, who carried five times for 30 yards. Facing a 4th-and-1 at the ESU 35, Bouch completed a short pass to Ed Brown, who took it the rest of the way to close the lead to 16-14.

East Stroudsburg lost another fumble two plays later, leading to Kody Robertson's career-long 47-yard field goal for a 17-16 lead.

Edinboro built its lead to 23-16 early in the third quarter when Soltis returned an interception 47 yards for a touchdown. Robertson's extra point was wide left.

East Stroudsburg took advantage of Bouch's second interception, as Anthony Carfagno ran 18 yards for a touchdown, making it 23-22. Brubaker's extra point was blocked by Amico with Page picked it up and returning it for a defensive PAT, giving Edinboro a 25-22 advantage.

The Warriors put together a 10-play, 62yard drive to end the third quarter and start the fourth. Terwilliger threw his second touchdown pass to Strenfel, covering seven yards, to give ESU a 29-25 lead., and setting the stage for the final minutes.

Terwilliger enjoyed another outstanding day against Edinboro. The sophomore completed 29 of 44 passes for 319 yards, adding 101 yards rushing on 16 carries. Strenfil hauled in 8 passes for 101 yards. ESU totaled 474 yards.

The Edinboro offense managed just 275 yards with Burke exiting early and Bouch suffering through possibly the worst day of his career. Despite a subpar 11 of 26 effort for 129 yards, he threw for two touchdowns and set a

new season record for yards passing with 2,281 yards. Phillips ran for a career-high 112 yards on 26 carries.

Justin Lipscomb also set a school record with his first catch of the day. The junior wide receiver not only extended his consecutive games streak with at least one catch to 34 games, but set a new school record for receptions in a season. With 3 catches for 32 yards, Lipscomb ended the year with 53 receptions.

Soltis paced the defensive effort with 9 tackles, 3 for losses. He had an interception, a sack, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble.

Edinboro ended the season with a schoolrecord 30 interceptions, but it was the potential for number 31 that will gnaw at the Fighting Scots the most.

Harlan Hill Trophy

Two Edinboro University football players have been finalists for the Harlon Hill Trophy. presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II football. Running back Elbert Cole was one of three finalists in 1989, while wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist a year later. Cole placed third in the '89 balloting. He earned All-American honors in 1989, receiving first team accolades from Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, second team recognition from Football Gazette, and third team status from Associated Press.

Cole rushed for 1,507 vards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns (24) and points (148). He led the Fighting Scots to the PSAC West title, a 8-3 record and a number seven ranking in the final Division II poll.

Priester was runnerup to North Dakota State quarterback Chris Simdorn in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title. Priester was the PSAC Western Division Co-Plaver of the Year in 1990. He was also recognized by Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press and the Football Gazette as a first team All-American.

The wide receiver hauled in 47 passes for 1,102 yards and 15 TDs. Edinboro finished 9-3, reaching the Division II quarterfinals.

A year ago Andre Burke (below) made a

run at the Harlon Hill Trophy, as the tailback was a Northeast Region semifinalist. Burke ended up with a schoolrecord 1,713 vards and 19 TDs.

Fighting Scots in the Pros

Edinboro University has had a history of players performing in the professional ranks. Two former Fighting Scots are playing professionally in the Canadian Football League, with several others playing arena football, including Dave Smith, Joe Valvoda, and Quentin Ware-Bey

Jeremy O'Day is in his ninth season as an offensive lineman in the CFL, and in his seventh season with the Saskatchewan Roughriders. He was chosen by the Toronto Argonauts in the 1997 supplemental draft, and was a member of the 1997 Grey Cup winning team. The center has played in 139 CFL regular season games and seven playoff games. John Williams was drafted by British Columbia in the fourth round of the 2002 CFL Draft. He is currently on Toronto's roster.

This past spring fullback Matt Phillips signed as a free agent with the New England Patriots, and two years ago punter Sean McNicholas signed as a free agent with the New York Jets. A number of other Fighting Scots have made their marks in the professional ranks. Denorse Mosely was a member of the Miami Dolphins as a defensive back for two seasons, and was also in training camp with the Green Bay Packers.



This is Edinboro University



Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is the largest comprehensive four-year university in northwestern Pennsylvania. Its 585-acre campus is home to some 8,000 students studying in more than 100 academic programs. The University's programs in art, criminal justice, and speech language pathology, among others, have earned regional and national recognition and accolades, and the campus is ranked among the top 10 in the nation for the services provided for students with disabilities. In 2003 the University's instutional accreditation with the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools was reaffirmed with commendation for ten years. In the 2006-07 academic year, the University will celebrate its Sesquicentennial recognizing 150 years of service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and beyond.

Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie -- Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 480,000 bound volumes and 1.3 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

The main campus also includes a modern University Center, planetarium, observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and televsion stations, health center, counseling center, and much more -- all accessible for people with disabilities. The recently renovated and expanded Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of ots kind in the nation

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including six residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learning floors -- all are wired for voice, video and data.

Edinboro University also operates centers in Erie and Meadville Edinboro University in Erie -- The Porreco Center is a beautiful 27-acre campus that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for small conferences, business meetings, and special events. Edinboro University in Meadville is located in the city's historic Bessemer Building.

Dr. Frank G. Pogue President, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Dr. Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor for student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central

Administration in Albany, serving in that position for 10 years. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, President Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY at Albany

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. He serves as a member of the American Council on Education (ACE) Commission on Women in Higher Education which provides counsel to ACE on policies related to women in higher education and advises on other concerns related to expanded roles and equal opportunity for women in higher education. He is a member of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Committee on Professional Development, Millennium Leadership Initiative and Christa McAuliffe Selection Committee. He was appointed in 2003 to the International Association of University Presidents Commission on Disarmament Education, Conflict Resolution and Peace. Since 1984, Dr. Pogue has served on the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA). Most recently, he served as President for the MSA Board of Trustees and as a member of its Executive Committee, and he is a former vice chair of the Commission's Executive Committee.

Dr. Pogue served for two years as chairperson of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) Commission for the Universities and Commission of Presidents Executive Committee. He is a member of the Executive Board of A Community of Agile Partners in Education (CAPE). In October 1996, Dr. Pogue was appointed by then Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge to the Governor's Commission on Academic Standards. In November 2002, he was appointed co-chair of the Higher Education Committee of Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell's Transition Team. In May, 2004, he was appointed to the Pennsylvania Department of Education Higher Education Advisory Board

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the Boards of Directors for the Meadville Area Industrial Commission, the Erie Regional Chamber and Growth Partnership, and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra. He serves on the Boards of Corporators for the Hamot Health Foundation, the Saint Vincent Health Center, and the Meadville Medical Center. He is a member of the Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee and an Honorary Member of the Erie Wolves Club. Dr. Pogue was chairperson of the Erie County Millennium Commission, the Erie County State Employees Combined Appeal (SECA) campaign in 2001 and 2002, and of the Erie Day School's Adopt-A-Scholar scholarship program (2000-01 and 2002-03). He was also a member of the Erie Mayor's Task Force on Public Safety. Dr. Pogue has served on the boards of directors for the United Way of Erie County and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

Dr. Pogue was honored by the Erie Area Chamber of Commerce with the Louis J. Tullio Community Service Award. The Greater Erie Community Action Committee (GECAC) honored him with the Paul P. Martin Community Service Award in 2000, and in 1999, the Distinguished Service Award for Leadership and Vision was presented to him by the SUNY at Albany Council of Trustees.

Director of Athletics



Bruce Baumgartner is regarded as one of the greatest American wrestlers ever, being recognized as the U.S. Olympic Wrestler of the Century by Globalaxxess.com five years ago and being inducted into the Wrestling Hall of Fame. Now Baumgartner is building a solid reputation as an athletic administrator. Baumgartner was named the acting Director of Athletics in 1997, then was awarded the job permanently in '98.

As the guiding force of the Fighting Scot athletic program, Baumgartner has initiated the Annual Athletic Fund Drive, a fundraising project designed to provide athletic scholarship funds. In addition, he has initiated several other fundraising projects, including a semi-annual sports memorabilia auction which has raised almost \$100,000 in its six years, plus the Super Bowl Raffle, a highly-successful project.

went on to finish sixth at the NCAA Division I Nationals, their highest finish ever.

Baumgartner affirmed his status as the greatest freestyle heavyweight wrestler in American history by winning the bronze medal at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta to go along with two golds and a silver. It was his fourth Olympic medal and record-setting 13th world-level medal. Baumgartner was honored by his fellow United States Olympic athletes when he was chosen to carry the American flag for the opening ceremonies. He won his first gold medal in Los Ängeles in 1984, America's first in 60 years of super heavyweight wrestling. Next came a silver medal performance at the 1988 Games in Seoul, Korea, followed by a second gold medal in Barcelona, Spain in '92 to become the first American wrestler to ever medal in three consecutive Olympics.

Honored as the winner of the James E. Sullivan Award in 1995 as the outstanding amateur athlete in the United States, Baumgartner had not lost to an American wrestler from 1981 through his retirement from competition in 1998. He has been inducted into numerous Hall of Fames, including the Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2002 and the Pennsylvania Hall of Fame earlier this year.

As a collegiate wrestler at Indiana State University, Baumgartner won 134 of 146 collegiate matches with 73 falls. He was twice the runnerup at the national collegiate tournament, then posted a perfect 44-0
