Edinboro student TV will televise all home contests in 2014. Go to www.edinboro.tv for more information.

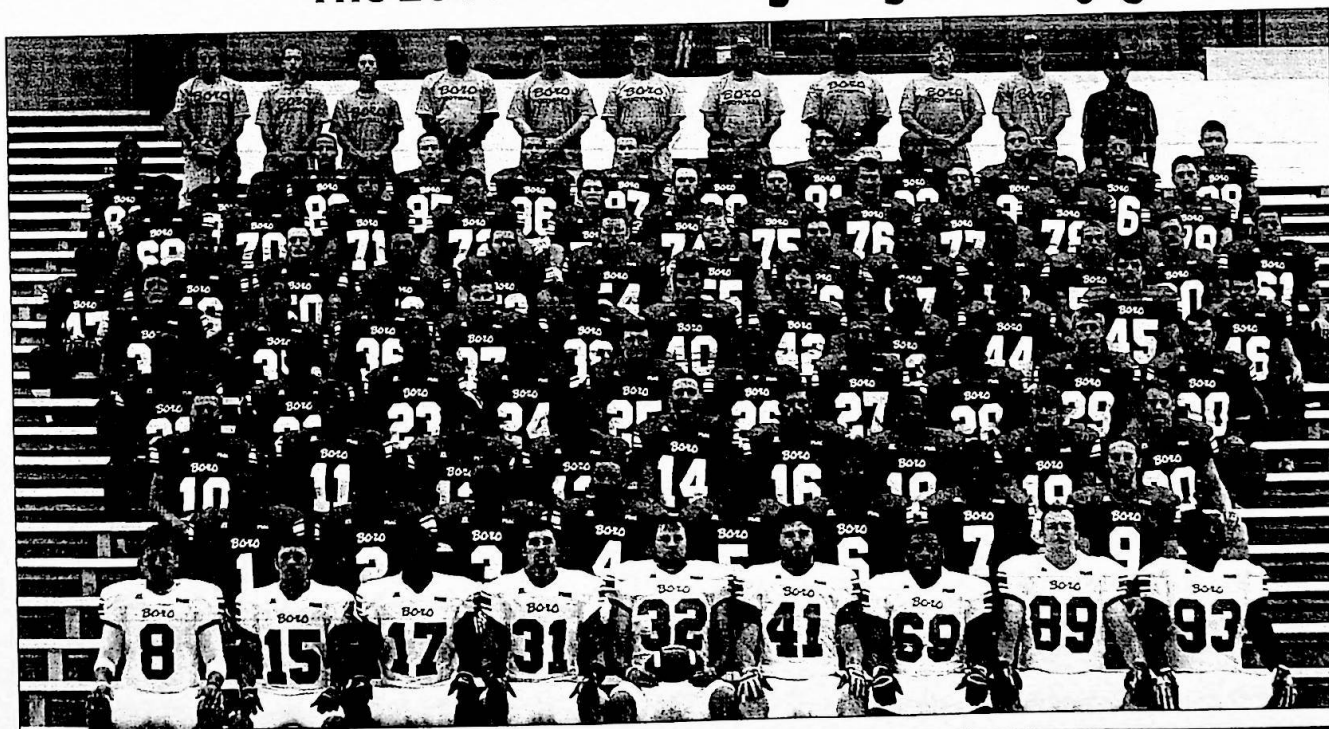

the third Edinboro head coach to reach 50 wins, joining Tom Hollman and Bill McDonald. He has an overall record of 56-43, taking over sole possession of second place in career victories with the win over Clarion. Browning was certainly no stranger to Fighting Scot football when he took over as the head coach, serving as an assistant coach for the previous twenty years. While at Edinboro he has coached the offensive linemen, defensive backs and running backs, along with serving as the offensive coordinator. Browning became the first head coach at Edinboro to debut with a win since McDonald in 1969 when the Fighting Scots opened the 2006 season with a 28-14 win at West Chester. He went on to lead Edinboro to a 6-5 finish, the most wins ever by a first-year coach. That was followed by a 7-4 finish in 2007. His

next two Fighting Scot editions recorded a school-record tying nine wins. In 2008 Edinboro ended the year at 9-2 and was ranked 20th in the final AFCA Top 25. The Fighting Scots had a 9-4 record in 2009, making the NCAA playoffs for the first time in his tenure. Edinboro would end the year 24th in the AFCA poll. The Boro fin-

ished with back-to-back 7-4 records in 2010 and '11 before the 2012 squad ended the year at 4-6, marking the first losing season during Browning's tenure. Last year's team ended the year at 5-6. (For more on Scott Browning, see pages 6-7.)

Greg Breitbach (Montana-Western '94) was named the 21st head football coach at Millersville on April 3, 2013. He owns a 2-19 record as he wraps up his second season as the head coach of the Marauders. He came to Millersville after a successful five-season run as the offensive coordinator at the University of North Dakota, which competes at the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Breitbach helped North Dakota transition from a Division II powerhouse into a Division I conference champion. He was an integral part of a program that posted a 49-30 record, appeared in the NCAA Division II playoffs twice and was nationally-ranked in the AFCA Division I FCS Coaches Poll over a seven week span in 2011. Prior to joining the North Dakota State coaching staff Breitbach piloted a high-powered offense at Division III Wisconsin-Stevens Point. His offenses averaged over 415 yards and 30 points per game in three seasons. From 1999-2002, Breitbach was the special teams coordinator, receivers and running backs coach at Lewis & Clark College. He also served two stints as an assistant at his alma mater Montana-Western, serving as offensive coordinator and assistant head coach in addition to coaching quarterbacks, receivers, running backs and linebackers. Montana-Western was a NAIA National semifinalist in 1994 and won two conference championships.

The Edinboro-Millersville Series

Tied at 5-5

This marks the first meeting between Edinboro and Millersville since 2009. The Fighting Scots have won the last two meetings between the two teams.

Scouting Millersville

Millersville snapped a 13-game losing streak with a 34-12 win at Cheyney on Saturday. The 34 points were the most since the Marauders dropped a 46-44 decision to Livinstone in the season opener. They had failed to score more than 17 points in the previous nine games. Millersville comes in averaging 16.4 ppg. and 292.4 yards in total offense. The Marauder defense gives up 42.8 points and 483.3 yards per game. They have allowed 40-or-more points in seven games.

Players to Watch

Sene Polamalu, LB – if the names rings a bell it should. The freshman is the first cousin of Pittsburgh Steelers standout Troy Polamalu. He has 37 tackles with a team-leading 6 tackles for losses, including 3 sacks.

Matt Misley, QBs – the graduate student returned after missing the better part of the last two games to complete 24 of 34 passes for 223 yards against Cheyney, adding



71 yards rushing on 11 carries. Misley played at Wagner before transferring to Millersville this season. A dual threat, he has thrown for 1,050 yards with 11 TDs and 8 INTs, adding 279 yards rushing and a score on 84 carries.

Kevin Wiggins/Malont'a Patterson, WRs – the duo of freshmen receivers rank one-two in receiving. Wiggins comes off a season-high 9-catch effort against Cheyney, boosting his season total to 40 catches for 360 yards and 4 TDs. Patterson added 6 catches for 71 yards vs. Cheyney to give him 32 receptions and a team-high 427 yards receiving with 3 TDs.

David Coates, RB – the senior running back is also a record-setting kick returner. He returned a kickoff 85 yards for a touchdown against Cheyney, his second career kickoff return for a touchdown. In the process he broke the NCAA record for career kickoff returns (134) and now ranks second with over 3,000 yards in kickoff returns. He is averaging 23.2 yards on 23 returns.

The Millersville Game

The Last Meeting

2009 - Edinboro 28, Millersville 25

Edinboro clinched a spot in the NCAA Playoffs with a 28-25 win at Millersville behind backup quarterback Joe Wanson. The senior filled in for injured starter Trevor Harris and had the game of his career. In his first career start he completed 17 of 33 passes for 231 yards with 3 TDs. He threw a pair of touchdowns in a wild first quarter which saw Edinboro grab a 14-10 lead after 15 minutes. The first was a 22-yarder to Josh Brown and the second a 25-yarder to D'Mar Jeter that would give the Fighting Scots the lead for good. Alex Romanias added a 28-yard field with 22 seconds left in the second quarter for a 17-10 halftime lead. Millersville added a safety early in the third quarter but Romanias booted his second 3-pointer from 21 yards out for a 21-12 lead. That set the stage for an interesting fourth quarter. Millersville would cap a 10-play, 68-yard drive with a one-yard plunge by Bill Shirk on the first play of the quarter. The Marauders failed on the two-point conversion run and still trailed 20-18. Edinboro answered with a nine-play, 68-yard march that saw Wanson throw a 19-yard TD pass to Brown. Wanson then ran in the two-point play for a 28-18 lead with 11:00 remaining. Millersville wasn't done yet, however. Jamal Smith's 42-yard punt return gave the Marauders the ball at the EU 22. One play later Smith went around right end for a 22-yard touchdown run, but the Marauders would get no closer. Edinboro ended the afternoon with 359 yards, while a banged-up Boro defense held the Marauders to 275 yards. Brown enjoyed the best day of his career with 6 catches for 118 yards and 2 TDs. David Bostic ran for 61 yards on 10 carries, and Michael Battles stepped in and picked up 55 hard yards on 22 carries.

Last Week

Edinboro 31, Seton Hill 27

Edinboro held off the Griffins behind some late heroics from linebacker Kyle Matula and three touchdowns from Cody Harris. With Harris throwing touchdown passes of seven yards to Connor Hollenbeck and five yards to Darren Massey, plus a three-yard touchdown run, Edinboro jumped out to a 31-14 lead early in the fourth quarter. The Fighting Scots would have to hold off a Seton Hill, and that's where Matula came in. The Griffins scored a pair of touchdowns in the final five minutes, and after each Matula recovered the onside kickoff. In addition, he broke up a pair of passes on Seton Hill's last two plays of the game with under a minute to play. Anfreenee Williams accounted for Edinboro's other touchdown on an eight-yard run. Edinboro had to withstand Seton Hill's record-setting aerial attack. The Griffins completed 43 of 69 passes, both opponent records.

Millersville 34, Cheyney 12

The Marauders picked up their first win of the season with the victory at Cheyney. Evan Stahl booted field goals of 26 and 24 yards to start the scoring. Millersville would take the lead for good when David Coates returned a kickoff 85 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter. In the process, Coates set an NCAA career record with his 134th kick return and became the second player to eclipse 3,000 career return yards. Mike Reichenbach hauled in a seven-yard touchdown pass from Matt Misley three seconds before the end of the first half to give Millersville a 20-6 lead. Millersville (1-9, 1-8 PSAC) pulled away in the fourth quarter using a 14-yard TD run from Myron Myles and a 17-yard fumble return from defensive lineman Neil Moloney.

Matula Comes Up Big Down the Stretch vs. Seton Hill

It may go down as the best game Kyle Matula has played at Edinboro, and it couldn't have come at a better time. The senior linebacker matched his career-high with 12 tackles on Saturday, and he made several plays late in the game to make sure Edinboro held on for its second win. He recovered a pair of onside kicks in the fourth quarter, the last after the Griffins closed the gap to four points. Finally, he broke up passes on Seton Hill's last two plays to preserve the win.

Welcome Back Cody

Cody Harris missed the Slippery Rock game with an injury, but returned against Seton Hill. He completed 27 of 34 passes for 310 yards, his 11th 300-yard game. He threw a pair of touchdown passes and added a third score on a three-yard run. Harris has thrown for 2,123 yards this season, good for eighth all-time.

Hollenbeck Boro's Secret Weapon

At the beginning of the season Connor Hollenbeck appeared ready to play a major role in 2014. The redshirt sophomore opened the year as a regular in the receiving corps and also served as Edinboro's punter. But he entered the Seton Hill game with just five receptions for 44 yards, and just one catch since week number two. In ad-

dition, he had not punted since the third game of the year. He stepped up against the Griffins with 6 receptions for 73 yards, including his first career touchdown catch. He also stepped in as the punter and on a windy day that made it difficult to kick he averaged 32.9 yards on seven kicks, with three inside the 20. The last pinned Seton Hill back at its own 17 with 33 seconds to play.


Welcome to Edinboro University and another great season of Fighting Scots Football! I'm excited that you've joined me to cheer on our team.

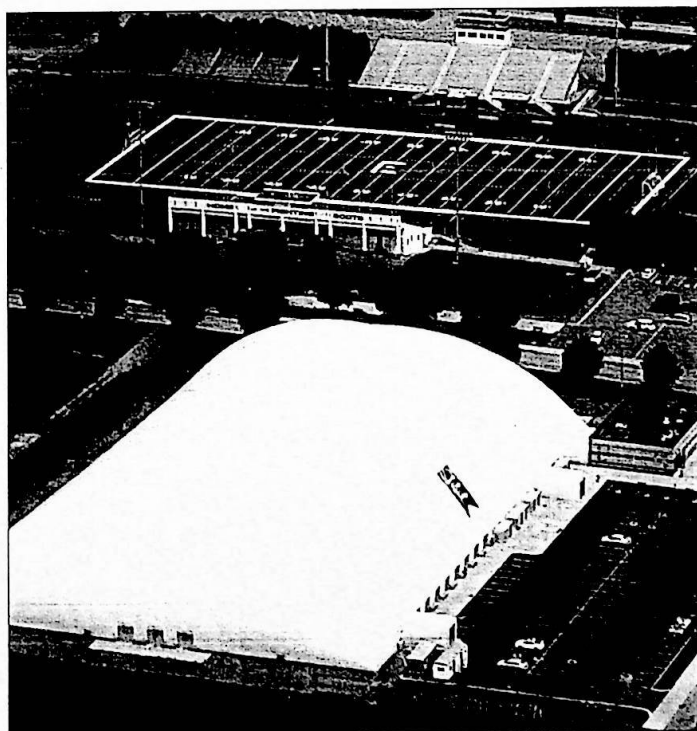

Mike S. Zafirovski Sports & Recreation Dome

The Mike S. Zafirovski Sports & Recreation Dome was officially opened on November 30, 2009. Named after the former Edinboro swimmer and soccer player, the Zafirovski Dome is the largest air-supplied facility in the tri-state area at over 85,000 square feet. It measures 370 feet in length, 230 feet in width and is 72 feet high. The interior area is approximately 85,000 square feet.

The facility has a six-lane 230 meter indoor track as well as four multi-purpose courts. The Zafirovski Dome serves as the home for indoor track & field meets, and in fact Edinboro has hosted the PSAC Indoor Track & Field Championships the last four years and is scheduled to do so again in 2014.

The Zafirovski Dome serves as a practice facility for all of Edinboro's varsity teams, including football, and is available for all students to use for recreation. It is also available during certain hours for the community. During the spring the Erie Express indoor professional football team used the dome as its practice facility, and it has hosted numerous wrestling camps, along with AAU and high school competitions in several sports.

Scott Browning knows a thing or two about the Edinboro football tradition. With twenty years under his belt as an assistant coach, he was all too familiar with the glory days of Edinboro football. So it didn't take him long to restore some lost traditions when he took over as the 13th head football coach of the Fighting Scots on January 5, 2006.

Most prevalent was the return to the "Boro", the common name the football team was referred to during the 1980's and '90's, some of the most successful periods in Edinboro football history.

One thing Browning didn't mess with

was the tradition of winning. In fact, as Browning enters his ninth campaign as the head coach, he has climbed into a tie for second place in career victories at Edinboro with Bill McDonald. He owns a 54-35 record in eight years as head coach, trailing only his mentor Tom Hollman, who owns 78 career victories.

He is also approaching some rarified territory at Edinboro, as only four previous coaches guided the Fighting Scots for ten-or-more years. He has led Edinboro to one NCAA Division II playoff appearance and the Fighting Scots have finished in the AFCA Top 25 twice.

Win number 50 came in the season-opening 35-34 win at Walsh. A week later the Fighting Scots suffered a 47-35 loss to 15th-ranked Bloomsburg. Edinboro lost more than a game that day, as starting quarterback Cody Harris was lost for the year with broken ribs.

That injury would be the first of many in the 2013 campaign, as an injury-wracked Fighting Scots squad would suffer its second straight losing campaign, ending the year at 5-6. With Harris out the offense struggled behind three first-year signal callers. Edinboro did enjoy a moment of glory with a 36-30 upset at 22nd-ranked Indiana(Pa.).

Browning's 2012 edition suffered the first losing season in his tenure at 4-6. Three of the losses came to nationally-ranked teams, and a fourth setback came in overtime. Edinboro trailed by less than a touchdown heading into the fourth quarter against sixth-ranked California(Pa.) and 22nd-ranked Indiana(Pa.), but could not pull off the upset.

Edinboro finished with a 7-4 record in 2011. The Fighting Scots got off to a fast start with four straight wins, climbing to as high as 18th in the AFCA Division II Top 25. The season would end in disappointment for Browning, who saw his team suffer a 34-28 loss to PSAC powerhouse California(Pa.) in week number ten, then follow that with a 27-26 loss at East Stroudsburg in the season finale on the final play of the game.

In 2010 Browning guided a young team to a 7-4 finish. The Fighting Scots actually opened the year with four straight wins, three on the road, including a 20-19 triumph at seventh-ranked West Liberty and a 16-14 win at West Chester, the pre-season favorite in the PSAC East.

Edinboro would climb as high as 12th in the AFCA Division II Top 25 but suffered a mid-season slump, dropping three straight games. The third was the most painful, a 22-21 setback in overtime to a Mercyhurst team which would go on to win

the PSAC championship and reach the Super Region One finals. The Fighting Scots would rebound with wins in three of their final four games, the only defeat coming to 24th-ranked California(Pa.).

The 2009 Fighting Scots tied the school record for wins for the second straight year while finishing with a 9-4 record. The Fighting Scots were selected for the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the first time since 2004, and won their third-ever playoff game with a 31-16 win at East Stroudsburg in the Super Region One quarterfinals. Edinboro would lose at West Liberty in the regional semifinals, but the Fighting Scots handed West Liberty one of its two losses in the season opener, claiming a 42-30 victory.

Edinboro ended the year ranked nationally for the second straight season, finishing 24th in the AFCA Top 25 and 20th according to D2Football.com. That despite facing a demanding schedule which saw eight of the 14 teams post winning records. Edinboro swept local rivals Gannon and Mercyhurst and defeated Indiana(Pa.) for the second straight year. Browning was recognized as the 2009-10 Edinboro Coach of the Year.

Taking over in 2006, Browning's first edition finished with a 6-5 record, the most wins ever under a first-year coach. But it didn't end just on the football field. The Fighting Scots excelled in the classroom, including a cumulative team GPA of over 2.8 for the spring semester.

Head Coach

Browning became the first coach at Edinboro since Sox Harrison to win his first two games as head coach. That happened in 1926, the first year of football at the Boro. Thanks to a 28-14 win at West Chester, he became the first coach since Bill McDonald in 1969 to win his first game as head coach.

That victory, on the road at West Chester between a pair of 2005 NCAA playoff teams, also displayed Browning's propensity as a riverboat gambler. The Fighting Scots went for it on fourth down four times, and converted on three occasions.

The 2007 Fighting Scots finished with a 7-4 record while facing one of the most difficult schedules in recent memory. Edinboro faced four nationally-ranked teams, upsetting 25th-ranked Bloomsburg thanks to a memorable comeback, 42-41, while losing to eighth-ranked California (Pa.), 17th-ranked West Chester and 24th-ranked IUP. In fact, Edinboro's four losses came to teams which combined for a 40-9.

In 2008 Edinboro barely missed making the NCAA Playoffs while tying the school record for wins in a season, finishing at 9-2. The wins included a 24-17 decision over 16th-ranked Indiana (Pa.). The losses came by a combined seven points to 14th-ranked California (Pa.) and Mercyhurst. The Fighting Scots finished 20th in the final AFCA Division II rankings.

Browning also places a strong emphasis on academics. Each year a good number of Edinboro players achieve PSAC Scholar-Athlete status, and through the years many players have earned CoSIDA District 2 Academic All-American honors. This past year defensive end Bobby Kmetz and offensive lineman Jaycen Watts received the honor.

Most noteworthy among the academic honorees is Branden Williams. The former cornerback is a two-time Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Football Team selection, earning first team accolades in 2012 and second team in 2011.

Browning joined the Edinboro program in 1986 as the running backs coach under Steve Szabo. After two seasons on the offensive side of the ball, the graduate of The Ohio State University moved to the defensive side, serving as the defensive backfield coach under Hollman. In 1994 he moved back to offense as the offensive line coach. He had remained in charge of the linemen since that time, coaching such All-Americans as Jeremy O'Day, Joe Valvoda and Greg Bzorek. The last two years Browning's offensive line led the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference in fewest sacks allowed.

After serving as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in Lou Tepper's first season in 2000, Browning took over as the offensive coordinator in 2001. The Fighting Scot offense made great strides over the next five years. Browning emphasized a balanced attack which showcased the combination of a strong ground game and dangerous aerial attack. Over his last three seasons Edinboro averaged 29.9 ppg. in 2003, 33.2 ppg. in '04, and 31.4 ppg. in '05.

He had previously served as the offensive coordinator for five seasons under Hollman. In all, Browning had served as Edinboro's offensive line coach the previous 12 years.

All told, Browning has been either the head coach or an assistant coach on all eight of Edinboro's NCAA playoff teams, along with five of the nine PSAC champion squads.

"It goes without saying that I am extremely excited to have this opportunity," noted an elated Browning upon his hiring. "I was proud to be a part of the teams in the 1990's that ranked among the best in Division II, and over the last few years we have once again elevated the program to one of the best in the country. The University and the community of Edinboro mean a great deal to me. Over the years we have tried to become an integral part of this community. I am thrilled that I can continue that association while taking over a group of players that represent the ideals I believe in.

"I'm sure you will see some changes in the future, but I can tell you this, the ideals remain in place for this program, and always have in the time I've been here. Without question we want to be successful on the field, and that means challenging for the PSAC West title. But we won't compromise integrity. We will continue to bring in young men who have the ability to be successful both in the classroom and on the football field. It is my sincere belief that when they take the field, they must wear the Edinboro jersey with pride, and when they are in the community, that they have earned the respect that comes with being a Fighting Scot."

Browning has served on the staffs at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for two years while serving as a graduate assistant. That group included Keith Byars. The Buckeyes went to the Rose Bowl in 1984, dropping a 20-17 decision to USC to finish with a 9-3 record. The following year Ohio State went bowling again, this time defeating Brigham Young, 10-7, in the Citrus Bowl, to once again finish at 9-3.

Browning served as a graduate assistant coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. Idaho State reached the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs before suffering a 27-20 defeat to Nevada.

A 1981 graduate of The Ohio State University with a bachelor's degree in Education, Browning began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Worthington High School and Dayton-Fairview High Schools in Ohio from 1979-81. Before transferring to Ohio State he attended Capital University where he played football for one season. Browning later earned a master's degree in Education Administration from New Mexico State in 1983.

A native of Loudonville, Ohio, Browning, 55, and his wife, Lynn, reside in Edinboro and have two children, Andrew (20), a former standout on the General McLane High School football team and a current junior at The Ohio State University, and Katelyn (16), a member of the General McLane girls basketball team.

Wayne Bradford is in his 16th year as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff. He enters his ninth season as the Fighting Scot defensive coordinator, and had previously held the same title in 1999 under former head coach Tom Hollman. After over-

seeing the defensive line for seven seasons, Bradford took over as the linebackers coach in 2006. He returned a year ago to work with the linemen. In addition, he serves as the recruiting coordinator.

Bradford has master-minded some brilliant defensive performances in recent years in a day and age when offense has taken over. For instance, in 2011 the Fighting Scots ranked eighth in Division II in scoring defense (17.0 ppg.), 11th in pass efficiency defense, and 18th in total defense (292.6 ypg.). Edinboro gave up fewer than twenty points in seven of its 11 games.

He orchestrated the top defense in the country in 2005, as Edinboro paced Division II in scoring defense (9.3 ppg.), total defense (211.2 ypg.), and rushing defense (53.7 ypg.). In addition, Edinboro was third in pass efficiency defense and turnover margin. The Fighting Scots recorded three shutouts, the most since the 1975 team also shut out three opponents. A total of seven opponents were held to seven points or less.

In 2006 his defensive unit recorded two more shutouts while leading the PSAC in rushing defense (70.6 ypg.), good for third in the country.

In 2008 Bradford guided a young defense that ended up having five players earn All-PSAC honors. The Fighting Scot defense tied for second in the PSAC in scoring defense despite ranking no higher than fifth in any individual category.

Under Bradford's tutelage, Edinboro has had 32 first team All-PSAC West defensive performers. In

fact, he has been responsible for three PSAC West Defensive Players of the Year, with Ben Stroup earning the honor in 2006, Chris Amico the 2005 recipient, and Seth Fragale the winner in 2004. This past year he coached a pair of defensive linemen – Bobby Kmetz and Chris Williams – to second team All-PSAC honors.

Bradford joined the Edinboro coaching staff after serving as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Salisbury State, since 1990, and was the Sea Gulls' defensive coordinator from 1994-98. He began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the linebackers (1990-92) and defensive linemen (1992-94). In 1994, he was promoted to defensive coordinator.

In 1997, Salisbury State ranked 38th in NCAA Division III in total defense, allowing just 268 yards per game. His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game.

Bradford graduated from Salisbury State in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration. He completed work on his master's degree in Business Administration from Salisbury State in 1992. In addition to working as a member of the football staff, Bradford was a faculty member in the School of Business. Beginning in 1996, he was the Director of the Business Graduate Programs for the Perdue School of Business.

As an undergraduate, Bradford was an offensive lineman. He played on the 1986 Salisbury State team which finished as the NCAA Division III national runner-up.

Bradford and his wife, Gwen, reside in Edinboro with their 16-year-old son, Nicholas, who is a member of the General McLane High School golf and swimming teams, 14-year-old daughter, Julia, a standout swimmer and basketball player who is a freshman at Villa Maria Academy, and nine-year-old son Mitchell.

at the University of Minnesota-Morris. He took over as the defensive coordinator at Minnesota Morris in 2005. During that period, he worked specifically with the defensive line and linebackers, while also serving as the strength coordinator. All told, he coached 22 all-conference performers.

In 2012 the Cougars posted a 6-4 record, leading the Upper Midwest Athletic Conference in pass defense (169.1 ypg.) while ranking fifth in scoring defense and total defense. In addition, Minnesota-Morris ranked third in sacks.

His 2011 unit also ranked first in the conference in pass defense, only allowing ten touchdowns through the air. The 2009 Cougar defense led the UMAC in total defense and showcased five all-conference performers.

Minnesota-Morris enjoyed its finest season in twenty years in Battle's second year, as the 2006 Cougar squad finished with a 7-3 record. The 2006 team won the UMAC championship.

Before coming to UMM, Battle coached the defensive line and defensive backs at Western Washington University from 2003-05. He again was involved with a conference champion, as the Vikings won the 2003 Great Northwest Athletic Conference.

Battle began his coaching career in 2001 as a graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, Idaho State, working with the tight ends. Once again, he earned a championship ring as the 2002 team won the Big Sky Conference championship.

Battle was a four-year letter winner at linebacker at Idaho State from 1995-98. He earned second team All-Big Sky honors as a senior. He was also named the team's Defensive Player of the Year in 1998 and was a team captain. He would complete work on his bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Idaho State in 2001, and is currently working on a master's degree.

A native of Miami, FL, Battle was a standout at Miami Killian Senior High School, earning first team All-Miami Dade County honors in 1994 and being named the Defensive Player of the Year.

The 2008 squad finished with a 9-7 record during the regular season, but then made an unlikely run as a wild card playoff team to the Super Bowl. Arizona defeated Atlanta (30-24), Carolina (33-13) and Philadelphia (32-25) in the NFC Championship game, before falling to Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLIII by a 27-23 score.

In 2009-10 Miller was elevated to the passing game coordinator. With Kurt Warner as the starting quarterback, the 2009 Cardinals finished with a 10-6 record and was first in the NFL in red zone efficiency. Arizona defeated Green Bay in overtime before losing to New Orleans in the second round of the NFC playoffs.

Miller most recently served as the assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach for the Montreal Alouettes of the CFL in 2013. He proudly points out that the injury-wracked Alouettes did something rarely accomplished -- have four different starting quarterbacks win two games.

Miller also served as an assistant coach in the NFL with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Buffalo Bills. Bill Cowher offered Millers his first professional coaching position, serving as offensive quality control coach from 1999-2003, where he worked closely with offensive coordinator Mike Mularkey.

When Mularkey was hired as Buffalo's head coach in 2004, Miller came along as the tight ends coach, holding that position for two years. In the spring of 2006 he served as the quarterbacks/wide receivers coach for the Berlin Thunder in NFL Europe.

2011 he took over as the offensive line coach, working side-by-side with head coach Scott Browning. He is now back with the running backs.

Henson joined the Edinboro staff after serving as a mathematics teacher, football coach and athletic director at Grand Valley High School in Ohio for 22 years. He led the Mustangs to a 150-68-4 record, with five Grand River Conference championships, three East Suburban Conference titles, and three state playoff appearances.

In the 1990's, Henson's charges posted three undefeated campaigns and a 23-game regular season winning streak. He was named the Conference Coach of the Year eight times and County Coach of the Year three times, culminated by his selection as the Ohio Division V Coach of the Year in 1997 and the Division IV Coach of the Year in '92. Tabitha Bemis and Dan Altavilla Named 2013-14 PSAC Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference is pleased to announce Mercyhurst's Dan Altavilla and Edinboro's Tabitha Bemis as its 2013-14 Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year. Altavilla and Bemis were selected by the league's sports information directors.

The Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year are presented to the top student-athletes who have achieved at least a 3.50 cumulative grade point average while competing at an outstanding athletic level. To be eligible for the awards, a student-athlete must have been recognized as a fall, winter or spring PSAC Top 10 award winner in the same academic year.

Bemis, a sports and recreation major with a 3.92 grade point average, was a two-time All-American at the 2014 NCAA Division II Outdoor Track and Field Championships, making her a six-time All-American (four indoor, two outdoor). She is a two-time PSAC Outdoor Field Athlete of the Year and a three-time PSAC Indoor Field Athlete of the Year, as she has won 15 PSAC Championship titles in her career. This season she placed fifth in the triple jump (43' 3 1/4") at the NCAA Outdoor National Championship and eighth in the long jump (19' 9"). At the indoor championship she placed second in the long jump (19' 8 1/4") and seventh in the triple jump (40' 9 3/4"). Bemis is the first PSAC athlete to be named to six PSAC Top 10 rosters, and is a three-time Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Altavilla

Altavilla, a sports medicine/pre-physical therapy major with a 3.70 grade point average, was a baseball Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team selection as well as being the inaugural winner of the Brett Tomko Award given to Division II's most outstanding pitcher. He was named the ABCA/Rawlings Division II National Pitcher of the Year, and the Daktronics' Ron Lenz Division II National Pitcher of the Year, while being a First Team All-American from ABCA/Rawlings, Daktronics, and NCBWA. In 12 starts this season he accumulated nine wins and established a 1.23 ERA. He led Division II with 129 strikeouts to set a new Mercyhurst season standard and limited opponents to a .167 batting average. Altavilla broke a 99 year-old PSAC record when he tossed 19 strikeouts in 7.2 innings of work in the opening game of the PSAC Championship against West Chester. Altavilla was drafted in the fifth round and 141st overall in the Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft by the Seattle Mariners, marking the highest draft pick in Mercyhurst history.

Sox Harrison Stadium

Sox Harrison Stadium



Sox Harrison Stadium serves as the home of the Fighting Scots. Dedicated in 1965, the stadium honors the memory of B. Regis "Sox" Harrison, the head football and basketball coach at Edinboro University for 34 years. Sox Harrison was the key figure in the building of Edinboro's athletic program, unselfishly devoting 34 years of service to the University as an athletic director, coach and physical education instructor. Appropriately, he was the first member inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.



Harrison coached the Fighting Scot football team from its inception in 1926 to 1938, the returned to guide the gridgers in 1941 and '42. In addition, he coached the men's basketball team for 23 seasons, from 1928-53, winning 175 games.

The stadium received a facelift several years ago, giving it a spanking new look. Most noticeable was the installation of an artificial surface, Sportex, to replace the natural grass. And it is now illuminated, with lights being installed for the first time. The first night game was played on xxx against xxxx. Finally, a new scoreboard was installed.

Sox Harrison Stadium seats 6,000 people in its two grandstands, along with plenty of standing room. In addition to press boxes on both sides of the stadium, the facility has locker rooms, a training room and complete amenities for fans.

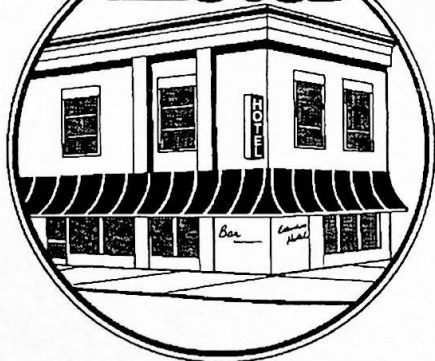
The stadium has undergone several renovations, including a new sound system and improved handicapped access areas in 1999. In 1997, a new grandstand was constructed on the visitor's side of the field, adding 2,500 permanent seats, along with a press box, locker rooms and a training room.

In addition to the football field, the facility contains complete track facilities.

Harlan Hill Trophy



Trevor Harris (below) became the third Edinboro University football player to finish as a finalist for the Harlan Hill Trophy, presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II football. Harris was a finalist in 2008 after being a Northeast Re-

gion finalist in 2007.

Running back Elbert Cole was one of three finalists in 1989, while wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist a year later. Cole placed third in the '89 balloting. He earned All-American honors in 1989, receiving first team accolades from Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, second team recognition from Football Gazette, and third team status from Associated Press.

Cole rushed for 1,507 yards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns (24) and points (148). He led the Fighting Scots to the PSAC West title, a 8-3 record and a number seven ranking in the final Division II poll.

Priester was runnerup to North Dakota State's Chris Simdon in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title. Priester was the PSAC Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He was also recognized by Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press and the Football Gazette as a first team All-American.

The wide receiver hauled in 47 passes for 1,102 yards and 15 TDs. Edinboro finished 9-3, reaching the Division II quarterfinals.

Andre Burke made a run at the Harlan Hill Trophy in 2004, as the tailback was a Northeast Region semifinalist. Burke ended up with a school-record 1,713 yards and 19 TDs.

Longest Plays

The Cactus Bowl

Trevor Harris continued the tradition of Edinboro Fighting Scots playing in the Cactus Bowl in January 2009. (NOTE: The 2007 contest was suspended.) The quarterback completed 10 of 13 passes for 97 yards and ran three times for 17 yards to help the West All-Stars to a 16-0 win over the East All-Stars. For a number of years Division II football teams had an all-star game named the Snow Bowl, which was played in Fargo, North Dakota. In 2000 the contest was moved to Kingsville, Texas and renamed the Cactus Bowl. The contest features the top small college seniors in the country. Edinboro had at least one representative in every Cactus Bowl (aka Snow Bowl) but one until last year, with a streak of nine straight years.
