

Unfortunately, a brutal early-season schedule has left the Fighting Scots with their worst record after four games since 1955.

To bring you up to speed, the Fighting Scots opened with a long road trip to Tennessee to face a Carson-Newman team that was ranked 16th in Division II. That contest was followed by games against a pair PSAC East teams who were 7-4 a year ago — Shippensburg and East Stroudsburg.

The latter game was particularly disconcerting since Edinboro drove inside the ESU 15 needing a touchdown to win late in the game before turning the ball over on downs.

Last week the Scots played at California(Pa.), another 7-4 outfit in 2013 and described by head coach Scott Browning as "the best team we've faced this year".

Now comes an Indiana(Pa.)

squad that was 9-2 last year and picked as the 2014 PSAC West preseason favorite.

One of those two losses a year ago came to Edinboro, 36-30 at IUP.

Enjoy today's game, and once again, welcome back.

The Coaches

Scott Browning (Ohio State '81) took over as Edinboro's 13th head coach on January 5, 2006, and in his first six seasons he tied former mentor Tom Hollman for the most wins during that period. Now in his ninth season, Browning picked up his 50th career win in the 2013 season opener against Walsh with a 35-34 win. He became the third Edinboro head coach to reach 50 wins, joining Tom Hollman and Bill McDonald. He has an overall record of 54-39, tied with McDonald for sec-

ond place in career victories. Browning was certainly no stranger to Fighting Scot football when he took over as the head coach, serving as an assistant coach for the previous twenty years. While at Edinboro he has coached the offensive linemen, defensive backs and running backs, along with serving as the of-

fensive coordinator. Browning became the first head coach at Edinboro to debut with a win since McDonald in 1969 when the Fighting Scots opened the 2006 season with a 28-14 win at West Chester. He went on to lead Edinboro to a 6-5 finish, the most wins ever by a first-year coach. That was followed by a 7-4 finish in 2007. His next two Fighting Scot editions recorded a school-record tying nine wins. in 2008 Edinboro ended the year at 9-2 and was ranked 20th in the final AFCA Top 25. The Fighting Scots had a 9-4 record in 2009, making the NCAA playoffs for the first time in his tenure. Edinboro would end the year 24th in the AFCA poll. The Boro finished with back-to-back 7-4 records in 2010 and '11 before the 2012 squad ended the year at 4-6, marking the first losing season during Browning's tenure. Last year's team ended the year at 5-6. (For more on Scott Browning, see pages 6-7.)

Curt Cignetti (West Virginia '82) is in his fourth year at the helm of the football program at IUP, showing a 31-8 record. The son of former legendary IUP coach Frank Cignetti, he led the Crimson Hawks to a 7-3 record his first year, then followed that up with a 12-2 finish. IUP won the 2012 PSAC Championship with a 41-10 win over Shippensburg, then reached the Super Region One Championship in the NCAA playoffs before falling to Winston-Salem State 21-17. A year ago IUP went 9-2. Now in his 32nd year of coaching, Cignetti has an impressive resume' that includes four seasons as wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator under Nick Saban at Alabama. The Crimson Tide won the 2009 BCS national championship with a 14-0 record. In addition to the national title, Cignetti was part of Alabama teams that posted a record of 33-3 over his last three regular seasons, including 29 consecutive regular season victories, won the 2008 and 2009 SEC West

Scouting Indiana(Pa.)

The Crimson Hawks were picked first in the PSAC West in the coaches preseason poll. They had scuffled the past couple weeks, losing to Kutztown 44-7 and just getting by Lock Haven 21-16. But last week IUP made a statement with a 41-7 win over Mercyhurst to improve to 3-1. They held the Lakers to 146 yards. On the year IUP ranks sixth in the PSAC in scoring defense (21.5 ppg.), third in rushing defense (76.2 ypg.), and third in total defense (304.8 ypg.).



Players to Watch

Luigi Lista-Brinza, TB -- the diminutive (5-9, 185 lb.) back has taken an early lead for PSAC West Freshman of the Year honors with 356 yards and 8 TDs on 77 carries, fourth in the PSAC in rushing. He had 103 yards and 3 TDs vs. Mercyhurst, his third 100-yard game. He was a second team all-state pick at Pittsburgh Central Catholic High School.

Chase Haslett, QB -- the son of former IUP and NFL standout Jim Haslett, the current Washington Redskins defensive coordinator, he joined the team this summer after transferring from Illinois. He has completed 50 of 87 passes for 607 yards with 6 TDs and 5 INTs.

Kevin Clarke, LB — a 6-1, 210 lb. sophomore, he leads the team with 46 tackles, with 6 for losses. He had 19 tackles against Kutztown, and was named the PSAC West Defensive Player of the Week after the season-opening win vs. St. Augustine (13 tackles, 2 forced fumbles).

Shane Meisner, DE – the 6-3, 260 lb. redshirt senior only has 11 tackles, 2 for losses, as teams tend to stay away from him. A year ago he had 55 tackles and led the team in tackles for losses (11) and sacks (5.5).

Brett Uliman, PK – a three-time All-PSAC West performer, he is challenging IUP career records for points scored, field goals made, extra points made. He is 14 of 15 on extra points but has yet to attempt a three-pointer. For his career he is 149 of 156 on PATs and 37 of 52 on FGs.

championships and earned a berth in the 2008 Sugar Bowl. Cignetti also spent seven seasons (2000-06) as an assistant coach at North Carolina State. The Wolfpack qualified for five bowl games during that time, including the 2002 Gator Bowl when N.C. State set a school record with 11 wins. Cignetti has also had previous coaching stops at Pittsburgh, Davidson, Rice and Temple.

The Last Meeting

2013 - Edinboro 36, #22 Indiana(Pa.) 30

The Edinboro defense forced five turnovers and blocked a punt, and Jon Girvin paced the offense with three touchdown passes as the Fighting Scots upset 22nd-ranked IUP. IUP grabbed a quick 6-0 lead, but Girvin's first TD pass, a 26-yarder to Jordan Williams, knotted the score at 6-6. Darren Massey returned a blocked IUP punt 19 yards for a 13-6 lead. Those scores were part of a 22-point second quarter as the Scots gained a 22-20 lead at the half. The other scores were a 75-yard hookup between Girvin and Massey and a 39-yard field goal by T.J. Hardy. Hardy's field goal started a string of 17 straight points for the Scots, as Jeremy Donaldson scored on a one-yard run and Girvin and Massey combined on a 33-yard touchdown pass. That gave the Scots a 36-20. The Crimson Hawks would score the final ten points of the game, but the rally ended when Delano Fabor intercepted a pass with just over two minutes left to play.

Last Week

California(Pa.) 34, Edinboro 16

Cody Harris scored on a pair of short touchdown runs in the second half but it wasn't enough to overcome a 28-0 halftime deficit. California(Pa.) scored on four of its first five possessions, but the Boro defense settled down to hold the Vulcans to a pair of field goals in the second half. The Edinboro offense was held in check until the fourth quarter when Harris directed the Fighting Scots on scoring drives of 79 and 91 yards. He accounted for both touchdowns on runs of one and two yards. Edinboro added a safety with just under two minutes to play when Joel Fulton blocked a punt out of the end zone. Harris completed 29 of 42 passes for 312 yards, but he was under constant pressure all afternoon. Edinboro quarterbacks were sacked seven times as the Scots finished with minus 12 yards rushing, the third-lowest total in school history.

Indiana(Pa.) 41, Mercyhurst 7

The Crimson Hawks sprinted to a 27-0 lead after one quarter and never looked back. It took just 12 seconds for IUP to open the scoring after Mercyhurst fumbled on the opening kickoff. Freshman Luigi Lista-Brinza, who rushed for 103 yards on 16 carries, scored the first of his three touchdowns on an 11-yard run. He capped a 10-play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard scoring run, and Brock DeCicco caught a 15-yard touchdown pass from Chase Haslett for a 20-0 lead with 1:55 to play in the quarter. The Crimson Hawks were back on the board just 31 seconds later after a quick Mercyhurst three-and-out. Lista-Brinza again did the honors with a 41-yard run. Haslett's 13-yard TD pass to Drew Carswell made it 34-0 at the half and Chris Temple's sevenyard TD run in the third quarter concluded IUP's scoring. The Crimson Hawks turned in a brilliant defensive effort, limiting the Lakers to 146 yards in total offense, including 29 yards rushing. Haslett completed 12 of 15 passes for 157 yards.

Cody in Top 5 of Division II Active Passers

Edinboro quarterback **Cody Harris** ranks among the NCAA Division II active career leaders in passing yards and total offense. He stands fourth in both categories with 8,318 yards passing and 8,909 yards in total offense. He is also climbing in the PSAC career numbers, ranking 13th in total offense and 15th in yards passing.

Trae Returns to the Lineup

Veuntrae Robinson started the first 27 games of his career at strong safety and had 29 career starts entering his senior year. After seeing limited action in a reserve role the first two games, he started against East Stroudsburg for his 30th career start. Robinson finished with 6 tackles, and added 5 tackles while starting at Cal.

Eisel Climbing in Receiving Charts

Ben Eisel had a season-high 7 receptions for 58 yards at California(Pa.), pushing him over 100 catches for his career. The senior wide receiver has moved into 12th place with 104 career receptions, and is now 14th in career receiving yards (1,268).

Darren Da Man

Darren Massey finished on a rush last year and was named the PSAC West Fresh-

man of the Year. It doesn't look like he has to worry about a sophomore slump. He leads Edinboro with 35 receptions for 391 yards. He had 11 catches for 161 yards at Shippensburg, and followed that up with 10 receptions for 103 yards and 3 TDs against East Stroudsburg. In the process he became the first Edinboro player with back-to-back games of 10-or-more receptions. Cal limited him to 6 catches for 58 yards.

Edinboro in Homecoming Games

Edinboro has an all-time record of 38-32-2 in Homecoming games, and have won two in a row and six of the last seven. The Fighting Scots are 6-2 in Homecoming games under head coach Scott Browning. Edinboro hosted IUP in the 2002 Homecoming game, with IUP winning 54-35.

Williams Tops 100 vs. ESU, but Ground Game Halted at Cal

Edinboro can only hope it gets more rushing efforts like it did from **Anfreenee Williams** against East Stroudsburg. The freshman from Georgia became the first Edinboro player to rush for 100 yards since Jeremy Donaldson in last year's Homecoming game against Lock Haven. He finished with 139 yards on 18 carries, including a pair of 44-yard bursts. The Fighting Scots have struggled to establish a ground game in its other three contests, although numbers are skewed somewhat since sacks are counted as rushes in college. A week ago at California(Pa.) seven sacks led the Edinboro finishing with minus 12 yards rushing, the third-lowest total in school history. Williams was Edinboro's leading rusher with 13 yards.

Mike S. Zafirovski Sports & Recreation Dome

The Mike S. Zafirovski Sports & Recreation Dome was officially opened on November 30, 2009. Named after the former Edinboro swimmer and soccer player, the Zafirovski Dome is the largest air-supplied facility in the tri-state area at over 85,000 square feet. It measures 370 feet in length, 230 feet in width and is 72 feet high. The interior area is approximately 85,000 square feet.

The facility has a six-lane 230 meter indoor track as well as four multipurpose courts. The Zafirovski Dome serves as the home for indoor track & field meets, and in fact Edinboro has hosted the PSAC Indoor Track & Field Championships the last four years and is scheduled to do so again in 2014.

The Zafirovski Dome serves as a practice facility for all of Edinboro's varsity teams, including football, and is available for all students to use for recreation. It is also available during certain hours for the community During the spring the Erie Express indoor professional football team used the dome as its practice facility, and it has hosted numerous wrestling camps, along with AAU and high school competitions in several sports.

Scott **Browning**

9th Year **Ohio State '81**



Scott Browning knows a thing or two about the Edinboro football tradition. With twenty years under his belt as an assistant coach, he was all too familiar with the glory days of Edinboro football. So it didn't take him long to restore some lost traditions when he took over as the 13th head football coach of the Fighting Scots on January 5, 2006.

Most prevalent was the return to the Boro", the common name the football team was referred to during the 1980's and '90's, some of the most successful

periods in Edinboro football history.

One thing Browning didn't mess with

was the tradition of winning. In fact, as Browning enters his ninth campaign as the head coach, he has climbed into a tie for second place in career victories at Edinboro with Bill McDonald. He owns a 54-35 record in eight years as head coach, trailing only his mentor Tom Hollman, who owns 78 career victories.

He is also approaching some rarified territory at Edinboro, as only four previous coaches guided the Fighting Scots for tenor-more years. He has led Edinboro to one NCAA Division II playoff appearance and the Fighting Scots have finished in the AFCA Top 25 twice.

Win number 50 came in the season-opening 35-34 win at Walsh. A week later the Fighting Scots suffered a 47-35 loss to 15th-ranked Bloomsburg. Edinboro lost more than a game that day, as starting quarterback Cody Harris was lost for the year with broken ribs.

That injury would be the first of many in the 2013 campaign, as an injury-wracked Fighting Scots squad would suffer its second straight losing campaign, ending the year at 5-6. With Harris out the offense struggled behind three first-year signal callers. Edinboro did enjoy a moment of glory with a 36-30 upset at 22nd-ranked Indiana(Pa.).

Browning's 2012 edition suffered the first losing season in his tenure at 4-6. Three of the losses came to nationally-ranked teams, and a fourth setback came in overtime. Edinboro trailed by less than a touchdown heading into the fourth quarter against sixth-ranked California(Pa.) and 22nd-ranked Indiana(Pa.), but could not pull off the upset.

Edinboro finished with a 7-4 record in 2011. The Fighting Scots got off to a fast start with four straight wins, climbing to as high as 18th in the AFCA Division II Top 25. The season would end in disappointment for Browning, who saw his team suffer a 34-28 loss to PSAC powerhouse California(Pa.) in week number ten, then follow that with a 27-26 loss at East Stroudsburg in the season finale on the final play of the game.

In 2010 Browning guided a young team to a 7-4 finish. The Fighting Scots actually opened the year with four straight wins, three on the road, including a 20-19 triumph at seventhranked West Liberty and a 16-14 win at West Chester, the preseason favorite in the PSAC East.

Edinboro would climb as high as 12th in the AFCA Division Il Top 25 but suffered a mid-season slump, dropping three straight games. The third was the most painful, a 22-21 setback in overtime to a Mercyhurst team which would go on to win

the PSAC championship and reach the Super Region One finals. The Fighting Scots would rebound with wins in three of their final four games, the only defeat coming

The 2009 Fighting Scots tied the school record for wins for the second straight year while finishing with a 9-4 record. The Fighting Scots were selected for the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the first time since 2004, and won their third-ever playoff game with a 31-16 win at East Stroudsburg in the Super Region One quarterfinals. Edinboro would lose at West Liberty in the regional semifinals, but the Fighting Scots handed West Liberty one of its two losses in the season opener,

Edinboro ended the year ranked nationally for the second straight season, finishing 24th in the AFCA Top 25 and 20th according to D2Football.com. That despite facing a demanding schedule which saw eight of the 14 teams post winning records. Edinboro swept local rivals Gannon and Mercyhurst and defeated Indiana(Pa.) for the second straight year. Browning was recognized as the 2009-10 Edinboro Coach of the Year.

Taking over in 2006. Browning's first edition finished with a 6-5 record, the most wins ever under a first-year coach. But it didn't end just on the football field. The Fighting Scots excelled in the classroom, including a cumulative team GPA of over 2.8 for the spring semester.

Head Coach

Browning became the first coach at Edinboro since Sox Harrison to win his first two games as head coach. That happened in 1926, the first year of football at the Boro. Thanks to a 28-14 win at West Chester, he became the first coach since Bill McDonald in 1969 to win his first game as head coach.

That victory, on the road at West Chester between a pair of 2005 NCAA playoff teams, also displayed Browning's propensity as a riverboat gambler. The Fighting Scots went for it on fourth down four times, and converted on three occasions.

The 2007 Fighting Scots finished with a 7-4 record while facing one of the most difficult schedules in recent memory. Edinboro faced four nationally-ranked teams, upsetting 25th-ranked Bloomsburg thanks to a memorable comeback, 42-41, while losing to eighth-ranked California (Pa.), 17th-ranked West Chester and 24th-ranked IUP. In fact, Edinboro's four losses came to teams which combined for

In 2008 Edinboro barely missed making the NCAA Playoffs while tying the school record for wins in a season, finishing at 9-2. The wins included a 24-17 decision over 16th-ranked Indiana(Pa.). The losses came by a combined seven points to 14th-ranked California(Pa.) and Mercyhurst. The Fighting Scots finished 20th in the final AFCA Division II rankings.

Browning also places a strong emphasis on academics. Each year a good number of Edinboro players acieve PSAC Scholar-Athlete status, and through the years many players have earned CoSIDA District 2 Academic All-American honors. This past year defensive end Bobby Kmetz and offensive lineman Jaycen Watts received the honor.

Most noteworthy among the academic honorees is Branden Williams. The former cornerback is a two-time Capital One Academic All-America® Division II Football Team selection, earning first team accolades in 2012 and second team in

Browning joined the Edinboro program in 1986 as the running backs coach under Steve Szabo. After two seasons on the offensive side of the ball, the graduate of The Ohio State University moved to the defensive side, serving as the defensive backfield coach under Hollman. In 1994 he moved back to offense as the offensive line coach. He had remained in charge of the linemen since that time, coaching such All-Americans as Jeremy O'Day, Joe Valvoda and Greg Bzorek. The last two years Browning's offensive line led the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference in

After serving as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in Lou Tepper's first season in 2000, Browning took over as the offensive coordinator in 2001. The Fighting Scot offense made great strides over the next five years. Browning emphasized a balanced attack which showcased the combination of a strong ground game and dangerous aerial attack. Over his last three seasons Edinboro averaged 29.9 ppg. in 2003, 33.2 ppg. in '04, and 31.4 ppg. in '05.

He had previously served as the offensive coordinator for five seasons under Hollman. In all, Browning had served as Edinboro's offensive line coach the previous 12 years.

All told, Browning has been either the head coach or an assistant coach on all eight of Edinboro's NCAA playoff teams, along with five of the nine PSAC champion squads.

"It goes without saying that I am extremely excited to have this opportunity," noted an elated Browning upon his hiring. "I was proud to be a part of the teams in the 1990's that ranked among the best in Division II, and over the last few years we have once again elevated the program to one of the best in the country. The University and the community of Edinboro mean a great deal to me. Over the years we have tried to become an integral part of this community. I am thrilled that I can continue that association while taking over a group of players that represent the ideals I believe in.

"I'm sure you will see some changes in the future, but I can tell you this, the ideals remain in place for this program, and always have in the time I've been here. Without question we want to be successful on the field, and that means challenging for the PSAC West title. But we won't compromise integrity. We will continue to bring in young men who have the ability to be successful both in the classroom and on the football field. It is my sincere belief that when they take the field, they must wear the Edinboro jersey with pride, and when they are in the community, that they have earned the respect that comes with being a Fighting Scot."

Browning has served on the staffs at three NCAA Division I institutions. Prior to joining the Fighting Scot staff, he coached receivers and running backs at Ohio State for two years while serving as a graduate assistant. That group included Keith Byars. The Buckeyes went to the Rose Bowl in 1984, dropping a 20-17 decision to USC to finish with a 9-3 record. The following year Ohio State went bowling again, this time defeating Brigham Young, 10-7, in the Citrus Bowl, to once again finish

Browning served as a graduate assistant coach at New Mexico State in 1982, and the following year instructed the receivers at Idaho State. Idaho State reached the NCAA Division I-AA Playoffs before suffering a 27-20 defeat to Ne-

A 1981 graduate of The Ohio State University with a bachelor's degree in Education, Browning began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Worthington High School and Dayton-Fairview High Schools in Ohio from 1979-81. Before transferring to Ohio State he attended Capital University where he played football for one season. Browning later earned a master's degree in Education Administration from New Mexico State in 1983.

Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers 16th Year Salisbury State '90

Wayne Bradford is in his 16th year as a member of the Edinboro coaching staff. He enters his ninth season as the Fighting Scot defensive coordinator, and had previously held the same title in 1999 under former head coach Tom Hollman. After over-

backers coach in 2006. He returned a year ago to work with the linemen. In addition, he serves as the recruiting coordinator.

Bradford has master-minded some brilliant defensive performances in recent years in a day and age when offense has taken over. For instance, in 2011 the Fighting Scots ranked eighth in Division II in scoring defense (17.0 ppg.), 11th in pass efficiency defense, and 18th in total defense (292.6 ypg.). Edinboro gave up fewer than twenty points in seven of its 11 games.

He orchestrated the top defense in the country in 2005, as Edinboro paced Division II in scoring defense (9.3 ppg.), total defense (211.2 ypg.), and

rushing defense (53.7 vpg.). In addition, Edinboro was third in pass efficiency defense and turnover margin. The Fighting Scots recorded three shutouts, the most since the 1975 team also shut out three opponents. A total of seven opponents were held to seven points or less.

In 2006 his defensive unit recorded two more shutouts while leading the PSAC in rushing defense (70.6 ypg.), good for third in the country.

In 2008 Bradford guided a young defense that ended up having five players earn All-PSAC honors. The Fighting Scot defense tied for second in the PSAC in scoring defense despite ranking no higher than fifth in any individual category.

Under Bradford's tutelage, Edinboro has had 32 first team All-PSAC West defensive performers. In

fact, he has been responsible for three PSAC West Defensive Players of the Year, with Ben Stroup earning the honor in 2006, Chris Amico the 2005 recipient, and Seth Fragale the winner in 2004. This past year he coached a pair of defensive linemen - Bobby Kmetz and Chris Williams - to second team All-

Bradford joined the Edinboro coaching staff after serving as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Salisbury State, since 1990, and was the Sea Gulls' defensive coordinator from 1994-98. He began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1990, serving as an assistant coach in charge of the linebackers (1990-92) and defensive linemen (1992-94). In 1994, he was promoted to defensive coordinator.

In 1997, Salisbury State ranked 38th in NCAA Division III in total defense, allowing just 268 yards per game. His 1995 defensive unit produced a first team AFCA All-American at linebacker, and helped the Sea Gulls finish 7-2 with a berth in the ECAC Southwest Championship Game.

Bradford graduated from Salisbury State in 1990 with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration. He completed work on his master's degree in Business Administration from Salisbury State in 1992. In addition to working as a member of the football staff, Bradford was a faculty member in the School of Business. Beginning in 1996, he was the Director of the Business Graduate Programs for the Perdue School of Business.

His 2011 unit also ranked first in the conference in pass defense, only allowing ten touchdowns through the air. The 2009 Cougar defense led the UMAC in total defense and showcased five all-conference performers.

Minnesota-Morris enjoyed its finest season in twenty years in Battle's second year, as the 2006 Cougar squad finished with a 7-3 record. The 2006 team won the UMAC championship.

Before coming to UMM, Battle coached the defensive line and defensive backs at Western Washington University from 2003-05. He again was involved with a conference champion, as the Vikings won the 2003 Great Northwest Athletic Conference.

Battle began his coaching career in 2001 as a graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, Idaho State, working with the tight ends. Once again, he earned a championship ring as the 2002 team won the Big Sky Conference championship.

Battle was a four-year letter winner at linebacker at Idaho State from 1995-98. He earned second team All-Big Sky honors as a senior. He was also named the team's Defensive Player of the Year in 1998 and was a team captain. He would complete work on his bachelor's degree in Physical Education from Idaho State in 2001, and is currently working on a master's degree.

A native of Miami, FL, Battle was a standout at Miami Killian Senior High School, earning first team All-Miami Dade County honors in 1994 and being named the Defensive Player of the Year.

Edinboro's new offensive coordinator is no stranger to western Pennsylvania. He graduated from Plum High School in Pittsburgh, then went on to earn his undergraduate degree from Clarion University in 1992, majoring in Communications. He would receive his master's degree in Education from Robert Morris in 1998.

The 2008 squad finished with a 9-7 record during the regular season, but then made an unlikely run as a wild card playoff team to the Super Bowl. Arizona defeated Atlanta (30-24), Carolina (33-13) and Philadelphia (32-25) in the NFC Championship game, before falling to Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLIII by a

In 2009-10 Miller was elevated to the passing game coordinator. With Kurt Warner as the starting quarterback, the 2009 Cardinals finished with a 10-6 record and was first in the NFL in red zone efficiency. Arizona defeated Green Bay in overtime before losing to New Orleans in the second round of the NFC playoffs.

Miller most recently served as the assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach for the Montreal Alouettes of the CFL in 2013. He proudly points out that the injury-wracked Alouettes did something rarely accomplished – have four different starting quarterbacks win two games.

Tabitha Bemis and Dan Altavilla Named 2013-14 PSAC Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference is pleased to announce Mercyhurst's Dan Altavilla and Edinboro's Tabitha Bemis as its 2013-14 Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year. Altavilla and Bernis were selected by the league's sports information directors.

The Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year are presented to the top student-athletes who have achieved at least a 3.50 cumulative grade point average while competing at an outstanding athletic level. To be eligible for the awards, a student-athlete must have been recognized as a fall, winter or spring PSAC Top 10 award winner in the same academic year.

Bemis, a sports and recreation major with a 3.92 grade point average, was a two-time All-American at the 2014 NCAA Division II Outdoor Track and Field Championships, making her a six-time All-American (four indoor, two outdoor). She is a two-time PSAC Outdoor Field Athlete of the Year and a three-time PSAC Indoor Field Athlete of the Year, as she has won 15 PSAC Championship titles in her career. This season she placed fifth in the triple jump (43' 3 1/4") at the NCAA Outdoor National Championship and eighth in the long jump (19' 9"). At the indoor championship she placed second in the long jump (19' 8 1/4") and seventh in the triple jump (40' 9 3/"). Bemis is the first PSAC athlete to be named to six PSAC Top 10 rosters, and is a three-time Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Altavilla

Altavilla, a sports medicine/pre-physical therapy major with a 3.70 grade point average, was a baseball Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team selection as well as being the inaugural winner of the Brett Tomko Award given to Division II's most outstanding pitcher. He was named the ABCA/Rawlings Division II National Pitcher of the Year, and the Daktronics' Ron Lenz Division II National Pitcher of the Year, while being a First Team All-American from

ABCA/Rawlings, Daktronics, and NCBWA. In 12 starts this season he accumulated nine wins and established a 1.23 ERA. He led Division II with 129 strikeouts to set a new Mercyhurst season standard and limited opponents to a .167 batting average. Altavilla broke a 99 year-old PSAC record when he tossed 19 strikeouts in 7.2 innings of work in the opening game of the PSAC Championship against West Chester. Altavilla was drafted in the fifth round and 141st overall in the Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft by the Seattle Mariners, marking the highest draft pick in Mercyhurst history.

Sox Harrison Stadium

Sox Harrison Stadium



Sox Harrison Stadium serves as the home of the Fighting Scots. Dedicated in 1965, the stadium honors the memory of B. Regis "Sox" Harrison, the head football and basketball coach at Edinboro University for 34 years. Sox Harrison was the key figure in the building of Edinboro's athletic program, unselfishly devoting 34 years of service to the University as an athletic director, coach and physical education instructor. Appropriately, he was the first member inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1982.



Harrison coached the Fighting Scot football team from its inception in 1926 to 1938, the returned to guide the gridders in 1941 and '42. In addition, he coached the men's basketball team for 23 seasons, from 1928-53, winning 175 games.

The stadium received a facelift several years ago, giving it a spanking new look. Most noticeable was the installation of an artificial surface, Sportexe, to replace the natural grass. And it is now illuminated, with lights being installed for the first time. The first night game was played on xxx against xxxx. Finally, a new scoreboard was installed.

Sox Harrison Stadium seats 6,000 people in its two grandstands, along with plenty of standing room. In addition to press boxes on both sides of the stadium, the facility has locker rooms, a training room and complete amenities for fans.

Trevor Harris (below) became the third Edinboro University football player to finish as a finalist for the Harlon Hill Trophy, presented annually to the top player in NCAA Division II football. Harris was a finalist in 2008 after being a Northeast Re-

gion finalist in 2007.

Running back Elbert Cole was one of three finalists in 1989, while wide receiver Ernest Priester was a finalist a year later. Cole placed third in the '89 balloting. He earned All-American honors in 1989, receiving first team accolades from Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, second team recognition from Football Gazette, and third team status from Associated Press.

Cole rushed for 1.507 vards and set Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference records for touchdowns (24) and points (148). He led the Fighting Scots to the PSAC West title, a 8-3 record and a number seven ranking in the final Division II

Priester was runnerup to North Dakota State's Chris Simdorn in 1990 when the Bison claimed the Division II national title. Priester was the PSAC Western Division Co-Player of the Year in 1990. He was also recognized by Kodak/American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press and the Football Gazette as a first team All-American.


The wide receiver hauled in 47 passes for 1,102 yards and 15 TDs. Edinboro fin-

Question & Answer with Cody Harris by Bob Shreve, Sports Information Director



This week we talk with quarterback Cody Harris. On the field he ranks second in most passing and total offense career statistics, trailing only his brother Trevor. Off the field he is a Human Performance major with a 3.86 GPA who will graduate in December.

Q. You were granted a sixth year of eligibility after breaking ribs last year. What were your

thoughts when you were first injured and learned of the severity?

A. "I went home and got an x-ray. I was pretty upset honestly because I wanted to play football that year but it was God's plan for me. Kind of just went with it after that and listed to Coach Browning and the coaches and got the sixth year."

Q. At what point did you realize that you wouldn't be able to return during the season?

A. "It was actually the following week when I went home, got the x-ray, and 'hey you broke two of your ribs'. I was like 'that's a good thing (laughed)'. I called Coach Browning and we talked about the sixth year to see if that would be a possibility."

Q. You are working with a third offensive coordinator in Mike Miller. What are thoughts in regards to being with a third offensive coordinator during

A. "Actually it's my fourth (he grinned). It's my fourth offensive coordinator but it's awesome working with Coach Miller. He's a professional. We're getting close. We're getting there. Kind of takes some time to put an offense in. Continue repetition, repetition. We're getting there."

Q. How difficult was it with Mike Miller not coming in until August and having to pick up a new system? How different is that system?

A. "It's very different, very different. There's a lot of different things with protection-wise and the way you throw hot routes and the way that receivers run routes. It's very, very different, something completely new to me. But it's something that I really like and really adapting to. I'm starting to really love it."

Q. You've played three games so far, the fourth one coming up at Cal this weekend. Where would you say the offense is? How much has been put in, how much growth for this offense?

A. "The sky's the limit for us. Especially with Coach Miller. Just because he has so much knowledge and so much information that we've yet to even tap into. So far as the season we've kind of struggled here and there and put ourselves in bad situations but we just look forward to one game at a time. The sky's the limit for us."

Q. Your brother Trevor was a somewhat renowned quarterback at Edinboro. How difficult was it following in his footsteps?

Q. Trevor is now playing professionally in Canada. How has he impacted your career as a football player and a student?

A. "Experience. Professionalism. Trevor knows more than I do. Calling him to get just little tips of information. What he sees and how he would deal with certain situations or kind of things you see in a film room. I kind of call him and say 'hey what would you do'. He kind of tells me and I can talk to the offensive coordinator and we can kind of come up with something that maybe would be a little bit better than what he initially thought. It's awesome to have him as sort of a go-to guy to go to outside of the coaching staff to have some real good

Q. We talked a little bit about your academics. You are a 3.8+ student. How do you balance the demands of football along with being such a successful athlete? What would you recommend for others.

A. "It's really prioritizing your schedule and your time and stuff. You know. when you have 15 minutes you have to open the books for a little bit, glance at your notes and kind of look over stuff so that when it comes to test time or a project or whatever you're ready to go. It's not like your cramming the night before. It's kind of a gradual thing you really have to prioritize your scheduling. Schedule when you're going to study and practice."

O. Your mother and father have rarely missed a game. They both have been through a lot during that time period. Talk about how they impacted you and what their support has meant to you.

A. "I can't even explain that. It's tough to explain. Their love for me is unreal. They're always here for me. It's extraordinary how great of parents they are. I've literally never had any problems with my parents. Anything I've ever wanted I've gotten. If I've needed anything they've always been there. I can't even put it into words."

Q. There's a time period, particularly early in your career, where your mom was pretty seriously ill. How much did that impact what you're doing now both as a student and an athlete?

A. "When she was sick and they got in a motorcycle accident I kind of took care

of them just because my brother and my sisters were gone or they have their own family. It's tough for them so I kind of was the guy there. Just little things like that kind of pushed me towards like really that's what I want to do. You know because I enjoy doing that. Especially taking care of my parents. Also I just like the medical field and understanding what was going on with them and how I can help them really impressed me towards being a PA and that's kind of the track I've taken and understanding that's what I want to do."




