TALENTED NEWCOMERS AND VETS STRENGTHEN SCOT DIAMOND MEN

With the help of a southern trip that will hopefully give Edinboro State diamond men an equal start with the rest of its competition, Fighting Scot head mentor, Bill LaRosa, is looking forward to a successful season of baseball competition.

"We have better balance than we've had in quite a while and we're a much better defensive club," commented LaRosa. "If our pitching comes through, we should have a real good year," continued the Scot mentor.

With eleven lettermen forming the nucleus of his team, LaRosa should get plenty of offensive help from a lineup that returns four of his five top sticks. Leading the batting brigade is sophomore outfielder Jim Sekel along with combination catcher-first baseman Jeff Ellis, a junior who owns a pair of varsity letters. Sekel stroked at a .476 pace last season while Ellis pounded out a .429 mark.

Centerfielder Dennis Runyan and team captain Denny Belcastro are also top timber toters with identical .333 averages a year ago. Joining the senior duo is sophomore shortstop Mike Basehart who finished at .500 in his brief stint at the plate.

Still on hand to provide veteran services are pitcher Tom VanVolkenburg, catcher Mike Ropelewski and outfielder Don Walker.

Expecting to help fill gaps in the lineup are first baseman Tom Klochak, shortstop Bill Evans, third baseman Dave Bruno, outfielder Lee Adams, second baseman Don Stewart and second sacker Mark Fuller. Also on tap are sophomore backstopper Dale Cochran and freshman catcher Tim Cacchion.

A quartet of veteran twirlers form the core of LaRosa's pitching staff. Front liners returning to the mound are triple letter winner Bill Bules, sophomore George Pakutz, VanVolkenburg and junior Doug Boyer. Likewise battling for starting nods are sophomores Tim Wheeler and Pat Wallace. All but Bules are right handers.

"Ellis, Sekel and Runyan will undoubtedly be our top hitters," revealed LaRosa. "If the rest of our guys could bat at least .250, we should be in great shape."

LEADING THE ESC BASEBALL TEAM...

In 1972, Bill LaRosa was named to lead the Edinboro State's baseball program as the Fighting Scots' new diamond coach.

LaRosa, a Seward, Pa., native began his baseball career in Johnstown where he played junior league ball as a catcher in 1948 and 1949. As a result of his outstanding play on the diamond, he was chosen to represent Johnstown in the "AAA" Baseball Association Tournament.

While serving for three years with the United States Air Force, he was attached to the Special Services and played on the USAF Championship Baseball Team. He was voted the Most Valuable Player of the European Tourney when the team qualified for the World Finals in Denver, Colorado.

Upon completion of his military obligations in 1953, he signed with the Washington Senators for a sizable bonus. Starting with Class "B" ball in the Piedmont League at Hagerstown, Maryland, he moved up the ladder to "A" play in Hobbs, New Mexico. Along the way, he spent stints with the Erie Sailors in Class "A" competition at "AA" at Charlotte, N.C.

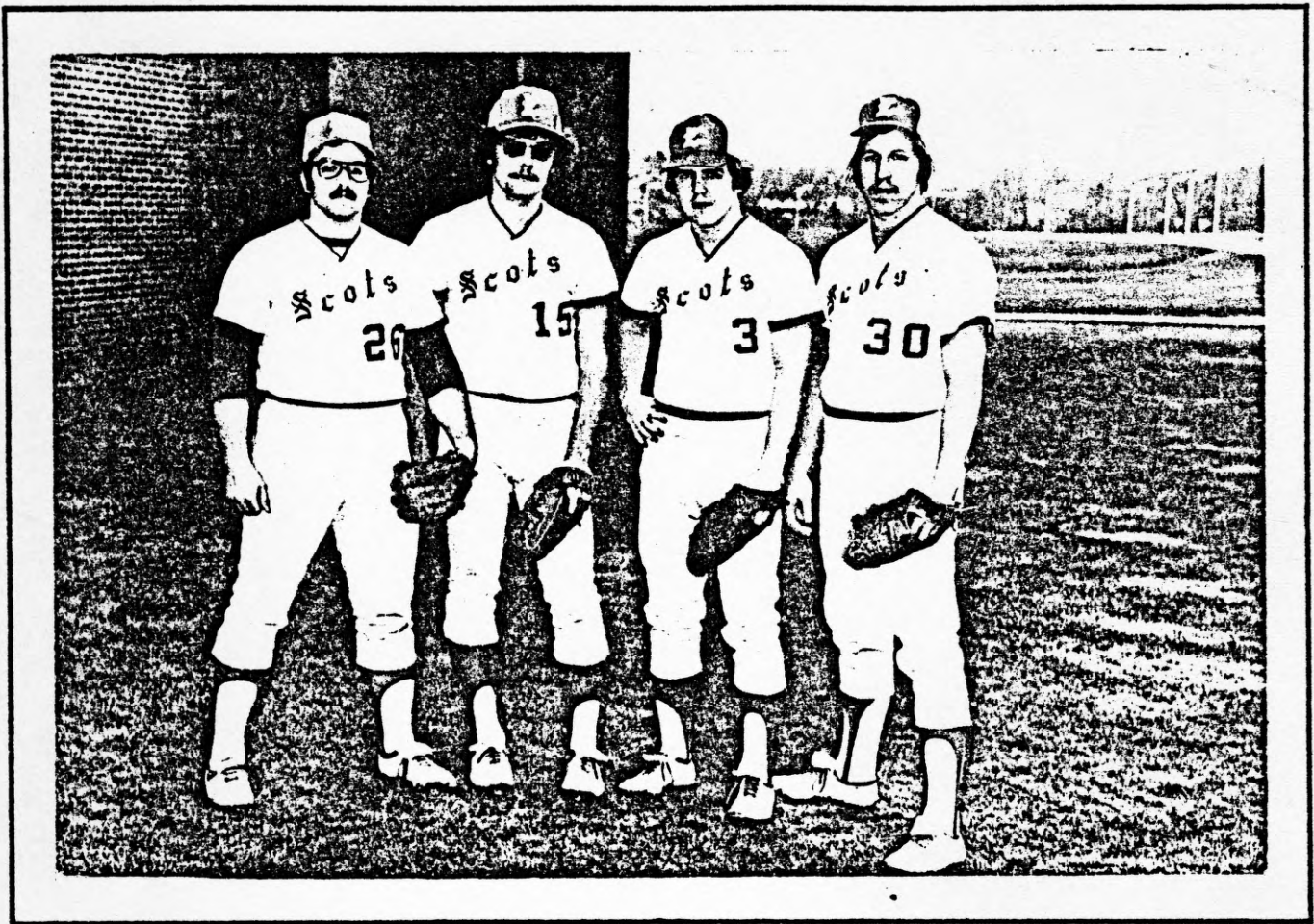
After deciding to make his home permanently in Erie in 1954, LaRosa took a position with Hayes Manufacturing where he is currently employed as a supervisor.

The Scot mentor also serves as a part-time scout for the Major League Baseball Scouting System.

In 1972, Coach LaRosa guided the Fighting Scots to the Pennsylvania State Conference Baseball Championship with a 13-8 record.

LaRosa, his wife, Florence, and their children, Billy Joe (20), Raymond (16) and Ralph (13) reside in Erie.

DENNY BELCASTRO - 3B, 5-10, 190 Lbs., Senior, Aliquippa, Pa.

Captain of this year's Scot squad, Denny has been a solid fixture at 3rd base since his sophomore year...Among the offensive leaders last season while batting at a .333 clip...Named to the Section 5 All-Star team in 1972 at Aliquippa High...His hustling style of play and aggressive bat make him a consistent player..."Bells" hit a grand slam home run in his first collegiate time at bat...A speech communications major.

MARK FULLER - 2B, 6-1, 185 Lbs., Sophomore, New Florence, Pa.

A shortstop converted secondbaseman, Mark appeared in 7 games last season as a freshman...A good power hitter, but still needs to be more consistent...An All-Conference selection in high school at Laurel Valley...A criminology major, Mark appears to have the inside track on becoming the Scots' starting secondbaseman.

WILLIAM EVANS - SS, 5-11, 170 Lbs., Junior, Pittsburgh, Pa.

A starter last year, Billy developed into a very consistent fielder...Has a fluid motion in the field with a strong and accurate throwing arm...A graduate of St. Marys High School, Billy lettered three times in basketball, while receiving four varsity letters in baseball...An All-Conference Catholic Class B selection...An English major with a focus in criminal justice.

TOM VANVOLKENBURG - P/INF, 6-1, 195 Lbs., Senior, Erie, Pa.

Recent development of a change-up will help Tom become an effective hurler for the Scots...Saw limited action on the mound last season due to arm problems... Will be in the lineup every day, either pitching or playing the infield...A graduate of Cathedral Prep, Tom collected six letters in baseball and basketball ...Named First Team All-City baseball team in 1972...Majoring in business economics.

MIKE BASEHART - SS, 6-0, 170 Lbs., Sophomore, Tonawanda, N.Y.

Last season, Mike showed excellent range and a good arm in the field...Developed into a very consistent fielder...Led the team in hitting last season when he batted .500 while seeing limited action...Captained the Kenmore East High team in 1971...Has the ability to hit to the opposite field...An outstanding all-around athlete, Mike is the goalie for the ESC hockey team...A geology major.

DAVID BRUNO - 3B, 5-10, 155 Lbs., Sophomore, Erie, Pa.

A very good defensive ball player, Dave appeared in five games last season as a reserve infielder...Displays a strong throwing arm...Cited by his teammates at Tech Memorial as Most Valuable Player in 1974...Dave was also named to the All-City team 3 years in a row, while receiving a Golden Glove award in 1974... Majoring in Geography.

DON WALKER - CF-RF, 6-0, 180 Lbs Senior, Wilkinsburg, Pa.

One of the Scots' eleven returning letter winners from a year ago, Don possesses excellent speed and a good throwing arm which make him a fine defensive outfielder...Probably will start this season in rightfield... Nicknamed "Fro" by his teammates Don captained the 1971 baseball team at Wilkinsburg High School. A member of the ESC Wrestling Team, Don is an elementary education major.

DENNY RUNYAN - CF, 5-10, 175 Lbs Senior, Springdale, Pa.

A consistent performer both offensively and defensively, Denny has been a starter for the Scots the past three seasons... Led the team in stolen bases last year with four while batting .333 with two home runs and eight RBI's...Named 2nd Team All-State Pennsylvania Conference Western Division...A sociology-criminal justice major, Denny enjoys hunting in the off-season.

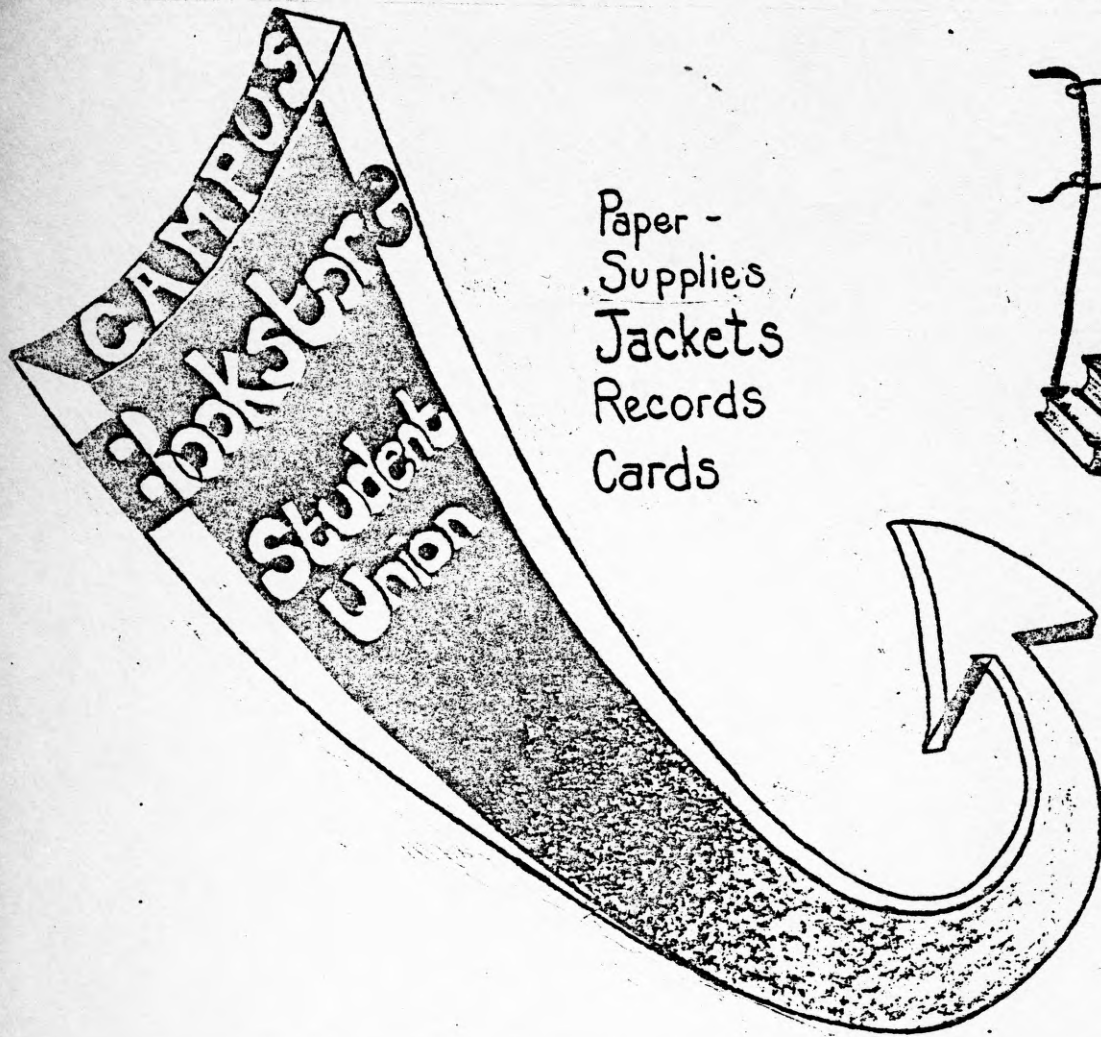

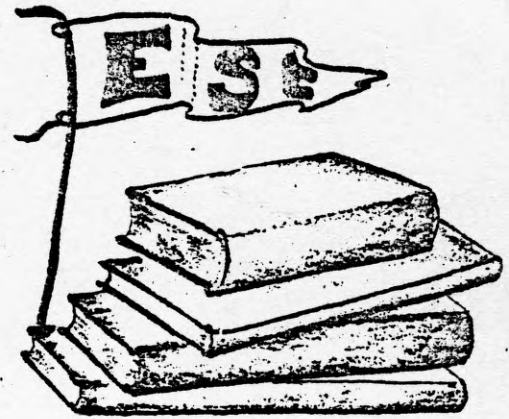
