Head Coach John Radovich



Fighting Scot head baseball coach John Radovich returns for his 13th season at Edinboro University. Radovich has guided the Scots to the PSAC Tournament three of the past six years. In 1994 he became the first head coach since 1971 to lead Edinboro to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference crown. The 1994 squad, which was ranked as high as 16th in NCAA Division II, also advanced to the Division II playoffs for the first time in school history and hosted the Northeast Regionals, where the Scots lost two games and finished with a record of 35-18.

The 1999 Boro edition returned to the PSAC playoffs for the first time in four years under Radovich, finishing with a 30-21 record. The 30 wins by the Scots

marked the fourth time under Radovich that the Scots finished a season with 30-or-more wins and was the first 30-win season since 1995.

In 1995, the Fighting Scots, who were ranked as high as 11th nationally during the regular season, finished second in the PSAC and once again returned to post-season play. Edinboro concluded the campaign with a 30-22 ledger.

Five players under Radovich have been taken in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft in the past ten years, including right-handed pitcher Mark Corey. Corey was the Scots' highest-ever draft choice when he was selected by the Cincinnati Reds in the fourth round of the 1994 amateur draft.

Radovich owns an overall record of 257-299-2 with the Fighting Scots, and including five seasons at the Community College of Allegheny-South Campus (CCAC) in Pittsburgh, shows a career record of 401-353-2.

His CCAC-South teams posted a 144-63 record, winning the Western Pennsylvania Collegiate Conference Championship in 1984 and 1986, and capturing the state junior college title in 1984. His 1983 and 1985 teams won sectional championships at CCAC. Also, Radovich coached in the Keystone State Games for four seasons, with his teams capturing three golds and one silver medal.

Head Coach John Radovich

Radovich began his coaching career at his alma mater, Central Catholic High School in Pittsburgh as an assistant. In 1979, his Viking squad earned a berth in the PIAA finals, finishing third in the state.

Upon arriving at Edinboro in 1987, Radovich orchestrated major renovations to the baseball complex that now make it one of the top facilities in the northwest Pennsylvania.

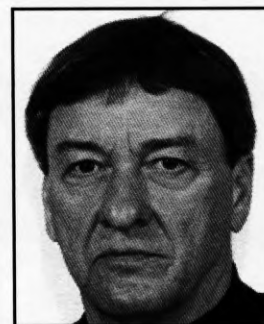


During his collegiate coaching career, Radovich has been honored by various organizations. In 1986 he was named "Coach of the Year" at CCAC. Radovich was also honored by Edinboro University as "Coach of the Year" in 1991. After his team set an Edinboro all-time best 17-3 conference record in 1994, Radovich was named as the PSAC "Coach of the Year." He captured the honor again in 1999.

The improvement of facilities, and the commitment towards the program, have led to the right attitude for the Edinboro baseball program. That attitude can be attributed to the intelligence, personality and effort of John Radovich.

Scots Shooting for Another Post-Season Berth

A year ago the Edinboro University baseball team fell just shy of reaching the NCAA Division II Playoffs. Coach John Radovich's squad posted a 30-21 record, reaching the PSAC Tournament for the first time since 1995. If not for a 10-inning loss to Kutztown, followed by a 14-inning setback to Slippery Rock, the Fighting Scots may have attained an NCAA playoff berth.

With a solid core of returning veterans, plus some talented newcomers, Radovich sees no reason why the Scots can't again challenge for postseason play.

"With the team we have returning, and the accolades they had last year, I think we can make it back to the PSAC playoffs," noted the veteran mentor. "We lost two extra inning games and finished fifth, right on the bubble. We'll miss some players from last year, but we brought in some kids who can do the job. And the pitching staff is made up largely of upperclassmen."

Oddly enough, Radovich's biggest concern is not defense or pitching, but health. He plans on carrying just 25 players, and fears a rash of injuries could leave the Scots shorthanded.

"We need to keep everybody healthy," stressed Radovich. "Some guys were not healthy in the fall. Also, our infield will be revamped, so we need to get them meshed together. With our pitching and defense, and potentially how well we can hit, our number one concern is health, along with good fundamental infield defense."

Here's a look at the 2000 Fighting Scots, position-by-position:

INFIELD

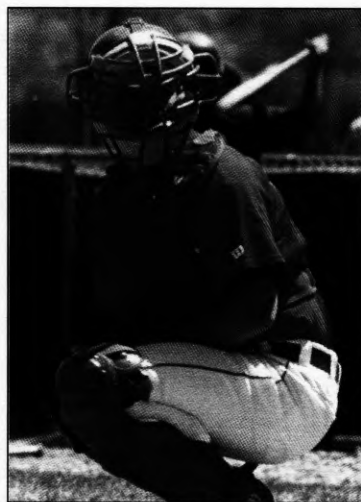
Senior Jason Blank is the lone returning starter from last year's infield. A second team All-PSAC West selection at first base, Blank made great strides a year ago both offensively and defensively. Blank hit .297 with a team-leading 4 home runs. The lefty swinger drove in

30 runs, good for fourth on the team, and belted 10 doubles.

Erik Glus enjoyed a strong freshman campaign while rotating between designated hitter, first base and pitcher. Now the sophomore will be asked to take over at third. While a new position, Glus is a solid athlete who was an infielder in high school. There's no question about his bat. He hit .344, third on the team, to earn first team All-PSAC West accolades at designated hitter. Glus drove in 28 runs.

The middle infield is totally new, but Radovich loves the enthusiasm Jaime Luna and Geoff Schaab bring to the team. Luna is a junior who transferred from El Paso Junior College. He can play either second or short, but will likely line up at shortstop, with freshman Schaab at second. An All-Western New York selection as a senior, Schaab bats from the left side and is the fastest player on the team. He is expected to bat leadoff.

Radovich likes the depth in the infield. Ryan Anderson returns after sitting out the '99 campaign. The senior will serve in a utility role and see plenty of action.

He can play all of the infield positions plus the outfield. He owns a .296 career average.

Freshman D.J. Sammel will back up at the corners. A middle infielder in high school, at 6'3" and 198 lbs. he is more suited to play first or third. He's a good all-around athlete with raw baseball skills.

Edinboro has a pair of strong catchers in Hethe McCollum and Dan Domenico. Radovich feels McCollum, a junior, is the best defensive catcher in the PSAC. He also looks for him to improve offensively after hitting .232 a year ago.

Domenico, meanwhile, is still learning the intricacies of catching after seeing most of his time in the outfield. While his defense must improve, the sophomore possesses a solid bat and has good speed. He hit .224 with one home run in 58 at bats.

OUTFIELD

As far as Radovich is concerned, he has four starting outfielders to fill the three spots. Leading the way is Shaun Mosberger, the Freshman of the Year two years ago and a first team All-PSAC West selection last year. Radovich rates the junior center fielder as one of the top outfielders in Division II. A year ago, Mosberger was second on the team with a .355 average and a team-high 36 RBIs. He also displayed plenty of pop, with 12 doubles, 5 triples and a pair of homers.

Seniors Jeff Miele and Frank Koch return in right and left, respectively. Miele hit .285 with 20 RBIs and 10 stolen bases, while Koch came in at .264, but led the Scots with 24 walks.

Newcomer Brian King, a transfer from Mercyhurst-North East, will see plenty of action. The sophomore has the best arm of the group, along with plenty of power. Domenico will also see some time in the outfield when not behind the plate.

PITCHERS

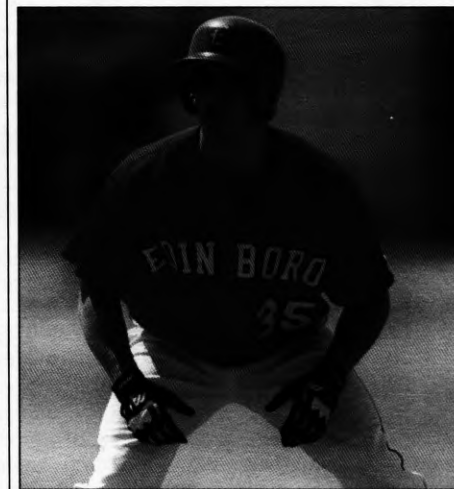
The one-two punch of Shaun Hayes and Bill Bendis is unrivaled in the PSAC. Both were first team All-PSAC West performers a year ago, with Hayes being named an ABCA second team All-American.

Hayes, a senior righthander, posted a 9-2 record with a 2.63 ERA. In 82 innings, he allowed just 63 hits and 41 walks while striking out 71. He needs just three victories to set the school record for career wins.

Bendis, meanwhile is a hard-throwing southpaw. The 6'4", 228 lb. senior returned from offseason elbow surgery to post a 7-3 mark with a minuscule 1.65 ERA. In 60 innings, he allowed just 42 hits and 23 walks while striking out a school-record 74. He holds the career strikeout record with 161.

After that twosome, Radovich notes that the Scots possess a lot of other pitchers who have shown they can beat anybody on any given day.

Radovich has a luxury in that the roster features plenty of left handed pitching candidates. Senior Bill Irons (2-3, 2.57 ERA) and junior Mike Evans (3-3, 4.39 ERA) are prime candidates to start.

Radovich felt Irons stepped forward a year ago, while Evans was strong in the PSAC Tournament. Senior Joe Garvin and Craig Kaufman also throw from the left side. Garvin was 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA, while Kaufman was 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA.

From the right side, senior Brad Kocher and sophomore Sean Beers will battle for starting roles. Kocher struggled after undergoing back surgery, going 1-4 with a 6.39 ERA. Beers saw limited action but showed promise. He was 1-2 with a 6.00 ERA.

Another returnee, senior Randy Powierza, will see time in relief. He was

1-2 with a 5.82 ERA in 15 appearances.

Radovich will try to groom several newcomers. Freshman Chris Weibl is raw but possesses plenty of talent. Junior Brad Orlando is a transfer from Penn State who has not played baseball since high school, but has the ability to be the team's closer if he throws strikes.

Joe Cipalla, a sophomore, is a transfer from Mercyhurst-North East, while fellow sophomore Travis Butcher attended Pitt-Titusville last year. Both are right handers. Butcher, in particular, impressed in the fall.

Year in Review

The 1999 baseball season will go down as one of the most successful in a number of years for the Edinboro University baseball team, but it will also be remembered for its bittersweet ending.

For the record, John Radovich's team finished with a 30-21 ledger, the fourth 30-win campaign during his tenure and the first since 1995. The Fighting Scots trailed only Slippery Rock in the PSAC Western Division standings, posting a 15-5 record compared to the Rockets' 18-2 finish.

Edinboro qualified for the PSAC Tournament for the first time since '95, but entered postseason action the losers of three of its final four regular season contests.

The Scots faced Kutztown, the top seed out of the Eastern Division, in the opening round of the PSAC Tournament. Neither team could push a run across over the first nine innings, but an error in the bottom of the 10th allowed Kutztown to score the winning run in a 1-0 game. The loss spoiled a masterful effort by Bill Bendis. The big lefty allowed just 3 hits while striking out 7, but the Scots could manage just two safeties.

The loss dropped Edinboro into the losers bracket against rival Slippery Rock. The Rockets bested Edinboro in three of four regular season meetings, and would ultimately oust the Scots from the playoffs, but not before the two teams battled 14 innings. Slippery Rock pushed across two runs in the top of the 14th, and while Edinboro put two runners on in the bottom of the frame, the Scots were unable to score. The Scots had sent the contest into extra innings on Jason Blank's two-run homer in the eighth.

The '99 campaign hardly opened as if postseason play was in the future. After going 3-2 in the Builders Invitational to open the season, the Boro won just 4 of 12 contests in Fort Myers, FL to bring a 7-10 record back north.

Independent contests with Alderson Broaddus, Fairmont State and Salem-Teikyo left the Scots with a 10-13 ledger heading into conference action.

The Scots caught fire once PSAC play

began. Edinboro won five of its first six league contests, and ran off a pair of six-game winning streaks during April. At one point, the Boro won 10 of 11 games, with the lone loss by a run at Indiana(Pa.).

Timely hitting and strong pitching were the Boro trademarks in 1999. With wooden bats being used in all league games and a number of independent tilts, the Scots hit just 14 home runs, but still boasted a healthy .298 team average.

Senior SS Brian Junker led the way with a .363 average, adding 14 doubles, 31 RBIs and 15 stolen bases. Sophomore OF Shaun Mosberger hit at a .355 clip and led the Scots with 36 RBIs. Newcomer Erik Glus added a .344 average, while Jeremy Sherman-Lear, a sophomore third baseman, hit .335.

The Scots compiled an impressive 3.90 ERA, thanks in large part to the tandem of Bendis and Shaun Hayes. Bendis was 7-3 with a miniscule 1.65 ERA, striking out a school-record 74 in 60 innings and giving up just 42 hits. Hayes, a junior right-hander, finished 9-2 with a 2.63 ERA. In 82 innings, he allowed 63 hits and struck out 71. Both hurlers were accorded first team All-PSAC West honors, with Hayes ultimately earning second team All-American accolades.

Junior lefty Bill Irons chipped in with a 2-3 mark but a fine 2.57 ERA. Another lefty, Mike Evans, went 3-3 with a 4.39 ERA.

Fighting Scots In The Pros

Since the arrival of John Radovich, five Fighting Scots have been selected in the annual Major League Baseball Amateur draft, held each June. Four pitchers and one position player have signed major-league contracts with professional teams. Edinboro baseball is currently represented in the Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, and Texas Rangers organizations.

Mark Corey is the only former Fighting Scot still currently active. Drafted in 1995, Corey was traded a year ago to the New York Mets organization. The Cincinnati Reds selected Corey in the fourth round, the highest draft choice ever at Edinboro.

Corey played at Double A Binghamton a year ago. A member of the starting rotation, he led the Mets in innings pitched with 155, allowing 175 hits with 64 walks and 111 strikeouts. Corey finished with a 7-13 record and a 5.40 ERA.

After two injury-plagued seasons, Corey enjoyed a breakthrough season in 1998 while playing most of the year at Class A Burlington. He went 12-6 with a 2.44 ERA at Burlington, walking just 36 batters in 140 innings. After winning his last six starts, with shutouts in two of his last three outings, Corey was promoted to Class AAA Indianapolis. He was later sent back down to Class AA Chattanooga.

All told, Corey tied for the Cincinnati organization lead in wins (12) and ranked fourth in ERA (3.39) and strikeouts (117). His seven complete games tied for the minor league lead. While splitting time at three different levels, Corey was 12-11 with a 3.39 ERA in 172 innings.

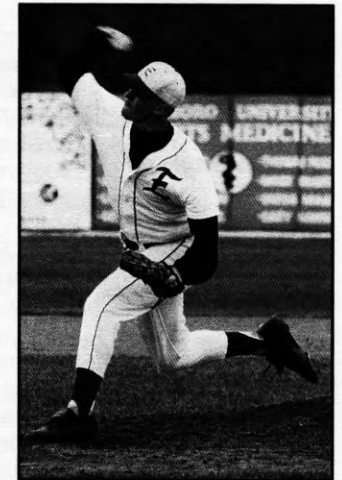
Corey holds the Edinboro record for career wins (17). He previously held the standards for career complete games (14) and strikeouts (154), along with season strikeouts (73). All were broken this past year.

Right-handed pitcher Pete Nyari was selected in the 17th round of the 1994 draft by the Philadelphia Phillies. Nyari reached Class AA Wilkes-Barre in 1998 before being released by the Phillies two winters ago. He enjoyed his finest campaign in 1997, appearing in 31 games, with 5 saves and a 2.70 ERA.

Tim Codd is a third Radovich pitching disciple selected in the draft. Codd, a 46th round selection of the Texas Rangers in 1995, recorded a 7-1 record in his first season of professional baseball at Class A Hudson Valley, before suffering arm injuries in 1996.

Two other former Fighting Scots also played professional baseball. In 1993, first baseman Brad Aurilia was chosen in the 38th round by the Montreal Expos. Aurilia holds various career hitting and fielding records for the Fighting Scots, including most at bats (561), games (179) and putouts (1,099).

In 1988, left-handed pitcher Tom Matthews became the first player under Radovich to be drafted when he was selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers. In his only season at Edinboro, Matthews compiled a 4-5 record before joining the Dodgers organization after his junior year.
