"Running Scots"—Depth, Talent, Desire

Traditionally optimistic Doug Watts might have every reason in the world to be beaming once again. Returning to lead the Scot running assault is four-time All-American sensation, Dave Antognoli, a senior from Akron, Ohio, who has won 45 straight dual meet titles. The undefeated distance ace will serve as captain for the 1972 squad.

First place finishes have become a steady diet with the 5'7" performer who seems to set a new course mark or win some kind of championship every time he runs. He holds Edinboro records in the mile (4:16.9), the two mile (9:02.1), the three mile (13:40.1) and the six mile (28:24.7) in track to add to his cross country laurels.

Returnees who are also pressing hard in top positions include Roland Champ, Gary Gotsch and Bill Deckman.

Champ was consistently among the top five last year and will be counted on for high finishes once again.

Junior college transfers Steve Turk and Bill Herman bring needed experience to the roster and also figure highly in the Scots 1972 hopes.

'We expect Turk and Herman to push for positions in our top five immediately," commented Watts. "Of course, there will be some real stern competition after Antognoli and a number of our runners could take turns climbing into scoring places."

Joining the leaders is Mark Roche, a junior newcomer who has been improving steadily and will be striving to be a top finisher.

Pushing for spots among the front runners are freshmen John Foreman and Bob Stonecipher. Foreman was an outstanding high school star and has recorded a 4:20 mile while teammate Stonecipher also has a list of impressive scholastic credentials.

Rounding out the Scot rookies are Mark Flanick, one of the fastest men on the team; Greg Baker, Pat Loque, Tom Brockman and Bruce Zymlinski.

"Our number one goal is to reclaim the Pennsylvania Conference title," summarized Watts.





Scots Shine With Watts

Coach Doug Watts enters his fourth year of bringing national distinction to Edinboro State's track and cross country teams.

A collegiate middle distance and cross country runner for the University of Akron, Watts was a vital part of Zip teams that lost only one dual track meet in a four-year span while once finishing as NCAA college-division runners-up in cross country.

The successful Akron ace simultaneously launched both his coaching career and Walsh Jesuit High's running sports programs. His two year record at the Cuyahoga Falls (Ohio) school showed winning campaigns in track and his cross country team finished unbeaten both years (19-0) while winning the district title.

Joining Edinboro State in 1969, Watts was faced with the challenge of initiating cross country as a varsity sport and also serving as the Scots' head track coach. The youthful mentor quickly established a winning tradition with outstanding distance runners and track performers. His three year cross country record stands at 21-6 while his cindermen are 11-5-1. The "Running Scots" have also claimed numerous invitational titles and finished high in national standings. Seventeen of 20 ESC track records have been broken under his tutorship.

The Scots captured the Pennsylvania Conference cross country championship in 1970, finished 19th nationally and followed up in 1971 with an NAIA finish of 15th in the nation.

Watts, his wife, Susan and their two children, Wendy, four, and two-year-old Christopher, reside in Edinboro.
