




Edinboro Hoop Teams to Open PSAC Play Hosting Slippery Rock

The Edinboro Fighting Scot men's and womens basketball teams will host the Slipperv Rock Rockets Wed. (Jan. 7) at McComb Fieldhouse in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference opener for all four teams. The women's game tips off at 6 p.m., with the men scheduled to start at 8 p.m.

Edinboro is now 11-3 overall after splitting four games on a West Coast trip last week. Edinboro has not played at home since Nov. 30, when they captured the title game of the 14th Annual Fighting Scots Invitational with a win over West Liberty State College.

Slippery Rock also returns to action after competing in California last week. The Rock went 1-2 at the Surf and Slam Classic in San Diego before posting an 86-71 home victory over Geneva College Monday night (Jan. 5) to improve to 7-6 overall.

Edinboro senior forward Heather Gates became the Scots all-time leading career rebounder versus Grand Canyon (AZ) University on Dec.29. She surpassed Montique Wade (86-90) as the top rebounder in Edinboro history and now has 1,129 rebounds. She also moved into second place on the PSAC's all-time list and needs only 130 more boards to set a new PSAC standard.

The women's game will feature four of the top eight scorers in the PSAC as the Rock's Heather Keamey comes in averaging a leaguebest 21.8 points per game. Edinboro junior guard Meghan Miller is currently scoring 16.9 points per game to rank second in the league. The Rock's Lori Robinson-Nuzzo holds the fifth position (16)2 ppg), and Scot guard Jessica Rowe (15.1 ppg) occupies the eighth spot.

Edinboro leads the PSAC in scoring (79.1 ppg) and has the highest average winning margin (17.0 ppg), while Slippery Rock is third (70.8 ppg). Miller's 43 three-pointers (3.1 per game) lead the conference.

MEN

The Fighting Scot men bring a seven-game winning streak into the conference opener and the Boro has won eight of nine games since opening the season in the prestigious Disney Division II Tip-Off Classic.

The Scots, now 9-3 overall after posting a 108-98 victory over Roberts Wesleyan on Saturday (Jan. 3), are 6-1 at McComb Fieldhouse this season and have won five straight games at home.

Slippery Rock is 2-8 overall this season. The Rockets lost their first six games of the season before splitting the last four. SRU is coming off a 65-51 loss at Glenville (WV) State on Saturday. The Rock led 30-25 at halftime, but was outscored 40-21 in the second half.

Sophomore forward Warren Chance was selected the PSAC West Player of the Week. He sparked Edinboro's 95-94 win at Wheeling Jesuit (Dec. 30) with 12 consecutive points late in the second half, then pumped in 29 points against Roberts Wesleyan to lead the team in scoring for the ninth time in 12 games.

Freshman center Amos Upshaw was selected the PSAC West Rookie of the Week after scoring a career-best 24 points against Roberts Wesleyan, while averaging 10.6 rebounds per game. He leads the Scots in rebounding, averaging 6.9 per game.

Freshman point guard Adam Kaufman leads the PSAC in assists per game (7.3) and leads the Scots in steals (32) and minutes played (30.1). Asmara Vassar also has played well in the backcourt lately, netting 11 points while handing out 11 assists in the win over RWC.

The Rock is led by Louie Moore who averages 11.5 points per game. Dave Simpson averages 10.2 a game to round out the Rockets' double figure scorers. Simpson also grabs a team-best 6.0 rebounds per game.

Edinboro will travel to Lock Haven on Sat. (Jan. 10) for another PSAC twinbill. The women play at 1 p.m. with the men starting at 3 p.m.



Scots to Host Cal (PA) in Key PSAC Games

The Edinboro University men's and women's basketball teams will host California (PA) University on Saturday (Jan. 24) afternoon. The women's contest is scheduled for a 1 p.m. start, and the men's game will begin at 3 p.m.

FIGHTING SCOT WOMEN LOOK FOR KEY CONFERENCE WIN

The Fighting Scot women's team, 14-4 overall and 3-1 in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, has been idle this past week after a road loss to Shippensburg University last Saturday.

The Boro is led by three players averaging double digit scoring. Junior guard Meghan Miller is third in the PSAC in scoring average with 16.3 points per game. Miller leads the conference in three-point field goals per game with 3.1. She is second in the PSAC with a three-point field goal percentage of .412, and fourth in steals per game with 3.1. Miller went over the 1,000-point plateau for her career versus Indiana (PA) University on Jan. 14.

Sophomore guard Jessica Rowe averages 13.3 points per contest and leads the team in assists with 3.6 each game. Heather Gates is the third Scot averaging in double figure scoring; the senior forward averages 11.0 points per game while leading the team in rebounding with 8.3 boards per game.

The Scots are 4-0 at home this season, and have played at home just once since the Thanksgiving holiday.

The Lady Vulcans of Cal (PA) are 9-7 overall and 2-2 in the PSAC West. California dropped Wednesday night's league game to Shippensburg, at home, by the final score of 71-61.

Cal is led by Sholanda Byas who is averaging 14.9 points per game. Others scoring in double figures include Kelli Torboli (14.1), and Heather Corby (11.9). Torboli and Corby are also one-two on Cal's rebounding charts, grabbing 8.6 and 7.7 rebounds, respectively.

'BORO MEN SHOOTING FOR VICTORY OVER NO. 12 CALIFORNIA (PA)

The Edinboro men, 14-4 overall and 3-1 in the PSAC West, will take the floor versus California, ranked 12th in the latest NABC/Division II Bulletin Top 25, looking for a big conference win. The Scots are currently in a three-way tie for first-place in the PSAC West with the Vulcans and Clarion University, and are coming off a key 88-72 non-conference win over the Central State (OH) University Marauders on Wednesday evening.

In the win over the Marauders, senior guard Jesse Ogden scored a game-high 29 points en route to eclipsing the 1,000-point plateau for his career. Ogden hit eight of 15 from three-point land, and added three blocks, two rebounds, a steal and an assist in 36 minutes of physical play.

Others in double figures for the Boro were Warren Chance (15), Amos Upshaw (12), and Dominic Robinson (11). Upshaw grabbed a game-high 16 rebounds to improve his per game average to a team-best 7.8.

Freshman point guard Adam Kaufman had another solid night for the Scots. Kaufman dished out six assists, scored eight points on three of three shooting from the floor, and swiped two steals. He continues to lead the PSAC in assists per game with 7.3. Kaufman needs just 19 assists to move into the Fighting Scots all-time *career* assist chart.

California enters this weekend with a 13-2 overall and 3-1 conference record. One of the three teams battling for first-place in the PSAC West, the Vulcans most recently won a home contest versus Shippensburg, 89-55. Sophomore guard Vince Graham, the 1997 PSAC West Rookie of the Year, leads the team in scoring (14.7 ppg).

The Boro men's team will travel to nearby Mercyhurst College on Monday, Jan. 26 with an 8 p.m. start time. Both Fighting Scot teams will then host Clarion University on Wednesday, Jan. 24. The women's game will start at 6 p.m., with the men set to follow at 8 p.m.



Scots Look for Important PSAC West Wins

The Edinboro University basketball teams host Shippensburg University on Saturday (Feb. 7), for a PSAC match-up. The women begin play at 1 p.m., and the men take the court for a 3 p.m. tip-off. Fans are encouraged to bring a non-perishable food item to benefit the Edinboro Food Bank in exchange for a McDonald's hamburger or cheese-burger coupon.

NO. 22 BORO WOMEN TAKE ON NO. 21 LADY RAIDERS

The Fighting Scots enter this weekend's competition with an overall record of 17-5 and are 6-2 in the PSAC. The Scots, ranked 22nd in the nation in this week's *USA Today/WBCA* poll, will host the No. 21 Lady Raiders of Shippensburg. Both teams are ranked in the NCAA Division II East Region with the Lady Raiders at No. 2 and the Scots at No. 3.

The Boro has not lost a game at home this year (7-0), and look to continue its 15 game home court winning streak this weekend. The Scots traveled to Slippery Rock University on Wednesday evening where they fell by the final score of 86-60.

Sophomore guard Jessica Rowe led the Scots in the game versus the Rock, scoring 16 points. Marin Hightower had a strong showing, registering her second straight game in double figures with 14 points.

The Scots lead the PSAC in scoring offense with 78.1 points per game. Junior guard Meghan Miller is currently eighth in NCAA Division II in 3-pointers per game (3.1) while leading the PSAC in the category. She is also among the conference leaders in scoring average (15.6). Senior forward Heather Gates holds the fifth position on the PSAC rebounding charts with 8.6 boards per contest. She needs 66 rebounds to claim the all-time conference career record.

The Lady Raiders have an overall record of 18-3 and are undefeated, 7-0, in the PSAC West. They are led by junior forward Ashley Totedo, who is averaging 16.3 points each time out. Totedo is ranked No. 10 nationally averaging 11.5 rebounds per game. Sophomore guard Nisa Wilson had a game-high 26 points and Totedo grabbed 11 boards in Ship's last meeting with the Scots.

BORO MEN LOOKING FOR 20TH WIN

The Fighting Scot men, 19-5 overall and 7-1 in the PSAC West welcome the Red Raiders, 8-13 overall and 1-6 in the PSAC, to McComb Fieldhouse.

The Boro is coming home after two impressive road wins this week. On Monday night the Scots traveled to the Hammermill Center and defeated the host Gannon University Golden Knights 91-79. Wednesday evening the Edinboro squad traveled to Slippery Rock and downed the Rock by a 75-64 final. The Scots have now won four straight games.

The Scots have won 17 out of their last 19 games. With 19 wins overall, the Boro is one victory away from its fifth 20-win season during Walcavich's nine year tenure.

In both wins last week, forward Warren Chance led the Boro in scoring. He hit for a career-high 36 points versus Gannon, and came back to score 24 points in 27 minutes at the Rock. Chance is among PSAC leaders in scoring (19.3 ppg) and free throw percentage (.835, 86-103).

Freshman center Amos Upshaw has been another steady performer for the Boro. Upshaw has recorded five double-doubles in his last six games, including a careerhigh 18 rebounds against the Golden Knights. Once again chosen as the PSAC West Rookie of the Week, Upshaw has now claimed the honor four times this season to go along with 'Player of the Week' honors once. He leads the Scots in rebounding (9.1).

Freshman guard Adam Kaufman dished the ball off for eight assists versus SRU, and his 7.6 assists ranks him sixth in the nation and tops in the PSAC. Now third on the Boro's single-season assist list (182), Kaufman has also moved up to 13th on the program's *career* assist chart.

The rest of the Scots squad is also playing well. Senior Jesse Ogden and sophomore Dwayne Butler round out the starting five. Ogden leads the conference in three-point field goals per game (3.0) and is scoring 11.2 points per game. Butler hits for 13.9 points per contest, and grabs 5.8 rebounds per game.

Reserve guards Dominic Robinson and Asmara Vasser have seen increased court time as of late. Vasser had five assists in the win over Gannon, and both players have helped Boro defensive efforts.

The Red Raiders are 8-13 overall and 1-6 in the conference. Wayne Morris leads Ship with 19.5 points per game and grabs 9.6 boards. Morris and Tyrone Burton led the Raiders with 22 and 24 points, respectively, as the Boro defeated Ship, 84-75, in their first meeting.



Scots Host Slippery Rock, Clarion in Playoff Tilts

The Edinboro men's and women's basketball teams will host first-round Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference games on Tuesday (Feb. 24) at 6 and 8 p.m.

The women will host the Slippery Rock University Rockets in their first-round contest, and the men will meet the Golden Eagles of Clarion University.

WOMEN CLAIM FIFTH 20-WIN SEASON UNDER SWANK

The Fighting Scot women are 20-6 overall and enter tonight's PSAC playoff game as the No. 2 seed in the West. The Rock, 15-11 overall, finished as the PSAC West's third seed after winning four of their last five games. The two teams split the regular season match-ups, each team claiming a win on their home court.

Edinboro has won three straight games including a 62-49 win over California (PA) in the regular season finale. The team has stepped up its defense as of late, holding their last two opponents to an average of 53.5 points per game.

Offensively, the Scots' are led by the backcourt tandem of junior Meghan Miller and sophomore Jessica Rowe. Miller leads the team with 14.5 points per game, and is among the top PSAC scorers. Miller is also second in the conference in three-point field goals made (2.9). She hit four of eight from behind the three-point arc in Saturday's win over Cal. Rowe averages double digits (13.6 ppg), and is a PSAC leader in scoring and field goal percentage (.416). Rowe accumulated 22 points, 11 assists, and eight steals in two games last week.

Seniors Amy Rapelje and Heather Gates have helped solidify the Scots inside game. Rapelje scored 30 points and cleaned the boards for 19 rebounds last week. Gates had a double-double versus California (11 points, 15 rebounds) and needs just 19 more rebounds to become the PSAC's all-time career leader. Currently she has 1,240 in her career as a Fighting Scot.

The Rockets feature the PSAC's top two scorers in Heather Kearney (21.5 points per game) and Lori Robinson-Nuzzo (18.4). The duo is also one-two in free throw percentage in the conference ranks. Kearney grabs a team-best 10.0 rebounds to compliment her offensive game.

The winner of tonight's game will play the victor of the West Chester vs. Bloomsburg quarterfinal. That game has a 6 p.m. tip-off at Bloomsburg University.

SCOT MEN READY FOR PLAYOFF RUN

The Fighting Scot men are 22-7 overall and finish the regular season as the No. 2 seed out of the PSAC West with a 9-3 record.

For the second time in just under a week, the Boro will tip-off against the Golden Eagles of Clarion University. The Scots fell to Clarion, 76-68, last Wednesday (Feb. 18) in a game played at Clarion's Tippin Gymnasium. The Scots won the early season contest at home by an 85-77 final.

Sophomore guard Warren Chance is among the conference leaders in scoring average (19.0), three-point field goal percentage, three-pointers made per game, and currently has the second-best free throw percentage in the conference, hitting .820 (100-122) of his attempts.

Senior sharpshooter Jesse Ogden leads the PSAC in treys per game (3.3). Ogden needs just five more threes to move into third-place on the all-time PSAC career threes made chart.

Freshman point guard Adam Kaufman made school history on Saturday evening when he handed out eight assists in the loss to California. Now with 230 assists, Kaufman surpassed the old school record for assists in a single season (222, Greg Fox in 1992-93). Kaufman's 7.9 assist per game average has him leading the PSAC and ranked fourth in the nation.

Amos Upshaw, the Scots' freshman center, scored 21 points and had 18 rebounds last week. Upshaw leads the Scots in rebounding with 9.3 per game, and is fourth in the PSAC in the same category. Upshaw has the second-best field goal percentage around the conference (.570, 146-256).

The fifth Boro starter is Dwayne Butler. Butler has led the Fighting Scots in scoring through the last five games, scoring 19.0 per game. Butler is among the league leaders in scoring average (14.8 ppg.) and field goal percentage (.498, 160-321).

Freshman Dominic Robinson scored 12 points and grabbed five rebounds in 17 minutes versus California.

Clarion is led Gregg Frist's 19.1 points per game. The senior's status for this game remains uncertain. Frist suffered a separated shoulder just over a week ago in a game versus Daemen College, and his availability will be a game-time decision.






