## Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference has established itself as one of the finest NCAA Division II men's basketball conferences in the nation, with several teams annually representing the league in the NCAA post-season tournament.

The PSAC is divided into seven-team Divisions, with California, Clarion, Edinboro, Indiana, Lock Haven, Shippensburg, and Slippery Rock making up the West, and Bloomsburg, Cheyney, East Stroudsburg, Kutztown, Mansfield, Millersville and West Chester forming the East. The top four teams from the East and West meet in the conference post-season tournament, with the winner earning an automatic NCAA berth.

The PSAC was founded in 1951 for the purpose of promoting and administering the athletic programs at the 14 state teachers colleges in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. From its inception, each conference member selected its own competitive division within the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). In 1980, however, the president's of each school, which make up the league's Board of Directors, voted to reclassify to NCAA Division II membership. Nine schools also elect to participate at the NCAA Division I level in select sports.

In 1983, all member institutions were granted University status and the State System of Higher Education (SSHE) was formed. The system currently has an enrollment in excess of 99,000 students with an alumni base of 402,000, including 287,000 which reside in the state. The Chancellor of the SSHE is Dr. James H. McCormick.

The PSAC, which is under the leadership of Interim Commissioner Steve Murray, sponsors championships in 20 men's and women's sports, including baseball, basketball, cross country, field hockey, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball and wrestling. The Board of Directors voted to expand the men's and women's post-season basketball tournament field from four to eight teams in 1996. The top four teams from both the East and West will compete for the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Division II national tournament.

- With a win, IUP will notch its fourth 20-win season in five years, the Indians won 27 games in 1994, 29 in 1995 and 24 in 1996.
- IUP and West Chester will meet for the first time in playoff action. The Indians are 1-1 against Edinboro in the playoffs and 3-1 vs. Bloomsburg, two semifinal victories in 1995 and 1996. IUP is 1-3 all-time vs. West Chester. The Rams beat IUP 67-63 in 1996 while the Indians were ranked No. 1 in the country.
- IUP's only victory over West Chester was a 77-56 victory in 1985.
