Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC), founded in 1951, consists of the 14 universities in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (SSHE). The granting of university status was a result of Legislative Act 188 which formed the Pennsylvania SSHE on July 1, 1983. Dr. James H. McCormick serves as chancellor of the SSHE.

The PSAC is under the leadership of a board of directors which consists of the 14 university presidents (see below). The organization of the conference, which includes a commissioner and an associate commissioner, is unique because it employs separate divisions for men's and women's athletics yet enables both programs to develop independently while sharing common goals.

One of the largest conferences in the nation, the PSAC sponsors championship competition in a total of 20 men's and women's intercollegiate sports. All 14 schools are members of Division II of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). However, some schools have elected to compete at either the Division I or Division III level in certain sports. Student/athletes and teams in the PSAC have won numerous honors in national post-season competition over the years and have helped the PSAC become one of the most respected NCAA Division II conferences in the nation.

State System of Higher Education

- ☆ The student population is 96,368, an increase of 4.3 percent, 18.2 percent since 1983.
- ☆ Centralized data base made accessible to all universities to support campus planning, faculty research, and institutional research.
- ☆ The Faculty Professional Development Council's first Summer Academy for the Advancement of College Teaching brought 36 faculty participants together for a five-day seminar in August 1989.
- ☆ The Faculty Professional Development Council gave nine awards for innovative University Special Projects for first time.
- ☆ Fall 1989 enrollment at State System universities included 7,474 minority students.
- ☆ All State System universities completed affirmative action plans for 1989-93.
- ☆ A first-time partnership with the School District of Philadelphia brought 42 students to the State System under Board of Governors' scholarship support.
- ☆ Commissions on the status of women at State System universities encouraged and established at nine, others underway.
- ☆ Women's Consortium sponsored System-wide Leadership Institute for women at McKeever Environmental Center; 28 students participated.
- ☆ Pennsylvania Academy for the Profession of Teaching continued Urban Education Project, establishing school partnerships and certificate program for teachers' aides.
- ☆ First issue of Scholars, System journal focusing on faculty instruction, research, and service activities, published in October.
- ☆ Research and strategy completed for first System-wide minority awareness campaign.
- ☆ 1989-90 total education and general appropriation of \$333,406,000 is largest annual increase in 16 years for the public university system in Pennsylvania; it is an increase of 8.63 percent over previous year.
- ☆ Pennsylvania Council of Alumni Associations (PCAA) made its most significant impact ever in support of State System's appropriation request. PCAA network credited with an effective letter-writing campaign leading to stronger support and broader recognition of State System.
- ☆ Board of Student Government Presidents represented unified student voice in support of State System issues. Board now has regular quarterly meetings attended by 40 to 50 students involved in the university student governments.
