

BUILDING A WINNER



Fred Caro

Coach Fred Caro has guided Edinboro State to winning ways on the mats over the past eight years while competing in one of the best small college wrestling conferences in the nation. His grapplers have made their most impressive surge over the last three campaigns with 38 victories and only 11 setbacks in dual match action.

Caro gained his initial teaching and coaching experience at Tyrone

Area High in Tyrone, Pa. For three years he served as assistant coach of the football, wrestling and track teams at Tyrone High. In addition, he was an assistant football coach at Williston Academy, Easthampton, Massachusetts for one year while completing academic requirements for his degree. During this time he was also an assistant wrestling coach at Springfield College.

His coaching and teaching experience also includes tenure at Derry Area High School in Derry, Pa.

Besides his wrestling mentorship at Edinboro. Caro has been an assistant football coach for the Scots and currently is in his sixth year as head of the Health and Physical Education Department.

He received his B.S. degree in Physical Education from Lock Haven State College in 1958 and his M.S. degree from Springfield College, Springfield, Mass, The certificate of Advanced Study was awarded to him from Springfield College in July of 1971.

A GLANCE AT LAST YEAR

Edinboro State's 1970-71 matmen finished regular season action with a 9-5 season slate behind the surprise performances of several young and relatively inexperienced wrestlers. Senior Dale Hrach (142) capped his career with an outstanding 13-1 slate in dual meet action. His impressive win-loss slate along with his team high of seven pins earned him the Scots' Most Valuable Wrestler honors. Also chipping in with sparkling marks were sophomore Bob Parker (118) with an overall record of 12-3-1 as well as freshmen standout Tom Herr (Unl.) who finished the year with a 12-7-2 slate and a third place finish in the Pennsylvania Conference. Also coming away with winning records in dual meet action were Paul Richardson (126), Mike Maines (150), Jim Woods (158), Dave Dimmack (167) and Don Scott (167).

YOUNG SCOTS ARE TALENTED

With three straight successful seasons tucked away. Edinboro coach Fred Caro faces the task of building another winner for the Scots with a squad which lists only three senior wrestlers. Also on tap is the challenge of being a competitive host for the Pennsylvania Conference Wrestling Championships which will take place in Edinboro's McComb Fieldhouse on February 25-26.

Pacing the Fighting Scots hopes on the mats will be tri-captains Bob Parker (118). Rick LaFerriere (142) and Jim Woods (158).

Parker, a junior with one varsity letter to his credit, should give the Clan a strong contender in the opening matches. He posted the squad's second best record with a 12-3 showing during his sophomore year and was the 118pound champ at the Ashland Invitational tournament.

In the 126-pound class sophomore Bruce Shumaker will be competing with teammate Tom English for a starting berth. Shumaker, in spite of his limited experience for the Scots, could be the key to a successful season.

Freshman standout Dan Harrison will battle veteran Leo Sheridan to represent Edinboro at the 134-pound mark. Dan lost his final match for General McLane High School in the semi-final round of the P.I.A.A. Championships last year. Sheridan will be working to regain the form that gave him a fine freshman year. As a sophomore, Sheridan was hampered by injuries.

Senior Rick LaFerriere will be the entry at 142-pounds along with newcomer Terry Mulligan, LaFerriere, who has also been slowed by injuries, is looking forward to a successful finish to his mat career, Mulligan, a freshman from Saegertown, is a top prospect for the Scots' future hopes.

Dan DeMarines will be pointing for a successful comeback in the 150-pound division after competing during only the first semester of 1970-71.

It will be a toss-up between seniors Jim Woods and David Dimmack for the 158-pound spot. Although Dimmack holds the edge on experience. Woods proved equal to the test last winter when he pinned two varsity opponents and decisioned three more.

Don Scott, a letter winner as a freshman will have strong opposition in "wrestle-offs" from another veteran in junior George Gast. Both wrestled at different weights last season as regulars.

Dave Hrach and Tony Pawlosky will provide the punch in the 190-pound division. Dave will be striving to regain the form he exhibited four years earlier as a sophomore at ESC. After producing an impressive record in dual meet action. Hrach finished fourth in the conference tournament. He has recently completed a stint with the U.S. Air Force.

Tom Herr, a sophomore from New York, will be counted on heavily to anchor the squad as he did last season. Herr grappled his way to third place honors at the conference championships in his freshman debut, and should be one of the top heavyweight wrestlers in the state.

The Scots face the most ambitious slate in ESC history with fifteen dual matches highlighting the varsity schedule. In addition, the Pennsylvania Conference Tournament will bring some of the nation's finest wrestlers to the Edinboro campus.
