





Assistant Coaches

Lou Rosselli Edinboro University '93



Lou Rosselli is in his ninth season as an assistant coach at Edinboro, the last six as a full-time assistant. He previously served for three seasons as a volunteer assistant at his alma mater. A two-time All-American as a Fighting Scot, Rosselli established himself as one of the top lightweight freestyle wrestlers in the United States before retiring after the 2000 Olympic Trials.

Rosselli won the U.S. National Championships in 1995, 1996 and 1999, earning a berth on the 1996 U.S. Olympic team with a dramatic victory in the finals of the Olympic Trials. At the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta, Rosselli competed along with former collegiate coach Bruce Baumgartner. He was in contention for a bronze medal before suffering a broken arm during his second victory, forcing him to withdraw from the competition.

As a collegiate wrestler, Rosselli placed third at the NCAA Division I National Championships at 118 lbs. as a senior in 1993, after a fourth place finish as a junior in 1991. Rosselli was selected the Outstanding wrestler at both the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Tournament and the Eastern Wrestling League Championships in 1993 after winning individual titles at both events. At the time he became just the second wrestler at Edinboro to win three PSAC championships, and his 136 career victories still ranks third on Edinboro's all-time wins list.

Off the mats, Rosselli was an Academic All-American as a Fighting Scot, completing work on his Bachelor's Degree in Health & Physical Education in 1993.

A native of Middleport, NY, Rosselli was a two-time New York state champion at Royalton-Hartland High School, in addition to twice finishing as the state runner-up. He and his wife, Amy, reside in Edinboro with their sons, Jordan (4), and Tyler (1).

Gary Astorino Edinboro University '81



Gary Astorino enters his 16th campaign as an assistant wrestling coach with the Fighting Scots. He attended Edinboro, collecting 58 victories to rank in the top thirty in career wins. He was the recipient of the Butch McBride Scholarship, presented to the student-athlete exemplifying both academic and athletic excellence.

Astorino plays an instrumental role in recruiting student-athletes in addition to his work on the mats. While serving as a graduate assistant coach, he started the Edinboro


Wrestling Coaches Clinic, which has developed a reputation as

one of the top clinics in the region and is now in its 17th year. After completing work on his Bachelor of Science Degree in Elementary and Secondary Education, Astorino went on to earn a Master's of Arts Degree in Personnel Services. He later earned a Certificate of Advanced Graduate Studies in Secondary Guidance and Counseling.

Astorino began his coaching career at his alma mater, Punxsutawney High School, where he coached three years before returning to Edinboro to assist the school's drive to the Division I ranks. He served as the coach at McDowell High School in 1989.

In addition to his duties at Edinboro, Astorino serves as a guidance counselor at nearby General McLane High School. He and his wife, Terri, reside in Edinboro with their three children Drew (15), Lauren (13), and Matt (10).

Mike Hahesy Edinboro University '87



Former Fighting Scot All-American Mike Hahesy returned to Edinboro as an assistant coach a year ago. Hahesy previously served as an assistant coach at Gannon University from 1998-2002, helping produce eight All-Americans and one National Champion.

Hahesy earned Division II All-American honors twice at Edinboro after transferring from the University of Iowa. He captured the 158 lb. National Championship in 1985, one five Division II National Champions

ever at Edinboro and only one of seven all-time National Champions at Edinboro. He finished second at 158 lbs. the following year. He finished with a 36-6-1 record in 1984-85, and was 33-8-2 in 1985-86. His career winning percentage of .820 (69-14-3) remains the ninth-best in school history.

A 1987 graduate of Edinboro with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Health and Physical Education, Hahesy was inducted into the Edinboro Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998. He was inducted into the NCAA Division II National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2002. In addition, he was recognized as the Sox Harrison Award winner in 1986, symbolic of Edinboro's top senior male athlete.

Hahesy served as the head wrestling coach at Warren(Pa.) High School from 1998-93, posting a record of 51-20-2. He produced three state qualifiers and one state runner-up. Next came a three-year stint at McDowell High School, coaching the Trojans from 1993-96. During that time McDowell had a 37-5 record, winning the Metro League championship, Sectional championship and District championship. He had eight state qualifiers. He was named the District 10 Sectional Wrestling Coach of the Year in 1993, '95 and '96.

Hahesy and his wife, Kathy, reside in Erie with their three children -- Madison (11), Haley (10) and Hunter (7). In addition to his undergraduate degree from Edinboro, Hahesy received a Master's of Education Degree in Administration, Supervision and Curriculum from St. Bonaventure University in June 1993, and a Doctorate of Education Degree in Administration and Leadership from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in August 2002. In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Hahesy serves as the assistant principal at Fairview(Pa.) High School.

2003-04 Preview



Alex Clemsen had many high expectations placed on him when he arrived a year ago, and for the most part he lived up to his advance billing. The sophomore went 28-15 with three falls, capturing the PSAC Championship and finishing third at the EWL Championships. He went 1-2 in his first trip to Nationals, being eliminated by a 2-1 tiebreaker to 11th-ranked Jordon Holm of Northern Iowa. Clemsen also captured second place at the Body Bar Invitational and third place at the Eastern Michigan Open.

"Alex is focused on winning a national championship," related Flynn. "I'd be shocked if he's not in the hunt. It's just a matter of time for him. He's certainly putting in the work. I expect him to be a lot more dominant this year. He won the close one's on guts last year. He took a big step this summer. We need him to win week in and week out."

Freshman Jim Gibson moves up from 174 lbs. to 184 lbs, and could even compete at 197 lbs. He redshirted a year ago, finishing 7-9 in open events. "Jim came back a lot bigger and stronger, which is always a good thing in college wrestling," Flynn pointed out. He's another young man who is the future of our squad. I expect him to take a big step."

Senior Mark Hudson, sophomore Dave Bubar and redshirt freshman Dan Watts add depth. Flynn noted that Watts came back bigger and stronger, but after going 1-4 in limited open tourney action, "it's time for him to step up and get some wins".

197

How big were David Shunamon's shoes to fill? So big, that Flynn will call on two freshman, Jeremy Mosley and Mike LaBella, to try and replace his former standout. Both lack experience, but have the ability to enjoy bright careers at Edinboro.

Mosley not only must make the jump to collegiate wrestling, but must do it after missing time last year with a knee injury. As a sophomore he was the Florida state champion while competing for University Christian High School, where he posted a career record of 92-29. At 6'4", he is a stark contrast to Shunamon, who was a short but muscular 197 pounder.

"Jeremy was hurt his senior year," commented Flynn. "He has a huge upside. No one recruited him hard. He's a big kid who could fill out. We're excited about him."

LaBella was the New York state champion this past year as a senior at Massapequa High School. "I have big plans for him," beamed Flynn. "I think he can compete pretty quickly. He fits the mold of

the kind of kids we want. He works year around. He will have success."

HWT

Joe Hennis no longer has Reuben Daniels, who transferred, to push him, but the third-year sophomore can still expect a stern challenge from redshirt freshman Shane Mihalko.

"With a little improvement Joe can be a top twelve guy," Flynn predicted. "He needs to improve his focus. He's shown a little of that early this fall. We have all the confidence in his upside. He just has to put in the hours. He can compete with the top guys. He finished fourth at the EWL's. Hopefully that made him hungry."

Hennis finished the year with a 21-13 record, leading the Scots with 9 falls. His best finish was a third place at the Eastern Michigan Open.


Mihalko came to Edinboro with impressive credentials after finishing third in the Pennsylvania state championships as a junior and senior. He missed most of the year with an injury, but Flynn isn't about to give up on him. "Shane is training harder than he ever has in his life. He's a big kid, and I think down the road he'll be tough."

Two-time national qualifier who was Edinboro's lone All-American a year ago, placing fourth at 165 lbs... faces a strong field at 165 lbs. this year, but head coach Tim Flynn feels he has the ability and toughness to challenge for the National Championships ... sat behind national qualifiers Ben Boozer and

Yanni Diamond for two years before earning the starting role two years ago. He reached Nationals in his first year as a starter only to suffer a broken ankle in his second match ... tied for 17th in career wins with an 89-20 record.

2002-03

Earned All-American honors with a fourth place finish at Nationals at 165 lbs... ended the year with a 42-7 record, tied for the third-highest season total ... six of his seven losses came to nationally-ranked opponents ... entered Nationals as the ninth seed ... after a pair of early wins, faced number one seed Matt Lackey of Illinois, dropping a 6-1 decision, but proceeded to win three straight matches in the wrestlebacks ... earned All-American status thanks to an 8-1 triumph over Northwestern's Jason Erwinski, then disposed of fifth seed Tyron Woodley of Missouri, 4-1 ... posted another upset to reach the third place match, defeating Tyrone Lewis of Oklahoma State, the third seed, by a 5-4 count ... lost to fourth-seeded Jacob Volkman of Minnesota, 6-0, in the third place match ... captured his first EWL title by defeating West Virginia's Tom McMath for the second time in less than three weeks by a 6-2 score ... also won his second PSAC crown thanks to a 7-2 triumph over Lock Haven's Jason Gilligan ... earned a first place finish at the Body Bar Invitational, was second at the Penn State Open, and took home third place in the Reno Tournament of Champions and Eastern Michigan Open ... ended the year ranked 11th by *Amateur Wrestling News* and 15th by *InterMat*.

2001-02

Qualified for Nationals in his first year as a starter, going 23-6 with 3 falls ... was 12-2 in dual matches ... season came to a disappointing end in his second match at Nationals ... seeded 10th, he picked up a 5-0 win over Mike Mitchell of Duke ... suffered a ankle injury in first period of second round match against 7th-seeded Eugene Harris of Oregon and was unable to continue ... had earlier suffered a 3-2 loss to Harris in the Las Vegas Invitational ... consolation round match also ended in a medical forfeit ... took home first place at the PSAC Tournament with a 10-4 win over Brandon Mihalko of East Stroudsburg, and finished second at the EWL Championships, losing to fifth-ranked Tom McMath of West Virginia, 6-4 ... all of his losses came to ranked opponents ... finished fifth at the Las Vegas Invitational ... ended the year ranked 10th by *InterMat* and 11th by *Amateur Wrestling News*.

2000-01

Finished with a 24-7 record, tied for fourth on the team in wins, despite splitting his lone two dual matches ... had 2 falls ... placed at five different tournaments, including a second place finish at the Cleveland State Open ... dropped a 4-0 decision to teammate Ben Boozer in the title bout ... finished in third place at both the Slippery Rock Open and Edinboro Open ... went 6-1 in the Slippery

Rock Open, besting Pitt-Johnstown's Aaron Rendes by a 12-4 count in the third place match ... was 4-1 at the Edinboro Open, winning twice by technical fall and defeating Mark Lazzo of Michigan, 10-3, to capture third place ... lone loss was a 3-2 setback to Gannon's Lantz Schwabenbauer, a Division II All-American ... took fourth place at the Oklahoma Classic, defeating Bloomsburg national qualifier Hunter Guenot by a 5-3 count along the way, and dropping a 7-2 decision to Oklahoma's Robbie Waller, who entered last year's Nationals as the fourth seed ... later lost to Waller by a 7-4 score at the National Duals ... placed fifth at the Penn State Open.

1999-2000

Redshirted ... posted a 22-9 record while competing in open competition at 165 lbs... finished second at the Slippery Rock Open, losing to national qualifier Carl Fronhofer of Pittsburgh, 5-2 ... also took second place in the Wilkes Open, dropping a 9-2 decision to national qualifier Jeff Rusak of Old Dominion in the finals ... earned third place finishes at the Edinboro Open and the Cleveland State Open.

HIGH SCHOOL

Was a three-time Pennsylvania state place winner at Connellsville Area High School, including a second place finish as a senior ... finished third as a sophomore and junior ... had a 143-21 record ... a two-time regional champion ... also a three-year starter in football.

Edinboro University



Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie – Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.


The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 480,000 bound volumes and 1.3 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

The main campus also includes a modern University Center, planetarium, observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and television stations, health center, counseling center, and much more – all accessible for people with disabilities. The recently renovated and expanded Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of its kind in the nation.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including six residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learned floors – all are wired for voice, video and data.

Edinboro University also operates centers in Erie and Meadville. Edinboro University in Erie – The Porreco Center is a beautiful 27-acre campus that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for small conferences, business meetings, and special events. The Meadville Access Center is located in the city's historic Bessemer Building.
