Gary Kagiavas



Gary Kagiavas was appointed Edinboro University's first head coach of the **Fighting** Scot women's soccer program August of 1996. The former Gannon University standout started the

Edinboro program that year, and since that time it has become one of the stronger teams in the Northeast Region.

Edinboro saw a run of five straight winning seasons come to an end two years ago following a 6-9-3 finish, and his Fighting Scots suffered a second straight losing campaign a year ago, finishing at 7-9-3. However, thanks to a 5-3-2 ledger in the PSAC West, Edinboro made its third-ever appearance in the PSAC Playoffs.

Over the past several seasons the Fighting Scot roster has been extremely youthful, yet Kagiavas has molded that inexperience into winning teams. The PSAC postseason awards bore that out a year ago, as Kagiavas was named the 2005 PSAC West Coach of the Year.

It marked the second time he had received the award.

The 2003 Fighting Scots registered a school record for wins while finishing with a 12-7-1 record. Edinboro made its second appearance in the PSAC Playoffs. The **Fighting** Scots climbed as high as fourth in the Northeast Region rankings during the 2002 In vear. Edinboro fell one point shy of qualifying for postseason action, compiling a 9-5-4 record. The 2002 squad finished with six wins and a tie in its last seven matches.

Kagiavas owns an overall record of 80-88-15 in ten seasons, with ten or more wins in six of the last eight seasons. Once a rare occurrence to show up in the Northeast Region rankings, the Fighting Scots are now a

weekly member of the top ten.

Kagiavas' teams accomplished a rarity in his first six seasons, finishing with a better record each year. The 2001 Fighting Scots went out and posted an 11-5-1 record, including a school-record six-game winning streak. The Fighting Scots advanced to the PSAC Playoffs for the first time. Edinboro dropped a 1-0 decision to Bloomsburg in its first postseason venture, but that could not diminish a season which saw the Scots climb as high as 14th in the NSCAA Division II rankings. Along the way, the Scots defeated 13thranked Slippery Rock, 3-0, while suffering four of its five losses to nationally-ranked opponents. Kagiavas was recognized as the PSAC Women's Soccer Coach of the Year.

Thanks to five wins in its final seven contests, Edinboro posted its first winning season in 2000, going 10-8-1. The Fighting Scots posted a four-game win streak in which it held opponents scoreless for 500 minutes. The team also recorded the program's first win over local rival Gannon.

The Fighting Scots weren't without their growing pains, as Edinboro's first-ever women's soccer edition finished with a 2-14-0

record in 1996. The ledger improved slightly in 1997, as Kagiavas' second team posted a 5-10-1 finish. The Fighting Scots improved to 9-10-0 in 1998. That included a 2-1 overtime win over West Virginia Wesleyan, an outfit ranked second in Division II at the time.

In 1999 the Fighting Scots posted a 9-9-1 finish to earn their first non-losing season. Edinboro debuted in the regional rankings during the season, a first for Kagiavas's squad. Included in the victories was another triumph over a nationally-ranked foe, as the Fighting Scots posted a 2-1 win at 14th-

ranked Slippery Rock.

Kagiavas brought a wealth of coaching experience to Edinboro, both locally and at the international level. He joined the Edinboro staff after serving as assistant manager of the Family First Sports Park in Erie for two years. At Family First, he was responsible for organizing all phases of the facility's indoor and outdoor soccer leagues.

Kagiavas has served as the coaching director of the Edinboro Regional Soccer Club. Under his direction, the organization has grown from four to 14 teams. In the 1997-98 season, he took the 15-under team to the state finals. In two of the past three summers he has taken the Erie Admirals U17 Girls team to the state championship and to the Final Four of Region 1. The team has finished in the top 16 in the country in their age group. He is the girls coaching director at the Erie Admirals. In 2004 Kagiavas had two more

state champions with the Erie Admirals in the Under-17 and Under-18 girls teams. This marks four state champions in four

years.

Kagiavas was a standout defender at Gannon from 1987-91, and played professionally in his native South Africa, along with Greece and Canada, after earning his bachelor's degree in 1991. He has held a variety of coaching positions in many levels of competition since 1989, highlighted by a successful stint as a professional coach in South Africa.

At Gannon, Kagiavas was a four-year starter at midfield and defender for a Golden Knight team which advanced to the NCAA Division II Final Four in 1989 and 1990. Gannon was 58-14-8 during his four seasons, with three NCAA playoff appearances.

Kagiavas played professionally for a St. Catherines team that won the Canadian Cup in the National Soccer League. He was a player/coach for the Springs Old Boys and Boksburg 'Two for Joy,' as well as for the Eastern Transvaal all-select indoor team.

In 1994, Kagiavas served as the head coach of Gannon's men's junior varsity soccer program, also assisting with the varsity squad as the Golden Knight men posted a 15-2-0 record and advanced to the NCAA Final Four.

Kagiavas began his coaching career with the Erie Strikers while also directing the Villa Maria Elementary School team. In the spring of 1992, Kagiavas was assistant coach of the Boksburg "Two for Joy" Division I team that competed in the National Soccer League of South Africa. In the summer of 1991, he was the head coach of the Springs (South Africa) Old Boys of the Division II men's semi-professional league, earning Coach of the Year honors.

Kagiavas has earned a South African coaching license, a professional referee license, and his United States Soccer Federation National B License and has his NSCAA Regional Coaching License.

He and his wife, Dawn, a native of St. Marys, Pa., reside in Fairview with their tenyear-old daughter, Kaylee.

Jamie Tekotte




After concluding a brilliant career at E d i n b o r o University with a record-breaking season as a senior in 2004, Jamie Tekotte is in her second season as an assistant coach for the Fighting Scots.

As a senior, Tekotte set school records for goals scored (21) and points (48) in a season. She was a first team All-Northeast Region and All-PSAC selection. In addition, she ranked second in the PSAC in points, points per game, goals, and goals per game, and was 13th in Division II in goals per game and 15th in points per game.

Tekotte concluded her career ranked first in goals scored (37) and second in career points (85) despite playing just three seasons for the Fighting Scots. She played at Central Michigan as a freshman.

A former standout at nearby McDowell High School, she was also a first team All-PSAC choice and second team All-Region selection in 2001.

Tekotte graduated in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in Sports Administration. She also serves as a coach for the Erie Admirals.

Mark Case is in his fourth season as an assistant coach at E d i n b o r o University. He works with the goalkeepers.

Case played for Gannon University for two seasons as a goalkeeper. As a prepster, he was a four-year starter at nearby Cathedral Prep. He earned first team All-Metro League accolades as a junior and senior for the Ramblers.

Case has been very active in the Erie area as a mentor for goalkeepers. That includes serving as the goalkeeper coach for a variety of high schools in the area.

Case resides in Erie. He recently completed work on his bachelor's degree in Elementary Education/Special Education and Psychology, with a minor in Coaching.

2006 Outlook

Fighting Scots Seek Second Straight Postseason Berth Thanks to Work Ethic

Edinboro University head coach Gary Kagiavas has been down this road before. He enters the 2006 campaign with another youthful roster. But the veteran coach, now in his eleventh season and the only head coach ever at Edinboro, admits that this team is even younger than he's used to.

"No seniors!," Kagiavas smiled as he appraised a roster which features eight freshmen and eight more sophomores. "But even though we have no seniors, we have experience."

Now you know the former Gannon University standout may have spent one too many days in the hot sun. "The biggest thing I find is this is an extremely hard-working group," he points out. "They are really moti-

vated to do well. It's a very closely-knit group of kids that want to play hard. The team is the biggest factor.

"I think we have a very solid team," Kagiavas continued. "They're very workmanlike. I don't think I've ever had a team work harder in the offseason."

The Fighting Scots finished with a deceiving 7-9-3 record a year ago. Despite the losing ledger, Edinboro was 5-3-2 in the PSAC West, good for third place and a birth in the PSAC Playoffs. After battling Slippery Rock to a pair of scoreless ties earlier in the year, Edinboro suffered a 4-1 setback to The Rock in a downpour in the first round of the playoffs.

"Last year we lost nine games, and in six of those nine games we outshot our opponents," related Kagiavas. "We couldn't get it in the net."

Unfortunately, the inability to score is Kagiavas' greatest concern heading into the 2006 season. A year ago Edinboro was shut out six times and scored just one goal in eight other contests. "After our first two scorers – Angie de Almeida and Ashley Pulman – who will score?" asked Kagiavas. "That's our big concern. Hopefully Kara Ciacchini and Janelle Layton will be the answers. We're expecting big things from Kara. I'm hoping the maturity of the forwards and center midfielders is better, and we win the games we lost last year when we outshot opponents."

While youth is clearly evident on the roster, 16 letterwinners and eight starters return. That lends to plenty of experience and a blossoming young team.


Edinboro opens the season on August 24, hosting Shippensburg. Kagiavas likes his schedule, although he's fully aware of the perils of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference. "Obviously the PSAC games are always brutal," he commented. "I think from top to bottom the PSAC is the best conference in the country. If you go .500 in the PSAC, you've done well. We beat up on each other.

"I think the schedule is not front-loaded as it has been in the past. It's challenging, but

This is Edinboro University

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is the largest comprehensive four-year university in northwestern Pennsylvania. Its 585-acre campus is home to nearly 8,000 students studying in more than 100 academic programs. The University's programs in art, criminal justice, and speech language pathology, among others, have earned regional and national recognition and accolades and the University has been named a "College of Distinction" by Student Horizons, Inc. In 2003 the University's institutional accreditation with the Commission on Higher Education Middle State Association of Colleges and Schools was reaffirmed with commendation for ten years. In the 2006-07 academic year, the University is celebrating its Sesquicentennial recognizing 150 years of service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and

Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie - Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 500,000 bound volumes and 1.4 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual

impairments

The main campus also includes a modern University Center that is undergoing a \$17 million renovation, planetarium, observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and television stations, health center, counseling center, and much more - all accessible for people with disabilities. The Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of its kind in the nation.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including five residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learning floors - all are wired for voice,

video and data.

Edinboro University also operates centers in Erie and Meadville. Edinboro University in Érie - The Porreco Center is a beautiful 27-acre campus that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for small conferences, business meetings, and special events. Edinboro University in Meadville is located in the city's historic Bessemer Building.

Dr. Frank G. Pogue

President, Edinboro University of PA



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Dr. Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor for student affairs and special programs at the State

University of New York (SUNY) Central Administration in Albany, serving in that position for 10 years. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, President Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY at Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. He serves as a member of the American Council on Education (ACE) Commission on Women in Higher Education which provides counsel to ACE on policies and concerns related to expanded roles and equal opportunity for women in higher education. He is a member of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Millennium Leadership Initiative (Chair), Committee on Professional Development, and Christa McAuliffe Selection Committee. He was appointed in 2003 to the International Association of University Presidents Commission on Disarmament Education, Conflict Resolution and Peace. Since 1984, Dr. Pogue has served on the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA). Currently, he serves on an advisory panel to address accreditation issues related to "affiliated" candidate and accredited institutions. Recently, he served as President for the MSA Board of Trustees and as a member of its Executive Committee, and he is a former vice chair of the Commission's Executive Committee. Dr. Pogue also serves on the Board of Directors of Pennsylvania Campus Compact. He served for two years as chairperson of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) Commission for the Universities and Commission of Presidents Executive Committee. He

is a member of the Executive Board of A Community of Agile Partners in Education (CAPE). In October 1996, Dr. Pogue was appointed by then Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge to the Governor's Commission on Academic Standards. In November 2002, he was appointed co-chair of the Higher Education Committee of Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell's Transition Team. In May 2004, he was appointed to the Pennsylvania Department of Education's Higher Education Advisory Board.

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the Boards of Directors for the Meadville Area Industrial Commission, the Erie Regional Chamber and Growth Partnership, and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra. In 2005, he was elected to the Executive Committee of the Civic Coordinating Committee of Erie County. Additionally, he serves on the Boards of Corporators for the Hamot Health Foundation, the Saint Vincent Health Center, and the Meadville Medical Center. He is a member of the Erie Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee and an Honorary Member of the Erie Wolves Club. Dr. Pogue was chairperson of the Erie County Millennium Commission, the Erie County State Employees Combined Appeal (SECA) campaign in 2001 and 2002, and of the Erie Day School's Adopt-A-Scholar scholarship program (2000-01 and 2002-03). He was also a member of the Erie Mayor's Task Force on Public Safety. Dr. Pogue has served on the boards of directors for the United Way of Erie County and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

Dr. Pogue was honored by the Erie Area Chamber of Commerce with the Louis I. Tullio Community Service Award. The Greater Erie Community Action Committee (GECAC) honored him in 2004 with the Othello Myers Johnson Human Services Award and with the Paul P. Martin Community Service Award in 2000. In 1999, the Distinguished Service Award for Leadership and Vision was presented to him by the SUNY at Albany Council of Trustees.

Dr. Pogue has shared his experiences and expertise in Edinboro University classrooms via guest lecturer presentations. He has also taught a course titled, "Special Topics in Sociology" for the Department of Sociology. He continues to enjoy working in the classroom environ-

Since becoming president, Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.
