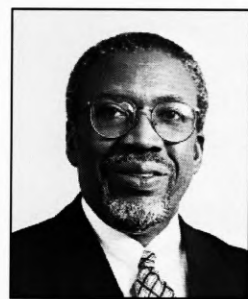

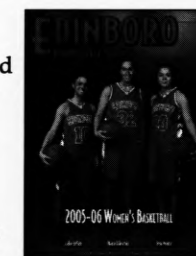

In Memory of Frank Hudak

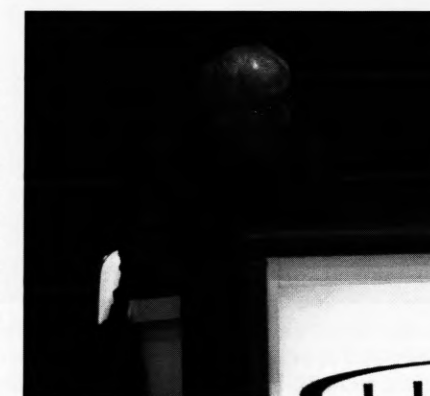

Swank Hopes Added Height Leads to More Wins

There's an old saying that winning teams are strong up the middle. When you think about it, that phrase can relate to most sports. In baseball, teams look for good catching, strong pitching, a solid middle infield, and a centerfielder who can roam the outfield. In football, it's strength in the trenches. You win games up front on the offensive and defensive lines. And in basketball, defense and rebounding has been a winning formula for many years.

Edinboro University women's basketball coach Stan Swank would argue that is not entirely the case. He's done just fine without much rebounding over the last few years, thank you. But the veteran coach realizes if his Fighting Scot squad is to advance further in the PSAC Playoffs, they must be able to clear the glass with more regularity.

The Fighting Scots have qualified for the PSAC Playoffs five of the last six years. Unfortunately, they've been eliminated in the first round each of those years. Now consider that Edinboro was the worst rebounding team in the PSAC three of the last four years, and in 2002-03 the Scots finished next to last.

Yet Edinboro has posted a 64-46 record during that period, including back-to-back

18-10 seasons the last two years. The great equalizer for the Fighting Scots has been turnover margin. Thanks to outstanding ballhandling and the ability to force turnovers, Edinboro has led the PSAC in turnover margin three of the last four years, and the other season the Scots were second.

Last season was a perfect example. Edinboro led the PSAC in turnover margin (+8.9), somewhat offsetting a huge minus 12.1 rebounding disadvantage. It resulted in an 18-10 record, but after getting off to a 14-2 start, the rebounding miseries eventually caught up, particularly when combating PSAC West foes. It resulted in a 5-7 league record, although Edinboro qualified for the PSAC Playoffs with a fourth place finish.

"I think probably the thing that sticks out the most is that we've been very successful, but we haven't had great rebounding teams like I had in the past," related Swank. "We wanted to get some size to get some rebounding. I think we've accomplished that."

For starters, he brought in Agnes Michalow and Kim Mardis a year ago. Both Michalow, a 6'3" junior transfer from the College of DuPage, and Mardis, a 6'4" red-shirt freshman, had to sit out last season, but they were able to practice with the team. Then Swank went out and signed Jessica Trotter, another 6'5" performer, last fall.

"I think all the other components are there," stressed Swank. "We have a point guard back who is exciting to watch. She runs the show. Our leading scorer is back. We have two other seniors who are great players. This gives us a great nucleus returning. It's very exciting."

"This team has great potential," Swank continued. "We're actually kind of youthful. I'm excited. We're going to be good. It's as good an academic group as I've ever coached, as well. I think this is a team with great character, excellent work ethic, and it's talented."

Eight letterwinners are back, including three starters. The biggest loss is Jodi Calderone, the top three-point threat the last two years, and an outstanding defender. Calderone's 81 three-pointers will no doubt be missed. Several of the returnees are second-year players who saw limited action a year ago, but Swank feels they have made great strides and are ready to contribute.

"This is a team with a lot of flexibility," Swank stated. "We can play Maria (DiVecchio) inside and outside. Agnes (Michalow) can play inside and out. We can play Kelly (Calderone) at the point or two-guard. Rachel (Johnson) has looked great. She's improved greatly over the summer. Jen Boykin's shooting is better. She worked hard during the summer. I've seen a lot of positives this year."

Swank noted that he has just 11 players

on the roster, which is both good and bad. "It will give us more repetitions in practice, and make us better conditioned. We have to stay away from the injury bug. One of the neat things about this team is all 11 can play."

Edinboro opens the 2005-06 season on Friday, November 18 in the Kutztown Classic. The Fighting Scots face a pair of West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference opponents - Alderson-Broaddus and Davis & Elkins - the opening weekend, then return home for seven straight contests. In fact, Swank's team doesn't leave the confines of McComb Fieldhouse until after the New Year.

Edinboro will host the Edinboro Classic on December 10-11, once again playing two WVIAC foes. After facing West Liberty the first day, the Fighting Scots will go up against a Glenville State team which was 24-8 a year ago and made the NCAA Division II Playoffs. "I like our schedule," related Swank. It's a nice blend of extremely challenging games, such as Glenville State, West Liberty, Pitt-Johnstown, and Millersville. And of course there's Cal out of the West. They'll be extremely tough."

In addition to Glenville State, four other teams on the schedule finished with twenty wins, with three making the NCAA Playoffs. California (Pa.), the 2004 national champion, was 26-6, with fellow PSAC West member Clarion 23-7. Millersville finished with a 21-9 ledger. Pitt-Johnstown was 21-6.

Here's a look at the 2005-06 Fighting Scots, position-by-position:

Backcourt

The backcourt is in great shape with Callie Iorfido at the point and Kelly Calderone on a wing. Inch for inch, there may not be a better player in the PSAC than Iorfido. The 5'5" senior led the PSAC both in assists and steals, falling just shy of the season assist record at Edinboro with 225, the second-highest total and fourth in Division II, and registering 91 steals, the sixth-highest season total. She committed just 95 turnovers.

Iorfido also averaged 10.4 ppg. and a surprising 4.0 rpg. She enters her final season with 433 career assists, good for fifth in the career records. She needs 68 assists to break Pam Artman's career record of 500. Iorfido also ranks tenth in steals with 188.

"I think Callie has the opportunity to have an unbelievably great season," stressed Swank. "She's at the pinnacle of her career. She played with Courtney Thompson, and learned how to play above the neck, to play the game mentally as well as physically. She has outstanding athletic ability. She'd like to have a great final year."

Calderone joined the Edinboro program a year ago after transferring from the

University at Buffalo. The 5'8" junior ended up leading the Fighting Scots in scoring at 16.1 ppg., adding 66 assists and 64 steals. She finished second in three-pointers, making 59 of 168, and made 117 of 138 free throws. Her 84.8 free throw percentage ranked 25th in Division II and is the fourth-highest figure ever at Edinboro. Calderone scored in double figures in 25 of 28 contests.

"Callie and Kelly played together in high school," recalled Swank. "They are a tremendously good tandem. Kelly brings the ability to score, and she now understands the conference and its rivalries. She started out slow, but finished very strong."

Jessi Montie will likely step in at the third guard spot, replacing Jodi Calderone. While she isn't the scoring threat the older Calderone was, Montie is a strong defensive player who has seen her offense improve each year. A year ago the 5'9" senior exhibited a much-improved jumper. Montie averaged 5.0 ppg. and 2.5 rpg. while averaging just under 15 minutes per contest. Despite the limited minutes, she finished tied for third on the team in steals (41).

"Jessi has played three years," stated Swank. "She brings good leadership. Jessi is shooting the ball well, the best I've ever seen her. She understands what she needs to do offensively and defensively."

Sophomores Jennifer Boykin, Rachel Johnson and Mandie Iorfido, Callie's younger sister, will compete for time off the bench. Boykin, 5'8", was known for her defensive skills a year ago. She saw limited action, appearing in 16 games and scoring 14 points, in just under five minutes per game. "Jen worked her tail off over the summer," stressed Swank. "She took over 10,000 shots during the summer. Her confidence level is much higher. She understands now, and has really dedicated herself."

Johnson is 5'11" and will likely also see time at forward. She also saw little action, with just 47 minutes in 10 games, scoring 4 points and pulling down 9 rebounds. Swank thinks she's ready to make her mark, as well. "Rachel has taken her game to a new level. She has the long arms of Heather Gates (former Edinboro standout), and plays a lot like her. She has improved her game so much over the summer, greater than anybody. She has improved her shot a lot. She will definitely play."

Mandie Iorfido, 5'7", made her mark as a softball player a year ago, but Swank feels she is in better shape and ready to contribute to the basketball team, as well. She played in just nine contests, scoring one point.

Frontcourt

Probably no one will welcome the addition of the three six-plus-footers more than Maria DiVecchio. For three years DiVecchio has been forced to perform as an undersized pivot player. Now the 5'11" senior can move outside to take advantage of her outside

shooting skills, and she'll be matched up against a player of similar size defensively.

After averaging 14.1 ppg. and earning second team All-PSAC West honors as a sophomore, DiVecchio suffered through a discouraging junior campaign, punctuated by an ankle injury which forced her to miss six games and hampered her much of the PSAC West campaign. It after a strong start in which she was averaging close to 15 points per game. She saw her average plummet to 8.8 ppg. by the end of the year, along with a career-low 4.1 rpg. After two straight seasons shooting better than 50 percent from the floor, she fell under the mark at 49.4 percent, still fifth in the PSAC. She enters the 2005-06 campaign with 846 career points, ranking 25th all-time at Edinboro.

"Maria is back in shape, her ankle is 100 percent," Swank pointed out. "She brings a wealth of experience and talent. Since she got hurt as a junior, she still has something to prove as a senior. Sometimes seniors aren't hungry, I think all three of our seniors are hungry. She has added to her game. She's shooting better from the outside. It will help her rebounding to be playing somebody her own size."

The other returnee in the frontcourt is Rae Sherrad, a 5'9" sophomore. Sherrad was an interesting story a year ago, transferring from Penn State Behrend, where she played volleyball. Little-used until injuries hit the Scots, she had several outings where her strength and desire to hit the glass proved valuable, including a 12-point, 8-rebound effort against Lock Haven. She ended up playing in 14 games and averaging just under nine minutes, averaging 2.1 points and 1.9 rebounds.

"Rae has worked hard on her conditioning," stated Swank. "She has improved quite a bit. She got the opportunity to see what the college game was about. She is playing well."

Agnes Michalow and Kim Mardis both redshirted a year ago, but they won't be doing a lot of sitting this year. Michalow is a 6'3" junior who played two seasons for a College of DuPage team which reached the NJCAA Division III national championship game in 2004. She had 30 points, 17 rebounds and 2 blocks in the loss to Minneapolis CTC. A native of Krakow, Poland, her game has a European flavor to it, as she is a very proficient outside player. She was a third team All-American as a sophomore, averaging 13.7 ppg. and 8.0 rpg. The surprising part is that she made 37 of 104 three-pointers. As a freshman she averaged 11.5 ppg. and 6.2 rpg. with 34 three-pointers in 85 attempts.

"Agnes is an excellent three-point shooter who can play guard or forward," commented Swank. "She can post up a smaller player, and can see over people to pass the ball. It was good for her to redshirt last year. She got a feeling for what we were trying to

do. Now there's no learning process."

Mardis will likely be brought along a little slower than Michalow, since the 6'4" red-shirt freshman does not have the benefit of two years of junior college ball. "Once she gets everything under control, she can be dominating. It helped Kim to sit last year. She's stronger now."

Mardis is a raw performer who played at East Tech High School in Cleveland, OH. She averaged 8 points, 8 rebounds and 3 blocks as a senior.

Swank compared Mardis and freshman Jessica Trotter, another 6'5" freshman, very favorably. "It's scary how good these two can be in four years," he beamed. "They have all the potential in the world. Both will play a lot. Both are raw and will make some mistakes. You can almost see the daily improvement."

Trotter was a standout at Mount Olive (NJ) High School, averaging 9.1 ppg. and 7.1 rpg. while blocking 160 shots in 24 games. As a junior, she averaged 10.6 ppg. and 7.3 rpg. with 114 blocks. In her four seasons she had 370 blocked shots in 83 games, an average of 4.5 per game.

"Jessica is a very intelligent player and hungry to learn," Swank assessed. "She is very coachable and runs the floor well."

Head Coach Stan Swank



Now in his 19th season, Stan Swank has brought a winning tradition to Edinboro University. The winningest coach in Fighting Scot women's basketball history, Swank has had 14 winning seasons during his 18-year tenure while compiling a 307-195 overall mark. He currently ranks 36th in Division II among active coaches in wins with 307.

Edinboro women's basketball has enjoyed seven 20-win seasons, with Swank directing the Fighting Scots to five of those. All told, five of his Fighting Scot editions have reached the NCAA Division II playoffs, with Edinboro reaching the PSAC postseason tournament twelve times. On six of those occasions the Fighting Scots have advanced to the championship game, winning the PSAC title in 1989-90. In the NCAA Division II Tournament, he has guided Edinboro to the Final 32 twice, the Sweet 16 and the Elite Eight.

Swank's Fighting Scots posted their second straight 18-10 ledger a year ago, finishing fourth in the PSAC West. It marked the eighth appearance in the PSAC Playoffs in the last ten years. Edinboro jumped out to a 14-2 record, capped by an eight-game winning streak. The year before Edinboro surprised the rest of the PSAC by going 18-10, the most wins since 1997-98, to finish third in the PSAC West. Three of the losses came to national champion California (Pa.), along with setbacks to nationally-ranked West Texas A&M and Emporia State.

After enduring just his fourth losing season in 2001-02 with a 12-14 record, Swank guided his 2002-03 edition to a 16-12 record. Picked to finish fifth in the preseason coaches poll, the Fighting Scots tied for third to return to postseason action. In 2000-01, Swank led a young outfit which had to replace Jessica Rowe and Marin Hightower to a surprising 17-10 finish. The veteran coach employed a variety of tactics to take advantage of his entire roster, including inserting his entire second team en masse for the starters. The Scots qualified for the PSAC Tournament. Despite a losing record in 1999-2000 (13-14), the Fighting Scots reached the PSAC Tournament.

Swank came to Edinboro in 1987 after an outstanding career as head coach at Parkland (IL) Junior College, where he recorded an impressive 104-20 overall mark.

His first Edinboro squad finished 14-11 overall, barely missing the PSAC playoffs. Building off the previous year's success, the 1988-89 team captured the PSAC Western Division crown, compiling a 21-6 overall record. Swank was chosen PSAC West Coach of the Year as the program won 20 games for the first time in nearly a decade.

The Scots repeated as PSAC West champions

in 1989-90 and won the PSAC tournament for the first time ever. Edinboro also advanced to the NCAA Division II national tournament, winning its first NCAA playoff game in history to advance to the Sweet 16. The team finished with a school-record 27 wins, and Swank was named PSAC West Coach of the Year for the second straight season.

Swank's 1991-92 team finished 22-8 overall and was the PSAC runner-up. The Scots also made another appearance in the NCAA national tournament. The Fighting Scots again finished second in the PSAC in '92-93 and appeared in the national tournament for the third time in four years. After a two-year hiatus, Swank's 1995-96 team returned to the postseason, as the Scots finished 15-13 overall. Edinboro beat PSAC East tri-champion Kutztown in the opening round of the PSAC tournament.

Edinboro was the PSAC West co-champion and the PSAC tournament runner-up in 1996-97, with Swank once again earning Coach of the Year honors. The Scots then posted three victories in the NCAA tournament to win the East Regional title and earn a berth in the NCAA Elite Eight. Edinboro finished the year 24-9, the second highest win total in school history.

The '97-98 Fighting Scot squad also made a run in the NCAA Playoffs after finishing as the runnerup in the PSAC Tournament. Edinboro defeated the University of Charleston before suffering an 88-78 loss to PSAC-rival Shippensburg in the NCAA's.

The Fighting Scots jumped out to a 9-0 start in 1998-99 and were ranked 16th in the USA Today WBCA Division II poll. Ravaged by injuries, Edinboro dropped 10 of its next 17 contests, finishing the year 16-10 and missing the PSAC playoffs.

During his tenure Swank has had 37 All-PSAC performers, two PSAC West Rookie of the Year recipients, and six Kodak All-Americans. He has received numerous honors, being named the PSAC West Coach of the Year four times and Edinboro University's Coach of the Year twice.

Swank earned a bachelor's degree in Physical Education at Purdue University in 1976. He completed work on his master's degree in Educational Administration at Purdue in 1979. He embarked on his head coaching career at Fisher High School in Illinois, where his boys team compiled a 39-14 record in two seasons. In 1983, he moved on to Parkland Junior College, where his Cobra team won four consecutive sectional championships and finished second twice, and third once, in the NJCAA Region 24.

Swank, his wife Gail and their two sons Stan II, 22, and Benjamin, 18, reside in Edinboro.

Assistant Coach Yvette Sparks



Yvette Sparks was hired as Edinboro University's assistant women's basketball coach in February 2004 and is now in her second full season with the program.

Sparks joined the Edinboro program after serving as the head coach at Malone College in Canton, Ohio from 2001-03. She led the Pioneers to a 37-23 record during her two seasons, including a 24-7 finish in 2001-02. Malone made its first-ever trip to the NAIA National Tournament after finishing third in the American Midwest Conference with a 16-4

ledger. In the first round of the AMC Tournament, the Pioneers earned their first playoff victory since 1982-83 with a 79-63 win over

rival Walsh. Malone played 15th-ranked Judson (Ill.) College in the opening round of the NAIA National Tournament, dropping an 83-68 decision.

Sparks was named the NCCAA East Region Coach of the Year following the 2001-02 campaign. In addition, Malone forward Amy Stefansic was named the school's first-ever NAIA All-American, landing a spot on the third team.

Prior to taking over the Malone program, Sparks served as an assistant coach at Valdosta State University from 1996-2001. The 1996-97 team won the Gulf South Conference East Division championship and earned a spot in the NCAA Division II South Regional, finishing with a 20-7 record. Sparks served as the interim head coach for the 1999-2000 season.

"Yvette brings enthusiasm, passion for the game, and a great personality for recruiting," noted head coach Stan Swank.

A graduate of Clearwater Christian College in 1994, Sparks holds a bachelor of science degree in Physical Education. She was a four-year letterwinner in both basketball and volleyball. Her husband, Jeff, is the National Sales Manager for Snyder Manufacturing in Paris, OH. The couple welcomed their first child, Kara, on August 15.

President, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania



Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996. A sociologist, Dr. Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta State University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh. Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor for student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) Central Administration, serving in that position for 10 years. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill. Prior to his assignment in the SUNY Central Administration, President Pogue was vice president for student affairs, associate vice president for research and educational development, dean of undergraduate studies, and a department chairperson, all at SUNY at Albany.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. He serves as a member of the American Council on Education (ACE) Commission on Women in Higher Education which provides counsel to ACE on policies related to women in higher education and advises on other concerns related to expanded roles and equal opportunity for women in higher education. He is a member of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) Committee on Professional Development, Millennium Leadership Initiative and Christa McAuliffe Selection Committee. He was appointed in 2003 to the International Association of University Presidents Commission on Disarmament Education, Conflict Resolution and Peace. Since 1984, Dr. Pogue has served on the Commission on Higher Education Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA). Most recently, he served as President for the MSA Board of Trustees and as a member of its Executive Committee, and he is a former vice chair of the Commission's Executive Committee.

Dr. Pogue also serves on the Board of Trustees of the BACCHUS &

Sesquicentennial recognizing 150 years of service to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and beyond.

Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie - Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 480,000 bound volumes and 1.3 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

The main campus also includes a modern University Center, planetarium, observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and television stations, health center, counseling center, and much more - all accessible for people with disabilities. The recently renovated and expanded Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of its kind in the nation.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including six residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learned floors - all are wired for voice, video and data.

Edinboro University also operates centers in Erie and Meadville. Edinboro University in Erie - The Porreco Center is a beautiful 27-acre campus that includes classrooms, a computer laboratory, and a unique facility for small conferences, business meetings, and special events. Edinboro University in Meadville is located in the city's historic Bessemer Building.

GAMMA Peer Education Network. He served for two years as chairperson of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (SSHE) Commission for the Universities and Commission of Presidents Executive Committee. He is a member of the Executive Board of A Community of Agile Partners in Education (CAPE). In October 1996, Dr. Pogue was appointed by then Pennsylvania Governor Tom Ridge to the Governor's Commission on Academic Standards. In November 2002, he was appointed co-chair of the Higher Education Committee of Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell's Transition Team. In May, 2004, he was appointed to the Pennsylvania Department of Education Higher Education Advisory Board.

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the Boards of Directors for the Meadville Area Industrial Commission, the Erie Regional Chamber and Growth Partnership, and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra. He serves on the Boards of Corporators for the Hamot Health Foundation, the Saint Vincent Health Center, and the Meadville Medical Center. He is a member of the Martin Luther King Center Scholarship Committee and an Honorary Member of the Erie Wolves Club. Dr. Pogue was chairperson of the Erie County Millennium Commission, the Erie County State Employees Combined Appeal (SECA) campaign in 2001 and 2002, and of the Erie Day School's Adopt-A-Scholar scholarship program (2000-01 and 2002-03). He was also a member of the Erie Mayor's Task Force on Public Safety. Dr. Pogue has served on the boards of directors for the United Way of Erie County and the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

Dr. Pogue was honored by the Erie Area Chamber of Commerce with the Louis J. Tullio Community Service Award. The Greater Erie Community Action Committee (GECAC) honored him with the Paul P. Martin Community Service Award in 2000, and in 1999, the Distinguished Service Award for Leadership and Vision was presented to him by the SUNY at Albany Council of Trustees.

Dr. Pogue has shared his experiences and expertise in Edinboro University classrooms via guest lecturer presentations. He has also taught a course titled, "Special Topics in Sociology" for the Department of Sociology. He continues to enjoy working in the classroom environment.

Since becoming president, Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.
