THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the Grand Marshal, Dr. Rhonda Matthews. A gift of the Alumni Association, the mace was designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel and Dr. Seymour Blinderman, former chairman of the Art Department. It was first used at the inauguration of Edinboro State College President Chester T. McNerney, in 1967.

The mace, twenty-seven inches in length, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded with circular cabochon rubies, secured by bezels. The collar of the mace is inlaid with ebony, alternated with silver relief fleur-de-lis design elements. The cultured pearls mounted in cups encircle the bottom of the collar symbolizing the thirteen state colleges of Pennsylvania. The shaft of the mace is composed of Brazilian rosewood sections, separated by sterling silver rings. The mace is terminated by a cast sterling silver finial; the five cultured pearls represent the existing curricula. The rib-like cone form is terminated by a small silver sphere symbolizing the world.

The metal working processes incorporated in the ceremonial mace include turning, forging, inlaying, stone setting, and lost wax centrifugal casting.

THE PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The first presidential medallion was presented to former President Foster F. Diebold during the May, 1981 commencement ceremonies. Designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel, the sterling silver medallion consists of a three and one-half inch pectoral pendant featuring on its face the figure of a Gordon Highlander with pipes. To the right of the piper is the Cross of St. Andrew. To the left is the Cross of England. Flanking the figure is the date 1857, the opening year of the University, and garland thistles. In the background are the hills of Scotland, and beneath the piper is an open book, a symbol of knowledge. On the reverse side is the sunken crest of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The pendant descends from a shield containing a triple-towered castle. The collar of the medallion is comprised of a series of two-inch shields, alternately bearing three different designs: the meigle, an interlacing knotwork peculiar to the Pictish school of Celtic art; the Tudor rose design; and "ESC" in interlocking letters on a background of tabby weaving. Connecting each of the collar shields is a Cross of St. George, representing the union of Scotland and England. The entire medallion was fabricated and cast in the cire perdue (lost wax) process.

Surrounding the silver medallion is a gold crafted circle which reads "Edinboro University of Pennsylvania." Professor Katzwinkel, now retired, added this piece to the medallion especially for the Inauguration of President Frank G. Pogue in 1997, and it is now a permanent fixture to the medallion representing the school's current status as a University.

ACADEMIC VESTMENTS

The gown, the cap, and the hood, representing the major components of the academic dress, are a ceremonial inheritance from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries, where dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The academic dress worn by those participating in today's academic processional symbolizes the level of their academic attainment and the institution they attended.

GOWN

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The bachelor's and master's gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the bachelor's gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the doctor's degree is made of wool, serge, or silk with an open front faced with wide velvet panels. The sleeves are loose and bell-shaped with three

bars of velvet in black or the color of the discipline in which the doctorate was obtained.

HOOD

The most outstanding feature of the academic dress is the hood. It is usually worn only for the master's and the doctor's degrees. The doctor's hood is longer than the master's hood and has distinguished panels. The college or the university granting the degree is indicated by the color of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

CAP

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the baccalaureate and master's degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The tassel for the doctor's mortarboard is of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the president.

PRESIDENT FRANK G. POGUE

Frank G. Pogue was appointed the 15th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 1996.

A sociologist, Dr. Pogue holds a bachelor's degree from Alabama State University, a master's degree from Atlanta University, and a Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh.

His 11 years of service at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania are marked by unprecedented growth and advancement in academic programs, graduate enrollment, campus facilities, and fund raising. Ushered by a nationally-recognized strategic planning process, academic programs have expanded to include broadcast and print journalism, forensic chemistry, forensic accounting, women's studies, character education, and management information systems among others. At the same time, online programs have contributed to significant growth in graduate enrollment. New accreditations have been achieved in Education, Business, and Social Work, and accreditation efforts are under way for the University's programs in Art, Theatre, Business and Journalism. The University was reaccredited with commendation for ten years by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools in 2003. Under Dr. Pogue's direction, the campus has undergone a physical transformation that is unparalleled in the history of the University. New buildings, renovations, new campus signage, infrastructure upgrades, and information technology equipment, networking, and information system enhancements have ensured that our students and faculty have access to the facilities and support systems necessary to enable academic excellence. The doors to Edinboro University in Meadville opened in 2005, signifying the University's permanent presence in Crawford County. Access to Edinboro University in Erie - The Porreco Center was enhanced through technological connectivity between and among the University's Edinboro, Erie, and Meadville locations. As the Sesquicentennial year concluded this spring, the University successfully completed the \$15 million capital campaign - the Campaign for Excellence. Dr. Pogue has created the concept and philosophy of the Edinboro Family, a learner-centered environment where students come first and are an integral part of a caring and supportive campus community.

Dr. Pogue participates in national, regional and statewide leadership groups. He serves on the American Council on Education's (ACE) Commission on Women in Higher Education and is chair of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities' (AASCU) Millennium Leadership Initiative. Regionally, he serves on the advisory council on affiliated institutions for the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA) with which he has been affiliated for more than 30 years. His statewide involvement includes the Board of Directors of Pennsylvania Campus Compact, the

Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (PASSHE) Commission for the Universities and Commission of Presidents, and the Executive Board of A Community of Agile Partners in Education (CAPE). He has served on higher education advisory panels for Pennsylvania Governors Tom Ridge and Edward G. Rendell.

Locally, Dr. Pogue serves on the Boards of Directors for the Meadville Area Industrial Commission, the Erie Regional Chamber and Growth Partnership, and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra. Additionally, he serves on the Boards of Corporators for the Hamot Health Foundation, the Saint Vincent Health Center, and the Meadville Medical Center. Dr. Pogue has provided leadership for a number of regional fund-raising initiatives, including the Erie County State Employees Combined Appeal (SECA) campaign, the Erie Day School's Adopt-A-Scholar scholarship drive, and the Annual Campaign of the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross. This year, he is serving as the Community Campaign Chair for the 2007 United Arts Fund Drive.

This year Dr. Pogue was honored by Governor and Mrs. Rendell for his dedication and service to all of northwestern Pennsylvania. The Erie Area Chamber of Commerce presented him with the Louis J. Tullio Community Service Award. The Greater Erie Community Action Committee (GECAC) honored him in 2006 with the R. Benjamin Wiley Memorial Award, "Spirit of GECAC"; the Othello Myers Johnson Human Services Award (2004); and with the Paul P. Martin Community Service Award (2000). In 1999, the Distinguished Service Award for Leadership and Vision was presented to him by the SUNY at Albany Council of Trustoes.

Prior to his presidency at Edinboro University, Dr. Pogue was the vice chancellor for student affairs and special programs at the State University of New York (SUNY) System Administration in Albany. While vice chancellor, he also served for one year as interim president at the SUNY College at Cobleskill.



GRAND MARSHAL

Leading the academic procession and representing her faculty colleagues by carrying the Ceremonial Mace at today's Commencement Ceremony is Dr. Rhonda Matthews of the Sociology Department at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Matthews' selection as Mace Bearer for the Spring Commencement is symbolic of the central role which faculty play in the academic and personal development of Edinboro's students.

Dr. Matthews typifies the expertise of our faculty in scores of disciplines, their dedication to academic excellence, and most of all, their commitment to our students.

A member of the American Sociological Association, the Association of College Personnel Administrators, and the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators, Dr. Matthews earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in English Literature from Alcorn State University. She was awarded the Master of Education in Counseling degree by Mississippi State University in Starkville. She earned the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Sociology from the University of Oklahoma at Norman.

Prior to her arrival at Edinboro, Professor Matthews served as Allegheny College's Director of the Office of Diversity Affairs. She was also Allegheny's Campus Sexual Harassment Officer and the Associate Director in the Office of Residence Life. While a visiting professor at Allegheny College, Dr. Matthews taught courses in Sociology, Research Methods and Cultural Anthropology.


Previously, she was employed in various teaching and administrative positions at Oklahoma City Community College, the University of Oklahoma, San Francisco State University and Women's Services, Incorporated.

Since joining the Edinboro faculty in 2002, Professor Matthews immersed herself in all aspects of University life, in addition to her roles as teacher and academic advisor.

"In advising students, my goals are twofold," she recently wrote. "The first is not so much a drive to convert people to Sociology as a major if they are undeclared, but to help them find what they would like to do and pave the way for declaration of their major in their chosen field. Secondly, I strive to direct Sociology majors and Human Services majors into classes that complete their majors, but also meet their work goals and personal interests."

In addition to her accomplishments in the classroom and student advising, Professor Matthews continues her scholarly growth through participation in myriad workshops, seminars, and training sessions, and through delivery of research papers and presentations that further advance and underscore her excellence in her chosen discipline.

With her overriding objective of making a positive difference in the lives and futures of her students while helping to fulfill the University's goals, Dr. Matthews is a true personification of our talented, dedicated faculty. Her selection as Mace Bearer honors not only Professor Rhonda Matthews, but Edinboro University's entire faculty.

HONORARY DOCTORATE

Dr. Frank G. Pogue – whose 11-year presidency at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania was built upon a student-centered philosophy with civility as its core value – has been selected to receive the degree, Doctor of Public Service (*Doctor Beneficiorum Publicorum*, *Honoris Causa*), at today's Commencement Ceremony.

As the University's 15th president, Dr. Pogue has been the most internally prolific and externally outreaching leader in Edinboro's storied 150-year history. Since July 1, 1996, the Pogue presidency transformed the 585-acre campus in terms of building renovation, new construction, unprecedented growth in academic programs and enrollment, diversity and inclusion, technology upgrades, and improved accessibility for those with disabilities. The result is a user-friendly, aesthetically pleasing academic, cultural and recreational environment focusing on student success – and a nationally acclaimed University.

During Dr. Pogue's tenure, Edinboro University created an important presence in Meadville, establishing a vital component to the region's economic development efforts. With three locations – Edinboro, Erie and Meadville – all linked by free EMTA bus service, Dr. Pogue further enhanced the University's reputation as northwestern Pennsylvania's largest and most comprehensive institution of higher education.

Dr. Pogue's focus on fundraising, endowments and scholarship surpasses all previous efforts. The recently concluded *Campaign for Excellence* exceeded its \$15 million goal, unprecedented in Edinboro's prior capital campaign efforts. The eight Frank G. Pogue Honors Scholarship Luncheons raised more than \$900,000, a lasting legacy of the Frank and Dorothy Pogue Scholarship.

A native of Alabama who grew up in the legally racially-segregated South, Dr. Pogue became Pennsylvania's first black president of a traditionally white college or university. Drawing upon childhood experiences, educational opportunities and his sociological background, President Pogue set out to not only increase diversity, but firmly establish an umbrella of

civility beneath which all academic, cultural and recreational endeavors have flourished within a safe, nurturing campus environment. In creating the "Edinboro Family," President Pogue extended his umbrella of civility to students and their families, faculty, staff, alumni and all friends of the University throughout the region, state, nation and world.

In 1961, President Pogue earned his Bachelor's degree in Sociology from Alabama State University. He earned his Master's degree in Sociology in 1965 from Atlanta University, and in 1973 he was awarded his Ph.D. in Sociology by the University of Pittsburgh.

Dr. Pogue's career in higher education has spanned 45 years, starting with Dean of Students and Chair of the Department of Sociology and Anthropology at Philander Smith College in Little Rock, Arkansas, and culminating with his presidency at Edinboro University. Along the way, his upward career path took him through various teaching, research and administrative positions, including Vice President for Student Affairs at the State University of New York at Albany, and Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs and Special Programs at the State University of New York System Administration, involving 64 campuses and more than 400,000 students. Upon his departure in 1996 from SUNY, where his wife, Dorothy Dexter Pogue, served as a librarian, the library's staff created the Frank and Dorothy Pogue Endowment Fund to recognize their exemplary service to the University.

In addition to his many on-campus accomplishments, Dr. Pogue's presidency extended far beyond the confines of the University. Regionally, his leadership and service extended to dozens of civic boards and commissions, including chairing the Erie County Millennium Commission and establishing Erie County's Commission on Civility.

The recipient of scores of tributes from local, regional, state, educational and business leaders, one of Dr. Pogue's hallmarks has been his accessibility to students, faculty and staff. He is a consistently visible figure on Edinboro's campus. Daily, he is greeted by countless students. Many bring cookies and pies to the Pogue residence,

and more than once during his travels he has stopped for disabled vehicles along Interstate 79 or Route 99, only to discover students in need of assistance.

Dr. Pogue's commitment to the Edinboro Family went far beyond normal business hours, as he made countless hospital, funeral home and home visits to comfort Edinboro Family members in times of illness or mourning.

Dr. and Mrs. Pogue have been married for more than 40 years. For her contributions as Edinboro's First Lady, and to the Baron-Forness Library and the community, Mrs. Pogue is also being honored today with an honorary Doctorate in Public Service. The Pogues are the proud parents of one daughter, Constance Pogue Williams of Dover, Delaware, and have two grandsons, Colson and Craig Williams.

As the final year of the Pogue Presidency coincided with the University's yearlong Sesquicentennial Celebration, President Pogue's accomplishments both on and off campus have well-positioned Edinboro University for the next 150 years.



HONORARY DOCTORATE



Mrs. Dorothy Dexter Pogue, beloved First Lady of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania for the past 11 years, has been selected to receive the degree, Doctor of Public Service (*Doctor Beneficiorum Publicorum*, *Honoris Causa*), at today's Commencement Ceremony.

Since 1996, Mrs. Pogue not only completed and complimented the popular, well-respected "Pogue Team," but she reached out far beyond the traditional First Lady role with her many contributions to the Edinboro Family and the regional community outside the confines of the University proper – just as she has throughout a career dedicated to the most lofty ideals of higher education and service to others.

Mrs. Pogue received her Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education (with an expertise in mathematics) from Alabama State University in Montgomery in 1962. While at Alabama State, she was a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority where she became active in its Community Outreach Program.

In 1969, Mrs. Pogue earned her Master's degree in Library Science at the University of Pittsburgh, and in 1982 she completed course work for the Advanced Certificate School of Information and Library Science at the State University of New York at Albany.

During an earlier period, Dorothy Dexter and Frank Pogue met, fell in love, and were married August 24, 1963 at the Mount Olive Baptist Church No. 2 in Mobile, Alabama. Performing the wedding ceremony was the late Rev. J.D. Weaver,

the director of the church's Sunday School where Dorothy Dexter worked as a secretary.

Her career, spanning more than four decades, included teaching and librarian duties at Carver Elementary School in Little Rock, Arkansas; Student Affairs Activities at Philander Smith College in Little Rock; caseworker for the Allegheny County Department of Public Assistance in Pittsburgh; and various teaching and library assignments in the Bethlehem (New York) School District. From 1984 through 1996, she was assistant librarian at SUNY-Albany, where her husband became Vice President for Student Affairs and later Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs and Special Programs at the State University of New York System Administration.

Upon her departure from SUNY-Albany in 1996, the library's staff created the Frank and Dorothy Pogue Endowment Fund to recognize their exemplary service to the University.

Shortly after Dr. Pogue became president of Edinboro University, Mrs. Pogue became a librarian at the Baron-Forness Library, where her main responsibilities were in reference services. In this area, she particularly enjoyed working directly with students and is recognized by administrators and co-workers as one of the most student-oriented librarians on campus. During her Edinboro tenure, in addition to her responsibilities as First Lady, Mrs. Pogue served on a number of library committees and teams where she was an active member the Facilities Committee, the Reference Services Team and the Assessment Committee. She was also the library's liaison to the English and Theatre Arts Department, and worked on collection development in English as well as other subject areas. In addition, she has prepared a number of library displays.

A key member of the Edinboro University Women's Association, Mrs. Pogue has been active as well within the Western Pennsylvania/West Virginia Chapter of the Association of College and Research Libraries. She is also credited with playing an important role in the formation of the Friends of the Baron-Forness Library support organization.

Her desire to reach out to the community began in high school as a Baptist Trainer at her church and continued throughout her life. From 1985 to 1989, she was co-director of Delta Pearl, a program for underprivileged girls operated by the Mount Calvary Baptist Church in Albany where she was a member. Since her arrival at Edinboro, she became a member of the Board of Directors of Community Shelter Services in Erie, helping secure adequate housing for abused women and their children.

The life partnership the former Dorothy Dexter forged more than 40 years ago with Frank Pogue, Edinboro's 15th President, would be one of continual service to others.

A highly visible figure on campus, as well as at many University and off-campus events, Mrs. Pogue was visited at home one night by several students who had been summoned by campus police. With the President away on business, the concerned students asked Mrs. Pogue to accompany them. She did not hesitate to join them, underscoring her commitment to students and the high value she places on being accessible to them.

Dr. and Mrs. Pogue are the proud parents of one daughter, Constance Williams of Dover, Delaware, and have two grandsons, Colson and Craig.

EDUCATOR, ADVISOR, RESEARCHER AND STAFF MEMBER OF THE YEAR AWARDS

DR. DAVID HURD, Geosciences Department, is the 2007 Educator of the Year. He joined the faculty of Edinboro University in 1992. Colleagues and students alike consistently remark upon the energy and vitality that he brings to the classroom, as well as his ability to actively involve students in the learning process. Said one of his students, "Dr. Hurd's enthusiasm for sharing his knowledge makes it obvious that he enjoys teaching, and his high energy and constant enthusiasm made it impossible not to enjoy each class period." Recently, he was recognized by Edinboro University during American Education Week for being "exceptional in the classroom." For the past two years, Dr. Hurd has served as the program director for the Westinghouse Science and Math program, which brings minority students from Pittsburgh and brings them to Edinboro University for a weeklong series of science and math programs. He has collaborated with the Office for Students with Disabilities in the development of tactile astronomy materials for use by visually impaired and blind students. This initiative has been so successful that Dr. Hurd is now an active consultant for the National Aeronautics and Space

Administration (NASA) and the National Park Service. In collaboration with other institutions along the east coast, he recently submitted a \$3 million National Science Foundation (NSF) grant proposal for the creation of a regional alliance for persons with disabilities in education. In addition to teaching, Dr. Hurd serves as the director of the Edinboro University Planetarium and as faculty advisor for the campus Astronomy Club. The Planetarium has thrived under his leadership: it now serves nearly 10,000 visitors per year and utilizes Dr. Hurd's own grade-specific programs and activities appropriate for the wide range of visitors' ages. Dr. Hurd remains active in a number of professional organizations such as the International Planetarium Society and the Great Lakes Planetarium Association, which he serves as treasurer. In addition, he finds time to participate in primary and secondary school science fairs and consults with local school districts on their astronomy curricula.

ELVAGE MURPHY, J.D., Department of Political Science and Criminal Justice, is the recipient of the 2007 Advisor of the Year award. He earned Bachelor's degrees in Economics and Business Administration from Edinboro University, and he earned the Juris Doctorate from West Virginia University College of Law. Murphy joined the faculty of Edinboro University in 2002 and currently teaches several courses in criminology. Professor Murphy serves as the faculty advisor for four organizations on campus. He chaired the Edinboro University Faculty Research Team and the Department Grade Appeal Committee. He also served as keynote speaker, guest lecturer, moderator, panelist, and coordinator for many academic and civic events at Edinboro. One of his nominators said of him, "Professor Murphy has always been accessible to his students...Professor Murphy always has an open door, compassionate ear, and warm smile... While I was out with an illness, he encouraged me to continue on with my studies and even made arrangements for me to take exams with my other instructors... He treats every student like they are his personal advisee." Prior to joining the Edinboro Family, Professor Murphy worked for the Erie County Public Defender's Office and as a prosecutor for the Erie County District Attorney.

DR. KEVIN COURTRIGHT, Department of Political Science and Criminal Justice, is the recipient of the 2007 Researcher of the Year award. Dr. Courtright earned his Bachelor's degree in Political Science from the State University of New York at Fredonia, his Master's degree in Administration of Justice from Mercyhurst College, and his Ph.D. in Criminology from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. He published 9 journal articles, presented 11 scholarly papers at national conferences, and received various research grants for his scholarly work. As a reviewer for several journals and publishers, Dr. Courtright conducts approximately 3-4 reviews per year. One of his nominators said of him, "Dr. Courtright has demonstrated that he is one of the State System of Higher Education's most successful and prolific young scholars through both the quality and

quantity of his publication of scholarly works, which have been important contributions to criminal justice scholarship nationally." Dr. Courtright considers research an important part of the university experience for students; his latest research project involved several graduate assistants in an ambitious endeavor spanning more than two years. In addition to maintaining an active and ambitious research agenda, he regularly teaches over 180 students each semester and advises 60-80 students. His teaching and research interests include: corrections, attitudinal measurement, criminology, research methods, and juvenile justice.

MS. PAULA WARNER, Secretary of the Department of Mathematics and Computer Science, is the 2007 Staff Member of the Year. She is beginning her ninth year as an employee of Edinboro University. Her first position was in the University's Scheduling Office, and in August of 2005, Paula began her current position in Doucette Hall. One of her nominators said of her: "Paula demonstrates outstanding service to the University, faculty, and students in a variety of ways. She is always more than willing to help in whatever way she can." Ms. Warner's nomination received an endorsement from her entire department. "To me, working at Edinboro is more than just a job. These past years have been very fulfilling and I thoroughly enjoy working with the students, staff, and faculty of this fine University," says Warner. "Because I enjoy my position so much, I try to give back to the University... volunteering my time is a way in which I try to help, and it is the most rewarding to me." Since her employment with Edinboro, she and her son Brian have been volunteers at the Edinboro Highland Games and Scottish Festival held every May. She serves as a member of the Judicial Affairs Committee of Fact, as well as a Sexual Violence Victim Advocate. In addition to her volunteer work, Ms. Warner writes a monthly departmental newsletter, "The MACS Tidbits," which she created to highlight outstanding scholarship, announce upcoming events, and bring students and faculty together.

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the Grand Marshal, Dr. Renata Wolynec. A gift of the Alumni Association, the mace was designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel and Dr. Seymour Blinderman, former chairman of the Art Department. It was first used at the inauguration of Edinboro State College President Chester T. McNerney, in 1967.

The mace, twenty-seven inches in length, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded with circular cabochon rubies, secured by bezels. The collar of the mace is inlaid with ebony, alternated with silver relief fleur-de-lis design elements. The cultured pearls mounted in cups encircle the bottom of the collar symbolizing the thirteen state colleges of Pennsylvania. The shaft of the mace is composed of Brazilian rosewood sections, separated by sterling silver rings. The mace is terminated by a cast sterling silver finial; the five cultured pearls represent the existing curricula. The rib-like cone form is terminated by a small silver sphere symbolizing the world.

The metal working processes incorporated in the ceremonial mace include turning, forging, inlaying, stone setting, and lost wax centrifugal casting.

THE PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The first presidential medallion was presented to former President Foster F. Diebold during the May, 1981 Commencement ceremonies. Designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel, the sterling silver medallion consists of a three and one-half inch pectoral pendant featuring on its face the figure of a Gordon Highlander with pipes. To the right of the piper is the Cross of St. Andrew. To the left is the Cross of England. Flanking the figure is the date 1857, the opening year of the University, and garland thistles. In the background are the hills of Scotland, and beneath the piper is an open book, a symbol of knowledge. On the reverse side is the sunken crest of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The pendant descends from a shield containing a triple-towered castle. The collar of the medallion is comprised of a series of two-inch

shields, alternately bearing three different designs: the meigle, an interlacing knotwork peculiar to the Pictish school of Celtic art; the Tudor rose design; and "ESC" in interlocking letters on a background of tabby weaving. Connecting each of the collar shields is a Cross of St. George, representing the union of Scotland and England. The entire medallion was fabricated and cast in the cire perdue (lost wax) process.

Surrounding the silver medallion is a gold crafted circle which reads "Edinboro University of Pennsylvania." Professor Katzwinkel, now retired, added this piece to the medallion especially for the Inauguration of President Frank G. Pogue in 1997, and it is now a permanent fixture to the medallion representing the school's current status as a University.

ACADEMIC VESTMENTS

The gown, the cap, and the hood, representing the major components of the academic dress, are a ceremonial inheritance from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries, where dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The academic dress worn by those participating in today's academic processional symbolizes the level of their academic attainment and the institution they attended.

GOWN

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The bachelor's and master's gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the bachelor's gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the doctor's degree is made of wool, serge, or silk with an open front faced with wide velvet panels. The sleeves are loose and bell-shaped with three

bars of velvet in black or the color of the discipline in which the doctorate was obtained.

HOOD

The most outstanding feature of the academic dress is the hood. It is usually worn only for the master's and the doctor's degrees. The doctor's hood is longer than the master's hood and has distinguished panels. The college or the university granting the degree is indicated by the color of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

CAP

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the baccalaureate and master's degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The tassel for the doctor's mortarboard is of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the president.

Dr. Jeremy D. Brown became the 16th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 2007.

Dr. Brown came to Edinboro from the State University of New York's Canton campus where he served as provost and vice president for academic affairs. As the 2,600-student university's chief academic officer, he guided campus-wide strategic planning, while overseeing vigorous growth in distance learning opportunities and cultivating international collaborations. During his tenure there, the number of baccalaureate degrees awarded doubled and external funding increased by 50 percent. Dr. Brown's responsibilities included academic affairs, institutional research, library, information technology, grants, registrar, small business development, extended studies, and national and international development initiatives. In addition, he was elected vice chair of the SUNY Chief Academic Officers Association.

Dr. Brown is a native of Manchester, England, and earned both a Bachelor of Science and a Ph.D. in physics from the University of Birmingham, England. His doctoral work was in the area of experimental nuclear physics, and he conducted research at both the University of Birmingham and the University of California-Berkeley. Upon completion of his Ph.D., Dr. Brown spent two years at Indiana University continuing his research in nuclear physics.

Dr. Brown accepted a faculty position in the Physics Department of Princeton University, where, in addition to continuing his research, he taught undergraduate and graduate-level physics courses. During this time, he served as a resident faculty fellow at Rockefeller College and was faculty liaison for academic and social programs there.

Transitioning into academic administration, Dr. Brown was named associate dean of the Graduate School at Yale University where his portfolio included the Science, Engineering and Biomedical Departments, as well as recruitment of underrepresented minority students. He also served as the Graduate School's chief budget officer.

Returning to Princeton as associate dean of the faculty, Dr. Brown advised the dean of faculty and provost on long-range academic planning initiatives and budgeting, and supervised all personnel issues for the 960 members of the technical, research and library staffs.

In 2000, Dr. Brown was named rector of Florida State University-Panama, serving as the chief executive officer of a small U.S. university operating in Latin America. During his tenure, enrollment, the curriculum and revenues grew dramatically as he developed strategic plans for growth and both national and international recruitment.

During his career, Dr. Brown published many scholarly articles and was an invited speaker at international conferences, research institutions and universities. He served as a visiting scientist at the University of Stellenbosch, the University of Manitoba, the Department of Nuclear Physics at Oxford University and the National Accelerator Centre in Cape Town, South Africa.

Dr. Brown's wife, Rebeca Acuña, a native of Panama, is also no stranger to higher education. Most recently, she served as director of Higher Education Opportunities at St. Lawrence University.

Dr. Brown is an avid squash player. He coached the St. Lawrence University men's and women's squash teams for three years, taking them to the national tournament. Dr. Brown also enjoys sailing and skiing, and particularly takes delight in spending time with his two sons, Lucas and Gabriel, and visiting his family in England. He likes to unwind by watching movies, and is an avid fan of the Manchester United soccer team.



Leading the academic procession and carrying the ceremonial mace at today's Commencement ceremony is Dr. Renata B. Wolynec, Professor of Anthropology.

Dr. Wolynec earned Baccalaureate and Master's degrees in anthropology from the State University of New York at Buffalo. She received a Ph.D. in anthropology from Northwestern University, and her thesis was among the first in the country to manipulate huge archaeological databases using computer technology.

Joining the Edinboro University faculty in 1973, Dr. Wolynec helped develop the first recognized major in anthropology in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, as well as one of the first archeology courses in the country to focus on the needs of teachers. She has directed the anthropology program since 1982 and served as advisor to the Anthropology Club since 1975. She has developed archaeology workshops for the U.S. Forest Service, the Society for American Archaeology, Pennsylvania science and social science teachers' conferences, Elderhostel, the Erie County Historical Society, and Edinboro Academy.

Dr. Wolynec has served as director of the Fort LeBoeuf Museum in Waterford, Pennsylvania, since 1982. She helped develop an agreement that allowed Edinboro to be the first State System university to manage a state-owned historical museum in collaboration with the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission. Wolynec has taught over 50,000 school children about George Washington's trip to Fort LeBoeuf, the beaver trade, Native American life, and other aspects of local history, and is now teaching those students' children. She chaired the George Washington 2003 Commemorative Celebration Committee, and she co-chaired the Lafayette Commemorative Days Committee in 2000. She has directed the development of a video-based curriculum project focusing on life at the French fort with a grant from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission.

Dr. Wolynec developed an archaeological field studies program which includes the Waterford Historical Complex, the Battles Museums of Rural Life in Girard, and the old Edinboro Cemetery Marker Inventory Project.

She has directed contract archaeology projects for the U.S. Forest Service, the City of Erie, and Coastal Zone Management. She has done archaeological field research in Ukraine and Belize, in addition to the United States and Mexico.

Dr. Wolynec has been a pioneer in public archaeology education in Pennsylvania. She was chair and co-chair of the Pennsylvania Archaeological Council Education Committee, a founding member of the Pennsylvania Archaeology Month Steering Committee, coorganizer of the forum for State Archaeological Councils at the annual meetings of the Society for American Archeology, Project Archaeology Coordinator for Pennsylvania, and representative to the national Project Archaeology initiative. On behalf of the Pennsylvania Archaeological Council, she was awarded grants from the PHMC Local History Grant program for two archaeology curriculum projects and a teaching trunk project. Dr. Wolynec served as a consultant to the Archaeology Education Coordinator of the Pennsylvania Bureau for Historic Preservation and the Cerros Cooperative Archaeological Development Project in Belize.

She directed and edited *Project Archaeology: Pennsylvania,* and authored Chapter 5, "Heritage Education for Special Students," in *The Archaeology Education Handbook: Sharing the Past with Kids.*

In 2001 she received the Erie County Historical Society's Local History Award. She currently serves as president of the University Senate and as editor of the Pennsylvania Archaeological Council Newsletter.
