THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the Grand Marshal, Dr. Renata Wolynec. A gift of the Alumni Association, the mace was designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel and Dr. Seymour Blinderman, former chairman of the Art Department. It was first used at the inauguration of Edinboro State College President Chester T. McNerney, in 1967.

The mace, twenty-seven inches in length, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded with circular cabochon rubies, secured by bezels. The collar of the mace is inlaid with ebony, alternated with silver relief fleur-de-lis design elements. The cultured pearls mounted in cups encircle the bottom of the collar symbolizing the thirteen state colleges of Pennsylvania. The shaft of the mace is composed of Brazilian rosewood sections, separated by sterling silver rings. The mace is terminated by a cast sterling silver finial; the five cultured pearls represent the existing curricula. The rib-like cone form is terminated by a small silver sphere symbolizing the world.

The metal working processes incorporated in the ceremonial mace include turning, forging, inlaying, stone setting, and lost wax centrifugal casting.

THE PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The first presidential medallion was presented to former President Foster F. Diebold during the May, 1981 Commencement ceremonies. Designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel, the sterling silver medallion consists of a three and one-half inch pectoral pendant featuring on its face the figure of a Gordon Highlander with pipes. To the right of the piper is the Cross of St. Andrew. To the left is the Cross of England. Flanking the figure is the date 1857, the opening year of the University, and garland thistles. In the background are the hills of Scotland, and beneath the piper is an open book, a symbol of knowledge. On the reverse side is the sunken crest of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The pendant descends from a shield containing a triple-towered castle. The collar of the medallion is comprised of a series of two-inch

shields, alternately bearing three different designs: the meigle, an interlacing knotwork peculiar to the Pictish school of Celtic art; the Tudor rose design; and "ESC" in interlocking letters on a background of tabby weaving. Connecting each of the collar shields is a Cross of St. George, representing the union of Scotland and England. The entire medallion was fabricated and cast in the cire perdue (lost wax) process.

Surrounding the silver medallion is a gold crafted circle which reads "Edinboro University of Pennsylvania." Professor Katzwinkel, now retired, added this piece to the medallion especially for the Inauguration of President Frank G. Pogue in 1997, and it is now a permanent fixture to the medallion representing the school's current status as a University.

ACADEMIC VESTMENTS

The gown, the cap, and the hood, representing the major components of the academic dress, are a ceremonial inheritance from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries, where dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The academic dress worn by those participating in today's academic processional symbolizes the level of their academic attainment and the institution they attended.

GOWN

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The bachelor's and master's gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the bachelor's gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the doctor's degree is made of wool, serge, or silk with an open front faced with wide velvet panels. The sleeves are loose and bell-shaped with three

bars of velvet in black or the color of the discipline in which the doctorate was obtained.

HOOD

The most outstanding feature of the academic dress is the hood. It is usually worn only for the master's and the doctor's degrees. The doctor's hood is longer than the master's hood and has distinguished panels. The college or the university granting the degree is indicated by the color of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

CAP

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the baccalaureate and master's degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The tassel for the doctor's mortarboard is of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the president.

Dr. Jeremy D. Brown became the 16th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 2007.

Dr. Brown came to Edinboro from the State University of New York's Canton campus where he served as provost and vice president for academic affairs. As the 2,600-student university's chief academic officer, he guided campus-wide strategic planning, while overseeing vigorous growth in distance learning opportunities and cultivating international collaborations. During his tenure there, the number of baccalaureate degrees awarded doubled and external funding increased by 50 percent. Dr. Brown's responsibilities included academic affairs, institutional research, library, information technology, grants, registrar, small business development, extended studies, and national and international development initiatives. In addition, he was elected vice chair of the SUNY Chief Academic Officers Association.

Dr. Brown is a native of Manchester, England, and earned both a Bachelor of Science and a Ph.D. in physics from the University of Birmingham, England. His doctoral work was in the area of experimental nuclear physics, and he conducted research at both the University of Birmingham and the University of California-Berkeley. Upon completion of his Ph.D., Dr. Brown spent two years at Indiana University continuing his research in nuclear physics.

Dr. Brown accepted a faculty position in the Physics Department of Princeton University, where, in addition to continuing his research, he taught undergraduate and graduate-level physics courses. During this time, he served as a resident faculty fellow at Rockefeller College and was faculty liaison for academic and social programs there.

Transitioning into academic administration, Dr. Brown was named associate dean of the Graduate School at Yale University where his portfolio included the Science, Engineering and Biomedical Departments, as well as recruitment of underrepresented minority students. He also served as the Graduate School's chief budget officer.

Returning to Princeton as associate dean of the faculty, Dr. Brown advised the dean of faculty and provost on long-range academic planning initiatives and budgeting, and supervised all personnel issues for the 960 members of the technical, research and library staffs.

In 2000, Dr. Brown was named rector of Florida State University-Panama, serving as the chief executive officer of a small U.S. university operating in Latin America. During his tenure, enrollment, the curriculum and revenues grew dramatically as he developed strategic plans for growth and both national and international recruitment.

During his career, Dr. Brown published many scholarly articles and was an invited speaker at international conferences, research institutions and universities. He served as a visiting scientist at the University of Stellenbosch, the University of Manitoba, the Department of Nuclear Physics at Oxford University and the National Accelerator Centre in Cape Town, South Africa.

Dr. Brown's wife, Rebeca Acuña, a native of Panama, is also no stranger to higher education. Most recently, she served as director of Higher Education Opportunities at St. Lawrence University.

Dr. Brown is an avid squash player. He coached the St. Lawrence University men's and women's squash teams for three years, taking them to the national tournament. Dr. Brown also enjoys sailing and skiing, and particularly takes delight in spending time with his two sons, Lucas and Gabriel, and visiting his family in England. He likes to unwind by watching movies, and is an avid fan of the Manchester United soccer team.



Leading the academic procession and carrying the ceremonial mace at today's Commencement ceremony is Dr. Renata B. Wolynec, Professor of Anthropology.

Dr. Wolynec earned Baccalaureate and Master's degrees in anthropology from the State University of New York at Buffalo. She received a Ph.D. in anthropology from Northwestern University, and her thesis was among the first in the country to manipulate huge archaeological databases using computer technology.

Joining the Edinboro University faculty in 1973, Dr. Wolynec helped develop the first recognized major in anthropology in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, as well as one of the first archeology courses in the country to focus on the needs of teachers. She has directed the anthropology program since 1982 and served as advisor to the Anthropology Club since 1975. She has developed archaeology workshops for the U.S. Forest Service, the Society for American Archaeology, Pennsylvania science and social science teachers' conferences, Elderhostel, the Erie County Historical Society, and Edinboro Academy.

Dr. Wolynec has served as director of the Fort LeBoeuf Museum in Waterford, Pennsylvania, since 1982. She helped develop an agreement that allowed Edinboro to be the first State System university to manage a state-owned historical museum in collaboration with the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission. Wolynec has taught over 50,000 school children about George Washington's trip to Fort LeBoeuf, the beaver trade, Native American life, and other aspects of local history, and is now teaching those students' children. She chaired the George Washington 2003 Commemorative Celebration Committee, and she co-chaired the Lafayette Commemorative Days Committee in 2000. She has directed the development of a video-based curriculum project focusing on life at the French fort with a grant from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission.

Dr. Wolynec developed an archaeological field studies program which includes the Waterford Historical Complex, the Battles Museums of Rural Life in Girard, and the old Edinboro Cemetery Marker Inventory Project.

She has directed contract archaeology projects for the U.S. Forest Service, the City of Erie, and Coastal Zone Management. She has done archaeological field research in Ukraine and Belize, in addition to the United States and Mexico.

Dr. Wolynec has been a pioneer in public archaeology education in Pennsylvania. She was chair and co-chair of the Pennsylvania Archaeological Council Education Committee, a founding member of the Pennsylvania Archaeology Month Steering Committee, coorganizer of the forum for State Archaeological Councils at the annual meetings of the Society for American Archeology, Project Archaeology Coordinator for Pennsylvania, and representative to the national Project Archaeology initiative. On behalf of the Pennsylvania Archaeological Council, she was awarded grants from the PHMC Local History Grant program for two archaeology curriculum projects and a teaching trunk project. Dr. Wolynec served as a consultant to the Archaeology Education Coordinator of the Pennsylvania Bureau for Historic Preservation and the Cerros Cooperative Archaeological Development Project in Belize.

She directed and edited *Project Archaeology: Pennsylvania,* and authored Chapter 5, "Heritage Education for Special Students," in *The Archaeology Education Handbook: Sharing the Past with Kids.*

In 2001 she received the Erie County Historical Society's Local History Award. She served as president of the University Senate for many years, and is currently editor of the Pennsylvania Archaeological Council Newsletter.



HONORARY DOCTORATE

Michael J. Redlawsk, one of the region's most successful real estate developers and strongest supporters of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, has been selected to receive the degree, Doctor of Public Service (Doctor Beneficiorum Publicorum, Honoris Causa), at today's Commencement Ceremony.

Through the years, Mr. Redlawsk has supported the mission of Edinboro University and many University activities and organizations such as the Wrestling Club, the Annual Arts Award program, the Class Gift program, and the Alumni Association as a major contributor to the Clock Tower Campaign. He created the James Properties Scholarship Fund, which is dedicated to providing financial resources to deserving Edinboro students. His recent pledge to the scholarship fund in honor of the Capital Campaign will take the value of contributions to over \$167,000.

Mr. Redlawsk is a founding member and former Chair of the Executive Committee of the Edinboro University Foundation. Nominated by Edinboro University, he was awarded the 2000 Eberly Award for Philanthropy by the State System of Higher Education. Mr. Redlawsk serves on the Board of Directors of Saint Vincent Health Center and Saint Vincent Health System. He is the Chair of the Finance Committee and a member of the Executive Committee. He also serves on the PNC Advisory Board of North Western Pennsylvania. He is a member of the Board of Directors of Villa Maria Academy; a former member of the Board and past president of the Kahkwa Club; and a member of the Erie Yacht Club and the Erie Club.

Mr. Redlawsk began his real estate career while a student at Edinboro in 1981, when he developed his first real estate limited partnership, James Manor Apartments. The off-campus apartment complex provided a new standard of professionally managed housing for Edinboro University students.

Mr. Redlawsk formed James Properties, Inc., in 1983. Throughout the 1980s, he developed other limited partnerships providing high quality, professionally managed housing for university students. Along with James Manor Apartments, Mr. Redlawsk is General Partner of Darrow Place Partnership, Darrow Place Partnership II, Edinboro College Park Apartments, Lake Ridge Development Company, Shippensburg

Townhouses LLC, Shippensburg Townhouses II, LLC, and University Gate Apartments. As President of James Properties, Inc., he provides housing to over 2,250 students attending Edinboro and Shippensburg Universities of Pennsylvania and Penn State Erie - The Behrend College. Mr. Redlawsk is currently managing the construction of a new, 280-bed facility adjacent to Penn State Erie - The Behrend College, and was recently named Project Developer and Construction Manager for a 320-bed student housing development at Mercyhurst College.

In 1989, Mr. Redlawsk began developing housing dedicated to the needs of older residents. The three Parkside Senior Living Communities, Parkside at North East, Parkside at Westminster, and The Regency at South Shore, provide independent and assisted living services to Erie area seniors. Along with his duties as General Partner, he is also the President of Senior Retirement Management, Inc.

Mr. Redlawsk is a General Partner of Westminster Place Partnership. In the fall of 2000, he formed Westminster Development, LLC, and became a preferred developer for Advance Auto Stores. Westminster Place Partnership and Westminster Development have developed nearly 50 stores for Advance. Through his Westminster entities, Mr. Redlawsk has completed development projects in over 60 markets throughout Pennsylvania, Ohio, New York, New Jersey, Vermont and New Hampshire. He is also a General Partner of Avonia Realty, LLC, the Developer and owner of 42 acres of land and buildings occupied by the Greater Erie Auto Auction.

An instrument-rated pilot, Mr. Redlawsk is President of James Aviation, Inc., and a General Partner of North Coast Charter, an air charter service operated from Erie International Airport.

Mr. Redlawsk lives in Fairview, Pennsylvania, with his wife Carol (a 1985 Edinboro alumna) and their three children, Jamie, Alexandra and Erin.

EDUCATOR, ADVISOR, RESEARCHER & STAFF OF THE YEAR

Ms. DARLA ELDER, RN, the Nurse Supervisor of Student Health Services at the Ghering Health Center, was an easy selection for Staff Member of the Year.

Edinboro University's Ghering Health Center is one of four health facilities in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education that received accreditation by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care. The major undertaking to achieve such accreditation was guided by the efforts of Darla Elder.

"She is always looking for and developing ways to promote better services to our students," wrote Frances Donatelli, Starla Thompson and Joye Dado, Darla's nominators for Staff Member of the Year. "She has a positive attitude and is always willing to help and go the extra mile."

Darla continues to provide educational programs for the Ghering Health Center staff on current and important health issues such as MRSA and influenza. In addition, she serves on many committees established to help promote health initiatives.

Ms. Elder also obtained several grants to assist in the promotion of healthy lifestyles. Among them were grants for The Biggest Loser weight loss contest, PA SWAT on smoking cessation, and a grant to provide drug and alcohol counseling services to Edinboro students.

Her staff members say she motivates them and students in many areas, including authoring articles on health promotion for the campus newsletter.

"Darla continues to work long hours and goes above and beyond her call of duty," conclude her nominators.

Mr. JOHN REPP, of the English and Theatre Arts Department, is this year's Researcher of the Year.

He brought his unsurpassed creative talent to Edinboro University, where he began teaching in 1991, and now serves as a professor for English and Theatre Arts students.

Previously, John was a visiting writer in residence at Carnegie Mellon University.

Since his arrival at Edinboro, Mr. Repp has consistently demonstrated his ability as a first-class scholar, researcher, teacher and colleague.

John's writing has been nothing short of prolific! He has published three books of poetry, seven poetry chapbooks, a short fiction chapbook,

a composition textbook, nearly two dozen book reviews and non-fiction essays and more than 150 individual poems.

Mr. Repp has been awarded numerous writing honors, including the Lyre Prize for Poetry, the Devins Award for Poetry, and an Academy of American Poets Prize.

He has also earned fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts and Pennsylvania Council of the Arts, and residency fellowships sponsored by such prestigious literary foundations as Yaddo and Helen Wurlitzer.

Dr. ROBERT HASS, also of the English and Theatre Arts Department, is the 2008 Educator of the Year. He was nominated by three of his students, Stacey Turner, Douglas Eckbloom and Mark Tanenbaum.

Ms. Turner, in nominating Dr. Hass, wrote: "Dr. Hass embodies all the necessary characteristics of an educator, but his reputation extends beyond his abilities as a teacher. His interpersonal communication with his students, his continuous scholarly pursuits and his gracious service to the University and Edinboro community are equally admirable. He is wise, insightful and enthusiastic, and, therefore, easily

capable of captivating his students' attention."

Mr. Eckbloom was equally praising of Dr. Hass. "As a professor at Edinboro, he is constantly striving to not only inspire and challenge the students to think critically in his class, but he also makes a valiant effort to better Edinboro's academic status as a University."

As a non-traditional student, Mr. Tanenbaum wrote: "Dr. Hass is a knowledgeable and effective educator, dedicated to the highest of higher education, promoting intellectual and interpersonal interactive activities as well as publishing his original and insightful research and observations. He is actively engaged in all facets of campus activity and embodies the finest ideals of academia."

Dr. DONNA HIXON, of the Social Work Department, is the 2008 Advisor of the Year.

"She embodies all of the traits that an outstanding advisor should have," wrote nominator Mathew Lasher.

As a student, Mr. Lasher could not help but be impressed when he met Dr. Dixon for the first time in her office. She had already reviewed his file and was familiar with his academic background. Immediately, she began to provide him with guidance for his transfer credits to help him prepare for graduate school.

Students find Dr. Hixon always accessible as an advisor, and willing to make whatever accommodations she finds necessary to help better prepare them.

Mr. Lasher wrote that after each meeting with Dr. Hixon, he always took at least one positive aspect away with him, useful information that went beyond his expectations and often new knowledge and insights into the profession of social work.

As an adult student, Mr. Lasher praised Dr. Hixon for the assistance she has provided to him and other students. Thanks to Dr. Hixon, he wrote, his future academic plan is now mapped out through graduation.



THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the Grand Marshal, Dr. Thomas White. A gift of the Alumni Association, the mace was designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel and Dr. Seymour Blinderman, former chairman of the Art Department. It was first used at the inauguration of Edinboro State College President Chester T. McNerney, in 1967.

The mace, twenty-seven inches in length, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded with circular cabochon rubies, secured by bezels. The collar of the mace is inlaid with ebony, alternated with silver relief fleur-de-lis design elements. The cultured pearls mounted in cups encircle the bottom of the collar symbolizing the thirteen state colleges of Pennsylvania. The shaft of the mace is composed of Brazilian rosewood sections, separated by sterling silver rings. The mace is terminated by a cast sterling silver finial; the five cultured pearls represent the existing curricula. The rib-like cone form is terminated by a small silver sphere symbolizing the world.

The metal working processes incorporated in the ceremonial mace include turning, forging, inlaying, stone setting, and lost wax centrifugal casting.

THE PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The first presidential medallion was presented to former President Foster F. Diebold during the May, 1981 Commencement ceremonies. Designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel, the sterling silver medallion consists of a three and one-half inch pectoral pendant featuring on its face the figure of a Gordon Highlander with pipes. To the right of the piper is the Cross of St. Andrew. To the left is the Cross of England. Flanking the figure is the date 1857, the opening year of the University, and garland thistles. In the background are the hills of Scotland, and beneath the piper is an open book, a symbol of knowledge. On the reverse side is the sunken crest of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The pendant descends from a shield containing a triple-towered castle. The collar of the medallion is comprised of a series of two-inch

shields, alternately bearing three different designs: the meigle, an interlacing knotwork peculiar to the Pictish school of Celtic art; the Tudor rose design; and "ESC" in interlocking letters on a background of tabby weaving. Connecting each of the collar shields is a Cross of St. George, representing the union of Scotland and England. The entire medallion was fabricated and cast in the cire perdue (lost wax) process.

Surrounding the silver medallion is a gold crafted circle which reads "Edinboro University of Pennsylvania." Professor Katzwinkel, now retired, added this piece to the medallion especially for the Inauguration of President Frank G. Pogue in 1997, and it is now a permanent fixture to the medallion representing the school's current status as a University.

ACADEMIC VESTMENTS

The gown, the cap, and the hood, representing the major components of the academic dress, are a ceremonial inheritance from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries, where dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The academic dress worn by those participating in today's academic processional symbolizes the level of their academic attainment and the institution they attended.

GOWN

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The bachelor's and master's gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the bachelor's gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the doctor's degree is made of wool, serge, or silk with an open front faced with wide velvet panels. The sleeves are loose and bell-shaped with three

bars of velvet in black or the color of the discipline in which the doctorate was obtained.

HOOD

The most outstanding feature of the academic dress is the hood. It is usually worn only for the master's and the doctor's degrees. The doctor's hood is longer than the master's hood and has distinguished panels. The college or the university granting the degree is indicated by the color of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

CAP

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the baccalaureate and master's degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The tassel for the doctor's mortarboard is of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the president.

Dr. Jeremy D. Brown became the 16th president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania on July 1, 2007. In the short time since his inauguration, President Brown has already established new pathways to academic excellence while leading the University in continued physical growth of the Edinboro campus. He has also traveled to Panama, China, Poland and South Korea, renewing or establishing new articulation and collaboration agreements with higher education institutions abroad, and has plans to travel to Bosnia and Mexico for the same purposes.

Since Dr. Brown assumed Edinboro's presidency, graduate studies program enrollment has increased significantly along with the University's distance and online learning offerings. His tenure also includes oversight of more than \$150 million in new and future construction projects.

A renewed "Fighting Scots" school spirit accompanies the Brown presidency, which emphasizes Edinboro's Scottish heritage with events such as Tartan Day, the Purple Thistle Award to recognize outstanding faculty and staff, and a fresh marketing campaign directed at audiences in the traditional recruiting area as well as beyond the boundaries of northwestern Pennsylvania.

Dr. Brown came to Edinboro from SUNY-Canton where he served as provost and vice president for academic affairs since 2003. As the 2,600-student university's chief academic officer, he steered campus-wide strategic planning, oversaw vigorous growth in distance learning opportunities and cultivated many international collaborations.

A native of Manchester, England, he earned both a Bachelor of Science and a Ph.D. in physics from the University of Birmingham, England. His doctoral work in experimental nuclear physics was conducted at the University of Birmingham and the University of California-Berkeley. Immediately following the completion of his Ph.D. requirements, Dr. Brown spent two years at Indiana University doing nuclear physics research.

Following his stint at Indiana, Dr. Brown accepted a faculty position in the Physics Department of Princeton University, where in addition to continuing his research, he taught undergraduate and graduate-level physics

courses. Transitioning into academic administration, Dr. Brown was named associate dean of the Graduate School at Yale University. Later, he returned to Princeton as associate dean of the faculty. In 2000, Dr. Brown was named rector of Florida State University-Panama, serving as the chief executive officer of a small U.S. university operating in Latin America.

During his career, Dr. Brown has published many scholarly articles and has been an invited speaker at international conferences, research institutions and universities. He served as a visiting scientist at the University of Stellenbosch, the University of Manitoba, the Department of Nuclear Physics at Oxford University and the National Accelerator Centre in Cape Town.

The President's community service includes membership on the Board of Corporators of the Hamot Health Foundation, the Board of Trustees for the Saint Vincent Health Center and System, and the Erie Philharmonic Orchestra's Board of Directors and chairmanship of the Board's education committee.

Dr. Brown and his wife, Rebeca, recently became the parents of Andrew Jeremy Brown, born June 17, 2008. When not traveling for the University or engaged in myriad presidential duties, he likes to play squash. In fact, he coached the St. Lawrence University men's and women's squash teams for three years, taking the teams to the national tournament. Weather permitting, Dr. Brown also enjoys sailing and skiing, and particularly takes delight in spending time with his sons Lucas, Gabriel, and now, Andrew Jeremy, and visiting his family in England.



Having taken film courses while on sabbatical at Oxford University, Dr. Brown thoroughly enjoys, when time permits, to unwind by watching movies. Also, being from Manchester, he is an avid fan of the Manchester United soccer team.

Leading the academic procession and representing his faculty colleagues by carrying the ceremonial mace at today's Commencement is Dr. Thomas White of Edinboro University's Nursing Department.

As an Assistant Professor of Nursing and President of the University Senate, Dr. White's distinction as Mace Bearer for the Winter Commencement is symbolic of the central role which faculty play in the academic and personal development of Edinboro's students.

Dr. White, a native of nearby Venango and graduate of Cambridge Springs High School, began his post-secondary academic career in New Castle, Pennsylvania, where he earned a diploma in Professional Nursing from the Jameson Memorial Hospital School of Nursing. From there, it was off to Edinboro University and a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing in 1994, followed by a Master of Science degree in nursing in 1999.

By 2000, he had earned an additional 10 postmasters credits from Edinboro, and in 2006 he was awarded the Doctor of Education in Administrative and Leadership Studies degree from Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

His professional certifications are many and include Basic Life Support, Advanced Cardiac Life Support, Certified Emergency Nursing, Basic Life Support Instructor and National Board-Certified Family Nurse Practitioner.

Dr. White has made many professional presentations at the state and national levels, and his licensure by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and by the Drug Enforcement Agency includes Registered Nurse and Family Nurse Practitioner.

He began teaching at Edinboro University in 1995. His current assistant professorship responsibilities include providing clinical instruction for sophomore, junior, senior and graduate (nurse practitioner) students; classroom instruction in the area of medical/surgical nursing, pediatrics, pharmacology, and community health for undergraduate nursing students; and classroom instruction in assessment and diagnosis for graduate family nurse practitioner students.

Dr. White is also employed at Saint Vincent Health Center's Emergency Department where his responsibilities include providing direct care for a wide variety of critical and non-critical patients, and serving as a charge nurse and trauma nurse leader.

His educational philosophy demonstrates a visceral understanding of the importance of providing complete health care education to students enrolled in one of Edinboro's most sought-after programs. In fact, that philosophy engenders a belief he conveys to students that education has no culmination. "Education is a lifelong journey," he tells his students. "My education truly began when I graduated from college!"

An avid traveler, Dr. White is particularly fond of his trips to Italy and to Hawaii.

Dr. White's background as an undergraduate and graduate student at Edinboro served to enhance and highlight a professional career here that has benefited his students and his colleagues. Like many in his field, he is respected Universitywide as well as in the local health care delivery system in the region beyond Edinboro.

As President of the University Senate, one of Dr. White's tasks is to bring all segments of the Edinboro community together to participate in dealing with challenges facing higher education in general and at Edinboro University in particular.

Dr. White typifies the dedication and commitment of Edinboro University's faculty to



e d u c a t i o n a l excellence and service to students. That's why his selection as our Winter Commencement Mace Bearer and Grand Marshal honors not only Dr. White, but also Edinboro's entire faculty.
