EDINBORO UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



Dr. H. Fred Walker

H. Fred Walker became the 18th President of Edinboro University on July 1, 2016, bringing to Edinboro a successful background in leadership and higher education.

Upon his arrival at Edinboro, President Walker immediately initiated a process of assessments and enhancements designed to build on EU's significant strengths as a public, regional, comprehensive university. The open, inclusive process is ongoing. It has engaged all University constituents, including students, faculty and staff as well as regional employers and other members of the broader community. Resulting initiatives focused on student success, University finances and refreshing the University's academic program array will further

ensure Edinboro's enduring value to Pennsylvania's students and employers.

Dr. Walker came to Edinboro from the Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT), where he served as Dean of the College of Applied Science and Technology from 2008-16. His extensive accomplishments at RIT included leading the college in the development and completion of a strategic plan that included bringing all units within the college into fiscal sustainability, growth of college enrollments and academic program offerings, significantly increasing the doctoral attainment of faculty members, formation or reformation of two schools and multiple centers and departments, conversion from academic quarters to semesters, replacement of the institution-wide information system, and renovation of general education. He also co-led the institute-wide efforts in enhancing student success, on-time graduation, and overall student retention while sustaining a complex set of international operations.

He began his academic career as an Assistant Professor at the University of Southern Maine (USM). There, he progressed through all of the academic ranks, earned tenure, and assumed multiple leadership positions at the campus level, within all of the satellite campuses, and within the University of Maine System, particularly in academic programming, shared governance, and as a liaison for collective bargaining.

Dr. Walker earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Industrial Technology and a Master of Business Administration at California State University, Fresno. He earned a Master of Engineering in Industrial and Systems Engineering and a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Industrial Education and Technology from Iowa State University. He has completed 14 professional certifications administered by the American Society of Quality and has written 13 major books in the field of quality and reliability engineering.

Additionally, Dr. Walker spent nine years in the U.S. Navy, working throughout the United States, Asia, Africa, and Australia in airborne electronics systems (avionics).

President Walker is married to Dr. Susan H. Newman, an audiologist. They have five adult and school-age children and enjoy outdoor activities such as walking/hiking, bicycling, kayaking, and skiing.



MACE BEARER



Dr. Roger Solberg

Leading the academic procession and representing his faculty colleagues by carrying the Ceremonial Mace at today's Undergraduate Commencement is Dr. Roger Solberg of Edinboro University's English and Philosophy Department.

Dr. Solberg's distinction as Mace Bearer is symbolic of the central role that faculty play in the academic and personal development of Edinboro University students. The University recognized Dr. Solberg's impressive commitment to his students by naming him Faculty Member of the Year in 2017.

Dr. Solberg earned his Bachelor of Arts in English – graduating

Summa Cum Laude - from Upsala College in New Jersey in 1975. In 1977, he completed his Master of Science in Education degree at Indiana University Bloomington. He earned his Master of Arts in English - Nonfiction Writing in 1985 from the University of Iowa. In 1999, Dr. Solberg was awarded his Ph.D. in English – Rhetoric & Linguistics from Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

From 1978-1982, Dr. Solberg worked as a Student Affairs administrator at Wagner College in Staten Island, NY. In 1986, he participated in the nine-month Great Peace March for Global Nuclear Disarmament from Los Angeles to Washington, D.C. He accepted his first teaching position at the University of Texas at San Antonio in 1987. Dr. Solberg arrived at Edinboro University in 1989 as an instructor of English. He became an assistant professor in 1992 and associate professor in 2003.

Since 1998, he has been a faculty advisor to Edinboro University's chapter of Sigma Tau Delta, the International English Honor Society. A three-time champion on the popular game show "Jeopardy," Dr. Solberg has been the coach of EU's intercollegiate academic quiz teams since 2008. He has created six new English courses, including Literature of the Vikings and Advanced Creative Nonfiction.

Dr. Solberg's essays have appeared in the New York Times, Lake Erie Lifestyle, The Iowa Journal of Literary Studies, and the book "Babe Ruth at 100." He has presented his scholarly work at national conferences on the teaching of English and at an international conference on Scandinavian Studies. He is currently writing a collection of essays, "The Brain Yards," about growing up in Staten Island during the 1960s.

Dr. Solberg lives in Edinboro with his wife, Mary. They have three sons: David, a senior at Kent State University; Peter, a sophomore at Indiana University of Pennsylvania; and Jon, a senior at General McLane High School. He is a fan of baseball - especially the New York Mets.

Throughout Dr. Solberg's 28-year career as an educator at Edinboro University, he has served the entire University community with distinction. He exemplifies the dedication and commitment of our faculty to educational excellence and to our students' success.

COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS



Dr. Rachel Levine

Dr. Rachel Levine serves as the Physician General for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Professor of Pediatrics and Psychiatry at the Penn State College of Medicine.

In her role with the Commonwealth, her primary focus is the opioid epidemic, which has reached crisis level in Pennsylvania. She is also responsible for overseeing the Pennsylvania Bureaus of Epidemiology and Laboratory Sciences. She serves as the chairperson for the Pennsylvania Patient Safety Authority, an 11-member board dedicated to identifying problems and recommending solutions for the patient experience in hospitals and medical facilities.

Dr. Levine is the former vice-chairperson for Clinical Affairs for the Department of Pediatrics and the chief of the Division of Adolescent Medicine and Eating Disorders at the Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital -Milton S. Hershey Medical Center.

While at the Penn State Hershey Medical Center, she oversaw the initiation of the Division of Adolescent Medicine for the care of complex teens with medical and psychological problems. She founded the Penn State Hershey Eating Disorders Program which offers multidisciplinary treatment for children, adolescents and adults with eating disorders such as anorexia nervosa and bulimia nervosa.

Dr. Levine has lectured at Penn State College of Medicine and on the national and international levels. Her topics include adolescent medicine, eating disorders and transgender medicine. She is the author of several articles and chapters on the medical management of eating disorders and transgender medicine.

Dr. Levine initiated her professional career upon graduation from Harvard College in 1979 and the Tulane University School of Medicine in 1983. She completed her pediatrics training at Mt. Sinai Medical Center in New York City in 1987 and a Fellowship in Adolescent Medicine at Mt. Sinai, 1987-1988. She served as a faculty member at the Mt. Sinai School of Medicine from 1988-1993.

In 1993, she relocated to Central Pennsylvania where she earned the role as Director of Ambulatory Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine at the Polyclinic Medical Center. She joined the staff at Penn State Hershey Medical Center in 1996 as the Director of Pediatric Ambulatory Services and Adolescent Medicine.

A lifelong advocate of LGBT students, Dr. Levine is the highest-ranking transgender official in Pennsylvania. She served as the liaison for the LGBT community for the Office of Diversity at the Penn State College of Medicine, where she established an LGBT faculty and staff affinity group. She was also the facilitator for the LGBT student group. During her tenure in Hershey, Dr. Levine served on the board of Equality Pennsylvania, a statewide gay rights group.

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the Mace Bearer. A gift of the Alumni Association, the mace was designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel and Dr. Seymour Blinderman, former chairman of the Art Department. It was first used at the inauguration of Edinboro State College by President Chester T. McNerney, in 1967.

The mace, twenty-seven inches in length, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded with circular cabochon rubies, secured by bezels. The collar of the mace is inlaid with ebony, alternated with silver relief fleur-de-lis design elements. Cultured pearls mounted in cups encircle the bottom of the collar. The shaft of the mace is composed of Brazilian rosewood sections, separated by sterling silver rings. The mace is terminated by a cast sterling silver finial; the five cultured pearls represent the existing curricula. The rib-like cone form is terminated by a small silver sphere symbolizing the world.

The metal working processes incorporated in the ceremonial mace include turning, forging, inlaying, stone setting, and lost wax centrifugal casting.

PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The first presidential medallion was presented to former President Foster F. Diebold during the May 1981 Commencement ceremonies. Designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel, the sterling silver medallion consists of a three and one-half inch pectoral pendant featuring on its face the figure of a Gordon Highlander with pipes. To the right of the piper is the Cross of St. Andrew. To the left is the Cross of England. Flanking the figure is the date 1857, the opening year of the University, and garland thistles. In the background are the hills of Scotland, and beneath the piper is an open book, a symbol of knowledge. On the reverse side is the sunken crest of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The pendant descends from a shield containing a triple-towered castle. The collar of the medallion is comprised of a series of two-inch shields, alternately bearing three different designs: the meigle, an interlacing knotwork peculiar to the Pictish school of Celtic art; the Tudor rose design; and "ESC" in interlocking letters on a background of tabby weaving. Connecting each of the collar shields is a Cross of St. George, representing the union of Scotland and England. The entire medallion was fabricated and cast in the cire perdue (lost wax) process.

Surrounding the silver medallion is a gold crafted circle which reads "Edinboro University of Pennsylvania." Professor Katzwinkel added this piece to the medallion especially for the Inauguration of President Frank G. Pogue in 1997, and it is now a permanent fixture to the medallion representing the school's status as a University.

ACADEMIC VESTMENTS

The gown, the cap, and the hood, representing the major components of the academic dress, are a ceremonial inheritance from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries, where dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The academic dress worn by those participating in today's academic processional symbolizes the level of their academic attainment and the institution they attended.

Gown

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The bachelor's and master's gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the bachelor's gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the doctor's degree is made of wool, serge, or silk with an open front faced with wide velvet panels. The sleeves are loose and bell-shaped with three bars of velvet in black or the color of the discipline in which the doctorate was obtained.

Cap

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the baccalaureate and master's degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The tassel for the doctor's mortarboard is of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the president.

Hood

The most outstanding feature of the academic dress is the hood. It is usually worn only for the master's and the doctor's degrees. The doctor's hood is longer than the master's hood and has distinguished panels. The college or the university granting the degree is indicated by the color of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

MACE BEARER



Dr. Mary Jo Melvin

Leading the academic procession and representing her faculty colleagues by carrying the Ceremonial Mace at today's Graduate Commencement is Dr. Mary Jo Melvin, chairperson of the Early Childhood and Reading Department at Edinboro University.

Dr. Melvin's distinction as Mace Bearer is symbolic of the central role that faculty play in the academic and personal development of Edinboro University students.

Dr. Melvin earned a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education and a Minor in Early Childhood Education from Edinboro State College in 1975. In 1990, she earned a Master of Education from Edinboro

University in Elementary Education, Focusing on children's literature, mathematics and preschool education, Dr. Melvin was awarded a Ph.D. in Elementary Education from the University of Akron in 1995.

Dr. Melvin spent the first 15 years of her professional career as a first-grade teacher in the General McLane School District in Edinboro beginning in 1975. In 1990, she joined the Edinboro University faculty in the Department of Elementary Education. From 2009-2013, Dr. Melvin served in the Edinboro University Early Childhood and Special Education Department until she assumed her current role as department chair. She has earned the ranks of department assistant chairperson and chairperson since 2002, when she was the assistant chairperson of the Elementary Education Department. From 2003-2007, she served as the director for the Dr. Robert C. Weber Honors Program. She served as department chairperson of Elementary Education (2007-2008), Early Childhood and Special Education (2008-2013) and Early Childhood and Reading (2013-present).

Edinboro University honored Dr. Melvin with the Educator of the year Award in 2003. Because of Dr. Melvin's commitment to literacy, former Edinboro University President Dr. Frank G. Pogue dedicated the Dr. Mary Jo Melvin Literacy Center in Butterfield Hall to her in 2007. For more than 10 years, Dr. Melvin represented Edinboro University in the Golden Apple Award program, which awards local educators through student nominations. She oversees the selection committee for selecting Teacher of the Year. Dr. Melvin was also presented with an Honorary Golden Apple Award for the 2015-2016 school year.

Dr. Melvin worked with Professor Robin Howell, of the Early Childhood and Reading Department, to secure \$245,000 in funding from Pre-K Counts and \$13,000 in funding from a Race to the Top -Higher Education Mini grant. One of her proudest initiatives is the Edinboro University Reading Camp summer literacy program.

Dr. Melvin lives in Edinboro where she enjoys reading children's literature, walking and spending time with her family, friends and cats.

EDINBORO UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT



Dr. H. Fred Walker

H. Fred Walker became the 18th President of Edinboro University on July 1, 2016, bringing to Edinboro a successful background in leadership and higher education.

Upon his arrival at Edinboro, President Walker immediately initiated a process of assessments and enhancements designed to build on EU's significant strengths as a public, regional, comprehensive university. This process has engaged all University constituents, including students, faculty and staff, as well as regional employers and other members of the broader community. The result is "Our Path Forward."

Edinboro University's Path Forward is a focus on student success -

which includes defining the EU Experience, University finances and refreshing the University's academic program array which will further ensure Edinboro's enduring value to Pennsylvania's students and employers.

Dr. Walker came to Edinboro from the Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT), where he served as Dean of the College of Applied Science and Technology from 2008-2016. His extensive accomplishments at RIT included leading the college in the development and completion of a strategic plan that included bringing all units within the college into fiscal sustainability, growth of college enrollments and academic program offerings, significantly increasing the doctoral attainment of faculty members, formation or reformation of two schools and multiple centers and departments, conversion from academic quarters to semesters, replacement of the institution-wide information system, and renovation of general education. Additionally, President Walker co-led the institute-wide efforts in enhancing student success, on-time graduation, and overall student retention while sustaining a complex set of international operations.

As an Assistant Professor at the University of Southern Maine (USM), Dr. Walker began his academic career. There, he progressed through all of the academic ranks, earned tenure, and assumed multiple leadership positions at the campus level, within all of the satellite campuses, and within the University of Maine System, particularly in academic programming, shared governance, and as a liaison for collective bargaining.

Dr. Walker earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Industrial Technology and a Master of Business Administration at California State University, Fresno. He earned a Master of Engineering in Industrial and Systems Engineering and a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Industrial Education and Technology from Iowa State University.

Dr. Walker is no stranger to scholarship. He has completed 14 professional certifications administered by the American Society of Quality and has written 13 major books in the field of quality and reliability engineering.

Additionally, Dr. Walker spent nine years in the U.S. Navy, working throughout the United States, Asia, Africa, and Australia in airborne electronics systems (avionics).

President Walker is married to Dr. Susan H. Newman, an audiologist. They have five adult and school-age children and enjoy outdoor activities such as walking/hiking, bicycling, kayaking and skiing.

Dr. Ronald Craig

Leading the academic procession and representing his faculty colleagues by carrying the Ceremonial Mace at today's Undergraduate Commencement is Dr. Ronald Craig of Edinboro University's Psychology Department.

Dr. Craig's distinction as Mace Bearer is symbolic of the central role that faculty play in the academic and personal development of Edinboro University students. The University recognized Dr. Craig's impressive commitment to his students by naming him Advisor of the Year in 2014.

Dr. Craig earned his Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Boise State University in 1990. In 1995, he completed his Master of Science in Developmental Psychology at the University of Utah. In 1997, Dr. Craig was awarded his Ph.D. in Developmental Psychology from

the University of Utah, where he focused on forensic developmental psychology.

A lifetime academic and noted advisor, Dr. Craig began teaching at Edinboro University in 1997, immediately following his doctorate degree. He earned tenure in 2002 as an associate professor in EU's Department of Psychology and was promoted to full professor in 2004. Dr. Craig has guided dozens of EU students in their undergraduate research projects that have included presentations and publications. Dr. Craig's University service has included membership on Edinboro's Institutional Review Board, University-wide Promotions Committee and the University Planning for Instructional Technology Committee.

Dr. Craig presented the keynote speech "Integrating Forensic Psychology in the Undergraduate Research Experience" at the Pennsylvania's State System Psychology Conference in 2016. As a member of a University of Utah research group, Dr. Craig was awarded the John E. Reid Memorial Award for Distinguished Achievement in polygraph research, teaching or writing in 2009.

Dr. Craig's research interests are in the areas of forensic and developmental psychology, including forensic interviewing with juveniles, detection of deception, and the role of technology in the courtroom. His research and publications have been featured in Psychology Crime & Law, Polygraph, Applied Developmental Sciences, and the Journal of Credibility Assessment and Witness Psychology. He has presented at regional and national conferences - including the American Psychology and Law Society, of which Dr. Craig is an active member, and the American Psychology Association.

Dr. Craig lives in Millcreek Township, Pa. with his wife, Kelly, who serves as the Marketing and Social Media Director for the Erie Playhouse. They have a son, Ethan, a senior at McDowell High School, who plans to pursue technical theatre and set design in college; and a daughter, Sydney, an eighth-grade student at Westlake Middle School, who participates in LEGO League and jazz band. Dr. Craig is active in his community, volunteering with the Erie Playhouse and Wayside Presbyterian Church, helping start a Girls Who Code Club in the Millcreek Township School District, and serving on the district's Citizens Advisory Committee. He is also an avid fly fisherman.

Throughout Dr. Craig's 20-year career as an educator at Edinboro University, he has served the entire University community with distinction. He exemplifies the dedication and commitment of our faculty to educational excellence and to our students' success.

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The ceremonial mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the Mace Bearer. A gift of the Alumni Association, the mace was designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel and Dr. Seymour Blinderman, former chairman of the Art Department. It was first used at the inauguration of Edinboro State College by President Chester T. McNerney, in 1967.

The mace, twenty-seven inches in length, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded with circular cabochon rubies, secured by bezels. The collar of the mace is inlaid with ebony, alternated with silver relief fleur-de-lis design elements. Cultured pearls mounted in cups encircle the bottom of the collar. The shaft of the mace is composed of Brazilian rosewood sections, separated by sterling silver rings. The mace is terminated by a cast sterling silver finial; the five cultured pearls represent the existing curricula. The rib-like cone form is terminated by a small silver sphere symbolizing the world.

The metal working processes incorporated in the ceremonial mace include turning, forging, inlaying, stone setting, and lost wax centrifugal casting.

PRESIDENTIAL MEDALLION

The first presidential medallion was presented to former President Foster F. Diebold during the May 1981 Commencement ceremonies. Designed and executed by Professor Henry Katzwinkel, the sterling silver medallion consists of a three and one-half inch pectoral pendant featuring on its face the figure of a Gordon Highlander with pipes. To the right of the piper is the Cross of St. Andrew. To the left is the Cross of England. Flanking the figure is the date 1857, the opening year of the University, and garland thistles. In the background are the hills of Scotland, and beneath the piper is an open book, a symbol of knowledge. On the reverse side is the sunken crest of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

The pendant descends from a shield containing a triple-towered castle. The collar of the medallion is comprised of a series of two-inch shields, alternately bearing three different designs: the meigle, an interlacing knotwork peculiar to the Pictish school of Celtic art; the Tudor rose design; and "ESC" in interlocking letters on a background of tabby weaving. Connecting each of the collar shields is a Cross of St. George, representing the union of Scotland and England. The entire medallion was fabricated and cast in the cire perdue (lost wax) process.

Surrounding the silver medallion is a gold crafted circle which reads "Edinboro University of Pennsylvania." Professor Katzwinkel added this piece to the medallion especially for the Inauguration of President Frank G. Pogue in 1997, and it is now a permanent fixture to the medallion representing the school's status as a University.

ACADEMIC VESTMENTS

The gown, the cap, and the hood, representing the major components of the academic dress, are a ceremonial inheritance from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries, where dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The academic dress worn by those participating in today's academic processional symbolizes the level of their academic attainment and the institution they attended.

Gown

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The bachelor's and master's gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the bachelor's gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the doctor's degree is made of wool, serge, or silk with an open front faced with wide velvet panels. The sleeves are loose and bell-shaped with three bars of velvet in black or the color of the discipline in which the doctorate was obtained.

Cap

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the baccalaureate and master's degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The tassel for the doctor's mortarboard is of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the president.

Hood

The most outstanding feature of the academic dress is the hood. It is usually worn only for the master's and the doctor's degrees. The doctor's hood is longer than the master's hood and has distinguished panels. The college or the university granting the degree is indicated by the color of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

MACE BEARER



Dr. Elaine S. Rinfrette

Leading the academic procession and representing her faculty colleagues by carrying the Ceremonial Mace at today's Graduate Commencement is Dr. Elaine S. Rinfrette, chairperson of the Social Work Department at Edinboro University.

Dr. Rinfrette's distinction as Mace Bearer is symbolic of the central role that faculty play in the academic and personal development of Edinboro University students.

Dr. Rinfrette earned a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of Rhode Island Nursing in 1972. She earned a Master of Social Work from Boston University in 1981. In 2001, she entered the

State University of New York at Buffalo, where she earned a Ph.D. in Social Welfare, with a focus on trauma.

Dr. Rinfrette spent the first 11 years of her professional career as an RN working in Pediatric Intensive Care at Rhode Island Hospital in Providence, R.I. After receiving her MSW, Dr. Rinfrette worked in outpatient mental health for 20 years, developing a special interest in trauma and co-occurring disorders. She joined the Edinboro University faculty in 2011. From 2011-2017, she was the head of the MSW program. She began her tenure as chair of the Social Work Department in May 2017.

Dr. Rinfrette received both the APSCUF Professional Development Funds Award and the Edinboro University Senate Research Grant in 2012. She earned the Certificate of Advanced Graduate Study in Conflict Management from Edinboro University in 2014. Dr. Rinfrette has been active at the local, state and national levels in the National Association of Social Workers. She served as secretary at the state level from 2011-2013. She was honored as Social Worker of the Year in Western New York in 2017. She also received a National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Addictions Fellowship in 2017. Currently, she serves as the chair of the National Committee on Nominations and Leadership for the National Association of Social Workers in Washington, D.C.

Dr. Rinfrette has an active research agenda along with colleagues in the Social Work Department. Her current research includes a University-wide trauma study and *A Survey of Social Work Practitioner Ratings on the Importance of Spiritual Components in Practice*. Her research includes a multi-site investigation of vicarious trauma and empathy in MSW students and the impact of spirituality in the recovery process in addictions recovery.

Dr. Rinfrette lives in East Concord, N.Y. with her family and pets. She enjoys reading, movies and traveling.

Dr. Rinfrette's career as a nurse, social worker, professor and scholar define a career that has impacted and continues to impact the lives of thousands of individuals, students and colleagues, the Edinboro University community and the Erie County area with distinction.
