PROGRAM NOTES

MRS. MILDRED D. BRUCE

The College Marshal

Leading the ranks of the academic procession as College Marshal will be Mrs. Mildred D. Bruce of the Art department. For her, carrying the ceremonial mace is an honor that follows many years of serious dedication to Edinboro State College.

Mrs. Bruce came to the town of Edinboro in 1948 and joined the Art department at the College five years later. Her late husband, Ralph, served Edinboro 17 years during a period when both the Bruces were involved with the improvement of the Art program.

A recipient of a Fine Arts degree from Oberlin College and an Art Education degree from Eastern Michigan University, Mrs. Bruce obtained her Master of Education degree from Penn State University.

She put her training to work, teaching studio courses in Design, Crafts, Graphics and Jewelry. Other involvement was with the Drama department, where Mrs. Bruce taught Costume Design and Theatre Arts, designing costumes and sets for Shakespearian productions and musicals.

Prior to her Edinboro career, Mrs. Bruce taught at Eastern Michigan and supervised art student teachers and demonstrated teaching in a laboratory school. She also taught art in Port Huron, Michigan, public schools.

Sharing her skills with the public, she has helped with workshops and demonstrations in Erie and Crawford counties and has conducted private classes in the Warren Art League.

Among her college contributions are service as departmental bibliographer, service on a downstate evaluation team and on the Senate Library Committee. She has also supervised the ordering of art books for a 10-year period.

Currently, Mrs. Bruce is a member of the National Education Association and APSCUF-PAHE.

She resides in Edinboro and considers landscaping and the restoration of her historic home her hobbies.

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The Ceremonial Mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the College Marshal, Mrs. Mildred D. Bruce. The Mace, a gift of the Alumni Association, was designed and executed by Dr. Seymour Blinderman, formerly of the Art faculty, and Mr. Henry Katzwinkel. The Mace was first used at the inauguration of President Chester T. McNerney.

The Mace, twenty-seven inches high, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded by cone-shaped rubies. The neck of the Mace is inlaid with rosewood, alternated with silver fleur-de-lis. Cultured pearls mounted on cups encircle the top of the staff. Discs of silver interspersed with rosewood compose the shaft which ends with tip-casted silver. Sunken cultured pearls encircle a rounded cone with textured silver to end in a small globe.

THE COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

THE HONORABLE JOHN C. PITTENGER

Secretary of Education Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

A laborer to bring flexibility to Higher Education in Pennsylvania is State Secretary of Education, The Honorable John C. Pittenger. Appointed to this important post in 1972, Mr. Pittenger has made many strides to improve the educational institutions of the Commonwealth, thus, he is being honored today by receiving a Certificate of Merit.

Through his efforts, the Department of Education has gained more control over school construction, and rigid teacher education requirements have been liberalized. He has reorganized the Department and tightened command and bureau structure within to improve efficiency in every department. He has also initiated educational programs for bilingual children and work-study programs in schools and colleges.

Because students are the consumers of the system, Secretary Pittenger has created student advisory boards representing high schools and colleges. He has directed schools and colleges to eliminate sex discrimination from curriculum and sports. He has opened to the public meetings of state college directors.

A 42-year-old bachelor, Secretary Pittenger was born in Philadelphia and educated in the public schools of Swarthmore. Following graduation from Phillips Exeter Academy, Harvard College and Harvard Law School, he served in the U. S. Army, then returned to practice law in Lancaster.

He was elected to the House of Representatives in 1964 and 1968. In between terms, he served as Director of Research for the House Minority Caucus.

In 1970, Governor Shapp named Mr. Pittenger as his Special Assistant for Legislation. He doubled as liaison with the Department of Education and as a member of the Commission on School Finance.

Mr. Pittenger has taught government courses at Harvard and Franklin and Marshall College. He co-authored with Henry W. Bragdon a book on the Constitution and civil liberties, "The Pursuit of Justice," published in 1969 by the MacMillan Company.

An advocate of participant sports, Secretary Pittenger plays volleyball, badminton and squash. On weekends he coaches the Franklin and Marshall varsity squash team and raises trees on a farm in southern Chester County.

THE HONORABLE FRANK C. HILTON

Secretary of Property and Supplies Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

Receiving a Certificate of Merit today is The Honorable Frank C. Hilton, Secretary of the Department of Property and Supplies of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Serving the state under the administration of Governor Milton J. Shapp, Mr. Hilton was appointed to his position in 1971.

A graduate of Springfield College, Massachusetts, Mr. Hilton is president of Hilton Brothers Industrial Chemicals, Meadville. His state appointments include membership in the State Art Commission, the General State Authority, the Pennsylvania Transportation Assistance Authority, The Pennsylvania Higher Education Facilities Authority, the Executive Board, the Board of Commissioners of Public Grounds and Buildings and secretary to the State Public School Building Authority.

Mr. Hilton chairs the Joint Committee on Documents and the Pennsylvania Manual Editorial Advisory Board.

Interested in civic and social affairs, Mr. Hilton has chaired the Pennsylvania March of Dimes, is a member of the Board of Trustees of Spencer Hospital, Meadville, and co-chaired the Pennsylvanians for Progress Committee, 1970-71.

He has also served in numerous political capacities, including chairman of the Shapp for Governor Committee, Veterans for Humphrey-Muskie and the Democratic Veterans-Farmers Labor Committee of Pennsylvania. He was vice-chairman of the National Veterans Committee, Democratic National Committee in 1968 and treasurer of the Pennsylvania Democratic State Committee in 1970.

Serving in the U. S. Army during World War II, he was elected State Commander, League of United Veteran Clubs of Pennsylvania, and is a member of the American Legion and Amvets.

He is a 32nd Degree Mason, Richmond Consistory, Richmond, Virginia.

Mr. Hilton has also been the recipient of numerous awards, including the Pennsylvania Gold Citizens Medal, the Disabled American Veterans Distinguished Service Award, the Pennsylvania Meritorious Service Medal and the League of United Veterans Clubs of Pennsylvania Distinguished State and National Service Plaque.

He resides with his wife and two children at their home in Meadville and is a vestryman at Christ Episcopal Church.

PROGRAM NOTES

Academic Vestments

The gown, the cap and the hood, representing the major components of the academic dress, are a ceremonial inheritance from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries, where dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The academic dress worn by those participating in today'a academic processional symbolizes the level of their academic attainment and the institution they attended.

Gown

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The Bachelor and Master gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the Bachelor gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The Master gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the Doctor degree is made of wool, serge, or silk with an open front faced with wide velvet panels. The sleeves are loose and bell-shaped with three bars of velvet in black or the color of the discipline in which the doctorate was obtained.

Hood

The most outstanding feature of the academic dress is the hood. It is usually worn only for the Master's and the Doctor's degrees. The Doctor's hood is longer than the Master's hood and has distinguishing panels. The college or the university granting the degree is indicated by the color or coloring of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

Cap

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the Baccalaureate and Master degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The tassel for the Doctor's mortarboard is of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the President.

This award was established in memory of their son Jack Finegan, a former student at Edinboro State College.

Lois Caldwell North, Class of 1886

A \$100 annual scholarship has been endowed in memory of Mrs. Lois Caldwell North by her daughter, Eleanor North of State College, Pa. The award is made each year to a student who plans to enter the ministry upon completion of his or her education.

Helen Sabin Reed, October 18, 1966

A \$10,000 endowment was given to Edinboro State College in memory of Mrs. Helen Sabin Reed, a member of the Education faculty since 1961. Because Mrs. Reed was a specialist in the reading field, the yearly \$500 scholarship will be awarded to an Elementary Education major. Mrs. Theo Sabin Meyer of Erie; Mrs. Mildred Sabin Young, Los Angeles, California, sisters; and a brother, Robert W. Sabin, Long Beach, California, established the gift.

Vlahakis Award, January 15, 1972

Each year a \$250 scholarship award is made available to a student at Edinboro State College who is majoring or planning to major in chemistry. The award has been established by Mrs. Thekla Vlahakis of Pittsburgh in memory of her late husband, George K. Vlahakis, and two sons, Walter and William.

Delta Kappa Gamma Scholarships

The Alpha Iota Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma professional sorority offers an annual award to an outstanding female education major. Academic achievement, service to the College and financial need are the criteria for selection of the recipient.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Hanna Kent Schoff Memorial PTA Scholarships

The Pennsylvania Congress of Parents and Teachers makes available each year two scholarships to outstanding high school students who will attend Edinboro State College. These yearly scholarships are continuous for four years, upon review of the scholarship committee. Awards are made on the basis of CEEB test results, grades, class rank, personal attributes, co-curricular activities, desire to teach and a personal interview.

The Bruce Manville Morrison Fund

The fund was established by the estate of the late Bruce Manville Morrison to provide financial support for Edinboro State College graduate students. Awards are made on a continuing basis to graduate students who can document financial need. The Morrison Fund also has provisions for the acquisition of rare books for the College Library.

SGA Luther V. Hendricks Memorial International Scholarship

The Edinboro Student Government Association annually funds the L. V. Hendricks Award in order to promote international understanding at the College. Fourteen scholarships are available during the current academic year.

Traineeship in Mental Retardation

Graduate students, seniors and juniors of Edinboro State College are awarded traineeship grants from the Federal Government. The awards are given for outstanding scholarship, campus citizenship and professional promise in the field of teaching the Mentally Retarded.

STUDENT EMERGENCY LOAN FUND

The Student Emergency Loan Fund has been established for undergraduate or graduate students who are in immediate need of a small loan. Contributions have been made to this fund in memory of

Dr. Harry W. Earlley, Dean of Instruction, who was serving as acting President of the College at the time of his death, March 25, 1966.

Corporal Gary Leslie Norman, a former student at Edinboro State College killed in action in Vietnam, December 18, 1967.

Dr. L. W. VanLaningham who served the College as Director of Student Teaching and Placement from 1949 until his death, December 2, 1967.

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The Ceremonial Mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the College Marshal, Professor Curtis L. Ickes. The Mace, a gift of the Alumni Association, was designed and executed by Dr. Seymour Blinderman, formerly of the Art faculty, and Mr. Henry Katzwinkel. The Mase was first used at the inauguration of President Chester T. McNerney.

The Mace, twenty-seven inches high, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded by cone-shaped rubies. The neck of the Mace is inlaid with rosewood, alternated with silver fleur-de-lis. Cultured pearls mounted on cups encircle the top of the staff. Discs of silver interspersed with rosewood compose the shaft which ends with tip-casted silver. Sunken cultured pearls encircle a rounded cone with textured silver to end in a small globe.

PROGRAM NOTES

PROFESSOR CURTIS L. ICKES The College Marshal

Because of his many years of service to the college and assistance to student interests, Professor Curtis L. Ickes of the Mathematics department has been selected as College Marshal to lead the academic procession.

Mr. Ickes joined the staff of the Mathematics department in 1957. He served as acting chairman from 1963 to 1965 and as assistant department chairman from 1966 to 1968.

His service on major college committees and student-oriented organizations has entailed hours of personal dedication. For eight years he worked as treasurer with officers of the then named Student-Faculty Council to make up the yearly Student Activity budget. At the same time Professor Ickes served as adviser for nine years to Sigma Tau Gamma, men's social fraternity.

Cóllege committees consist of the Senate, where he has served for two terms on Membership and Election, and the Sabattical Leave committees. He also has been chairman of the Ad Hoc Committee of the Executive Committee of the Senate. Other groups include the All-Campus Committee for Middle States Academic Consolidation Committee, and five years as a member of the Admissions committee.

For two years Professor Ickes has participated in the Visiting Lecture Program in mathematics to Secondary schools, sponsored jointly by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and the U.S. Department of Education.

Another major committee to which Professor Ickes devoted his time is the group which studies and makes recommendations to the Executive Committee dealing with requirements for the four professional ranks at Edinboro State College. The standards and ratings still remain in use.

Willing to contribute time and potential to the college, Professor Ickes was a member both college and departmentwise of the committee to study the curricula for the General Education and Professional Education programs of Teacher Preparation.

Professional affiliations include membership in the Association of Pennsylvania State Colleges and University Faculties and the Pennsylvania Association for Higher Education; life membership in the National Education Association; the Pennsylvania Council of Teachers of Mathematics and the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics.

Mr. Ickes earned the BS degree from Indiana College (now Indiana University of Pennsylvania), the MEd from Pennsylvania State College, an MS degree from State University at Albany with concentrations in mathematics and mathematics education.

Mr. and Mrs. Ickes are the parents of two sons, both graduates of Edinboro State College and both teachers of mathematics.

MR. EDWARD M. MEAD

Vice President and Assistant Publisher Times Publishing Company

A worker in a craft that serves as a mirror of human performance, catching and reflecting the drama of real ilfe, Mr. Edward M. Mead, vice president and assistant publisher of the Times Publishing Company is our guest speaker today. Also, he is being honored as the recipient of a certificate of merit for his interest in education news.

Mr. Mead began his newspaper career in 1949 at the Trenton Times in Trenton, New Jersey. The following year he joined the Erie Daily Times, where he worked in all departments until he reached his present position.

PROGRAM NOTES

Academic Vestments

The gown, the cap and the hood, representing the major components of the academic dress, are a ceremonial inheritance from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries, where dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The academic dress worn by those participating in today's academic processional symbolizes the level of their academic attainment and the institution they attended.

Gown

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The Bachelor and Master gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the Bachelor gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The Master gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the Doctor degree is made of wool, serge, or silk with an open front faced with wide velvet panels. The sleeves are loose and bell-shaped with three bars of velvet in black or the color of the discipline in which the doctorate was obtained.

Hood

The most outstanding feature of the academic dress is the hood. It is usually worn only for the Master's and the Doctor's degrees. The Doctor's hood is longer than the Master's hood and has distinguishing panels. The College or the University granting the degree is indicated by the color or coloring of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

Cap

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the Baccalaureate and Master degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The tassel for the Doctor's mortarboard is of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the President.

Helen Sabin Reed, October 18, 1966

A \$10,000 endowment was given to Edinboro State College in memory of Mrs. Helen Sabin Reed, a member of the Education faculty since 1961. Because Mrs. Reed was a specialist in the reading field, the yearly \$500 scholarship will be awarded to an Elementary Education major. Mrs. Theo Sabin Meyer of Erie; Mrs. Mildred Sabin Young, Los Angeles, California, sisters; and a brother, Robert W. Sabin, Long Beach, California, established the gift.

Vlahakis Award, January 15, 1972

Each year a \$250 scholarship award is made available to a student at Edinboro State College who is majoring or planning to major in chemistry. The award has been established by Mrs. Thekla Vlahakis of Pittsburgh in memory of her late husband, George K. Vlahakis, and two sons, Walter and William.

The Alpha Iota Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma professional sorority offers an annual award to an outstanding female education major. Academic achievement, service to the College and financial need are the criteria for selection of the recipient.

Hanna Kent Schoff Memorial PTA Scholarships

The Pennsylvania Congress of Parents and Teachers makes available each year two scholarships to outstanding high school students who will attend Edinboro State College. These yearly scholarships are continuous for four years, upon review of the scholarship committee. Awards are made on the basis of CEEB test results, grades, class rank, personal attributes, co-curricular activities, desire to teach and a personal interview.

The Bruce Manville Morrison Fund

The fund was established by the estate of the late Bruce Manville Morrison to provide financial support for Edinboro State College graduate students. Awards are made on a continuing basis to graduate students who can document financial need. The Morrison Fund also has provisions for the acquisition of rare books for the College Library.

SGA Luther V. Hendricks Memorial International Scholarship

The Edinboro Student Government Association annually funds the L. V. Hendricks Award in order to promote international understanding at the College. Fourteen scholarships are available during the current academic year.

Traineeship in Mental Retardation

Graduate students, seniors and juniors of Edinboro State College are awarded traineeship grants from the Federal Government. The awards are given for outstanding scholarship, campus citizenship and professional promise in the field of teaching the Mentally Retarded.

PROGRAM NOTES

THE CEREMONIAL MACE

The Ceremonial Mace, a symbol of presidential authority, is carried at the head of the academic procession by the College Marshal, Dr. Charles H. Glendinning. The Mace, a gift of the Alumni Association, was designed and executed by Dr. Seymour Blinderman, formerly of the Art faculty, and Mr. Henry Katzwinkel. The Mace was first used at the inauguration of President Chester T. McNerney.

The Mace, twenty-seven inches high, is topped by a sterling silver sphere studded by cone-shaped rubies. The neck of the Mace is inlaid with rosewood, alternated with silver fleur-de-lis. Cultured pearls mounted on cups encircle the top of the staff. Discs of silver interspersed with rosewood compose the shaft which ends with tip-casted silver. Sunken cultured pearls encircle a rounded cone with textured silver to end in a small globe.

PROGRAM NOTES

DR. CHARLES H. GLENDINNING The College Marshall

Dr. Charles H. Glendinning of the English department leads the academic procession as College Marshal. For Dr. Glendinning, carrying the ceremonial mace is an honor which follows many years of serious dedication to the students and College.

Coming to Edinboro in 1958, Dr. Glendinning joined the English faculty as an instructor. In this position he taught English I, English literature and American literature. Later he collaborated with Dr. John Marsh in co-authoring two textbooks, A Television Approach to American Literature and A Television Approach to English Literature.

A recipient of a Bachelor of Arts with Distinction in English and a Masters of Arts degree in English from the University of Missouri, Dr. Glendinning was awarded his doctorate in Aesthetic Criticism from Case Western Reserve, Cleveland, Ohio. Through his dissertation, The Third Hero: A Re-evaluation, Dr. Glendinning presented a different set of abstract rules applicable to the tragic hero in drama, noting that the tragic hero has been evaluated by other scholars.

Prior to his Edinboro career, Dr. Glendinning taught for three years at the University of Missouri. In 1968 he was appointed assistant chairman of the Edinboro English department by Dr. Chester T. McNerney, president. At that time he served as an assistant to Dr. John Marsh, acting chairman.

During his 15 years of service to Edinboro State College, Dr. Glendinning has taught more than 36 different courses and served on numerous committees. A few of these committees include the concert lecture series, homecoming and curriculum development. Last May he was also named the director of the Honors Convocation program.

Dr. Glendinning resides with his wife, Alva, at 312 Meadville Street in Edinboro. They are the parents of a son, David. In his spare time, Dr. Glendinning enjoys gardening and reading.

PROGRAM NOTES

Academic Vestments

The gown, the cap and the hood, representing the major components of the academic dress, are a ceremonial inheritance from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries, where dress was the outward sign of privilege and responsibility. The academic dress worn by those participating in today's academic processional symbolizes the level of their academic attainment and the institution they attended.

Gown

Although the gown is more frequently black, certain universities have authorized the use of colored gowns. The Bachelor and Master gowns are fashioned from black serge. The yoke for the Bachelor gown is designed to be worn closed and features long, flowing and pointed sleeves. The Master gown is designed to be worn open or closed. Its sleeves are very long with square ends, and the front part has an arc cut away. The arms protrude through a slit at the elbow. The gown for the Doctor degree is made of wool, serge, or silk with an open front faced with wide velvet panels. The sleeves are loose and bell-shaped with three bars of velvet in black or the color of the discipline in which the doctorate was obtained.

Hood

The most outstanding feature of the academic dress is the hood. It is usually worn only for the Master's and the Doctor's degrees. The Doctor's hood is longer than the Master's hood and has distinguishing panels. The college or the university granting the degree is indicated by the color or coloring of the hood lining. The velvet trim of the hood indicates the field in which the degree was granted.

Cap

The standard cap is the mortarboard, usually the color of the gown. The tassel is black for the Baccalaureate and Master degree and is worn over the left front quarter of the cap. The tassel for the Doctor's mortarboard is of gold thread. Undergraduates wear the tassel on the right side of the cap until the moment the degree is conferred by the President.

Two \$100 annual scholarships have been endowed in memory of Mrs. Lois Caldwell North by her daughter, Eleanor North of State College, Pa. The awards are made each year to students who plan to enter the ministry upon completion of their education.

Helen Sabin Reed, October 18, 1966

A \$10,000 endowment was given to Edinboro State College in memory of Mrs. Helen Sabin Reed, a member of the Education faculty since 1961. Because Mrs. Reed was a specialist in the reading field, the yearly \$500 scholarship will be awarded to an Elementary Education major. Mrs. Theo Sabin Meyer of Erie; Mrs. Mildred Sabin Young, Los Angeles, California, sisters; and a brother, Robert W. Sabin, Long Beach, California, established the gift.

Vlahakis Award, January 15, 1972

Each year a \$250 scholarship award is made available to a student at Edinboro State College who is majoring or planning to major in chemistry. The award has been established by Mrs. Thekla Vlahakis of Pittsburgh in memory of her late husband, George K. Vlahakis, and two sons, Walter and William.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Delta Kappa Gamma Scholarships

The Alpha Iota Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma professional sorority offers an annual award to an outstanding female education major. Academic achievement, service to the College and financial need are the criteria for selection of the recipient.

Hannah Kent Schoff Memorial PTA Scholarships

The Pennsylvania Congress of Parents and Teachers makes available each year a scholarship to an outstanding high school student who will attend Edinboro State College. This yearly scholarship is continuous for four years, upon review of the scholarship committee. The award is made on the basis of CEEB test results, grades, class rank, personal attributes, co-curricular activities, desire to teach and a personal interview.

The Bruce Manville Morrison Fund

The fund was established by the estate of the late Bruce Manville Morrison to provide financial support for Edinboro State College graduate students. Awards are made on a continuing basis to graduate students who can document financial need. The Morrison Fund also has provisions for the acquisition of rare books for the College Library.

Traineeship in Mental Retardation

Graduate students, seniors and juniors of Edinboro State College are awarded traineeship grants from the Federal Government. The awards are given for outstanding scholarship, campus citizenship and professional promise in the field of teaching the Mentally Retarded.

STUDENT EMERGENCY LOAN FUND

The Student Emergency Loan Fund has been established for undergraduate or graduate students who are in immediate need of a small loan. Contributions have been made to this fund in memory of

Dr. Harry W. Earlley, Dean of Instruction, who was serving as acting President of the College at the time of his death, March 25, 1966.

Corporal Gary Leslie Norman, a former student at Edinboro State College killed in action in Vietnam, December 18, 1967.

Dr. L. W. VanLaningham who served the College as Director of Student Teaching and Placement from 1949 until his death, December 2, 1967.

HISTORY

Edinboro State College lies in little Conneautee Valley in Northwestern Pennsylvania amid rolling wooded country 18 miles from Erie, 25 miles from Meadville and 125 miles from Pittsburgh. The rolling farm lands, the stately small town atmosphere and Edinboro Lake all enhance its beauty during the summer resort season and the picturesque winter months.

The town is easily accessible from the north and south by Route 19 and Interstate 79 and from the east and west by National Highway 6.

Edinboro State College is the oldest Pennsylvania teacher training school west of the Allegheny Mountains and the second oldest such school in the State. Edinboro Academy was chartered in 1856 and became a State Normal School by the Act of 1857.

Under the original charter the school was privately administered until 1861, when the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania chartered it as a State Normal School. The school was purchased by the Commonwealth in 1914.

In 1926 the State recognized Edinboro as a four-year college and granted it the right to offer undergraduate degrees in elementary, secondary and art education.

In 1957 the College was authorized to begin its graduate program of teacher education which leads to the Master of Education degree in elementary and secondary education with specialization in the areas of English, Science and Social Studies. In 1964 the program was extended to include a Master of Education degree in Guidance and Counseling.

Edinboro State Teachers College became Edinboro State College in 1960.

A Liberal Arts program leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree with concentration in the Natural Sciences, Social Sciences and the Humanities was approved in 1962.

A considerable number of undergraduate and graduate programs culminating in the bachelor's and master's degrees have been added to the curriculum.
