





PRESIDENT FOSTER F. DIEBOLD



Now in his fifteenth year as president of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, Foster F. Diebold is the fourteenth chief executive officer of the institution of higher learning that has come to acclaim in the last decade as one of Pennsylvania's and the nation's finest. He has brought a vigorous educational and moral leadership, a strengthening of the spirit of community, a clear sense of direction and purpose, and a dimension of multicultural pluralism and diversity.

Much has been accomplished during President Diebold's tenure. The University has returned to financial health. Significant facilities and grounds improvements have been achieved, with several of the historic structures on campus restored to their original splendor. Academic programs have been emphasized and improved, with more than 100 degree offerings now available. Enrollment gains have been unprecedented in both numbers and academic quality. International linkages have been established with institutions in several other countries, and Edinboro University's program for students with disabilities continues to garner acclaim as one of the finest among all colleges and universities in the United States. Widely recognized as a leader in education both here and abroad, President Diebold has positioned Edinboro University to meet the challenges of the 1990s, as well as those that will face public higher education in the 21st century.

The Orange, New Jersey, native is a graduate of Monmouth College and also holds a master of arts in educational administration from Seton Hall University. He has met coursework requirements for a doctorate in education at Rutgers University and is currently completing the dissertation requirement for the Ph.D. program in higher education at the University of Pittsburgh.

Prior to his presidency of Edinboro University, President Diebold was president of the University of Alaska from 1977 to 1979. Before that, he was executive secretary to the Board of Regents and special assistant to the president of the University of Alaska Statewide System. From 1969 to 1976, he was director of Development and Planning at Kean College in New Jersey and a member of the graduate faculty at that institution; and from 1965 to 1969, he was assistant superintendent of the Neptune Township (New Jersey) Public Schools.

Recognized for his extensive experience in the field of education management, President Diebold's scholarly achievements in the discipline of applied ethics in higher education deserve special mention. The model statement he authored for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, "Ethical Practices for College Presidents," was unanimously adopted by that professional organization and published as policy for the chief executives of its nearly 400 member institutions nationwide. It is the first formally adopted ethical practices and policy statement for higher education presidents.


For his leadership on an international scale and for his many contributions to the advancement of higher education and enrichment of an emerging culture in Pakistan, President Diebold was decorated with prestigious gold medals from three Pakistani universities. The awards for educational eminence were presented during visits to the Edinboro campus by official Pakistani delegations.

President Diebold was also honored by the Government of Pakistan with the awarding of the degree of Doctor of Laws (honoris causa), presented at the Government House in the City of Karachi. The ceremony was attended by the presidents of the several Pakistani universities holding linkage agreements with Edinboro University, as well as many high-ranking officials of the Government of Pakistan and U.S. diplomatic officials.


A staunch advocate of a statewide system of public universities in Pennsylvania, President Diebold supported the enabling legislation for the State System of Higher Education (Act 188 of 1982) and saw the State System come to existence in 1983 as a member of the transition team. He currently serves on the System's Executive Council of Presidents and on the boards of the Pennsylvania Academy for the Profession of Teaching, the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, and the Dixon University Center at Harrisburg.

President Diebold's stature in American higher education was recognized recently by several high-level appointments. He was named to the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations, the leading national organization devoted to building constructive relationships between the two countries. He was also appointed to the Leadership Council of the Northeast-Midwest Institute, a regional component of the Center for Regional Policy, and to the Pennsylvania Humanities Council, the private, non-profit group promoting statewide public understanding of the humanities.

MEET THE SCOTS



HEAD COACH GREG WALCAVICH



On April 10, 1989, Gregory L. Walcavich became Edinboro University's tenth men's head basketball coach.

Walcavich, 42 years old, came from West Virginia Wesleyan College in Buchannon, West Virginia. A graduate of Bladensburg High School in Maryland, he received a journalism degree from Rutgers University in 1973.

In his first season as the Scots head coach, Walcavich guided them to one of the best seasons in school history. On three occasions the Fighting Scots were ranked in the nation's top 20, posting an impressive 22-5 record. Despite playing in the rugged PSAC, the Boro was overlooked for the NCAA II tournament.

Walcavich began his coaching career as an assistant at Birmingham Southern in Alabama, where he stayed for four seasons. In 1977, he obtained his first head coaching position at Alexander City (Alabama) Junior College. After one year, Walcavich returned to Birmingham Southern as the school's head coach.

During his five years at BSC, an NAIA affiliate, Walcavich posted an impressive 114-44 record. His teams were ranked in the top 20 four times in five seasons, as high as number two in 1979 and twice appeared in the NAIA national tournament in Kansas City, Missouri.

For his efforts at Birmingham Southern, Walcavich was named District "Coach of the Year" three times. His success was recognized nationally in 1981 as he was selected as an assistant

coach for the United States Olympic Festival in Syracuse, New York.

In 1983, he moved on to the Division I ranks, as an assistant coach at Rice University. There, he was a part of some of the biggest wins in Rice basketball history including victories over Arkansas, Notre Dame, and Houston. After staying at Rice for four years, Walcavich joined the Bobcats of West Virginia Wesleyan in 1987.

Taking over a squad which returned only four players and a schedule that showed just 11 games, he quickly turned the program around and posted an 18-10 slate in his first year. During his initial season, Walcavich led his Bobcats to championships in the Lock Haven tournament and also in the annual Walker Brothers' tourney here in Edinboro. Wesleyan downed the Fighting Scots 103-90 in the championship game. His squad then edged the Plaid 90-84 in a non-conference tilt later in the year.

In his last season at West Virginia Wesleyan, Walcavich led the Bobcats to 22 wins against just nine losses with a squad of all underclassmen.

Overall, his ten-year head coaching mark is 246-112 (a winning percentage of .687).

Married for 20 years to wife Maureen, Walcavich has two daughters, Sarah, 14, and Jennifer, 11.

ASSISTANT COACH STERLING WASHINGTON

Sterling Washington, a volunteer assistant under Coach Greg Walcavich in 1991-92, begins his third season as Edinboro's assistant basketball coach.


Washington, who played for the Scots from 1988-91, was an All-PSAC first team choice following his senior season. He was also tabbed to the All-East Region second team by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

Edinboro's 16th best all-time rebounder with 526, Washington also netted 931 points to rank in the top 20 among Fighting Scot players. He played just two and one-half seasons at Edinboro after spending three years in the United States Army. Also a great defensive player, Washington totaled 161 career steals including 75 his senior year, the second most for a single season in Fighting Scot history.

Washington graduated from Edinboro University in May 1992 with a bachelor of arts in criminal justice and a minor in geography.

"We are thrilled that Sterling has chosen to come to our program," Walcavich said. "He brings a great deal to our team, our program and our University. His dedication and intensity as a player will serve him well as a coach. Sterling's vast experience in the military certainly will be a positive trait in his coaching career."

Washington resides in Edinboro.



THE PENNSYLVANIA CONFERENCE

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (Pennsylvania Conference) is the largest NCAA II conference in the nation and is composed of the 14 universities in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education.


Championship competition is sponsored for 20 men's and women's sports in the Pennsylvania Conference with all 14 universities belonging to Division II of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) while some elect to compete in Division I sports. PSAC teams have won numerous honors in national competition over the years and have helped the PSAC become one of the most highly respected Division II conferences in the nation.

The Pennsylvania Conference is under the leadership of a board of directors, which consists of the 14 university presidents who govern through an executive committee. Current chairman of the board is Mansfield University President, Mr. Rodney C. Kelchner.

Dr. James H. McCormick is the chancellor of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education (SSHE).

A list of member universities with their basketball affiliation includes: Eastern Division - Bloomsburg, Cheyney, East Stroudsburg, Kutztown, Mansfield, Millersville, and West Chester; Western Division - California, Clarion, Edinboro, Indiana, Lock Haven, Shippensburg, and Slippery Rock.

In basketball the top two teams in each division compete in a preliminary playoff with the winners proceeding to the Pennsylvania Conference championship game at a determined site. The eventual champion is awarded an automatic berth in the NCAA II East Regional Tournament.



1993-94 YEAR IN REVIEW

There may have been better overall records in past years, but the 1993-94 edition of the Fighting Scots basketball team accomplished something no other team in school history had ever done – win a game in the NCAA II national playoffs.

Finishing the year 20-8, coach Greg Walcavich's third 20-win season in five years, the Scots advanced to the NCAA East Regional semifinals with a convincing 88-67 "play-in" victory over West Chester University. The Scots then fell to East Regional champion IUP in a semifinal matchup. But the setback did not tarnish an otherwise banner season for the Scots.

The Scots won 12 of their first 14 games including a victory over Gannon University, 69-58, in the championship of Edinboro's Daniel Overheim Memorial Tournament and finished as the #14-ranked squad in the final NCAA II poll, Edinboro's highest ever. Playing in arguably the toughest conference in the country, the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, the Scots 8-4 western division slate was only good enough for third place.

Plenty of top individual performances highlighted the season as forward Price Williams and guard Tyrone Mason were named to the All-PSAC West all-star squad. Williams was also tabbed first-team East Region by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and honorable mention All-American by Don Hansen's Basketball Gazette magazine. Williams, a

product of F.W. Ballou High School in Washington, D.C., tallied 557 points (19.9 pg) this season, tying him for the fourth highest single-season total in school history. He led the Scots in 15 statistical categories, including scoring, rebounding (8.9), three-point field goals (59), blocked shots (24) and steals (73).

Mason, a sophomore from Philadelphia, was named to the second-team conference squad for his brilliant play at the point guard spot. He was second to Williams in scoring (16.5), three-point field goals (49) and steals (52) and led the team with 156 assists. His point total of 463 was the 14th most for a single-season in Edinboro school history.

In addition to Williams, other seniors making strong contributions were guards Ron Santiago (5.8 ppg, 80 assists) and Walter Reap (9.0 ppg, 81% FT), center Lasana Crider (8.2 ppg, 5.9 rpg) and forwards Charles Zollicoffer (4.2 ppg, 24 assists) and Alex Boyden (3.1, 10 3's).

Williams led the Scots in scoring and rebounding in 13 different games a year ago with a season high 33 points in a 98-82 road win over Clarion. He grabbed ten or more rebounds in ten games a year ago. Mason drilled IUP for 31 points in an overtime loss in January and led the Scots with a 26-point effort in the playoff win against West Chester.

AND Now . . . 1994-95

Coming off one of the most successful seasons in school history, the Edinboro men's basketball team looks to return to the NCAA II tournament in 1994-95, but the first priority, as always, is the rugged Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference.

"As I have said in the past, our priority is the PSAC Championship, something that has eluded us. When you play in a conference as balanced as ours, your attention has to remain focused on the teams in our own backyard," said Coach Greg Walcavich, beginning his sixth year (92-49) as director of the Scot program. "Getting to the NCAA's was nice a year ago and we certainly want to return, but we have to be realistic in our approach to the season. We were only good enough last year to finish third in our division and I am sure that this year won't be any easier."

Faced with the loss of one of the school's best all-around players ever in Price Williams, the Boro will look to the increased contributions from its four returning players to lead the charge in 1994-95. Spearheading that effort will be point guard Tyrone Mason, a PSAC West second team choice a year ago. Second to Williams in nearly every statistical category, Mason netted 16.5 points per game last season and led the squad with 156 assists. His 463 points were the 14th most for a single season in Boro history. Among his many top performances was a career high 31 points in a tough overtime loss at nationally ranked IUP

Also returning with plenty of big game experience will be forwards Phillip Melton and Chris Paris and center Johan Clay.

Melton, a two-year starter, netted 7.3 points and 4.7 rebounds a year ago, and led the Scots in field goal percentage (57%, 75-132). Showing great consistency over his brief career, Melton scored 187 points as a freshman and 183 a year ago.

Paris, originally a walk-on two years ago from nearby Seneca High School, has matured into a fine player for the Scots. Connecting on 42% of his three-point goals last season, he averaged 5.6 points per game while committing just 21 turnovers in over 350 minutes played.

Clay, rotating as a starter last season with Lasana Crider, will solidify the interior for the Plaid this year. Playing in all 28 games a year ago, he averaged six points and over four rebounds per outing connecting on 54% of his shots from the field. Clay's 22 blocked shots tied for second on the squad.

Included among the new faces to the Scots' 1994-95 squad will be guard Michael Blunt, center Jason Crotty, forward Brian Ellis, forward Michael McCleskey and guard Jesse Ogden.

Blunt, who comes to the Boro from basketball rich Simon Gratz High School, averaged 12 points, five rebounds, four assists and two steals last season and will give the Scots a threat from the perimeter.

Crotty, who recently completed his final year of high school in Canada, also performed nearby scholastically for North East High School. He led North East to a 20-7 mark, netting 20 points and 13 rebounds per outing.

Ellis, also from the Erie area, transferred to Edinboro from Division I Canisius and should have an immediate impact. He played in 26 games for the Grifs in 1992-93 after a stellar career at Academy High School. His senior year, he led the Lions to a 26-4 record.

McCleskey, at 6-4 can play the guard or forward spot, is an Ohio product who last played at Cuyahoga Community College in the Cleveland area. A double digit scorer for his juco squad the past two seasons, he is a solid all-around athlete with great ability and knowledge of the game.

Ogden, a sharpshooter from Ontario, will give the Scots a strong threat from the three-point circle. He netted over 20 points per game last season, connecting on an incredible 156 three-point goals.




JOHAN CLAY

- played in all 28 games, predominantly as the Scots starting five-man, averaging just under 20 minutes per game
- soft touch on the interior with great rebounding skills
- netted six points and 4.4 rebounds per game a year ago, connecting on 54%, 74 of 136, of his field goal tries
- 124 rebounds were third on the team
- tied for second on the squad with 22 blocked shots
- career highs of 18 points and 15 rebounds in win over Columbia Union
- single-game rebound mark of 15 ranked in the top five among players in the PSAC last season
- led Scots in rebounding in three games a year ago


TYRONE MASON

- outstanding playmaker, named to the second team PSAC west all-star squad a year ago
- led the squad with 156 assists while second in scoring (16.5), points (463), three-point goals (49), free throw made (72), and free throw percentage (76%), minutes (832) and steals (52)
- his single-season point total tied him for 14th most in Edinboro history
- tallied team game highs of six steals (vs. Malone) and 11 assists (twice) last season
- nailed a career high 31 points in tough 94-93 overtime setback at IUP
- led the Scots in scoring seven times last year, including 26 tallied in the NCAA II play-down win over West Chester
- averaged over 21 points per game in three contests against rival Gannon
- junior college All-American at Camden Junior College before coming to Edinboro
- tallied over 1,000 career points in high school for coach George Tomosky as Bartram's second all-time leading scorer




CHRIS PARIS

- all-time leading scorer in Seneca history with 1,173 career points
