

Now the senior guard has his sights set on the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference and NCAA Division II standards. Kaufman enters his final season with 687 career assists. In all likelihood, the NCAA Division II record of 1,044 set by Assumption's Demetri Beekman is out of reach. But Kaufman can still finish in the top five nationally, and he

Kaufman holds three of the top season assist seasons at Edinboro, including a school-record 273 as a freshman. That figure tied the PSAC record previously held by Darnell White of California(Pa.).



Fighting Scots Hope Physical Play Equates To **Playoff Berth**

Three years ago the Edinboro University men's basketball team snuck up on the PSAC and ended up capturing the PSAC title and a berth in the NCAA Division II East Regional. That squad finished with a 26-8 record, the best in school history, as head coach Greg **Walcavich incorporated a group of newcomers into a** championship outfit.

The Fighting Scots have not approached that success over the last two years, but reached the PSAC Tournament two years ago and were well on their way last year when starting center Jason Roseto went down with a broken bone in his hand. Roseto was leading the country in blocked shots at the time, with Edinboro sporting a 10-6 record entering the IUP game. The Fighting Scots would go on to lose six of their final nine games without Roseto's presence in the middle to finish with a 13-13 ledger.

Roseto returns for his sophomore season, but more importantly, Adam Kaufman and Kenny Tate headline a group of four

returning starters and ten letterwinners. While Walcavich doesn't mind incorporating talented newcomers into his program, it's comforting to know that two of the best players in the PSAC call McComb Fieldhouse home.

"I'm glad we have the people back that we have back, but I also enjoy having a good number of new people," admitted the veteran coach. "I do think we have an opportunity to be closer to what we can be earlier. When you have five or six people to incorporate it takes longer. We have a chance to get better for a longer period of time.'

Walcavich enters his 12th season at the helm of the Fighting Scots confident that his team can compete for the PSAC crown. But with powerful Indiana(Pa.) and California(Pa.) the obvious choices in the West, plus another 20-win program in Clarion, and a Slippery Rock program on the rebound, capturing one of the four divisional playoff berths won't be easy.

"I think we will be a team that seriously challenges for our league championship," Walcavich boasted. "In the same breath, I don't think we're the lone ranger. I'm sure there are three or four teams that feel that

"We have two guys that are back that have performed at this level exceptionally well," related Walcavich, referring to Kaufman and Tate. "I don't think anybody has that. They have set the bar pretty high. Adam and Kenny are the cornerstones of who we are and what we want to

Walcavich notes that the two Edinboro captains are not the only talented players on the roster, but while the 2000-01 Fighting Scots possess a nice blend of height, perimeter shooting and guickness, there's another key factor involved.

"We have a much better sense of who we are than a year ago," Walcavich pointed out. "That's a positive for us. Our greatest asset is our ability to play and live together. We have a real good group of guys.

Walcavich tempers his enthusiasm over the upcoming season with the usual concern over depth. A year ago he was strapped with a youthful bench that provided little production.

"The last two seasons we have not been able to substitute without it being detrimental," admitted Walcavich. "Until we can demonstrate we can do that, it will be a concern. I think we will be able to, but we have to see it to believe it. We haven't been able to freely substitute one person for another. We have everybody back who was at all positive in a supporting role. They have worked hard, and I believe they'll all be better.

"The greatest single weakness we had last year was a lack of experience at basketball at this level," he continued. "How good you have to be on a daily basis was an eye-opener to our guys. Now they know. Are they prepared? Only time will tell. But we hope so."

Walcavich will find out the answer to that question and others on November 18, when the Fighting Scots host Lake Erie in the 2000-01 season opener. That is the first of six straight contests at home to open the campaign, and 15 total home games at McComb Fieldhouse.

"I'm glad we have some home games initially," stated Walcavich. "We had so few last year, it inhibited our growth curve. You have to be able to win on the road. but it hurt us early. You miss practice

GUARD

The college game is built around point guard play, and in Adam Kaufman the Fighting Scots possess one of the best in the country. The 5'11" senior earned a spot on the PSAC West first team for the second straight year, and was a Division II Bulletin honorable mention All-American after averaging 11.8 ppg. and 4.1 rpg.

But Kaufman's game is all about defense and playmaking. He led the PSAC in assists for the third consecutive campaign, handing out 211, and was fifth in steals with 54. Kaufman finished fourth in Division II in assists, his third straight year in the top five, and with 687 career assists, he now ranks second in the PSAC and 14th in Division II in career assists. An improving shooter, Kaufman was Edinboro's top outside marksman a year ago with 59 three-pointers in 161 attempts.

"Adam is very good," understates

Walcavich. "He's continued to improve. He's literally gotten better every single year. I'm really excited for him to go into his last year. This kid has started every game since he's been here. To be able to bring it the way he brings it every day is

Kaufman has rarely left the floor during his Edinboro career. A year ago, he averaged 38.9 minutes per game. That could change this season, as he may finally have a backup capable of spelling him for more than a minute or two.

Freshman walk-on Rvan McElhinny brings an impressive resume with him from Kennedy Christian High School, where he helped the Golden Eagles win three PIAA Class A state championships. The 5'9" southpaw earned fifth team All-State honors as a senior. Another walk-on, 5'9" Tommy Gallagher, adds further depth.

"Ryan and Tommy will both give us the best backup situation since Adam's freshman year," Walcavich commented. "Both of these guys will come along and give us the opportunity to rest Adam. I'm hopeful his minutes will be down. When you're his size, it's a long, long year. In late January and early February, it's hard."

Transfer Blake Johnson is expected to join Kaufman at guard. The 6'1" junior replaces second-leading scorer Jean Paul, the lone loss of consequence from last year's squad. Johnson earned Division II first team All-American honors in 1997-98 while playing at Jamestown Community College. He signed to play at Kent after that, but never played for the Flashes.

Johnson is a proven scorer, averaging 27.0 ppg. as a sophomore. Walcavich describes him as a complete player, with the ability to make things happen on both ends of the court. Walcavich heaped high praise on him, noting that "he'll be the best shooter we've had since Jesse Ogden".

David Gartrell will serve as Johnson's caddy. The 6'2" sophomore was the best reserve Edinboro had a year ago, coming off the bench to average 6.2 ppg. Walcavich was impressed with Gartrell's summer workouts, and looks for him to become a larger contributor. He is another outside marksman, with 35 of his 46 field goals from beyond the three-point arc.

Junior Kevin O'Connor, a walk-on a year ago, provides further guard depth. The 6'2" O'Connor played in six contests.

FORWARD

A year ago, Kenny Tate and Keith Allen joined the Edinboro program as junior college transfers. Allen came with the bigger JUCO reputation, but it was Tate who made his mark felt in the PSAC. Though just 6'4", Tate used strength, leaping ability and an unequalled work ethic to dominate inside. The junior led the PSAC off the glass, pulling down 10.3 rebounds, and was the league's second-leading scorer at 20.5 ppg. He scored in double figures in all 26 contests, ranking 16th nationally in rebounding and 25th in scoring. Tate dis-

played an uncanny ability to find the foul line, converting 108 of 161 freebies.

As expected, the honors poured in for the former New Mexico Junior College performer. He was accorded first team All-PSAC West and NABC All-East honors, and would land a spot on the second team of Basketball Times' All-American squad. He enters the upcoming campaign as a member of Street & Smith's preseason first unit, Edinboro's first-ever preseason first team All-American.

"He's a better player than he was a year ago," warned Walcavich, "and he improved during the season last year. He was better in February than December. He has a better idea of what he can do for us, and the people we play against. He made superior progress throughout the season. He has more skill and is in better condition than last year. Kenny knows more about himself and his teammates."

The same could probably be said for Allen. A first team junior college All-American at the Community College of Beaver County in 1998-99, Allen rededicated himself over the summer, and it is a trimmer and hungrier player that will take the court this year. The 6'4", 212 lb. senior is a powerful performer who plays the physical style of ball Walcavich relishes.

Allen was one of four Fighting Scots to start all 26 games a year ago, finishing as the fourth-leading scorer (10.3 ppg.) and third-leading rebounder (6.1 rpg.).

Three players will battle for the right to back up Allen. Each has displayed the ability to contribute, but not the consistency to earn significant minutes. James Dickerson is the most experienced and explosive of the trio, but the 6'4" junior may also be the biggest enigma. An excellent athlete, Dickerson averaged 3.6 points and 3.0 rebounds a year ago.

Derek Armstrong spent most of his freshman year acclimating himself to American basketball, but the talent was evident in the 6'3" Canadian. The least experienced of the trio, the talent is there for Armstrong to be a significant contributor, including three-point shooting and outstanding leaping ability. He averaged 2.5 ppg. in 20 contests.

Former walk-on Ryan Leahy completes the triumvirate. A 6'3" junior, Leahy saw little action until the latter stages of the campaign. In eight games, he averaged 3.2 ppg. But he brings the competitiveness and aggressive qualities that Walcavich is looking for. "I'm real anxious for our team to be physical," Walcavich stated.

Rob Schodt, one of only two seniors on the team, will serve as Tate's backup. Though 6'8", Schodt's most redeeming quality is a smooth jump shot. He has previously spent his time at center, but now moves to forward. As a sophomore, he averaged 7.4 points while starting 13 contests, but his playing time dwindled last season until a season-ending 20-point outing at Lock Haven. Schodt averaged 3.6 points and 2.0 rebounds.

Further adding depth to the frontline is

Andy Stritzinger. A 6'7", 215 lb. sophomore, Stritzinger previously played at Penn State Behrend. Hopefully a banger inside, he now joins former high school teammate Jason Roseto up front.

CENTER


Jason Roseto improved immensely a year ago. It may be unreasonable to expect similar improvement this year, but after missing the final nine games with a broken bone in his hand, Walcavich looks for the 6'10", 265 lb. sophomore to provide rebounding and shot-blocking.

"Jason made incredible strides through 17 games," stressed Walcavich. "Last September, he was not a real good player. He did some things that enabled our team to be a real good team. It would be my hope that Jason would perform at the level he performed at last January.'

While Roseto showed improved scoring skills as the year progressed, he was not asked to score much. But while averaging 4.8 ppg., he was second on the team in rebounding at 6.5 per game, and blocked 71 shots. That is the third-highest season total at Edinboro. When he went down, he led Division II in blocked shots. That included a school and PSAC record-tying 11 against Mansfield.

Now along comes another tall, raw player to spell Roseto. Sam Woods was probably better known for his volleyball than his hoops skills at Montour High School. But the 6'10", 211 lb. freshman has the athletic ability to be a solid contributor. Walcavich is quick to point out that he is clearly ahead of Roseto at the same time last year.

"Does he have a long way to go? Yes. I don't know what we can anticipate statistically. But I have worked a long time with big guys. Sometimes it happens overnight, with some it takes longer. But he'll be a real asset to our team," predicted Walcavich.

Greg Walcavich ranks as one of the deans of the coaching world in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, standing third in longevity behind Bloomsburg's Charlie Chronister and Rodger Goodling of Shippensburg. Walcavich enters his 12th season as the head coach at Edinboro University, and his 19th overall.

Walcavich's tenure at Edinboro has been earmarked by winning basketball teams. He surpassed Jim McDonald to set the school record for career wins during the 1998-99 campaign, and with 196 career victories at the Boro, he now has his sights set on 200.

Walcavich has posted a record of 196-115 at Edinboro. Add in five seasons at Birmingham Southern and two more at West Virginia Wesleyan, and he owns a career mark of 350-178. Walcavich ranks among the leading active NCAA Division II coaches in both career wins and winning percentage. He is 38th in winning percentage with a figure of .663 and 26th in career victories. Those figures are bettered only by Chronister among PSAC mentors.

But Walcavich isn't just about winning. He places a sincere emphasis on success off the court - in the classroom and the community. He expects his student-athletes to perform with the same

winning attitude in the classroom as they do on the basketball court. In fact, his office is not adorned with pictures of past greats. It does, however, feature a photograph of every student-athlete to graduate from Edinboro.

Walcavich received his Bachelor's Degree in Journalism from Rutgers University in 1973, then completed work on his Master's Degree in Physical Education from the University of Alabama-Birmingham two years later.

During his eleven seasons at Edinboro, the Fighting Scots have won 20-or-more games five times. That includes the 1997-98 Fighting Scot edition which posted a 26-8 record, the most wins in school history. Edinboro went on to capture the PSAC Championship for the first time in thirty years, advancing to the NCAA East Regional. There the Scots handed California(Pa.) a narrow 79-78 defeat before suffering a 91-83 setback to Salem-Teikyo in the semifinals. Walcavich was recognized as the PSAC West Coach of the Year for the third time.

In all, Edinboro has made the NCAA Division II Playoffs three times under Walcavich, while qualifying for the PSAC

Tournament seven times. His 1993-94 squad finished with a 20-8 ledger, defeating West Chester in a NCAA play-in game before losing to Indiana(Pa.) in the regional semifinals. The Boro made it back to the tournament in '95-96, defeating Bloomsburg, 90-82, in the first round. The Scots squandered an 11-point lead to California(Pa.) in the semifinals, losing 84-76. That concluded the season with a 21-8 mark, with Walcavich capturing PSAC West Coach of the Year accolades for the second time.

Walcavich took over the Fighting Scot program in 1989-90, guiding the Boro to one of its best seasons ever. Edinboro won its first twelve games, the best start in nearly fifteen years, and was ranked in the Division II top twenty. The Scots eventually finished 22-5, the most wins since 1981-82. On three occasions the Fighting Scots were ranked in the nation's top twenty. The following season the Scots made their second straight appearance in the PSAC Playoffs under Walcavich, finishing with a 18-10 ledger.

The Scots made it three straight seasons in PSAC postseason action the next year, and the second twenty-win season in three years, with a 20-9 finish. Walcavich picked up his first PSAC tournament win, an 81-78 triumph over East Stroudsburg, before falling to California(Pa.) in the next round.

The 1992-93 campaign brought a very unfamiliar result for Walcavich - a losing season. The Scots finished at 12-17, losing eight games by five points or less. The Boro more than made up for it the next year with the trip to the NCAA Playoffs. The '93-94 season also saw the Scots finish 14th in the Division II final rankings, their top finish ever. The 1994-95 edition added another milestone to Walcavich's resume, as the Scots handed number one ranked Indiana(Pa.) a 94-77 loss. The season ended at 15-11.

Walcavich's fourth 20-win campaign at Edinboro in '95-96 was followed by his second losing season, a 13-14 finish. Despite the losing record, the Boro made it to the PSAC Playoffs for the fifth time in his first eight years. That mark improved to seven out of ten the next two seasons, thanks to the 26-8 finish in '97-98 and the 16-12 ledger in '98-99. After replacing four starters from the '97-98 squad, Walcavich directed the Scots to three wins over nationally-ranked opponents. The Boro upended IUP twice, including a 63-61 win in Indiana in the first round of the PSAC Tournament, and St. Rose, an Elite Eight team for the second straight season, a 50-

A year ago, the Scots appeared well on their way to a third straight PSAC postseason appearance when starting center Jason Roseto, the leading shot blocker in Division II, went down with a broken hand. Prior to injuring the hand, Edinboro was 10-6. The Scots would lose six of its final nine contests without Roseto to finish at 13-13.

Walcavich took over as head coach at Edinboro after a successful two-year stint at West Virginia Wesleyan, where he posted a 40-19 mark. In his first season, he inherited a team which returned just four players, but quickly turned the Bobcats into a winner, finishing at 18-10. His second season concluded with a 22-9 ledger, including a pair of wins over Edinboro, while playing all underclassmen.

Walcavich began his coaching career at Birmingham Southern College in 1973, staying for four seasons before obtaining his first head coaching job at Alexander City (AL) Junior College in 1977. After one year, Walcavich returned to Birmingham Southern


as the school's head coach. During his five seasons as the head coach, the NAIA affiliate posted an impressive 114-44 record, with Walcavich named the Coach of the Year three times. His teams were ranked in the NAIA Top 20 four of the five seasons, as high as number two in 1979, and twice appeared in the NAIA National Tournament in Kansas City, Missouri.

While at Birmingham Southern, Walcavich

was recognized nationally in 1981, being selected to serve as an assistant coach for the United States Olympic Festival in Syracuse, New York. He coached future NBA stars, including Michael Jordan.

In 1983, Walcavich moved on to the Division I ranks as an assistant coach at Rice University. He was involved in some of the biggest wins in the Owls' basketball history at Rice, including triumphs over Arkansas, Houston and Notre Dame. After four years as a member of the Rice staff, Walcavich left for the head coaching job at West Virginia Weslevan.

Walcavich and his wife, Dr. Maureen Walcavich, a professor in the Education Department at Edinboro, have been married for 26 years. They have two daughters, Sarah (20), a student at Penn State, and Jennifer (17).

A year ago, Patrick Cleary was hired as an interim assistant coach following the sudden death of assistant coach Bryant Houston. Pivotal Injury Leaves Fighting Scots Out of PSAC Playoff Picture

The Edinboro University men's basketball team was cruising along with a a 10-6 record and appeared well on its way to a third straight Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference playoff berth when the Fighting Scots traveled to Indiana(Pa.) on January 26.

Just when the Scots appeared ready to peak entering the final month of play, fate dealt head coach Greg Walcavich's team a cruel blow. Center Jason Roseto, the top shot blocker in Division II, suffered a broken bone in his hand and would be lost for the rest of the season. Without the big freshman, who until that point had battled the big, bad boys of the PSAC on an even basis, the Scots went on to lose to IUP, and finished with six losses in their final eight contests.

It should be noted that even had Roseto been available for the final nine games, Edinboro may have failed to reach the PSAC Tournament. California(Pa.) and Indiana(Pa.) maintained their usual spots high atop the PSAC West, with Clarion posting a twenty-win season. A muchimproved Slippery Rock came on strong down the stretch to edge the Fighting Scots for the final playoff spot.

While the team's main goal of reaching postseason play went unachieved, 1999-2000 was an exciting season filled with plenty of outstanding accomplishments. Edinboro opened the season in the Wendy's Classic, hosted by Ohio Univ.-Eastern. Junior college transfer Kenny Tate served immediate notice that he would be a force with a 32-point, 12-rebound effort in a 99-85 win over West Liberty in the opening round.

Edinboro disposed of Wheeling Jesuit by a 77-57 count in the championship tilt, with Tate earning MVP honors.

Game number three turned into a classic, despite poor shooting on both team's parts. Local rival Mercyhurst finally prevailed in a contest which went into two overtimes by a 90-86 count. Area basketball fans had their first opportunity to see Tate, and they had to come away impressed with his skill and untiring work ethic. The 6'4" forward dropped in 27 points and grabbed 16 boards.

The Mercyhurst affair also afforded fans a chance to view Roseto's transformation into a college player. A former standout at nearby Harbor Creek High School, he blocked 5 shots while going toe-to-toe with Laker pivotman Brent Swain.

Wins over Allegheny and Point Park boosted Edinboro's record to 4-1 before the Scots fell to another local entrant, Gannon, by a 96-79 score. The next game was a rematch with Mercyhurst at McComb Fieldhouse, with Edinboro evening the score with a 60-57 victory, improving to 5-2 entering the Christmas break.

The Fighting Scots turned in a disappointing performance in the Capital Key Classic prior to New Years. Edinboro dropped all three of its contests to see its record go to 5-5.

The millenium dawned with a hot streak, as the Scots won five of six games heading into late January, leading into that fateful night at Indiana.

The lone loss during the stretch was a 79-76 battle with the Vulcans of California(Pa.). Prior to that, Edinboro scored a season-high 104 points in a 104-80 triumph over Columbia Union, then edged Clarion in another classic affair, 85-74 in overtime. The Scots rallied from a large second-half deficit to force the extra session, then dominated the five minute extra period behind point guard Adam Kaufman. Kaufman scored 21 points, handed out 8 assists and grabbed 6 rebounds.

Following the Cal tilt, Edinboro ran off three more wins, the most notable a non-conference triumph over Mansfield. The Mountaineers continually drove inside, only to be rebuffed by Roseto. When the evening was over, Roseto had tied the school and PSAC record with 11 blocked shots in the Boro's 96-85 win.

Following the 74-61 loss to IUP, the Scots righted themselves long enough for a 69-62 win over Lock Haven, but the small lineup featuring no starters taller than 6'4" lost its next five games.


That's not to say the Scots went down without a fight, but the losing skid virtually ended their playoff hopes. The most noteworthy game in the five-game skid occurred at Clarion, where the two PSAC rivals played a double overtime affair with the Fighting Scots battling for their playoff lives. Clarion would pull out a 100-94 triumph.

The losing streak came to an end with an 84-61 win over Shippensburg, but four days later Slippery Rock officially eliminated the Scots with a 77-66 win. One game under .500, Edinboro pulled out a 76-67 win at Lock Haven, thanks to a season-high 20 markers from Rob Schodt, for a 13-13 final ledger.

Tate and Kaufman garnered numerous honors, with both capturing a spot on the All-PSAC West first team. Tate then was named to the NABC East Region first unit, with Kaufman a second team selection. Tate would go on to earn a spot on the Basketball Times second team All-American unit, while Kaufman was recognized as an honorable mention All-American by Division II Bulletin.

Tate led the Scots both in scoring (20.5 ppg.) and rebounding (10.3 rpg.), while Kaufman enjoyed another typical campaign with 211 assists and an 11.8 scoring average.

Jean Paul, the lone senior on the squad, finished as the second-leading scorer at 14.3 ppg., with junior college transfer Keith Allen also in double digits at 10.3 ppg. And Roseto, despite missing nine games, finished with 71 blocked shots.

Edinboro University



HISTORY

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania was founded in 1857 as a private academy. Previously named Edinboro Academy, Edinboro Normal School, Edinboro State Teachers College, and Edinboro State College, the University was the second normal school established in Pennsylvania and the 12th in the United States. On July 1, 1983, it became Edinboro University of Pennsylvania with the formation of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.

LOCATION

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is located in the resort community of Edinboro -- just 15 miles south of Erie, Pennsylvania's third-largest city. Edinboro is conveniently located approximately 100 miles from Pittsburgh, Cleveland and Buffalo. The University is easily accessible from all directions because of its proximity to Interstates 79 and 90.

There are two lakes nearby. Edinboro Lake is a 250-acre recreational area with three guarded beaches for swimming, boating and other water sports. The Edinboro lakeside community features a large selection of cottages for rent. Lake Erie, one of the Great Lakes, is just 15 miles north. Edinboro also is close to several ski resorts for both downhill and cross country enthusiasts. The area is a popular hunting and fishing spot for outdoors enthusiasts.

Edinboro is the largest employer in the area, with approximately 2,000 full and part-time employees, many of them current and former Edinboro University students.

ACADEMICS

Edinboro University offers a diversified and comprehensive

selection of more than 100 degree programs, with 52 minors tailored to meet the needs of each student. With a student-faculty ratio of 18:1, Edinboro offers associate's degrees, bachelor's degree and master's degrees in many specialized fields of study.

Edinboro has an undergraduate and graduate enrollment of nearly 7,200 students.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Edinboro University is proud to feature the nation's third largest educational program for the physically disabled including services for the hearing impaired, the visually impaired, and the learning disabled. The campus is nearly 100-percent wheelchair accessible.

The University has an outstanding honors program for academically-gifted students and an international education program for the exchange of faculty and students.

Internships and field experiences integrate academic pursuits with on-site "real world" work situations and personal relationships, while numerous cultural, social and recreational activities are available.

CAMPUS FACILITIES

- ◆ Edinboro features 43 buildings on a spacious 585-acre wooded campus which includes a five-acre lake, open fields and wooded area. Day, evening and weekend classes are available at Edinboro University in Erie -- the Porreco Center.
- ◆ There are eight on-campus residence halls housing approximately 2,600 students.
- ♦ A state-of-the-art seven-story library in the center of campus features more than 440,000 bound volumes and 1,200,000 microform units, an on-line public access catalog, on-line and CD-ROM searching systems, public access catalog for the visually impaired, and inter-library loan services.
- Edinboro University houses a planetarium, modern science labs, solar observatory, robotics laboratory, TV studio, radio station, and center for the performing arts.
- ◆ The University also features a reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, math clinic, parent-child development center, and computer lab for children.
- ◆ Five powerful mini-computer systems, more than 725 personal computers, 300 terminals, and 11 computer labs with current hardware and software are available for student use throughout the year.
- The University Center boasts an indoor running track, saunas and whirlpools, weight room, racquetball and handball courts, full-service bookstore and dining areas, and an aerobics room for student

FIGHTING SCOT ATHLETICS

Edinboro University competes in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference as a member of the NCAA. The Fighting Scots sponsor 16 sports, with all but wrestling competing on the Division II level. Wrestling is classified as a Division I sport. Edinboro sponsor's the following sports:

Men: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, swimming, tennis, track (indoor and outdoor) and wrestling Women: basketball, cross country, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis, track (indoor and outdoor) and volleyball

McComb Fieldhouse houses several indoor athletic facilities.

including basketball courts, a weight room, and an olympic-sized swimming pool with diving tank. McComb is home for the men's and women's basketball teams, the wrestling team, the volleyball team, and the swimming team. Outdoor facilities include Sox Harrison Stadium, home of Fighting Scot football, an all-weather track, baseball and softball fields, tennis courts, a cross country course, and 26 soccer fields.

Edinboro student-athletes are success stories in the classroom as well as the playing fields. In 1999-2000, almost one-third of all Fighting Scot student-athletes maintained a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better. Over fifty student-athletes were honored as scholar-athletes by the PSAC.
