If there's one thing that coach Greg Walcavich's team is proving, it's don't count out the Fighting Scots. Having suffered two straight losses and with several members of the team battling the flu, Edinboro turned in an outstanding effort on Wednesday in handing Clarion a 73-67 defeat. The victory improved the Boro's ledger to 11-10 overall and 4-4 in PSAC West action. It also displayed the team's amazing recuperative powers at McComb Fieldhouse. At one point the Scots trailed

HEAD COACH: Tom Ackerman (126-135, 10th year; 159-212, 14th year overall)

Like Edinboro, Mansfield has been a terror at home while struggling on the road. The Mounatineers have won just once in ten road affairs, but that was an impressive win over a 16-3 Fairmont State club, 78-77. Also like the Boro, Mansfield snapped a two-game losing skid on Wednesday with a 96-78 win over East Stroudsburg ... coach Tom Ackerman's club relies greatly on the talents of Tom Harvey and Steve Shannon. The duo has led the team in scoring in all but two games. Harvey is a multi-talented 5'9", 147 lb. junior who was an All-PSAC East second team choice a year ago. He ranks among the Division II leaders in both scoring (20.9 ppg., 31st) and steals (66, 11th). Harvey is shooting 50.2 percent from the floor and 79.5 percent from the line, while making 47 of 119 three's. He also leads the team in assists with 96. The ESU game was a typical contest, as he narrow-

ly missed a triple double (25 points, 10 assists, 9 rebounds) ... Shannon is a 6'7", 231 lb. senior who hails from Fairview High School. He ranks 11th in the country in rebounding, clutching 11.0 per game, and has led the Mountaineers on the glass in all but four games. Shannon is also a proficient scorer, averaging 17.4 ppg. while shooting 52.9 percent from the floor. Both Shannon and Harvey spend frequent time at the line, Shannon attempting 162 free throws and Harvey 146 ... junior guard **Kevin Perluke** falls just under double figures at 9.6 ppg. He owns 33 three's in 80 tries ... a pair of freshman complete the regulars. **Jim Davies**, a 6'3" swingman, comes in at 7.7 ppg., while 6'10" center **Owen Murphy** only recently joined the starting five. He leads the team with 13 blocks ... youth abounds on the bench, as well, with two freshmen and a sophomore in the regular rotation.

17-2, only to proceed to score the next 22 points to run their home record to 10-3. Now Edinboro takes a night off from Western Division play to host a crossover contest with Eastern Division foe Mansfield. Both teams look to build momentum for the PSAC playoff chase, while Edinboro would love to a venge a 91-88 overtime setback to the Mountaineers a month ago. The Scots are tied with Slippery Rock for the fourth and final playoff spot in the West, with Mansfield's 96-78 win over East Stroudsburg on Wednesday boosting the Mountaineers to within a half game of fourth place in the East. Coach Tom Ackerman's club is 9-12 and 3-5 in the East.

THE LAST TIME OUT

Edinboro posted a key PSAC West victory, upending visiting Clarion, 73-67. The Fighting Scots missed 17 of their first 18 shots to fall behind, 17-2. The Boro then scored the next 22 points to eventually defeat the Golden Eagles, the fifth-ranked squad in the East Region. Michael Johnson had 15 points to lead the way, with Troy Stout adding 12 markers and a career-high 14 rebounds. Jean Paul had 12 points, as well, while Adam Kaufman totalled 11 points, 8 rebounds, 7 assists, and no turnovers. Edinboro committed a season-low 7 turnovers, and outrebounded Clarion, 50-40.

Edinboro suffered a heartbreaking loss at Mansfield thanks to the efforts of Steve Shannon and Tom Harvey. Harvey sent the contest into overtime, hitting a pair of free throws with one second remaining. He then canned a three-pointer with a minute to play in overtime to hand the Mountaineers the lead for good. Shannon, meanwhile, posted a career-high 32 points (10 of 13 FGs, 12 of 14 FTs), while grabbing 14 rebounds. Harvey totalled 17 points and 6 assists. The Fighting Scots featured five players in double digits, led by lan Johnson's 22 points and 10 boards. Michael Johnson added 20 markers, with Jean Paul chipping in 18, Adam Kaufman 13 points and 11 assists, and Troy Stout 11 points and 13 rebounds.

After opening the Clarion game by making just one of 18 shots, Edinboro proceeded to turn in one of its best efforts of the season. The Fighting Scots were guilty of just seven turnovers, and held an impressive 50-40 rebounding edge over the Eagles. That was more than enough to offset a 33.8 percent figure from the floor. The Boro defense, meanwhile, held Clarion to just 33.9 percent ... while displaying

more energy than in the previous two outleading scorer Michael Johnson inas. continued to be dogged by the flu. It didn't stop him from scoring a team-high 15 points. The 6'5" sophomore averages 14.3 ppg., and is second in rebounding at 6.4 per game. He swatted away three more shots vs. the Eagles, boosting his season total to 62. That figure ranks fourth on the season charts, and his 99 career blocks is eighth. Johnson stands fifth in Division II in blocks ... the Boro roster features just two seniors and no juniors, but the upperclassmen showed the way on Wednesday. Troy Stout returned to his early season form, contributing 12 points and a career-high 14 boards, good for his third double-double of the campaign. The 6'6" forward leads the team in rebounding (7.3 per game) while averaging 8.3 ppg. He is also the top shooter from the floor at 53.1 percent ... fellow senior Jean Paul has fallen into a minislump from the floor, connecting on just 4 of his last 26 attempts, but the 6'3" guard turned in an outstanding floor game and defensive effort vs. Clarion. The former Indiana University gridder totalled 12 points, keeping his season average at 12.5 ppg. He leads the Scots with 31 three's in 78 attempts, and is second in assists with 59 ... sophomore Adam Kaufman, a second team All-PSAC West choice a year ago, turned in what is now becoming just an average night for him, totalling 11 points, 8 rebounds and 7 assists. In actuality, the 5'11" guard is playing outstanding ball, boosting his scoring average to 11.5 ppg.

while remaining one of the top playmakers in the country. He has 153 assists, as opposed to just 71 turnovers, and also leads the team with 35 steals. Kaufman ranks fourth in Division II in assists. In addition, he has canned 28 of 81 triples ... Rob Schodt completes the starting five. The 6'8" sophomore averages 7.2 points and 3.0 rebounds, and is the team's top free throw shooter at 85.1 percent (40 of Edinboro is 4-2 since the former 47). McDowell High School product joined the starting lineup ... while depleted by the flu on Wednesday, the bench has played a large role in the team's success in '98-99. lan Johnson, a 6'7" sophomore, provides scoring and rebounding, coming in at 8.4 ppg. and 5.4 rpg. Johnson shoots 51.1 percent from the floor and owns 18 blocked shots ... freshman James Dickerson (3.7 ppg.) provides athleticism, while fellow frosh Jarrod Graham (3.4 ppg.) injects defense and ballhandling into the lineup.

MORE HARVEY AND SHANNON

Mansfield's duo of Tom Harvey and Steve Shannon are highly-ranked among the school's career leaders. Harvey has scored 1,223 points, good for ninth place, while Shannon is 13th with 1,172 markers. Harvey is 3rd in steals (193) and 7th in assists (362). Shannon, meanwhile, is second in career rebounding with 755, and his 43 career blocks stands fourth. Shannon has had 14 double-doubles. As for Harvey, he's scored in double figures in 20 of 21 games.




