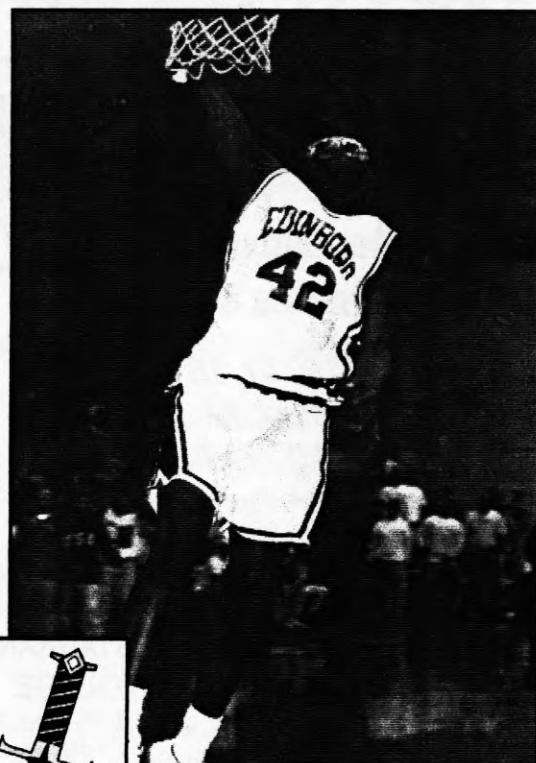


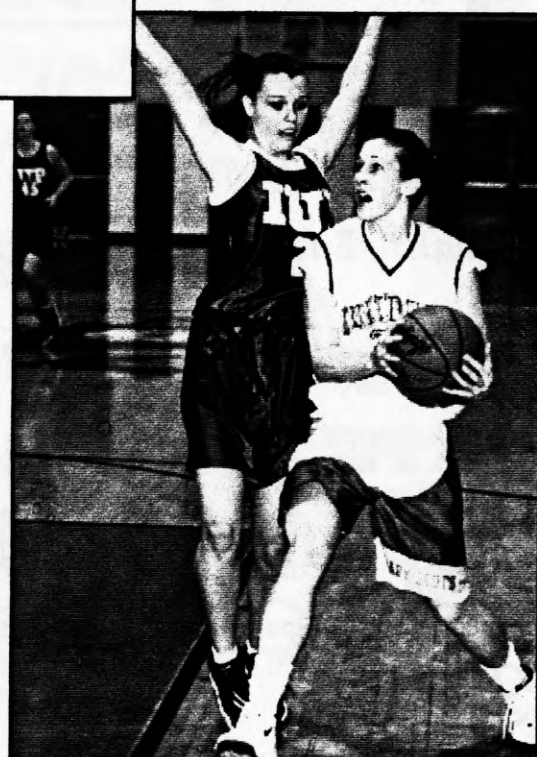
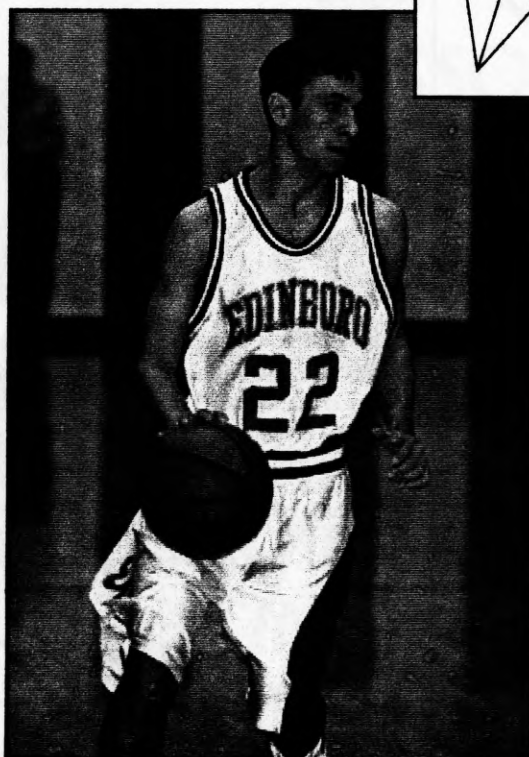

THE GAME STORY

Edinboro hopes to revenge an earlier loss to Clarion and at the same time red-main on the heels of PSAC West leaders Shippensburg and Indiana(Pa.). The Fighting Scots own wins over both Shippensburg and IUP, and turned in an impressive win on Saturday against California(Pa.). Edinboro brings a record of 15-6 overall and 4-3 in league play into the contest. The Fighting Scots have won five of their last six outings, the lone slipup at Slippery Rock last Wednesday. Clarion had lost five of its previous seven games before a convincing 105-35 triumph over

HEAD COACH: Gie Parsons (165-112, 10th year at Slippery Rock; 275-185 overall)

Longtime mentor Gie Parsons has not swept the season series with Edinboro since the 1993-94 campaign. A win would not only accomplish that, but also pull the Golden Eagles back into the PSAC West playoff hunt. Clarion invades Edinboro with a 9-11 record, 2-5 in league competition. However, it is an outfit which can give a team fits if hitting on all cylinders. The Eagles force 21.4 turnovers per contest, and still bear the reputation as mad bombers. Over 45 percent of all of Clarion's field goal attempts have come from beyond the three-point arc. In all, Clarion has made 153 of 575 triples ... four Eagles average in double figures, with Erica Johnson leading the way at 12.4 ppg. The junior guard has made 32 of 127 three's ... senior forward Bobbi Schneider is next in the scoring parade, checking in at 12.0 ppg. She is the team leader in three-pointers with 37 in 127 tries, while adding 5.8 rpg... Miesha

Henry averages 10.8 ppg. as the Clarion point guard. A 5'5" junior, Henry leads the Eagles with 93 assists, and has displayed a knack for getting to the free throw line. In all, she has converted 94 of 136 at the charity stripe ... the fourth double digit operative is Alison Campbell. A 5'10" senior, Campbell contributes 10.1 ppg. and a team-leading 6.3 rpg. She is another three-point threat with 22 in 79 attempts ... Krista Archiabile has started all 20 games at forward. A 6'0" junior, Archiabile averages 7.1 points and 5.9 rebounds. She also leads the team with 18 blocked shots ... Melissa Yearous, a 5'10" sophomore, has started 12 times. She averages 8.3 ppg. and 4.9 rpg., while leading Clarion with 36 steals ... Parsons likes to go nine or ten deep with her bench. In addition to Yearous, Heather Jensvold has put up the best numbers. The 5'11" sophomore comes in at 5.2 ppg. and 3.6 rpg., with 15 three's in 52 tries.

Columbia Union on Monday night. The Golden Eagles are just 3-7 in road contests and are still searching for their first conference road win. Edinboro, meanwhile, has posted a gaudy 10-1 ledger at McComb Fieldhouse.

Edinboro opened PSAC West play with a disappointing loss at Clarion. Playing without leading scorer Marin Hightower for the first time, the Fighting Scots fell behind by fourteen points just nine minutes into the fray. The Boro then proceeded to outscore Clarion, 17-2, to take a three-point lead. Edinboro would take its largest lead of the game at 37-31 early in the second half, but with four of five starters playing 37-or-more minutes, the Scots eventually wore down. Jessica Rowe paced the Scots with 18 points, while Meghan Miller added 17 and Kelli Torboli 14 markers and 14 rebounds. Erica Johnson had 17 points to lead a trio of Golden Eagles in double figures. Alison Campbell added 13 points and 10 boards, with Miesha Henry notching a dozen tallies.

SCOUTING THE FIGHTING SCOTS

Edinboro continues to battle adversity in its search for a third straight NCAA Playoff appearance. First the Fighting Scots were forced to play four games without leading scorer **Marin Hightower**. Now coach Stan Swank's club must persevere without another inside force, leading rebounder **Kelli Torboli**. The 6'1" senior sat out the California(Pa.) game with a back injury, and is out indefinitely. Missing are her 10.9 ppg. and 10.1 rpg., along with a team-high 39 blocked shots. Totboli ranks fifth in the PSAC in rebounding and fourth in blocked shots ... Hightower has hardly missed a beat since returning three games ago. The 6'1" junior is averaging 19.8 ppg., good for second in the league, along with 8.2 rpg. She totalled 20 points in Saturday's 63-56 win over California(Pa.). Hightower is also shooting 52.9 percent from the floor and is second in both steals (33) and blocked shots (19) ... with the injuries to Hightower and Torboli, forward **Dana Polakowski** has stepped up and become a force on the glass. The 5'11" junior, from nearby General McLane High School, is now averaging 7.2 rebounds an outing, including 13 against California(Pa.). In fact, even without Torboli, Edinboro held a 53-38 rebounding edge over a Vulcan team which entered the game as the top rebounding outfit in the PSAC. Polakowski adds 6.8 ppg., along with 44 assists ... Edinboro's backcourt of **Meghan Miller** and **Jessica Rowe** continues to play well. Miller continues her ascent up the Boro records charts. She ranks first in career three-pointers made (221) and attempted (578), third in career scoring (1,408 points), career assists (410) and career steals (278). For the year, the senior point guard comes in at 12.1 ppg., while leading the team with 53 steals and tied for the lead in assists with 70. She is also the team's top three-point threat with 46 in 109 attempts. Rowe, a junior, stands second on the team in scoring at 14.4 ppg., and is tied with Miller for the assist lead with 70. She has made 28 of 86 three-pointers, along with shooting 80.0 percent from the line (56 of 70). Like Miller, Rowe is etching her name on many of the career records, including scoring (11th

with 1,170 points) and assists (9th with 295) ... Swank will choose between freshman **Korie Morton** and sophomore **Julie McNees** for the fifth starting spot. Morton brings more size and rebounding ability, while McNees is a strong defender and ballhandler. Morton, 5'9", is averaging 6.5 points and 4.5 rebounds. She contributed 12 points and 10 boards on Saturday. McNees shows numbers of 1.8 ppg. with 25 assists ... a third key reserve is sophomore **Kim Vay**. The 5'10" forward averages 6.2 points and 4.9 rebounds in just thirteen minutes per contest. She is also shooting 52.1 percent from the floor.

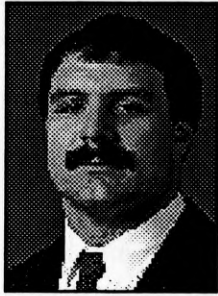
