Should the Rockets upend the Scots for the second time in 1998-99, Edinboro would need to defeat Lock Haven on the road on

HEAD COACH: DARCIE VINCENT (27-46, 3rd year at Slippery Rock)

All year long, senior **Heather Kearney** has carried a young Slippery Rock outfit. The 5'10" forward will be asked to again shoulder a major portion of the load as the Rockets fight for their playoff lives. Kearney is the PSAC's leading scorer and ranks third in Division II at 23.3 ppg. She's more than a scorer, however. Kearney is second both in the PSAC and nationally in rebounding at 12.8 per game, and she stands 14th in Division II in field goal percentage at 59.6 percent. The All-American has scored in double figures in 68 consecutive games, the longest streak in Division II, along with 17 double-doubles ... while Kearney has played the role of lead actress, she has had a number of supporting stars. **Shelbey Wardman**, one of three freshmen in the starting lineup, is averaging 15.6 ppg. The 5'7" guard missed seven games with a knee injury, but has played well since her return. Wardman is an excellent shooter, making

25 of 78 three's and 80.6 percent from the line (58 of 72). She also leads the Rockets with 14 blocks ... **Jackie Altenweg** is another of the freshmen in the lineup. Altenweg has taken over the point guard responsibilities since fellow frosh Jenni Morrison went down with a knee injury after fifteen games. Altenweg averages 9.1 ppg., along with a team-high 82 assists ... the third first-year player expected to start is **Anna Bell**. A 6'1" center, Bell is averaging 6.3 points and 3.6 rebounds ... **Julia Perkins** completes the starting five. Perkins is a 5'10" junior who ranks as the team's top three-point threat with 34 in 93 tries. Perkins averages 7.1 ppg. and 5.5 rpg. Amazingly, she has been to the line just eight times, making five ... junior **Lisa Shall** (4.4 ppg.), a two-year starter, and freshman **Nikita Lewis** (4.9 ppg., 4.6 rpg.) spearhead the bench ... Slippery Rock is ranked second in the PSAC in field goal percentage (44.4 pct.).

Saturday, and also have Slippery Rock lose at Shippensburg to capture the fourth play-off spot. In other words, Edinboro's fate rests in its own hands. Coach Stan Swank's gang has been near invincible at McComb Fieldhouse, posting an 11-1 ledger. The Boro comes off back-to-back losses at IUP and Shippensburg, the latter a heartbreaking 88-84 double overtime setback. The Rockets, meanwhile, have lost four of their last five outings.

Slippery Rock rode Heather Kearney's 13th double-double and 63rd straight game in double figures to an 87-74 victory. Kearney contributed 27 points and 17 rebounds. The Fighting Scots forced 21 turnovers while turning the ball over just eight times, but could not overcome a 48-38 rebounding deficit, or a 51.7 percent performance by the Rockets from the floor. Shelbey Wardman added 20 markers for the Rock, with Julia Perkins totalling 16 points and 10 boards. Marin Hightower scored 20 points to leads the Boro, with Jessica Rowe (17 points) and Kelli Torboli (11 points, 10 rebounds) also in double figures.

SCOUTING THE FIGHTING SCOTS

There are those who might say that at 16-8 and 5-5 in PSAC West action, the Edinboro women's basketball team has not lived up to expectations. This is a team that started 9-0 and was chosen the preseason favorite in the PSAC West. For those with such negative thoughts, consider this. In a league featuring plenty of height and inside power, the Scots have played just two of ten league frays with inside stalwarts **Marin Hightower** and **Kelli Torboli** both active. Hightower, the Boro's top scorer at 19.6 ppg. and second-leading rebounder at 8.2 rpg., missed the first four games of PSAC action and five games in all. The duo played together for two games -- a win over Lock Haven and a loss at Slippery Rock -- before Torboli went down with a back injury. She returned against Shippensburg after missing three games, but illness kept Hightower home in bed for the Shippensburg contest. With the duo, Edinboro possesses a potent inside game, along with a solid guard combination of **Meghan Miller** and **Jessica Rowe**. Throw in unheralded **Dana Polakowski**, and it's a strong starting five, along with a productive bench. Coach Stan Swank now hopes this is the group he can rely on as the Boro enters its final week ... Hightower ranks 25th in Division II in scoring. She is shooting 52.4 percent from the floor ... Torboli, a 6'0" senior, averages 11.0 points and 9.9 rebounds while leading the Scots with 39 blocks.. She was expected to see very limited action at Shippensburg, but due to foul problems, she played 16 minutes, totalling 13 points and 6 boards ... Miller and Rowe continue their climb up the records chart. Miller, a senior, stands third in career scoring with 1,424 points. She averages 11.2 ppg. while tying Rowe for the team lead in assists with 78. She also has a team-high 61 steals and paces the Scots in three's with 47 in 120 attempts. Miller is third in career assists (418) and second in career steals (286) ... Rowe, meanwhile, comes in at 15.4 ppg. The junior has 78 assists and has made 33 of 104 three-pointers, along with shooting 81.1 percent from the line (77 of 95). Rowe

ranks ninth in scoring (1,238 points) and moved into eighth in career assists (303) ... to understand Polakowski's contributions, just take a look at her numbers vs. Shippensburg. The 5'11" junior had 10 points, 11 rebounds, 7 assists and 3 steals in the double overtime setback. Polakowski, a former standout at nearby General McLane High School, averages 7.1 ppg. and 7.3 rpg., with 55 assists ... with Torboli out, freshman **Korie Morton** stepped in and played extremely well. The 5'11" forward totalled 22 points and 11 rebounds against Clarion, canning 11 of 15 field goal attempts, and contributed 15 points and 10 boards at Shippensburg. Morton is averaging 7.5 ppg. and 5.0 rpg. She has started six contests due to the injuries ... sophomores **Julie McNees** and **Kim Vay** are the top reserves. McNees, a 5'6" guard, is a strong defender and ballhandler who averages 1.6 ppg. with 25 assists. Vay, a 5'10" forward, contributes 5.9 points and 5.0 rebounds while shooting 51.0 percent from the floor. She hauled down a season-high 13 rebounds last Saturday.

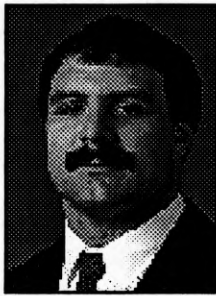

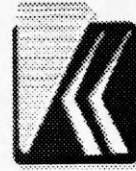
