THE GAME STORY

Edinboro has lost three of its last four contests but remains in third place in the PSAC West, two games behind first place IUP. The Indians posted their third 20-win season in the last five years on Saturday with a 67-50 win over Slippery Rock. They are now 20-2 overall and 7-1 in PSAC West play. Edinboro, meanwhile, fell to 14-8 overall and 5-3 in PSAC West play with a 78-74 loss at Clarion on Wednesday. The Fighting Scots play three of their final four games at home, where they are 9-2 this season. IUP captured the first meeting between the two by an 81-63 count. The Boro held a 36-32 halftime lead but saw the Indians run off the first 12 points in the second half. IUP is ranked first in the East Region and 13th in the latest NABC/Division II Bulletin national poll.

THE EDINBORO-INDIANA(PA) SERIES

IUP leads 78-59

IUP captured this year's first meeting by an 81-63 score after trailing by 36-32 at the half. The Indians ran off the first 12 points of the second half to take the lead for good. Dennis Mims led four Indians in double digits with 23 points and 11 rebounds, with Aaron Faulkner adding 19 points. Wes Layton had 11 points and 11 assists, while Fannar Olafsson totaled 10 points. Leon Piper paced a 47-40 rebounding edge with 13 boards. Blake Johnson (19) and Dan Grabill (10) were the lone Scots in double figures, with Kenny Tate limited to 8 points, but pulling down 10 rebounds.

THE COACHES

Edinboro mentor **Greg Walcavich** is in his 13th season, posting a record of 231-130 during that period. The all-time leader in coaching wins at Edinboro, Walcavich has an overall career mark of 385-192 and is in his 20th season as a head coach. **Gary Edwards** owns an impressive 118-46 record in his sixth season at IUP. He previously coached at Charleston Southern and Barton, and has a career mark of 301-214 in 18 years as a head coach.

TATE GARNERS PRESEASON ACCOLADES

Kenny Tate once again received plenty of preseason honors, culminated by his selection as Division II Bulletin's preseason Player of the Year. WINNING WHILE LOSING THE BOARD WARS

Edinboro has been outrebounded just six times this season. Until last week's 80-66 win over Slippery Rock, the Fighting Scots had lost the previous five games in which it had lost the war on the boards. The Rock claimed a 39-34 rebounding advantage.

DUKE GETS OUT HIS SIX-SHOOTERS

Duke Gartrell found out just before game time that he would replace Blake Johnson in the starting lineup vs. Slippery Rock. The junior guard then went out and fired the Scots past The Rock. He made his first six shots and finished the first half with 15 points. Gartrell would finish the night with a season-high 18 points, making 7 of 14 field goals, including 4 of 8 three-pointers, along with 2 assists and 3 steals. He remained in the lineup at Clarion, making 5 of 11 three's and finishing with 17 points.

SECOND HALF BLUES

The first meeting with Indiana(Pa.) began a disturbing trend for the Fighting Scots. Edinboro led 36-32 at intermission, only to go down to defeat, 82-72. The Scots have now lost three of their last four games, and in the three losses they've been outscored, 147-87.

HOT FROM THE LINE

Kenny Tate saw a streak of 20 straight free throws made come to an end at Clarion. That included a perfect 11-for-11 effort vs. Slippery Rock. The senior forward made his first attempt of the night before misfiring at Clarion, going 4-for-6.

HOME SWEET HOME

Edinboro concludes the regular season playing three of its final four games at home. The Boro is 9-2 at McComb Fieldhouse this year, and 61-10 since the 1996-97 season.

THE PSAC PLAYOFF PICTURE

With a scant week and a half left in the regular season, it's time to use the dreaded "p" word. The PSAC Playoffs are just around the corner, and there's still plenty of things that can happen for the Fighting Scots. At 5-3, Edinboro is in third place in the Western Division, with IUP holding down the top spot at 7-1, and California(Pa.) sitting at 7-2. If the Scots are to defend their

PSAC West regular crown, a win over IUP is a must, since IUP won the first meeting between the two. With a split against Cal, and an IUP-Cal meeting still to come, Edinboro can still grab one of the top two spots and host a home game on Tuesday, February 26. However, of greater concern may be what's waiting behind the Scots. Lock Haven's 61-59 win over Clarion on Saturday left the Bald Eagles at 4-4, breathing down the neck of the Scots and 5-4 Clarion. If Edinboro has an advantage, it's the schedule. The Scots play three of their final four games at home, where they are 9-2, including a meeting with Lock Haven to close out the regular season. Clarion has just two games remaining, hosting IUP and playing at California(Pa.). Lock Haven must play three of its last four on the road, with the lone home game against IUP. Finally, Cal plays two of its final three at home, with the season finale at IUP in what could decide the regular season crown. But as we've seen throughout the season, anything is still possible.

SCOUTING THE INDIANS

INDIAN TEEPEES: IUP has won its last five games and 19 of its last 20. Their lone losses have been Gannon in the second game of the season and California(Pa.) by a point, both on the road. Both teams are ranked in the top 25 at 16th and 22nd, respectively, while IUP moved into the 13th position in the latest NABC/Division II Bulletin Top 25 ... IUP's 20-2 overall record is not the only impressive number put up by the Indians. They ranked second in the country in field goal percentage defense, limiting foes to a measly 34.7 percent. In addition, they are averaging 81.9 ppg. while giving up just 64.8 ppg. And they lead the PSAC in rebounding margin at plus 11.0 per game. If IUP has an achilles heal, it may be the 20 turnovers it commits a game. In Saturday's 67-50 win over Slippery Rock, they committed 27 turnovers, but limited The Rock to just four field goals in the second half and 26.9 percent shooting for the game ... as is traditionally the case, IUP is loaded with experienced talent, with five Division I transfers and a pair of Division II transfers dotting the roster. Edwards calls on four seniors in his starting unit, and the team is so deep that **Keenan Holmes**, a first team All-PSAC West choice a year ago, has been unable to get back into the starting lineup after missing time due to injuries. The 6'4" junior, who previously played at Rice, is averaging 6.2 ppg. after leading the Indians at 18.3 ppg. a year ago ... the "big" addition this year at IUP was **Dennis Mims**. A 6'9", 235 lb. forward, Mims played for three years at Virginia Tech. In 1999-2000, he averaged 14.2 ppg. and 7.6 rpg. for the Hokies, leading the Atlantic 10 conference in blocked shots (58) and field goal percentage (52.6 percent). Now Mims is leading IUP both in scoring (16.9 ppg.) and rebounding (11.0). He also leads the team in blocked shots (63) and field goal percentage (61.2 percent) ... the IUP lineup features two other newcomers, as well. **Leon Piper**, a 6'6", 220 lb. senior, previously played at Delaware State. He averages 12.9 ppg. and 8.9 rpg. The third member of the frontline is **Fannar Olafsson**, a 6'8", 235 lb. transfer from Division II USC Spartanburg. A sophomore, the native of Iceland averages 7.9 ppg. and 7.5 rpg., and is also an efficient shooter at 54.0 percent ... **Aaron Faulkner**, a 6'2" senior who joined IUP a year ago after playing at Monmouth, is the second-leading scorer at 15.3 ppg. Faulkner also leads the Indians with 101 assists and 40 steals, along with 47 three-pointers in 142 attempts ... **Wes Layton**, a Campbell University import a year ago, rounds out the starting five. The 5'11" guard averages 8.3 ppg. along with 91 assists and 27 steals, and has made 42 of 90 three-pointers ... former Union City High School standout **Mike Mangel** is also a reserve. The 6'4" guard has played in 17 games, averaging 3.2 ppg.

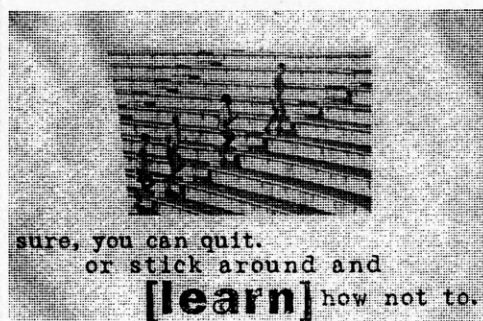
