

Talented Fighting Scots Seek Second Straight PSAC Crown

Few teams can lose two 1,000-point scorers, one who also ranks as the all-time leading rebounder, and feel that the upcoming season could be better than the year before. That is particularly true when the previous year's team finished 24-7, which is just what the Edinboro men's basketball team did in 2004-05.

The Fighting Scots enjoyed one of the finest seasons in school history, with the 24 wins tied for the second-highest win total in school history. Edinboro defeated Millersville to capture its first Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference championship since 1998, and made the NCAA Division II playoffs for the first time since that '98 campaign.

Ah, but now the problem of replacing two 1,000-point scorers. Jakim Donaldson, a consensus All-American and the PSAC West Player of the Year, not only averaged 16.3 ppg. and 13.1 rpg. a year ago, but departed as the eighth all-time leading scorer with 1,355 points and as the all-time leading rebounder with 1,100 rebounds. Rob Sims was named the PSAC Tournament's MVP. A three-time All-PSAC West honoree, Sims finished his career with 1,138 points.

Yet long-time head coach Greg Walcavich, not one to throw out undeserved praise, is optimistic. Part of the optimism stems from the eight returning players from last year's squad, including three former transfers who should feel more comfortable after a

year in the system. Add in a pair of transfers who should pay immediate dividends, and Walcavich sees his Fighting Scots once again battling down to the wire for the PSAC West crown. That's nothing new, since Edinboro has finished either first or second in the PSAC West each of the last five seasons.

"I think we have a chance to have a good team," stated Walcavich, who enters his 17th season as the head coach. "We have a real good core group of people who have really played a lot. They were instrumental in helping us to a great season last year. Some will have to take on different roles and responsibilities, but we have a chance to have a fine season."

Walcavich isn't about to downplay the contributions of Donaldson and Sims. "When you lose guys like we lost, that's a lot to replace. You have to try to do things a little bit differently. You try to be as effective, but in different ways. It will be interesting to see how the personality of this team emerges. You can't get a feel for that until you begin practice."

Losing Donaldson and Sims also leaves Walcavich wondering who will emerge as the go-to player down the stretch. "For the last two years they've been our end of the game options," related Walcavich. "Somebody is going to become that. I think that will shake out. Clearly it will have to be someone. We have some good candidates."

A year ago the Fighting Scots were a deep and versatile team, featuring speed and quickness. It was a formula that worked on both ends of the court, averaging 75.6 ppg., while giving up just 66.5 ppg., fourth in the PSAC. In addition, Edinboro held opponents to 40.3 percent from the floor, ranking 15th in Division II and second in the PSAC.

Those qualities are once again evident in the 2005-06 edition, but the loss of Donaldson leaves the Fighting Scots without the second-leading rebounder in the country. Thanks to Donaldson, Edinboro has rated as one of the top rebounding teams in Division II the last few years, including 24th last year.

"It concerns me that we don't have a real physically big team," admitted Walcavich. "There can be nights where that can be a negative factor, but it's not a grave concern."

Standing in the way of another run at the PSAC title and the NCAA playoffs is a demanding schedule that features 13 games against teams with 15-or-more wins, including 12 contests with opponents who won 18-or-more contests in 2004-05.

"The schedule is more difficult than last year because we have fewer home games," pointed out Walcavich, referring to 14 games at McComb Fieldhouse this season, as opposed to 18 at home last year.

"The conference part will be even more challenging. Last year, we knew IUP and Clarion would be good. Everybody didn't know that Shippensburg would be as

good as they were. Now Ship has everybody back, Clarion has a lot back and had people sitting out. When you have the resources California and IUP have, you're never far away. And I think Lock Haven and Slippery Rock feel good about themselves."

"Then look at the crossovers," he continued. "Last year we had three on the road and four at home. We only played one of the top four teams from the East on the road. Now we have four on the road. You throw in Charleston and Alderson-Broaddus, plus playing both Gannon and Mercyhurst both on the road. Last year we had both at home."

With such a demanding schedule awaiting his team, Walcavich was able to hook up with Penn State for an exhibition game on November 10. "I think that will be a really good experience for us," he related. "It has a chance to put an exclamation point on our preseason. We will play somebody better than anybody we'll play the next 27 nights. That will be a measuring stick."

The regular season gets started for the Fighting Scots on Tuesday, November 15, as Edinboro tips off the 2005-06 campaign by hosting West Virginia Wesleyan.

Here's a look at the 2005-06 Fighting Scots:

Backcourt


Walcavich employs a three-perimeter, two-frontcourt alignment, and he has plenty of quality guards to choose from. "We had five guys last year who played point guard at one time or another," Walcavich pointed out. "We lost one and picked up one. That's a positive thing. We like to have good dribblers and good passers."

While the Fighting Scots must replace Rob Sims, three players who started at least 13 games return. Leading the way is Torry Mitchell, a 5'10" senior who transferred from Mercyhurst a year ago. Mitchell came off the bench the first seven contests, then started the final 24. He finished the year with a rush, scoring in double figures five of the final six games, including 29 points vs. Shippensburg and 30 in the NCAA playoff loss to IUP, making nine three-pointers in the latter contest.

Mitchell ended the season as the second-leading scorer with 364 points, an average of 11.7 ppg., making 67 of 196 three-pointers. The 67 three-pointers ranks eighth, and the 196 attempts is tied for sixth. In addition, he was second on the team in assists (83) and steals (36).

"It's hard to have a better game than Torry had in the NCAA's," related Walcavich. "He hit nine three's in the biggest game of the year. It shows what he's capable of. He's poised to have another very good year."

Another transfer who made a large impact was Chris Ravello, who played two seasons at Canisius. The 6'3" senior had his ups and downs after sitting out the previous season, but when on he was a dangerous three-point threat. In addition, he's a strong defensive performer. Ravello averaged 7.8

Cardinal Mooney (Oh.) High School, earning first team All-Ohio honors as a junior and senior.

Justin Bean, a 6'1" freshman, will provide depth at guard, although he is expected to redshirt. Bean is from nearby East High School. He sat out last season after averaging 15.2 ppg. as a senior.

Frontcourt

The frontcourt will no doubt miss Donaldson, a player who produced a double-double each of the last three seasons and is now playing professionally in Portugal. But the departure will likely open up things even more for Daren Tielsch, a player with immense offensive skills. Tielsch joined the Fighting Scots a year ago after playing one season at Penn State and one game at Robert Morris. Rust was no doubt also a part of his game, since that season at Penn State came in 2001-02, when he started nine games as a freshman, only to sit out the 2002-03 season, then go down with an injury after one game at Robert Morris.

As did his brother, Tom Grabill, a 5'8" junior. He played in 14 games, with 22 points. He made 6 of 14 three-pointers, with all but one of his field goals from behind the three-point arc.

"Tommy hit some really big shots for us off the bench," Walcavich commented. "He did it for us at East Stroudsburg. I really feel good about him. He has begun to physically mature. Plus his confidence will serve him well. He'll play a very important role."

Last, but certainly not least of the returning backcourt players, is Devon Knight. The 5'8" sophomore was a dynamic addition to the Fighting Scots a year ago, and he's a proven winner. After leading Penn Hills High School to the PIAA AAAA State Championship as a senior, he was a key performer in Edinboro's playoff run. Knight averaged 5.9 ppg., had 28 steals and shot a team-high 78.3 percent from the line (47 of 60) while averaging just over 16 minutes a game. Knight scored in double figures in five of the final ten games, and was twice named the PSAC West Rookie of the Week.

"I think Daren is ready for another very good year," Walcavich pointed out. "He's healthier than he was last year. He's had the pins removed from his leg. That has enabled him to work harder, to be in better shape. I think he's going to have a terrific season."

Tielsch averaged 13.4 ppg. and 7.2 rpg., ranking 18th in the PSAC in scoring and 12th in rebounding, while playing in 25 games. His big-time leaping ability led to many dunks, yet he can step outside and hit the three-pointer (17 of 47). If he can improve his free throw shooting (41.6 pct.) and stay out of foul trouble after fouling out of five contests, Tielsch has a chance to have a memorable senior season.

Sophomore Ryan McLemore will likely start alongside Tielsch. At 6'8" and 200 lbs., McLemore bears a striking resemblance physically to Donaldson. While it would be unfair to expect McLemore to make the same strides Donaldson did, the raw McLemore has already brought his game to another level.

Walcavich brought McLemore along slowly a year ago. He played in 29 games, averaging just under 12 minutes per game, with 2.7 ppg. and 3.7 rpg. and shooting 52.5 percent from the floor. With his long arms, he showed the ability to block shots, ranking second with 32.

"Ryan made huge strides as a freshman," stated Walcavich. "What he could do at the beginning of the year doesn't compare to what he could do at the end. That improvement has continued this summer. We think he will take a big step forward."

Walcavich looks for senior Joe Cephas and sophomore Justin Moore to give the Fighting Scots four solid frontcourt performers. Cephas is 6'5", 200 lbs., and can play

inside or outside. A year ago he played guard. A former walk-on, he has made himself into a valuable performer. In 2004-05 he scored 24 points and pulled down 19 rebounds in 17 games, missing time with a back injury.

"Joe is someone whose role and responsibility has expanded every year," stressed Walcavich. "He has moved to forward this year. He's ready to have his best year."

Moore joins Ingram as the other addition to the Fighting Scot roster. A year ago, the 6'6", 221 lb. sophomore played at New Haven, where he appeared in 23 games, with 19 starts. He averaged a modest 3.9 ppg. and 3.8 rpg. while shooting 58.5 percent from the floor, adding 15 blocks. As a prepster at Canon-McMillan(Pa.) High School, and then Massanutten Military Academy, he was a Street & Smith's honorable mention All-American.


"Justin will really help the other three in the frontcourt, and vice-versa," predicted Walcavich. "He has a pretty good skill level, although he may be a bit undersized at times. He is a good player. He'll fit right in. Justin is the kind of guy we've had a lot of success with."

Rob Lowther is a 6'5", 200 lb. walk-on from nearby Villa Maria Academy who completes the picture in the frontcourt. The freshman is expected to redshirt this year.

Head Coach Greg Walcavich



Greg Walcavich ranks as one the deans of the coaching world in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, ranking behind only Dick DeLaney of West Chester and Clarion's Ron Righter in terms of longevity. Walcavich enters his 17th season as the head coach at Edinboro University, and his 24th overall.

In terms of wins Walcavich ranks second to none in the PSAC, with 444 career victories. He enters the 2005-06 season ranking 14th in career victories in NCAA Division II, and his winning percentage of .656 is 27th.

Walcavich's tenure at Edinboro has been earmarked by winning basketball teams. He surpassed Jim McDonald to set the school record for career wins during the 1998-99 campaign, and he recorded his 250th win at Edinboro during the 2002-03 season. He enters his 17th season as the Fighting Scot head coach with a 290-163 record. Add in five seasons at Birmingham Southern and two more at West Virginia Wesleyan, and he owns a career mark of 444-226.

But Walcavich isn't just about winning. He places a sincere emphasis on success off the court - in the classroom and the community. He expects his student-athletes to perform with the same winning attitude in the classroom as they do on the basketball court. In fact, his office is not adorned with pictures of past greats. It does, however, feature a photograph of every student-athlete to graduate from Edinboro.

Walcavich received his bachelor's degree in Communications from Rutgers University in 1973, then completed work on his master's degree in Physical Education from the University of Alabama-Birmingham two years later.

During his sixteen seasons at Edinboro, the Fighting Scots have won 20-or-more games seven times, including a 24-7 ledger a year ago. The Fighting Scots won the PSAC Championship with an 85-76 win over Millersville and advanced to the NCAA Division II East Regional. At one point in the season Edinboro climbed to 10th in the NABC Division II rankings, the highest in school history.

Last year's 24 wins is tied for the second-highest win total in school history. The 1997-98 team set the record wins with a 26-8 record. Edinboro went on to

capture the PSAC Championship for the first time in thirty years, advancing to the NCAA East Regional. There the Scots handed California(Pa.) a narrow 79-78 defeat before suffering a 91-83 setback to Salem-Teikyo in the semifinals. Walcavich was recognized as the PSAC West Coach of the Year.

He picked up his second PSAC West Coach of the Year plaque four years ago, guiding the Fighting Scots to a 21-7 finish. Edinboro captured its first PSAC West crown since 1985-86 thanks to a 9-3 finish in league play, earning the right to host the PSAC Tournament. Unfortunately, a possible NCAA Tournament berth was denied the Scots when West Chester posted an 82-72 upset in the PSAC semifinals.

The Fighting Scots have finished either first or second in the PSAC West each of the last five seasons, with a 42-18 record during that period, the best in the division during that period.

Two years ago Edinboro was 14-14 overall while playing a schedule with just 13 home games, but earned second place in the Western Division with an 8-4 record.

After two straight years in first place in the PSAC West, the Scots dropped to second in 2002-03, but still finished 17-11 after being picked to finish fifth in the preseason. A similar scenario occurred in 2001-02, with the Scots going 18-9. The coaches' preseason poll had picked Edinboro fourth.

Unfortunately, the three-way tie for first with Indiana(Pa.) and California(Pa.) saw the Fighting Scots have to go to California for the first round of the PSAC Playoffs, where the Scots lost, 82-70.

In all, Edinboro has made the NCAA Division II Playoffs four times under Walcavich, while qualifying for the PSAC Tournament eleven times. His 1993-94 squad finished with a 20-8 ledger, defeating West Chester in a NCAA play-in game before losing to Indiana(Pa.) in the regional semifinals. The Boro made it back to the tournament in '95-96, defeating Bloomsburg, 90-82, in the first round. The Scots squandered an 11-point lead to California(Pa.) in the semifinals, losing 84-76. That concluded the season with a 21-8 mark, with Walcavich capturing PSAC West Coach of the Year accolades for the second time.

Head Coach Greg Walcavich

Walcavich took over the Fighting Scot program in 1989-90, guiding the Boro to one of its best seasons ever. Edinboro won its first twelve games, the best start in nearly fifteen years, and was ranked in the Division II top twenty. The Scots eventually finished 22-5, the most wins since 1981-82. On three occasions the Fighting Scots were ranked in the nation's top twenty. The following season the Scots made their second straight appearance in the PSAC Playoffs under Walcavich, finishing with a 18-10 ledger.

The Scots made it three straight seasons in PSAC postseason action the next year, and the second twenty-win season in three years, with a 20-9 finish. Walcavich picked up his first PSAC tournament win, an 81-78 triumph over East Stroudsburg, before falling to California(Pa.) in the next round.

The 1992-93 campaign brought a very unfamiliar result for Walcavich - a losing season. The Scots finished at 12-17, losing eight games by five points or less. The Boro more than made up for it the next year with the trip to the NCAA Playoffs. The '93-94 season also saw the Scots finish 14th in the Division II final rankings, their top finish ever. The 1994-95 edition added another milestone to Walcavich's resume, as the Scots handed number one ranked Indiana(Pa.) a 94-77 loss. The season ended at 15-11.

Walcavich's fourth 20-win campaign at Edinboro in '95-96 was followed by his second losing season, a 13-14 finish. Despite the losing record, the Boro made it to the PSAC Playoffs for the fifth time in his first eight years. That mark improved to seven out of ten the next two seasons, thanks to the 26-8 finish in '97-98 and the 16-12 ledger in '98-99. After replacing four starters from the '97-98 squad, Walcavich directed the Scots to three wins over nationally-ranked opponents. The Boro upended IUP twice, including a 63-61 win in Indiana in the first round of the PSAC

Tournament, and St. Rose, an Elite Eight team for the second straight season, a 50-48 setback.

The Scots appeared well on their way to a third straight PSAC postseason appearance in 1999-2000 when starting center Jason Roseto, the leading shot blocker in Division II, went down with a broken hand. Prior to injuring the hand, Edinboro was 10-6. The Scots would lose six of its final nine contests without Roseto to finish at 13-13.

Walcavich took over as head coach at Edinboro after a successful two-year stint at West Virginia Wesleyan, where he posted a 40-19 mark. In his first season, he inherited a team which returned just four players, but quickly turned the Bobcats into a winner, finishing at 18-10. His second season concluded with a 22-9 ledger, including a pair of wins over Edinboro, while playing all underclassmen.

Walcavich began his coaching career at Birmingham Southern College in 1973, staying for four seasons before obtaining his first head coaching job at Alexander City (AL) Junior College in 1977.


After one year, Walcavich returned to Birmingham Southern as the school's head coach. During his five seasons as the head coach, the NAIA affiliate posted an impressive 114-44 record, with Walcavich named the Coach of the Year three times. His teams were ranked in the NAIA Top 20 four of the five seasons, as high as number two in 1979, and twice appeared in the NAIA National Tournament in Kansas City, Missouri.

While at Birmingham Southern, Walcavich was

recognized nationally in 1981, being selected to serve as an assistant coach for the United States Olympic Festival in Syracuse, New York. He coached future NBA stars, including Michael Jordan.

In 1983, Walcavich moved on to the Division I ranks as an assistant coach at Rice University. He was involved in some of the biggest wins in the Owls' basketball history at Rice, including triumphs over Arkansas, Houston and Notre Dame. After four years as a member of the Rice staff, Walcavich left for the head coaching job at West Virginia Wesleyan.

Walcavich and his wife, Dr. Maureen Walcavich, a professor in the Education Department at Edinboro, have been married for 31 years. They have two daughters, Sarah (25), a graduate of Penn State and the Georgetown Law School, who is now practicing law in New York City, and Jennifer (22), who graduated from Penn State last May and is a teacher in Charles, MD.



Assistant Coach Pat Cleary



Five years ago, Patrick Cleary was hired as an interim assistant coach following the sudden death of assistant coach Bryant Houston. That designation changed in the

spring of 2000, as Cleary was appointed a full-time member of the Edinboro University coaching staff. He served as a student assistant from 1997-99, helping the Fighting Scots reach the PSAC Playoffs both years, along with an NCAA Division II Playoff berth in 1997-98.


Cleary has played a large role in Edinboro's success. He is a tireless recruiter who has developed many contacts in his efforts to come up with the next great Fighting Scot. Cleary has had direct input in tracking down players such as Kenny Tate, Blake Johnson, Rob Sims and Rob Green, among others. In addition to handling the day-to-day duties of recruiting and scouting, he assists head coach Greg Walcavich with

the running and promotion of summer basketball camps.

Cleary attended Sharon High School where he played basketball for the Tigers. He completed work on his Bachelor of Arts Degree in 1999. In addition to his basketball duties he is the co-director of the Athletic Department Study Program. He was presented the Outstanding Supervisor Award for Peer Tutoring by Edinboro University in 2005.

Cleary is single and resides in Edinboro. An active member of the Sons of the American Legion, he currently serves as the chaplain for Post 162 in Sharpsville, PA.

Edinboro is situated just 100 miles from the metropolitan areas of Cleveland, Buffalo and Pittsburgh, and less than 20 miles south of the city of Erie – Pennsylvania's fourth largest city. Meadville, the seat of Crawford County, is approximately 20 miles south of Edinboro.

The University's Baron-Forness Library has more than 480,000 bound volumes and 1.3 million microform units, along with an online catalog, access to numerous online databases and electronic reserves. The building is equipped with a wireless network, computer labs and equipment to assist users with visual impairments.

The main campus also includes a modern University Center, planetarium, observatory, reading clinic, speech and hearing clinic, science and robotics labs, writing center, numerous computer labs with the latest hardware and software, three art galleries, an animation studio, campus radio and television stations, health center, counseling center, and much more – all accessible for people with disabilities. The recently renovated and expanded Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disability Resources rivals any facility of its kind in the nation.

In addition to a five-acre lake and wooded areas, there are 43 buildings on the spacious Edinboro Campus, including six residence halls with private or shared rooms, co-ed housing, honors housing, and living-learned floors – all are wired for voice, video and data.
