My dear :

Uncertainty of enrollments and limited budgets for next year make it necessary to announce to you at the request of the Board of Trustees, that the employment of all instructors and their compensation beginning with June 1, 1936, are dependent upon enrollments and budgetary limitetions. Much as this procedure is regretted, it is the only fair way, protecting the College and at the same time giving you the opportunity to seek and to accept employment elsewhere. We are, therefore, giving you and other employees the opportunity of advising the College not later than March 1 whether or not you desire to continue in the employ of the College under these conditions and circumstances. Naturally, if several employees inform us that they do not desire to continue in the employ of the College, the status of certain employees may be made more certain quite early in this semester.

It is understood, too, that the College reserves the right to make such curtailments among its employees as may seem necessary. These curtailments will be made as early as possible in order that sufficient notice of such change may be given the parties affected.
