Upon motion of Mrs. Mahoney, seconded by Dr. Renz, the following resolution was adopted:

Whereas, later and more complete study at the Edinboro State Teachers College in so far as its physical plant is concerned reveals the need for additional improvements:

Whereas, the President of the College had already submitted a supplementary items under Class "D", in addition to those submitted on May 6, 1938.

Therefore, be it resolved further, that the Board of Trustees in their regular meeting Thursday, June 30, 1938, approve these supplementary items to Class "D" as submitted since May 6, 1938, and as follows:

- 1. Completion of North Wing to Haven Hall, \$75,000 about
- 2. New Library Building to house library now on second floor of Normal Hall, \$125,000 about
- 3. Renovating and improving toilets in Normal Hall \$10,000
- 4. Renovating and improving toilets in Girls' Dormitory, \$10,000 about
- 5. New laundry equipment, \$12,000 about 6. Erection of a modern brick building to house present storeroom and laundry, \$75,000 to \$100,000 (Present storeroom is located in a poor frame building, while the laundry is shoused in the basement of Haven Hall.)
- 7. Pipe Organ for new auditorium

Therefore, the President of the Gollege is hereby authorized to submit these additional needs to the proper authorities through the Department of Public Instruction with the urgent recommendation that these needs be studied carefully and their fulfillment be recommended to the General State Authority.

Furtherfore, the Board of Trustees desire to enter upon its minutes its profound appreciation for the fine understanding of the authorities at Harrisburg of the problems existing at Edinboro in rehabilitating the physical plant at the College so long neglected in the past twenty-five years.

Following the suggestion made by the President of the College that a change ought to be made in the personnel of the Department of Health, it was moved by Mrs. Mahoney, and seconded by Miss MacBride, that Mr. Harrison, director of health education for boys should be notified at an appropriate time that his services would not be needed after May 31, 1939. After some discussion during which it was generally agreed that new personnel should be secured for the new program that must follow the completion of the new gymnasium, it was thought better to postpone action until a little later date. To carry out this suggestion, the motion was laid on the table until a later meeting.

Upon motion of Dr. Renz, seconded by Mrs. Mahoney, the meeting was adjourned.
