Upon motion of Mr. Lord, seconded by Mr. Harp, the Board accepted the bid of Mrs. Sherred for frame house #1 for \$152.60, subject to the approval of the Department of Property and Supplies. Separate bids to be sent out for house #2.

Upon motion of Mr. Knapp, seconded by Mr. LaBounty, the Board approved the following resolution:

That the Department of Property and Supplies and the Department of Public Instruction be requested to authorize the approval of the architectural fees of Meyers and Johnson, Erie, Pennsylvania, for the preparation of the plans and specifications and supervision of the construction of the Program Clock and Signal System as approved in Purchase Request Nos. A53269 and A53270 on April 15, 1939, and recently completed by the Nourse Construction Company and approved by the Bureau of Standards, the total cost of the installation of said system being \$3936.

Upon motion of Mr. Lord, seconded by Mr. McClymonds, the Board granted the Edinboro Summer Baseball men permission to play baseball two nights per week on the Darrow Road field belonging to the College.

Upon motion of Mr. McClymonds, seconded by Mr. Earp, the Board passed the following resolution.

Whereas, the Edinboro State Teachers College about twenty years ago constructed two frame bath houses on Edinboro Lake for the use of students during the Summer Sessions; and

Whereas, said bath houses were built on land leased by the College but recently donated to the Borough of Edinboro by the proprietor; and

Whereas, said bath houses are in a poor physical condition and would require a considerable outlay of labor and materials to repair them; and

Whereas, the College now has its own swimming pool which meets the recreational and educational needs better than the bath houses and lake facilities;

Therefore, be it resolved by the Edinboro State Teachers College Board of Trustees in regular meeting on June 14, 1940, that it be recommended to the Department of Property and Supplies that the transfer of said bath houses be made to the Borough of Edinboro, without consideration. Upon motion of Mr. LaBounty, seconded by Mr. Krapp, the Board employed Stanley Crawford as a full time campus men to work until October 1, 1940.

Upon motion of Mr. Lord, seconded by Mr. Knapp, Mr. Marsh was reelected Chairman of the Board of Trustees for the ensuing year.

Upon motion of Mr. LaBounty, seconded by Mr. McClymonds, Mr. Earp was re-elected Vice Chairman for the ensuing year.

Upon motion of Mr. Lord, seconded by Mr. Earp, Mrs. Sallee was reelected Secretary of the Board of Trustees for the ensuing year.

Upon motion of Mr. McClymonds, seconded by Mr. Lord, the Board recommended a raise in salary for Miss Sarah Pettit of \$120.00 for the year beginning June 1, 1940, making her salary \$2520 for 12 months, subject to the approprial of the Department.
